THE SET-UP

Owning the nation's 10th longest active win streak of five games, San Diego State (7-3; 5-1 MW) returns home to face long-time rival Air Force (5-4; 4-1 MW) at Qualcomm Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The Aztecs control their own destiny in the quest to earn the school's 19th football conference title, but first since 1998.

Game time is slated for 12:30 p.m. PT and the contest will be televised nationally in high definition by NBC Sports Network with radio coverage on KOGO 95.7 FM & AM 600. Tickets start at just \$10, and fans can get two \$26 tickets for \$28 by purchasing online and entering the promo code Marshall. The game marks the final home contest for 16 seniors, who have helped guide the Aztecs to what would appear to be a third consecutive bowl game.

San Diego State ran its winning streak to five games, its longest single-season winning streak in 17 years, with a 21-19 victory at No. 19/14 Boise State. It marked the first time in school history the Aztecs have defeated a nationally-ranked team on the road (1-31).

SDSU limited the Broncos to 19 points, 276 total yards and 4-for-12 on third-down conversions. The Aztecs forced five three-and-outs on 10 Boise State possessions in the contest. Sophomore running back Adam Muema recorded his second straight 100-yard game, fifth of the season and sixth of his career.

The Aztecs received great performances from special teams, including junior Colin Lockett's 100-yard kickoff return for touchdown, the second of the season and third of his career, and freshman punter Seamus McMorrow averaging 50.3 yards on three punts, two of which were downed inside the 20.

San Diego State will be looking to continue a recent trend of success against service academy teams. Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, the Aztecs are 5-0 against the academies (2-0 vs. Air Force, 2-0 vs. Army and 1-0 vs. Navy).

- Saturday marks the final home game for 16 San Diego State student-athletes. The group that redshirted in 2008 has played for three different head coaches and has seen the Aztecs transition from one of the worst teams in the country to one that is currently receiving top 25 votes in both the Associated Press and the USA Today Coaches Poll.

 Alec Johnson, C - Made 39 career starts and is tied for the team lead with 36 consecutive starts
 Ryan Katz, QB - Transferred from Oregon State, started the first eight games of season before injury
 Walter Kazee, RB - Career numbers: 1,711 yards, 17 rushing TDs in 40 games played
 Chance Marden, PK - Made eight consecutive FGs prior to the Boise game in his lone season with FB
 Leon McFadden, CB - A two-time first-team all-Mountain West selection; Tied school record for PBU
 Jimmy Miller, OL - Played in four games in 2012 and has seven career games played
 Dominique Sandifer, WR - Seen action in 32 career games, with 67 catches and 765 rec. yards.
 D.J. Shields, TE - Seven career starts and 43 games played; 17 receptions for 174 yards
 Freddie Trujillo, DL - Played in six straight games and has seen action in 20 career games
 Josh Wade, DB - Started nine games this season and has 34 career tackles and 5 PBU

San Diego State has won its last two "Senior Day" games and is 7-2 in those games since the 2003 campaign.

- Although Saturday is all about the seniors, it is worth noting how young the 2012 Aztec team is. Below is a look at the average starts broken down by class through the first 10 games. This counts only offensive and defensive players and does not include specialists.

San Diego State starts an average of 6.7 seniors per game. The Aztecs have played more juniors (16.7 per game) and sophomores (13.8) than seniors (13.5).

- In its last 31 games, SDSU has posted a 5-0 record against service academies with a pair of victories over Air Force (2010 and 2011) and Army (including a 42-7 win this year and last year), and a win over Navy (2011 Poinsettia Bowl)
- In his fourth year at San Diego State and second as the head coach, Rocky Long has a chance to make Mountain West history on Saturday. Long, who was the head coach at New Mexico from 1998-2008, has an 80-77 career record. Of those 80 victories, 77 have come while coaching in the Mountain West. That is tied for the league record held by TCU's Gary Patterson. With San Diego State's next victory, Long will be alone atop the charts with Patterson.

- Long has led a dramatic turnaround at San Diego State, first as the defensive coordinator in 2009-10 and then as the head coach since 2011. The Aztecs went without a winning season for the nine straight years from 2000-09 when they won 32.2 percent of their games and owned one of the nation's worst records. Now, SDSU is bowl eligible in 2012 and appears to be in a position to advance to a bowl game for a third consecutive season. Below is a look at the dramatic turnaround.

During the win streak, the Aztecs defense ranks among the top 25 nationally in points allowed per game (19th), total offense allowed per game (20th) and yards allowed per play (8th). Below is a look at SDSU's numbers through the first five games compared with those from the last five contests.

- Last Saturday, San Diego State sophomore Adam Dingwell became the first Aztec quarterback to win his first two starts since David Lowery in 1991. The week before, Dingwell became the first SDSU signal-caller to win his debut start since Spencer Britton on Oct. 25, 1997. The win snapped an 11-game losing streak for SDSU quarterbacks in their initial start. Dingwell's pass efficiency rating of 142.32 in his opening game was the highest since Kevin McKechnie on Sept. 5, 1997.

- During the off-season, many questioned if San Diego State would be able to get the same production out of its ground attack with the departure of All-American Ronnie Hillman to the NFL. That has not been a problem to date. The running back tandem of sophomore Adam Muema and senior Walter Kazee have outrushed last season's first-team all-Mountain West performer and has helped the 2012 team eclipse the rushing totals of the 2011 squad. Through 10 games, Muema and Kazee have rushed for 1,700 yards and 18 touchdowns compared with Hillman's nine-game totals of 1,286 yards and 13 TDs last season. As a team, the Aztecs have rushed for 296 more yards and four more touchdowns through the first 10 games this season.

OBSCURE NOTES OF THE WEEK

- As previously noted, last Saturday at No. 19/14 Boise State, San Diego State claimed its first road win over a nationally ranked opponent in school history. The Aztecs were 0-31 heading into Saturday.
- In addition to getting the victory, Saturday marked:
 - * First time SDSU led a ranked team in the second half on the road since playing at 17th-ranked Michigan on Sept. 18, 2004. SDSU did not have a lead in its last five such games.
 - * The 19 points were the fewest allowed in a road game vs. an AP top 25 team since second-ranked Ohio State scored 16 points on Sept. 6, 2003 (OSU 16-13).
 - * The eight-point advantage in a road game vs. a nationally-ranked opponent was the largest since the Aztecs had an eight-point advantage against No. 1 Washington on Oct. 2, 1982 (UW 46-25).

PROGRAM TIDBITS

- Entering the games this weekend, San Diego State has compiled the nation's second-highest winning percentage in combined football and men's basketball since the beginning of the 2010-11 academic year. San Diego State is a combined 83-23 (78.3 percent) and trails only Ohio State in the two sports since the beginning of the 2010 football season. *See chart below*

- Adding the success of the women's basketball program at SDSU, which has advanced to NCAA Tournament play in two of the last three seasons, further demonstrates the department's overall success. Combining football, men's basketball and women's basketball records since the beginning of last season, San Diego State owns the seventh-best winning percentage in the country, trailing only Baylor, Stanford, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Kentucky and Brigham Young. *See chart above*
- The Aztecs have posted a 24-12 record since the beginning of the 2010 season after needing 74 games to claim 24 victories prior to 2010 (SDSU went 24-50 during that stretch from the 10th game of the 2003 season through the end of 2009 campaign). The 24-12 record since the beginning of the 2010 season is tied for the 25th-best mark in the country and is the third-best in the state of California during that time.

- Through 23 games, Rocky Long has an 15-8 record as SDSU's head coach. That is the best 23-game start to a coaching career at San Diego State since Claude Gilbert opened his tenure with a 18-3-2 record in the 1973 and 1974 seasons.
- SDSU opens the 2012 campaign after advancing to bowl games each of the last two seasons (Poinsettia Bowl in 2010 and New Orleans Bowl in 2011). San Diego State has never gone to bowl games in three consecutive years.
- The Aztecs play seven home games in 2012, which ties for the program's highest number since 1976. SDSU concluded a three-game homestand in September, its longest in a decade, against San Jose State.
- Despite serving as an assistant coach at San Diego State for two seasons (2009-10), **Rocky Long** is currently tied for the winningest coach in Mountain West history. Long has 77 wins while a member of the league, tied with only TCU's Gary Patterson (77 wins). With TCU no longer in the league, Long needs one victory to break the record. The other nine active coaches in the league entered the season with a combined 75 wins while their teams have been a member of the conference.
- The Aztecs have played 68 student-athletes through 10 games, with 38 of those seeing action in all 10 contests. Only 11 seniors saw action in the opening contest at Washington and two of those (quarterback Ryan Katz and wide receiver Brice Butler) were playing in their first game with SDSU. San Diego State only started more than seven seniors twice this year (vs. Colorado State and at Nevada) and as few as five seniors (vs. Army).
- The Aztecs have seven seniors listed as starters on the current depth chart, five on offense (RG **Nik Embernate**, LG **Riley Gauld**, C **Alec Johnson**, WR **Brice Butler**, WR **Dominique Sandifer**) and two on defense (CB **Leon McFadden** and CB **Josh Wade**).
- To date, SDSU has had 25 players make their first appearance in a San Diego State game, 15 players on the offensive or defensive side of the ball make their first start with the Aztecs and 13 make their first Division I start. The 15 first time starters is the 14th-highest total in the country and third-highest number in the conference behind Air Force (21) and Wyoming (16).

