San Diego State Plays Host to City Championship; Aztecs Put 7-0 Record on the Line Against Toreros

San Diego State (7-0), ranked 10th nationally in the RPI through Monday's games, looks to match its best start to a season in program history (covers 86 seasons) and give Steve Fisher the best start of his remarkable career as the Aztecs play host to crosstown rival San Diego (2-3) on Wednesday night at Cox Arena.

Game time is set for 7 p.m. and the contest will be carried locally by Channel 4 San Diego (no satellite coverage). The game can also be heard on the SDSU flagship, XX Sports Radio (1090-AM and 105.7-FM).

On Saturday, SDSU won its fourth game of the season by four points or less, claiming a 76-72 victory over previously unbeaten UC Santa Barbara.

The Aztecs trailed at intermission and faced an eight-point second half deficit, before rallying for their 12th consecutive regular-season victory.

Brandon Heath scored 23 of his game-high 29 points after halftime, connecting on 7-of-9 field goals and 4-of-5 three-point field goals after the break to help SDSU rally for the victory.

Senior Mohamed Abukar added 14 points and a game-high nine rebounds. Junior Jerome Habel added 14 points (7-of-12 shooting) and seven rebounds, while sophomore Lorenzo Wade chipped in with 13 points (6-of-10 shooting).

One reason for the fast start is that San Diego State continues to be one of the best shooting teams in the country. Through seven games, the Aztecs are shooting 52.9 percent from the field and an eye-popping 52.4 percent from beyond the arc. Through Sunday's games, SDSU led the country in three-point field goal percentage and was 14th nationally in field goal percentage.

San Diego fell to 2-3 on Sunday with a 64-49 loss at Texas-San Antonio. The Toreros have held opponents to 42.8 percent field goal shooting, including 34.3 percent from behind the arc.

This is the 38th meeting between the teams with San Diego State owning a 20-17 series advantage. Last season, San Diego halted San Diego State's three-game win streak in the series with a 90-80 decision at Jenny Craig Pavilion. The Aztecs have won the last two games played between the teams at Cox Arena.

Once again this season, SDSU is teaming up with Channel 4 San Diego to produce Aztec Sports Weekly.

The 30-minute sports magazine show highlights the week in San Diego State athletics. Each week head coach Steve Fisher and a men's basketball player will review the previous week's action and look ahead to upcoming games.

Storylines

▶ Senior guard **Brandon Heath**, one of 50 players on the preseason John Wooden Award watch list, has scored in double figures in 32 consecutive games, to tie the school record set by Zack Jones set from Nov. 28, 1980 to Dec. 8, 1981. Heath will look to break the record on Wednesday against San Diego, in the 100th game of his college career.

▶ **Steve Fisher** has 112 victories at San Diego State, tied for the third highest total in school history with Smokey Gaines. Fisher is six games over .500 in his Aztec career and although that may not sound very impressive, keep in mind that San Diego State compiled a 77-146 (34.5 percent) in the eight seasons prior to his arrival on The Mesa (averaging 9.6 wins per season) and that SDSU

went 16-35 in its first 51 games under Fisher (Aztecs are 96-71 since). At six games above .500 for his Aztec career (112-106), Fisher is at the high-water mark for his SDSU tenure. Prior to the recent run, his 1-0 mark was the only time he owned an above .500 record and at one point was 19 games below .500 at SDSU. In his remarkable career, Fisher has posted a 296-188 record.

▶ As of Tuesday morning, San Diego State was one of 36 remaining undefeated teams in the country. Of those 36 schools, only eight other schools have won as many contests as the Aztecs' seven (Butler, Clemson, Illinois, Maryland, Marquette, Missouri, Oklahoma State and Syracuse).

▶ As of Tuesday morning, San Diego State was 10th in the RPI ratings according to collegeapi.com. The Aztecs schedule to date was rated as the 43rd most difficult nationally (out of 336 teams). Last season, SDSU ended the campaign ranked 56th.

▶ San Diego State will put a couple of winning streaks on the line Wednesday against the Toreros, including a seven-game overall winning streak (13-game regular-season winning streak; excludes NCAA tournament loss to Indiana); a nine-game regular-season non-conference winning streak, a six-game homecourt winning streak and a seven-game non-conference homecourt win streak.

