AZTEC HEADLINES

- San Diego State returns to the court this Saturday when it plays host to No. 19/14 South Carolina at Viejas Arena. Opening tip is scheduled for 1 p.m. PT.
- The Aztecs are coming off a narrow 48-45 defeat in their home opener against the University of San Diego in the annual city showdown last Monday.
- SDSU was led by junior Erimma Amarikwa, who finished with 13 points on 5-of-5 shooting and a 3-for-3 effort at the free-throw line.
- The Aztecs also received a decent contribution from sophomore Deidra Smith, who totaled six points and a career-high four blocked shots in her first start in a Scarlet and Black uniform, taking the place of injured senior Cierra Warren.
- The Gamecocks are the first ranked opponent the Aztecs will face since dropping an 80-72 decision to then-No. 14/13 Oklahoma State in the finals of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam last season.
- South Carolina is also the first of two SEC schools that San Diego State will play during its 2013-14 non-conference slate, with a road trip to No. 13/11 Texas A&M awaiting the Aztecs on Dec. 3.

#AztecWBB Set to Battle No. 19/14 South Carolina at Home on Saturday

San Diego State will square off against its first ranked opponent of the 2013-14 campaign when it welcomes South Carolina to "America's Finest City" on Saturday, Nov. 23. Game time is set for 1 p.m. PT at Viejas Arena.

The Gamecocks received a No. 19 ranking in the latest Associated Press poll and have climbed to No. 14 in the ESPN coaches poll.

The Aztecs will be looking avoid back-to-back home losses since falling to UCLA and CSU Bakersfield in November of 2010. That season also marked the last time the Scarlet and Black began a season with an 0-3 mark.

SDSU's last victory over a ranked foe occurred almost two years ago to the date when it knocked off No. 18 DePaul, 82-74, in the opening game of the Jack In The Box Rainbow Wahine Classic on Nov. 18, 2011, in Honolulu, Hawaii.

The Aztecs are 6-8 against Southeastern Conference members, including a 58-55 setback to South Carolina in the only previous meeting between the two schools on Nov. 28, 2009, at the U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam. SDSU entered the contest with a No. 23 AP ranking, but committed 20 turnovers in the upset loss.

The Aztecs last defeated an SEC team a year ago when they downed Auburn 78-57 in the opener of the OMNI Hotels Classic on Nov. 23, 2012, in Boulder, Colo.

Scouting the Gamecocks

South Carolina raised its record to 5-0 on the season after posting a convincing 68-43 victory at intrastate rival Clemson on Wednesday night. Against the Tigers, four of the Gamecocks' five starters reached double figures in scoring, including junior forward Aleighsa Welch, who led all players with 17 points and added game-highs of 10 rebounds and four blocks, followed by sophomore guard Tiffany Mitchell, who contributed 14 points, six rebounds and a game-best four assists, while junior center Elem Ibiam and sophomore guard Khadijah Sessions notched 10 points apiece.

A second-team all-SEC selection last year, Welch is averaging a double-double so far this season with 14.6 points and 10.6 rebounds per contest, while Ibiam (13.6 ppg), Mitchell (12.4 ppg) and freshman Alaina Coates (12.4 ppg) have also produced double-digit point scoring averages.

As a team, South Carolina is shooting 49.0 percent from the floor, including a 32.5 percent clip from three-point range and 58.4 percent from the free-throw line. Defensively, the Gamecocks have limited their opponents to a paltry 31.0 percent on field goal attempts while maintaining a +18.6 rebounding advantage. Not surprisingly, South Carolina is outscoring its foes by an average margin of 33.2 points.

Now in her sixth year, head coach Dawn Staley has compiled a 97-66 record at the helm of Gamecocks program, highlighted by a pair of NCAA tournament berths over the past two seasons, including a Sweet 16 appearance during the 2011-12 campaign. Prior to her arrival in the Palmetto State, Staley coached eight seasons at Temple University from 2000-08, guiding the Owls to the NCAA tournament on six occasions.

A three-time Kodak All-American during her collegiate career at Virginia from 1989-92, Staley won a trio of gold medals as a member of the USA Basketball squad at the Summer Olympics in 1996, 2000 and 2004. She was also named to seven all-star teams at the professional level during a 10-year career in the ABL and WNBA.

Stacie Terry coached against the Gamecocks twice during her tenure as an assistant at LSU, with the Lady Tigers defeating their SEC counterparts on both occasions in 2011 and 2012.