OFFENSIVE QUICK HITS

- San Diego State returns seven starters on offense from last season's 2011 team that scored 387 points, the second-highest total for an Aztec squad in the last 15 seasons.
- Through 10 games this season, San Diego State is averaging more points (35.1 in 2012, 29.8 in 2011) and nearly the same total offense (406.1 in 2012 and 427.4 in 2011) as last season.
- SDSU has four offensive players appearing on preseason watch lists for the top player at their position in the country - junior tight end **Gavin Escobar** (John Mackey Award Watch List (TE), Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (lineman)), senior center **Alec Johnson** (Rimington Trophy Watch List (center)), senior running back **Walter Kazee** (Doak Walker Award Watch List (RB)) and sophomore wide receiver **Colin Lockett** (Biletnikoff Award Watch List (WR)). In October, **Escobar** was named to the Midseason John Mackey Award Watch List (TE).
- San Diego State has scored 339 points in the last nine games combined. It is the highest nine-game output since midway through the 1996 season and including the 1997 opener (a span of 189 games).
- SDSU's 351 points is the highest scoring output for an Aztec squad through the first nine games of a season since 1996 when Ted Tollner's squad scored 421 points in the first 10 contests.
- San Diego State's 52 points against Hawai'i earlier this season represented its highest output since posting 52 against Portland State (Sept. 22, 2007) and the most points against a FBS opponent since scoring 52 points against San Jose State on Sept. 24, 2005.
- The Aztecs produced a pair of 100-yard rushers against North Dakota and UNLV as sophomore **Adam Muema** and senior **Walter Kazee** each reached the century mark. It is the 15th and 16th time in school history that two players rushed for 100 or more yards in the same game and the first time since Oct. 17, 1998. SDSU is 15-1 in those occurrences.
- San Diego State has 21 drives this season of 70 or more yards.
- Although San Diego State entered the year looking to replace third-round NFL Draft selection Ronnie Hillman, the Aztecs have proven they have quality depth at the position. Sophomore **Adam Muema** is off and running, with 1,019 yards, 10 touchdowns and a 6.0 yards-per-rush average through 10 games. Also in the backfield is senior **Walter Kazee**. A career 1,000-yard rusher, Kazee's season was cut short in 2011 when he suffered a knee injury at Colorado State. In 10 games this season, Kazee has 681 rushing yards and eight rushing touchdowns, and is averaging 5.2 yards per carry.
- The Aztecs have had just five student-athletes start at quarterback since Nov. 18, 2006. During that 75-game stretch, Kevin O'Connell (15 games during the 2006-07 seasons), Drew Westling (1 game; vs. Air Force on Oct. 11, 2008) and Ryan Lindley (49 games during the 2008-09-10-11 seasons) have all taken snaps. In the season opener, senior Oregon State transfer **Katz** became the fourth SDSU player to start over the 66-game stretch (now 75 games). Against UNLV, **Adam Dingwell** joined that group and snapped an 11-game losing streak by Aztec quarterbacks in their inaugural start.
- Last season due to graduation and injury, the Aztecs' combined receiving corps entered the campaign with four career catches for 39 yards. That has changed significantly in 12 months as SDSU entered the 2012 campaign with a Biletnikoff Award candidate and preseason all-Mountain West selection in junior **Colin Lockett** (17 catches, 256 yards, three touchdowns this year) and highly decorated USC transfer senior **Brice Butler** (20 catches, 314 yards and four touchdowns this season). Making his long-awaited collegiate debut in the opener was **Ezell Ruffin**, who already has 13 catches for 256 yards this season. And don't forget the tight end, **Gavin Escobar**, who has a team-high 35 catches for a team-best 483 yards and five touchdowns this year.
- The offensive line is anchored by two returning starters - senior center **Alec Johnson** and senior right guard **Nik Embernate**. Joining the two seniors on the offensive line is converted tight end, now left guard junior **Bryce Quigley**, junior left guard **Japheth Gordon**, who missed the past five games with a foot injury, and sophomore right tackle **Zach Dilley**. The only new member of the coaching staff, former SDSU offensive lineman **Mike Schmidt**, leads the unit.
- San Diego State has gone 74 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU). That is the only time the Aztecs have been shutout in their last 169 games.

DEFENSIVE QUICK HITS

- SDSU returns six starters off a squad that has continually gotten better under the direction of second-year head coach Rocky Long, who is in his fourth season as the defensive coordinator. Statistically one of the nation's worst units less than five years ago, Long has transitioned the San Diego State defense into one of the most feared units on the West Coast. Below is a look at the progress made under Long's direction.

- San Diego State has not allowed a point in the last six drives following an Aztec turnover.
- In the 20 drives prior to the North Dakota game, San Diego State's defense allowed a total of seven points. At one point, the Aztecs went 16 drives (last seven of the Washington game and first nine of the Army game) without allowing an offensive point.
- SDSU is led on defense by Mountain West preseason defensive player of the year, senior cornerback **Leon McFadden**. McFadden is on the preseason watch list for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (best defensive player) and the Jim Thorpe Award (DB). McFadden, who has been a first-team all-Mountain West selection the past two seasons, is looking to become the school's fourth three-time first-team all-league selection, joining Marshall Faulk, Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila and Kirk Morrison.
- Plenty of other defensive players received preseason attention from at least one publication. Junior Aztec back **Nat Berhe** and sophomore linebacker **Jake Fely** were among the players getting attention. Berhe is the top retuning tackler of the 2011 squad, and has a team-high 72 stops this season. Fely is second on the squad with 66 tackles, and leads the squad with 11 tackles for loss and seven sacks.
- McFadden** recorded an interception in three straight games (Sept. 15-29) and has eight career picks.
- SDSU has forced three or more turnovers nine times in the last 22 contests.
- San Diego State has allowed a total of 1,320 yards rushing in its last 12 games combined (110.0). The Aztec defense has held its opponent to 100 yards or less on the ground in six of the last 16 games.
- In the opener at Washington, the SDSU defense allowed just 14 points (the Huskies had a fumble return for touchdown) and 328 yards of total offense against one of the most potent offensive attacks in the country. In 2011, Washington averaged 33.38 points to rank 25th nationally and 409.85 yards (38th in the nation).
- The Huskies scored 21 points off three drives that accumulated a total of 97 yards of offense.
- The Aztecs held Washington without a point on its final seven possessions of the game. That is something no team did against the Huskies in 2011.
- Against Army, SDSU held the Black Knights scoreless until there was 5:54 left in the third quarter.
- San Diego State held Army well below its 2011 season averages in rushing yards (282 allowed, 346.50 average in 2011) and total yards (332 allowed, 396.92 average in 2011).
- Against North Dakota, Leon McFadden intercepted a pass on UND's first offensive play of the game and took it 28 yards for the touchdown. It was the Aztecs' first defensive touchdown since Nov. 13, 2012, at No. 3 TCU and their first interception return for a score since Luke Laologi returned one 55 yards at UNLV on Nov. 28, 2009.
- At Fresno State, both Eric Pinkins and Leon McFadden intercepted a pass for a touchdown. They had gone 28 games in between without returning an interception for a touchdown. McFadden became just the second player in program history with two interception returns for a touchdown in a season (Tory Nixon in 1984).
- San Diego State allowed just 173 yards of total offense in the victory over Hawai'i and allowed an average of just 2.98 yards per play. That is the lowest per play average allowed by an SDSU squad since Nicholls State (2.71 ypp) on Sept. 4, 2010, the lowest against a FBS opponent since Colorado State (2.97 ypp) on Oct. 16, 2004 and the 33rd lowest average in the Division I era.