▶ San Diego State has put together one of the more remarkable streaks not only in school history, but one of the most impressive active runs in the country. The Aztecs have won seven straight games, 13 of their last 14 (13-1) and 23 of their last 26 (23-3) games dating back to Jan. 11, 2006. The three losses in that span have been by a total of 16 points (two-point loss to Utah, 10-point loss at Brigham Young (Aztecs trailed by four points with 91 seconds to play) and a four-point loss to Indiana in the NCAA Tournament (Aztecs led and had the ball with under one minute to play)).

▶ At 7-0, San Diego State has its best opening to a campaign since the 1984-85 squad opened the season 8-0. A victory on Wednesday would match San Diego State's best start to a campaign in 86 seasons of basketball on The Mesa. This is just the fourth time in 37 Division I seasons that the Aztecs have opened with seven consecutive victories (1971-72, 1982-83, 1984-85 and 2006-07). The first two times SDSU opened 7-0 (1971-72 and 1982-83) San Diego State finished 18-10, while the 1984-85 squad finished 23-8.

▶ The best sign for Aztec fans is what Steve Fisher's teams have accomplished after jumping out to a 5-0 start, let alone a 7-0 start. This season's 7-0 campaign matches the best start by a Steve Fisher coached team. Now in his 16th full season, Fisher has guided four teams (including this season's Aztec squad) to at least a 5-0 start and as you might suspect, his clubs have gone on to accomplish some pretty good things. Those three previous teams have all advanced to post-season play, advancing to the national championship game in 1992, the NCAA regional final in 1994 and winning the postseason NIT in 1997, en route to posting a cumulative 73-28 record (72.3 percent). Below is a look at Fisher's quick starts. Not included in the list since it did not start a season is his magical run in 1989 when he took the reigns of the Michigan program just prior to the NCAA Tournament and guided the Wolverines to their only basketball national championship (going 6-0).

The two schools will be meeting for the 38th time with San Diego State holding a slight 20-17 edge in the all-time series... San Diego won the last meeting, 90-80, at Jenny Craig Pavilion, but SDSU has won the last two games played at Cox Arena... The Aztecs are 15-8 when they are the designated home team... Senior Brandon Heath has accounted for 33.6 percent of San Diego State's offense in the three games he has played in (25.7 ppg)... ing back to last season.

▶ San Diego State has opened 7-0 despite playing less than full strength. The Aztecs have already had four players miss games due to injury (Matt Thomas and Kyle Spain) or team suspension (Brett Hoerner and Jerome Habel). The four players have combined to miss 14 games to date.

▶ San Diego State is quickly showing that it has not forgotten how to win the close games. The Aztecs have already posted four wins this season by four points or less and now owns a 13-4 record in games decided by eight points or less since the beginning of the 2005-06 season. San Diego State has won seven straight games decided by five points or less.

▶ It is easy to look at seniors Brandon Heath and Mohamed Abukar and think that San Diego State is a team full of upperclassmen but that is not the case. In fact, of the 35 starts so far this season, the senior class has 14, the junior class has two and the sophomore class has 19. Of the 10 scholarship players that have seen action this season, five are sophomores, two are seniors, two are true freshmen and one junior.

▶ **Brandon Heath**, who earned his school record sixth Mountain West Conference player of the week honor earlier this season, continues to close in on the Aztec career scoring record. The John Wooden Award candidate, has 1,698 career points, just 37 points shy of Anthony Watson in second place and 148 points shy of Michael Cage atop the career charts. Oh by the way, in addition to graduating a semester early next month, he leads the team in scoring (20.9) and is second on the team in assists (3.3). Not that you need more numbers to track the importance of Heath to the Aztecs, but the right box contains a few numbers to ponder for Wednesday.

▶ **Mohamed Abukar**, has started and reached double figures in six of seven games this season for the Aztecs. The best news for SDSU fans is that the senior has appeared to have left his problems with shin splints in the past. Off-season surgery kept him off the basketball court for much of the summer, but Abukar opened the season by playing 100 minutes in the three games in three days in Moraga (something he would not have been able to do a year ago). He is averaging 16.4 points, 6.4 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game. After opening a very uncharacteristically 4-for-12 from the field against Murray State, he responded with four straight games of 50 percent or better field goal shooting. In fact in his last six contests, Abukar is an impressive 34-for-66 (51.5 percent) from the field, including 6-for-9 from three-point range. With his seven starts this season, the Aztecs are now 24-4 when Abukar is in the start-

ing lineup. One area of improvement this season for the senior has been getting to the free throw line. Abukar has 39 free throw attempts through six games (he had 86 attempts all of last season) and is connecting on a rather gaudy 84.6 percent.

