OFF TO BEST START SINCE 1994, AZTECS TRAVEL TO COLUMBIA TO FACE NO. 25 MISSOURI

San Diego State (2-0), which is undefeated after two games for the first time in 16 years, plays its second consecutive road game when the Aztecs travel to Columbia, Mo., to face fellow unbeaten No. 25 Missouri on Saturday evening at Memorial Stadium.

The game is available nationally on a pay-per-view basis, with additional details to be released as they become available. The game can be heard throughout southern California on AM 600 KOGO.

Saturday's contest features two of the 46 remaining undefeated teams at the FBS level and two of the 43 teams that own a 2-0 record. The contest is one of 10 games this week (nine on Saturday) between undefeated FBS teams.

With its 41-21 victory at New Mexico State last Saturday, San Diego State posted its first 2-0 start since 1994, and its first 2-0 start with at least one of those victories coming on the road since 1986. The Aztecs took a 13-7 lead just prior to intermission and led the entire second half. Freshman running back Ronnie Hillman became the 71st player in school history to record a 100-yard rushing game, carrying 22 times for 150 yards and four touchdowns. He is the first Aztec to score four rushing touchdowns since Nov. 17, 2001, and also set a Mountain West Conference single-game record for a freshman.

The Aztec defense recorded seven three-and-out series and held the Aggies to 169 yards of total offense over the final three quarters of the contest.

San Diego State's special teams enjoyed another big day, with senior punter Brian Stahovich booming four punts of 50 or more yards (50.8 average), including two that pinned New Mexico State inside the 20, a forced turnover by the punt coverage unit, and six of eight kickoffs resulting in touchbacks.

It is early in the season, but the drastic improvement in the Aztec football program is evident under second-year head coach Brady Hoke. Through Saturday, San Diego State ranks among the top 25 nationally in six major statistical categories - total offense (6th), scoring defense (14th), passing offense (14th), scoring offense (16th), total defense (20th) and rushing offense (21st).

Saturday's game between the Tigers and Aztecs is just the third all-time meeting between the teams, with Missouri sweeping a home-and-home series in 1979 (45-15 in Columbia) and 1980 (31-7 in San Diego). Although the Aztecs have faced a slew of teams from the Midwest over the past nine years (Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State (three times), and Wisconsin), this will mark SDSU's first encounter with a member of the Big 12 Conference since suffering a 34-14 defeat at 17th-ranked Colorado on Sept. 7, 2002.

The Aztecs are looking for their first 3-0 start to a campaign since 1981 and their eighth such start in their 42nd season at the Division I level.

Aztecs Now Online, a weekly show featuring San Diego State athletics, is set to premiere on Monday, Aug. 30. The show will be posted every Monday night during the season exclusively on GoAztecs.com.

Hosted by Mike Costa, the sideline reporter for SDSU football broadcasts, Aztecs Now Online will highlight head coach Brady Hoke, a football student-athlete and an Aztec Olympic sport.

Each episode will include a review of the previous week's game and a preview of the upcoming contest as well as an Olympic sport feature, which gives fans an in-depth look at one of SDSU's other 17 sports on campus.

TEAM QUICK NOTES

► San Diego State is 2-0 for the first time since 1994 and for the 12th time in 42 seasons at the Division I level. In 10 of the previous 11 seasons the Aztecs have opened with consecutive wins, San Diego State has gone on to post a winning record. In the previous 11 seasons in which SDSU has started 2-0, the Aztecs have gone on to average 8.45 victories. San Diego State's last 3-0 start to a season was in 1981.

► San Diego State has outscored its opponents this season by 67 points (88-21). The +67 point differential is the best through two games for an SDSU squad since the 1969 team owned a +83 margin following wins over Cal State Los Angeles and San Jose State.

► San Diego State is one three schools in the nation that is ranked among the NCAA top 20 in scoring offense, scoring defense, total offense and total defense. The other two schools are 5th/6th-ranked Oregon and 24th/18th-ranked Arizona. Six other schools are ranked among the top 20 in three of those four categories. They are No. 1 Alabama, No. 12/13 Arkansas, No. 19/19 Stanford, No. 24 California, Arizona State and Texas A&M.

► With eight rushing touchdowns in the first eight quarters of football this season, San Diego State has matched its total number of rushing scores from the entire 2009 campaign. The Aztecs are well on their way to eclipsing last season's production on the ground. In 2009, San Diego State rushed for 940 yards for the season, marking the third straight year SDSU ranked 105th or lower in rushing offense. Through two games in 2010, the Aztecs have amassed 480 rushing yards, which places them 51.1 percent of the way to their 2009 output. San Diego State currently ranks 21st in the country in rushing offense (231.00 per game), tied for seventh in rushing touchdowns (8) and 10th in yards per carry (6.24).

► The Aztec passing game continues to show tremendous efficiency, posting a third consecutive 300-yard passing performance (dating back to last season), and a second consecutive interception-free game. Junior quarterback Ryan Lindley has completed 54.4 percent of his passes and thrown for 622 yards in the first two contests and SDSU ranks 14th in the country in passing. Senior wide receiver DeMarco Sampson is ninth nationally in receiving yards per game (126.00), while classmate and Biletnikoff nominee Vincent Brown is 75th nationally in the category (69.00). Missouri and San Diego State are two of the 32 schools that have yet to throw an interception this season. The Aztecs have thrown for the fifth-highest passing yards among those schools without an interception, while Missouri has the second-most passing attempts without an INT (SDSU is seventh on that list).