SDSU VS. AIR FORCE

- This is the 31st meeting between San Diego State and Air Force with the Falcons owning a 19-11 series lead.
- The Aztecs have won two straight in the series and are looking to tie their series best with a third straight win (accomplished in 2002-04).
- Air Force owns a 7-6 series advantage in San Diego. San Diego State has won three of the last four meetings at Qualcomm Stadium, including the last encounter (25-23 on Oct. 16, 2010).
- Eleven of the last 19 games in the series have been decided by seven points or less. Of those 11 games, three have been decided by one point, one decided by two points, one decided by three points, one decided by four points, one decided by five points, two decided by six points (one that went to overtime) and two decided by seven points.
- The teams first played in 1980, a 13-10 Aztec victory at Falcon Stadium. This will mark the 30th time in the last 32 years the two teams have played. Air Force and San Diego State have tangled every season since 1980 with the lone exceptions being 1995 and 1998.
- Since 1994, the team that has committed fewer turnovers is undefeated in the series. The teams have played 16 times since 1994, with the team turning the ball over less winning on 13 occasions (in 1997, TOs were tied at one apiece, AFA won 24-

- Rocky Long's influence is evident on the series. Since taking over the Aztec defense three years ago, Long's unit has allowed an average of 25.3 points and 250.0 rushing yards per game. Compare that to the two meetings prior (2007 and 2008), when the Aztecs gave up 45.0 points and 485.0 rushing yards per game.
- **SDSU-AIR FORCE TIDBITS:** This is the 14th straight season the teams have played, a streak that will end next season when the Aztecs move to the BIG EAST Conference... The Falcons won the first three encounters during the MW era, but San Diego State has won six of the last 10 encounters... The games in the series have typically featured plenty of offense... In the last 17 meetings, the games had a combined average of 56.8 points and 815.2 yards of total offense... Only three times in the last 17 encounters have the teams failed to combine to score at least 42 points and five times during that stretch the teams have posted at least 69 points... Over the last 20 games, the cumulative point total is Air Force 545, San Diego State 503... The only game former Aztec quarterback and current Arizona Cardinal Ryan Lindley missed in his career was the 2008 meeting against Air Force... Senior cornerback Leon McFadden has three played games against the Falcons, registering 14 tackles, including a tackle for loss, and four PBUs... Wide receiver Dylan Denso has five catches for 83 yards... Rene Siluano has an interception against the Falcons... The Aztecs would not mind having their dynamic receiving duo of Vincent Brown and DeMarco Sampson back for this game... The former Aztecs, who now play in the NFL, combined for 30 catches, 399 yards and two touchdowns during their career vs. Air Force.

LAST MEETING: SDSU 41, AIR FORCE 27

- **Oct. 13, 2011 | Falcon Stadium | USAFA, Colo.**

USAFA, Colo. – Two fourth-quarter touchdowns from Ronnie Hillman were plenty for the San Diego State football team, as they cruised to a 41-27 victory against Air Force in front of 27,490 fans at Falcon Stadium. The win snapped SDSU's two-game losing streak and improved the team's record to 4-2 overall and 1-1 in the Mountain West.

San Diego State struck first on its opening drive, notching three points on a field goal after going 72 yards on 12 plays. Air Force responded by putting together a 12-play 80-yard drive of its own to take a 7-3 lead.

The Aztecs had another long drive on their next possession, putting seven points on the board on a 27-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Lindley to tight end Alston Umuolo to give SDSU a 10-7 lead.

Air Force once again responded, scoring its second touchdown of the game on a 4-yard run from David Baska on an eight-play, 62-yard drive. SDSU's offense got a break on its next possession as Brandon Davis returned the Falcons' kickoff 98 yards to give the Aztecs a three-point lead.

San Diego State's lead was short lived, however, as Air Force used the remaining 5:50 of the second quarter to drive 53 yards and tie the game on a 44-yard field goal.

In the second half, the Aztecs stepped up their defense by holding the Falcons to 10 points. Despite Air Force notching the first points of the third quarter on a 31-yard field goal, SDSU's offense had little issue as it scored the next 24 points of the contest.

After a 25-yard field goal by Abelardo Perez, the Aztecs tallied their third touchdown on a 28-yard pass from Lindley to Colin Lockett, which was set up by a fumble recovery, to give SDSU a 27-20 lead after three quarters of action.

In the fourth quarter, Hillman scored on consecutive Aztec possessions to put the game out of reach. Hillman's first touchdown was a 22-yard run, while the second was from 57 yards out.

The Falcons would notch one more score late in the fourth quarter, but it was too late as SDSU picked up the 41-27 win.

Hillman finished the game with 172 yards and two touchdowns on 27 carries, while Lindley passed for

209 yards and two scores.

THE COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF'S TROPHY

- San Diego State might be able to make a claim on the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, presented annually to the top football military academy. The Aztecs have won five straight meetings with service academies, with all four of those wins coming since Oct. 16, 2010 (during the last 31 games).
- The current streak started with a 27-25 victory over 23rd-ranked Air Force on Oct. 16, 2010 at Qualcomm Stadium. Ronnie Hillman rushed for 191 yards on 24 carries and Ryan Lindley threw for 247 yards in the victory.
- Win No. 2 in the streak came in a 35-14 victory over Navy in the 2010 Poinsettia Bowl. Hillman rushed for 228 yards and scored four touchdowns and Lindley was flawless, going 18-for-23 for 276 yards and two touchdowns.
- The streak reached three with last season's 23-20 win at Army on Sept. 10, 2011.
- The Aztecs pushed the streak to four with a 41-27 win at Air Force on Oct. 13, 2011. SDSU forced three turnovers and had nine tackles for loss, while Hillman and Lindley once again came through big. Hillman rushed for 172 yards and two touchdowns and Lindley was 15-of-21 for 209 yards and two scores.
- SDSU made it five earlier this year with a 42-7 triumph over Army on Sept. 8. In that game, San Diego State forced three turnovers, scored four rushing touchdowns and a passing score and added a 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.
- One reason for the recent success has been San Diego State's ability to keep the ground game in check for the service academies. In three of the five games during the win streak, the Aztecs have held their opponent well below their rushing average for the season. In all five of the wins, SDSU has held its opponent below their scoring average for the season.

Adding the season numbers up for the five teams above, the Aztecs should have allowed 147 points and 1,628 rushing yards. Instead, SDSU has allowed 93 points (63.3 percent of the expected total) and 1,427 rushing yards.

LAST TIME OUT: SAN DIEGO STATE 21, No. 19/14 BOISE STATE 19

BOISE, Idaho -- San Diego State used an opening 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown and solid special teams play all around to defeat No. 19/14 Boise State, 21-19, at Bronco Stadium. It was the fifth straight win for the Aztecs, who snapped a 31-game road/neutral losing streak against top-25 AP teams.

Colin Lockett returned the opening kickoff for the 100-yard score, his second of the season and third of his career. Dwayne Garrett later blocked a Bronco punt, which set up a 3-yard run by Adam Muema and put SDSU up, 14-13, early in the third quarter.

Early in the fourth, Walter Kazee capped a 10-play, 80-yard drive that took up 6:45 of clock time with a 1-yard rushing touchdown on a fourth and goal.

Southwick led BSU on a 16-play, 75-yard drive capped by his 1-yard touchdown toss to fullback Dan Paul that pulled Boise State within 21-19. The Broncos went for 2, but Southwick was pressured and Rene Siluano picked off his pass near the goal line.

San Diego State ran out the clock on its ensuing drive to hand BSU just its second loss in its last 73 regular season home games.

Muema rushed for 127 yards on 25 carries to lead the Aztec rushing attack.

