UNLV Lady Rebels (16-4, 5-2 MWC) at San Diego State Aztecs (7-13, 2-5 MWC)

► **When & Where:** Sat., Feb. 14, 2004, at 5:00 p.m. PST, Cox Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif.

► **Webcast/Live Stats:** The games will be broadcast live on the internet at www.goaztecs.com with Tammy Blackburn, Bill Earley and Dan Lawton calling the action. Live stats will be available for Saturday's game.

► **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team rounds out its longest conference homestand of the season as the Aztecs, 7-13 overall and 2-5 in the MWC, play host to UNLV Saturday. The game with the Lady Rebels marks the start of the second half of league play, while it will be the final home game of the year in Cox Arena, as the Aztecs' final two games in San Diego will be played across the street at Peterson Gym.

UNLV currently stands in a tie for second place in the Mountain West Conference standings along with New Mexico, boasting a 16-4 overall record and a 5-2 mark in league play. The Lady Rebels have dropped two of their last three contests, but have won eight straight over the Aztecs.

► **SDSU Head Coach Jim Tomey:** Tomey (Michigan '81) is in his second season at San Diego State after taking over the Aztec helm on April 9, 2002. His career and Aztec head coaching record is 16-31.

► **UNLV Head Coach Regina Miller:** Miller is in her sixth season with the Lady Rebels and boasts a record of 109-57. Her 12-year career record stands at 169-157.

► **Series History:** UNLV leads 16-11 (Last: UNLV def. SDSU, 76-58, 1/17/04 in Las Vegas).

SDSU Women's Basketball Begins Second Half Of League Play Saturday Against UNLV
The San Diego State women's basketball team starts round two of its Mountain West Conference schedule on Saturday, as the Aztecs face second-place UNLV at Cox Arena, beginning at 5 p.m. SDSU will look to avenge a 76-58 loss to the Lady Rebels back in mid-January and finishes up its longest conference homestand of the year, a three-game stint. Saturday's game will be the Aztecs last of the season in Cox Arena, as the final two home contests later this month will be played across the street at Peterson Gym.

Aztecs Drop Game To Cougars

SDSU finished out the first round of conference play with an 82-50 loss to visiting Brigham Young Saturday at Cox Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 7-13 overall and 2-5 in the MWC, while the Cougars improved to 12-9 overall and 2-5 in league play.

San Diego State had three players reach double-figures in scoring, including freshman

Michelle Elliott (Pasco, Wash.), who finished with a career high 21 points on 7-for-13 shooting from the field. Sophomore Ashlee Dunlap (Los Angeles, Calif.) chipped in 11 points and classmate Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.) added 10 points with eight coming in the second half.

Other BYU Notes

SDSU was down to nine available players against BYU, as sophomore Veronica Shaw (Phoenix, Ariz.) missed the game due to injury ... Shaw is expected to be back in uniform for the team's match-up with UNLV on Saturday ... the Aztecs were ahead 14-13 with 7:05 remaining in the first half, before BYU outscored them 18-5 going into the break ... Michelle Elliott played 40 minutes for the fourth time this season, while Farryn Lewis (Walnut Creek, Calif.) almost doubled her previous career high for minutes played with 22 ... SDSU's starting five scored 45 of the team's 50 points.

20 Or More

With Michelle Elliott's career high 21 points against BYU, three different Aztecs have been able to reach the 20-point mark six times this season. Elliott, sophomore Ashlee Dunlap and freshman Courtney Fritz have each scored 20 or more points in a game twice.

In the team's game against Nevada, Dunlap and Elliott both reached the 20-point mark, becoming the first Aztecs other than former standout Jamey Cox to reach the milestone since Atim Otii had 21 points against New Mexico at the MWC championships on March 7, 2001. SDSU also had two, 20-point scorers in one game for the first time since Cox and Claire Swinbank scored 24 and 20, respectively, against UNLV on Feb. 24, 2001.

The six times an Aztec has scored 20 or more points in 2003-04, is just one short of the team's total in the same category in 2000-01. That year, five different players combined to score 20 or more points in a game seven times.

Seeing Double

After a three-game dry-spell, SDSU freshman Michelle Elliott tallied her 15th career game with 10 or more points, finishing with a career high 21 against BYU a week ago. Elliott has not reached double-figures four times with the lone exceptions being against UT-Martin (8 pts.), New Mexico (7 pts.), Air Force (4 pts) and Utah (8 pts.).