► The improvement on the defensive side of the ball has been nothing short of amazing. One week after recording the school's first shutout in seven years, the Aztec defense continued its stingy play, allowing a mere 169 yards after the first quarter. The Aztecs held New Mexico State to just 2-for-13 on third-down conversions, making SDSU's opponents 5-for-28 (17.9 percent) this season. That figure is tied with Oregon for the fourth-lowest third-down conversion percentage in the country and a far cry from last season when Aztec opponents converted at a rate of 46 percent. How in control was SDSU's defense on Saturday? New Mexico State had 60 offensive snaps on the evening, with 54 of those plays resulting in a total of 157 yards.

SAN DIEGO STATE-MISSOURI: THE SERIES

► San Diego State and Missouri will meet for the third time on the gridiron Saturday, with the Tigers winning the previous two encounters. Missouri swept a home-and-home series with the Aztecs in 1979-80.

► The Aztecs own a 7-9 all-time record against current members of the Big 12, but are 2-1 against those teams since the formation of the league. San Diego State defeated Oklahoma, 51-31, on Sept. 21, 1996, in the first year of the league's existence. The other two encounters came on Sept. 25, 1999, when the Aztecs won at Kansas, 41-13, and Sept. 7, 2002, with 17th-ranked Colorado claiming a 34-14 win in Boulder. There are no future Big 12 teams on the schedule at this time.

► Sept. 8, 1979 | Missouri 45, San Diego State 31, Memorial Stadium | Columbia, Mo. - In one of the stranger games in school history, San Diego State held advantages in first downs (18-12) and total offense (356-276), but suffered from 11 turnovers, including seven interceptions, in a 45-31 loss at Missouri. Steve Stapler recorded 113 receiving yards and Mark Halda threw for 260 yards. San Diego State scored the first 13 points of the game and led 13-0 at half-time. The Tigers, which had just 48 yards of total offense in the first half, benefitted from a fumble recovery in the end zone and a 71-yard interception return for touchdown as part of a 31-point fourth quarter. The 11 turnovers are the most for the Aztecs in a single game.

► Sept. 27, 1980 | No. 12 Missouri 31, San Diego State 7, Jack Murphy Stadium | San Diego - Once again, San Diego State was a victim of turnovers as the Aztecs committed six, including five interceptions, as 12th-ranked Missouri claimed a 31-7 win. Three Aztec quarterbacks combined to throw the five interceptions. Bobby Taylor had a game-high 107 yards receiving and caught a 75-yard touchdown pass from Corral Kofler for SDSU's lone score. The game kicked off at 10:05 a.m. local time to accommodate a Padres-Dodgers baseball game later that day. Pedro Guerrero homered, Steve Garvey had three hits and Don Sutton allowed just one unearned run in seven innings as Los Angeles defeated San Diego, 6-4.

SAN DIEGO STATE-MISSOURI: CONNECTIONS

► SDSU head coach Brady Hoke and Missouri head coach Gary Pinkel both have ties to the University of Toledo. Hoke coached outside linebackers at Toledo in 1987-88, while Pinkel was the Rockets' head coach from 1991-2000. In all, Hoke and nine members of the Missouri coaching staff have coached at Toledo.

► Tonight marks the third time that Hoke has faced Pinkel and Missouri. Hoke coached against the Tigers in each of his first two seasons at Ball State, losing in Columbia in 2003 and 2004. Missouri defeated Hoke's Ball State squads, 35-7 on Sept. 6, 2003 (Hoke's second game as head coach at Ball State) and 48-0 on Sept. 18, 2004 (six years ago game day).

► Missouri has won 19 straight non-conference games dating back to Sept. 10, 2005. The last coach to hand the Tigers a non-conference loss? Current San Diego State defensive coordinator Rocky Long. Long, the all-time winningest coach in Mountain West Conference history, took down the Tigers at Memorial Stadium, 45-35, as head coach of New Mexico. The Lobos forced three turnovers in that game and scored 17 fourth-quarter points to claim the win.

► SDSU defensive coordinator Rocky Long faced Missouri twice while head coach at New Mexico, splitting the matchups in 2005-06. Six of Missouri's current coaches were on the staff at the time.

► SDSU assistant head coach Jeff Hecklinski has coached in the Show Me State. From 2001-02, he was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Central Missouri State.

► No Aztec players or coaches are from Missouri.

► Missouri has just one player on its roster hailing from California. Junior linebacker Josh Tatum was born in Oakland. However, three players transferred to Missouri from City College of San Francisco, including Tatum and safeties Jarrell Harrison and Kenronte Walker.

LAST TIME OUT: SAN DIEGO STATE 41, NMSU 21

LAS CRUCES, N.M. - Behind freshman Ronnie Hillman's four, second-half touchdowns, the San Diego State football team started a season 2-0 for the first time in 16 years by defeating New Mexico State for the second consecutive campaign, 41-21, at Aggie Memorial Stadium.

The Aztecs once again used a balanced offensive attack, compiling 244 yards on the ground and 315 yards through the air to exceed the 500-yard mark in total offense in back-to-back outings for the first time since 2005. The SDSU defense, meanwhile, surrendered only 328 yards with 149 of those yards coming on five plays.

