THE GAME - Sun Devil Football continues the 2017 season at home this week, taking on San Diego State State on Saturday, September 9 at Sun Devil Stadium in Tempe, Ariz. The game, scheduled for a 8 p.m. PT kickoff, will be broadcast live on the Pac-12 Networks with Roxy Bernstein, Anthony Herron and Lewis Johnson providing the talent.

THE AZTECS - ASU leads the all-time series against San Diego State, 10-0-1, as the two teams square off for the first time since a 34-14 Sun Devil victory in 2007. The Devils are 105-34-2 all-time against teams currently playing in the Mountain West Conference. SDSU is the only team that ASU has played at least 10 times in history that it hasn't lost a single game to.

SDSU is coming off a 38-17 season opening victory against UC Davis. SDSU won for the 22nd time over the last 25 games (22-3). The .880 win percentage over that time (since Oct. 3, 2015) trails only Alabama (25-1; .962 - entering tonight) and Clemson (26-2; .929) for the highest winning percentage in FBS play. San Diego State won its 33rd consecutive game when rushing for at least 200 yards and is 41-2 when doing so in the Rocky Long era (since 2011).

Rashaad Penny was named the MWC Offensive Player of the Week as he rushed a career-high 21 times for 197 yards (9.4 avg.) and two touchdowns. Christian Chapman was 16-for-21 for 220 yards and two touchdowns against one interception and improved to 14-3 as the starting quarterback over his career.

HONORING FRANK KUSH - In honor of Arizona State Hall of Fame coach Frank Kush, Sun Devil Athletics will dedicate the contest SDSU to the legendary coach. The Sun Devil marching band will honor Coach Kush during their halftime performance before the Kush family and former players are honored on the field. Other tributes are planned throughout the evening as well.

AN ASU VICTORY WOULD...

- » Improve ASU's all-time record against San Diego State to 11-0-1 - notable as SDSU is the only remaining team that ASU has faced in history at least 10 times that it has not lost to.
» Mark the fifth time in Todd Graham's six seasons at ASU that his team has started the year at 2-0.
» Move the Devils to 27-8 in games played at Sun Devil Stadium since Todd Graham took the reins in 2012.
» Improve ASU to 14-3 under Todd Graham in regular season non-conference games since 2012.
» Be the team's seventh straight regular season victory over a non-conference opponent.
» Mark the 90th career victory for head coach Todd Graham.

### General

The Sun Devil Athletics media relations staff understands the importance of assisting the media in providing coverage of the institution, its athletics programs, administrators, coaches and student-athletes. We pride ourselves in being able to disseminate information as widely, uniformly and fairly as possible using normally accepted media standards. To this end, the best attempt will be made to fill reasonable requests by recognized media outlets. Members of the media are encouraged to work with the Sun Devil Football media relations staff to assist in that endeavor. It is not permissible for media members to contact any athletics department administrator, associate, coach or student-athlete directly without working through the media relations department.

### Practice Policies

Due to the nature of Arizona State game dates this season, practices schedules each week will vary dependent upon that week's game. The ASU media relations office will provide a practice schedule prior to each game week for the media. Viewing periods will operate under the same procedures as in 2016 for practices that occur at ASU's indoor facility, The Dickey Dome. Only members of the media will be allowed to view the open portions of those practices in the facility. Members of the media will enter the facility once the team has completely entered.

For those wishing to shoot still photography or video tape practices, ASU will allow you to shoot approximately 30 minutes of each practice, unless the drill is team-related and as long as the footage does not include play signals. This is the same policy that used in Spring drills, 2017 and Fall practices, 2016. This period will begin at approximately 9:35 a.m. and end at approximately 10:05 a.m.

Viewing periods are always subject to the discretion of the Sun Devil Football coaching staff and may change suddenly. Following that open viewing period, the members of the media will be escorted out of the facility and reconvene near the end of the practice period at southeast entrance of Sun Devil Stadium for post-practice interviews. Under no circumstances will Periscope technology be permitted.

### Interview Policies

All interviews will be conducted post-practice at the new Student-Athlete Facility, located at the north end of Sun Devil Stadium. Additional information on this will come at a later date. Due to high demand, several players and members of the coaching staff might only be available on a limited basis each week. A full availability schedule will be provided to the media each week.

Special in-season interview policies for Head Coach Todd Graham, coordinators Billy Napier and Phil Bennett and selected players will follow at a later date.

All other interviews must be arranged through the Media Relations office. Under no circumstances are members of the media allowed to contact a student-athlete or member of the coaching staff without first contacting a member of the Media Relations staff. All coaches and student-athletes have been encouraged to check in with the Media Relations staff and not indulge any interview requests that have not been arranged through the

proper channels. Every possible attempt will be made to accommodate all media requests.

Following home contests, Arizona State will bring several student-athletes to the media room at the new Student-Athlete Facility in the North end zone for a post-game press conference. Head Coach Todd Graham will follow the student-athletes.

