SAN DIEGO STATE WELCOMES IDAHO STATE FOR A SATURDAY NIGHT SHOWDOWN

- San Diego State continues its three-game homestand to start the season Saturday night against Idaho State.
- The Aztecs are playing three consecutive home games to start a campaign for the first time in their Division I era (since 1969) and for the first time overall since beginning 1967 with four straight home outings.
- After playing 23 consecutive games (two-plus seasons) out of San Diego County (streak started on Nov. 30, 2019 vs. Brigham Young and also included 2020 and 2021), SDSU is playing its second straight seven-game home schedule at Bashor Field at Snapdragon Stadium in Mission Valley.
- San Diego State is 6-2 all-time at Snapdragon Stadium, including a 38-7 win over Idaho State last Sept. 10.
- The Aztecs are coming off a 20-13 win over Ohio on Saturday in their earliest game (Aug. 26) in program history.
- Senior quarterback **Jalen Maiden** threw two touchdown passes to senior tight end **Mark Redman** and SDSU intercepted three OU passes, downing a team that won 10 games a year ago and returned most of its starters on both sides of the ball.
- Eight players earned their first career start for SDSU and 10 players overall made their first start at San Diego State.
- The Aztecs started a pair of true freshmen in Aztec (safety) **Marcus Ratcliffe** on the defense side of the ball - the first true freshman to start at SDSU's signature position in the 3-3-5 defense since it was installed in 2009 - and wide receiver **Baylin Brooks**.
- San Diego State appeared to take a 26-6 lead with just under two minutes left in the fourth quarter when **Ratcliffe** returned an interception 100 yards for a touchdown. A roughing the passer penalty, however, was called on the Aztecs and the Bobcats scored on the very next play.
- Ohio stopped SDSU on fourth-and-3 on the OU 36-yard line but was unable to tie the game as **New Zealand Williams** recorded San Diego State's third interception of the night right before time expired.
- Two Aztecs - **Cody Moon** (defensive) and **Jack Browning** (special teams) - were named Mountain West players of the week. If was the first career accolade for Moon, who had 12 tackles in his first game at SDSU after transferring from New Mexico. Browning, meanwhile, made a pair of field goals and averaged an FBS-best 56.3 yards per punt en route to his third career weekly conference honor.
- SDSU rallied from a 2-3 start in 2022 by winning five of their next six games (5-1) and finishing 7-6 overall for its 13th consecutive .500 or better season. That is tied for the sixth-longest streak nationally and is the longest streak among Pacific Time Zone teams. In 12 of those 13 seasons, San Diego State has posted a winning record.
- The Aztecs have posted a .500 or better overall record and a winning record in Mountain West action in each of the last 13 seasons.
- San Diego State plays one of the toughest schedules in the country this year with five games against 10-win teams - vs. Ohio (W, 20-13), at Oregon State, vs. Boise State, at Air Force and vs. Fresno State - and eight vs. bowl teams from a year ago - also vs. UCLA, vs. Utah State and at San Jose State.
- The beginning of the Aztecs' schedule is particularly tough as five of their first six opponents made a bowl in 2022, including games vs. Ohio (10-4) on Aug. 26 (W, 20-13), UCLA (9-4) on Sept. 9, at Oregon State (10-3) on Sept. 16, vs. Boise State (10-4) on Sept. 22 and at Air Force (10-4) on Sept. 30 before hitting its open week in the first week of October.
- SDSU scored the final 38 points of the game in last year's win over Idaho State. Saturday will be ISU's first game of the season.

CODY MOON AND JACK BROWNING NAMED MW PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. -- San Diego State football's Cody Moon and Jack Browning have each been named Mountain West players of the week, the league announced Monday morning. Moon was named the MW Defensive Player of the Week for the first time of his career, while Browning was chosen as the MW Special Teams Player of the Week for the third time.

The duo led the Aztecs to 20-13 win over Ohio in the season opener Saturday night at Snapdragon Stadium. SDSU improved to 16-1-1 all-time against teams from the Mid-American Conference, taking down a team that won 10 games a year ago and returned almost its entire offense and defense.

Moon, a transfer from New Mexico, registered a team-high 12 tackles (seven solo) in his first game at San Diego State, while adding a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry. Moon's 12 tackles were more than the next two Aztecs combined as he helped limit the Bobcats to just 13 points, not scoring its lone touchdown until 1 minute, 59 seconds left in the game.

The reigning MW Special Teams Player of the Year and preseason MW Special Teams Player of the Year, Browning made a pair of field goals - 49 yards and 21 yards - accounting for eight of SDSU's 20 points in a seven-point victory. He also punted three times for a 56.3 average with all three going for over 50 yards, including a 57-yarder, 60-yarder and a 52-yarder. The 56.3 average was the highest in the country last weekend (min. 3 attempts). Browning also kicked off, handling all three kicking duties.

PROGRAM-AT-A-GLANCE

- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State is 73-30 with a 70.6 winning percentage (11th nationally) (*Top 25 listed on the right*) and the Aztecs are 72-27 (72.7 percent) since Oct. 3, 2015 (10th nationally).
- SDSU had five double-digit victory seasons from 2015-21. Only eight schools in the nation can say that - San Diego State, Alabama, Appalachian State, Clemson, Georgia, Notre Dame, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
- Only eight schools have more wins than SDSU's 20 over the last two-plus seasons (since 2021), including Georgia (29), Michigan (25), Alabama (24), UTSA (23), Cincinnati (22), Ohio State (22), Clemson (21) and Notre Dame (21).
- San Diego State has posted 13 consecutive seasons with at least a .500 record. That is tied for the sixth-longest streak nationally and is the longest streak among Pacific Time Zone teams. In 12 of those 13 seasons, the Aztecs have posted a winning record.
- The Aztecs have played in 12 bowl games since 2010. Only seven schools have played in all 13 over that stretch - Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Mississippi State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State and Wisconsin.
- Since the start of the 2019 campaign, San Diego State is 24-8 in games decided by seven or more points (8-2 last year).
- The Aztecs are 24-10 in their last 34 games decided by one score (started with 27-24 win at Wyoming in 2016 Mountain West Championship game). SDSU's eight-game winning streak in one-score games was snapped Oct. 29, 2022 at Fresno State (L, 32-28).
- San Diego State is 47-17 in its last 64 regular-season games against Mountain West opponents.
- Brady Hoke is the only active college coach to lead three different FBS programs (Ball State, Michigan and SDSU) to an 11-win season and one of only two coaches overall since 1996 (also Urban Meyer with Utah, Florida and Ohio State).

2022 IN REVIEW

- After starting 2-3, the Aztecs won five of their final seven regular-season games (5-2) to clinch a bowl spot.
- SDSU finished 5-2 in its first season at Snapdragon Stadium.
- San Diego State played in its 12th bowl game since 2010, tied for the eighth most in the country over that stretch.
- The Aztecs finished 7-6 for their 13th straight season with at least a .500 record, which is tied for the sixth-longest active streak in the country. SDSU's lone .500 season in that stretch was a 4-4 campaign in the COVID-shortened 2020 season.