The Aggies, playing in their first contest of 2010, looked to gain momentum early, taking the opening kick off and putting together a 11-play, 61-yard drive, bolstered by a 27-yard reception and an Aztec pass

interference penalty on third and 20. NMSU kicker Tyler Stampler, however, missed wide right on a 37-yard field-goal leaving the game scoreless.

Taking over, San Diego State attempted five passes on its first six offensive plays, completing three of them to set up a 4th-and-1 at its own 40-yard line. The Aztecs gambled and went for it, but Davon Brown was stuffed at the line of scrimmage and NMSU took over on downs. Utilizing the short field, the Aggies scored just over two minutes later on an 18-yard rush by Kenny Turner to take a 7-0 lead.

After a three and out on its next drive, SDSU got on the board at the end of the first quarter, settling for a 25-yard Abel Perez field goal, despite having first and goal at the Aggie 10-yard line.

This proved to be a common theme for the Aztec offense in the second quarter, as it was unable to get into the end zone on each of its next two possessions, despite getting deep into NMSU territory. Place-kicker Perez made a 32-yard field goal, but missed on his next attempt from 37 yards out, meaning SDSU still trailed 7-6.

The Aztecs finally took the lead with 1:26 left until the half, as quarterback Ryan Lindley found Gavin Escobar for a 14-yard TD reception and the 13-7 advantage.

The second half turned into the Hillman show, as he started off the third quarter with a sensational 44-yard touchdown run and scored three more times, logging 15 carries for 120 yards in the final 30 minutes for the first 100-yard effort of his career.

NMSU, whose offense was limited to -3 yards in the second quarter, utilized quick strikes to keep the game close, scoring touchdowns on a one-play drive and later a three-play possession to only trail 27-21 with 11:45 left in the game.

SDSU would immediately answer, as a 57-yard screen pass from Lindley to Brandon Sullivan on a third and nine led to Hillman's third TD of the night. The freshman capped scoring following an NMSU turnover, rushing three consecutive times to put the final score at 41-21.

POSTGAME NOTES

► San Diego State improves to 2-0 for the first time in 16 years. It is the 12th time in 42 Division I seasons that the Aztecs have opened 2-0. In 10 of the previous 11 times, San Diego State has gone on to record a winning season, averaging 8.45 victories in those 11 campaigns.

► It is the first time a San Diego State team has opened with a 2-0 record, with at least one of those victories coming on the road since 1986. That season, the Aztecs ended the campaign with an 8-4 record, a trip to the Holiday Bowl and a No. 25 ranking in the final CNN/USA Today poll.

► San Diego State recorded its first non-conference road victory since Sept. 13, 2003 (at UTEP, 34-0). The victory today snapped a 14-game non-conference road losing streak. The Aztecs are 33-52-3 all-time in road openers.

► San Diego State snapped a 17-game losing

ing streak in its first road game of the season. The last time the Aztecs won their initial road contest of the campaign was Sept. 10, 1992, when SDSU won at Brigham Young, 45-38.

► Coupled with last season's victory over the Aggies, San Diego State completed a home-and-home sweep of a non-conference opponent in consecutive seasons for the first time since defeating UNLV (at that time a member of the Big West Conference) and Oklahoma State in 1981 and 1982. Since those series, San Diego State had 32 opportunities to complete a sweep prior to today.

► San Diego State improved to two games above .500 for the first time since posting a 3-1 record after four games of the 2003 campaign.

► San Diego State claimed consecutive victories in the same September for the first time since 2003. That season, the Aztecs won at UTEP (34-0) and vs. Samford (37-17) in consecutive weeks. SDSU is now 2-3 all-time in Sept. 11 games (1-3 on the road).

► San Diego State claimed its first ever victory in Las Cruces (three all-time games played against New Mexico State) and recorded its first victory in the "Land of Enchantment" state since Nov. 4, 2000 (a 17-16 win at New Mexico). The Aztecs move to 8-1-1 all-time against the Aggies and have won six in a row.

► San Diego State is now 2-2 in its last four road games after losing the previous nine contests away from Qualcomm Stadium (from Nov. 17, 2007-Sept. 16, 2009). The two victories in the last four road outings equals the total number of road wins San Diego State had in its previous 22 road games (2-20 from Dec. 3, 2005-Sept. 16, 2009).

► By outscoring its first two opponents by 67 points, San Diego State posted its most dominant opening to a campaign since the 1969 season. It is the second-widest scoring margin through two games of San Diego State's 42 seasons at the Division I level.

ADDITIONAL TEAM NOTES

► San Diego State scored 40 or more points in consecutive games for the first time since Oct. 11 and 19, 1996. That season, the Aztecs recorded wins over Hawai'i (56-8) and at New Mexico (48-42) in consecutive weeks.

► SDSU has recorded over 500 yards of total offense in back-to-back games for the first time since 2005, when the Aztecs had 508 yards vs. BYU and 513 yards vs. San Jose State ... SDSU has reached the 400-yard mark in total offense in three consecutive games for the first time since 2002, when the team turned the trick vs. Utah (410 yards), Wyoming (419 yards) and UNLV (475 yards). The Aztecs had 445 yards in last year's finale at UNLV and 531 yards against Nicholls.