With a Victory...

An SDSU win over South Carolina on Saturday will mean:

- Stacie Terry picks up her first career head coaching victory.
- The Aztecs even the all-time series at one game apiece.
- SDSU defeats a ranked opponent for the first time since 2011 when it beat No. 18 DePaul at the Jack In The Box Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii.
- The Aztecs knock off an SEC school for the second year in a row.
- SDSU moves to 28-26 in regular-season games played in November dating back to the 2003-04 campaign.

Dissecting the Slow Start

The fact that San Diego State sits at 0-3 for the first time since the beginning of the 2010-11 campaign can be at least partially attributed to the following factors:

► **Turnovers** - The Aztecs are committing an average of nearly 10 more turnovers more per game (26.0-16.3) than their foes this season, compared to last year when they were just one of three teams in the Mountain West to finish with a positive turnover margin (+2.9), along with Fresno State and Colorado State. Opponents have capitalized on SDSU's miscues by maintaining a combined 76-36 advantage in points off turnovers.

► **Offensive Rebounds** - The Aztecs are getting outrebounded on the offensive glass by an average margin of 20.3-9.0 during the first three games. As a result, SDSU's foes own a collective 51-27 advantage in second-chance points this year.

► **Experience** - The Aztecs' starting lineup against USD featured five players who have combined for just nine starts in an SDSU uniform prior to Monday. With that lack of experience, growing pains are certainly inevitable.

Despite the adversity, the Aztecs have lost their first three games by a scant 11 points. The youthful SDSU squad has displayed much resiliency during the early part of the season, nearly overcoming a pair of 19-point deficits in its first two games. In fact, the Aztecs owned late leads at Sacramento State and against USD, only to cede go-ahead three-pointers by the opposition.

The Last Time Out - USD at SDSU

San Diego State was saddled with its third straight hard-luck defeat last Monday after falling to the University of San Diego, 48-45, in the annual city showdown at Viejas Arena.

With the Aztecs clinging to a slim 45-43 lead in the defensive struggle, the Toreros' Amy Kame drained a three-point basket from the top of the key to put the visitors up for good at 46-45 with 1:32 left on the clock.

SDSU (0-3) had a chance to force overtime on its last possession after USD (3-0) sank two of four free throws

in the closing minute. However, Ahjalee Harvey's three-point attempt from the right corner was off the mark, spoiling the Aztecs' 2013-14 home opener.

In a season that has featured a plethora of statistical anomalies thus far, SDSU posted a higher field-goal percentage than its opponent for the third consecutive outing. The Aztecs shot 36.7 percent (18-49) from the perimeter, compared to USD's 31.8 percent clip (21-66). However, the Scarlet and Black was outrebounded by a 42-37 margin, including a 23-9 spread on the offensive glass. The Toreros capitalized on those opportunities, outscoring SDSU 21-8 in second-chance points.

In addition, the Aztecs lost the turnover battle as USD parlayed 22 miscues by the host school into 18 points, while SDSU was only able to muster nine points off 14 Torero blunders.

Individually, the Aztecs were led by junior Erimma Amarikwa, who totaled 13 points on 5-of-5 shooting and a 3-for-3 effort at the free-throw line to go with a team-high tying six rebounds. Elsewhere, Harvey contributed eight points, including two triples, while junior Desi Culberson knocked down a pair of threes as well to finish with six points of her own.

The Aztecs led 7-6 at the 14:19 mark of the first half following one of Harvey's aforementioned treys, before USD fashioned a 9-0 run over the ensuing 4:49, capped by two consecutive Brooke Jelniker jumpers. SDSU missed eight straight shots during that span until Amarikwa sank back-to-back layups to help the Aztecs answer right back with a 9-0 blitz of their own. After Culberson buried a three-pointer with four minutes left before intermission, SDSU trailed by just one at 17-16.

However, USD was able to maintain the upper hand in the closing minutes as Kame and Malina Hood converted baskets sandwiched around a jumper by sophomore Deidra Smith to increase the lead back to four at 22-18 with 2:04 to go. After the two sides exchanged turnovers and missed field goals, Culberson dialed up from beyond the arc once again with 44 seconds on the clock to give the contest its 22-21 score at the break.