► After missing the first four games of the season due to a team suspension, **Jerome Habel**, made quite a splash in his opening week as an Aztec. The junior scored a game high 23 points on 10-of-11 shooting from the field off the bench in his first game against California. In his first career start against UC Riverside, Habel had six points and a game-high 10 rebounds in 25 minutes of action. Through three games he is averaging 14.3 points and 8.5 rebounds.

San Diego State vs. San Diego: The Series

► Wednesday night's meeting between the Aztecs and Toreros marks the ninth consecutive season in which the two teams have squared off and it will be the 38th meeting between the two teams since their first game back in 1962. The Aztecs hold a 20-17 advantage overall with a 15-8 record when they are the "home team." SDSU is 2-2 versus USD in Cox Arena and has won the last two contests on its home court.

► The last time these two teams met at Cox Arena was on Dec. 1, 2004 when the Aztecs handed the Toreros an 83-63 defeat in front of 6,132. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath led all scorers with 26 points and had a game-high five assists, while Chris Manker notched 22 points with six rebounds and three blocked shots for SDSU.

► Although the overall series is close (SDSU with a 20-17 lead), the history can be broken into four periods: the early years (in which SDSU owned a 4-3 advantage), the Aztec dominance (SDSU was 11-2 from 1975-84), the Torero dominance (USD was 11-2 from 1985-2001) and recently with the Aztecs winning the three of the last four games.

► Senior guard Brandon Heath has had an impressive career versus the Toreros. In three games versus USD, Heath has averaged 25.7 points per game and is shooting above 54 percent from the field (52.6 percent from three-point distance). Heath is the only member of the current squad to have more than nine points in his career versus San Diego and only Heath and junior Matt Thomas have played more than one career game versus USD. In Heath's three games versus USD, he has scored a combined 77 points and as a team the Aztecs have scored a total of 229 points. In those three games he has accounted for 33.6 percent of SDSU's offense.

► San Diego State enters the city rivalry game undefeated for the first time since the Dec. 2, 1995 game (USD won 69-65) when the Aztecs carried a 2-0 record into the contest. The best undefeated record SDSU had entering the city championship game prior to this season was a 4-0 mark for the Dec. 9, 1982 game (SDSU won 47-45) and Dec. 15, 1966 game (SDSU won 55-50 in overtime). At 7-0, San Diego State will enter this season's game seven games above .500 matching the school record in that category from when the Aztecs entered the Jan. 25, 1972 game with an 11-4 mark (SDSU won 87-69).

Aztecs vs. The West Coast Conference

► San Diego State is 74-89 against current members of the West Coast Conference, posting records of 31-26 vs. Loyola Marymount, 20-17 vs. San Diego, 17-35 vs. Pepperdine, 3-3 vs. Saint Mary's, 2-5 vs. Portland, 1-2 vs. San Francisco, 0-1 vs. Gonzaga.

► Steve Fisher owns a 11-9 mark against current members of the WCC, with a majority of those contests occurring dur-

San Diego 90, San Diego State 80 | Nov. 30, 2005 | Jenny Craig Pavilion | Att.: 5,012

SAN DIEGO -- Ross DeRogatis scored 20 points, including a go-ahead three-pointer in the second half to lift the University of San Diego to a 90-80 victory over SDSU at Jenny Craig Pavilion.

The loss ended the Aztecs' three game winning streak against the Toreros, who connected on 11-of-21 shots from beyond the arc, including a 7-for-10 clip in the second half.

USD grabbed a 27-19 lead in the first half, before SDSU stormed back with 15 unanswered points and took a 38-35 lead into the half. The Aztecs, however, could not sustain the momentum in the second half as DeRogatis' trey put the Toreros ahead to stay 42-41 with 16:30 left.

SDSU kept it close, pulling to within 56-55 after Brandon Heath nailed a jumper with 9:50 remaining. USD then went on a 15-4 run over the next four minutes to build a 71-59 cushion.

The Aztecs never got closer than eight points the rest of the way and were denied a fourth straight victory in the crosstown rivalry.