For the season, Elliott is still SDSU's leading scorer with 13.1 ppg., a stat that ranks her sixth overall and first among freshmen in the Mountain West Conference.

Fritz For Three

Despite being held without a three-pointer for the second straight game, Aztec freshman Courtney Fritz (Newberg, Ore.) remains within striking distance of moving up in the SDSU season record book in two categories before year's end.

Fritz is currently 10th in both three-point field goals made and attempted, converting on 42 of her 113 shots from beyond the arc.

She trails Jamey Cox, who put up 134 attempts in 2001, for the ninth-place slot in that category. Fritz is behind Falisha Wright for both eighth and

McCartny Reaches The Century Mark

With a block in last Saturday's game with BYU, senior Nicolette McCartny become the fifth player in SDSU history to log 100 career blocks.

The team's lone senior is in fifth place in the Aztec record book with 100 blocks, passing Brook Meadows, who had 95 in her career from 1986-89, a few weeks ago.

McCartny is 15 away from moving up another notch in the Aztec top 10, passing Jessica Haynes' 114 blocks.

A year ago, McCartny had a career high 45 blocks in 27 outings.

UNLV Tid-Bits

UNLV has somewhat come down to earth since the two sides first met in January ... the Lady Rebels had their season best 10-game win streak come to an end at New Mexico on Jan. 31 and since then, has dropped another contest to MWC front-runner Utah last Sunday (72-55) ... Saturday's game will feature the top two rebounders in the MWC in SDSU's Ashlee Dunlap and UNLV's Sherry McCracklin ... the Lady Rebels are led by junior RanDee Henry, who averages a conference best 19.5 ppg., while McCracklin also leads the league with her 10.9 rpg. ... UNLV has played 13 of its 20 games at home this season with three of its four losses coming in opponent's arenas.

San Diego State-UNLV Series Shorts

- UNLV leads the all-time series, 16-11.
- Seven of San Diego State's 11 wins in the series have come at home, boasting a 7-5 record in San Diego versus UNLV.
- The last two games between SDSU and UNLV at Cox Arena have been close ones, as the Lady Rebels edged the Aztecs by just one point (50-49) last season and eight points in 2002 (57-49).
- SDSU last victory over UNLV came at Cox Arena on Jan. 29, 2000, when the Aztecs beat the Lady Rebels, 54-52.
- UNLV's eight-game winning streak versus San Diego State is its longest in the 27-game series.
- SDSU head coach Jim Tomey is 0-3 versus the Lady Rebels, while UNLV head coach Regina Miller is 6-1 versus the Aztecs.

San Diego State-UNLV Take One Notes

- UNLV defeated San Diego State in both teams' MWC season-opener back on Jan. 17, in Las Vegas, 76-58.
- Aztec freshman Michelle Elliott led the team in scoring with 18 points, while sophomore Veronica Shaw finished with a then season-high 15 points on 6-for-6 shooting off the bench. Junior **Candace Mattson (Alpine, Utah)** added a career high nine rebounds and six points in only 18 minutes of action.
- SDSU limited the MWC's leading scorer RanDee Henry to only 10 points (she averaged 19.3

Geographically Challenged

The SDSU coaching staff traveled far and wide to make-up its 2003 recruiting class. This year's 12-player roster includes players from 10 states with the most coming from California (3). Other states represented include: Arizona, Colorado, Illinois, Nevada, Oregon, Texas, Utah, Washington and Wisconsin.

ppg) and the nation's No. 2 rebounder Sherry McCracklin to just five boards (she averaged 12.8) - SDSU went to the free-throw line just 17 times, half of UNLV's total of 34 trips - SDSU's Ashlee Dunlap saw a then career-low 13 minutes of action before fouling out.

- UNLV led 42-27 at the half and would go up by as many as 26 points, before the Aztecs put together a 15-0 scoring run to pull back to within 11 at 55-44, which is as close as SDSU would get.

- UNLV's Infini Robinson, who entered the game shooting just 28 percent from the field, led UNLV in scoring with a career high 24 points, including six three-pointers.

Friend or Foe?