AZTEC OFFENSE

- **SCORING:** Through 10 games, San Diego State ranks 31st in scoring offense (35.10) and 59th in total offense (406.10)... Despite losing five starters off last season's team that accounted for 144 career starts, including NFL Draft picks Ryan Lindley and Ronnie Hillman, San Diego State is averaging more points this season than last (see note below)... San Diego State has scored 339 points in its last nine games, its highest nine-game total since a stretch during the 1996-97 seasons (a span of 189 games)... SDSU has 351 points through the first 10 games of the season, the highest output to open a campaign since the 1996 squad had 421 points through 10 games... The Aztecs scored 52 points against Hawai'i, its highest output since posting 52 against Portland State (Sept. 22, 2007)... It was the most points against a FBS opponent since scoring 52 points against San Jose State on Sept. 24, 2005... The Aztecs have scored 30 or more points in 11 of the last 14 games dating back to last season... San Diego State has 400 or more yards of total offense in 11 of its last 18 games dating back to last season... The Aztecs have committed two turnovers or less in 34 of their last 44 games... SDSU did not have a turnover in four of its last nine games and has played turnover-free football in six of its last 12 contests... The Aztecs have one turnover or less in 13 of the last 18 games... SDSU already has 21 drives of 70 or more yards this season... San Diego State is 52-for-70 (74.3 percent) in converting third- or fourth-down situations of three yards or less this season... The Aztecs are 16-for-19 this season on converting third-down-and-one.
- **OFFENSIVE RUSHING:** The Aztecs rank 22nd nationally in rushing offense (217.20), 35th in rushing yards per carry (4.8), 15th in rushing touchdowns (24)... San Diego State has rushed for 1,779 yards in the last eight games (222.4 rypg) and has rushed for 152 yards or more in all 10 games this season... San Diego State's rushing total through 10 games is 2,172 yards, which is the highest 10-game total since a stretch during the 1995-96 campaigns (Sept. 28, 1995-Sept. 7, 1996) when the Aztecs rushed for a total of 2,174 yards against Nevada, Utah, Fresno State, San Jose State, UTEP, New Mexico, Wyoming, Hawai'i, Colorado State and Idaho... Since the beginning of the 2010 season (last 36 games), the Aztecs have 81 rushing touchdowns... SDSU has at least one rushing touchdown in 18 consecutive games, dating back to the Oct. 8, 2011 contest against TCU, and has 22 rushing touchdowns in the last nine games... That is the longest stretch of consecutive games with a rushing touchdown since a 19-game stretch from Nov. 25, 1989 through Oct. 12, 1991... Earlier this season against North Dakota, and UNLV, for the 15th and 16th time in school history, San Diego State had two players rush for 100 or more yards... Adam Muema and Walter Kazee each reached the century figure marking the first time that had happened since Oct. 17, 1998, when Jonas Lewis and Larry Ned did it... It's the second time in its Division I history that SDSU has had the same duo each break 100-yard rushing in two games in the same season (also 1998 when Lewis and Ned did it)... It was the third time overall that San Diego State has had two games with multiple 100-yard rushers (also 1952 - Phil Prokop and Norm Nygaard vs. Pepperdine and Nygaard and Don Bonatus vs. Cal State Los Angeles)... The Aztecs are 15-1 when multiple backs rush for 100 yards... San Diego State running backs carried 20 times in the contest against Washington and did not have a carry that resulted in negative yardage.
- **OFFENSIVE PASSING:** The Aztecs rank 101st nationally in passing offense (188.90) and 36th in pass efficiency (145.39)... San Diego State had just one interception in its first six games this season and have just two interceptions in the last five games combined... Earlier this season, Ryan Katz threw 91 consecutive passes without an interception, a streak that was snapped in the first quarter of the game at Fresno State... That was the first time the Aztecs have gone three consecutive games without an interception in the same season since the 2005 season... Against North Dakota, Ryan Katz produced the seventh-highest single-game passing efficiency rating in school history at 228.58... That marked two consecutive weeks in which SDSU has had a passing efficiency rating above 168... That is the first time that has occurred since the final two games of the 2010 campaign... Two of the three-highest passing efficiency games of the Rocky Long-Andy Ludwig era have come in the past seven weeks... During the last 25 games, San Diego State has 47 touchdowns through the air with 13 interceptions... The Aztecs have just six interceptions in the past 12 games combined.

MUEMA MAKING HIS IMPACT FELT

- Sophomore Adam Muema is making his presence felt in his second season on the field. A native of Covina, Calif., Muema burst onto the scene last season when he rushed for 119 yards and two touchdowns against 10th-ranked Boise State.
- Muema ranks 28th nationally in rushing yards per game and is sixth among all FBS sophomores.
- Muema posted consecutive 100-yard rushing games earlier this season with a 13-carry, 124-yard and one-touchdown effort vs. North Dakota. He averaged 9.5 yards per rush in that contest.
- He followed that up with a career-high 202-yard effort on 25 carries and a touchdown against San Jose State. He averaged 8.1 yards per rush against the Spartans.
- Ran for 105 yards and two touchdowns on 14 carries vs. Colorado State.
- Had another set of back-to-back 100-yard rushing games with 143 on 21 rushes vs. UNLV and 127 and a touchdown on 25 carries at Boise State.
- Muema has six career 100-yard rushing games, including five this season.
- Dating back to last season, Muema has a rushing touchdown in nine of his last 11 games. He has 13 rushing touchdowns in his last 14 games.
- He already has 766 more yards rushing this season (1,019), than he did in six games last season (253).
- Of the FBS players with at least 1,000 yards rushing this season, Muema ranks eighth nationally in yards per carry (6.0).
- In just his 14th career game, Muema surpassed 1,000 career rushing yards.

KAZEE CLIMBING CHARTS

- San Diego State running back Walter Kazez has enjoyed a stellar start to his senior campaign. After suffering a season-ending knee injury in the ninth game last season, Kazez has proven that he is fully recovered by rushing for 681 yards on 130 carries through the first 10 games. He has eight rushing touchdowns this season and is averaging 5.2 yards per rush. All marks are career bests.
- Kazez has two 100-yard rushing games this season (UNLV and North Dakota) and three 100-yard efforts in his career.
- After posting a team-high 86 yards rushing in the opener at Washington, Kazez logged 51 yards on just seven carries against Army. He also rushed for two touchdowns against the Black Knights. He followed that up with his third career 100-yard rushing effort, with 105 yards and two touchdowns in the victory over North Dakota. Against San Jose State, Kazez rushed for 90 yards and one touchdown on 17 carries.
- Kazez has a rushing touchdown in six of his last nine games and eight rushing scores in the last nine outings.
- Kazez has 12 rushing touchdowns in his last 12 games. He has those 12 TDs in his last 152 carries.
- Kazez has rushed for at least an average of 5.3 yards in six of 10 games this season.
- He has four of his six highest rushing-total games and has posted three of his five highest per-average rushing games this season (see below).

ESCOBAR MAKING CASE AS NATION'S TOP TIGHT END

- Tight end Gavin Escobar has opened his junior year with impressive numbers, justifying his preseason selection on the John Mackey Award (top tight end) and Rotary Lombardi (top lineman) Watch Lists, and his midseason pick to the Mackey Award list.
- Escobar currently ranks in a tie for fourth in touchdowns (5), in a tie for seventh in receiving yards (483) and tie for 11th in receptions (35) among all tight ends in the country.
- Through 10 games, Escobar leads the team in each of those categories.
- He posted his third career 100-yard receiving game against North Dakota, catching five passes for 117 yards and a touchdown.
- His fourth 100-yard receiving effort came last week against UNLV. He caught four passes for 108 yards and a touchdown.
- He has three career games with multiple touchdowns, including one this year (at Nevada on Oct. 20).
- Escobar now has a reception in 17 straight games and has 100 yards or more receiving in four of his last 14 games.
- In his last 15 games, Escobar has 61 catches for 947 yards and seven touchdowns.
- He is in 17th-place on San Diego State's all-time reception list with 115 career catches.

AZTEC DEFENSE

- **OVERALL:** San Diego State ranks 55th nationally in scoring defense (25.70) and 44th in total defense (372.60)... The Aztec defense has played much better of late, refer to page three for details... SDSU ranks in a tie for 35th nationally in turnovers gained (18)... The Aztecs allowed just 173 yards of total offense in the victory against Hawai'i... That was the fewest yards allowed in a game since New Mexico had 162 yards last season... San Diego State allowed just 2.98 yards per offensive play, the lowest average since Nicholls State (2.71 ypp) on Sept. 4, 2010, the lowest against a FBS opponent since Colorado State (2.97 ypp) on Oct. 16, 2004, and the 33rd-lowest average in the Division I era... Prior to the game against North Dakota, the Aztecs had allowed seven points in the last 20 opponent drives... SDSU went 16 drives (the last seven of the Washington game and the first nine of the Army game) without allowing a point... The San Diego State defense got stronger as the game progressed at Washington... After allowing two touchdowns on the first two Husky possessions, the Aztecs did not allow a point on the final seven UW drives... In no game last season did UW go seven consecutive possessions without a point... Of Washington's 328 yards of total offense, 97 came on its first two possessions... The Huskies' 21 points (including a fumble return for a touchdown) came on a total of 97 yards of offense... San Jose State's first 17 points came on 24 yards of total offense... San Diego State has returned three interceptions for touchdowns this season, that ranks in a tie for sixth nationally behind SMU (6), Fresno State (5), Oregon (4), Stanford (4) and Toledo (4).

- **RUSH DEFENSE:** San Diego State is 27th nationally in rushing yards per game (124.10), 27th in av-

erage yards allowed per rush (3.5) and tied for 44th in fewest rushing touchdowns allowed (12)... Only three opponents this season (Army, UNLV and Boise State) has averaged more than 3.67 yards per rush... Two opponents (North Dakota and Colorado State) have been held below 2.05 yards per carry... San Diego State has 69 tackles for loss this season from 19 different players... At 6.90 tackles for loss per game, the Aztecs rank 26th nationally in the category... Three of SDSU's last eight opponents have failed to rush for 100 yards and the Aztecs have held an opponent to under 100 yards rushing in five of the last 13 games.

