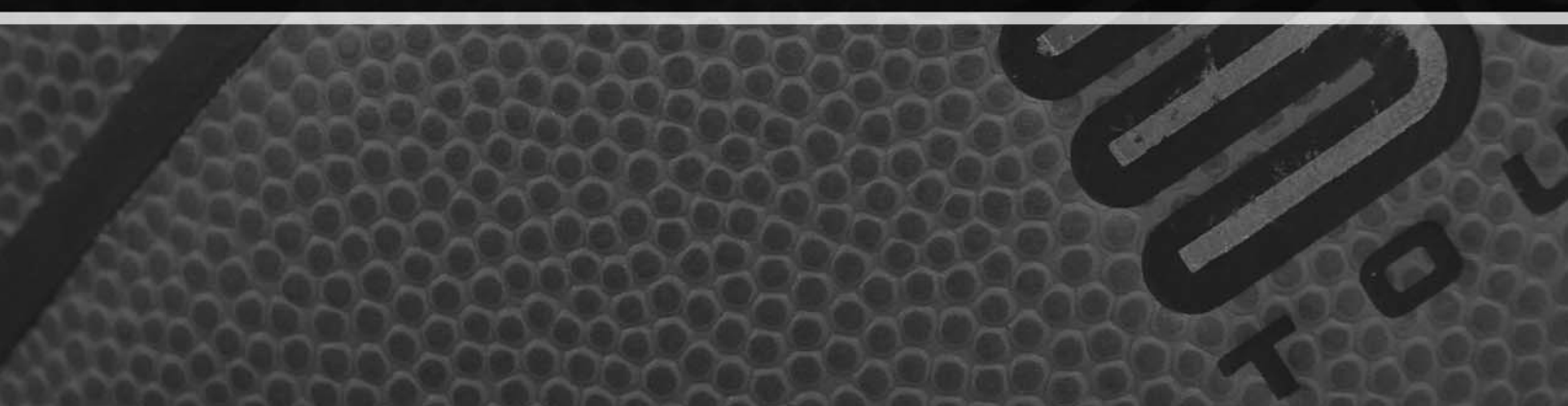

► QUICKLY

Starter in her first year as an Aztec, garnering MWC Newcomer-of-the-Year honors ... Signed with San Diego State in late April 2008 after playing two years at Baylor ... Redshirted in 2008-09 due to NCAA rules ... One of two Aztecs from Sacramento ... Played club basketball with Paris Johnson ... Strength is her versatility ... Can face-up, handle the ball, pass and also command a double team in the paint ... Is an athletic shot blocker.

► AS A JUNIOR (2009-10)

Tabbed the Mountain West Conference Newcomer of the Year and league preseason newcomer of the year ... Starter in all but one game, playing in all 34 ... Led the team in rebounding (6.5/g) and blocked shots (63) ... Her 54 assists were fourth best ... Ranked second in the MWC in blocked shots in both overall and conference-only games ... Was ninth in rebounding in the league, including seventh in offensive boards (2.5/g) ... Starter in the team's opener at UC Irvine, notching a team-high 10 rebounds ... Second straight game with 10 rebounds, also tallying 14 points vs. USD for her first double-double as an Aztec ... Third outing in a row with 10 boards and also recorded her first career blocks (3) and steal (1) in the win over Arizona ... Had 12 points, eight rebounds, three assists, three steals and two blocked shots in the near upset of No. 5/6 Notre Dame ... Recorded her second double-double with 13 points and 10 boards and was 7-for-11 from the stripe vs. LBSU ... Tied her season best with 14 points and also had eight rebounds at LMU ... Four second-half blocks and eight boards for the second game in a row vs. Wake Forest ... Posted 12 points, seven boards, three assists and three blocks in the win over Auburn ... Career-high 12 rebounds in MWC debut at New Mexico ... Six blocked shots to go with 13 points

(5-for-5), seven rebounds and three assists in only 23 minutes vs. UNLV ... Season-best four steals at CSU ... Shot 60 percent for 13 points at Air Force ... Had five blocked shots in 27 minutes against New Mexico ... Season-best four assists to go with four blocked shots in the upset of TCU ... Game-high seven rebounds in only 15 minutes in the regular season finale vs. Air Force ... Standout MWC tournament debut with a double-double including 11 points and 12 boards, while posting a career and team season-best seven blocked shots in the win over Wyoming ... Six points, nine rebounds and three blocks at No. 17/20 Texas in the first round NCAA Tournament game ... Eight rebounds and three assists in the second round vs No. 10/10 West Virginia ... First career 3-pointer to give her nine points vs. Duke in the Sweet 16.

