Media desiring to cover Aztec practices on campus can park in the Viejas Arena lot L and obtain a special parking pass at the Viejas Arena office. Media parking (via permit) will be provided for all home games in Parking Structure IV, adjacent to Viejas Arena.

Directions To Viejas Arena

Take I-8 East to the College Avenue exit. Take College Avenue south towards SDSU. Turn right on Montezuma Road. Turn right on 55th Street. Viejas Arena is on the right-hand side.

Practice And Interviews

Media wishing to attend practice should contact the Aztec media relations department at least one day in advance.

Head coach Beth Burns and the players are generally available to meet with the media following each workout, as requested. Coaches and players are also available to conduct television and radio interviews, which must be set up through the media relations office at 619-594-2576.

Please request all interviews with a minimum of 24 hours notice. San Diego State players and coaches will not be available for interviews on game days until postgame.

SDSU BASKETBALL NETWORK



For the ninth straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of regular season and conference tournament games over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU graduate Chris Elio (play-by-play) begins his third season with the team and is a familiar voice in the San Diego area. He currently plays host to a daily sports talk radio show, "The World of Sports According to Chris Elio", on the all-sports station, XTRA Sports 1360 AM.

Elio started his career in sports talk in San Diego on XTRA Sports 690 in the summer of 1994. He has experience doing play-by-play for a variety of different sports at every level, including stints with the Aztec football (1985), baseball (1998-99) and men's basketball (2006-07) squads. The last two years, Elio has served as the color analyst for the SDSU football broadcasts.

From 1996-2006, he was the voice of the San Diego Gulls hockey team and has called the action for the San Diego Sockers (indoor soccer), San Diego Spirit (outdoor soccer), San Diego Wildcards (CBA) and San Diego Riptide (arena football). Elio also has experience broadcasting high school CIF football and basketball games since 2000.

Elio is a 1985 graduate of San Diego State with a bachelor's degree in journalism, where he spent two seasons with the baseball team from 1980-81 as a left-handed pitcher. A former sports editor at the *Daily Aztec*, he resides in Rancho San Diego with his wife, Lori.

For the fourth consecutive year, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

MWC TELEVISION PACKAGE

With the addition of The Mtn. - The MountainWest Sports Network to DIRECTV on August 27, 2008, the Mountain West Conference enjoyed unprecedented national television exposure in 2008-09 with 48 football, 103 men's basketball and 32 women's basketball contests airing across the country through a combination of telecasts on The Mtn., CBS College Sports Network (formerly CSTV) and VERSUS. In addition to the new satellite carriage agreement, The Mtn. has been available to cable subscribers in the MWC footprint since it first aired in 2006-07.

On Aug. 26, 2004, College Sports Television (CSTV) and the Mountain West Conference announced a visionary partnership that revolutionized the college sports landscape. The landmark agreement was the first NCAA Division I football and men's basketball conference-wide deal for CSTV and provided the network exclusive rights to all Conference events, including cable and satellite television coverage, national over-the-air and satellite radio, video-on-demand and online broadcast rights.

A succession of events since the fall of 2004 has improved the television model, including CSTV's joint venture with Comcast SportsNet to create The Mtn., and CBS Corporation's purchase of CSTV. CBS acquired CSTV in January 2006, and on Feb. 12, 2008, incorporated CSTV's cable, broadcast and online activities into its world-famous brand as the CBS College Sports Network (CBS C). The Mtn. is co-owned by CBS College Sports Network and Comcast SportNet.

The relationship with Comcast SportNet also delivered a new national broadcast partner in VERSUS. The MWC was the first exclusive college programming provider for the Com-

cast-owned entity, with football and both men's and women's basketball games. The CBS C/MWC partnership has guaranteed greater levels of television exposure for all league sports and has resoundingly met the fundamental goals of more exposure and preferred start times and dates.

In the summer of 2006, the centerpiece of this historic relationship was realized with the launch of The Mtn. - the first sports network dedicated to serving a single collegiate athletic conference. The Mtn. provides sports fans blanket coverage of MWC athletics across multiple sports, including football, men's and women's basketball, and men's and women's Olympic sports. The Mtn. features more than just live games and has added its own original programming. Fans get a comprehensive array of news, features and analysis about their favorite MWC teams and players. More than 17,000 hours of MWC programming have aired on The Mtn. since the network's launch on Sept. 1, 2006, and over 250 MWC



events are shown live on annually through a combination of telecasts on The Mtn., CBS College Sports Network and VERSUS. CBS College Sports Network is currently in 30 million homes, and available in over 84 million nationwide. VERSUS is in more than 74 million households across the U.S.

The MWC has remained steadfast in its mission to promote the league's athletic events to national and regional television audiences and will continue to grow its new TV model. Previously, ESPN served as the league's inaugural official television partner, while in-house productions guaranteed coverage for several MWC Olympic sports. Through the league's first 10 years, excluding institutional local packages, more than 1,350 football, volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball events have aired on television, with 225 football games and over 260 men's basketball contests broadcast nationally.



