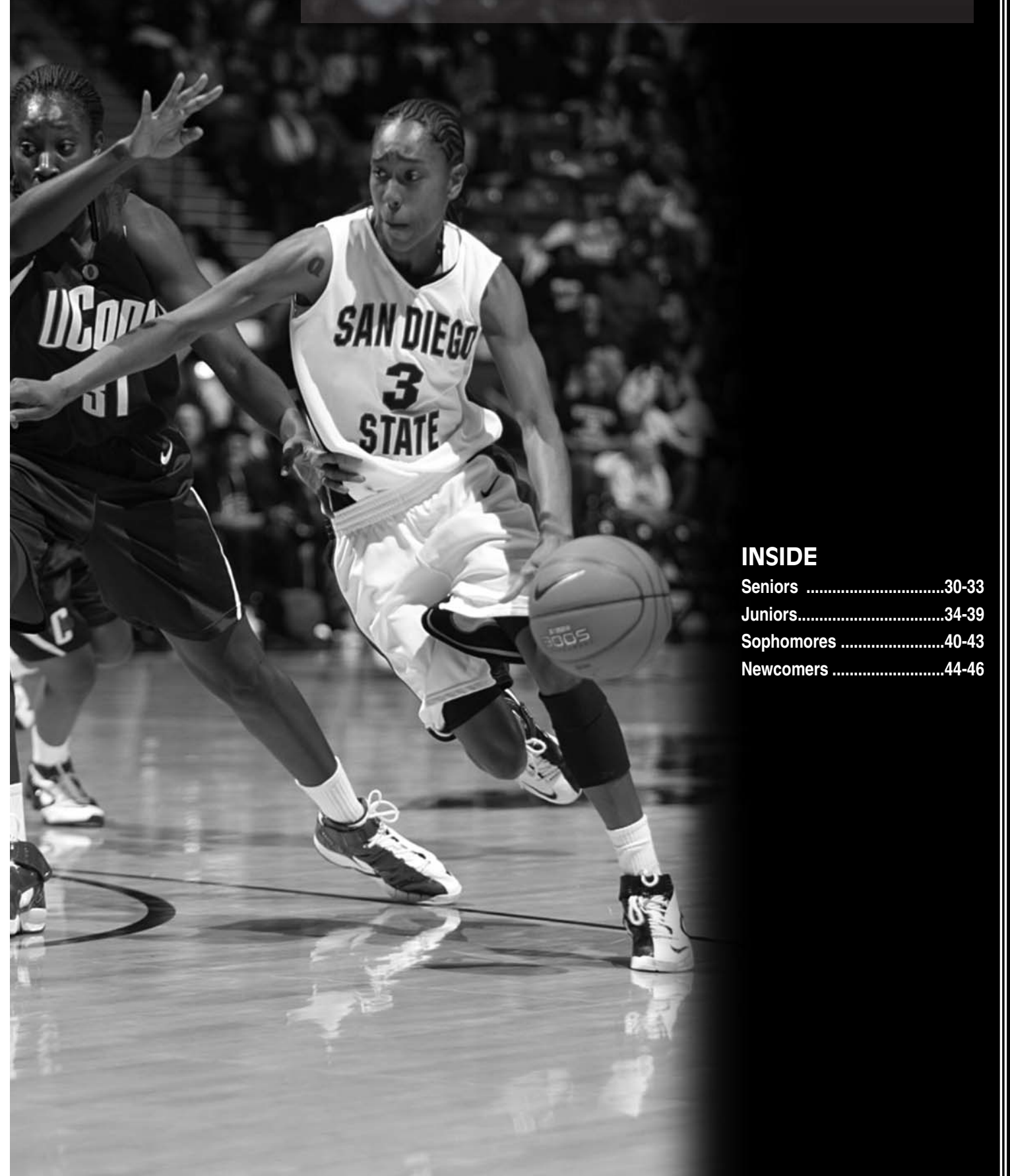

QUICKLY

A combo guard, who is a good shooter and is quick off the dribble ... Has worked hard on improving all facets of her game ... A quick defender and a great teammate ... Good offensive rebounder with a solid vertical leap ... Played in 68 career outings, starting 10 times ... Returning starter from 2007-08, after being a member of the starting five in the final eight contests ... Provides a spark on the floor ... Is left-handed ... SDSU scholar-athlete ... Voted this year's team captain.