Did not compete a year ago, after transferring from Baylor.

► AT BAYLOR (2006-08)

Played in all 32 games for the Lady Bears in 2007-08, starting six times ... Team was ranked as high as fifth in both national polls and opened 2007-08 with a 20-1 record ... Averaged 6.2 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.1 blocks per game, posting a pair of double-doubles highlighted by a 10-point, 10-rebound performance against then No. 10 Oklahoma ... Notched 10 multi-block games, grabbed five or more rebounds 14 times and contributed six or more points on 13 occasions ... As freshman, logged minutes in 33 contests and earned her first career start versus Oklahoma ... Finished second in the Big 12 Conference among freshmen in blocked shots with 0.79 per game and was fourth on the team in offensive rebounds.

A four-time first-team all league pick and was named the conference co-MVP as a senior in 2006, when she averaged 24 points, 16 rebounds, six blocks and five assists per game ... Helped the Lady Dragons to four Capitol Athletic League titles and a runner-up finish at the state tournament her final campaign ... Two-time *Cal-Hi Sports* Division III all-state honoree and a three-time team captain ... *Street & Smith* honorable mention All-American and an adidas Top Ten Camp All-Star ... Rated the 45th-best player in America and No. 12 forward by the *All-Star Girls Report* ... Also competed in track and field and volleyball at Sacramento High.

► QUICKLY

A two-year returning starter at guard ... Good passer and decision maker ... Tremendous court vision ... Solid defensive rebounder, who has increased her offensive production over her career ... Will be counted on to play a lot of minutes once again, due to the team's youth in the back court ... Older sister, Queness, played at SDSU from 2006-10.

► AS A JUNIOR (2009-10)

Played in all but one contest, starting 30 times ... Second on the team in assists with a career-high 120 to rank eighth in the MWC ... Led the Aztecs and ranked fifth in the MWC in assists-to-turnover ratio (1.4) ... Had a career-best 32 triples, shooting 33 percent from beyond the arc ... Shot a career-best 77.8 percent from the charity stripe ... Had six rebounds and four assists as a starter at UCI ... Team-best six assists in the win over USD, shooting a perfect 2-for-2 from beyond the arc and ending up with seven points and four rebounds ... Seven helpers and seven boards vs. Arizona ... Seven rebounds for the second game in a row vs. No. 5/6 Notre Dame, while also tallying five assists ... Was a reserve at UC Riverside ... Missed the Pepperdine game with a knee injury ... Came back against Long Beach State and had four assists off the bench ... Starter at LMU, contributing six assists ... Scored 10 points vs. Auburn to go with six rebounds in 38 minutes ... ► AS A FRESHMAN (2007-08)