- **PASS DEFENSE:** San Diego State is 76th nationally in pass defense (248.50) and 94th in pass efficiency defense (140.34)... The Aztecs intercepted two of Army's nine pass attempts and picked off a pass against North Dakota, San Jose State and a pair passes at Fresno State... With nine interceptions this season, the Aztecs rank in a tie for 38th nationally in the category... The Black Knights' passing efficiency of 35.56 was the lowest for a San Diego State opponent since Nov. 29, 1986 against Brigham Young... The Aztecs had three sacks and three PBU in the season-opening game against Washington... Leon McFadden has an interception in three of his last seven games and returned an interception for a touchdown against North Dakota, the program's first defensive touchdown since Nov. 13, 2010, at No. 3 TCU, and the first interception return for a score since Nov. 28, 2009 at UNLV... McFadden has returned two picks for scores this season... He is one of just seven players in the country to have accomplished that.

McFADDEN CONTINUES SUCCESS AT CORNERBACK

- Senior cornerback Leon McFadden is on the Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List (Best Defensive Player) and the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (Best Defensive Back).
- McFadden was also named the Mountain West Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, the first Aztec to earn that honor (offense, defense or special teams).
- He is looking to become the fifth player in school history to earn first-team all-conference honors in three consecutive years.
- He is also looking to lead the league in passes defended (PBU + INT) for the third straight year.
- Has played in every single game at SDSU since arriving in 2009 as a true freshmen.
- Ranks second in school history with 37 pass breakups and sixth with 186 interception yards.
- Is just the second Aztec with two interceptions returned for a touchdown in a season (Tory Nixon in 1986).
- His two career interceptions for a touchdown trail only Ricky Parker's three from 1993-96.
- Is second in the Mountain West and is tied for 20th in the nation with 1.30 passes defended per game (13 total).
- Is tied for third in the Mountain West and tied for 67th in the country with 0.30 interceptions per game (3 total).
- Had a career-high eight tackles in the opener at Washington.
- Returned an interception 28 yards for a touchdown against North Dakota on its first pass attempt.
- Had an interception, tied a career high with three PBUs, and a tackle against San Jose State.
- Returned an interception 96 yards for a touchdown at Fresno State. It was tied for the sixth longest in program history and the longest since 1986. It was his third interception in three games and eighth of his career. Also had five tackles and a PBU.
- Forced his first career fumble vs. Hawai'i.

LONG HAS BEST DEBUT SEASON IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- Rocky Long, the school's 18th head coach, became the first San Diego State coach to lead the team to a bowl game in his inaugural season.
- Long is 15-8 in his first 23 games at San Diego State. He has produced the best 23-game coaching record since Claude Gilbert opened his tenure with a 18-3-2 record. Long's win total through 23 games is four higher than his predecessor, Brady Hoke (11-12).
- Rocky Long posted an 8-5 record in his first season as head coach of the Aztecs. That is the highest victory total in a SDSU head coaching debut season since Denny Stolz finished 8-4 in his first year in 1986.
- With eight first-year wins, Rocky Long had one more coaching victory in his inaugural season than the previous two San Diego State coaches combined (Brady Hoke went 4-8 in 2009 and Chuck Long was 3-9 in 2006).
- Last season marked the third time in Rocky Long's head coaching career that his team won at least eight games (also 2007 and 2003). His squads have won six or more games in eight of his last nine seasons as a head coach.
- Last year, Long helped guide the Aztecs to their first 3-0 start in 30 years, ended the program's 19-game losing streak to Pac-10/12 foes, snapped SDSU's 23-game losing streak to automatic-qualifying BCS teams and gave the program its first win in the Eastern Time Zone since 1972, all in the opening month of the season.
- San Diego State finished the 2011 season above .500 for only the second time in the last 13 seasons.
- The Aztecs won eight games in a campaign for just the second time in the last 15 seasons.
- Long has 77 victories while coaching teams in the Mountain West. That is tied with TCU's Gary Patterson for the most ever in the conference.

KATZ ESTABLISHING HIMSELF AS ONE OF THE TOP QBs IN WEST

- Senior quarterback Ryan Katz suffered a season-ending fracture to his left ankle in the first quarter of the game against Nevada (Oct. 20). Despite having his season cut short, Katz proved to be of the top quarterbacks in his abbreviated season.
- Katz made the most of his one season on The Mesa. After transferring from Oregon State prior to the 2012 spring semester, Katz was named the starter following the first week of fall camp.
- A dual-threat quarterback, he has made the most of his opportunities in the first seven games.
- San Diego State has its highest point total through eight games since the 1996 campaign. Senior quarterback Billy Blanton was in his third season as a starter during that season.
- Katz posted a career-high three-touchdown performance in which he was 11-of-18 for 241 yards with no interceptions against North Dakota. He recorded a passing efficiency rating of 228.58, which is the seventh-highest mark in school history.
- At Fresno State, Katz rushed for a career- and team-high 89 yards.
- Katz was responsible for a career-high five touchdowns in the victory over Hawai'i. Katz rushed for three scores and 57 yards on 10 carries, and added a 15-for-29, 190-yard, two-touchdown performance through the air.
- Katz passed for two touchdowns and rushed for another in the win against Colorado State. Against the Rams, he was 16-of-22 for 181 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions.
- His 13 touchdown passes this season were thrown to seven different receivers. He had a pass completion to 12 different receivers through the first seven games of this season.
- He had a streak of 91 consecutive pass attempts without an interception earlier this season and went three straight games without throwing a pick.
- Katz enters this week's game ranked 25th in passing efficiency in the nation and second in the Mountain West at 151.61. That is the sixth-highest passer rating in school history.
- Katz had three 200-yard passing games in his last seven outings.

SDSU FOOTBALL ACCEPTS INVITE TO JOIN THE BIG EAST

- The BIG EAST Conference announced in December 2011 that San Diego State University has accepted an invitation to join the league in the sport of football beginning with the 2013-14 academic year.

SDSU joins Boise State, Houston, Southern Methodist and Central Florida as the newest members of the league. The aforementioned five will join a football league that also consists of Cincinnati, Connecticut, Louisville, Rutgers and South Florida.

"I am extremely excited about our prospects for joining the BIG EAST in football," San Diego State University President Dr. Elliot Hirshman said. "This new conference affiliation will provide extraordinary opportunities for our student-athletes, our coaches and staff, our alumni and supporters and the entire University."

"This is a very important day in the history of the San Diego State athletic department," SDSU Athletic Director Jim Sterk said. "This affiliation with the BIG EAST Conference allows us to compete at the highest level in college football. This will give the athletic department and University attention on a national stage that we have not had before."

The BIG EAST is one of six conferences with an automatic berth to one of five Bowl Championship Series (BCS) games. The BCS includes the Rose Bowl Game, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl, Allstate Sugar Bowl, Discover Orange Bowl and the Allstate BCS National Championship Game.

In addition to the BCS automatic berth, the BIG EAST has tie-ins to the Champs Sports Bowl (Orlando, Fla.), Belk Bowl (Charlotte, N.C.), New Era Pinstripe Bowl (Bronx, N.Y.), BBVA Compass Bowl (Birmingham, Ala.), AutoZone Liberty Bowl (Memphis, Tenn.) and Beef 'O' Brady's Bowl St. Petersburg (St. Petersburg, Fla.).

The move to the BIG EAST provides San Diego State's football program with national television exposure through ABC, ESPN, BIG EAST Network, SportsNet New York (SNY) and the BIG EAST/IMG Sports National Radio Network.

San Diego State, which led the Mountain West in average home attendance this season (39,865), has a storied football tradition having won 18 conference championships and participated in nine bowl games, including last season's Poinsettia Bowl, which resulted in a 35-14 victory over Navy. A year after posting a 9-4 record, the Aztecs finished the 2011 season with an 8-4 mark and recently accepted an invitation to the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl where they will face Louisiana-Lafayette on Dec. 17. The back-to-back bowl appearances mark the first time San Diego State has accomplished that feat in its Division I history.

Individually, SDSU has produced 144 NFL draft picks, including 52 top-100 selections, and 104 All-Americans, including 19 first-teamers. In 2011 alone, San Diego State had the nation's third-leading rusher and had seven all-conference first-team picks, two second-teamers and one honorable mention choice.

McFADDEN NAMED PHIL STEELE MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICAN

- San Diego State senior cornerback Leon McFadden was named to Phil Steele's 2012 Midseason All-American team on Oct. 11 as a fourth-team selection. The Inglewood, Calif., native has enjoyed a stellar first 10 games of the season, tallying 48 tackles along with a team-high three interceptions that he notched in three straight games (Sept. 15-29).

On the season, McFadden leads the Aztecs in interceptions (3) and PBU's (9), and is one of seven with a forced fumble. He also has 48 tackles, including 37 solo stops. McFadden is 20th in the country in passes defended per game (1.30) and is tied for 67th with 0.30 interceptions per game.

McFadden has been instrumental to SDSU's defense this year as two of his three interceptions in 2012 have been returned for a touchdown. He is just the second Aztec with two interceptions returned for a touchdown in a season (also Tory Nixon in 1986). McFadden's two career interceptions for a touchdown trail only Ricky Parker's three from 1993-96.

