2013 Season Recap



TRAIGHT BOWL GAME APPEARANCES ▶ 19 CONFERENCE CHAMPIO

Most San Diego State fans had cautious optimism entering the 2013 football season. Although the Aztecs were coming off a 2012 conference title, their first since 1998, and a school-record three straight bowl games, SDSU had to replace three players that were selected in the NFL Draft. To make things more challenging, the Aztecs had a non-conference game with national-power Ohio State and had a crossdivision conference game with Boise State.

Expectations took a hit in the opener when San Diego State suffered a loss to Eastern Illinois, a team that would advance to the guarterfinal round of the NCAA FCS playoffs.

But despite an 0-3 start and the insertion of a walk-on quarterback five quarters into the season, SDSU rallied to win eight of its last 10 games, including a 49-24 statement win over Buffalo in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

The dramatic turnaround gave San Diego State a fourth consecutive bowl appearance, leaving the Aztecs and Stanford as the only football teams (FBS or NFL) in the state of California to reach postseason play four consecutive sea-

In addition, SDSU's dramatic turnaround and season full of close wins were historic in nature.

- ▶ In 2013, San Diego State became the first team in the nation since 2010 and just the 19th team since 1980 to make a bowl game after starting the season 0-3.
- ► The Aztecs played eight games that were decided by seven points or less. That figure was tied with UCF for the most games in the FBS last season. SDSU was an impressive 6-2 in those contests and won its last four games decided by seven points or less.
- ► San Diego State tied an FBS record by playing in four overtime games in a single season. The Aztecs posted a 3-1 record in those contests.
- ▶ SDSU rallied from a fourth-quarter deficit to win five times last year. That was the highest total in the FBS in 2013.
- ▶ San Diego State rallied from a 14-point or greater deficit to win three games last season. That was the highest total in FBS play last season.
- ▶ The Aztecs finished with a 6-2 conference record and in sole possession of second place in the West Division of the
- ▶ Since Sept. 28, 2013, San Diego State has posted an 8-2 record, which is tied for the 10th-highest winning percentage in the country and tied for the best in the Mountain West. Additionally, the 8-2 mark since Sept. 28, 2013, is the highest winning percentage in the state of California.

ANOTHER YEAR TO REMEMBER

- ▶ San Diego State advanced to its fourth consecutive bowl game. The Aztecs joined Stanford as the only football teams in California - FBS or NFL - to advance to the postseason in each of the past four seasons.
- ▶ SDSU is one of 29 schools to play in a bowl game in each of the last four seasons, which marks the longest streak in the Mountain West, San Diego State and Boise State are the only two current Mountain West schools to reach a bowl game in 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013.
- ▶ With bowl game appearances in a school-record four straight seasons, the Aztecs equaled their total number of bowls played in the 41 prior campaigns (1969 through 2009).
- ▶ Between 2000-09, SDSU was 38-80 (.322) and owned the nation's 106th-best winning percentage. Since 2010, San Diego State is 34-18 (.654) and owns the nation's 28th-best winning percentage.
- ▶ Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, San Diego State has posted a 34-18 record (.654). The only teams in the state of California with a better record during that span are Stanford and USC.

- ▶ The 34 wins from 2010 through 2013 is the highest fouryear total since SDSU won 36 (36-7-1) from 1974-77.
- ► San Diego State defeated Boise State in consecutive seasons (2012 and 2013), becoming the first team to accomplish the feat since Washington State did it in 2000 and 2001.
- ▶ Since the beginning of 2010, the Aztecs have won 34 games. The total is more than any other team while a member of the league (Air Force and TCU are second at 24).

IN LONG WE TRUST

Head coach Rocky Long continues to leave his legacy on the Mountain West and now San Diego State.

Note the following:

- ▶ Is the MW's all-time leader in coaching victories (87).
- ▶ Was named the MW Coach of the Year in 2012, 10 years after winning the award while at New Mexico.
- ▶ Is tied with Claude Gilbert for the most coaching victories (25) ever through the first three seasons with the Aztecs.
- ▶ Owns the third-best coaching record in program history
- ▶ Is the only coach to lead San Diego State to a bowl game in his first three seasons as head coach and joins Don Coryell as the only coach to lead the Aztecs to three bowl games.

