Aztec Basketball Travels Across Town To Take On Univ. of San Diego Tuesday

The San Diego State women's basketball team (1-4), which is in the midst of a six-game stint away from home, will have a shorter distance to travel this week, as the Aztecs go across town to take on the University of San Diego on Tuesday at Jenny Craig Pavilion. Game time is slated for 7 p.m. PT.

The Aztecs are coming off a 1-1 road trip in which they advanced to the championship game of the Nugget Classic in Reno, defeating a solid Minnesota team, 61-59, before falling in the final minutes to host Nevada on Saturday evening, 63-61.

The loss to the Wolf Pack is SDSU's second this season by only a two-point margin and also was the second such defeat in a span of four days. Three of the Aztecs' four total losses in 2010-11 are by seven points or fewer.

USD, meanwhile, is playing its fourth-straight game on its home court and boasts a 4-1 mark on the campaign. The Toreros won their season-opener 72-61 at Pacific, before dropping a road game at UNLV, 66-48. Since then, they have reeled off three straight victories, while scoring over 71 points in all three outings.

San Diego State won the annual meeting between the two sides last year, posting a dominating 79-52 victory at Viejas Arena. USD, however, has won six of the last eight in the series, including four-straight at Jenny Craig Pavilion, but still trails in the series by a healthy 26-7 margin.

Tuesday's contest will feature a live audio broadcast with Chris Ello, as well as live stats, on goaztecs.com.

Last Time Out: Aztecs Fall In A Thriller At Nevada, 63-61

The San Diego State women's basketball team rallied from an 11-point second-half deficit to take the lead, but couldn't come away with the victory, falling in the championship game of the Nugget Classic to host Nevada, 63-61, at the Lawlor Events Center. The Aztecs dropped to 1-4 on the season, while the Wolf Pack improved to 5-1.

Senior **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** once again led SDSU with 19 points on 8-for-13 shooting, while also tallying seven rebounds and a pair of blocked shots. Johnson was one of two Aztecs named to the all-tournament squad along with classmate **Jessika Bradley (Sacramento, Calif.)**, who had eight rebounds and three blocks. Sophomore **Courtney Clements (Long Beach, Calif.)** added 11 points, while junior **Sajoyia Griffin (San Antonio, Texas)** had her best performance of the year with a career-high nine points, five rebounds and seven assists, compared to just one turnover.

There were four ties and six lead changes in the first 10 minutes of the game as each side boasted a four-point advantage. Nevada went on a 9-0 run to go up 28-19, but the Aztecs responded with two buckets by Clements and one by **Candace Chambers (Seattle, Wash.)** to close the gap to 28-26.

The Wolf Pack began to pile up trips to the free-throw line using a 13-for-16 performance at the stripe to head into the break up by six points at 39-33.

After the two sides combined for only six points in the first four minutes, the Wolf Pack broke their stalemate first, building its largest lead of the game at 51-40 at the 13:59 mark.

The Aztecs, however, wouldn't go down easily, answering with a 9-2 run to close to within four points twice, before a fast-break bucket made it a one-point game and two free throws put the visitors ahead 58-57 with 3:03 to go.

Coming out of a timeout, Nevada's Tahnee Robinson hit a 3-pointer, but Johnson tied it at 60 with a lay-up. Robinson struck again the next time up the floor, making what would turn out to be the winning basket with 25 seconds remaining to give her squad another two-point advantage at 62-61.

Bradley was fouled on the Aztecs' next possession, but was only able to make the first of her two free throws, as Robinson secured the rebound and was then fouled herself. She made one of two shots at the stripe and Coco Davis got the ball down the court with only four seconds left, but was unable to make the final shot near half court, as the Wolf Pack survived for the 63-61 win.

All-Tourney Honors

San Diego State seniors Jessika Bradley and Paris Johnson each earned a spot on the all-tournament team at the Nugget Classic.

It is Bradley's first such honor of her career, as she averaged 8.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and tallied five assists and seven blocks in the two games.

The all-tourney squad, meanwhile, is commonplace for Johnson, who has been tabbed for the honor in each of her four campaigns and six out of her seven opportunities in regular-season events. The only time she has not garnered honors was at the 2009 Paradise Jam in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Johnson averaged nearly a double-double in Reno, leading the team in scoring with 27 points vs. Minnesota and 19 against Nevada. She also shot 63.3 percent from the field, pulled down 19 rebounds and had five blocks.