GAVIN ESCOBAR NAMED TO MACKEY AWARD MIDSEASON WATCH LIST

■ San Diego State junior football player Gavin Escobar has been named to the 2012 Mackey Award Midseason Watch List, given annually to the most outstanding collegiate tight end, the Nassau County Sports Commission announced on Oct. 15.

It's the second consecutive year that Escobar has made the midseason watch list. He was already on the preseason watch list, which was announced in July.

In 10 games this season, the Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif., native leads the Aztecs with 35 receptions and 483 yards, while adding five touchdowns. Escobar, who is averaging 13.8 yards per catch and has 19 receptions for a first down, has caught at least one pass in 17 straight contests. He has 10 catches for 20 or more yards this year, the most on the team.

For his career, Escobar has 115 receptions for 1,586 yards and 16 touchdowns. The 115 receptions are 17th all-time at SDSU.

COLIN LOCKETT NAMED MW SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

■ San Diego State football player Colin Lockett has been named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week, the league announced on Nov. 5. It is the first career weekly award for the Diamond Bar, Calif., native.

Lockett set the tone for an outstanding special teams game for the Aztecs in their 21-19 win at No. 19/14 Boise State on Nov. 3 when he took the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown. It was tied for the longest ever by a SDSU player and was the program's first 100-yard kickoff return since 1979. The junior is one of only 16 players in the country this season with a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

Lockett now has two kickoff returns for a touchdown this season and a school-record three for his career. The three are tied for the second most in the country since 2011. Lockett finished the night with three kick returns for 141 yards (47.0 avg.).

On the year, Lockett has returned 27 kickoffs for 707 yards and the two touchdowns. The 26.2 average ranks third in the conference and 28th in the nation.

San Diego State has now had a player win the player-of-the-week award in five consecutive weeks, including Ryan Katz (offensive on Oct. 8), Jake Fely (defensive on Oct. 15 and Oct. 29), Chance Marden (special teams on Oct. 22) and Lockett (special teams on Nov. 5). Nat Berhe also was the MW Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 10.

Additionally, Lockett was named a College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) National Kickoff Returner of the Week. Lockett was joined by Utah's Reggie Dunn, Kansas State's Tyler Lockett, Oklahoma State's Desmond Roland, Temple's Matt Brown and Middle Tennessee State's Reggie Whatley.

JAKE FELY NAMED MW DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (OCT. 29)

■ San Diego State sophomore football player Jake Fely (San Diego/Oceanside HS) has been named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week, the league announced Oct. 29. It is the second career award for the Oceanside, Calif., native and his second in three weeks.

Fely became the first Aztec to earn MW Defensive Player-of-the-Week honors twice in the same season since linebacker Joe Martin in 2006.

Fely had a team-high and game-tying-high 11 tackles in San Diego State's 24-13 victory over UNLV on Oct. 27. The win made the Aztecs bowl eligible for the third consecutive season and stretched their win streak to four games. Fely's 11 tackles were the second most of his career, while his 2.0 sacks tied a career high. He also added 2.0 tackles for loss (both the sacks) and forced his first fumble of the season and fourth of his career.

It was the third time this season that Fely led SDSU in tackles and fifth time in his career. On the season, Fely ranks second on the squad with 66 tackles and first in tackles for loss (11.0) and sacks (7.0). His 0.70 sacks per game ranks in a tie for 39th in the country.

MARDEN NAMED MW SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK (OCT. 22)

■ San Diego State football player Chance Marden (Fremont, Calif.) was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week, the league announced Oct. 22. It is the first career weekly award for Marden.

Marden, a senior in his first year with the football program after spending four seasons (one redshirt) with the men's soccer team, scored a career-high 11 points to help SDSU to a 39-38, come-from-behind overtime victory at Nevada on Oct. 20. Marden was 3-for-3 on field goal attempts and made both of his PAT opportunities. He connected on field goals of 39, 46 and 35 yards with the latter coming as time expired in regulation, forcing the game into overtime. The 46-yarder in the second quarter was a career long for Marden.

■ San Diego State football player Jake Fely has been named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week, the league announced on Oct. 15. Additionally, the Oceanside, Calif., native was picked as one of two national defensive performers of the week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA).

A linebacker, Fely had a career-high 13 tackles (his previous best was eight) in the Aztecs' 38-14 victory over Colorado State on Oct. 13. He also set career highs with 2.0 sacks and 3.5 tackles for loss, while recovering his second fumble of his career (and season). The 2.0 sacks were the most by an SDSU player since Miles Burris had 2.0 vs. Fresno State on Dec. 3, 2011, while his 3.5 TFL were the most since Burris had 3.5 vs. UNLV on Nov. 27, 2010.

It was the first Mountain West weekly award for Fely.

Fely was joined by Rutgers' Khaseem Greene as the CFPA Defensive Performers of the Week. Fely was also chosen as a linebacker performer of the week (along with Greene), while teammate Derek Largent (eight tackles, two interceptions) was an honorable mention selection on the linebacker list.

RYAN KATZ NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (OCT. 8)

■ San Diego State football player Ryan Katz has been named the Mountain West Co-Offensive Player of the Week, the league announced on Oct. 8. It was the first weekly honor for the senior and Oregon State transfer.

Katz accounted for five touchdowns and 247 yards of total offense to lead the Aztecs to a 52-14 victory over Hawai'i on Oct. 6. On the ground, the Santa Monica, Calif., native carried 10 times for 57 yards and a career-high three touchdowns, including scoring runs of 27, 34 and nine yards. Katz became the first SDSU quarterback with three rushing touchdowns since Kevin O'Connell had three at Colorado State on Oct. 6, 2007.

Katz added 190 yards through the air with two touchdown passes, his then 10th and 11th of the season and then 29th and 30th of his career.

New Mexico's Kasey Carrier shared the award with Katz.

NAT BERHE EARNS MOUNTAIN WEST DEFENSIVE POW HONORS (SEPT. 8)

■ San Diego State junior football player Nat Berhe has been named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week, for his efforts in the Aztecs' victory over Army on Sept. 8. It is the second career weekly honor for the Colton, Calif., native.

Berhe, a defensive back, had a then career-high 14 tackles, including 10 solo stops, to lead SDSU to a 42-7 victory over Army on Saturday. He also had one tackle for a loss and a pass breakup while anchoring a defense that forced three turnovers and limited the Black Knights to just 50 yards passing.

Berhe and the San Diego State defense held Army without an offensive score for its first nine possessions of the game before a Black Knight scored with 5:54 left to play in the third quarter. The touchdown snapped the Aztecs' streak of not allowing an offensive score at 16 possessions (also last seven at Washington), which was a total of 86:41 of clock time.

FIVE AZTECS ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

■ San Diego State has placed five student-athletes on preseason national award watch lists in 2012. Junior tight end Gavin Escobar, senior center Alec Johnson, senior running back Walter Kazee, junior Colin Lockett and senior Leon McFadden are on the initial short list for their positions' top honors.

Escobar (Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif.) is one of 33 players on the John Mackey Award Watch List (most outstanding tight end) and one of 145 on the Rotary Lombardi Award Watch List (top lineman). Last season, the Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif., native reeled in 51 catches for 780 yards and seven touchdowns. His 51 receptions and 780 receiving yards were the second most by a tight end in school history. Escobar averaged 60.00 receiving yards per game, which were the third most in the country among tight ends. He ended up earning all-Mountain West honors for the second consecutive season (first team in 2011, second team in 2010). Escobar is on the preseason all-conference team for this year. This season, Escobar leads the Aztecs with 35 catches, 483 receiving yards and five touchdowns.

Johnson (Denver, Colo.) is one of 51 players on the Rimington Trophy Award Watch List (best center). Johnson, one of SDSU's two returning starters on the offensive line, entered the 2012 campaign having made 29 career starts and is slated to start at center for the second consecutive year. Last season, Johnson never missed a game despite breaking his snapping hand (right) in the Aztecs' season opener. The MW academic all-conference honoree also helped SDSU rush for nearly 2,400 yards as well as finish among the nation's leaders in fewest sacks allowed (T-7th, 0.85 per game) and in fewest tackles for a loss allowed (15th, 4.46 per game).

Kazee (San Bernardino, Calif.) is one of 52 candidates on the Doak Walker Award Watch List (top running back). Last year, Kazee rushed for 339 yards and four touchdowns on 74 carries (4.6 yards per rush) before a knee injury in the ninth game sidelined him for the rest of the season. Kazee also caught eight passes for 89 yards. For his career, Kazee has 1,711 rushing yards and 17 touchdowns on 357 rushes (4.8 yards per carry). Additionally, Kazee has 212 yards receiving on 24 catches. This year, Kazee has career highs of 681 yards, 130 carries, 5.2 yards per carry and eight rushing touchdowns.