► The Aztecs have rushed for at least 200 yards in back-to-back games for the first time since 2005, when SDSU had 210 yards vs. San Jose State and 265 yards vs. BYU ... The Aztecs have rushed for at least 100 yards in three consecutive outings for the first time since the first three games of the 2007 season.

► SDSU did not have a turnover in a game for the first time since last year's road victory at Colorado State.

► On Gavin Escobar's first career touchdown in the second quarter, SDSU has now scored a touchdown in 40 straight games.

► The Aztec defense limited the UNM offense to a combined -3 yards in the second quarter.

► With four last week and four tonight, SDSU has eight rushing TDs already this season after accumulating only eight in 12 outings a year ago.

PLAYER NOTES

► **Ronnie Hillman, Freshman RB:** First SDSU player to post four rushing touchdowns in the same game since Larry Ned turned the trick at Wyoming on Nov. 17, 2001 (W, 38-16) ... The four TDs tie for fifth in Aztec single-game history and it is the ninth time an Aztec has tallied exactly four rushing scores in the same outing ... Became the 71st player in Aztec history with a 100-yard rushing game in his career ... Marks the second straight year SDSU has had a true freshman log a 100-yard rushing game against New Mexico State (Walter Kazee, 2009, 101 yards) ... Has four rushing TDs in two career outings ... His first TD of the night came on a career-long 44-yard rush.

► **Brian Stahovich, Junior P:** Kicked his second, third and fourth punts of 50 or more yards in 2010 (also 56-yard punt vs. Nicholls) ... Has 29 career kicks for 50 or more yards ... Dropped two of his four kicks inside the 20 vs. NMSU.

► **Vincent Brown, Senior WR:** With his five catches vs. NMSU, moved from 10th to eighth in career receptions with 150, passing both Az-zahir Hakim (147) and Gary Garrison (148).

► **Abel Perez, Junior PK:** Logged a pair of field goals for the second game in a row ... On kickoffs, recorded six touchbacks in eight tries, giving him seven on the season. SDSU had only two touchbacks on kick-

offs in 2009.

► **Gavin Escobar, RS Freshman TE:** Posted his first career touchdown on his third career catch in the second quarter to give the Aztecs the 13-7 lead.

► **Ryan Lindley, Junior QB:** Threw for over 300 yards passing for the third-straight game, the longest streak of his career ... Did not throw an interception for the second game in a row, the second time in his career that he has had back-to-back outings with no picks thrown.

OTHER NOTES

► Aztec redshirt freshman tight end Gavin Escobar made his first career start vs. the Aggies. He is the third SDSU player to start a game for the first time in his career in 2010 (Davon Brown, Darryn Lewis).

► Redshirt freshman Dylan Denso caught his first career reception in the third quarter to give SDSU a first down.

► Aztec senior running back Brandon Sullivan caught a career-long 57 pass in the fourth quarter. His previous long reception was a 45-yard effort against Idaho in 2008.

► SDSU redshirt freshman Nat Berhe recovered his first career fumble in the fourth quarter, setting up the Aztecs' final TD.

AMONG THE ELITE

Through last Saturday's games, San Diego State is one of three schools nationally to rank among the top 20 in total offense, scoring offense, total defense and scoring defense. The other two teams are No. 5/6 Oregon and No. 24/18 Arizona.

Six other schools are among the top 20 in three of the aforementioned categories. They are No. 1/1 Alabama, No. 12/13 Arkansas, No. 19/19 Stanford, No. --/24 California, Arizona State and Texas A&M.

PROGRESS AS PROMISED

It is early in the season, but the remarkable progress San Diego State has shown under second-year coach Brady Hoke and his staff is quite evident when looking at the stats.

In addition, to posting the first 2-0 start in 16 seasons, and the most dominant opening two games of a campaign since 1969, the Aztecs' progress in the NCAA stats is equally amazing.

At the right is a comparison of the national rankings in major categories from the past three seasons - 2008 (the year prior to Brady Hoke), 2009 (the first year of Hoke and Co.) and this season.

This year, San Diego State ranks among the top 21 of six of the eight major categories and in the top 30 in all eight categories. By comparison, The Aztecs were ranked in the top 61 of just one category last season and in 2008, were in the bottom 15 of six of those same eight categories.

WE HAVE LOCATED THE RUNNING GAME

Brady Hoke and offensive coordinator Al Borges have pledged to have a balanced offensive attack since they arrived on campus. This year, Aztec fans have seen exactly what they meant.

After finishing 105th (2007), 117th (2008) and 116th (2009) in rushing offense the last three seasons, San Diego State has found its running game. Behind an offensive line that returned four starters from a year ago and spent the offseason living in the weight room, and a quartet of running backs, San Diego State has rushed for 462 yards and eight touchdowns in its first two games of the season.

The Aztecs currently rank 21st nationally in rushing, and the eight rushing touchdowns are tied for

MEET RONNIE HILLMAN

True freshman running back Ronnie Hillman had a game to remember last Saturday, carrying 22 times for 150 yards and four, second-half touchdowns in just his second college game. He became the 71st player to record a 100-yard rushing game in Aztec history and it was just the 81st time in school history that a player rushed for 150 or more yards.

Through two games, Hillman has carried 37 times for 215 yards, an average of 5.8 yards per carry. The freshman already has five rushing touchdowns, one more than any Aztec player had in 2009.

Among his classmates nationally, Hillman leads all freshmen in rushing touchdowns and yards per carry and is third in rushing yards per game.