Close Calls

Four of San Diego State's five contests this season have been decided by seven points or fewer, with the Aztecs unfortunately coming out on the winning side just once.

SDSU led by eight points at the half against UCLA in the season-opener, before falling 55-48. All three of the team's outings last week were decided by just two points, as the Aztecs lost to both UC Irvine (68-66) and Nevada (63-61), but defeated Minnesota (61-59).

Last year, only six of San Diego State's 34 contests were by five points or less.

Keeping It Under 40

All five Aztec foes this season have failed to reach the 40.0 mark in field-goal percentage, including Nevada, which shot an SDSU opponent season-low 33.9 percent on Saturday.

Current No. 13 UCLA shot 37.9 percent and both Cal State Bakersfield and UC Irvine put up a 36.5 field-goal mark. Minnesota, which entered the game with a 51.3 team shooting percentage, made just 20 of their 55 attempts for a 36.4 mark.

Paris Part II

After beginning the weekend 15th in San Diego State history in career points, senior Paris Johnson moved all the way into 10th on the Aztec scoring chart with 1,274

points.

Johnson leaped over Shelda Arceneaux, who had 1,232 points from 1984-87, moved past Aztec Hall of Famer Kieishsha Gaines (1,235) and former WAC Tournament MVP Christina Murguia (1,237) following Friday's win over Minnesota.

She then jumped over the program's No. 11 scorer in Tina Hutchinson (1,256) and No. 10 Marsha Overton (1,273). She needs just two points Tuesday to surpass Jamey Cox (1,275), but is 37 away from moving beyond Brooke Meadows (1,310 points) for eighth place.

The Century Mark Part 2

For the second time this year, a San Diego State women's basketball player will log minutes in her 100th career outing in the Red & Black.

Senior **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** is up next, as she is slated to reach the century mark in games played this Tuesday at USD. Her classmate, Paris Johnson, played her 100th career outing vs. UC Irvine last week.

The pair are close to cracking the Aztec career top 10 in games played with Kate Eveland (2005-08) standing 10th with her 111 outings.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over USD will mean:

►SDSU improves to 27-7 all-time against the Toreros, winning two straight and three of the last four meetings.

►SDSU wins at USD for the first time since 1995, a span of five outings.

►SDSU is 1-1 vs. teams it played a year ago ... The Aztecs claim their first game at an opponent's arena in 2010-11.

►SDSU is 54-35 all-time vs. current members of the West Coast Conference.

USD Tid-Bits

USD enters Tuesday's contest with a 4-1 record, including victories over Pacific, Seattle, Cal State Fullerton and Columbia ... The Toreros only loss happened at UNLV on Nov. 19 ... Junior guard Dominique Conners is one of three USD players to average in double-figure scoring with 17.0 points to go with 14 assists and 12 steals ... Senior Sam Child puts up 14.0 points per game and is shooting 88.2 percent at the line, while Emily Hatch is her team's top rebounder (7.6/g) ... USD averages 72.0 points a contest and owns a +4.8 margin on the boards ... The Toreros are a combined 3-for-19 from three-point range in their last three meetings with the Aztecs ... USD head coach Cindy Fisher used to be the head coach at Wyoming, while Nya Mason played at Colorado State.

Recent SDSU-USD Series Notes

►Since the annual series restarted in 2002, the two sides have only reached the 70-point barrier three times in the eight games. Each occasion, the team to score over 70 points came away with the win.

►Three of the last eight contests have been decided by five points or fewer. The other five have been by an average of over 20 points.

►Each school has a victory of more than 25 points in the last eight meetings.

►The losing school has failed to score more than 60

points in all of the last eight contests.

Rewind: SDSU vs. USD, 2009

The San Diego State women's basketball team jumped out to a 10-point lead early in the first half and never looked back, limiting visiting University of San Diego to only 19 points through the first 25 minutes of the game and going on to claim a 79-52 victory at Viejas Arena.

SDSU had four players finish in double-figure points, including senior Jené Morris and junior Jessika Bradley who both scored 14. Bradley added 10 rebounds for her first double-double in an Aztec uniform and junior guard Coco Davis had six of the team's 20 assists on the night.

SDSU never trailed, scoring the first point on a free throw by Coco Davis and logging the first field goal on a Morris triple. The Toreros countered with a jumper by Nya Mason and a bucket by Morgan Henderson, but the Aztecs scored four lay-ups in the paint for an eight-point lead at 12-4.

A Quenese Davis jumper at the 13-minute mark sparked a 7-0 run to put the host up by 13 and would move all the way out to 26 at the half, as San Diego State headed into the locker room on a 15-2 run to make the score 45-19.