Appeared in all but one game, starting once against Southern Utah ... Team's co-most improved scholar-athlete ... Averaged 2.6 points and 2.1 rebounds per outing ... Tallied 39 assists, owning a positive assist-to-turnover ratio ... One of five Aztecs with more than 10 three-pointers ... Led the team in assists on two occasions ... Played 15 minutes off the bench in her first official outing as an Aztec at Nevada, logging four points and one steal ... Team game-high four assists to go with five boards and two steals at Saint Mary's ... First career start vs. Southern Utah, posting eight points to go with four rebounds, four assists and a block ... Made both her three-point attempts against CS Fullerton and added five rebounds in 15 minutes ... 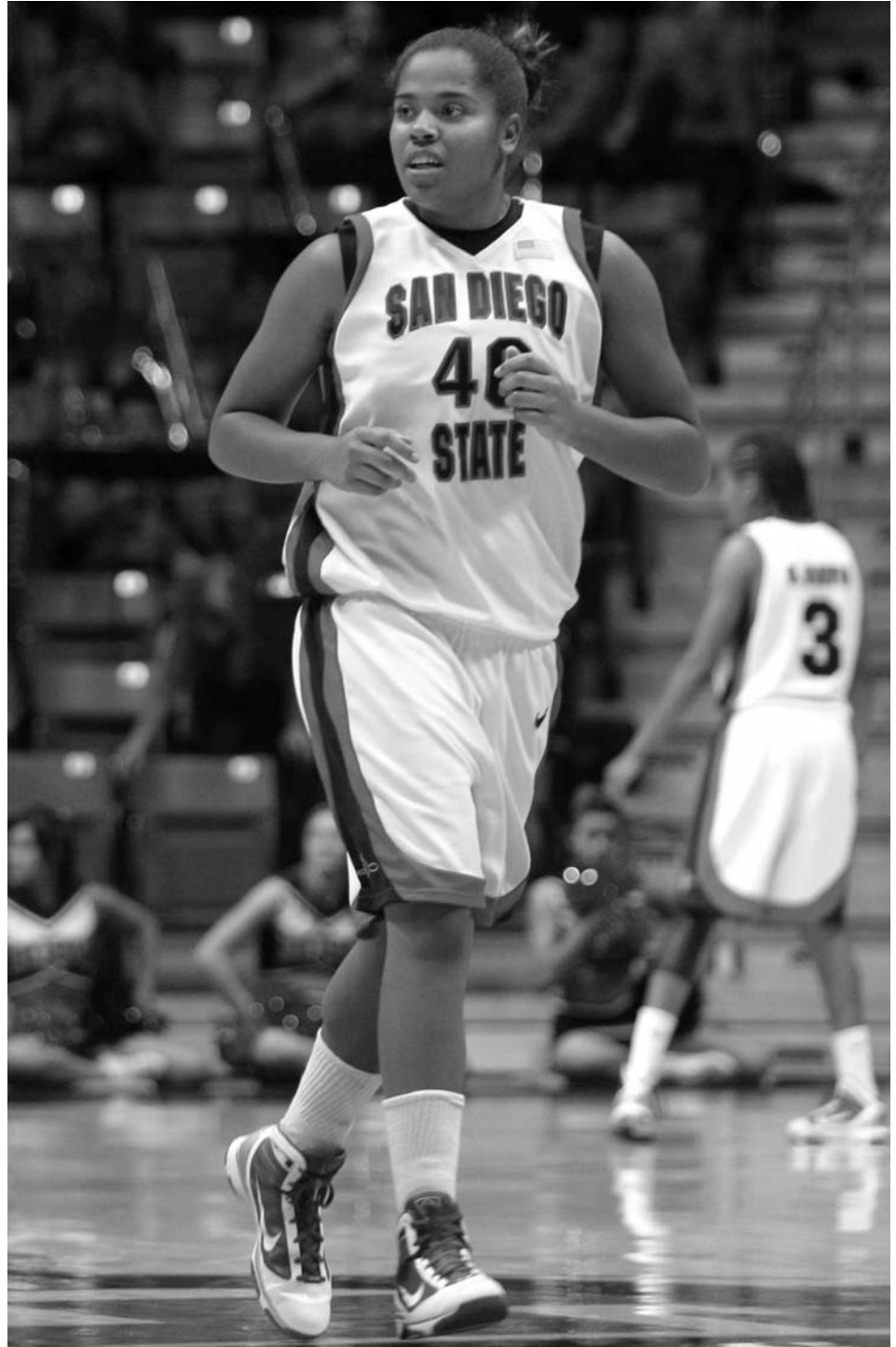

The Mountain West has claimed the 2009-10 Bowl Challenge Cup for the third time in six years after sending five football teams into postseason action and finishing with a 4-1 mark. For the third time in five seasons the Mountain West sent a team to a BCS Bowl game.

TCU finished the 2010 season with a 54-14 record, advancing to the College World Series semi-finals. In 2009, the MWC sent three teams - TCU, San Diego State and Utah - to the NCAA Baseball Championship for the first time in league history, as well as had the #1 pick in the Major League Baseball draft - Stephen Strasburg.

- In 2010, five men's basketball teams participated in postseason play, with a league-best four competing in the NCAA Tournament.
- In 2010, five women's teams made it to the postseason as well, with San Diego State shocking Texas and West Virginia to advance to the Sweet 16.

Colorado State, New Mexico and TCU were selected to the 2009 NCAA Women's Volleyball Championships, marking the eighth year the MWC has had at least three teams in the tournament. CSU won the league title for the third time in four years and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Volleyball Tournament.