Heath led all scorers with 24 points. Marcus Slaughter tallied 23, marking the 30th time in the last 31 games the junior forward has reached double figures.

John Sharper added 12 points off the bench, while Mohamed Camara had his first career double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

Due to injury, Trimaine Davis missed his first game action since March 11, 2004, a span of 33 contests.

San Diego State 83, San Diego 63 | Dec. 1, 2004 | Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl | Att.: 6,132

SAN DIEGO -- Sophomore guard Brandon Heath scored a game-high 26 points and added a game-high five assists as San Diego State defeated San Diego, 83-63, at Cox Arena.

The victory was the third in a row for the Aztecs and the third straight over the Toreros. The 20-point margin of victory was the largest in the series for SDSU since a 23-point victory on Feb. 25, 1975. The Aztecs led for the final 28:04.

With the 20-point margin of victory, San Diego State won by a wider margin than the previous four meetings combined (17).

Senior forward Chris Manker continued his impressive play with 22 points, six rebounds and a career-best three blocked shots for the game. Junior guard John Sharper posted a career-high 13 points and sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter had his second double-double of the season with 12 points and a game-high 12 rebounds.

San Diego was led by Brett Melton's 16 points and Brice Vounang's 15 points and team-high six rebounds.

The Aztecs enjoyed advantages in nearly every statistical category, including field goal percentage (53.6-41.9 percent), free throws attempted (18-5) and rebounding (38-24).

Among the National Leaders

Although official NCAA statistics have not been released as of yet, the group at Stats, Inc., who provide daily updates, have the Aztecs ranked among the national leaders in several categories. All stats below are through games of Sunday, November 26.

San Diego State ranks first nationally in three-point field goal percentage, having connected on an astonishing 52.4 percent of its attempts (44-of-84). Richie Williams (8-of-13), Mohamed Abukar (6-of-9) and Jon Pastorek (4-of-6) have all connected on at least 61.5 percent of their attempts to date. Brandon Heath has also chipped in, connecting on 21-of-42 for 50.0 percent.

The Aztecs rank 14th in overall field goal percentage at 52.9 percent. Every player on the Aztecs squad except Mohamed Abukar, Brandon Heath, walk-on Brandon Martin and Kyle Spain is currently shooting above 50.0 percent from the field. San Diego State has cleared 50 percent from the field five times in seven contests this season. The Aztecs have also passed the 60 percent field goal shooting plateau twice this season.

The Aztecs lead the nation in three-point field goal percentage and are second in field goal percentage among teams that have played at least seven games.

Cage Watch

With 1,698 career points, Brandon Heath ranks third all time on San Diego State's scoring list. The senior needs only 37 points to tie Anthony Watson for second place and 148 points to tie Aztec great and former NBA star Michael Cage

for No. 1 in school history.

It's only fitting that Heath is pursuing Cage's record as the Los Angeles native last year became the first Aztec since Cage to be named an *Associated Press* All-American and conference player of the year in the same season.

On Target

Steve Fisher has said on more than one occasion that the Aztecs can put the ball in the basket and right now they are proving it. For the season, SDSU is shooting 52.9 percent, including 52.4 percent from beyond the arc. Through seven games, San Diego State has shot above 50 percent from the field five times and above 60 percent in two of its last four contests. From distance, SDSU opened the campaign by hitting at least 50 percent of its three-pointers in four consecutive games.

Shooting well has been a good trend for the Aztecs, as they have shot 50 percent or better from the floor in five of the last six games. In Steve Fisher's eight seasons at SDSU, the Aztecs are 44-12 (78.6 percent) when shooting at least 50 percent from the field.

Century Club

With 99 career games under his belt, Brandon Heath is approaching 100 games played in his San Diego State career. The senior is currently tied for 16th in SDSU's Division I era with Joel Kramer. When Heath plays in his 100th career game, he will become the 16th player in Aztec history to reach the century mark only 18 behind Aztec record-holder and another former teammate, John Sharper, who played in 119 contests.

74 is the Magic Number

Reaching the 74-point plateau seems to bring good fortune for the Aztec as they have done so 25 times since the beginning of last season, including all seven games this year. In those 25 games, San Diego State has a record of 22-3.