The Toreros' offense continued to struggle out of the break, as it failed to score a point until the 14:43 mark with the Aztecs now up by 34 points. The SDSU lead stayed in the upper 20's to low 30's the rest of the way until the final buzzer sounded for the team's 79-52 win.

The Aztecs ended the night shooting 50.9 percent from the field, including a 72.7 mark (8-for-11) from beyond the arc, and outrebounded the Toreros, 39-18. USD tried only one free throw, the fewest ever by an SDSU opponent in a game, breaking the previous mark of two by the Toreros in 1978 and USIU in 1981.

Record Watch

San Diego State's senior trio of Coco Davis, Paris Johnson and Jessika Bradley are well on their way toward making a dent in the Aztec record book.

Johnson needs just 34 more blocks to become the school's all-time leader, surpassing current record-holder Michelle Suman, who had 251 from 1992-95.

Johnson is also sixth in the SDSU record book in career rebounds with 734, and is one of only five Aztecs to post 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 100 blocks in their careers. She is 10th in free throws (234) and third in free-throw attempts (421).

Davis, meanwhile, just entered the top 10 in career 3-pointers, boasting 67. Her 229 attempts from beyond the arc are ninth and her 289 assists are three away from the record book.

After only 39 games in the Red & Black, Bradley is now 10th in career blocked shots with 74, including a squad-best 63 as a junior and 11 in the opening five games in 2010-11.

Now That's A Road Trip

After starting a season with three-straight home contests for only the second time in program history, SDSU is two outings into a six-game road swing over nearly a month's time.

After the two contests in Reno and Tuesday's meeting across town at USD, the Aztecs will then play a road game at Pepperdine, followed by two contests at the USC tournament, Dec. 18-19. The team will finally get back to Viejas Arena for a Dec. 21, outing with Washington State.

San Diego State had played its entire December schedule at home three straight campaigns from 2006-08, before competing twice on the road in 2009.

Other 2010-11 In Season Notes Thus Far

- Courtney Clements' 19 points vs. UCLA are the most by an Aztec in a season-opener since Michelle Strawberry had 29 points against Wichita State in November 2005.

- Paris Johnson's 18 rebounds vs. Cal State Bakersfield is a career high (prev. 15, twice) and most by an Aztec in a single outing since Ashlee Dunlap also had 18 in a win against American University in Dec. 2002.

- SDSU played its 1,000th contest in program history on Nov. 26, downing Minnesota, 61-59, in Reno, Nev.

Knox Joins Aztec Coaching Staff

Carlos Knox was named an assistant coach for the San Diego State women's basketball team, Aztec head coach Beth Burns announced last week.

Knox comes to the Aztecs from the WNBA's Indiana Fever, where he was an assistant under head coach Lin Dunn. He also served a one-year stint with the Fever from 2008-09, as a volunteer assistant coach in player development.

Knox played collegiately at Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis (IUPUI) from 1994-98. He was a three-time All-American, two-time NCAA scoring cham-

After graduating in 1998, he played professionally with the Indiana Pacers, before moving overseas where he competed in four different countries over a three-year span from 1999-2002.

The Dayton, Ohio, native has been a head men's coach in the CBA for the Indiana Alley Cats and Pittsburgh Xplosion, a head coach in the IBL for the Dayton Jets and an assistant men's coach at his alma mater. He spent 2009-10 as a head coach in the Saudi Arabia League (Division 1) with Club Al Hilal.

Knox has also worked with NBA and WNBA players to develop their basketball skills, as well as rehabilitate from injury.

Aztecs Fall Recruiting Class Ranked 20th

San Diego State women's basketball's fall 2010 recruiting class has been rated 20th nationally and first in the Mountain West Conference according to *Espn.com's HoopGurlz* national rankings. The Aztecs moved up 11 spots from last year's No. 31 final ranking, after inking five high school seniors to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period, Nov. 10-17.

For the second campaign in a row, the Aztecs are easily the top ranked school among Mountain West Conference members, as TCU is the only other team listed in the top 40 at No. 38. San Diego State's recruiting class is rated higher than several notable programs including LSU (No. 22), Notre Dame (No. 25), Ohio State (No. 26), Georgetown (No. 27), West Virginia (No. 28), Nebraska (No. 34) and Michigan State (No. 51). The Aztecs are also the only school in a "non-automatic BCS qualifying" conference rated in the top 30.