With 215 yards to date, Hillman would need to average 78.5 yards over the remaining 10 games to become the third San Diego State freshman to rush for 1,000 yards. Marshall Faulk in 1991 and Lynell Hamilton in 2003 are the only Aztecs to break the 1K yard total in their freshman campaign.

HILLMAN NAMED MWC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

San Diego State freshman running back Ronnie Hillman was named the Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in the team's victory at New Mexico State, the league office announced Monday. Hillman becomes the first Aztec running back to earn the honor since Larry Ned in 2001.

Hillman scored four, second-half touchdowns to lead the Aztecs to a 41-21 victory in Las Cruces, marking the first time since 1994 that SDSU has started a season with a 2-0 record. Hillman first reached the end zone on the team's opening drive of the second half, putting together a spectacular, career-long 44-yard run to move the Aztecs ahead by 13 points at 20-7. He later scored touchdowns on four-, two- and one-yard runs, finishing the night with 22 carries for 150 yards, including 120 yards in the second half, for his first career 100-yard rushing game.

Hillman's four rushing TDs set a MWC freshman single-game record and are the most by a San Diego State player since Ned's four-touchdown performance against Wyoming in 2001. His four scores tie for fifth in school single-game history and tie him for No. 2 in the nation in 2010 in total points in a game. Hillman's 150 yards rushing are the most by a player in the MWC so far this season and rank 24th nationally.

On the year, the 5-10 running back has carried 37 times for 215 yards (5.8 ypc.) and five touchdowns. He is currently 27th in the nation in rushing yards per game (107.5).

Hillman is the first Aztec freshman to be named a MWC player of the week since Ryan Lindley in 2008, while he is the first ever true SDSU freshman to garner the honor.

OFFENSE QUICK HITS

- ▶ San Diego State has scored 40 or more points in consecutive games for the first time since Oct. 11 and 19, 1996. It is the first time the Aztecs have scored 40-plus points in their first two games of the season since 1991.
- ▶ San Diego State has accumulated 500 or more yards of total offense in both games this season and 400 or more yards in three consecutive games dating back to last season. This is the first time the Aztecs have posted consecutive 500-yard efforts since 2005, and the first time SDSU has accumulated 400 or more yards in three straight contests since 2002
- ▶ The Aztecs have rushed for at least 200 yards in back-to-back games for the first time since 2005, when SDSU had 210 yards vs. San Jose State and 265 yards vs. BYU. San Diego State has rushed for at least 100 yards in three consecutive outings for the first time since the first three games of the 2007 season.
- ▶ SDSU did not have a turnover in the game at New Mexico State, marking the first time since last year's road victory at Colorado State. The Aztecs have committed just one turnover this season, which ranks seventh nationally.
- ▶ The Aztecs have yet to allow a sack this season. San Diego State is one of just nine schools nationally that has yet to allow a sack (Brigham Young, Indiana, Michigan, Middle Tennessee, Penn State, San Diego State, Texas and Utah). San Diego State now has one turnover or less in seven of its last 10 games.
- ▶ San Diego State has yet to throw an interception this season. The Aztecs are one of just 32 schools nationally not to throw a pick this season. Only four schools in the country have thrown for more yards than San Diego State and not thrown an interception (North Carolina, Hawai'i, Texas A&M and Texas Tech).
- ▶ Junior quarterback Ryan Lindley has three consecutive 300-yard passing efforts (dating back to last season) for the first time in his career. He has yet to throw an interception this season, a streak that is currently at 80 consecutive passes (final 12 attempts of 2009 and 68 attempts this season). Through two games this year, he has completed passes to 10 different receivers. Only four times in school history has a quarterback recorded four consecutive 300-yard passing games (Billy Blanton, twice in 1995-96 and later in 1996, Dan McGwire twice during in 1990 and
- ▶ Freshman Ronnie Hillman has 26 consecutive rushes in which he has not been tackled for a loss.
- ▶ San Diego State has run 134 consecutive plays without fumbling the football. Not only have the Aztecs not lost a ball during that stretch, but San Diego State has not put the ball on the ground during that period, which dates back to the first quarter of the season-opening game.

DEFENSE QUICK HITS

- ▶ San Diego State has allowed 21 points through the first two games of the season. That is the lowest point total allowed in consecutive games for the Aztecs since allowing 21 points in a two-game span late in the 2003 campaign (at UNLV W, 7-0 and at Colorado State L, 6-21).
- ▶ The Aztecs have allowed just 5-of-28 third-down conversions to date. At 17.86 percent, San Diego State is tied for fourth nationally in the category, behind Rutgers, Florida Atlantic and Florida International. Opponents have not converted a third down while rushing against San Diego State this season, going 0-for-8 attempts for 17 yards (2.1 ypr).
- ▶ Opponents haven't found it any easier on fourth down, going 0-for-2, failing on 4th and one and 4th and two.
- ▶ Last week 27 of New Mexico State 60 plays went for no gain or loss yardage. That means that through two weeks, San Diego State has held opponents to no or lost yardage on 62 of 123 offensive plays 50.4 percent).
- ▶ San Diego State ranks 10th nationally in tackles for loss per game at 9.00.
- ▶ The Aztec defense has allowed only two touchdowns and no field goals in five red zone opportunities to opponents this season. The 40.0 percent success rate is fifth nationally.
- ▶ San Diego State has had 32 players record a tackle this season and had 24 players see 13 or more defensive snaps last week in the victory at New Mexico State.