MORE PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

▶ San Diego State has produced 11 NFL Draft selections since 2011, including Nat Berhe (5th round, No. 152 to New York Giants) and Eric Pinkins (6th round, No. 208 to Seattle Seahawks) in May. That is tied for the 30th-highest total nationally and is second among current MW schools (Boise State, 13).

BOWL VICTORY

San Diego State capped its season with a convincing, 49-24 victory over Buffalo. The 25-point victory was the largest margin in a bowl game in school history and provided the Aztecs with just their second bowl win in 44 seasons.

SDSU never trailed in the contest and struck for a touchdown and field goal in the final 71 seconds of the first half to open up a 28-10 advantage at intermission. San Diego State built its advantage to 32 points on two occasions in the second half, before settling for the 25-point win.

As a team, the Aztecs rushed for 249 yards, while their five touchdowns were the most in a 2013/14 bowl game.



SAN DIEGO - Eastern Illinois spoiled San Diego State's season-opener by scoring three unanswered touchdowns in the second half to pull away for a 40-19 victory in front of 42,978 fans at Qualcomm Stadium.

Aztec quarterback Adam Dingwell posted career-highs of 27 completions and 318 passing yards to go along with a school-record 63 attempts. However, the junior signal-caller threw four interceptions and lost a fumble as the Panthers converted three of those miscues into touchdowns to help secure the upset.

SDSU scored on the opening drive of the game as Wes Feer booted the first of his four field goals on night, before EIU responded with a 37-yard touchdown pass from Jimmy Garoppolo to Erik Lora with 11:14 to go in the first guarter.

The Aztecs reclaimed the lead on their ensuing possession when wide receiver Colin Lockett sprinted 48 yards to paydirt on a reverse, putting the host school up 10-7. Feer then added another field goal from 35 yards out later in the period to extend the Aztec advantage

to 13-7.

Garoppolo, who finished the game with 361 yards on 31-of-46 attempts, threw a pair of TD passes in the second quarter, a 4-yard toss to Lora and a 62-yard strike to Keiondre Gober, thrusting the visitors in front by a 19-13 margin

after both conversions attempts went awry.

With time winding down in the half. Eric Pinkins' fumble return gave SDSU the ball in Panther territory. However, the Aztecs had to settle for a field goal when their subsequent drive stalled at the 5-yard line, giving the contest its 19-16 score at intermission.

After holding EIU to a three-and-out to start the third quarter, SDSU knotted the game at 19-19 when Feer connected from 38 vards away with just over four minutes elapsed. However, the Panthers took the ball and marched 75 yards in 12 plays, taking the lead for good when running back Taylor Duncan scored on a two-yard run with 7:36 remaining in the period

After limiting the Aztecs to just four plays on their next possession, Sheperd Little returned the ensuing punt 60 yards to the end zone, putting EIU up 33-19 early in the fourth quarter. Later in the period, Duncan closed out the scoring with a 45-yard touchdown burst with 4:40 left.

Despite maintaining a nearly 16-minute advantage in time of possession and running the fourth-most plays from scrimmage in school history (99), SDSU was outgained 533-440 in total offense.

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Making its first appearance in Ohio Stadium since 2005, San Diego State came up on the short end of 42-7 decision against No. 3/2 Ohio State in front of 104,984 fans. The Buckeyes scored six touchdowns on their first nine drives to build an insurmountable lead and maintained a 263-64 advantage in rushing yardage to help key their victory.

Junior quarterback Quinn Kaehler made his Aztec debut, completing 22 of 36 passes for 216 yards with one touchdown and one interception after replacing an injured Adam Dingwell late in the first quarter. The transfer from Diablo Valley College went 4-4 on SDSU's lone scoring drive, connecting with wide receivers Ezell Ruffin and Colin Lockett for a pair of 18yard receptions following a 17-yard completion to tight end Adam Roberts. Freshman running back Donnel Pumphrey then gained 17 yards on two carries before Kaehler hit fullback Chad Young on 2-yard swing pass to cap the 11-play, 66-yard march with 2:54 remaining in the third quarter.