San Diego State signed three, four-star recruits according to HoopGurlz, including forward Chairese Culberson, who was the No. 7 rated wing and 46th overall, forward Deajanae Scurry (No. 31 forward) and point guard Ahjalee Harvey (No. 32 point guard). Forwards Kristina Hunter and Erimma Amarikwa rounded out the Aztec fall signing class.

Preseason Points

The reigning MWC champion San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish second in the league in 2011 in a vote by the nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 13, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo.

The Aztecs received three first-place votes and 147 points overall, trailing only TCU, which had 16 first-place votes (174 points). SDSU, which has been picked first or second each of the last three years, just edged out Brigham Young for second place, as the Cougars had 145 points and garnered the other two first-place votes. Utah was picked fourth, followed by Wyoming, New Mexico, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force.

San Diego State has posted its two highest finishes in

conference history the last two seasons, tying with Utah for first place in 2009, and for third place in 2010.

Aztec Individual Accolades

Aztec senior center Paris Johnson was tabbed to the five-member preseason all-league squad for the third straight year at the MWC's annual media day last month. In addition, sophomore guard Courtney Clements, who redshirted a year ago after transferring from Arizona, was picked as the MWC's newcomer of the year and guard Melissa Sweat was chosen preseason freshman of the year.

Clements is the second SDSU player in a row to pick up the MWC's preseason newcomer of the year distinction, as senior Jessika Bradley was honored and went on to win the award last March.

Sweat, meanwhile, is the second Aztec on the current roster to earn the league's preseason freshman-of-the-year award, joining Johnson, who was honored in 2007.

Poll Watching

For the second consecutive season, San Diego State received votes in both national preseason top-25 polls. The Aztecs garnered the 34th-most votes (22 total) in the *USA Today ESPN* coaches edition, while they had the 37th-most votes (8 total) in the Associated Press Top 25.

SDSU earned votes in the coaches' poll eight times in 2009-10, including on Nov. 23, when it reached the No. 24 slot. The Aztecs finished the campaign at No. 20, the first time they had been ranked in the coaches' poll to end a season since it began in 1986.

The team also broke through in the AP poll a year ago, earning its first top-25 ranking (23rd on Nov. 23) since March 1995, when the team ended up 22nd following a 24-6 campaign.

SDSU is joined by TCU as the only two Mountain West Conference schools to receive votes in either poll thus far in 2010-11. The Aztecs garnered one vote in the first regular-season AP poll released Nov. 16, and had two in the Nov. 22 edition.

Strength Of Schedule

In 2010-11, SDSU has potentially six regular-season games against teams receiving votes in the AP preseason poll, which included the match-up with No. 16 UCLA to open the campaign on Nov. 12. Besides No. 23 TCU, who the Aztecs play twice, No. 8 Texas A&M (Dec. 30), Dayton (Dec. 18) and USC (Dec. 19) are all ranked or receiving votes.

Other Things To Watch For In 2010-11

Coming off one of the most successful seasons in Aztec basketball history, here are a few other things to look for in 2010-11:

- ♦ SDSU senior center Paris Johnson has started all 102 career contests since coming to Montezuma Mesa in 2007-08. She needs to start the next 21 outings to beat the school record for consecutive starts of 122, set a year ago by Quenese Davis.
- ♦ SDSU is a combined 27-3 at home over the last two campaigns entering this season. The Aztecs have 10 or more wins at Viejas Arena in three of the last four years.
- ♦ The Aztecs have 34 Mountain West Conference

wins in the last four seasons after having only 19 in the league's first seven years.

- ♦ SDSU has advanced to the final of the Mountain West Conference Championships three years in a row, after not winning a single game in the MWC tournament's first eight years of existence.

Back Again

San Diego State returns three starters, including senior center Paris Johnson, senior forward Jessika Bradley and senior guard Coco Davis. Three other letterwinners are also back in juniors Candace Chambers and **Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.)** and sophomore **Gabrielle Clark (Los Angeles, Calif.)**, who redshirted a year ago after lettering in 2008-09.

Noting The Newcomers

Of the 13 student-athletes on this year's roster, eight players did not compete for a full season with the Aztecs in 2009-10.

Four of the eight were on campus, but sophomores Courtney Clements and **Malia Nahinu (Hayward, Calif.)** both had to sit out a year after transferring from Arizona. Gabrielle Clark and **Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.)**, meanwhile, each tore an ACL either before the season began (Clark) or less than two games into the campaign (Stamps), and utilized their medical redshirt year.