In 2006-07, the Mountain West Conference had 32 women's basketball games on regional and national television, while in 2007-08, The Mtn. televised 25 live women's basketball games. The network also produces halftime and post-game shows during the season.

A year ago, 33 games involving Mountain West Conference teams were televised nationally with 26 games shown on The Mtn., six games live on CBS C, while the MWC tournament championship game, between the Aztecs and Utes, was seen live on VERSUS.

The 2009-10 women's basketball broadcast schedule currently features 34 games on national television, including a record seven involving the Aztecs. Twenty-one games will be shown on The Mtn. - MountainWest Sports Network. Five games will be broadcast live on CBS College Sports Network (CBS C), while the final game of the MWC Championship can be seen live on VERSUS.

The television schedule tips off Saturday, Nov. 21, with San Diego State hosting Arizona at 6:30 p.m. PT. Conference play begins Tuesday, Jan. 5, with Wyoming facing Colorado State in Fort Collins on The Mtn. at 6 p.m. MT.

The Mtn. is carried nationally by DIRECTV (Channel 616) and numerous cable operators representing over 200 municipalities in nine states. CBS College Sports Network is widely available on cable systems across the country and via satellite on DIRECTV (Channel 613) and Dish Network (Channel 152).

SEASON PREVIEW NOTES

PRESEASON HONORS

Coming off its most successful campaign in 14 years, the Aztec women's basketball team received a number of pre-season accolades.

As a team, San Diego State was picked 22nd nationally in both *Lindy's College Basketball* and *Sporting News's* pre-season top 25s, while it was tabbed No. 23 among the 64 teams to watch in 2009-10 by *ESPN.com's* Charlie Creme.

Individually, senior Jené Morris is up for three national player-of-the-year awards - the Wade Trophy, the Naismith Trophy and the John R. Wooden Award. Morris was an honorable mention State Farm Coaches' All-American in 2008-09, and is just the second player in MWC history to be named to either the Wade or Wooden preseason watch lists. She was also picked as a preseason third-team All-American by the *Sporting News*.

2008-09 REWIND

The San Diego State women's basketball team made a remarkable run in 2008-09, highlighted by its first NCAA appearance in 12 seasons, its first postseason victory in 14 years, a share of the regular-season league title and a return to the national spotlight.

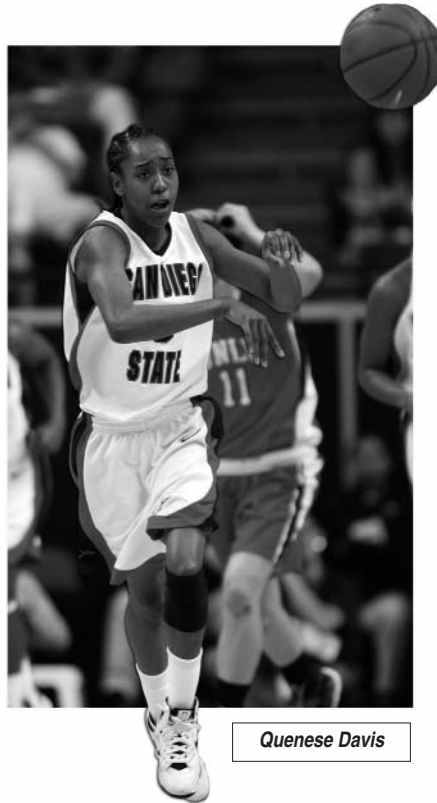
Below are a few of the accomplishments of last year's team:

- ◆ Posted the program's first 20-win season in 12 years, finishing with a 24-8 overall record and a 13-3 mark in Mountain West Conference play.
- ◆ Earned an at-large bid to the 2009 NCAA tournament, defeating DePaul in the first round for the program's first NCAA victory in 14 years (1994).
- ◆ Won a share of its first-ever Mountain West Conference regular season title. The Aztecs' previous best finish in the 10-year history of the MWC was tied for fifth in 2007-08.
- ◆ Tallied its first win over an AP ranked team in 14 years by defeating then No. 4 and unbeaten Texas, 60-55, to win the San Diego Surf 'N Slam tournament title.
- ◆ Earned votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll six times, a program first since 1997. SDSU ended with five votes in the final *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll.
- ◆ Advanced to its second consecutive MWC championship game, after failing to even win a game in the event's first eight seasons.
- ◆ Posted an unbeaten home regular season for just the second time in school history, going 14-0. The record jumped to 15-0 with the NCAA victory over DePaul, before ending against No. 2 Stanford.