USD built a pair of five-point leads early in the second half, including a 28-23 spread following a Kame jumper with nearly three minutes elapsed in the period. Moments later, Amarikwa finished off an old-fashioned three-point play; senior Danesha Long sank a free throw, while freshman Ariell Bostick hit a layup to give the hosts a 29-28 advantage with 14:56 to go.

The two sides fought for strategic control of the game over the next 9:14, with USD maintaining a 41-38 lead following a jumper by Hood at the 5:42 mark. However, Amarikwa scored the next four points on a layup and two foul shots to put SDSU back in front 42-41 with four minutes remaining. On the Toreros' next possession, Smith blocked three straight shots; however, the Aztecs were unable to secure the rebound on each occasion as Kame soon made the hosts pay by nailing a jumper from the right baseline with the shot clock running down.

Smith answered with a basket on SDSU's next foray up the court, while sophomore Deajanae Scurry hit one of two free throws shortly thereafter to up the Aztec lead to 45-43 with 2:22 left on the clock, setting the stage for Kame's clutch shot.

Kame, who tallied the Toreros' lone three-point make of the night, finished with 16 points to lead USD, while Jelniker chipped in 12 points of her own in the victory.

Noting the USD Game

- The visiting team has now won four straight in the crosstown series.
- Both sides were held under 50 points for the first time in series history.
- Monday's result marked just the eighth time in 37 all-time meetings in which the margin of victory was five points or less.
- The Aztec bench outscored the Torero reserves 27-10.
- For the third straight game, SDSU held the opposition to under 40 percent shooting from the floor, but ended up with a loss. Last year, the Aztecs were 27-2 when limiting their foes to a field-goal percentage of less than 40 percent.
- For the first time this season, SDSU did not attempt a free throw in the first half.
- Junior Desi Culberson connected on two three-pointers after making just three during the entire 2012-13 campaign.
- Sophomore Deidra Smith made her first start in an SDSU uniform, recording a career-high four blocks in place of the injured Cierra Warren.
- Freshman Ariell Bostick made her first-ever start for the Scarlet and Black, tying for game-high honors with four assists while adding two points and three rebounds.
- Freshman Alyssa Lawrence saw her first game action for SDSU, posting one rebound in nine minutes.

San Diego State head coach Stacie Terry inked her first pair of recruits last week with the signing of Cheyenne Greenhouse (Riverside, Calif.) and Lexy Thorderson (Castle Rock, Colo.) to National Letters of Intent. The two high school seniors are set to join the Aztecs for the 2014-15 season.

Greenhouse signs with SDSU out of Canyon Springs High School, where she captured CIF Division 1A co-player of the year honors as a junior last season after leading the Cougars to the Southern Section championship and a berth in the semifinals of the CIF regional tournament.

A 5-11 guard, Greenhouse averaged 18.4 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 2.1 steals during the 2012-13 campaign, earning first-team all-state CIF Division 1A recognition while landing a spot on MaxPreps all-state first team.

"Cheyenne is going to be very important to us because she has can play multiple positions," Terry said. She will add tremendous athleticism to our program with her great leaping ability. Cheyenne is also a very intelligent player and her basketball IQ is off the charts."

Greenhouse makes her signing official as a three-star recruit, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. A three-time all-Inland Valley League selection for head coach Gail Hale at Canyon Springs, Greenhouse also brings three years of club experience with her to The Mesa, having played for Cal Swish in 2011, followed by a two-year stint with the West Coast Premier program. She intends to study biology or pre-medicine at San Diego State.

Thorderson, meanwhile, garnered first-team all-Continental Leagues accolades as a junior last year at Rock Canyon High School after averaging a team-best 16.1 points to go along with 5.7 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 1.3 steals. Under the tutelage of head coach Robbie Ballard, the 6-0 guard/forward received Colorado 5A honorable mention all-state distinction on two occasions in 2011 and 2013.

In a game against eventual state champion Regis Jesuit last February, Thorderson scored 32 points to earn player of the game honors by MaxPreps. Earlier in the season, she also gained recognition as the Denver Post's female student-athlete of the week.

"Lexy's addition will enable us to extend our offense because she is deadly from three-point range," Terry said. "Her ability to knock down that jumper will also help open up the game for our post players."

Thorderson, who also competed at the USA Basketball U16 national team trials in 2011, has a basketball pedigree in her family. Her father Eric Thorderson played collegiately at Wayne State (Mich.) from 1980-85, while two of her sisters, Ali and Abby, earned varsity letters at Weber State. She is undecided on a major at San Diego State, but is considering a career in physical therapy and physical education.