Kaehler also directed a 10-play, 62-yard drive late in the second half, fueled by two 17-

yard strikes to reserve tight end Robert Craighead and Ruffin. However, the Aztecs came up empty after reaching the Ohio State 2, as Kaehler's short toss to Ruffin was broken up by Doran Grant in the end zone with no time left on the clock.

Still, Ruffin finished with a career-high six receptions for 80 yards, while Lockett added six catches for 58 yards. Lockett also returned five kickoffs for 105 yards to become SDSU's all-time leader in kickoff return yardage.

The Buckeyes opened the scoring on their initial possession, driving 50 yards on eight plays, as Dontre Wilson found the end zone on a 7-yard sweep. Following an OSU interception and an exchange of punts, the Buckeyes put together another scoring march, culminating in a 27-yard touchdown pass from Kenny Guiton to Corey Brown. The Ohio State duo also combined on a 24-yard scoring strike in the third quarter that gave the host school a 42-0 cush-

Guiton passed for 152 yards on 21-of-30 attempts with two TDs and an interception after relieving injured starter Braxton Miller in the first quarter. Guiton also added 83 yards on the ground, highlighted by a 44-yard TD run on a quarterback keeper in the second quarter.

The Aztec defense was led by Vaness Harris, who posted eight tackles, including four solo stops, in his first start of the season, while Damontae Kazee made six unassisted tackles of his own. Kazee, a redshirt freshman, also recorded his first collegiate interception in the second quarter.

In the second guarter, San Diego State used a career-long 45-yard field goal by Wes Feer and a 2-yard run by Adam Muema to open up a 24-14 lead at the half.

Feer made it 27-14 Aztecs with a 40-yard field goal with 1:55 left in the third guarter.

The Beavers answered in the fourth with a 10-play, 65-yard drive, capped by a 2-yard pass from Mannion to Kevin Cummings

Feer made another field goal for with 5:18 left to put SDSU up, 30-21, but Ward's 10-yard TD reception and the Nelson interception return for a score sealed the win for OSU.

Kaehler completed 16 of 24 passes for 251 yards and two touchdowns after taking over the starting job when Adam Dingwell injured his back the previous week against Ohio State. His pass efficiency rating of 158.74 was the highest by an Aztec quarterback in their starting debut since Kevin McKechnie had a 291.82 mark on Sept. 5, 1997, against Navy. The 30 points that SDSU scored was also its most in an Aztec quarterback debut since that 1997 game, when SDSU defeated the Midship-

Lockett finished with five catches for 113 yards, the fourth 100-yard game of his career, and Muema rushed a career-high 28 times for 71 yards and a touchdown.

King Holder had a career-high 11 tackles and a career-best two PBUs to pace the San Diego State defense. Nat Berhe added nine tackles and Eric Pinkins recorded eight stops.

Both teams were penalized heavily as Oregon State committed 13 penalties for 99 yards and the Aztecs committed nine penalties

Mannion completed 38 of 55 attempts for 367 yards, and the Oregon State rushing game was held to just 10 yards.

LAS CRUCES, N.M. - Behind Donnel Pumphrey's three second-half touchdowns, San Diego State overcame a slow start to defeat New Mexico State, 26-16, at Aggie Memorial Stadium.

Pumphrey rushed for a career-high 167 yards on 19 carries, while Quinn Kaehler completed 22 of 34 passes for 229 yards to help the Aztecs post their first victory of the season and keep the Aggies winless on the year. With the triumph, SDSU has now captured the last seven meetings against NMSU and raised its record to 9-1-1 in the all-time series.

But it wasn't easy. The Aztecs watched the Aggies open with 16 unanswered points, while Pumphrey was held to just 14 yards on four rushes before intermission. The SDSU running back took charge in the second half, however, exploding for 153 yards to finish with the highest rushing yardage by an Aztec freshman since Ronnie Hillman gained 228 in the 2010 Poinsettia Bowl

After forcing SDSU to punt on its first series, NMSU marched 68 yards in 10 plays, punctuated by Andrew McDonald's 6-yard scoring pass to Joshua Bowen for the game's first touchdown. The Aggies then tacked on a 28-yard field goal by Maxwell Johnson on their next possession to build a 10-0 cushion by the end of the first quarter.

