- At San Diego State: Athletic defensive back ... A smart player ... Is excellent against the run with good coverage skills ... Not afraid of contact ... Was on the two-deep for the final five games in 2016 at left cornerback as a true freshman ... Then played in 12-of-13 in 2017, before starting the first 10 games at cornerback in 2018 ... Made the move to Field Warrior (safety) in the spring of 2019 ... Was slated to start 2019 at Boundary Warrior, but moved back to cornerback for the first two games with Darren Hall out with an injury, but went back to Boundary Warrior ... Tore his ACL in his right knee in the fifth game of the season at Colorado State and missed the rest of the year.
- 2019 (Senior): Started the team's first five games, including the first two at cornerback and three at Boundary Warrior, before tearing his ACL in his right knee and missing the rest of the season ... Finished with 22 tackles (15 solo), including 3.0 tackles for loss, an 11-yard sack, forced fumble and two pass breakups ... Started the opener with Weber State at cornerback, where he had four solo tackles, including one tackle for loss, and one pass breakup, while playing all 51 snaps ... Came up with three tackles (two solo) in a start at cornerback at UCLA, while adding a 11-yard sack (and TFL), forced fumble and pass breakup ... Started at Boundary Warrior for the first time of the season at New Mexico State, making four tackles (three solo) in 48 snaps ... Had a career-high eight tackles (four solo) in a start at Boundary Warrior against Utah State, logging 46 snaps ... Had three tackles (two solo), including one for a 2-yard loss, in a start at Colorado State before exiting late with a knee injury ... Missed the rest of the season, including games vs. Wyoming, at San Jose State, at UNLV, vs. Nevada, vs. Fresno State at Hawai'i, against Brigham Young and vs. Central Michigan in the New Mexico Bowl.
- 2018 (Junior): Played in all 13 games, starting 10 times at cornerback ... Had 37 tackles (24 solo) with 4.5 tackles for loss, a 12-vard sack, a forced fumble, fumble recovery and four pass breakups ... Earned his first career start in the opener at No. 13/13 Stanford, making five tackles with 0.5 tackle for loss ... Had a career-high seven stops (six solo) with a 4-yard tackle for loss vs. Sacramento State ... His seven stops tied Kvahva Tezino for the most on the team ... Had six tackles (five solo) and a career-best four pass breakups against No. 23/25 Arizona State ... The four pass breakups were tied for the 17th most in a FBS game in 2018 ... Had a big game against Eastern Michigan in another start, making four tackles (three solo) with a 12-yard sack, a career-high 1.5 tackles for loss and his first career forced fumble ... Started again at rv/No. 24 Boise State, making one tackle ... Had two assisted stops in a start vs. Air Force ... Made four tackles (two solo) with 0.5 tackles for loss against San José State in a starting role ... Had two stops (one solo), including a tackle for loss, in a start at Nevada ... Registered two solo tackles in a start at New Mexico ... Made one solo tackle in a start against UNLV ... Did not start for the first time at Fresno State, but did make a solo tackle on special teams ... Played on special teams against Hawai'i ... Had two tackles (one solo) and recovered his first career fumble in 25 snaps vs. Ohio in the DXL Frisco Bowl.
- 2017 (Sophomore): Played in 12 games, making 13 tackles (nine solo) and a pass breakup ... Saw time in a reserve role in the opener vs. UC Davis, making one solo stop ... Had a solo stop off the bench on special teams at Arizona State ... Logged special teams time vs. No. 19/19 Stanford and at Air Force, but did not find the stat sheet ... Did not play against Northern Illinois ... Had a career-high four tackles (two solo) in time late and on special teams at UNLV ... Did not record a stat against Boise State ... Made one solo tackle against Fresno State ... Had a solo tackle on special teams at Hawai'i ... Had an assisted tackle at San José State ... Registered a solo stop against Nevada ... Had a pass breakup late against New Mexico, the first of his career ... Logged a career-high 33 snaps against Army West Point in the Armed Forces Bowl, making

two tackles (one solo).

- 2016 (True Freshman): Had one tackle in seven games, which went down as a 10-yard sack (and tackle for loss) ... Was not on the travel squad and did not play the first six games of the season ... Was on the travel roster for the first time of his career against San José State, but did not play ... Logged the first playing time of his career at Utah State without making the stat sheet ... Logged snaps late against Hawai'i, sacking UH quarterback Dru Brown for a 10-yard loss on 4th and 5, keeping SDSU's 55-0 shutout intact ... Also played the final five games of the season, including the MW Championship and the Las Vegas Bowl, without recording a stat.
- High School: A two-year letter winner at Chandler High School in Chandler, Ariz., the same high school that former Aztec and 2014 all-MW punt returner Lloyd Mills attended ... Helped the Wolves go 24-4 (.857) over his final two years, including a 9-1 record in league play ... Chandler HS finished first in the state in 2014 and second in 2015 ... Recorded 130 tackles, four interceptions and nine pass deflections over his two seasons, including 85 stops, two interceptions, a touchdown and six pass deflections as a senior in 2015 ... Was an all-state, allsection and all-district selection ... A three-star recruit by 247sports and ESPN, and a two-star

recruit by Rivals and Scout ... Received a grade of 81 by 247sports and a grade of 71 by ESPN ... Was picked as the 13th-best recruit in Arizona by ESPN and the 17th best by 247sports ... Also played basketball and competed in track and field at Chandler High School ... A member of the National Honor Society.

Personal: Kyree Damon Woods was born Feb. 2, 1998, in Mesa, Ariz. ... Picked the Aztecs
over other offers from Brown, Cornell, Nevada, New Mexico State, UNLV and Utah State ... Also
received interest from Boise State, Boston College, California, Colorado, Northwestern, Oregon,
Washington State and Wyoming ... Majored in business administration with an emphasis in
marketing.