AS A JUNIOR (2007-08)

Appeared in 30 games, starting the last eight, including all three at the MWC championships ... Career-high 2.0 rebounds a game to go with 2.8 points an outing ... Career-high 26 assists and 24 steals ... Averaged 17.5 minutes per contest ... One of nine Aztecs to score 10 or more points in at least one game ... Led the squad in rebounds and assists in one game apiece ... Voted team's most improved player ... Played 12 minutes in the opener with Nevada ... Two steals, two rebounds and six points, in the team's win over Saint Mary's ... Did not see action at Cal Poly ... Matched her career-bests with 10 points on 4-for-5 shooting and three rebounds against Cal State Fullerton ... Matched career-high with three steals to go with a season-best four rebounds versus Quinnipiac ... Career and team game-high five rebounds, while also tallying three assists against TCU on Feb. 9 ... Three steals against No. 19 Utah ... First start of the year on Feb. 20 against Wyoming ... Career-high four assists and matched her career-best with five boards vs. UNLV ... Six points, making 3-of-4 shots and matched a season-best with three steals against Air Force on March 8 ... Starter against Wyoming in the MWC quarterfinals, scoring four points and pulling down three rebounds in 27 minutes ... Scored six points in the upset of TCU in the MWC semis ... Perfect at the line in the championship game with New Mexico, making all four free throws.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2006-07)

Played in 22 games, starting twice ... Averaged 2.7 points per contest ... Contributed 16 steals and 16 assists ... Suffered a torn lateral meniscus in SDSU's first exhibition game ... Had surgery Nov. 13, and returned to action Nov. 24 at Southern Utah ... Played seven minutes, notching one assist and a free throw in the win over the Thunderbirds ... Three points, two assists and her first career block in the overtime win versus Cal Poly ... Career-best three assists and three steals in 16 minutes vs. Saint Mary's ... Four points against George Washington and at UNLV ... Had four points and two rebounds at New Mexico ... Season-best seven points against UNLV, while adding a pair of assists and a steal in only 16 minutes of action ... First career start vs. Wyoming on Feb. 18, logging three points and a pair of assists in a career-best 22 minutes ... Seven points and two boards in a starting role at Colorado State ... Three-pointer in the MWC tournament game with Wyoming.

AS A FRESHMAN (2005-06)

Played in 16 games in her first collegiate season, averaging just over six and a half minutes a contest ... Limited by an ankle injury during conference play ... Six three-pointers were fifth on the squad ... Made seven of her eight free throw attempts ... Had a three-pointer in the opener at Wichita State ... Scored four points with two steals in just five minutes at UC Riverside ... Led the team with nine points off the bench at UC Davis, also tallying three rebounds and a pair of steals ... First career assist at Pepperdine ... Career-best and team game-high 10 points on 4-for-5 shooting (2-for-2 from three-point land) versus Utah ... A reserve against TCU, scoring eight points on 3-for-4 shooting and logging a pair of boards and an assist in 10 minutes ... Returned to the court after a four-game absence, playing two minutes at Air Force on Feb. 8 ... Played 12 minutes versus UNLV, scoring three points and pulling down a pair of rebounds ... Four points and an assist at TCU on Feb. 18 ... Played 10 minutes against BYU and at Wyoming ... Logged three minutes at the MWC tournament.

AT AZUSA HIGH SCHOOL

Earned four letters in basketball at Azusa High School under coaches Joe Scherf and Brad Dolin ... Became her school's first female student-athlete to earn an NCAA Division I college athletic scholarship ... Two-time league MVP ... Averaged 18.4 points, 3.4 assists and 4.2 steals per game as a senior ... Helped Azusa to a 22-4 overall record and a share of the league title ... Garnered first team all-CIF honors her final year and was named player of the year by the *San Gabriel Valley Tribune* ... Four-time first team all-Montview League pick ... As a junior, averaged 19.5 points and 4.3 assists per contest, leading the Aztecs to a conference championship with an 11-1 record and a 20-5 mark overall ... Second team all-CIF honoree as a junior ... Played in the *Tribune/Star-News* All-Star Basketball Classic in April 2005 ... Also ran track at Azusa.

AS A JUNIOR (2006-07)

SDSU's leading scorer with 10.6 points per game, the only Aztec in double-figures ... Fourth in the MWC in blocks per game (1.24/g) and ninth in offensive rebounds (2.29/g) ... Also was 10th in field-goal percentage (.423) and 17th in scoring ... Had 11 double-figure scoring games and four with 10 or more rebounds ... Team game-high in points on seven occasions ... Led the team in points in both exhibition games, scoring 20-plus in each outing ... First career double-double in her first career game, recording a team-best 18 points and 12 rebounds vs. Nevada in 40 minutes ... Went 10-for-10 from the field in the second half to lift the Aztecs to their win over UC Davis ... Ended the contest 10-for-15 from the field with 20 points, eight rebounds and three blocks ... Second and third career games in double-figure rebounds with 10 at USD and at Southern Utah ... Hit the game-winning lay-up in overtime against Wichita State ... Second career double-double with a team game-high 18 points to go with 11 boards vs. Cal Poly ... Career-high four blocks and a pair of assists and steals against the Mustangs ... Had 15 points in the win over Pepperdine ... Fourth-straight game in double-figure points, scoring 15 of her 17 points in the second half vs. Brown ... San Diego Surf 'N Slam all-tournament selection ... Team-best 12 points and three blocks at Wyoming ... Team-high 14 points and seven rebounds at TCU ... Missed the final seven games of the season.