Two players, guards **Chelsea Hopkins (Las Vegas, Nev.)** and Sajoyia Griffin, came from Duke and South Plains College, respectively, while guard Melissa Sweat and forward **Jasmine Porter (Layton, Utah)** are true freshmen.

Entering the 2010-11 season, five players account for 341 of the 366 total career games played (93.2 percent) in an Aztec uniform by the entire SDSU 2010-11 roster.

Hopkins Joins The Aztecs

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced in early July that Chelsea Hopkins transferred to the Aztecs from Duke University. Hopkins, a 5-8 point guard, has two years of eligibility remaining and will be able to play for SDSU beginning with the 2011-12 season.

Hopkins appeared in 46 contests for the Blue Devils from 2008-10, helping the team to a pair of NCAA tournament appearances, including a trip to the Elite Eight this past year, and a combined record of 57-12.

Hopkins signed with Duke after a successful four-year career at Mojave High School in Las Vegas, where she led the state in scoring as a junior (27.7 ppg.) and senior (28.5 ppg.). The 2006 and 2008 Las Vegas Athletic Club Female Athlete of the Year was a two-time first-team all-state and three-time all-conference honoree. Her freshman season she was named the state of Nevada's Gatorade Newcomer of the Year.

As a prep, Hopkins was rated the 63rd-best player in America and the No. 12 point guard by Hoopgurlz.com, and played during the summer for coach Brian Crichlow's West Coast Premier Black club team, alongside current Aztec guard Kiyana Stamps.

Hopkins has also excelled in the classroom, earning a spot on the Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Honor Roll and in high school, boasted a 4.7 GPA and

was her class salutatorian and treasurer.

2009-10 Rewind

The San Diego State women's basketball team made a remarkable run in 2009-10, highlighted by its first Mountain West Conference tournament title and a trip to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen.

Below are a few of the accomplishments of last year's team:

- ♦ Earned its first-ever final top 25 ranking in *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll (No. 20), becoming the first MWC school to do so since 2006. The No. 20 spot ties as the program's highest-ever final ranking in a national poll (No. 20 in AP in 1985).

- ♦ Earned the program's first AP top 25 regular-season ranking since 1995 (Nov. 23 – No. 23)

- ♦ Posted back-to-back seasons with at least 23 wins for the first time since 1994-95 (24) and 1993-94 (26) ... Logged the program's 13th, 20-win campaign with six of those coming under coach Beth Burns ... Had an eight-game win streak, the team's longest since 1996-97

- ♦ Recorded three wins over AP top 25 teams (No. 10 West Virginia, No. 17 Texas, No. 23 TCU) ... Eight of 11 losses were to teams advancing to the NCAAs, including three vs. teams advancing to the Sweet 16

- ♦ Earned the program's first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance (64-team bracket) and won two NCAA games in the same season for the first time in school history.

- ♦ Garnered the program's eighth NCAA tournament bid and made back-to-back NCAA appearances for the first time since 1994-95

- ♦ Was the lowest seed to advance to the Sweet 16 since 2007, was the first No. 11 seed to advance to the Sweet 16 since 2004, and the first MWC team to advance to the Sweet 16 since 2006 ... Was the 12th double-digit seed all-time to advance to the Sweet 16

- ♦ Won its first MWC championship title and advanced to the third consecutive MWC championship game.

Last Year's Numbers

The Aztecs' success also translated into big numbers in the stat columns. Here are some of the 2009-10 team's statistical highlights:

- ♦ SDSU led the MWC in field-goal percentage (44.5), three-point field-goal defense (27.0), blocked shots (5.4), offensive rebound percentage (40.7), victories (23 – tied)

- ♦ SDSU ended the year ranked eighth nationally in three-point field goal percentage defense, 18th in blocks per game, 22nd in field goal percentage and 25th in assists per game.

- ♦ The Aztecs limited 18 of its 34 opponents to under 60 points a game, including a 55-spot by No. 10 West Virginia. Eight foes scored 50 or fewer points and three didn't reach the 40-point barrier.

- ♦ Twelve of the Aztecs' 23 wins were by 19 or more points, after posting only six such victories in 2008-09.

- ♦ SDSU held opponents to three or fewer 3-pointers in a game 20 times last season, including a combined 3-for-22 mark in the NCAA First & Second Rounds.

- ♦ The Aztecs shot at least 40 percent from the field in 26 of 34 outings, topping the 45 mark on 14 occasions. The team's final season field-goal percentage of 44.5 is its best since the 1995-96 squad shot 45.6 percent.