NMSU got the ball back early in the second quarter after Darien Johnson recovered a Kaehler fumble at the SDSU 30. The Aggies quickly took advantage of the miscue two plays later when McDonald found Andrew Dean in the left corner of the end zone on a 15-yard touchdown strike. The Aztecs quickly stole the momentum, however, as David Lamar scooped

up Sam Meredith's blocked extra point and raced 89 yards for a two-point defensive con-

version, which narrowed the gap to 16-2.

Buoyed by its good fortune, the SDSU offense began to assert itself at this juncture. After netting just 12 yards on 10 plays during its first four possessions, the Aztecs racked up 429 yards the rest of the way, beginning with a 68-yard drived capped by a Wes Feer 25-yard field goal with 6:41 elapsed in the second quarter. Kaehler completed three passes to Ezell Ruffin on the drive, including a 39-yard strike on 3rd-and-13 from midfield.

After Adam Muema was stopped short on 4th and goal from the 3 on SDSU's next series, the Aztecs held the host school to a three-andout and got the ball back in Aggie territory, threatening to add another score just before halftime. Kaehler hooked up with Dylan Denso for a 22-yard gain down to the NMSU 23, but Feer's 40-yard field-goal attempt with seven seconds was blocked by Mason Russell.

SDSU put together another long march on its first series of the second half and once again and found itself in a fourth-down situation from the Aggie 22. Disdaining a field-goal attempt, Kaehler's pass was intercepted by Greg Callender at the 11, but an NMSU holding penalty nullified the turnover. Given new life, the Aztecs scored on the next play when Pumphrey swept around right end for 12 yards into the end zone, which narrowed the gap to 16-11. Although Kaehler was intercepted on the ensuing twopoint conversion try, SDSU had wrested the momentum away from the Aggies, limiting the hosts to just three first downs for the remainder of the contest.

The Aztecs then took the lead for the first time when Pumphrey scored on a two-yard run on the first play of the fourth quarter to complete an eight-play, 60-yard drive. Later in the period, Pumphrey sealed the win on a 43-yard dash with 2:51 left on the clock.

SDSU held NMSU to 40 yards rushing on 27 attempts and came away with three sacks. Individually, Josh Gavert tied a career-high with seven tackles, while Eric Pinkins recorded his second fumble recovery of the season and third of his career.

USAF ACADEMY, Colo. - Quinn Kaehler threw two touchdown passes in the fourth quarter and Donnel Pumphrey scored on a 10-yard run with 1:39 remaining, helping San Diego State rally for a 27-20 victory over Air Force in a contest that was played despite the partial government shutdown.

Down by 14 heading into the fourth quarter, the Aztecs (3-3, 2-0 Mountain West) scored 21 straight points to escape with the win after missing two extra points and a field goal. San Diego State improved to 2-151-1 in program history when trailing by 14 or more points in the final quarter.

Kaehler finished 15-of-26 for 249 yards and three touchdowns. Pumphrey had 117 yards rushing along with another 43 receiving and a score.

Backup Nate Romine scored on a 16-yard run and threw a 71-yard TD pass for the Falcons in a game they didn't know would even be staged until it was given the official go-ahead about 27 hours before kickoff due to the shutdown,

Will Conant made two long field goals, including a 52-yarder that bounced in off the left upright. His counterpart, Wes Feer, had a field goal and an extra point clang off the same left goal post.

A few plays later, Kaehler found a wide open Ezell Ruffin for a 62-yard score. But Mc-Morrow had his point-after attempt blocked by Troy Timmerman, making it 20-19, Air Force.

After forcing the Falcons to punt, Kaehler marched the Aztecs down the field and Pumphrey punctuated the winning drive with a run up the middle for a score. Kaehler threw a pass to Tim Vizzi for the 2-point conversion.

Of the 45 schools that opened 0-3 since 2010, the Aztecs joined only Houston (2012) as the only teams to even its record at 3-3 after six contests.

Romine received the call to go in shortly after starter Karson Roberts came off the field in the first guarter with an undisclosed injury. Romine directed a scoring drive in his first series, capping it off with a 16-yard TD run early in the second quarter.