- Two Aztecs were Pro Football Focus All-Americans (Jonah Tavai - 1st team, and Jack Browning - 2nd team). SDSU was one of only eight schools with multiple first or second-team PFF All-Americans, joining USC, Ohio State, Alabama, Notre Dame, North Carolina, Illinois and Iowa.
- Tavai and Browning also earned other All-America nods. Tavai was a first-team selection by Bleacher Report, a second-team pick by Associated Press and USA Today, and an honorable-mention selection by College Football Network. Browning, meanwhile, was an honorable mention punter by College Football Network.
- San Diego State had seven first-team all-Mountain West selections, the most in the league for the fourth straight year. The seven selections were C Alama Uluave, KR Jordan Byrd, DE Jonah Tavai, LB Caden McDonald, S Patrick McMorris, P Jack Browning and PR Jordan Byrd.
- The Aztecs also had the most overall selections (16), matching a program record (also 2001). Making the second team were WR Tyrell Shavers, TE Mark Redman, LG Cade Bennett and LB Michael Shawcroft with honorable-mention accolades going to QB Jalen Mayden, WR Jesse Matthews, DE Keshawn Banks, CB Dez Malone and CB Dallas Branch.
- Browning was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Year. An Aztec has now won the award five times (all over the last eight years), the most in the 24-year history of MW.
- Byrd became the first Aztec to make a MW first team at both kick returner and punt returner.
- Byrd became the first FBS player with at least one rushing touchdown, receiving touchdown, kick return touchdown and punt return touchdown in the same season since Temple's Isaiah Wright in 2018 and just the second MW player in league history (also former Aztec Rashaad Penny in 2017).
- McDonald made the all-MW first team for a third consecutive season, joining fellow Aztec Kirk Morrison (2002-04) as the only linebackers in league history (since 1999) to make three all-MW first teams.
- McMorris landed on his second straight all-conference team, becoming just the second SDSU safety to make two all-MW first teams, joining Will Demps from 2000-01.
- Shavers was a second-team all-MW selection, the first San Diego State wide receiver to earn first or second-team honors since both Vincent Brown and DeMarco Sampson were first-team picks in 2010.
- Mayden became an honorable mention selection at quarterback, despite playing the first five games at safety. Mayden is the first Aztec quarterback since Ryan Lindley in 2010 (second team) to earn all-MW honors when he was named an honorable mention pick.
- Banks became a four-time all-Mountain West pick with an honorable-mention nod.

OFFENSIVE KEYS

- San Diego State is 54-2 the last 56 times it has rushed for 200 yards. The Aztecs surpassed 200 yards rushing twice last season (vs. Idaho State on Sept. 10 and vs. Toledo on Sept. 14).
- The Aztecs are 83-16 since 2011 when committing one turnover or less, something SDSU has done in 36 of its last 49 games.
- SDSU has an advantage in time of possession in 31 of the last 48 games. Since 2011, the Aztecs are 34-7 when possessing the football for at least 35 minutes.

DEFENSIVE KEYS

- The Aztecs are 71-4 since 2011 when holding the opposition to 17 points or less. SDSU has held 27 of its last 45 opponents to 17 points or less.
- San Diego State has won 21 of its last 23 games when forcing at least two turnovers (SDSU's 17-game winning streak came to an end on Sept. 3, 2022 vs. Arizona) and 31 straight games when forcing at least three turnovers.
- San Diego State is 75-6 in its Division I history when owning at least a plus-3 turnover advantage, something it did twice last year (vs. Toledo and vs. UNLV).
- The Aztecs are 33-9 since 2011 when allowing less than 150 passing yards.
- San Diego State is 60-7 the last 67 times it has held the opposition to a 33.3 percent or less mark on third down.
- Since 2009, San Diego State's record broken down by opponent passing efficiency: less than 110: 67-10; between 110-150: 44-25; greater than 150: 7-27.

- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, SDSU is 45-4 when holding its opponent to a passing efficiency rating of below 110. SDSU did that in five of 13 games last year and in its only game this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS / OVERALL TRENDS

- The Aztecs are 48-2 the last 50 times when owning a turnover advantage.
- San Diego State has won 17 straight games when committing fewer turnovers than its opponent.
- San Diego State is 31-3 the last 34 times it has an advantage in field position.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has 14 kickoff returns for touchdowns, the most in FBS play over that time. To put that stat into perspective, 13 other teams have played at least 60 games over that span and do not have a single kick return touchdown.
- Since the start of the 2020 season, San Diego State has 14 non-offensive touchdowns, tied with Houston, Pittsburgh and TCU for the fourth most in the country over that span, trailing only Middle Tennessee State (16), Alabama (15) and Iowa (15).
- San Diego State had five non-offensive touchdowns last year, including a blocked punt recovery in the end zone to score against Arizona on Sept. 3, a returned punt for a touchdown against Idaho on Sept. 10, a blocked punt and return at Boise State on Sept. 30, a fumble return at Nevada on Oct. 22 and a kick return touchdown against San Jose State on Nov. 12. The five non-offensive touchdowns were tied for seventh most in the country, only trailing Mississippi State (7), Western Kentucky (7), Iowa (6), Middle Tennessee (6), Pittsburgh (6) and TCU (6).
- SDSU has won 34 of its last 36 games leading after three quarters (35-5 in Brady Hoke era) (30-game winning streak was snapped at Fresno State on Oct. 29).

BULLET NOTES - OFFENSE

- San Diego State returns five starters on offense this season, including three who earned 2022 all-Mountain West honors in offensive linemen **Cade Bennett** (second team), tight end **Mark Redman** (second team) and quarterback **Jalen Mayden** (honorable mention). Offensive linemen **Brandon Crenshaw-Dickson** and **Ross Ulugalu-Maseuli** are also back for the Aztec offense.
- **Ryan Lindley**, San Diego State's all-time leading passer from 2008-11, enters his first season as the offensive coordinator. Lindley came to SDSU from Mississippi State last Oct. 3 and will continue to coach the Aztec quarterbacks.