◆ SDSU posted a school-record 155 three-pointers for the second season in a row and improved its team free-throw percentage from 61.2 in 2008-09 to 69.9 in 2009-10.

Award Central

The awards were aplenty for this past year's Aztec squad, as several individuals were singled out for their achievement.

Guard Jené Morris' was named an honorable mention State Farm Coaches' All-American for the second year in a row, was tabbed the 2010 MWC Defensive Player of the Year for the second consecutive season and became the first Aztec to earn first-team all-league honors twice since Jodi Nowlin-Tres in 1996-97. Morris, who was the first SDSU player to ever lead the MWC in scoring, also garnered a spot on the MWC all-defensive team and MWC championship all-tournament squad. She began the season by being named to the national watch list for both the Naismith and Wooden Awards, and the Wade Trophy.

Fellow guard Quenese Davis completed her career by picking up the MWC tournament MVP honors after averaging 18.7 points, 12 steals and a 55.6 three-point percentage over the three games. Davis was a third-team all-league pick, while junior Paris Johnson was a second-team honoree.

SDSU forward Jessika Bradley was the other big award-winner as the 2010 MWC Newcomer of the Year.

Aztec In The WNBA

Guard Jené Morris became San Diego State's first-ever WNBA Draft pick on April 8, 2010, going in the first round (11th pick overall) to the Indiana Fever. Morris, who was one of 14 players invited to the Draft announcement in Secaucus, N.J., also is the first Aztec to ever don a WNBA jersey.

The San Francisco native became the 11th player in Mountain West Conference history to be tabbed in the WNBA Draft and the fourth selected in the first round. She is the league's highest pick overall since 2006, and third highest in MWC history, trailing only Utah's Shona Thorburn (7th overall) and TCU's Sandora Irvin (3rd).

A two-time honorable mention All-American and Mountain West Conference defensive player of the year, Morris was the first Aztec to ever lead the MWC in scoring (17.1 ppg.), is the conference's all-time leader in career steals (293) and ranks third in the SDSU record book in career points with 1,499, despite only playing three seasons in the Red and Black.

She played 25 games during her rookie campaign for the Fever, before moving to Poland after the WNBA season to play professionally for CCC Polkowice.

TV Time

The Aztecs will have seven regular-season televised games in 2010-11. After the UCLA contest that was carried by The Mtn., SDSU will have six of its' MWC regular-season games on TV, including three straight in January. In all, the Aztecs will have six games on The Mtn. and one on CBS College Sports.

Listen/Watch Live

For the 10th straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play

of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alum Chris Elio will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the fourth straight season.

Again in 2010-11, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

Burns Named To WBCA Board

This past June, San Diego State head coach Beth Burns was reelected to a three-year term on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors. She continues to serve as a Division I at-large representative on the 23-member board.

Burns had been serving a one-year term in the same position before she was elected in 2010. She is an active member of the WBCA, having previously served as a committee member for the Jostens-Berenson Lifetime Achievement Award and being on the voting panel for the *WBCA/USA Today* Coaches Top 25 national weekly poll.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the sixth season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

Burns took the program to new heights in 2009-10, as the Aztecs advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams. SDSU notched victories over a pair of top 25 foes in No. 10 West Virginia and defeated No. 17 Texas on the Longhorns' home floor. The 11th-seeded Aztecs were the lowest seed to advance to the Round of 16 in 2010, and lowest overall since 2007.

In the last two seasons, San Diego State has posted a combined record of 47-19, including a 27-3 mark on its home court, with Burns at the helm. The Aztecs claimed the program's first-ever MWC tournament championship in 2010, after earning a share of the regular-season crown in 2009. SDSU has made two consecutive NCAA appearances, going 2-0 in first-round games, after not earning a postseason bid in the 11 previous years.

In her first stint as Aztec head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A four-time conference coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 19-year overall head coaching record of 313-224, while her school record stands at 232-159 over 13 seasons.

Earlier this fall, Burns signed a five-year contract extension to stay as SDSU's head coach through the 2014-15 campaign.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team scored only four points in the final 6:58 of the game, as the Aztecs were unable to pull off the upset of 16th-ranked UCLA in front of 2,196 fans at Viejas Arena. The Bruins rallied from an eight-point halftime deficit to claim the 55-48 victory in both schools' season-openers.