Noting the Newcomers

Of the 12 student-athletes on the current roster, five players will be wearing an Aztec uniform for the first time this season. Cierra Warren practiced with the squad last year but did not compete after transferring from Louisville, while Deidra Smith utilized her redshirt campaign as well, following her transfer from Boston College. In addition, sophomore Deajanae Scurry missed the latter half of the 2012-13 campaign to concentrate on academics.

With San Diego State losing nearly 67 percent of its scoring offense from a year ago, three true freshmen look to gain significant experience this season. Guard

Veasley, who enjoyed a successful playing career at UCLA, returns to her Southern California roots after two productive stops as an assistant at Tulsa and Colorado. While at CU, Veasley played a pivotal role as the team's recruiting coordinator, helping to land three top-40 classes.

Aztecs Garner MW Preseason Honors

San Diego State received three preseason Mountain West individual honors on Oct. 15, as forward Erimma Amarikwa was named to the all-conference team, center Cierra Warren was selected newcomer of the year, while guard Chloe Johnson was tabbed the MW preseason freshman of the year.

As a team, the Aztecs were picked to finish third in the MW preseason poll, which was conducted in a combined panel of the league's 11 head coaches and select conference media members. SDSU collected 196 points and picked up two first-place votes, trailing second-place Wyoming, which received 212 points and four first-place votes, while preseason favorite Fresno State garnered 238 points and 17 first-place votes.

Basketball Performance Center On the Docket

San Diego State Director of Athletics Jim Sterk announced on Nov. 12 that a proposed 23,500-square-foot basketball performance center is under design, with a plan to break ground on the project in late spring 2014.

The \$14.5 million facility, which will be located just south of the Fowler Athletics Center and east of the football practice fields, will include two full-length courts, eight baskets, locker rooms, film rooms, team lounges, athletic training room and coaches locker rooms to help support the Aztec men's and women's championship basketball programs.

Although a majority of the funds have been pledged, fundraising continues for the project which is tentatively scheduled to be completed in 2015.

"This is an exciting day to be able to announce this project is moving forward," Sterk said. "It is a project that will greatly benefit our already successful men's and women's basketball programs. It is also an important day because we are going public with our drive to raise funds for the project and hope that the community that has enjoyed San Diego State basketball will get behind this project."

"The basketball performance center is more than just a building, it is our classroom," SDSU women's basketball head coach Stacie Terry said. "The facility will provide an opportunity for our student-athletes to enhance their individual games, which will in turn benefit our program. It also keeps San Diego State competing at the highest level not only in basketball, but in recruiting as well."

What's New in the Mountain West

With the addition of newcomers San José State and Utah State, the Mountain West will have a different look for the third year in a row. Following the departures of Brigham Young and Utah in 2011, the league added Boise State, while Fresno State and Nevada joined the circuit last year after the defection of TCU. The latest realignment means the Aztecs will now have 18 league games this season instead of 16, with the Scarlet and Black facing Wyoming (home) and Nevada (road) just once, while completing a home-and-home slate with the rest of the conference.

The Mountain West Championship, scheduled for March 10-15, 2014, has also been revamped to include three games with the six lowest-seeded teams during the first round. In addition, the four surviving squads from the quarterfinals will have two days to prepare for the semifinal round.

Two For The Show

Former SDSU All-Americans Courtney Clements and Chelsea Hopkins both earned roster spots with the WNBA this past season after completing their illustrious careers for the Scarlet and Black following the 2012-13 campaign. Clements joined the Atlanta Dream as a free-agent rookie last May, while Hopkins was signed by the San Antonio Silver Stars in September.

Clements appeared in 30 games for Atlanta in 2013, becoming the first former Aztec to compete for a WNBA title after the Dream advanced to finals against the eventual champion Minnesota Lynx. The Long Beach native totaled 59 points (2.2/gm) on the year to go with 26 rebounds, eight assists and five steals. Against the Seattle Storm on July 14, Clements recorded a season-best 12 points before logging season highs of five rebounds and 29 minutes played vs. San Antonio on Sept. 15.

Hopkins, meanwhile, averaged 14.3 minutes in three games during a late-season tour of duty with the Silver Stars, finishing with six points, six rebounds and five assists.