Please note that there is a new NCAA rule in effect for 2017-18 that states that every NCAA athletic team must take one day off per week from all team-related activities, including practice, weight training, conditioning, meetings, interviews, etc. This means that one day per week (Monday for Sun Devil football) we will not be allowed to conduct interviews as per NCAA rule. Since this is an NCAA rule and will be monitored by compliance personnel there can be no exceptions made.

### Weekly Press Conferences

Head coach Todd Graham will resume his weekly press conferences each Monday prior to game week. The press conference is tentatively scheduled for 12 p.m. (Noon) Arizona Time each week. When the team practices on Mondays, Coach Graham will not be available following practice.

### Photography/Videography

Media wishing to document practice via photograph or video will be able to do so during this time, so long as said documentation does not record play-calling signals. On-camera interviews will be conducted at the end of each practice.

For home games, a photographer work area has been established inside the Carson Student-Athlete Center (first floor). Internet access to transmit files is available in the photography workroom. Credentials must be worn in plain view throughout the game while on the field and all photographers must adhere to painted lines and instructions given by security personnel and/or Arizona State staff members at all times.

### Weekly Media Teleconference

The Pac-12 Football Coaches Weekly Media Teleconference Call will take place each Tuesday during the season. Coach Graham is scheduled to speak at 12:05 PT/1:05 MT each Tuesday. The teleconferences will be recorded and available at [Pac-12.com](http://Pac-12.com) that same afternoon of the call. Members of the media may reach out to the Pac-12 (925-932-4411) for the media-only phone number for the teleconference.

### Media Highlights Policy

Highlights include Pac-12 Networks/ESPN/FOX broadcasts and all home hosted non-televised competitions, including those that are live streamed.

### Live Broadcasts

It is not permissible for any non-rightsholder to broadcast over the air, stream over the internet (audio or video), or transmit in any other way, any live event without the consent of the Sun Devil Athletics Department. Live events include varsity contests, press conferences (including but not limited to weekly scheduled and postgame press conferences) and any other group media availability. Exceptions may be made for any major news-breaking event and will be communicated in the media advisory for the event.

### Third-Party Website Highlight Policy

No third party organization may post competition footage of any Pac-12 game or any non-conference home game on its website without a license to the content from the Pac-12 Networks or its licensing partner (XOS Digital), with the exception of news window privileges described below. Third parties are permitted to post video on their websites through the use of the Pac-12 Digital embeddable video player (embed code available at <http://video.pac-12.com>).

### News Outlet Highlight Policy

Certified news outlets may use a maximum of 3 minutes of Pac-12 event footage on their newscasts during the 48-hour news window following the conclusion of included events. If these highlights do not contain a Pac-12 mark, the news outlet must insert "Courtesy of the Pac-12 Conference" over the footage. Highlights may also be posted to certified news providers' websites, but must be removed 48 hours after the conclusion of any included event, unless a license for that footage is obtained from the Pac-12 Conference. Highlights may not be posted to YouTube, Facebook, or other social media properties. Beyond the 48 hour news window, certified news outlets are permitted to use a maximum of 1 minute of footage - on their television newscasts only - for 14 calendar days after the conclusion of the game in question. This policy pertains to the 2013-14 academic year only and is subject to change in subsequent years.

## LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION

The Sun Devils will look to improve upon their impressive 16-4 all-time record when playing a game broadcasted by the Pac-12 Networks. The contest will feature Roxy Bernstein on the call alongside analyst Anthony Herron while Lewis Johnson will provide insight from the sidelines.

The Pac-12 will again provide access to Armed Forces Network for carriage of Pac-12 football games in 2016 for the benefit of the men and women in the military.

## LAST TIME - SDSU - 2007

**TEMPE, Ariz. (AP)** -- Rudy Carpenter threw for 200 yards and two touchdowns and Keegan Herring filled in for leading rusher Ryan Torain with two scores as well in Arizona State's 34-13 win Saturday night over San Diego State.

Herring rushed for 161 yards on 19 carries in place of the injured Torain, who sat out to rest his sprained right ankle, after gaining 214 yards in the first two weeks of the season.

Arizona State (3-0) broke open the game with Carpenter's second TD pass, late in the first half, and Herring's third-quarter score that gave the Sun Devils a 31-10 lead.

San Diego State (0-2) moved the ball well, amassing 323 yards of offense, but only got into Sun Devil territory five times, settling for two long field goals and scoring on Kevin O'Connell's 3-yard dive into the end zone with 7:58 left in the second quarter that cut the lead to 14-10.

Carpenter was 15-of-21 with an interception for the Sun Devils, who have started the season 3-0 for the second straight year.

Arizona State is 10-0-1 against San Diego State. It was the second-best night of Herring's career. He carried for 197 yards in a 52-21 win over Northwestern in 2005.

Under Todd Graham, ASU has outscored opponents 550-287 in points off takeaways. Since 2012, The Sun Devils have scored **70.8 percent of the time following an opponent turnover since 2012 (92 of 130) w/ 71 TDs (54.6 percent)**. Conversely, opponents have scored just 51.1 percent of the time following an ASU turnover since 2012 (48 of 94) w/ 37 TDs (39.4 percent). The Sun Devils have forced 130 turnovers under Todd Graham, which is the 10th-highest total in the country in that span.