AT SAN JOAQUIN DELTA JC (2004-06)

Played two seasons at San Joaquin Delta College in Stockton, Calif., under coach Gina Johnson, where she led the Mustangs to a runner-up finish in the 2006 state junior college championships ... Named to the state all-tournament team for Delta, which was ranked No. 1 in Northern California, logged a 33-5 record

and tallied the school's first ever undefeated conference campaign (12-0) ... Averaged 13.4 points and 7.6 rebounds per contest in 2005-06 ... Two-time second team all-state and first team all-conference ... In her first season at Delta College, averaged 16 ppg. and led the team in nearly every statistical category ... Mustangs claimed a conference title and advanced to the state Elite Eight in 2004-05.

AT JOHN F. KENNEDY HIGH SCHOOL

QUICKLY

Standout first two collegiate seasons ... Ranked in the top two in the Mountain West Conference and top 30 nationally each of the last two years in assists per game ... Gave the Aztecs much needed scoring power from the guard position ... Has great handles, can slash and rebound ... Served as a team captain a year ago as a sophomore ... Four career games in double-figure assists ... Ranks seventh in school history and 18th in the MWC record book in career assists with 312.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2007-08)

Started all 31 contests ... Led the Aztecs in assists 22 times and ranked second in the conference in that category for both overall (5.26/g) and league-only contests (4.81/g) ... Ended up ranked 30th nationally in assists ... Her 163 assists ranked eighth in Aztec single-season history ... Scored in double-figures in nine games and logged her third career double-double ... Fourth in the MWC in steals with a career-best 71 (2.29/g) ... Contributed a team-high 17 points, while adding four steals and four assists at Nevada ... Had a team-best five assists and scored 13 points, including a perfect 6-for-6 effort from the line, in the game with Jackson St. ... Matched career-best in points with 21 in the win over Cal Poly ... Was 11-for-12 from the free-throw line and added four steals and four boards vs. the Mustangs ... Eleven free-throws matched her career-high and tied for fourth in school history ... Career-high 12 assists to go with 10 points for her first double-double of the year vs. CS Fullerton ... Season-high seven rebounds against Quinnipiac ... Recorded 10 helpers in the win at Air Force, reaching double-figures in assists for the third time in her career ... Team game-high 19 points against Wyoming ... Nine assists in the victory over UNLV ... Career-high seven steals to go with 19 points at CSU, including 17 in the first half ... Nine assists against Wyoming in the MWC quarters, committing just two turnovers in 40 minutes ... Clutch in-bound play in the upset of TCU in the MWC semis, scoring the go-ahead lay-up with just two seconds left on the shot clock ... Contributed 10 assists against the Lady Frogs, the third-most ever in a MWC tournament game, most by a sophomore in a game and most by a player in the conference semifinals ... Scored 12 points in the MWC championship game on a career-high four 3-pointers, while also adding eight assists and five steals ... Averaged 9.0 assists per game at the MWC tourney.

AS A FRESHMAN (2006-07)

Third-team all-league pick ... Mountain West Conference leader and in the top 25 nationally in assists per game (5.32) ... Ranked first nationally among freshmen in assists per game ... Averaged a league-best 5.25 assists in conference action ... Fourth in the MWC in steals (1.96/g) ... Led the Aztecs in points (273 pts./9.8 ppg.) ... SDSU's assist leader in 26 of 28 games ... Scored in double-figures on 17 occasions and had a team-high in points seven times ... Second in steals (55), tied for third in rebounding (4.8/g) ... Her 149 assists on the year were the most by an

Aztec since 1999-2000 and the 10th-best total all-time ... Had a block in 13 games ... Played in all 28 contests and started 27 times ... Started against Nevada, the fourth straight year a true freshman has started at the point in the season-opening game for the Aztecs ... One rebound short of a triple-double in her first career outing against Nevada ... Ended with 11 points, 10 assists and nine rebounds against the Wolf Pack ... Ten assists tied as the most by a player in the MWC in 2006-07 ... Had 18 points on 7-for-8 shooting to lead SDSU to a win at Southern Utah ... Nine assists and five steals versus Wichita State ... 13 points, five rebounds and four assists and steals in the win over Cal Poly ... Second double-double with 17 points and a career-best 11 boards vs. Saint Mary's ... Added eight assists and four steals against the Gaels ... Career-best six steals to go with 11 points and six assists against Brown ... San Diego Surf 'N Slam all-tournament ... Scored in double-figures in nine of 16 MWC games ... Eight assists against Utah and Air Force ... Team season best and career-high 21 points in the win over Utah ... Seven helpers vs. UNLV, Air Force, Wyoming ... Team-best 13 points at the MWC tournament, also chipping in five assists.