OFFENSIVE NUMBERS

- **San Diego State is 62-14 since 2015 when scoring just 20 or more points (1-0 this year).**
- The Aztecs are 47-4 the last 51 times they have scored at least 30 points. SDSU has won its last 12 games when scoring at least 30 points.
- SDSU scored 43 points against San Jose State on Nov. 12, 2022 its most in a game since scoring 48 against Towson on Sept. 25, 2021, most against an FBS opponent since scoring 48 vs. Central Michigan in the 2019 New Mexico Bowl (Dec. 21) and its most in a Mountain West game since scoring 52 at San Jose State on Nov. 4, 2017.
- SDSU has won 19 straight games when scoring 40 points (8-0 under Brady Hoke).
- San Diego State scored 38 unanswered points twice last season - Sept. 10 vs. Idaho State and Nov. 12 vs. San Jose State.
- SDSU is 27-6 since 2011 when having at least 36 minutes of time of possession.
- **San Diego State has won nine straight games when not committing a turnover (11-0 under Brady Hoke).**
- Since the beginning of 2014, SDSU is 67-14 when committing one turnover or less (13 straight win streak was snapped at Boise State on Sept. 30, 2022) and 13-22 when having two or more turnovers in the game. San Diego State has one turnover or less in 33 of its last 46 games.
- San Diego State has one turnover or less in 54 of its last 76 games.
- SDSU is 55-11 in its last 66 games when owning an edge in time of possession (5-1 last season).
- The Aztecs are 19-5 under Brady Hoke when totaling just 400 yards of offense.
- SDSU beat San Jose State, 43-27, on Nov. 12, 2022. The 70 combined points were the most in an Aztec game since falling to Army West Point, 42-35, in the 2017 Armed Forces Bowl (Dec. 23) and the most in an Aztec win since beating Northern Illinois, 42-28, on Sept. 17, 2016.
- It marked the first time in SDSU's Division I history that it scored exactly 43 points.
- San Diego State averaged 7.17 yards per play at New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2022, its highest mark since a 9.03 average vs. Army West Point in the 2017 Armed Forced Bowl, and highest in a win since a 7.98 mark against New Mexico on Nov. 24, 2017.
- The Aztecs outgained the Lobos by 250 yards, their largest margin since outgaining Utah State by 355 on Oct. 21, 2020.

RUSHING OFFENSE

- **San Diego State is 54-2 the last 55 times it has rushed for at least 200 yards (2-0 last year) and is 51-1 in its last 52 regular-season games when rushing for 200-plus yards.**
- The Aztecs have won 12 straight games when rushing for at least 200 yards.
- San Diego State has a 100-yard rusher in 49 of the last 103 games since 2015 (61, 100-yard rushers total).
- San Diego State had two 100-yard rushers at New Mexico State (Jordan Byrd - 118 and Chance Bell - 116) on Sept. 14, 2019 for the 30th time in program history. The Aztecs are 29-1 in those occasions, including a 19-game win streak.
- San Diego State ran for 380 yards against Idaho State on Sept. 10, 2022, its most in a game since running for 407 at Utah State on Oct. 31, 2020.
- The Aztecs averaged 8.84 yards per run in the Idaho State game, their highest average in a game since averaging 12.14 yards

- SDSU outrushed Idaho State by 300 yards, its largest margin since outrushing Utah State by 304 on Oct. 31, 2020.
- **San Diego State is 28-7 in the Brady Hoke era when outrushing its opponent (1-0 this year).**
- SDSU's rushing average this season by down - 1st: 5.4, 2nd: 3.7; 3rd: 8.5 and 4th: 2.0.
- San Diego State's rushing average this season by quarter - 1st: 6.4; 2nd: 2.1; 3rd: 12.3 and 4th: 2.1 - and by half - 1st: 4.3 and 2nd: 5.9.
- RB Jaylon Armstead ranks third in FBS in rushing yards per attempt (9.75, 2nd in MW), seventh in rushing yards (78, 2nd in MW) and rushing yards per game (78.00, 2nd in MW), tied for ninth in all-purpose yards per play (9.75, T-5th in MW), 13th in scrimmage yards per play (9.75, 7th in MW), 18th in total offense per game (78.00, 5th in MW) and 19th in total scrimmage yards (78, 5th in MW).
- Armstead ranked fifth in the Mountain West in rushing yards per attempt (6.02, T-48th in MW) last season.
- Armstead ran for 96 yards against Idaho State on Sept. 10, 2022 on just five carries. The 19.2 average was the second-highest by an Aztec since at least 1996 (min. 5 att.), trailing only Rashaad Penny's 20.8 average at Nevada on Nov. 12, 2006.
- Armstead's 19.2 average against Idaho State was also the eighth-highest average in a FBS game last season (min. 5 att.).
- RB Kenan Christon leads the Mountain West and ranks in a tie for 12th in FBS in rushing attempts per game (11.00), and is fourth in the league in both rushing yards (45, 18th in FBS) and rushing yards per game (45.00, 18th in FBS).
- Christon ran for 102 yards and a touchdown on just 10 carries (10.2 avg.) at New Mexico on Nov. 18. It was his second career 100-yard rushing game and first since rushing for 103 in his first college game at USC against Arizona on Oct. 19, 2019. He became the 81st Aztec with a 100-yard rushing game. He also became the first Aztec since Rashaad Penny against Army West Point on Dec. 23, 2017 and just the third Aztec overall since 2000 (has now happened eight times overall) to average at least 10 yards per carry on at least 10 attempts.
- Among quarterbacks, QB Jalen Mayden ranks fourth in the Mountain West with 24 rushing yards.
- If you take away the 17 times Mayden was sacked last year (for 101 yards), he rushed 52 times for 332 yards (6.4 avg.) with three touchdowns. The three rushing scores were tied for the fifth most among Mountain West quarterbacks. Mayden has not been sacked this year.

PASSING OFFENSE

- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has thrown 50 interceptions, the fourth-fewest picks in the nation over that span behind option teams Navy's 41 (min. 65 GP), Air Force's 46 and Army West Point's 49. In contrast, Purdue has thrown 113 interceptions over that span, which is the most since 2015.
- SDSU has won five of its last six games when throwing for at least 300 yards (1-1 last year).
- The Aztecs threw multiple touchdown passes in four consecutive games from Oct. 29-Nov. 18 for the first time since a four-game stretch in 2016 (Nov. 5-26).
- San Diego State outpassed Hawai'i, 322-196, on Oct. 8, 2022. The 126-yard margin is its largest since outpassing Fresno State by 187 yards on Nov. 15, 2019 (W, 17-7).
- QB Jalen Mayden is 6-3 as the team's starting quarterback.
- This season Mayden ranks second in the Mountain West in completion percentage (62.96, 6th in FBS), pass efficiency rating (138.43, 8th in FBS), yards per attempt (6.07, 9th in FBS), yards per completion (9.65, 10th in FBS), third in completions per game (17.00, T-8th in FBS), passing yards (164, 11th in FBS), passing yards per game (164.00, 11th in FBS), total offense per game (188.00, 11th in FBS) and total offense per play (5.08, 15th in FBS), and tied for fourth in points responsible for per game (12.00, T-8th in FBS).
- Since Mayden has moved to quarterback for the Oct. 8, 2022 game against Hawai'i, he is ranked sixth in the nation in yards per completion (13.89, 1st in MW, min. 200 att.), 16th in passing yards (2,194, 1st in MW), 19th in yards per attempt (8.31, 2nd in MW, min. 150 att.), a tie for 29th in touchdown passes (14, T-29th in FBS), 35th pass efficiency (139.6, min. 200 att., 3rd in MW) and 38th in passing yards per game (243.8, 3rd in MW).
- Mayden accounted for 11 touchdowns over a four-game stretch (nine passing, two rushing) from Oct. 29-Nov. 18, 2022.
- **Mayden has multiple touchdown passes in six of his last seven games (13 total).**
- Mayden had a monster starting debut vs. Hawai'i on Oct. 8, 2022, throwing for 322 yards and a touchdown. The 322 yards were just six passing yards shy (328) of what San Diego State had for its first five games of the season.
- Mayden's 322 yards were the most by an Aztec quarterback in their starting debut since current offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Ryan Lindley threw for 352 against Cal Poly on Aug. 30, 2008 and the most in a debut in an Aztec win since Kevin McKechnie threw for 371 against Navy on Sept. 5, 1997.
- Mayden became the 27th different Aztec with a 300-yard passing game (127th time overall).
- At Fresno State on Oct. 29, 2022, Mayden had another good game with four overall touchdowns, including his first multi-touchdown passing game and first multi-touchdown rushing game. He was 19-for-24 for 291 yards and two touchdowns (and two interceptions), while rushing for 43 yards and two touchdowns on eight attempts (5.4 avg.). Mayden became just the second SDSU quarterback since at least 1996 with at least two passing touchdowns and two rushing touchdowns, joining Ryan Katz (Oct. 6, 2012 vs. Hawai'i).
- Mayden had another big game against San Jose State on Nov. 12, 2022 en route to being named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week (the first by an Aztec quarterback since Ryan Katz on Oct. 8, 2012), throwing for 268 yards and a career-high three touchdown passes (to three different receivers), rallying SDSU back from a 14-0 deficit. Against a team that ranked in the top 30 on defense in passing (28th, 196.50), rushing (28th, 120.38), total (20th, 316.88) and pass efficiency (34th, 122.58), SDSU managed 268 passing yards, 157 rushing yards, 425 yards and a 206.14 pass efficiency rating under his quarterbacking. The 206.14 pass efficiency rating was the highest allowed by San Jose State since a 245.7 mark against San Diego State on Nov. 4, 2016. The 14-point deficit overcome was SDSU's largest (win or loss) since also overcoming a 14-point deficit at San Jose State on Nov. 9, 2013, SJSU's first year in the league. Mayden also ran 13 times for 61 yards including 69 yards on 11 carries when taking away the two times he was sacked.
- Mayden threw for 280 yards and two touchdowns in a win at New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2022, while adding 38 rushing yards on five