SPECIAL TEAM QUICK HITS

- ▶ Junior Abel Perez recorded six touchbacks in eight kickoffs last week at New Mexico State. He now has seven touchbacks on the season, which is five more than the Aztecs had in all of 2009.
- ▶ Senior Brian Stahovich has seen four of his five punts this season travel at least 54 yards. Against the Aggies, he punted four times, averaging 50.8 yards per boot and owned a net average of 48.0.
- ▶ Perez has kicked two field goals in each of his first two games, giving him four for the season. San Diego State had just 10 field goals during the entire 2009 season.
- ▶ The punt coverage team already has a turnover to its credit, with Nat Berhe recovering a fumble last week.

PLAYING WELL IN MIDDLE AMERICA

- The Aztecs have proven to be a handful during the past eight years for power teams from the Midwest. Saturday's game at Notre Dame marks SDSU's sixth contest against a BCS team from the Midwest in the past eight years.
- ▶ In 2003, San Diego State traveled to Ohio State as 32-point underdogs in a game televised on

ESPN+Plus. The Aztecs took the Buckeyes to the wire in front of 104,433 fans in Columbus, before eventually falling, 16-13. SDSU outgained No. 2 Ohio State, 216-196, and owned a 20-10 first down advantage. The Buckeyes would go on to finish the season 11-2 and defeated Kansas State, 35-28, in the Fiesta Bowl.

► The following year, the Aztecs traveled to the Big House for an ESPN televised game against No. 17 Michigan. SDSU put a scare into the Wolverines, taking a 21-17 lead at halftime before falling, 24-21, on a third quarter touchdown reception by Braylon Edwards. The Aztecs threw for 289 yards on Michigan, a team that would go on to finish 10-3 with a trip to the Rose Bowl.

► In 2005, San Diego State returned to Columbus and let the Buckeyes know it came to play by scoring on its first offensive play, an 80-yard pass from Kevin O'Connell to Brett Swain to give the team an early 6-0 lead. Ohio State, however, scored 27 unanswered and kept the Aztecs' offense in check the rest of the game in the 27-6 victory, which was broadcast on ABC. The Buckeyes went 10-2 on the season, culminating with a 34-20 win over Notre Dame in the Fiesta Bowl.

► In 2006, SDSU held Wisconsin scoreless through two quarters before eventually dropping a 14-0 decision to the host Badgers on ESPN+Plus. The Aztecs, playing without starting quarterback Kevin O'Connell, held Wisconsin to just 85 yards through the air in an admirable job by the defense. The Badgers had a terrific season, posting a 12-1 record, including a 24-10 victory over Auburn in the Capitol One Bowl at Citrus Bowl Stadium in January.

► Finally, in 2008, the Aztecs made their first appearance at Notre Dame Stadium. In front of national television audience, San Diego State took a 13-7 lead into the fourth quarter. The Aztecs had the ball first-and-goal on the Irish four-yard-line, and appeared to have scored a touchdown when the officials ruled a fumble just prior to reaching the end zone. Replay was inconclusive and Notre Dame was awarded a touchback. The Irish drove the length of the field and ended up claiming a 21-13 victory.

NOT MANY UNDEFEATED MATCHUPS SATURDAY

Through last Saturday, there are only 46 undefeated teams in the country and 43 teams that have won both of their games (the other three teams are 1-0). When San Diego State and Missouri meet Saturday, it will represent just one of 10 games this week between undefeated FBS teams and one of nine such games on Saturday.

THREE AZTECS ON WATCH LISTS

San Diego State placed three student-athletes on preseason national award watch lists in 2010. Senior wide receiver Vincent Brown, senior center Trask Iosefa and senior tight end Alston Umuolo are on the initial short list for their positions' top honor.

Vincent Brown (Rancho Cucamonga, Calif.) is one of 51 candidates for the 2010 Biletnikoff Award, which is given annually to the nation's most outstanding college football wide receiver. Brown was one of 10 semifinalists for the same honor a year ago and is the first Aztec to be nominated for the award twice in his career. The 6-0 wideout entered the upcoming season with 140 career catches for 1,758 yards and 13 touchdowns. In 2009, he had 45 receptions for 778 yards and six touchdowns before suffering a season-ending injury against Colorado State. Despite only playing seven outings, he was still tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Trask Iosefa (Ewa Beach, Hawaii) is one of just 37 players to be named to the 2010 Fall Watch List for the Rimington Trophy, awarded annually to the nation's best center. Iosefa entered the 2010 campaign having made 36 consecutive starts, the most on the team. The three-year starter has played in every game since the beginning of the 2008 season. He was also on the Rimington Trophy watch list in 2009.

Alston Umuolo (Phoenix, Ariz.) is one of 32 candidates on the 2010 John Mackey Award Watch List, presented annually to the nation's top tight end. Umuolo, who earned a position on the preseason all-Mountain West Conference team as selected by the media at media day, has established himself as one of the premier tight ends in the nation. Last season, he caught a career-high 22 passes for 243 yards and three touchdowns. In 33 career games, the senior has 42 receptions for 420 yards.