ASU has **15 interception returns for touchdowns under Todd Graham since 2012** after Kobe Williams picked one up in the season opener against NMSU. That total comes aft to posting just four total in the three previous seasons prior to 2012. The total is second in the FBS behind only Ohio State in that time (16). ASU has added four fumble returns as well for 19 defensive touchdowns since the 2012 season, tied for third in the country in that time span behind Ohio State (25) and Alabama (23).

The Sun Devils enter the season with **seven players in the program that have already earned their undergraduate degrees** and will be pursuing graduate programs this fall. 65 student-athletes earned Scholar Baller recognition for the 2016-17 academic year and 431 Football Scholar-Athletes have been named Scholar Ballers in eight semesters under Todd Graham. 33 members on the roster have a cumulative GPA over 3.00. Additionally, the team as a whole has posted over a 3.00 Team GPA for the first time in program history as of summer school classes coming into Fall 2017.

Manny Wilkins has found his stroke airing it out in the last four games dating back to last season, eclipsing 300 passing yards in three of those games and is averaging 308.5 yards of total offense in those four games. Wilkins had **two touchdown passes of 50 or more yards** against New Mexico State, notable as he had none in his career prior to that. The redshirt junior quarterback became the only Sun Devil quarterback in history to complete over 80 percent of his passes in a season opener (22-of-27) and one of just three ASU quarterbacks over the years to throw for 300 or more yards in the first game of a season.

**A LOOK BACK - NEW MEXICO STATE**

- » ASU improved to 76-27-2 on Opening Day in history and 58-15-1 on Opening Day at home.
- » The Sun Devils have now recorded sixteen consecutive Opening Day wins when the game is at Sun Devil Stadium.
- » It was the 19th straight victory in a home opener for the Sun Devils, dating back to 1999. ASU's current 19-game active home opening win streak is the fifth-longest in the country.
- » Manny Wilkins pieced together an impressive third quarter, that saw the Junior complete 10-of-10 passes for 139 yards, while connecting on a 60-yard touchdown pass to John Humphrey.
- » The 101 degrees at kickoff marked the eighth warmest kickoff temperature since the 2002 season.
- » Coach Graham moved to 6-0 in home openers and 5-1 in the first game of the season as head coach at ASU.
- » The victory marked the 40th victory for Todd Graham as head coach of the Devils.

- » Under Graham, ASU has forced 1,686 plays that have not resulted in positive yardage out of 4,732 (35.6 percent).

**SERIOUSLY, DON'T CROSS IT**

- » Entering the season, ASU was first in the Pac-12 and second in the nation (Clemson) with an average of 7.89 TFL per game under Graham and one of three teams in the nation with more than 500 total tackles for loss. They ranked third in that time with 3.13 sacks per game.
- » For the fifth consecutive season under Todd Graham, the Sun Devils had at least two players who reached double digits in tackles for loss (Koron Crump, JoJo Wicker and DJ Calhoun). ASU has had 17 such occurrences under Graham (2012-present) after having just 17 TOTAL players reach the mark in 10 previous seasons (2002-11) with at least two players reaching double digits in the category just six times in that span.

**LIGHT' EM UP**

- » ASU has scored 50 or more points 16 times since Todd Graham arrived in Tempe for the 2012 season.
- » To put that in perspective, ASU eclipsed 50 points 10 times total in the previous 10 years before the current coaching regime (2001-11).
- » Against Pac-12 opponents, the Sun Devils have scored 50 or more points 10 times under Coach Graham, after only tallying nine in the conference era prior (since 1978).
- » ASU went 86 games without scoring 60 from 2005-2011. Under Coach Graham it has scored 60 or more four times ('12-63 NAU, '12-62 Navy, '13-62 USC, '16-68 TTU).
- » The Sun Devils have dropped 50 on Arizona twice in the last three years after doing so just three times in 86 previous contests.

**GOLD RUSH**

- » The Sun Devils rushed for 27 touchdowns last season after having 19 in the entirety of 2015. The 26 touchdowns were good for 43rd among all FBS teams, despite not playing in a bowl game or a championship game.
- » The Sun Devils have reached 25 rushing touchdowns three times under Graham in five seasons. That total is notable as the Devils had just three previous seasons with at least 25 rushing touchdowns from 1980-2011 (1985, 1986 and 1996).



- » After having just two five-rushing touchdown games in nine previous seasons, the Sun Devils did it in back-to-back games to open the 2016 season, marking the fifth and sixth times in the Graham era that ASU had gone over five rushing touchdowns in a game. The Devils had three such games TOTAL from 1997-2011.
- » Yards after contact have been a been impressive in recent years with the likes of Demario Richard, Kalen Ballage and Nick Ralston. 48 of ASU's total 79 yards in the opener against NMSU came after first contact (60.8 percent).