THE YEAR IN NUMBERS

The Aztecs' success also translated into big numbers in the stat columns. Here are some of the 2008-09 team's statistical highlights:

- ◆ SDSU led the MWC in assists (15.16/g), steals (11.25/g), blocks (6.09/g) and turnover margin (+4.38), while ranking second in field-goal percentage (.422) and offensive rebounds (13.66/g). The Aztecs' 195 blocks were easily a conference record, beating the old mark of 166.
- ◆ SDSU ended the year ranked sixth nationally in blocks per game, 15th in steals and 19th in turnover margin.
- ◆ The Aztecs had 10 or more steals in 21 of 32 games, had five blocked shots in 22 of 32 games, shot above 40 percent in 19 outings and eclipsed the 20-assist barrier in seven contests.

- ◆ SDSU set school season records for most 3-pointers (155; prev. 140 in 2004-05) and most blocks (195; prev. 162 in 1988-89).

2008-09 ACCOLADES

The awards were aplenty for last year's Aztec squad, as several individuals were singled out for their achievement.

Guard Jené Morris was named an honorable mention State Farm Coaches' All-American, becoming just the third SDSU player so honored and the program's first since Falisha Wright in 1994. Morris was also tabbed the 2009 MWC Defensive Player of the Year and was selected first-team all-conference, MWC all-defensive team, MWC championship all-tournament team and four-time MWC player of the week.

Morris and center Paris Johnson became the first Aztecs to ever be named first-team all-Mountain West Conference in the league's 10-year history. Johnson also was a four-time league player of the week, WBCA honorable mention national player of the month and earned a nod on two non-conference all-tournament teams.

Johnson and Morris were joined on the MWC all-defensive squad by guard Quenese Davis, who was a second-team all-league choice and one-time player of the week.

Head coach Beth Burns was also acknowledged for the team's performance by being voted MWC coach of the year, the fourth time she has won such an award in her career.

INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT 2009-10

With the build up of what could be the most successful season in Aztec women's basketball history, here are a few things interesting things to look at in 2009-10:

- ◆ Three Aztecs are on pace to easily reach the 1,000-ca-

reer point mark this season. Senior Quenese Davis has 922 career points, followed by classmate Jené Morris with 919 points and junior Paris Johnson with 809 points.

The trio would be the first Aztecs to reach that mark since Jamey Cox did so in 2002-03. SDSU has only had 16 players in its program's history reach the 1,000-point barrier.

- ◆ SDSU has won 10 straight home MWC contests dating back to 2008, after going a perfect 8-0 in 2009. The Aztecs have won 16 straight home regular-season games and are 35-12 on their home court in the last three years.

- ◆ The Aztecs have 24 MWC wins in the last three seasons after having only 19 in the league's first seven years.

- ◆ Aztec head coach Beth Burns needs 11 more victories to reach the 300-win milestone in her career.

- ◆ With her school-record 94 blocked shots in 2008-09, SDSU's Paris Johnson had more blocks than four teams in the MWC and more than 159 of 328 in NCAA Division I.

- ◆ Senior point guard Quenese Davis became SDSU's all-time leader in career assists a year ago. She needs just one more helper to reach the 500 mark and already has 51 more than any other Aztec with a full season yet to play.

- ◆ SDSU will have a pair of sisters on the floor with Coco and Quenese Davis and Allison and Ashley Duffy. Paris Johnson's sister Desiree also played for the Aztecs from 2005-07.

- ◆ SDSU's home arena underwent a name change this past summer. The Aztecs' home court is now Viejas Arena at Aztec Bowl, after being Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl since the facility opened in 1997.

THE 2009-10 AZTECS

Back Again: San Diego State returns four starters, including senior guards Quenese Davis and Jené Morris, junior guard Coco Davis and junior center Paris Johnson. Six other letterwinners return in senior Kim Spinardi, juniors Allison Duffy and Jerica Williams and sophomores Candace Chambers, Gabrielle Clark and Kalena Tutt. Allison Duffy started 30 games as a redshirt freshman in 2007-08.

Noting The Newcomers: SDSU will get a huge boost in the front court from former Baylor transfer, junior Jessika Bradley, who sat out last year due to NCAA rules. The Aztecs also welcome 5-9 freshmen guards Ashley Duffy and Kiyana Stamps, who should both see playing time in their first year on The Mesa.

Arizona transfers, sophomores Courtney Clements and Malia Nahinu, will not be eligible to play this year, but will be assets to the team in practice.

The Schedule: Two home tournaments and a trip to the U.S. Virgin Islands highlight the San Diego State women's basketball team's highly-competitive 2009-10 schedule.

The Aztecs, who open the season on Nov. 13, will play host to the first-ever JHG Jam on Nov. 21, followed a month later by the fifth annual San Diego Surf 'N Slam, slated for Dec. 28 & 30.

SDSU biggest non-conference challenge will be in the Virgin Islands over the Thanksgiving break when the Aztecs take on preseason top 10 schools Notre Dame and Oklahoma.

MWC play begins Jan. 6 and the conference championships is set for March 9-13 in Las Vegas.