San Diego State controlled the clock and outgained the Falcons in the first half, only to trail 10-6 when Conant connected on a 48-yard field goal on the last play before halftime.

The Aztecs took an early lead after Kaehler found a wide open Eric Judge for a 44yard score. But Wes Feer's extra-point attempt hit the left upright and bounded away. Earlier in the quarter, Feer's 37-yard field goal try clanged off the left goal post.

It was that kind of half for San Diego State. Adam Muema had a fumble, Kaehler threw an interception off the hands of Muema and Pumphrey was stopped at the 1 on fourth down by Air Force safety Christian Spears.

For a third straight week, the Falcons let a halftime lead slip away.

SAN DIEGO - Adam Muema rushed for a season-high 233 yards and three touchdowns to propel San Diego State to a 35-30 victory over New Mexico at Qualcomm Stadium.

Ezell Ruffin added 165 receiving yards and two touchdowns on seven catches for the Aztecs, who never trailed in the game.

SDSU came out firing with a 75-yard touchdown pass from Quinn Kaehler to Ruffin on the very first play of the game. It was the first score by San Diego State on its opening play from scrimmage since Sept. 17, 2005, at Ohio State.

After forcing a Lobo punt, which was downed on the Aztec 4, SDSU marched 96 yards on nine plays over 4:13, culminating with a 4-yard touchdown run by Muema.

UNM answered on its ensuing possession after a 41-yard kick return by Carlos Wiggins put the visitors in good field position on the New Mexico 48. The Lobos converted on a key 4th and 2 when Cole Gautsche eluded SDSU defenders for a 20-yard run. Two plays later, Teriyon Gipson dashed into the end zone from 20 yards out to get UNM on the scoreboard.

The two teams were held scoreless in the second quarter as the Aztecs took a 14-7 lead into the locker room.

The Lobos quickly got to the SDSU 7 on their first possession of the third quarter, but SDSU's defense held firm, allowing just a 20yard field goal by Justus Adams.

The Aztecs answered with an 8-play, 71yard drive, highlighted by a 33-yard run by Muema and ending when Kaehler found Ruffin for a 24-yard strike on a 3rd-and-8 play.

UNM responded with a 6-play, 72-yard drive and 18-yard touchdown scamper by Crusoe Gongbay to get New Mexico back to within four at 21-17 after the end of three quarters.

To kick off the fourth quarter, SDSU put together its longest drive of the season in terms of plays (17) and time (8:28), marching 87 yards, including 64 on the ground. Muema finished the drive with a 2-yard touchdown on a 4th and goal, putting San Diego State up by a 28-17 margin.

The Lobos continued to fight, marching 72 yards on eight plays over 3:22 before Gipson scored his second touchdown of the game on a 5-yard run. Down by five, UNM went for the 2-point conversion, but Kasey Carrier was stopped by Aztec senior Nat Berhe at the goal

SDSU looked to put the game away with a 7-play, 75-yard drive, all by Muema, ending with a 1-yard touchdown (his third of the game) with just 1:50 left.

New Mexico took advantage of San Diego State's prevent defense with a 5-play, 75-yard drive over just 1:04. Clayton Mitchem found Tyler Duncan for a 36-yard score, bringing the Lobos to within five at 35-30.

SAN JOSÉ, Calif. - San Diego State rallied with a 22-point fourth quarter to come from behind to defeat San José State, 34-30, on the road at Spartan Stadium.

The Aztecs, who trailed by 14 (20-6) in the first half and by 11 (23-12) after three quarters, exploded for 22 points in the final quarter, their most in the fourth period in the Mountain West

The momentum changed in the game when Damontae Kazee blocked an Austin Lopez field-goal attempt early in the fourth quarter, which allowed Nat Berhe to return the ball 56 yards to the SJSU 34. On the ensuing play, Donnel Pumphrey scampered 34 yards down the sideline for the touchdown, followed by a Quinn Kaehler to Dylan Denso 2-point conversion pass to pull SDSU to within three points at 23-20.

San Jose State, however, answered with a 9-play, 83-yard drive, ending with a 12-yard pass from David Fales to Tim Crawley.