#### **GOLD ZONE**

- » The Sun Devils scored on 43-of-47 trips to the red zone in 2016 (91.5 percent), a total that ranked 10th in the nation.
- » The Devils scored a touchdown on 33 of those trips (70.2 percent). That percentage was ranked 22nd nationally and notable as ASU found the end zone on just 51.5 percent of its red zone trips in 2015 - a total that ranked 108th in the country.
- » ASU opened things up on the same token in the opener, scoring two touchdowns on two trips to the red zone.

#### **SUPER DEMARIO**

- » Demario Richard is currently 15th in Sun Devil history with 2,144 career rushing yards and one of just 19 Devils to reach the 2,000-yard milestone.
- » Richard now has nine 100-yard rushing games in his career, three shy of cracking the ASU top-five in the category.
- » Of Richard's 1,697 rushing yards as a sophomore and junior, 780 came after first contact (46.0 percent/2.1 yards per touch).
- » In 2015, Richard became the fourth Sun Devil in history to have at least seven 100-yard rushing games in a single season, joining Freddy Williams and Art Malone (8) and Woody Green (7, 2 times).

#### **CAME IN LIKE A WRECKING BALLAGE**

- » Kalen Ballage had 14 rushing touchdowns last season, making him just the fourth Sun Devil since 2000 to reach double digits and moved him into a tie for the seventh most single season rushing touchdowns in ASU history. He finished 26th in the nation in rushing touchdowns (14) and 34th among all position players with 94 total points scored.
- » Ballage picked up where he left off, rushing for two touchdowns against NMSU and now has 23 in his career, creeping up on ASU's all-time Top-5 in the category (the threshold being 28 rushing TDs).
- » He averaged a touchdown once every 11.1 carries last season, a total that ranked fourth nationally.
- » Ballage returns with the highest receiving grade among all returning Power Five running backs in the country with 84.4 according to Pro Football Focus.

#### **NO RUSH**

- » The Sun Devils have held 23 opponents under 100 rushing yards in the Todd Graham era (66 games/34.8 percent), including four of 12 games last year.
- » Last year, ASU held three straight opponents under 100 rushing yards for the third time under Graham (2013, 2015, 2016). The Devils had limited opponents to under 100 rushing yards in three straight games in just five previous seasons dating back to 1986.

#### **TAKING OFFENSE**

- » Entering the season, ASU ranked second in the Pac-12 and 13th in the nation at 36.7 points per game in the Graham era.

#### **MAKE 'EM PAY**

- » Under Todd Graham, ASU has outscored opponents 550-287 in points off takeaways.
- » Since 2012, The Sun Devils have scored 70.8 percent of the time following an opponent turnover since 2012 (92 of 130) w/ 71 TDs (54.6 percent).
- » Conversely, opponents have scored just 51.1 percent of the time following an ASU turnover since 2012 (48 of 94) w/ 37 TDs (39.4 percent).

#### **A HAND IN THE COOKIE JAR**

- » The Sun Devils have forced 130 turnovers under Todd Graham, which is the 10th-highest total in the country in that span.
- » ASU has 15 interception returns for touchdowns under Graham, compared to posting just four total in the three previous seasons prior to 2012. The total is second in the FBS behind only Ohio State in that time (16). ASU has added four fumble returns as well for 19 defensive touchdowns since the 2012 season, tied for third in the country in that time span behind Ohio State (25) and Alabama (23).

#### **TURNOVER FACTORY**

- » Entering the year, ASU ranked sixth in the nation with a .51 average turnover margin per game since Graham took over the helm and is seventh in the nation with a plus-33 total turnover margin.
- » The Devils were first in the Pac-12 and tied for eight in the nation with 80 total interceptions in that span.

#### **WINNING THE BATTLE FOR FIELD POSITION**

- » Under Todd Graham, ASU has had an average starting yard line of its own 34.5 in 40 victories compared to a starting yard line of the 25.4 for their opponents in such contests.
- » Conversely, opponents have an average starting field position of their own 31.3 yard line compared to ASU starting at its own 28.6 in ASU's 26 losses under Graham.



**SEAL THE DEAL**

- » ASU has outscored other teams 691-547 in the fourth quarter and overtime under Todd Graham (10.5 points per fourth quarter and OT/+2.2 points per game) and averaged 12.8 points per fourth quarter last season (outscored opponents 155-125).
- » Excluding FCS NAU, the Sun Devils finished 2016 seventh nationally in averaging 19.6 points per second half against FBS opposition and second in the country with 11.9 points per fourth quarter against FBS teams.
- » The 19.6 second-half points per game were more than 13 teams were averaging PER GAME against FBS opposition last season.

**ROAD WARRIORS**

- » The Sun Devils are winners of nine of the last 19 true road contests. ASU has 13 wins in the past 28 road games, including 10 Pac-12 Conference road wins in the past 23.
- » Todd Graham has 10 Pac-12 road victories under his belt already, the second-most among all ASU coaches since 1980 behind only Bruce Snyder's 18 from 1992-2000. Graham is 10-12 in Pac-12 road games at ASU, notable as the Devils were 5-13 in four seasons prior.
- » The Sun Devils are 4-4 in Pac-12 games in the State of California since 2012 after going just 3-23 from 1998-2011.