THREE AZTECS NAMED TO PRESEASON MWC TEAM

San Diego State football was tabbed for a sixth-place finish and senior wide receiver Vincent Brown, senior tight end Alston Umuolo and junior punter Brian Stahovich were all named to the preseason all-Mountain West Conference team, according to the annual preseason media survey conducted by the league office. The 26-member all-conference squad and predicted league finish were released July 27 at the MWC's annual media day in Las Vegas.

The sixth-place ranking in the preseason poll was the highest for an Aztec team since also being selected sixth prior to the 2006 campaign. San Diego State has finished at or higher than its projected preseason ranking in four of the last five seasons.

With three members on the all-conference team, San Diego State equaled its combined representation in the previous four seasons (2006-09) and placed multiple individuals on the squad for the first time since four Aztecs - Lynell Hamilton, Mike Kracalik, Matt McCoy and Kirk Morrison - earned spots on the 2004 squad.

Brown was one of the top receivers in the country last season before suffering a season-ending thumb injury. Nonetheless, he earned second-team all-conference honors and enters his final year with 140 receptions, 1,758 receiving yards and 13 touchdowns receiving. Brown is on the preseason all-conference list for the second consecutive season, the first SDSU player to do so since current New Orleans Saints running back Lynell Hamilton was tabbed in 2004 and 2005.

Despite playing his home games at sea level, Stahovich was one of the nation's top punters a year ago as a sophomore. In 2009, he averaged 43.8 yards per kick and had 13 of his boots downed inside the 20. He was 13th in the country a year ago in punting average.

With 33 career games played, Umuolo has established himself as one of the premier tight ends on the West coast. Last season, he caught a career-high 22 passes for 243 yards and three touchdowns.

Defending MWC champion TCU, which finished 2009 with an 8-0 conference record (12-1 overall) and a No. 6 national ranking, was picked to win the league and received all 31 first-place votes. The Horned Frogs were followed by Utah (242 points), BYU (207 points), Air Force (195 points) and Wyoming (147 points). Colorado State (7th - 96 pts.), UNLV (8th - 56 pts.) and New Mexico (9th - 45 pts.) rounded out the poll.

AZTECS NAME CAPTAINS

San Diego State head coach Brady Hoke announced that seniors Doug Deakin, Ernie Lawson and Andrew Preston have been named team captains for the upcoming 2010 season. The three were selected in a vote by their teammates in late August.

Deakin, a senior wide receiver from Oak Park, Calif., started his career at San Diego State as a volunteer for the football video staff in 2006. He earned a spot on the roster the following season on the defensive scout team. In 2008, he switched positions to wide receiver and last season saw action in 11 games, mostly on special teams. He earned the 2008 President's Award for Highest Standards of Academic and Athletic Excellence, has been recognized as a SDSU Scholar-Athlete and was a 2009 nominee for the College Football Rudy Awards, honoring the student-athletes who demonstrate excellent character, contribution and commitment as members of their collegiate football teams.

Lawson, a senior defensive end from Vallejo, Calif., has played in 30 career games and made 17 career starts in his three seasons as a member of the Aztecs. He set career highs last season, with 22 tackles, 6 ½ tackles for loss, two sacks and a fumble recovery. He has 49 career stops and has started 12 consecutive games for San Diego State. This summer, Lawson has moved from defensive tackle to defensive end, and earned preseason all-Mountain West Conference honors by Phil Steele Magazine. Lawson is also a San Diego State scholar-athlete.

Preston, a senior Aztec back from Centennial, Colo., has moved from an outside linebacker position last season to the feature spot in defensive coordinator Rocky Long's defense. Preston has played in 35 games in three seasons, including 29 consecutive contests. He has 200 career stops, the most of any active player. Five times in his career Preston has recorded double-figure tackle totals, including a career-best 18 stops against Air Force on Oct. 11, 2008. Despite the off-season position change, Preston still earned preseason all-conference accolades by Phil Steele Magazine.

FAULK HONORARY WARRIOR FOR OPENER

Marshall Faulk, a three-time All-American at San Diego State and NFL Most Valuable Player, was selected by the football team to be the Honorary Warrior at the Aztecs' season-opening game on Saturday against Nicholls State. A seven-time NFL Pro Bowl selection, Faulk planted the Aztec spear near the 50-yard line just prior to the team taking the field.

An Honorary Warrior will be named for every home game this season. The individual, who must be an alumnus of the University, will be handed the spear from the Aztec Warrior and will throw it into the ground before the 2010 team runs onto the field.

In addition, several other new pregame activities will start this season. Two hours prior to kickoff, the football team will be dropped off in the Qualcomm Stadium parking lot, and walk between the E and F parking lots en route to the stadium, providing fans with a chance to cheer on the Aztecs as they head to the locker room. The Warrior Walk will take place two hours prior to every home game this season and for this week's contest with Nicholls State, will commence at 3 p.m.

- Became San Diego State's 17th head football coach on Dec. 16, 2008.
- Of the 22 new head coaches in 2009, he was the only one to receive multiple votes for Associated Press coach of the year in 2008.
- He is one of 12 current head coaches who also serves as a position coach.
- One of three first-year coaches in 2009 who doubled his schools' win total from the previous season.