carries. It was his fourth straight multiple touchdown game, the first time an Aztec quarterback has accomplished that since Christian Chapman in 2016 (Nov. 5-26).

- Mayden earned honorable mention from the Mountain West coaches and media in 2022, becoming the first Aztec quarterback since Ryan Lindley in 2010 (second team) to earn all-MW honors.
- WR Mekhi Shaw became the 90th different Aztec in program history with a 100-yard receiving game with career highs of six catches, 120 yards and two touchdowns at New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2022.
- TE Mark Redman is the first SDSU tight end to earn preseason all-MW honors since David Wells in 2017 and just the second since 2012.
- Redman ranks in a tie for second in FBS in receiving touchdowns (2, T-2nd in MW), total touchdowns (2, T-2nd in MW), total points (12, T-2nd in MW) and points per game (12.00, T-2nd in MW), tied for seventh in scrimmage yards per play (12.40, T-5th in MW), tied for eighth in points responsible for per game (12.00, T-4th in FBS), a tie for ninth in all-purpose yards per play (62.00, 5th in MW), a tie for 10th in total receptions (5, T-4th in FBS) and receptions per game (5.00, T-4th in MW), and a tie for 14th in receiving yards (62, T-4th in FBS) and receiving yards per game (62.00, T-4th in FBS).
- Among tight ends in the country this year, Redman ranks first in touchdown receptions (2) and receiving yards (62), and a tie for second in receptions (5, T-1st in MW).
- Redman had a big game against Ohio in the 2023 opener on Aug. 26, catching five passes for 62 yards and two touchdowns. **Redman became just the third Aztec tight end since at least 1996 with two touchdown catches in a game, joining Gavin Escobar (three games from 2011-12) and Kahale Warring (at Nevada in 2018).**
- Redman became the first Aztec tight end with two touchdown catches in a season opener and the seventh overall player (the other six were all wide receivers).
- Redman has all four of his touchdown catches over the last six games.
- **The offensive line hasn't allowed a sack this season in 29 pass opportunities.**
- Against Ohio on Aug. 26, the Aztecs did not allow a sack in a season opener for the first time since Sept. 3, 2011 against Cal Poly, the final season of current offensive coordinator Ryan Lindley's college career at SDSU.
- LT Christian Jones hasn't allowed a quarterback pressure this season in 29 pas opportunities.
- LG Cade Bennett allowed only five quarterback pressures (no sacks) in 333 passing opportunities last season.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Bennett's 83.1 pass block rating last year was the second highest in the Mountain West among offensive linemen and first among MW guards (min. 200 pass opportunities).

BULLET NOTES - DEFENSE

- Kurt Mattix is in his fourth season as defensive coordinator running the 3-3-5 defense at San Diego State. He previously served as defensive coordinator at Eastern Kentucky and worked with Brdy Hoke at Michigan. Mattix has been named a nominee for the Broyles Award for the top assistant coach in both 2020 and 2021.
- San Diego State's returns six starters return from a defense that ranked 15th in the country last year in total defense (322.77), 19th in rushing defense (113.85) and scoring defense (20.54), and 39th in passing defense (208.85). Starters that are back for the Aztec defense are honorable-mention all-MW cornerbacks Dallas Branch and Dez Malone, along with linebacker Cooper McDonald, safety Cedarious Barfield and cornerback Noah Tumblin.

DEFENSIVE NUMBERS

- **Since 2014, SDSU ranks sixth in a tie for fifth in turnovers forced (209), and sixth in both total defense (313.1) and scoring defense (18.8).**
- San Diego State has held its opponent to single digits 20 times time since 2015 (103 games) and to 10 or less points 30 times over that span.
- SDSU won 18 straight games when holding its opponent to under 24 points until the streak was snapped in a 13-3 loss to Air Force on Nov. 26, 2022. San Diego State is now 35-3 under Brady Hoke when keeping its opponent to under 24 points (1-0 this season.)
- The Aztecs have allowed just 786 points over the last 174 quarters (4.52 points per quarter) (does not include overtime periods).
- SDSU has allowed just 860 points over the last 49 games (17.6 ppg).
- San Diego State held its opponent scoreless on its opening drive eight times last year in 13 games, 20 times in 28 games since 2021 and 74 times since 2015 (103 games).
- Last year opponents had 163 drives where they tried to score on SDSU and the Aztecs forced three-and-outs (or less) in 67 of those drives (41.1 pct.). San Diego State averaged 5.15 three-and-outs per game. This year SDSU is averaging 2.00 three-and-outs per game.
- SDSU shut out an opponent in the first half for three straight games (Sept. 24 vs. Toledo, Sept. 30 at Boise State and Oct. 8 vs. Hawai'i) last year for the first time since at least 2000. The streak, which was snapped with a late second quarter touchdown by Nevada on Oct. 22, was tied for the longest in the country last season. San Diego State shut out its opponent in four of the 13 games last year in the first half, including four of the final 10 games.
- San Diego State held its opponent scoreless in five straight first quarters before being snapped with a field goal by Fresno State on Oct. 30, 2022. It was SDSU's longest streak since a five-game stretch from 2003-04 (last four games of 2003, first game of 2004). San Diego State then shut out UNLV in the first half the following game, making it just three points allowed in a seven first-quarter stretch.
- The Aztecs held their opponents scoreless in 22 of the 52 quarters last season, including 22 of the final 47. This year SDSU has held its opponent scoreless in one of the four quarters.
- The Aztecs allowed just 4.92 yards per play last year, which ranked 17th in the country.