**T.N.T, WE'RE DYNAMITE**

- » The Sun Devils have a classification of "explosive plays" that equal a run of 12 or more yards or a passing play of 16 or more yards. ASU had eight such plays against NMSU (11.4 percent)
- » ASU had two 50+ yard scoring passes in the opener, something it had not achieved since the Jael Mary game against USC in 2014. They were the first two 50+ yard scoring passes of Manny Wilkins' career.
- » ASU finished 30th nationally in plays over 10 yards in 2015 with 216 and 27th in 30+ yard plays at 35. ASU finished 24th nationally with 20 plays over 40 yards in 2014 after having just 16 total in 2013 and eight the year before. ASU was 26th nationally in plays of 20 or more yards with 71. The Sun Devils finished 2013 tied for seventh in the nation in plays longer than 20 yards with 86 after having 72 in 2012, which was good for 19th in the country in the category.

**KEEP IT CLEAN**

- » Entering the year, ASU averaged just 37.8 penalty yards per game, tied for fourth-best in the nation. While that is impressive, what raises the eyebrows is who are the top three: Navy (25.2), Army (36.2) and Air Force (37.7).
- » Since Todd Graham arrived at Arizona State, the Sun Devils have had just 296 penalties in 66 games (4.48 penalties per game).
- » ASU had just 1 penalty for 10 yards against NMSU

**PROTECT THIS HOUSE**

- » ASU is 26-8 at Sun Devil Stadium since Todd Graham took over in the 2012 season.
- » In 34 regular season home games under Todd Graham, the Sun Devils have averaged 41.5 points per game. Against non-conference Power Five teams, ASU is averaging 50.0 points per game at home under Graham.
- » The Sun Devils join Baylor and Oregon as the only schools in the country to be ranked in the Top-40 in home points per game in EACH of the previous five seasons.
- » ASU has posted under 20 points in a regular home game just twice in Todd Graham's tenure - a 19-16 overtime victory over Utah in 2014 and a 42-14 loss to #19 USC in 2015.
- » The Sun Devils are 283-103-3 (.734) all-time at Sun Devil Stadium since 1958, the 26th-highest active winning percentage in a stadium among all FBS schools.

**USE THEM WISELY**

- » Since the start of the 2012 season, ASU has used 68 timeouts on defense in third down situations, and have not allowed a first down on the ensuing play and/or forced a turnover on 48 of those occasions (70.6 percent).

**HOLD ON TO YOUR SEATS**

- » ASU has now gone 10-6 in games decided by a touchdown or less since the 2012 Arizona comeback in Tucson. ASU had gone 6-16 in such games since the 2007 season up until that moment. The Devils are 1-0 in games decided by a touchdown or less this season.
- » In 2016, ASU went 4-4 in games it had been tied or trailed in the second half after going 8-19 in four previous seasons.
- » ASU went 3-1 in 2013 in games decided by less than a touchdown, after going 4-13 in the previous four seasons in such games.. ASU was 3-1 in 2014 in games decided by less than a touchdown.



## HOLD ON TO THAT BALL, ALSO

- » ASU is now 13-3 under Todd Graham in games where it does not have a turnover after the NMSU victory this season.
- » In 2014, the Sun Devils had six games where they did not turn the ball over and went 6-0 in those contests. That number was notable because in the previous two seasons, ASU had just five combined games where it did not turn the ball over.
- » ASU earned its first victory in a game in turned the ball over three times against UTSA last year after going 0-6 in the Todd Graham era prior.

## TAKING DOWN THE TOP

- » The Sun Devils have gone 8-8 in the last 16 games against ranked teams.
- » In four seasons at the helm, Todd Graham is 8-11 against AP-ranked opponents and the team was 4-2 in such teams in 2014.
- » Graham has more than doubled the Top-25 win total of Dennis Erickson (3) and Dirk Koetter (2) during their tenures.
- » In the previous 14 seasons, ASU was 5-40 in games against teams ranked in the AP poll. Other notable victories include the come-from-behind victory over Arizona in 2012, winning a game in the Coliseum last season for the first time since 1999 and defeating USC in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-97. ASU also ended a four-game losing streak to Stanford.

## DIRTY HARRY

- » Possessing deceptive speed and elusiveness, N'Keal Harry had 27 yards out his 69 total come after the catch in the opener against NMSU.
- » N'Keal Harry became just the ninth true freshman in Arizona State history to start in a season opener last year. He was just the fourth Sun Devil ever to start on offense as a true frosh in the opener and he joined D.J. Foster as the only other Sun Devil in history to score in each of their first three games of the season as a true freshman.
- » Harry recorded 659 receiving yards last season – breaking Zach Miller’s 2004 school record for a freshman of 552. He had 58 catches on the year, also breaking Miller’s freshman record of 56. His five touchdown receptions

last season were second in Sun Devil history as far as freshmen go, trailing only Miller’s school record of six.