Lockett (Diamond Bar, Calif.) is one of 48 athletes on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List (most outstanding wide receiver). Lockett led SDSU in receiving last year with 970 yards and his 74.6 receiving yards per game ranked fourth in the conference. Lockett also tallied 678 yards on special teams in 2011, including a 94-yard kickoff return touchdown in the season opener against Cal Poly. He's also on the 2012 preseason all-conference team. Lockett has 17 catches this season for 256 yards and three touchdowns. He also has 27 kickoff returns for 707 yards (26.2 average per kickoff return), including a career-long 100-yard return for a touchdown at Boise State and a 96-yard return for a touchdown vs. Army.

McFadden (Inglewood, Calif.) is one of 84 players on the Bronco Nagurski Trophy Award Watch List (best defensive player) and one of 35 on the Jim Thorpe Award Watch List (best defensive back). McFadden, who became the first San Diego State player to be named a preseason player of the year (offense, defense or special teams) in July, is looking to become the fifth Aztec in program history to earn first-team all-conference honors in three consecutive years. Last year, McFadden led the league in passes defended (17), while recording 46 tackles (35 solo), two interceptions and a sack. This year, McFadden has recorded 48 tackles, 10 pass breakups, three interceptions, two interceptions returned for a score and a forced fumble.

SDSU TABBED TO FINISH FIFTH BY LEAGUE MEDIA

■ The San Diego State football team is picked to finish fifth in the Mountain West preseason poll, which was released on July 24. The Aztecs had 173 points in the 2012 preseason poll, which is voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

The fifth-place projection is SDSU's second highest in the last eight years. Last season, San Diego State was selected fourth and finished fourth. It marked the sixth time in the last seven years that the Aztecs finished at or higher than their projected finish. SDSU also picked up one of the 30 first-place votes, a first in its 14-year history of the MW.

Boise State was picked to win the league with 296 points, including 27 first-place votes. Only 74 points separated the second-place team (Nevada, 244 points) and the sixth-place team (Air Force, 170 points). Fresno State was third with 231 points and two first-place votes, while Wyoming (213 points) and SDSU (173 points) rounded out the top five at fourth and fifth, respectively.

MCFADDEN NAMED MW PRESEASON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

■ San Diego State defensive back Leon McFadden has been selected as the Mountain West Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, the league announced in July. McFadden was joined on the preseason all-conference team by tight end Gavin Escobar and wide receiver Colin Lockett.

McFadden became the first San Diego State player to be named a preseason player of the year (offense, defense or special teams). McFadden, who is looking to become the fifth Aztec in program history to earn first-team all-conference honors in three consecutive years, is on the preseason watch list for the Nagurski Award (top defensive player) and the Thorpe Award (top defensive back). He's also the third player in the last 11 years (also Kirk Morrison and Lynell Hamilton) to be named to the preseason all-conference team for a second time. The Inglewood, Calif., native led the league in passes defended (17) last year, while recording 46 tackles (35 solo), two interceptions and a sack.

Escobar, who is on the preseason watch list for the Lombardi Award (top lineman) and the Mackey Award (top tight end), had 51 catches a year ago for 780 yards and seven touchdowns. His 60.00 receiving yards per game in 2011 were the third most in the nation among tight ends. The Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif., native was an honorable mention All-American last year by Sports Illustrated after earning freshman All-America accolades by Sporting News in 2010.

A member of the Biletnikoff Award Watch List (most outstanding wide receiver), Lockett led SDSU in receiving last year with 970 yards. Lockett, who also had 58 catches and eight touchdowns, averaged 74.6 receiving yards per game, which ranked fourth in the conference. Lockett also tallied 678 yards on special teams in 2011, including a 94-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the season-opener against Cal Poly.

SDSU ANNOUNCES TEAM CAPTAINS

■ San Diego State head coach Rocky Long announced that seniors Leon McFadden, Walter Kazee and Dominique Sandifer have been named football team captains for the 2012 season. This year, the special teams captain will be selected on a week-by-week basis.

McFadden, a senior defensive back from Inglewood, Calif., has played in 48 games in his three-plus seasons as an Aztec. McFadden had a solid season last year recording 46 tackles in 13 contests, had two interceptions and averaged almost six yards per carry on punt returns. McFadden ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West for the second consecutive year and 12th nationally in passes defended with 17, including six more breakups than any other player in the league. He enters 2012 as the preseason Mountain West defensive player of the year.

Kazee, a senior running back from San Bernardino, Calif., has tallied 1,711 total yards in his 40-game career at SDSU. Kazee had one of his best seasons last year in becoming SDSU's second-leading rusher with 339 yards on 74 carries and four scores. He was also effective in the passing game as he tallied eight catches for 89 yards (11.1 ypc).

Sandifer, a senior wide receiver from Gardena, Calif., is a two-year letterwinner who had his 2011 season derailed by injury. Prior to his setback, he played in 23 straight games from 2009-2010 in 2010 and was part of the 2010 Poinsettia Bowl team. He is one of two senior wide receivers, but the only one to have worn a SDSU uniform. In his first two seasons, he tallied 561 yards, averaging 11.5 yards per reception.

- In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MWC-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.

OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85.
- Also served as an assistant coach at TCU, with the CFL's British Columbia team and started his career at New Mexico has a graduate assistant coach in 1972.

PLAYING EXPERIENCE:

- Originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned team most valuable player honors and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- Long played professionally in the CFL with British Columbia in 1972-73 and 1975-76. He also competed in the World Football League with the Detroit Wheels in 1974.
- Attended Alta Loma High School in Alta Loma, Calif.

Hannah, meanwhile, is the head women's basketball coach at Texas Lutheran, an NCAA Division III school in the American Southwest Conference. Hannah is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school Georgetown, Texas. She is a four-time conference coach of the year and this past season led the Pirates to the NCAA regional semifinals and a 30-4 overall record.

SEATTLE -- San Diego State was unable to overcome an early deficit and three turnovers in a 21-12 loss at Washington in the 2012 season opener for both teams.

The Aztecs threw an interception on their first drive and punted on a three and out on their second, and the Huskies took advantage with touchdowns on both possessions.

UW, which took over on the SDSU 35 after the interception, got in the end zone on a two-yard run by Bishop Sankey.

Quarterback Keith Price drove Washington 62 yards on the team's next drive, culminating in a 8-yard pass to Kasen Williams.

After the slow start, the San Diego State defense stood tall the rest of the way, limiting the Huskies to 231 yards and no points on their final seven drives.

The Aztecs got on the scoreboard on the first play of the second quarter when quarterback Ryan Katz found a wide-open Tim Vizzi on the left side, who ran 47 yards for the touchdown. SDSU, however, failed on the 2-point conversion.

Early in the third quarter, UW safety Will Shamburger returned a fumble 44 yards to give the home team the 21-6 advantage.

Adam Muema completed an 11-play, 71-yard drive in the fourth when he pounded it in on a 4th and 1. But once again, San Diego State was unable to convert the 2-point conversion and trailing, 21-12.

After forcing Washington to punt, the Aztecs tried to mount another scoring drive. They went 76 yards, highlighted by a 26-yard run by Walter Kazee and a 32-yard pass from Katz to Colin Lockett. SDSU got to the Huskies' 8-yard line on third down, but missed on consecutive pass attempts, giving the ball back to UW.

Washington ran most of the 4:44 left on the clock and San Diego State's last-ditch effort fell short in the 21-12 setback. It was the Aztecs' first season-opening loss since 2009.

Kazee, who missed the end of last year with a knee injury, ran for a game-high 86 yards on nine carries, his highest total since the first game of the 2009 season and the first game of his career.

Katz added a career-high 77 yards on the ground and passed for another 128. Lockett led all Aztecs with four catches and 48 yards in the loss.

SDSU had multiple turnovers for only the second time in its last nine games, dating back to last year. San Diego State finished the 2011 season with just one turnover over its final three games.

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State scored the first 35 points of the game en route to a dominating 42-7 victory over Army in the 2012 home opener for the Aztecs.

SDSU forced three turnovers, scored four rushing touchdowns and a passing score, and added a 96-yard kickoff return for another touchdown in the program's largest margin of victory since the 2010 opener.

SAN DIEGO (AP) --Ryan Katz threw for 241 yards and three touchdowns as San Diego State outlasted North Dakota 49-41 on Saturday night.

Adam Muema rushed for 124 yards and Walter Kazee added 105 for the Aztecs (2-1).

Marcus Hendrickson connected on 27 of 50 passes for 434 yards and four TDs for North Dakota (2-1). Three TDs went to Greg Hardin, who had eight receptions for 142 yards.

Hendrickson's 15-yard scoring pass in to Tyrhe Ivery brought North Dakota within 49-41 with 6:17 remaining. UND got the ball back with 1:52 left, but came up a half-yard short on a fourth down pass play at its 38-yard line, and San Diego State ran out the clock.