SERIES HISTORY

- San Diego State and Idaho State are meeting for the third time in school history and just the second time since the 2004 opener.
- The Aztecs defeated the Bengals, 38-21, in the first game on Sept. 4, 2004 and was followed by the annual KGB SkyShow. SDSU then defeated ISU, 38-7, last Sept. 10 for San Diego State's first victory at Snapdragon Stadium.
- In the first encounter between the two schools in 2004, SDSU outgained ISU, 581-398, including a 290-46 advantage on the ground.
- Michael Franklin had a 67-yard touchdown run on the first play from scrimmage, the Aztecs scored on their first three possessions en route to a 24-0 lead in the first quarter and scored the first 38 points of the game.
- The 24 points are still the most in the first quarter by SDSU in a season-opening game, while the 31 points in the first half are its second most in a first half over a lidlifter.
- Some notable Aztecs played in that game. Current Minnesota Vikings quarterback Kevin O'Connell made his collegiate debut in the contest, coming off the bench to complete 5 of 14 passes for 58 yards and a touchdown, while running seven times for 54 yards (7.7 avg.) with a long run of 21 yards.
- The announced attendance for the 2004 game was 57,216, at the time a record for an regular-season Aztec home game. It is now ranked second behind the announced attendance of 57,286 against Washington State on Sept. 17, 2011. SDSU also featured 59,473 in the 1986 Holiday Bowl when it fell to Iowa, 39-38.
- Last year, SDSU spotted Idaho State a 7-0 lead and then scored the final 38 points in a 38-7 triumph.
- San Diego State ran for 380 yards last year, its most in a game since running for 407 at Utah State on Oct. 31, 2020.
- The Aztecs averaged 8.84 yards per run in the 2022 meeting, their highest average in a game since averaging 12.14 yards against Army in the 2017 Armed Forces Bowl (Dec. 23).
- SDSU outrushed Idaho State by 300 yards, its largest margin since outrushing Utah State by 304 on Oct. 31, 2020.
- **SDSU-IDAHO STATE TIDBITS:** SDSU has led for 91.5 percent of the series (109 minutes, 47 seconds of the 120 minutes). The series has been tied for 7:25 and San Diego State has trailed for just 2:48... The Aztecs scored the first 38 points of a 38-21 win on Sept. 4, 2004 and the last 38 points of the 38-7 win last year... SDSU has outgained Idaho State, 1,069-736, in the series, including a massive 670-126 (+544) advantage on the ground... In the two games, San Diego State has rushed 94 times for 670 yards (7.1 avg.) and five touchdowns.

Big Notes

- San Diego State won its 13th game (13-3) since the start of the 2021 season. Coming into the weekend, only eight teams had more wins than the Aztecs since 2021.
- San Diego State won for the first time in its own county since defeating Brigham Young, 13-3, on Nov. 30, 2019. The Aztecs played all 22 of their games away from county the last two seasons (2020-21), going 16-6, before falling to Arizona last week in their first game of the year.
- SDSU improved to 53-2 over its last 55 games when rushing for at least 200 yards.
- SDSU played its 18th straight game without having a two-game losing streak. San Diego State's last two-game losing streak was Nov. 21-28, 2020 (lost at Nevada, 26-21, and at Colorado, 20-10).
- The Aztecs improved to 18-2 in all games played in September since the start of the 2016 campaign.
- San Diego State held its opponent to single digits for the 19th time since 2015 (91 games).

Team Notes

Aztecs Run Past Idaho State, 38-7

SAN DIEGO -- Jordan Byrd returned a punt 66 yards for a touchdown and added a 53-yard scoring run to spark San Diego State to a 38-7 victory over Idaho State. It was the first win for the Aztecs (1-1) at Snapdragon Stadium after playing their last two seasons at Dignity Health Sports Park in Carson, California.

SDSU spotted the Bengals (0-2) a 7-0 lead on a 75-yard scoring strike from Tyler Vander Waal to Xavier Guillory two plays into the game before scoring the final 38 points of the game.

Byrd's punt return tied the score at the 11:58 mark, San Diego State's seventh non-offensive touchdown since the start of 2021.

Later in the quarter, quarterback Braxton Burmeister ran 47 yards for a touchdown to put the Aztec in the lead for good.

Byrd stretched SDSU's advantage early in the second quarter on the 53-yard scamper, one of six San Diego State rushes of at least 20 yards in the game.

ISU got all the way to the San Diego State's 5-yard line on its ensuing drive, but Hunter Hays' pass on fourth-and-3 was broken up by first-time starting safety Dav Vaughn Celestine.

The Aztecs turned the ball over on back-to-back drives to start the third quarter and Idaho State once again got deep into SDSU territory, but Hays' pass missed the target on a fourth-and-2 situation from the San Diego State 7.

The Aztecs responded with a 10-play, 91-yard drive, but had to settle for a 20-yard field goal by Jack Browning to take a 24-7 lead after three quarters.

Burmeister hooked up with Tyrell Shavers for a 14-yard score early in the fourth quarter to stretch the advantage to 31-7.

Running back Cam Davis scored on SDSU's next possession from three yards out for the final points of the game.

San Diego State ran for 380 yards in the game, led by Jaylon Armstead's 96 yards on just five carries. The 380 yards were the most by the Aztecs since running for 407 at Utah State on Oct. 31, 2020, while the 8.84 yards per carry was their highest average since a 12.14 mark against Army in the 2017 Armed Forces Bowl (Dec. 23).

SDSU improved to 53-2 over its last 55 games when rushing for at least 200 yards.

Armstead's 19.2 average, meanwhile, was the second-highest by a San Diego State player since at least 1996 (min. 5 att.), only trailing Rashaad Penny's 20.8 average at Nevada on Nov. 12, 2016.

Burmeister added 80 yards on the ground, while Byrd had 48, Kenan Christon 48 and Davis 38.

Burmeister completed 15 of 26 passes for 108 yards.

Celestine finished with nine tackles after entering the game with four for his career. CJ Baskerville, Caden McDonald and Patrick Morris chipped in with eight tackles apiece for San Diego State, which held Idaho State to 263 yards over their final 71 plays (3.7 avg.) of the game.