## THE FIRST OF MANNY

- » Manny Wilkins returned as the Pac-12 leader as far as the highest percentage of throws of 20+ yards this season with at least 50 deep passes at 19.9 percent., according to Pro Football Focus.
- » Wilkins had two touchdown passes over 50 yards against NMSU in the opener, becoming the first Sun Devil to do so since Mike Bercovici against USC in 2014. They were also the first two 50+ touchdown passes of Wilkins’ career.
- » He became the ONLY quarterback in ASU history to complete over 80 percent of his passes in an opener and one of just three to throw for 300+ yards in a season opener.
- » Dating back to last season, Wilkins has thrown for 300 or more yards in thee of his last four games.

## BRINGING THE WOOD

- » Koron Crump was second on the Sun Devils with 10.5 tackles for loss last season and 9.0 sacks. He averaged a tackle for loss just once every three times he made a tackle and a sack for every four tackles. He also had a team-leading three fumbles forced last season. Crump added two sacks in the opener against NMSU.
- » Tashon Smallwood logged a career best 4.0 tackles for loss with two sacks against NMSU, becoming the first Sun Devil to have 4.0+ tackles for loss since Antonio Longino against Arizona in 2015.
- » Four times in the Todd Graham era has a defensive player had at least 10 sacks in a season. ASU had just two players reach the milestone from 2003-2011.
- » For the fifth consecutive season under Todd Graham, the Sun Devils had at least two players that reached double digits in tackles for loss (Koron Crump, JoJo Wicker and DJ Calhoun). ASU has had 17 such occurrences under Graham (2012-present) after having just 17 TOTAL players reach the mark in 10 previous seasons (2002-11) with at least two players reaching double digits in the same season just six times in that span.
- » Crump leads all returning Pac-12 defensive players with 46 total QB pressures (sacks/hits/hurries) last season according to Pro Football Focus while JoJo Wicker is fifth among returning players with 36.

## IN THE RIGHT HANDS...OR FEET

- » The Sun Devils came into the season as one of just three teams in the country that started the year with no kickers OR punters with D-I experience on the roster, along with Virginia and UAB.
- » The team is replacing unanimous All-American and 2017 Lou Groza Award winner Zane Gonzalez at the placekicking position in addition to two-time



Ray Guy Award watchlist punter Matt Haack but first impressions of the newcomers were positive against New Mexico State.

- » Brandon Ruiz set an ASU record with his 52-yard field goal in the opener, his first career field goal to make him the first Sun Devil to have their first career field goal go for 50 or more yards.
- » Michael Sleep-Dalton won't blow anyone's mind with his yards per punt, but the redshirt sophomore downed four of his six punts inside the 20 in the contest while also adding a 51-yard punt to his tally.

### AIR IT OUT

- » With his two catches for 68 yards in the opener, Jalen Harvey continued a trend that he has maintained his whole career as the redshirt junior has a knack for the big plays.
- » 20 of his 27 career catches have gone for a first down while he has averaged 29.4 yards per catch average in caree and 47 yards per catch on two career touchdown receptions.
- » John Humphrey introduced himself to the Sun Devil nation in a big way in the opener, catching seven passes for 123 yards and a touchdown. The debut is the second best for a first collegiate game in Sun Devil history, trailing only Calvin Demery's 1969 school record of 201 yards in his first game.

### KOBE...BRYANT???

- » Junior college transfers Kobe Williams and Joey Bryant wasted no time leaving their mark on the Sun Devils, each picking up their first career starts AND interceptions in the season opener against NMSU - Williams' interception resulting in a pick-six.
- » The cornerback duo tallied four total pass defenses on the evening as well.

### SCHOLAR BALLERS

- » The Sun Devils entered the season with seven players in the program that have already earned their undergraduate degrees and will be pursuing

graduate programs this fall.

- » 65 student-athletes earned Scholar Baller recognition for the 2016-17 academic year and 431 Football Scholar-Athletes have been named Scholar Ballers in eight semesters under Todd Graham.
- » 33 members on the roster have a cumulative GPA over 3.00. Additionally, the team as a whole has posted over a 3.00 Team GPA for the first time in program history as of summer school classes coming into Fall 2017 classes.

# TODD GRAHAM

## HEAD COACH

**ASU: 40-26 (6TH SEASON) | CAREER: 89-55 (12TH SEASON)  
2013 PAC-12 COACH OF THE YEAR**

From the moment he was introduced as Arizona State University's head football coach on December 14, 2011, Todd Graham made it clear he was a visionary. A throwback. A teacher who truly believes in the virtues of hard work, dedication and giving back.

He had a plan to infuse the program with a culture that was about winning in all facets of a student-athlete's life. Graham referred to it simply as, 'The Sun Devil Way.'

Graham, the 2013 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, enters his sixth season at the helm of the Arizona State University football program. Under Graham's leadership, every phase of the Sun Devil football program has excelled.

On the field, Graham has led ASU to a Pac-12 South title, four bowl games and distinguished himself as one of three coaches in the history of the program (Frank Kush, Darryl Rogers) to have won 30 or more games (34) in his first four seasons. Individually, Sun Devil football players have accounted for 51 All-Pac-12 awards, numerous All-American awards – including a pair of consensus All-Americans in Will Sutton and 2016 Lou Groza Award winner Zane Gonzalez – and more than 30 student-athletes have either been selected in the annual NFL Draft or signed NFL free agent contracts.