AT RIO AMERICANO HIGH SCHOOL

Four-year letterwinner and team captain at Rio Americano High School ... All-America nominee and first team All-Metro selection as a senior under coach Richard Drawbert ... Led team to an 18-9 record as junior, averaging 25.3 points, 4.4 rebounds and 2.8 steals per game ... 2004-05 *Cal-Hi* all-state underclass second team (junior) honoree ... Participated in the Sac vs. Bay Showdown along with future teammate Kim Spinardi, scoring a team-high 15 points.

QUICKLY

A returning starter at guard, who shined in her first competitive season with the Aztecs in 2007-08 ... A second-team all-league choice as a sophomore ... Top defensive player, who can also score and help in the assist column and beyond the arc ... Extremely athletic and could be one of the fastest players on the roster ... Signed with San Diego State in mid-August 2006, before sitting out 2006-07 due to NCAA transfer guidelines ... A top recruit as a prep, who gained valuable experience in one season at Cal.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2007-08)

Second team all-Mountain West Conference selection ... One of two Aztecs named to MWC championship all-tournament team ... Team MVP and co-best defensive player ... Played and started all 31 games ... Led the team in scoring with 14.1 points per game ... Also first for SDSU in three-pointers (46) and steals (92) ... Ranked first in the conference and 27th nationally in steals in overall (2.97/g) games ... Also No. 1 in steals for league-only outings (3.06) ... Her 92 steals ranks fourth in MWC season history, while her 49 steals in 16 conference contests tie for third and are the most-ever by a sophomore ... Fifth in the MWC in scoring in conference games (16.1 ppg.) with the highest average ever by an SDSU player (prev. 14.5 ppg. by Jamey Cox in 1999-2000) ... Only the second Aztec to finish in the top five in MWC scoring ... Fourth in free-throw percentage in MWC games (85.7 percent) ... Entered into the SDSU season record book in three categories including steals (7th), three-point percentage (7th) and three-pointers made (10th) ... Team-best 22 double-figures scoring games, including 13 in MWC action ... SDSU's high scorer in 14 games ... Led the squad in assists eight times and in rebounds four times ... Starter in the opener with Nevada, logging seven steals ... Career-best nine assists and seven steals vs. Southern Utah ... Four steals in just 18 minutes against USD ... Team-best six assists vs. No. 2 UConn ... Had 20 points and four 3-pointers vs. Quinnipiac ... Team game-high 17 points, six rebounds and went 9-for-9 from the line vs. UNM ... Scored 25 points on 10-for-18 shooting to go with a team-best five rebounds at Utah ... Matched a team game-high with 17 points in the win over BYU ... Career-high 35 points at UNLV, making seven consecutive three-point attempts, while also adding three steals and five boards ... Named MWC co-player of the week on Jan. 28 ... 35 points, 13 field goals and 7 three-pointers vs. UNLV was the most by a player in a league game in 2008 ... Seven threes in a single game are the second-most in Aztec game history and tie for fourth in conference history ... Fourth 20-point scoring outing at New Mexico, finishing with 22 to go with four steals ... 14 points at BYU and 19 vs. UNLV, tallying six assists against both opponents ... Had seven steals for the third time at CSU, while also adding 19 points and a team-best five boards ... Six steals in the first half of the final home game with AFA ... Team game-high 21 points, including 18 in the second half, in the win over Wyoming in the MWC quarterfinals ... Added team-best four steals

to go with six rebounds and a 4-for-7 effort from three ... Second 20-point scoring outing in the MWC semis vs. TCU, notching 24 points ... Made a steal off an in-bound pass with 11 seconds remaining to secure the upset over the Lady Frogs ... Limited by foul trouble in the conference championship game against New Mexico, but still managed to score 10 points ... Averaged 18.3 points and 3.7 rebounds, while chipping in seven triples, seven steals and a 41.7 field-goal percentage in the three MWC tournament games.

IN 2006-07

Did not play her first year on campus, sitting out after transferring from Cal.

AT CALIFORNIA (2005-06)

Started 21 of 27 games, helping the Golden Bears to their first NCAA tournament appearance since 1993 and an 18-12 overall record ... Averaged 8.7 ppg. and 2.3 rpg. and led the squad in steals with 62 (2.30/g), including nine in one game ... Third in the Pac-10 in steals ... Also had 68 assists, 26 three-pointers and averaged over 31 minutes to earn honorable mention Pac-10 All-Freshman honors ... Scored in double-figures 12 times, with a career-high of 19 ... Did not play in the team's NCAA contest due to a concussion ... Invited to the 2006 U.S. under-20 national team trials in May.

AT URBAN HIGH SCHOOL

Outstanding career at Urban High School in San Francisco ...