- SDSU recorded a safety (Jonah Tavai sack) against San Jose State on Nov. 12, 2022, its first since Oct. 4, 2013 against Nevada and first on a defensive play since Nov. 13, 2010 at TCU.
- San Diego State held New Mexico without a third-down conversion on Nov. 18, 2022 for its first time since Sept. 3, 2016 against New Hampshire and for the first time against a FBS opponent since Oct. 3, 2015 vs. Fresno State. New Mexico was 0-for-11 on third down, marking the first time that UNM was held without a third-down conversion since going 0-for-7 against Wyoming in a 36-30 win on November 29, 2014.
- SDSU held Middle Tennessee to 170 yards in the 2022 EasyPost Hawai'i Bowl, the fewest against San Diego State since Weber State had 154 on Aug. 31, 2019 and the fewest by a FBS team since New Mexico had 142 on Nov. 3, 2018.
- San Diego State gave up 2.33 yards per play vs. Middle Tennessee, its fewest in a game since Fresno State averaged 1.89 yards on Oct. 3, 2015.
- LB Cody Moon leads the Mountain West in tackles (12, 4th in FBS), tackles per game (12.00, 4th in FBS) and assisted tackles (5, T-10th in FBS), and third in solo tackles (7, T-5th in FBS) and solo tackles per game (7.00, T-5th in FBS).
- Moon was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week on Aug. 28 for his play in the Aug. 26 opener against Ohio. Moon had a team-high 12 tackles (seven solo) in his first game as an Aztec after playing at New Mexico the past two seasons. The 12 tackles were two more than the next two Aztecs combined. It was his fifth career double-digit tackle game and third over his last four games.
- CB Noah Tumblin ranks in a tie for sixth in the Mountain West in solo tackles per game (5.00, T-16th in FBS).
- In the opener against Ohio on Aug. 26, S Marcus Ratcliffe became the first true freshman to start at the signature Aztec position in SDSU's 3-3-5 defense, which started in 2009. The other true freshmen to start on defense since 2009: CB Leon McFadden (2009), S Tariq Thompson (2017), CB Noah Avinger (2021) and S CJ Baskerville (2021).
- CB Dallas Branch was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week for the first time of his career on Nov. 7, 2022 for his play against UNLV on Nov. 5. Branch had four tackles, a sack, two tackles for loss, an interception and a fumble recovery. He ended up setting career highs in tackles for loss (2) and had his first sack, while tying career bests in interceptions (1) and fumble recoveries (1). He first recovered a fumble in the second quarter after UNLV reached SDSU territory and later picked off a Doug Brumfield pass in the end zone on the second play of the fourth quarter.

- Fresno State averaged negative 0.12 yards per carry vs. San Diego State.
- **San Diego State held Middle Tennessee State in the 2022 EasyPost Hawai'i Bowl to a Division I-era program-record minus-66 yards rushing, eclipsing a minus-44-yard effort against Cal State Los Angeles on Sept. 27, 1969.**
- The minus-66 yards rushing were the fewest allowed in a FBS game since Michigan State held Tulsa to minus-73 yards on Oct. 30, 2019 and fewest in any bowl game since at least 1996.
- The Aztecs did not allow a rushing first down for the first time in any game since at least 1996.

PASSING DEFENSE

- **SDSU's 146 interceptions since the 2014 season are the most in the country over that while its 15 interceptions returned for a touchdown ranks in a tie for 16th.**
- The Aztecs had 28 sacks and 60 tackles for loss over the final seven games in 2022.
- SDSU's three interceptions this year are tied for the most in the country.
- CB Cedarius Barfield is tied for first in the Mountain West in interceptions (1, T-2nd in FBS) and interceptions per game (1.00, T-2nd in FBS), second in interception yards (7, 5th in FBS), third in passes defended per game (2.00, T-4th in FBS) and a tie for third in total pass breakups (1, T-5th in FBS).
- LB New Zealand Williams leads the Mountain West in interception yards (40, 2nd in FBS), and is tied for first in interceptions (1, T-2nd in FBS) and interceptions per game (1.00, T-2nd in FBS).
- LB Trey White is tied for first in the Mountain West in interceptions (1, T-2nd in FBS) and interceptions per game (1.00, T-2nd in FBS).
- CB Noah Tumblin ranks in a tie for first in the country in total pass breakups (3, T-1st in MW) and passes defended per game (3.00, T-1st in FBS).
- Tumblin's four pass breakups in the 2021 opener against New Mexico State were tied for the fifth most in a game in FBS that season and tied for the fourth most in a game in school history (an Aztec has only recorded games with at least four PBU's 16 times in program history).
- LB Zyrus Fiasseu is tied for second in the Mountain West in both tackles for loss (2.0, T-6th in FBS) and tackles for loss per game (2.00, T-6th in FBS), tied for third in sacks per game (1.0, T-4th in FBS) and fourth in tackles for loss yards (11, T-9th in FBS).
- DT Tupu Alualu and LB Cooper McDonald each are tied for fifth in the Mountain West in sacks per game (0.50, T-17th in FBS).
- CB Dallas Branch had an interception in three straight games last year from Nov. 5-18, which was tied for the longest in FBS play this season. Only two Aztecs since 2007 have had a longer streak - Larry Parker in 2011 and Vonnice Holmes in 2007, each with four.