In the classroom the Sun Devils have had an impressive 208 student-athletes receive academic honors, including 34 Pac-12 All-Academic citations under Graham. That total includes seven student-athletes who have garnered All-Pac-12 Academic First-Team honors. In 2015, ASU became the first school to have consecutive winners – quarterback Taylor Kelly in 2014 and quarterback Mike Bercovici in 2015 – of the Pac-12's Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year, awarded to senior student-athletes that are standouts both academically and in their sports discipline.

Graham's resolute commitment to help Sun Devil football be the best can also be seen in the recent reinvention of Sun Devil Stadium, a project which Graham has invested in both figuratively and literally. In September 2014, Graham and his wife Penni, and Vice President for University Athletics Ray Anderson and his wife Buffie, each gave \$500,000 in personal funds to the Sun Devil Athletics Momentum fundraising campaign.

The three phases of the \$256 million project is set to be finished in 2018. The most recent stage of the reinvention to be completed – what Graham calls a 'game-changer' for the program – is the 118,669-square-foot student-athlete facility that the Sun Devil football team moved into in July 2017. The new building,

which includes a 5,750-square-foot locker room, set a new standard for such facilities in excellence and innovation in fulfilling all the daily needs of student-athletes.

Throughout his time at ASU Graham has been steadfast when stating his ultimate goal: to bring championships to Tempe. During Graham's tenure in Tempe, the Sun Devils have been close to fulfilling that vision on multiple occasions.

In 2014, Graham's Sun Devil squad posted a 10-3 record, including a 6-3 mark in Pac-12 play, a second-place finish in the Pac-12 South Division and a 36-31 victory over Duke in the Sun Bowl. Tasked with replacing nine starters on defense, Graham led a unit that ranked near the top in the nation in sacks and tackles for loss, forced 27 turnovers and scored five touchdowns during the season.

On the other side of the ball, ASU finished the season ranked 16th in the nation in scoring offense and averaged more than 440 yards per game behind record-breaking quarterback and Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year Taylor Kelly, 1,000-yard rusher D.J. Foster and 1,000-yard receiver Jaelen Strong.

In 2013 Graham's Sun Devils brushed aside the prognostications from skeptics who felt that an early-season string of games against Wisconsin, Stanford, USC and Notre Dame would be a little bit too much to overcome en route to an appearance in the Pac-12 Championship Game.

ASU outscored its opponents 146-42 on points off turnovers while posting a +15 takeaway number in 2013. ASU put points on the board following 75.8 percent of opponent turnovers (25-of-33) compared to just the 33.3 (6-of-18) percent clip ASU opponents scored off of Sun Devil turnovers.

The duo of defensive tackle Will Sutton and linebacker Carl Bradford combined to give ASU the most dynamic defensive tandem in the country as the two combined for 24.5 sacks and 44.0 tackles for loss in 2012. Their collective average of 1.92 sacks per game was the highest in the country by two players on the same team since the 2006 season. Bradford racked up 40.5 tackles for loss in two years under Graham, tied for the fourth most by any player in the nation in that time.

Sutton became ASU's sixth winner of the Morris Trophy and the 18th consensus All-American and first since 2007. Sutton also became the fifth ASU player to win the Pac-10/12 conference Defensive Player of the Year award. After accomplishing all of that as a junior, Sutton returned for his senior season and repeated as the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year and Morris Trophy Winner while adding numerous All-American accolades.

Although the 2013 Sun Devils would come up short of their ultimate goal of getting to and winning the annual Rose Bowl Game, they proved they had the right people



on board. And leading that ship a captain in Graham, who was named the 2013 Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

In his first season at Arizona State, Graham guided the team to an 8-5 record as the program recorded its first winning regular season since going 10-2 in 2007. ASU ended the season with three straight wins for the first time since 1978 and just the 14th time in school history.

While known for leading programs that have annually been among the nation's leaders in offensive production, Graham gained national acclaim for his coaching prowess on the other side of the ball after leading defenses that helped West Virginia (2002) and Tulsa (2003) engineer two of the top single-season turnarounds in recent memory. With head-turning accomplishments like those it is easy to see why Graham believes that defense wins championships.

Employing an approach that emphasizes excellent fundamentals and hard and disciplined play, the Sun Devils' extraordinary improvement on defense played a paramount role in the team's rise improvement in 2012. After finishing at or near the bottom of the Pac-12 in several defensive categories in 2011, the Sun Devils experienced an amazing reversal in 2012 as they led the conference in tackles for loss (No. 1 in the nation), pass defense (No. 3 in the nation), and pass efficiency defense (No. 10 in the nation) and finished second in the league in sacks (No. 2 in the nation), interceptions (No. 4 in the nation) and total defense.

Graham was named the 23rd head football coach in program history on December 14, 2011, arriving in Tempe from the University of Pittsburgh.

Graham became well-known on the national scene following a four-year stint at Tulsa (2007-2010) where he led the Golden Hurricane to a 36-17 mark, which included three bowl wins and three seasons of 10-plus wins. Tulsa was one of just 11 schools to post back-to-back 10-win seasons in 2007 and 2008.