Down by 10, San Diego State responded by marching 74 yards on seven plays in just 2:19, culminating in a 1-yard TD pass from Kaehler to Adam Roberts.

The Aztec defense then forced the Spartans into a 3-and-out and, after just a 25-yard punt, gave the offense the ball at the SJSU 38 with 6:00 left. SDSU stayed alive when Kaehler found Lockett for a 12-yard pass on 4th and 7 on the Aztecs' fifth play of the drive. Adam Muema then finished it with a 12-yard touchdown run, giving SDSU its first lead of the game at 34-30 with 3:32 remaining.

SJSU took a 10-0 lead in the first quarter on a 43-yard field goal by Austin Lopez and a 13-yard pass from Fales to Crawley.

Muema got the Aztecs on the board early in the second quarter on a 2-yard run, but Seamus McMorrow's PAT was blocked.

The Spartans extended their lead to 20-6 with a 27-yard field goal by Lopez and a 40yard pass from Fales to Chandler Jones.

SDSU put together a 9-play, 82-yard drive in 2:44 where Kaehler found Lockett with a 14yard strike in the corner of the end zone, but Wes Feer's subsequent conversion attempt

Lopez put the Spartans up, 23-12, with 8:06 left in the third quarter before his next attempt was blocked by Kazee, which ignited the Aztecs' incredible charge.

SDSU rallied from an 11-point deficit in the fourth quarter for the fifth time in program history, improving to just 5-174-2 under that situ-

The win marked San Diego State's fifth in six games, 11th in 12 Mountain West contests, fifth in six road tilts and sixth straight in Novem-

Muema posted his third straight 100-yard rushing game with 113 yards and two touchdowns, while Pumphrey had 78 yards and a score on 10 attempts. Kaehler passed for 235 yards and two touchdowns and Lockett had six catches for 90 yards and a score.

Eric Pinkins paced the Aztec defense with seven tackles, two passes defended and a tackle for loss, while Nick Tenhaeff had two tackles for loss, one sack and his first career interception.

HONOLULU - Adam Muema rushed 163 yards to lead San Diego State to another comefrom-behind victory over Hawai'i at Aloha Śtadium.

The win was the sixth of the season for the Aztecs, who became bowl eligible for the fourth straight year after failing to make a bowl the previous 11 campaigns.

SDSU rallied from a 7-point deficit three times during the game and won its fourth straight contest when trailing at the half.

Down 21-14 with 6:20 left, San Diego State put together an 8-play, 82-yard drive over

3:50, culminating with a 14-yard touchdown run by Chad Young.

The Aztec defense then forced the Warriors to punt with 54 seconds left. Starting on its own 28, SDSU got into UH territory when Quinn Kaehler found Dylan Denso with a 19-yard pass on a 3rd and 8. Denso, however, fumbled the ball, giving Hawai'i a last chance to end the game in regulation. The Warriors' Hail Mary at the end of regulation was knocked down by San Diego State's Nat Berhe, forcing overtime for the third time this year and fourth time in 16 contests.

As they had done for most of the game, the Aztecs let Muema and the offensive line do the work. Muema ran it three times for 25 yards on the overtime drive with rushes of 11 yards and 12 yards before ending with a 2-yard score. The PAT by Seamus McMorrow put SDSU

Áfter a no gain by Joey Iosefa, San Diego State's Eric Pinkins sacked UH quarterback Sean Schroeder, forcing a 3rd and 20. The Aztecs then forced Schroeder into throwing two

more incompletions, sealing the win for SDSU and improving its all-time overtime record to 6-2 and 2-1 in 2013.

Hawai'i got on the scoreboard late in the first quarter when it recovered a fumble on a rugby punt and losefa punched it in from five yards one play later.

San Diego State answered early in the second quarter when Quinn Kaehler took advantage of a free play and Warrior penalty, and found a streaking Colin Lockett, who blew by the UH defenders for a 56-yard score.

On the ensuing drive, Hawai'i responded with a 5-play, 65-yard drive with Schroeder connecting on a 31-yard pass to Harold Moleni.

