Aztec Men's Golf Returns to Action This Weekend at ASU Thunderbird Invitational

Following a two-week break, the San Diego State men's golf team returns to the fairways this weekend when it heads to the desert for the 37th annual ASU Thunderbird Invitational, April 10-11, in Tempe, Ariz. First-round action at the 54-hole tournament gets underway on Friday at the 7,057 yard, par-71 Karsten Golf course. A live scoring link will be provided on the home page of GoAztecs.com.

The three-round event features a highly competitive field of 16 schools, 10 of which are ranked in the top 60, according to the latest Golfstat rankings released April 8. At No. 9, TCU is the highest-ranked squad in the tournament, followed by the 20th-rankedAztecs, UNLV (24), host school Arizona State (28), Arizona (33), Colorado State (34), California (36), Oregon (38), New Mexico (39) and UC Irvine (56). In addition to Colorado State, New Mexico and UNLV, SDSU will also get an early look at MWC competitors BYU prior to the Mountain West Conference Championships, which are set to begin April 24. Ball State, Cal State Northridge, Denver, Fresno State and Oklahoma round out the list of competitors.

The Scarlet and Black will be making its fourth straight appearance in the ASU Thunderbird Invitational and sixth in the last seven years. During that span, SDSU's highest team finish came in 2006, when it tied for third along with Kansas State. Last season, Matt Hoffenberg placed 14th for the Aztecs' top individual showing at the tournament.

This Week's Lineup

Head coach Ryan Donovan will field his eighth different lineup of the 2008-09 season. Leading the way for SDSU will be the sophomore duo of Johan Carlsson and Matt Hoffenberg. Senior classmates Ryan Citarella and Bryan Martin will make the trip for the Aztecs, along with redshirt freshman Colin Featherstone. Fellow freshman Andrew Cooley will make the trip to Tempe, but will participate as an individual.

This tournament marks the spring debut for Citarella, who has only competed as an individual for the Scarlet and Black this season. Carlsson, Featherstone, Hoffenberg and Martin were all part of the squad that finished runner-up at the Barona Collegiate Cup (March 16-17). Carlsson, Hoffenberg and Martin were also part of the fivesome that finished second in medal play and sixth in match play at the exclusive Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championships (March 22-24).

A Look At The Course

Karsten Golf Course has a classic Pete Dye linksstyle design, featuring lakes, mounds and pot bunkers. Strategy and precision are critical as numerous greens are partially hidden and well guarded by water and bunkers. Located in the shadows of Sun Devil Stadium on the Arizona State campus, Karsten has welcomed the likes of professionals such as Phil Mickelson, Billy Mayfair and Grace Park, all who have sharpened their skills at the course.

On Deck

SDSU will have one final tune-up before heading to the Mountain West Conference Championships. The Aztecs will head to the Lone Star State to compete at the Texas A&M Aggie Invitational, April 18-19, at the par 72, 7,235 yard Traditions Golf Club in Bryan, Texas.

Flashback: The 2008 Thunderbird Invitational

Matt Hoffenberg fired a 3-under-par 68 to lead the Aztec men's golf team during the final round of the 36th annual ASU Thunderbird Invitational. Despite shooting a 6-over 290 as a team, SDSU (+24, 876) still managed to climb three places over the final 18 holes, finishing in the eighth position. With two squads participating, host school Arizona State captured the tournament title and runner-up spot at 9-under and even par, respectively, while Texas A&M (+7), Colorado State (+7) and Denver (+8) rounded out the top five.

After jumping 21 spots during the second round, Hoffenberg maintained his assault on the individual leaderboard by vaulting an additional 31 places on the final day to finish in a tie for 14th at 2-over 215. Hoffenberg tied two other golfers for the low round of the day, carding three birdies while posting an eagle on the par-5 14th. With his effort, Hoffenberg equaled his third-best round as a collegian en route to his seventh straight top-20 finish in as many starts this spring.

Right behind Hoffenberg was Aaron Goldberg, who managed to move up one notch over the final 18 holes after carding a final-round 73 to finish the tournament in a tie for 16th at 3-over 216. Goldberg, who hopped 37 places on day two, had his ascent sandbagged by three bogeys over the final 18 holes; however, the Aztec senior still came away with his 10th top-20 showing in 11outings this season.

Meanwhile, fellow classmate Chad Moscovic matched his second-best outing of the year thus far, tying for the 46th position at 9-over 222. Moscovic drained consecutive birdies on the front nine en route to a 73 to tie Goldberg for SDSU's second-best score of the final round. Completing the scoring for the Aztecs was freshman Johan Carlsson who closed with a 5-over 76 to tie for 69th at 13-over 226.

Carlsson Named Mountain West Conference Golfer of the Month

Sophomore Johan Carlsson was named the Mountain West Conference men's golfer of the month as announced by the league office on Nov. 19. The award is the first of his career.

Carlsson, a product of Gothenburg, Sweden, helped the Aztecs to a third-place finish at the Rees Jones Intercollegiate on Daufuski Island, S.C. in early November, followed by a second-place team finish at the Turtle Bay Resort Intercollegiate in Kuhuku, Hawaii.

Carlsson recorded five rounds below 70 during the fall campaign, including two during the month of November.

Freshmen Fantastic

San Diego State's freshman class is among America's best. The class currently ranks second on the Golfstat Top 25 Freshman Class Impact Ranking, released April 8. As a class, the SDSU freshmen hold a 72.90 stroke average, according to Golfstat. Only Alabama ranks ahead of the Aztecs.