The native of Mesquite, Texas, had seasons at Tulsa which included records of 10-4 (2007), 11-3 (2008) and 10-3 (2010) and in his final season the Golden Hurricane won games at Notre Dame and then topped No. 24 Hawaii 62-35 in its own bowl game. The Notre Dame win was dubbed the biggest upset of the 2010 college football season by ESPN's Kirk Herbstreit.

One distinguishing characteristic of Graham-coached teams has been their propensity for lighting up the scoreboard. On two occasions Tulsa led the nation in total offense (2007 at 543.9 yards per game and 2008 at 569.9 yards per game) and ranked fifth in 2010. His 2010 Tulsa team also led the nation in interceptions (24) and was third in turnovers gained (36). His 2007 squad not only led the nation in total offense at 543.9 yards per game, it set 29 school records, 15 conference marks and four NCAA records. Tulsa routed Bowling Green 63-7 in the GMAC Bowl, the largest bowl margin of victory in NCAA history.

Graham's 2008 team again led the nation in total offense (569.9 yards per game) while ranking second in scoring (47.2 points per game), fifth in rushing (268 ypg) and ninth in passing (301.9 ypg). His team finished 11-3, capped by another large bowl win, a 45-13 victory over No. 22 Ball State in the GMAC Bowl.

Including ASU's 62-28 win over Navy in the 2012 Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, Graham's offense has enabled three different teams (two at Tulsa) to score 60-plus points in a bowl game, making him the only coach to accomplish the feat multiple times.

Prior to taking the head job at Tulsa, Graham led Rice to its first bowl game in 45 seasons in 2006 and earned Conference USA Coach of the Year honors that same season.

Graham began his coaching career in 1988 as an assistant at Poteet High School/Middle School in Mesquite (1988-90) and then helped lead East Central University from a .500 program to NAIA national champions in his third year as he served as defensive coordinator from 1991-93. One year later he was at Carl Albert High School in Midwest City, Okla., and then spent time from 1995-2000 at Allen High School in Allen, Texas. While at Allen, north of Dallas, he also served as athletic director and led a program that had no district wins in the year prior to his arrival to five playoff berths in six seasons (1995-2000).

Graham was hired as the linebackers coach at West Virginia in 2001 and one year later he was promoted to defensive co-coordinator as the Mountaineers went from 3-8 to 9-4, the top turnaround in the country in 2002.

Graham was an all-state defensive back at North Mesquite High School and, after graduating in 1983, he played for East Central University in Ada, Okla., where he was a two-time NAIA All-American defensive back.

Born Dec. 5 1964, Graham earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in education from East Central University. He and his wife, Penni, have six children: Bo, Natalie, Hank, Haylee, Dakota and Michael Todd Jr.

**TODD-BITS OF INFO**

- » Graham's team's throughout his head coaching career have averaged 35.95 points per game (5,141 in 143 games), the 10th-highest average among all active coaches with at least two full FBS seasons under their belt and the fourth-highest average among all active coaches with over 100 games coached.
- » Over the past 11 seasons at Pitt, Tulsa, Rice and now ASU, only one Graham-coached team has ranked outside the top 50 nationally in sacks. The Sun Devils averaged 4.0 sacks per game in 2012, the second-best mark in the nation, and then finished with 2.9 per game in 2013 and 3.0 per game in 2014 to finish 17th and 13th, respectively, in the country. ASU would earn the NCAA statistical trophy in the category in 2015, leading the nation with 3.54 sacks per game before against finishing in the top 50 nationally in 2016 with 2.53 per game.
- » In 11 seasons, Graham is 30-29 in true road games. ASU was 3-3 in such games in 2012, 3-2 in 2013 and 4-2 in 2014. In the previous four seasons prior to Graham's arrival, ASU was 5-16 in true road contests.
- » In nine of the last 11 years, Graham's teams have ranked 39th or better nationally in fewest penalty yards per game. The Sun Devils averaged 34.92 penalty yards per game in 2012 (eighth nationally), 31.36 per game in 2013 (seventh nationally) and 32.38 per game in 2014 (fourth nationally) and 39.85 per game in 2015. (15th nationally).

**NOT WASTING TIME**

- » In his first four seasons, Todd Graham had an average of 8.5 wins per year at ASU, which ranked him number one all-time in Sun Devil lore.
- » ASU's 31 regular-season wins under Coach Graham (2012-15) were the most regular-season wins in a four-year span since 1980-83, and the team's 34 total wins were the most since 1975-78.
- » Graham became the third-quickest coach to reach 30 wins, doing so in 43 games (Frank Kusk and Darryl Rogers each did so in 40).
- » As far as Bowl Games go, Graham has wasted no time establishing himself in the record books as his four appearances with the Sun Devils are already tied for second among all ASU coaches and his two wins are tied for second.

- » Head Coach Todd Graham had a school-record 28 wins in his first three seasons as head coach at ASU, one more than College Football Hall of Fame Coach Dan Devine (1955-57).