BULLET NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS

- ESPN's special teams efficiency rating had San Diego State at 72.2, which ranked second in FBS, trailing only South Carolina (79.8). The Aztecs were fifth in 2021 at 69.9.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has 14 kickoff returns for touchdowns, the most in FBS play over that time. To put that stat into perspective, 13 other teams have played at least 60 games over that span and do not have a single kick return touchdown.
- The Aztecs also have five 100-yard kickoff return touchdowns since 2015, one behind Western Michigan for the most in FBS play over that span.
- San Diego State had five non-offensive touchdowns last year, including a blocked punt recovery in the end zone to score against Arizona on Sept. 3, a returned punt for a touchdown against Idaho on Sept. 10, a blocked punt and return at Boise State on Sept. 30, a fumble return at Nevada on Oct. 22 and a kick return touchdown against San Jose State on Nov. 12. The five non-offensive touchdowns were tied for seventh most in the country, only trailing Mississippi State (7), Western Kentucky (7), Iowa (6), Middle Tennessee (6), Pittsburgh (6) and TCU (6).
- The Aztecs have 10 non-offensive touchdowns since the start of the 2021 season. Only three schools have more non-offensive touchdowns over that span, including Middle Tennessee State (14), Iowa (12) and Pittsburgh (12). Over that span, SDSU has four blocked punt returns for touchdowns, two interception returns for touchdowns, two kickoff returns for a touchdown, a fumble recovery for a touchdown and one punt return for a touchdown.
- Since the start of the 2020 season, San Diego State has 14 non-offensive touchdowns, tied with Houston, Pittsburgh and TCU for the fourth most in the country over that span, trailing only Middle Tennessee State (16), Alabama (15) and Iowa (15).
- P/K Jack Browning has been named the 2023 Mountain West Preseason Special Teams Player of the Year. Browning is the second straight Aztec to be named the MW Preseason Special Teams of the Year (Jordan Byrd) and the fourth overall (also Rashaad Penny in 2016 and 2017).
- Browning is just the second Aztec punter to garner preseason all-MW accolades, joining Brian Stahovich (2010 and 2011).
- Browning was named the 2022 Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Year, SDSU's second straight punter to win the award and the fifth time an Aztec has captured the award in the last eight years (since 2015). The five special teams players of the year are the most in the history of the league (started in 1999). Browning also made the all-MW first team as a punter.
- For his career, Browning ranks fourth in field goal percentage (.786, min. 25 att.) and tied for 12th in made field goals (22).
- Browning ranked third in SDSU single-season history last year in punt average (46.10), tied for third in field goals (20) and tied for seventh in field goal percentage (80.0).
- This year, Browning is tied for the national lead in PAT percentage (100.00), and tied for second in field goals per game (2.00, 1st in MW), made field goals (2, 1st in MW), attempted field goals (3, 1st in MW), attempted field goals per game (3.00, 1st in MW), tied for third in field goal percentage (66.67, 1st in MW), and sixth in punt yards (169, 2nd in MW) and punt yards per game (169.00, 2nd in MW). He's also second in the league in total kickoffs (4, T-6th in FBS) and kickoff yards (221, 10th in FBS), third in made PATs (2, T-8th in FBS), attempted PATs (2, T-8th in FBS), total punts (3, T-9th in FBS), punts per game (3.00, T-9th in FBS) and kickoff average (55.25, 11th in FBS), tied for fourth in total points (8, T-12th in FBS) and points per game (8.00, T-12th in FBS), and seventh in points responsible for per game (8.00, T-19th in FBS).
- Last year, Browning tied for the FBS lead in PAT percentage (100.00), and was sixth in punt average (46.1, 1st in MW), tied for sixth in punts inside the 20-yard line (28, 1st in MW), eighth in kickoff average (64.14, 1st in MW) and total punt yards (3,145, 3rd in MW), 12th in net punt average (42.3, 1st in MW), tied for 12th in field goal attempts per game (1.92, T-1st in MW), tied for 14th in field goal attempts (25, T-2nd in MW), 16th in punt yards per game (241.92, 3rd in MW), tied for 16th in total punts (68, 3rd in MW) and field goals made (20, 3rd in MW), and tied for 17th in field goals per game (1.54, T-3rd in MW) and punts per game (5.25, 4th in MW). Browning also was second in the league in kickoff touchbacks (37, T-48th in FBS), third in kickoff touchback percentage (62.71, 37th in FBS), fourth in field goal percentage (80.00, T-47th in FBS), fifth in total points (90), sixth in points per game (6.92), seventh in made PATs (30) and attempted PATs (30), and tied for eighth in points responsible for (90).
- Browning didn't have a touchback from a punt until his 33th attempt of the season last year (Sept. 30 at Boise State).
- Browning made his first career eight field goal attempts and made 20 of 25 last season.
- Browning has eight games with multiple field goals, including the opener with Ohio this year.
- Browning picked off where he left off last year, being named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week for the third time of his career on Aug. 28 for his play against Ohio on Aug. 26. Browning helped the Aztecs beat Ohio, 20-13, accounting for eight points on two field goals (49 yards and 21 yards) and two PATs. He also punted three times for 169 yards (56.3) with all three going for at least 50 yards. His 56.3 punt average is the highest in a game this season (min. 3 punts).
- Browning had an impressive game against Idaho State on Sept. 10, 2022, punting six times for a 47.5 avg., with all six landing inside the 20-yard line, including five inside the 10 and four inside the 5. He became just the second punter with four punts inside the 5-yard line since at least 2012 (also Michael Dickson (Texas) vs. Missouri on Dec. 27, 2017). Additionally, Dickson was the only player since 2012 with more than five punts inside the 10 (he had six). Off Browning's six punts, Idaho State averaged a 4.83 starting field position. He also made his only field goal and all five PATs, while kicking off seven times for a 65.7 average with six touchbacks. He also had a 26-yard rush on a fake punt attempt.
- Browning was named the MW Special Teams Player of the Week for the first time of his career on Sept. 26, 2022 for his play against Toledo on Sept. 24. In the kicking game, Browning made his only field goal attempt - a career-long 50-yarder - and was 2-for-2 in PATs. Browning also punted nine times for 364 yards (40.4 avg.) (three of his punts started in Toledo territory) with a long of 56 yards. Out of his nine punts, six landed inside the 20 (last six of the game) and three inside the 10. Out of his nine punts, Toledo averaged a 21.7-yard field position. Browning also kicked off four times for a 64.2 average with two touchbacks. Off his four kickoffs, Toledo averaged a 22-yard field position. Out of his 13 overall kicks (punts and kickoffs), Toledo averaged starting on its own 21.8-yard line.
- Browning had another good game at Boise State on Sept. 30, 2022, punting a career-high 10 times for a career-high 48.5 average. The 48.5 average was the third highest last season for those with at least 10 punts in a game and the 24th highest since at least

- 1996. Browning also made both of his field goal attempts.
- Browning was named the MW Special Teams Player of the Week for the second time of his career on Nov. 21, 2022, for his play at New Mexico on Nov. 18. Browning made all six kicks (four PATs, two field goals), scoring 10 of SDSU's 34 points. He also punted twice for a 52.5 average, including a career long of 63 yards, and kicked off seven times with four touchbacks for a 64.1 average, while logging a tackle on a kickoff.
- For his career on planned fakes, Browning has rushed three times on fake punts/kicks for 72 yards (24.0 avg.) with a touchdown.
- Martin Blake ranks second in FBS play in kick return average (22.00, 2nd in MW), tied for fourth in total kick returns (2, 3rd in MW) and sixth in combined kick/punt return yards (44, 3rd in MW).

SAN DIEGO -- Jalen Mayden threw two touchdown passes to Mark Redman and San Diego State opened the season with a 20-13 win over Ohio on Saturday night at Snapdragon Stadium.

The game turned in the final minute of the first half when Cedarius Barfield intercepted Ohio quarterback CJ Harrison inside the Aztecs 30-yard line. Mayden then drove the Aztecs 71 yards in 44 seconds, hitting Redman for a 13-yard score as time ran out. That made it 10-6 at halftime.

The Bobcats then missed a 31-yard field goal to cap the opening drive of the second half, a drive that chewed up more than half of the third quarter.

After a 3-and-out, San Diego State put together two long drives -- a 10-play, 77-yard drive for Jack Browning's 21-yard field goal and an 11-play, 79-yard march capped by a 4-yard Redman touchdown. In the second drive, Mayden was 7-for-7 for 68 yards.

Ohio threw three straight incompletions from the SDSU 6 with less than three minutes to play and on fourth down Marcus Ratcliffe had a 100-yard interception return nullified by a roughing-the-passer penalty on Cody Moon.

The Bobcats then cashed in with a 3-yard touchdown pass from Harris to Miles Cross with 2:04 to go, making it a 20-13 game instead of 27-6. The onside kick went out of bounds but the Aztecs only picked up eight yards on four runs, failing to convert on fourth-and-3 from the Bobcat 36.

Ohio got the ball back on its 35 with 55 seconds to play and picked up a pair of first downs before New Zealand Williams had an interception at the 20, returning it 40 yards before stepping out of bounds with a second to play.

Mayden was 17 of 27 for 164 yards, including five passes for 62 yards and two touchdowns to Redman. Redman became just the third Aztec tight end since at least 1996 with two touchdown catches in a game, joining Gavin Escobar (three games from 2011-12) and Kahale Warring (at Nevada in 2018). Additionally, Redman became the first SDSU tight end with two touchdown catches in a season opener and the seventh overall player (the other six were all wide receivers).