Last Time Out

San Diego State men's golf team placed sixth at the exclusive Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championships at the Farms Golf Club in Rancho Santa Fe, Calif. The Aztecs carded a 12-over 588 in

the medal play rounds to advance to the championship bracket of the match play portion of the tournament in the No. 2 seed.

The Aztecs were paced on day one by top-15 performances by freshman Andrew Cooley (T4 at 144; 70-74) sophomore Matt Hoffenberg (T14 at 147; 73-74). Senior Bryan Martin (77-72) and sophomore Johan Carlsson (73-76) tied for 21st position as each recorded a two-round 149. Freshman Alex Kang rounded out the Aztec competitors with his day one 153 total (T43; 78-75).

San Diego State split second-day action at The Farms. The Scarlet and Black dropped its first match of the day against eventual champion Middle Tennesse, but rebounded to defeat Texas Tech in the semifinal round.

SDSU's Johan Carlsson and Matt Hoffenberg each claimed matches during its 3-2 loss against Middle Tennessee in the opening Match. Carlsson outplayed Rick Cochran on his way to a 5 and 4 victory, while Hoffenberg defeated Jason Millard, 1-up.

In the afternoon match-up with Texas Tech, Andrew Cooley, Alex Kang and Bryan Martin each claimed victories en route to the Scarlet and Black's 3-2 victory over the Red Raiders. Colley outlasted Santiago Rivas to win the point, 1-up, while Alex Kang earned his victory over Chris Ward with his 2-up finish. Bryan Martin claimed his match with his 5 and 4 triumph over Will Griffin.

San Diego State dropped its final match against Stanford, 3-1-1, on the final day of the match play championships.

Martin was the lone Aztec to claim a victory on the final day. Martin and Daniel Lim were all square through 14, but earned Martin would earn the win over Lim, 3 and 1. Hoffenberg, meanwhile, halved his match with Dodge Kemmer.

The final three Aztec matches all remained close to the end, but the Cardinal would earn three victories over the Scarlet and Black. Johan Carlsson would be defeated by Steve Ziegler (1 up), Cooley by David Chung (2 and 1) and Kang fell to Sihwan Kim (1 up).

Middle Tennessee defeated Indiana, 4-1, to win the Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championship.

Two Former Aztecs Named to MWC 10th Anniversary Team

Former San Diego State men's golf standouts Aaron Goldberg and Mark Warman were named to the Mountain West Conference 10th Anniversary Men's Golf Team, as selected by a combined panel of media, institutional and conference personnel and online fan poll. In order to be eligible for consideration, candidates must have been a first-team all-MWC selection at least once in their careers.

A native of Encinitas, Calif., Goldberg earned first-team all-MWC accolades three times (2006-08) and was named the league's player of the year in 2008. Goldberg was named the MWC golfer of the month five times in his Aztec career, joining Ryan Moore of UNLV as the only two players to be recognized on a least five occasions since the league's formation in 1999-2000. A two-time All-American, Goldberg became the first SDSU golfer to gain All-America status in consecutive seasons since Kris Moe accomplished the feat in 1983-84. Goldberg ended his Aztec career with two individual tournament titles and currently owns the top 54-hole individual score in the SDSU record books (68-66-67-201 at the 2006 District 7 Shootout).

Warman, meanwhile, earned first-team all-MWC honors each of the three years he played for the Aztecs (2002-04). The San Clemente, Calif., product claimed medalist honors at the 2003 U.S. Intercollegiate, a tournament in which he shot a 62 which stands as the lowest individual 18-hole score

in the SDSU record books. The MWC player of the month in March 2002, Warman was also an All-American candidate his senior season and was named one of Golf World's top 50 "Players to Watch" in 2004

Head Coach Ryan Donovan

Coming off San Diego State's best season since 1982 and the Aztecs' best showing during his tenure, San Diego State alumnus Ryan Donovan is now in his sixth season as the leader of the Aztec men's golf program. With Donovan at the helm, SDSU placed in the top 14 in all 15 outings with the 15th tournament being a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Overall, the Aztecs compiled a 266-21 head-to-head record and finished 20th in Golfstat's final collegiate poll.

Individually, Donovan helped a pair of athletes in senior Aaron Goldberg and junior David Palm earn All-America accolades. Additionally, both were all-Mountain West Conference and all-Southwest Region selections. Other players to earn season-ending honors under Donovan were matt Hoffenberg (MWC freshman of the year, all-MWC, all-Southwest Region) and Johan Carlsson (all-Southwest Region). Donovan himself was named the Eaton Golf Pride Division I Coach of the Year for the southwest region given out annually by the Golf Coaches Association of America.

In 2006-07, SDSU secured three team tournament titles and reached the NCAA Regionals for the team's ninth straight appearance. Aaron Goldberg had one the program's finest campaigns, finishing with a scoring average of 70.71, while recording seven top-five finishes and capturing medalist honors at the District 7 Fall Shootout on his way to being named an honorable mention PING All-America honors, the program's first such honor since 2001.

The 2005-06 season was equally impressive as Donovan guided SDSU to three team tournament victories and its eighth consecutive NCAA regional appearance. Three Aztec golfers - seniors Andrew Scott and Josh Warthen and sophomore David Palm - all claimed individual titles during the season, while Scott and Goldberg garnered all-Mountain West Conference accolades.

Donovan was a four-year competitor for the SDSU golf squad from 1997- 2001. His most successful season came as a junior when he posted five top-30 finishes