SDSU will return to the court on Saturday, Nov. 30 when it travels to UC Santa Barbara for a clash at The Thunderdome beginning at 2 p.m. PT. Last season, the Aztecs defeated the Gauchos 69-46 at Viejas Arena in the first round of the WNIT.

Stacie Terry was named the eighth head coach in the history of the San Diego State women's basketball program on May 15, 2013. A native of San Diego, Terry gained a wealth of experience as an assistant coach at the Division I level over the past 14 years, including the last five under head coach Nikki Caldwell, who transferred UCLA into a powerhouse before restoring LSU to national prominence.

During Terry's two seasons at LSU, the Lady Tigers compiled a 45-23 overall record and earned two NCAA tournament bids, including a Sweet 16 appearance during the 2012-13 campaign. This past season, the Lady Tigers also posted six victories against ranked opponents and finished with their second-highest scoring average (69.0) in the last seven years. Under Terry's guidance, forward LaShondra Barrett garnered first-team all-Southeastern Conference accolades and received honorable mention All-America distinction in 2012 before becoming a first-round draft choice of the WNBA's Washington Mystics.

"I am honored and humbled to be the next head coach at San Diego State University," Terry said. "I want to thank Jim (Sterk) and his staff for this amazing opportunity. This is such a special place for me. Not only is this my dream job, but it is home. SDSU is a first class university that has all the resources in place to be successful. I am so eager to get started and confident that we can continue the winning tradition that Aztec supporters have become accustomed to both on and off the court."

Prior to her arrival at LSU, Terry served as an assistant under Caldwell at UCLA from 2008-11, helping the Bruins gain national acclaim with a pair of NCAA tournament appearances. During Terry's tenure, UCLA posted 72 overall victories, as the 2010-11 squad finished with a 28-5 record, setting a school record for fewest losses in a single season to go with a No. 7 national ranking. In addition, the Bruins signed the fourth-ranked recruiting class that season, according to ESPN HoopGurlz, while Terry helped mentor first-team all-Pac-10 performers in Doreena Campbell, Darxia Morris and Jasmine Dixon, a 2012 honorable mention AP All-America selection, as well as all-conference freshman honorees Atonye Nyin-gifa and Markel Walker.

Terry spent the 2007-08 campaign at Southern Mississippi, as the Golden Eagles posted a 21-14 record and earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). While at Southern Miss, Terry spearheaded the development and coordination of the Lady Eagle recruiting campaign. Her responsibilities also included working with the perimeter players, scouting opponents and film breakdown, as well as coordinating all of the team's community service events.

Terry also coached for three seasons from 2004-07 as an assistant under Hall of Fame head coach Theresa Grentz at Illinois, where the Fighting Illini had three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 25 in

the nation, according to Blue Star Basketball, and made three consecutive trips to the WNIT. Her primary duties included defensive instruction and working with the perimeter players.

In addition, Terry coached at Dayton during the 2003-04 season following a three-year stint at Louisville from 2000-03. With the Cardinals, Terry's responsibilities encompassed recruiting, scouting, player development, summer camps and serving as a liaison for the program's community service outreach. Louisville captured the Conference USA regular-season title and earned a trip to the NCAA tournament in 2001 before making a WNIT appearance in 2002. She also assisted in signing the nation's 21st-ranked recruiting class in 2002-03, according to All-Star Girls Report. Terry recruited and coached all-Conference USA honoree Lori Nero, a draft choice of the WNBA's Houston Comets, as well as Sara Nord, who finished her collegiate career as the Cardinals' all-time assist leader and ranks among the top 15 scorers in school history.

Terry enjoyed a successful collegiate playing career at Texas-Arlington, winning four varsity letters from 1994-98 under head coach Mike Dean. She earned first-team all-Southland Conference honors after leading the Mavericks in scoring with 17.4 points per game as a senior in 1997-98. Terry scored 1,169 points during her career at UTA and still ranks among the school's top 10 in three-point field goals made (third), assists (sixth), steals (seventh) and free-throw percentage (10th). She is just one of 17 players in Maverick history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau, while her .335 career three-point field-goal percentage is also a school and Southland Conference career record.

Terry played one season of professional basketball in Warsaw, Poland, averaging 12.0 points and 6.0 assists with the Polonia Phoenix, before returning to Texas-Arlington to begin her coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1999.

Terry, who graduated from El Capitan High, stills holds the Vaqueros' career scoring record and was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2008.