Exploding Onto the Scene

Jerome Habel certainly made a name for himself in his debut against California with 23 points (10-11 FG), seven rebounds and three blocks. Even though the junior from San Bernardino Valley College-transfer did not come from a Division I school, his first game as an Aztec was phenomenal when compared to SDSU's other transfers on the current roster. Last season, Mohamed Abukar scored 10 points (4-10 FG) and had two rebounds and two assists in a losing effort at Providence in his first game. Meanwhile, Lorenzo Wade posted 11 points and four rebounds in his first game with the scarlet and black.

Mr. Clutch

His nickname might be "Bottoms", but "Mr. Clutch" might be more appropriate. In his career at San Diego State, Heath has made seven shots that have given his team a lead it did not relinquish with less than 1:45 to play in the contest (he also has one other clutch shot that tied a game using the same criteria).

One of the most dramatic occurred in the season opener vs. Murray State at the Shamrock Invitational. After missing a layup and Kyle Spain's putback dunk failed, Heath came from behind the Racer player, stole the ball, dribbled the other way and with one foot over the halfcourt line shot the ball and banked it in to give SDSU the three-point victory. In the following game at Saint Mary's, Heath nailed two free throws with 17 seconds left to give the Aztecs lead is would not relinquish.

Mo' from Abukar

Mohamed Abukar has always been able to put the ball in the basket. Coming into the year, he had 20 career double-figure scoring games, including 17 last season. This year is no different as the senior from San Diego opened with five straight double-digit scoring games and has six total. The one thing that pops out on the stat sheet these days is his ability to rebound. In two seasons at Florida, the most rebounds he ever collected was five and in his first year on Montezuma Mesa he had seven or more boards just six times with a career best of nine in the NCAA Tournament game vs. Indiana. Although he only had one rebound in the opener against Murray State, the last six games Abukar has recorded 44 rebounds, including a career-high 10 boards against Seattle Pacific and nine at UC Santa Barbara. In doing so, Abukar posted his first double-double vs. the Falcons when he finished with 22 points.

Free Points

The Aztecs have taken full advantage of their free throw opportunities as they are 116-of-156 on the year, good for 74.4 percent. Last year, San Diego State shot a Division I era school best 72.8 percent from the line, the first time it had cleared 70 percent since 1996-97. In seven games this year, San Diego State has shot over 80 percent twice after only doing so seven times in 2005-06 (33 games). The improved shooting and increased attempts have also made a difference in the final outcome as three SDSU victories have come by three points or less and five by seven points or fewer. The Aztecs have outscored its opposition by 61 points from the line and have 79 more attempts (156-77). SDSU has made 39 more free throws than its opponents have attempted.

Individually, three Aztecs, Mohamed Abukar, Kyle Spain and Lorenzo Wade, have taken advantage of their opportunities at the charity stripe. For those players with at least 10 attempts, Spain leads the team at 92 percent (23-25), Wade is shooting at a 90 percent clip (9-10), while Abukar has made 33-of-39 for 84.6 percent.

Heath Named MWC Player of the Week

Brandon Heath was named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week on Nov. 13. The award extends his school record for most weekly awards to six after he earned the honor three times as a junior and twice as a sophomore.

Heath, the Shamrock Invitational most valuable player, hit the game-winning shot in each of the first two nights and averaged 22.3 points, 4.7 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 2.0 steals, while playing 117 of a possible 120 minutes in the process. The Los Angeles native led the team in scoring, was second in assists, third in rebounds, and produced three consecutive 20-point scoring games.

With three double-digit scoring games over the weekend, Heath has produced double figures in 28 consecutive games, which ties him with Marcus Slaughter for the third-longest streak in school history (four short of SDSU record-holder Zack Jones). He has 82 double-figure scoring games and 41 20-plus scoring efforts in 95 career games.

Heath also passed the 200 career three-point field goal plateau (202) with his eight three-point makes over the course of the three opening games.

Aztecs Picked to Win Mountain West for Second Straight Year; Heath Tabbed Top Returning Player, Abukar First Team

San Diego State men's basketball was picked by the Mountain West Conference media to repeat as 2006-07 MWC champions in a preseason poll released by the conference on Oct. 26. The selection marks the second consecutive season in which the Aztecs have been picked to win the league. Last year, SDSU went on to record a 24-9 record, including a 13-3 mark in conference action, en route to both the regular season and conference tournament titles.