Down, 14-7, at halftime, the Aztecs put together an 8-play, 78-yard drive on their first opening possession, gaining all 78 yards on the ground and taking advantage of a roughing the kicker by a Warrior player on fourth down. Donnel Pumphrey officially tied it at 14-14 on a 30-yard touchdown run down the left side of the field.

UH took its third lead of the game to start the fourth quarter, going 86 yards on 16 plays and taking up 7:17 of clock time before Schroeder found losefa for an 8-yard touchdown on a dump pass on 3rd and 6.

After trading punts, SDSU used its 8-play, 82-yard drive to force overtime.

Muema finished with 163 yards and a touchdown on 24 attempts (6.8 avg.), his fourth straight 100-yard rushing game, fifth of the season and 13th of his career.

Pumphrey added 61 yards on 10 rushes

Lockett picked up his second 100-yard receiving game and fifth of his career with four catches for 106 yards and the touchdown, while Ezell Ruffin just missed a 100-yard game with four receptions for 99 yards.

His two punt returns for a touchdown in a season tied a school record, while his two career punt returns for a score were tied for third.

Pumphrey rushed for 87 yards and a touchdown on 13 attempts (6.7 avg.) to pace the SDSU rushing attack, which was limited as leading rusher Adam Muema (12 carries, 11 yards) was battling an ankle injury.

BOISE, Idaho – Making its school-record fourth consecutive postseason appearance. San Diego State closed off the 2013 campaign on a winning note with a convincing 49-24 victory over Buffalo in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

The Aztecs were once again led by Adam Muema, who rushed for 229 yards and three touchdowns on 28 carries en route to earning the game's most-valuable-player award. With his performance, the junior running back finished with at least 200 yards on the ground for the fourth time in his career to help SDSU capture its first bowl game outside of its own stadium since the 1969 Pasadena Bowl.

The Aztecs, who never trailed in the contest, capitalized on three crucial Bulls turnovers, scoring 28 unanswered points during the second and third quarters to put the game out of reach.

On a day that witnessed numerous big plays, SDSU rode the legs of quarterback Quinn Kaehler on its initial scoring drive as the junior transfer tip-toed 29 yards down the right sideline on a bootleg to provide the Scarlet and Black a 7-0 advantage with 21 seconds left in the opening quarter.

The Aztecs regained possession in enemy territory shortly thereafter when Cody Galea pounced on a loose ball at the 30-yard line following Vaness Harris' sack of UB quarterback Joe Licata. Six plays later. Muema tallied the first of his three scores on a 3-yard sweep to increase the SDSU lead to 14-0.

The Bulls, who were held without a first down until the 10:42 mark of the second period, managed to narrow the gap to 14-10 on a 10-yard toss from Licata to Brandon Oliver and a 38-yard field goal by

However, the Aztecs quickly countered with a 5play, 67-yard march, capped by Muema's 8-yard TDscamper around left end, while Kaehler hit Dylan Denso with a 25-yard scoring strike on the first play following Marcus Andrews' interception return from midfield, giving SDSU a 28-10 bulge at intermission.

Denso also made a key contribution on special teams, recovering a Buffalo fumble on the opening kickoff of the second half to put the Aztecs in business at the Bulls 26. Moments later, Kaehler connected with Adam Roberts from 11 yards out on a post pattern for his second TD pass of the day.

After forcing a three-and-out, SDSU marched downfield once again, consuming 4:19 on the clock as Chad Young's 1-yard touchdown plunge increased the Aztec lead to 42-10 with 8:18 left in the third quarter.

Buffalo ended its offensive drought early in the fourth quarter, driving 73 yards in seven plays, culminating in a 23-yard touchdown reception by Alex Neutz. However, the score proved too little too late as Muema wrapped up his dazzling afternoon with a 30-yard burst into the end zone with 6:40 left in the contest

In additon to Muema's heroics, Kaehler completed 15-of-28 passes for 211 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions, finishing the season with a 8-3 record as the Aztecs starter. Meanwhile, wide receiver Ezell Ruffin registered multiple receptions for the 13 straight game, hauling in five catches, including a 39-yarder on SDSU's third scor-

The Aztecs also welcomed the return of special teams standout Scott Graves, who blocked two punts in his first action of the year.