San Diego State picked off Harris three times and won its 31st consecutive game when forcing three or more turnovers. The Aztecs also won their 17th straight game when committing fewer turnovers than their opponent. This against an Ohio team that won 10 games a year ago, returned nine starters on offense and owned the eighth-best turnover margin in the country in 2022 at +0.86. The Bobcats only threw five interceptions in 14 games a season ago.

Jaylon Armstead rushed for 78 yards on just eight carries for SDSU, which had eight players make their first career Division I start and 10 players overall make their first start at San Diego State.

Cody Moon had 12 tackles in his first game as an Aztec after transferring from New Mexico, while Noah Tumblin came off the bench for five solo tackles and three pass breakups.

SDSU improved to 16-1-1 all-time against current members of the Mid-American Conference, avenging a 27-0 loss to Ohio in the 2018 Frisco Bowl.

San Diego State improved to 62-14 since 2015 when scoring just 20 points.

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Has amassed 39 years of coaching experience at the collegiate level including 14-plus seasons as a FBS head coach at Michigan (2011-14), San Diego State (2009-10, 20-) and Ball State (2003-08).
- Received conference coach-of-the-year recognition in three different leagues as a head coach while posting a 102-82 overall record. During his tenure as a head coach, Hoke's teams have produced 107 all-conference selections.
- Brings 20 years of experience as a collegiate defensive coach with stints at Grand Valley State (1983), Western Michigan (1984-86), Toledo (1987-88), Oregon State (1989-94), Michigan (1995- 2002), Oregon (2016) and Tennessee, where he was named interim head coach for the final two games of the 2017 campaign.

AT SAN DIEGO STATE

- Hoke returned to "America's Finest City" as the Aztecs' defensive line coach in 2019, helping SDSU rank second in FBS in rush defense (75.4), third in scoring defense (12.7), and sixth in both total defense (287.8) and pass efficiency defense (110.25).
- Spent two seasons as San Diego State's head coach (2009-10), earning Mountain West Coach of the Year honors in 2010 after leading the Aztecs to their first postseason appearance in 12 years with a victory over Navy in the Poinsettia Bowl.
- Coached 18 all-MW performers during his first stint at SDSU, as well as 25 conference all-academic recipients.

OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Served as head coach at Michigan from 2011-14, guiding the Wolverines to a 31-20 record, including an 18-14 conference ledger. He became the first Michigan head coach to go undefeated at home (14-0) in his first two seasons since Fielding Yost in 1901-02.
- Directed the Wolverines to an 11-2 record and a victory in the Allstate Sugar Bowl in his first season on the Ann Arbor campus. For his efforts, Hoke collected the inaugural Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year award from the Big Ten Conference coaches while garnering Dave McClain Coach of the Year accolades from the Big Ten media. In addition, he was named the Maxwell Football Club Collegiate Coach of the Year that season and was a finalist for three other national Coach of the Year honors: Bear Bryant, Eddie Robinson and Liberty Mutual.
- During Hoke's tenure in Ann Arbor, the Wolverine defense improved from a unit that in 2010 ranked 108th in the FBS in scoring defense and 110th in yards allowed to one that ranked among the top 20 in total defense in 2011, 2012 and 2014. Meanwhile, the offense averaged nearly 30 points per game (29.2) in his four years at the helm.
- Under Hoke's tutelage at Michigan, a total of 21 Wolverine players received all-Big Ten recognition.
- Earned his first head coaching job at his alma mater, Ball State, where he guided the program for six seasons, culminating with a 12-1 campaign in 2008 and an undefeated Mid-American Conference regular season.
- With Hoke at the controls, Ball State made its' first-ever appearance in the national polls in 2008, ranking as high as 12th by the Associated Press and 13th in the USA Today Coaches poll. For his efforts, Hoke was one of 10 finalists for the 2008 Liberty Mutual National Coach of the Year award.
- Led the Cardinals to back-to-back bowl game appearances (2007-08), the first time the feat was accomplished in school history. The 2008 team, which also advanced to its first MAC championship contest, earned an invitation to the GMAC Bowl in Mobile, Alabama.

SDSU Downs Ohio, 20-23, in 2023 Opener

SAN DIEGO -- Jalen Mayden threw two touchdown passes to Mark Redman and San Diego State opened the season with a 20-13 win over Ohio at Snapdragon Stadium.

The game turned in the final minute of the first half when Cedarius Barfield intercepted Ohio quarterback CJ Harrison inside the Aztecs 30-yard line. Mayden then drove the Aztecs 71 yards in 44 seconds, hitting Redman for a 13-yard score as time ran out. That made it 10-6 at halftime.

The Bobcats then missed a 31-yard field goal to cap the opening drive of the second half, a drive that chewed up more than half of the third quarter.

After a 3-and-out, San Diego State put together two long drives -- a 10-play, 77-yard drive for Jack Browning's 21-yard field goal and an 11-play, 79-yard march capped by a 4-yard Redman touchdown. In the second drive, Mayden was 7-for-7 for 68 yards.

Ohio threw three straight incompletions from the SDSU 6 with less than three minutes to play and on fourth down Marcus Ratcliffe had a 100-yard interception return nullified by a roughing-the-passer penalty on Cody Moon.

The Bobcats then cashed in with a 3-yard touchdown pass from Harris to Miles Cross with 2:04 to go, making it a 20-13 game instead of 27-6. The onside kick went out of bounds but the Aztecs only picked up eight yards on four runs, failing to convert on fourth-and-3 from the Bobcat 36.

Ohio got the ball back on its 35 with 55 seconds to play and picked up a pair of first downs before New Zealand Williams had an interception at the 20, returning it 40 yards before stepping out of bounds with a second to play.

Mayden was 17 of 27 for 164 yards, including five passes for 62 yards and two touchdowns to Redman. Redman became just the third Aztec tight end since at least 1996 with two touchdown catches in a game, joining Gavin Escobar (three games from 2011-12) and Kahale Warring (at Nevada in 2018). Additionally, Redman became the first SDSU tight end with two touchdown catches in a season opener and the seventh overall player (the other six were all wide receivers).

San Diego State picked off Harris three times and won its 31st consecutive game when forcing three or more turnovers. The Aztecs also won their 17th straight game when committing fewer turnovers than their opponent. This against an Ohio team that won 10 games a year ago, returned nine starters on offense and owned the eighth-best turnover margin in the country in 2022 at +0.86. The Bobcats only threw five interceptions in 14 games a season ago.

Jaylon Armstead rushed for 78 yards on just eight carries for SDSU, which had eight players make their first career Division I start and 10 players overall make their first start at San Diego State.

Cody Moon had 12 tackles in his first game as an Aztec after transferring from New Mexico, while Noah Tumblin came off the bench for five solo tackles and three pass breakups.

SDSU improved to 16-1-1 all-time against current members of the Mid-American Conference, avenging a 27-0 loss to Ohio in the 2018 Frisco Bowl.

San Diego State improved to 62-14 since 2015 when scoring just 20 points.