SDSU sophomore Courtney Clements had a game-high 19 points, despite missing her first nine shots from the field. Clements also added six rebounds in her first outing as an Aztec, while senior center Paris Johnson pulled down a team-best 10 boards to go with her eight points. Senior Coco Davis chipped in nine points and seven assists in her first start at point guard.

UCLA scored the first five points of the game, before San Diego State notched its first bucket of the 2010-11 campaign by freshman Melissa Sweat at the 17:41 mark. The Bruins went up by seven at 9-2, but the Aztecs went on a 7-0 run to tie the contest at 9-9.

The squads would be tied twice more in the first half, including at 16-16. Davis then hit a jumper and Clements scored seven points in a row to put the Aztecs up by nine at 25-16. After UCLA cut its deficit to five twice in the final two minutes, SDSU's Gabrielle Clark hit a 3-pointer with 23 seconds remaining to give the home team a 32-24 advantage heading into the locker room.

The Aztecs' shooting woes from the field continued into the second half, as the Bruins scored the first eight points to tie the score at 32-32. San Diego State finally got on the scoreboard with a Davis triple to stay ahead, but the lead changed hands five times, including at the 5:53 mark when UCLA hit a pair of free throws to put it up 45-44.

SDSU would manage only four more points the rest of the way as UCLA ended the evening on a 10-4 run to secure the 55-48 victory.

SAN DIEGO - Cal State Bakersfield outscored San Diego State 12-3 in the final four minutes of the game to earn a 73-62 victory over the host Aztecs at Viejas Arena. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 0-2 on the season, while the Roadrunners improved to 3-0 following the two schools' first-ever meeting.

San Diego State senior center Paris Johnson led the Aztecs both offensively and on the glass, tallying her 16th career double-double with a career-best 18 rebounds and 19 points on 7-for-8 shooting.

Sophomore Courtney Clements was the only other Aztec in double-figure points with 15 to go with eight rebounds and three assists. Freshman Melissa Sweat had eight points and was a perfect 2-for-2 from beyond the arc, while senior Jessika Bradley had nine rebounds and three assists. Senior Coco Davis had a team-best eight assists, but was 1-for-11 from the field.

Cal State Bakersfield jumped out to an early 10-point lead, taking advantage of SDSU's five turnovers in the first three minutes, and the hot shooting of Roadrunner guard Britney McGee, who had 10 points during that same span. The Aztecs finally were able to put some offense together, scoring six straight points to get to within four at 14-10 at the 13:07 mark.

CSUB, however, pushed its lead back up to nine points until a late run, including a pair of triples by junior Sajoyia Griffin, put the home team down by only three at 33-30 heading into the locker room.

San Diego State came out of the break and tied the game at 35, before pushing out to its largest lead of the night at 44-37 less than four minutes into the second half. That advantage quickly disappeared when the Roadrunners converted two more Aztec giveaways into points and a 44-44 tie.

After another tie at 48-48, SDSU had another turnover and missed two free throw attempts which ignited a 7-0 CSUB run. The Aztec deficit would grow to 10 with 1:33 remaining and left too little time for another rally, as the Roadrunners came away with the 73-62 win.

SAN DIEGO - A pair of turnovers in the final 1:33 of the game proved costly, as the San Diego State women's basketball team was unable to record its first victory of the season, falling to visiting UC Irvine, 68-66, at Viejas Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs, who rallied to tie the score after a pair of seven-point deficits, dropped to 0-3 overall and the Anteaters improved to 1-3 on the year.

SDSU sophomore guard Courtney Clements posted a team-best 16 points on 7-of-15 shooting, while seniors Jessika Bradley and Paris Johnson both chipped in 13 points apiece. Bradley was one rebound short of a double-double with nine boards and senior guard Coco Davis matched her career-best with five of the Aztecs' 13 steals on the night.

San Diego State got off to a good start, scoring eight straight points within the first two minutes of the contest for an 8-0 lead. The Anteaters finally got on the board with a jumper by Jade Smith-Williams, followed quickly by a 3-pointer by Kassandra McCalister to cut their deficit to just three.

The Aztecs continued to hold a two possession advantage until going up by seven points twice, including at 22-15. UC Irvine didn't back down, eventually knotting the game at 22 and again at 24 points, and taking the lead for the remainder of the first half with an 18-11 run and a 42-35 advantage at the break.

SDSU quickly erased the UCI lead by scoring the first six points of the second half and tying the game for the third time at 44-44. The Aztecs, however, were never able to jump ahead, as the game was knotted three more occasions, but the Anteaters continued to score the very next bucket.