AT BALL STATE:

- Guided Ball State to a 12-1 record and an appearance in the GMAC Bowl in 2008. The Cardinals were
- One of 10 finalists for the 2008 Liberty Mutual National Coach of the Year award.
- Was named Mid-American Coach of the Year in 2008 and American Football Coaches Association Football Bowl Subdivision Region 3 Coach of the Year.
- Served as head coach at Ball State University in Muncie, Ind., for the last six seasons, leading the Cardinals to a pair of bowl game appearances.



vs. Nicholls

SAN DIEGO – The San Diego State football team put on a dominating performance on both sides of the ball, blanking first-time opponent Nicholls State, 47-0, for its first win in a season-opener in six years. The Aztecs outgained the Colonels, 531-171, posted their first shutout since 2003, and logged their largest margin of victory in 14 years in front of 25,290 fans at Qualcomm Stadium.

Despite the rout, SDSU took awhile to get started with both teams attempting to shake off the first-game jitters. The Aztecs' first two drives of the evening resulted in a missed 42-yard field goal and then a fumble on their own 19-yard line. Luckily, the visitors were unable to capitalize on that mistake, as the SDSU defense stepped up with consecutive sacks followed by another tackle for loss that made Nicholls attempt a 40-yard field goal, which it also missed.

The Aztecs used the run game to find the end zone for the first time in 2010, as the team utilized five consecutive draw plays, capped by a six-yard TD rush by senior Davon Brown, to get on the scoreboard for the first time, 7-0.

After Nicholls turned the ball over on downs at the SDSU 29-yard line, the home team wasted little time in doubling its lead as quarterback Ryan Lindley found DeMarco Sampson down the sideline for a quick 71-yard touchdown.

The Aztecs took advantage of good field position for its final tally of the first half, as Lindley completed passes of 14, 20 and finally 18 yards to Sampson for the 21-0 lead.

Little changed for either side coming out of the locker room. After its only punt of the game, San Diego State scored on each its final five possessions, posting a pair of field goals and three touchdowns by three different running backs to ring up 47 points, its highest offensive output since a 52-point outburst in 2007.

Nicholls had just one legitimate scoring chance in the second half, getting to first and goal from the Aztec five-yard line on its first drive of the third quarter. The SDSU defense, however, again turned the Colonels away, dropping them for a two-yard loss on first down, holding them to no gain on second down and forcing an incomplete pass on third down. The visitors attempted a short 24-yard field goal, but that too was turned back when Aztec linebacker Logan Ketchum blocked the kick.

Defensively, SDSU held an opponent to under 200 yards of total offense for first time since 2004, and to less than 100 yards in both categories for the first time since 1998. Overall, the defense had 12 tackles for loss, including three sacks, and did not let Nicholls past its own 43-yard line on its final five possessions of the game.

Offensively, the Aztecs sported a very balanced attack with 218 rushing yards and 313 passing yards. Lindley was 17-for-26 for 303 yards, no interceptions and the two touchdowns, which both went to Sampson, who had seven receptions for 179 yards. SDSU's Walter Kazee (74 yards), Ronnie Hillman (65 yards) and Davon Brown (65 yards) all rushed for over 65 yards apiece and all scored at least one TD.

GAME 2

Sept. 11 • Aggie Memorial Stadium (16,891)

at New Mexico State

LAS CRUCES – Behind freshman Ronnie Hillman's four, second-half touchdowns, the San Diego State football team started a season 2-0 for the first time in 16 years by defeating New Mexico State for the second consecutive campaign, 41-21, at Aggie Memorial Stadium.

The Aztecs once again used a balanced offensive attack, compiling 244 yards on the ground and 315 yards through the air to exceed the 500-yard mark in total offense in back-to-back outings for the first time since 2005. The SDSU defense, meanwhile, surrendered only 328 yards with 149 of those yards coming on five plays.

The Aggies, playing in their first contest of 2010, looked to gain momentum early, taking the opening kick off and putting together a 11-play, 61-yard drive, bolstered by a 27-yard reception and an Aztec pass interference penalty on third and 20. NMSU kicker Tyler Stampler, however, missed wide right on a 37-yard field-goal leaving the game still scoreless.

Taking over, San Diego State attempted five passes on its first six offensive plays, completing three of them to set up a 4th-and-1 at its own 40-yard line. The Aztecs gambled and went for it, but Davon Brown was stuffed at the line of scrimmage and NMSU took over on downs. Utilizing the short field, the Aggies scored just over two minutes later on an 18-yard rush by Kenny Turner to take a 7-0 lead.

After a three and out on its next drive, SDSU got on the board at the end of the first quarter, settling for a 25-yard Abel Perez field goal, despite having first and goal at the Aggie 10-yard line.

This proved to be a common theme for the Aztec offense in the second quarter, as it was unable to get into the end zone on each of its next two possessions, despite getting deep into NMSU territory. Place-kicker Perez made a 32-yard field goal, but missed on his next attempt from 37 yards out, meaning SDSU still trailed 7-6.

The Aztecs finally took the lead with 1:26 left until the half, as quarterback Ryan Lindley found Gavin Escobar for a 14-yard TD reception and the 13-7 advantage.

The second half turned into the Hillman show, as he started off the third quarter with a sensational 44-yard touchdown run and scored three more times, logging 15 carries for 120 yards in the final 30 minutes for the first 100-yard effort of his career.

NMSU, whose offense was limited to -3 yards in the second quarter, utilized quick strikes to keep the game close, scoring touchdowns on a one-play drive and later a three-play possession to only trail 27-21 with 11:45 left in the game.