The Aztecs received 17 of 21 first-place votes and 192 total points to lead the league. Brigham Young finished second with one first-place vote and 156 points overall, while Air Force was picked to finish third after garnering three first-place votes and 147 total points. Rounding out the poll was Utah (114 points), New Mexico (101), UNLV (99), Colorado State (68), Wyoming (51) and TCU (27).

Individually, the league media tabbed senior guard Brandon Heath as the MWC's top returning player, a year after it selected former Aztec Marcus Slaughter as its top player. The Los Angeles native earned 2006 MWC Player of the Year honors after averaging 18.4 points, 3.4 rebounds and 3.5 assists during the campaign. During conference action, Heath increased his production as he averaged 19.5 points, 3.4 rebounds and 4.2 assists. Besides earning the league's top individual honor, he was named to the all-MWC first team and the all-MWC tournament squad. On a national and regional level, Heath earned Associated Press honorable mention All-America accolades as well as being named to the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) all-District IX team and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) all-District 13 first team.

Joining Heath in receiving individual accolades was senior forward Mohamed Abukar, who was named to the all-MWC first team. The preseason honor comes on the heels of a 2006 season in which Abukar averaged 15.3 points and 4.6 rebounds in 16 conference games en route to earning second-team all-league recognition. Last season at the annual media day event, Abukar was named MWC Newcomer of the Year.

With Abukar being voted among the league's top five, this marks the second straight year that San Diego State has placed two players on the preseason all-conference first team.

Ring in the New Season

Coming off a season in which San Diego State tied the overall school record with 24 victories, set a Division I record for wins in a season, captured its first Mountain West Conference regular-season crown and its second MWC tournament title, excitement surrounding the program is at an all-time high.

Couple last year's successes with the return of four returning starters, a strong recruiting class and a high-profile transfer, there is no wonder as to why great things are expected of the 2006-07 ballclub.

Below are reasons why many believe SDSU will be dancing come March:

► **Brandon Heath:** Heath returns to Montezuma Mesa after being named MWC Player of the Year, all-MWC first team and earning *Associated Press* honorable mention All-America accolades... He is one of three players in the nation to rank among the NCAA's top 75 in scoring and top 40 in free throw percentage, three-point field goals made and three-point field goal percentage... He returns as the reigning MWC scoring, free throw percentage and three-point field goal champion.

► **Mohamed Abukar:** Entering 2005-06, he was tabbed MWC Newcomer of the Year and he didn't disappoint as he was named all-conference second team last season... Once he became eligible last December he helped the Aztecs to 17 wins in 21 games as a starter and has currently scored in double figures in 13 of his last 15 games... In conference games only, he ranked No. 3 in free throw percentage (.857), No. 4 in field goal percentage (.537) and No. 9 in scoring (15.2).

► **Four Returning Starters:** In addition to Heath and Abukar, SDSU returns Kyle Spain and Richie Williams to round out its four returning starters. Steve Fisher has coached seven teams with four returning starters that he coached off a team the previous season and all seven times he reached the postseason (six NCAA appearances and an NIT championship).

► **Lorenzo Wade:** After sitting out the 2005-06 season due to NCAA transfer rules, the former Louisville Cardinal is eligible for 2006-07. Wade joins the Aztecs having played on Rick Pitino's 2005 squad which advanced to the Final Four. That season, he played in 35 games and scored a career-high 14 points on two different occasions.

Four Starters Returning for Fisher Equals Postseason

In his coaching history, Steve Fisher plus four or more returning starters has resulted in tremendous success. Seven previous times Steve Fisher has returned four or more starters from a team coached, with those clubs advancing to the NCAA Tournament on six occasions and winning the postseason NIT championship once. Below is a look at those clubs.

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In seven seasons he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs knocking on the door of the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that Fisher signed a new five-year contract prior to the start of practice in October that will keep him in San Diego for the foreseeable future.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, the postseason NIT in 2003 and the NCAA Tournament last season. In addition, the Aztecs may have their best team in school history entering the 2006-07 campaign with four starters returning off a team that won a Division I school-record 24 games, won the conference regular season and postseason championships and was just a minute away from claiming their first Division I NCAA Tournament victory in school history.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was

undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at the University of Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Company raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led San Diego State back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

The future looks even brighter. The Aztecs return four starters to go along with another nationally-ranked recruiting class have SDSU fans looking forward to the 2006-07 campaign.