The final tie came at 63-63 with 3:58 left in the game. UC Irvine got a fast-break basket off a steal, followed by a miscommunication on a hand-off between Clements and Davis that resulted in another giveaway, which the Anteaters converted into two free throws with 18 seconds left. Davis hit a long 3-pointer to close the gap to just two, but too little time was left as the Anteaters came away with the 68-66 victory.

RENO, Nev. - Behind Paris Johnson's 27 points and 12 rebounds, the San Diego State women's basketball team claimed its first victory of the season, defeating Minnesota, 61-59, in its first contest of the Nugget Classic at the Lawlor Events Center in Reno, Nev. The Aztecs moved to 1-3 on the year following 1,000th game in SDSU program history, while the Gophers dropped to 3-3 on the season in the first meeting between the sides in 25 years.

Johnson dominated the paint, scoring 15 of her game-high 27 points in the first half, while also adding 12 rebounds for her second double-double of the campaign. The 6-4 center was 11-of-17 (64.7 percent) shooting for her biggest offensive output since 2008, and the 11th, 20-point scoring game of her career.

Jessika Bradley, was the only other Aztec in double-figure points with 12 to go with her seven rebounds and season-best four blocked shots. Johnson had three of SDSU's other eight rejections on the night, while sophomore Courtney Clements added nine points and Coco Davis contributed eight assists.

San Diego State held a two-point lead at 61-59 with only 20 seconds remaining, as the Gophers ended up getting a pair of chances to tie or win the game. Minnesota guard Leah Cotton missed a jumper on her team's first opportunity, but the rebound resulted in an alternate possession which gave the ball back to the Gophers with 12 seconds left.

Coming out of a timeout, Minnesota's Micaella Riche got the ball in the low block, but then tried to muscle her way to the basket, knocking over a defender and was called for an offensive foul and a turnover. The Aztecs then just had to inbound the ball, which they did, to secure the victory.

The game was tied five times in the first half, before an 18-4 run gave SDSU its largest lead at 39-25. Minnesota, however, would close that gap all the way down to only five points at the break at 39-34 on a lay-up at the buzzer.

The Aztecs started the second half quickly, moving their advantage back up to 11 points twice and later 10 points at 57-47 with 8:39 to go in the game. The Gophers staged yet another rally as SDSU struggled to find the basket, scoring only two points over a more than six-minute span to allow Minnesota to get to within two points twice, including in the final minute.

RENO, Nev. - The San Diego State women's basketball team rallied from an 11-point second-half deficit to take the lead, but couldn't come away with the victory, falling in the championship game of the Nugget Classic to host Nevada, 63-61, at the Lawlor Events Center. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped to 1-4 on the season, while the Wolf Pack improved to 5-1.

Senior Paris Johnson once again led SDSU with 19 points on 8-for-13 shooting, while also tallying seven rebounds and a pair of blocked shots. Johnson was one of two Aztecs named to the all-tournament squad along with classmate Jessika Bradley, who had eight rebounds and three blocks. Sophomore Courtney Clements added 11 points, while junior Sajoyia Griffin had her best performance of the year with a career-high nine points, five rebounds and seven assists, compared to just one turnover.

There were four ties and six lead changes in the first 10 minutes of the game as each side boasted a four-point advantage. Nevada went on a 9-0 run to go up 28-19, but the Aztecs responded with two buckets by Clements and one by Candace Chambers to close the gap to 28-26.

The Wolf Pack began to pile up trips to the free-throw line using a 13-for-16 performance at the stripe to head into the break up by six points at 39-33.

After the two sides combined for only six points in the first four minutes, the Wolf Pack broke their stalemate first, building its largest lead of the game at 51-40 at the 13:59 mark.

The Aztecs, however, wouldn't go down easily, answering with a 9-2 run to close to within four points twice, before a fast-break bucket made it a one-point game and two free throws put the visitors ahead 58-57 with 3:03 to go.

Coming out of a timeout, Nevada's Tahnee Robinson hit a 3-pointer, but Johnson tied it at 60 with a lay-up. Robinson struck again the next time up the floor, making what would turn out to be the winning basket with 25 seconds remaining to give her squad another two-point advantage at 62-61.

Bradley was fouled on the Aztecs' next possession, but was only able to make the first of her two free throws, as Robinson secured the rebound and was then fouled herself. She made one of two shots at the stripe and Coco Davis attempted to get the ball down the court with only four seconds left, but was unable to make the final shot near half court, as the Wolf Pack survived for the 63-61 win.