The Aztecs will see a familiar face in the opposing coaches' box as former Aztec director of basketball operations, Anthony Turner, is now in his second season as an assistant at UNLV. Turner spent two seasons on The Mesa from 2000-2002.

In The MWC

Through games of Feb. 8, Ashlee Dunlap is still the league's second-leading rebounder with her 9.2 rpg., while she is second in both defensive (5.60/g) and offensive (3.65/g) boards. Courtney Fritz is second in three-pointers per game (2.10) and senior Nicolette McCartney is third in blocked shots (1.20).

In MWC games, Fritz is second in three-pointers made (2.00/g), McCartney is third in blocked shots (1.29/g) and Veronica Shaw is third in steals (2.17/g).

Assists = Wins

So far this season, SDSU is a perfect 6-0 when tallying more assists in a game than its opponent. The only time SDSU has had fewer assists and still come away with a victory was at UC Irvine back on Dec. 2.

Individually, an Aztec has had four or more assists in a game in seven of the team's last nine outings, a trend that occurred only three times in SDSU's first 11 contests.

Can We Please Go To The Line?

Through the first round of conference play in 2003-04, San Diego State opponents have already gone to the free-throw line 57 more times than the Aztecs, making 170 trips to SDSU's 113. The Aztecs have gone to the charity stripe more times than their opponent in just one MWC game, owning a 18-9 margin Thursday versus Utah.

Aztec opponents own a slightly smaller advantage in overall games at 416-378. A year ago, the Aztecs took 84 fewer free throws than their opponents and 43 fewer in MWC contests. The MWC mark includes a school-record zero trips to the charity stripe on Jan. 25, 2003, at home versus Utah.

Double-Double

Ashlee Dunlap added to her double-double output, logging her 11th of 2003-04 with 23 points and 12 boards at Air Force a week ago. Dunlap is now one up on her season total in double-doubles from a year ago and is tied for the conference lead with UNLV's Sherry McCracklin.

Dunlap remains in her third place spot in Mountain West Conference career history with the 21 double-doubles. Linda Frohlich (UNLV) owns the MWC record of 43, while Carrie Bacon (WYO) is second with 23 and McCracklin, a junior, is three behind Dunlap with 19.

A year ago, Dunlap had eight double-doubles through the first 20 games and at this pace, could pass Bacon for second on the list by year's end.

A.D. On The Boards

Ashlee Dunlap has tallied double-figures in rebounding in 11 of the last 17 games and an MWC best 12 times overall in 2003-04. For the season, Dunlap's longest stretch without recording 10 rebounds or more is a mere two games, which would put her in position to add to her season total Saturday versus UNLV.

For her career, the sophomore has 23 double-figure rebounding performances in her 47 career games and has tallied nine boards in five others.

On The Top Of Turnovers

San Diego State's 10 turnovers in its loss to Utah on Feb. 5, are the fewest by an Aztec squad since the 1996-97 campaign. That team had 10 turnovers or less in a game three times with the most recent being the WAC tournament game on March 7, 1997, versus Hawaii'i when SDSU had exactly 10.

The 1996-97 team, which also had nine turnovers against Wyoming and eight versus Pepperdine, went on to post a 23-7 record.

In 2003-04, the Aztecs have won the turnover battle 13 times matching its season total from a year ago.

A Force In The First Half

Twelve times this season, an Aztec player has reached double-figures in points in the first half. Sophomore Ashlee Dunlap has led the charge, tallying 10 or more points in the first half five times. Freshman Michelle Elliott is close behind with double-figures in four games, while classmate Courtney Fritz recorded a team season-high 16 points in the first 20 minutes versus Cal State Fullerton (Dec. 1) and San Diego (Dec. 10). Fritz also had 10 points against Southern Methodist on Dec. 14.

Other Aztec Notes

SDSU has just 10 active players on its roster with freshmen **Jessica Huettl (Eau Claire, Wis.)** and **Jordie Smith (Ft. Collins, Colo.)** both out due to injury ... all available players have seen action for the Aztecs in seven of the last nine contests ... the Aztecs have outrebounded their opponent in 10 games already this year after doing so only five times (once in league play) in 27 outings in 2002-03 ... SDSU has held four opponents to 20 points or less in the first half ... an Aztec opponent has scored 20 points or less six times in either the first or second half.

Pick Six