Katz completed 8 of 11 passes for 195 yards in the first half, throwing TD strikes to Brice Butler (44 yards), Colin Lockett (37 yards) and Gavin Escobar (20 yards) as the Aztecs built a 35-20 halftime lead.

Escobar finished with five receptions for 117 yards.

The temperature at kickoff was 97 degrees, the hottest for a San Diego State home game since Sept. 8, 1984, when it was 93 for a contest against UCLA.

Behind quarterback David Fales, the Spartans rallied with a 5-play, 65-yard drive that culminated with a 14-yard pass to Chandler Jones with just 50 seconds left.

It was the final dagger for the Aztecs, who couldn't mount one more comeback.

Fales finished the game 21-for-31 for 260 yards and four touchdowns to give SJSU its third straight win in the series.

FRESNO, Calif. -- Derek Carr threw for a career-high 536 yards and five touchdowns to lead Fresno State over San Diego State in the Mountain West opener for both teams at Bulldog Stadium.

It was a back and forth game as the Aztecs led by as many as 14 in the first quarter and trailed by as many as 13 in the second quarter. SDSU took its final lead at 40-36 early in the second half when Leon McFadden returned an interception 96 yards for a touchdown. It was his third straight game with an interception and second interception return for a touchdown in three contests.

Carr, however, hit Isaiah Burse with a 31-yard touchdown pass and, following a 27-yard field goal by Quentin Breshears, tossed a 5-yard TD to Rashad Evans to give the Bulldogs a win in their first-ever Mountain West game.

Ryan Katz passed for 160 yards and two touchdowns for San Diego State and led all rushers with 89 yards on 13 carries, including a career-long 67-yard run.

Adam Muema rushed for 64 yards and scored two touchdowns, while Brice Butler (8 yards) and D.J. Shields (5 yards) each caught a touchdown pass.

Eric Pinkins scored on a 32-yard interception return for a touchdown, giving the Aztecs three in the past three contests after not having one the previous 28 games.

SAN DIEGO -- Ryan Katz rushed for three touchdowns and passed for another two as San Diego State avoided a three-game losing streak with a 52-14 victory over Hawai'i at Qualcomm Stadium.

Katz rushed for 57 yards, including scoring runs of 27, 34 and nine yards to become the first Aztec quarterback with three rushing touchdowns in a game since Kevin O'Connell had three at Colorado State on Oct. 6, 2007.

Katz added 190 yards through the air with two touchdown passes - a 36-yard strike to Brice Butler and a 31-yard completion to Adam Muema - to finish with 247 yards of total offense.

Muema added a 1-yard touchdown run and ended the night with 77 yards on 20 carries, while Chase Price got in the end zone for the first time of his career with a 2-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.

The SDSU defense limited the Warriors to 173 total yards of offense and forced three turnovers.

The game was played before 50,586 fans, which was the 13th-largest home game in program history. The San Diego State offense put up some fireworks prior to the annual SkyShow game, as its 52 points were its most since also scoring 52 against Portland State on Sept. 22, 2007.

SAN DIEGO -- Adam Muema rushed for two touchdowns and Ryan Katz passed for two scores and ran for another to lead San Diego State to a 38-14 victory over Colorado State at Qualcomm Stadium.

Muema had 105 yards on 14 carries, while Katz was 16-for-22 for 181 yards and no interceptions. Walter Kazee added 95 yards on the ground for the Aztecs, who finished without a penalty for the first time since Nov. 3, 1971 at San Jose State.

The SDSU defense forced three Ram turnovers (two interceptions by Derek Largent and a forced fumble by Josh Wade (recovered by Jake Fely) and turned them into three touchdowns and 21 points.

San Diego State took just four plays and 1:47 to score on its opening drive, culminating with a 51-yard run by Muema. CSU responded with a 15-play, 72-yard drive that took up 5:33 of clock time when M.J. McPeek found Kiv Cartwright on a 2-yard pass on four and goal.

The Aztecs scored 31 unanswered points before a 1-yard run by Tommey Morris in the fourth quarter doubled Colorado State's scoring total.

RENO, Nev. -- Backup quarterback Adam Dingwell threw three touchdown passes and a two-point conversion in overtime to San Diego State a 39-38 victory over Nevada.

Dingwell, who replaced an injured Ryan Katz after the team's second drive of the game, completed 14 of 23 passes for 177 yards. He came into the contest with two career completions for 28 yards.

After Nevada went up 38-31 in overtime on a 3-yard TD pass from Cody Fajardo to Brandon Wimberly, the Aztecs needed two just plays to pull to within 38-37, scoring on a 21-yard pass from Dingwell to Gavin Escobar. The Aztecs elected to go for the win and Dingwell sealed it with a pass to Adam Roberts in the corner of the end zone for the successful two-point conversion.

San Diego State trailed, 31-28, and tied it on a 35-yard field goal by Chance Marden as time expired in regulation to force overtime.

Nevada's Stephon Jefferson, the nation's leading rusher finished was held to 108 yards on 32 carries, and scored on a 1-yard touchdown run that put the Wolf Pack up 31-21 with 7:46 left in the game.

Dominique Sandifer had five catches for 60 yards and a touchdown, while Escobar caught five balls for 39 yards and two scores. Walter Kazee (15 rushes, 58 yards) also scored a rushing touchdown for the Aztecs.

SAN DIEGO -- Adam Dingwell threw for 231 yards and two touchdowns in his first-ever start to lead San Diego State to a 24-13 victory against UNLV at Qualcomm Stadium.

Dingwell, who replaced Ryan Katz after he suffered a season-ending broken ankle the week before at Nevada, became the first Aztec quarterback to win his first start since Spencer Brinton did so in 1997.

Dingwell threw touchdown passes to Gavin Escobar (12 yards) in the second quarter and Colin Lockett (27 yards) in the third period. Escobar had 108 yards on four receptions.

Adam Muema ran for 143 yards on 21 carries and Walter Kazee added 105 yards and a touchdown on 21 rushes for the Aztecs (6-3, 4-1 Mountain West). It was the second time this season both runners eclipsed 100 yards in the same game and the 16th time that has happened in program history.

The Rebels scored first when Tim Cornett broke free for a 64-yard touchdown on their opening drive after SDSU was forced to punt. San Diego State, however, scored a touchdown each over the next three quarters to open a 21-6 lead. UNLV's Nick Sherry found Devante Davis with 25-yard TD pass to cut the lead to eight late in the third quarter, but a 28-yard field goal by Chance Marden in the fourth sealed the 11-point win for the Aztecs.

With the win, SDSU became bowl eligible for the third consecutive season.

TEAM NOTES

* San Diego State finished with multiple 100-yard rushers for the second time this season and 16th time in program history. It's the second time in school history that SDSU has had two players each break 100-yard rushing in two games in the same season (also 1998 when Jonas Lewis and Larry Ned did it).

* With the win, San Diego State became bowl eligible for the third consecutive season.

* The Aztecs claimed their sixth victory of the season tonight (Oct. 27), the fifth-earliest date for a sixth win in the Division I era and the earliest date for a sixth victory since 1993.

* Jordan Smith (TE) joined Dingwell as a player making his first start tonight. San Diego State has now had 15 players make their first start with the Aztecs this season and 13 earn their first Division I start.

* SDSU has received the ball first in all nine games this season.

* San Diego State held its opponent without a first down to open the second half for the third straight game. Opponents have -(minus)20 yards in those drives.

* The Aztecs scored a touchdown on their opening drive of the second half for the third time in the past five games and for the fourth time overall.

* SDSU was 2-for-2 on fourth down conversions tonight and is 9-for-14 (64.3 percent) on the season. Last year it was 9-for-23 (39.1 percent).

BOISE, Idaho -- San Diego State used an opening 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown and solid special teams play all around to defeat No. 19/14 Boise State, 21-19, at Bronco Stadium. It was the fifth straight win for the Aztecs, who snapped a 31-game road/neutral losing streak against top-25 AP teams.

Colin Lockett returned the opening kickoff for the 100-yard score, his second of the season and third of his career. Dwayne Garrett later blocked a Bronco punt, which set up a 3-yard run by Adam Muema and put SDSU up, 14-13, early in the third quarter.

Early in the fourth, Walter Kazee capped a 10-play, 80-yard drive that took up 6:45 of clock time with a 1-yard rushing touchdown on a fourth and goal.

Southwick led BSU on a 16-play, 75-yard drive capped by his 1-yard touchdown toss to fullback Dan Paul that pulled Boise State within 21-19. The Broncos went for 2, but Southwick was pressured and Rene Siluano picked off his pass near the goal line.

San Diego State ran out the clock on its ensuing drive to hand BSU just its second loss in its last 73 regular season home games.

Muema rushed for 127 yards on 25 carries to lead the Aztec rushing attack.
