THIS WEEKEND

Due to the wildfires throughout San Diego County, the Aztec women's soccer team will hit the road for both of its matches this weekend. On Thursday, SDSU will face New Mexico in Provo, Utah, at 5 p.m. PT. The game was originally scheduled to be played at the SDSU Sports Deck. The Aztecs then travel to Salt Lake City, Utah, to wrap up the road portion of its schedule against Utah. The game will be televised live on The Mtn.-The Mountain West Sports Network beginning at noon PT.

SDSU is looking to continue its stellar play against conference foes. Last week's wins over BYU and Wyoming moved the Aztecs into second place in the conference standings with a 3-1-0 MWC record and gave SDSU its most wins to start league play since 2002.

SCOUTING THE LOBOS

The Lobos enter the game with a 7-4-3 overall record but have gotten off to a rough start in conference action with a 1-2-1 mark.

The tie came in the team's last contest when the Lobos played No. 27 Utah to a scoreless draw. New Mexico's lone MWC win came against Wyoming in its conference opener.

New Mexico is led on offense by freshman Alexis Ball and junior Hannah Hand. Ball leads the Lobos with six goals, four-game winning tallies, and Hand is tops on the team with seven assists.

In the nets, the Lobos are led by junior Shannon Adragna who has recorded four of the team's seven victories. Adragna has made 40 saves and recorded five shutouts.

SCOUTING THE UTES

Utah enters the weekend once again near the top of the conference standings with a 2-0-2 record, 10-2-4 overall. The Utes are unbeaten in their last 13 contests and haven't lost since their third game of the season at Colorado (4-2).

The Utes enter the weekend as the highest scoring team in the Mountain West Conference. Utah is tops in the league in points (105), goals (35) and assists (35).

On offense, Utah is led by the reigning MWC Offensive Player of the Year junior Adele Letro. The Utes' first-ever All-American leads the conference with 16 goals scored, while also chipping in a pair of assists.

Utah also has the league's top playmaker in sophomore Kelly Isleib. Isleib has set her teammates up 11 times, almost tripling the number of assists she had a year ago.

The other offensive threat SDSU will have to contain is junior Katy Reineke who has nine goals and five assists.

The net is guarded by sophomore Lynzee Lee who has registered 10 wins and has made 58 stops.

Mike Friesen



Head Coach
First Season/Fourth
Overall at SDSU
Sonoma State, 1996

After spending the last three years as an assistant on the San Diego State coaching staff, including the last two as associate head coach, Mike Friesen begins his first season as the Aztecs' head coach.

Friesen, the fourth head coach in Aztec history, has played a significant role in bringing excitement back to San Diego State soccer. An offensive standout in his playing days at Point Loma Nazarene (1988-89) and Sonoma State (1993-94), Friesen has helped the Aztecs become one of the most potent offenses in the West Coast.

In 2004, SDSU reached the Mountain West Conference championship game for the first time since 1999. The team's 3-1-2 conference record was also its best since that same 1999 season.

Friesen teamed with former Aztec head coach Dr. Mike Giuliano to bring an up-tempo-in-your-face style of defense, which was successful, as evident by the team's nine shutouts in 2004, second most in school history. The Aztecs allowed just 18 goals in 21 games that season, the program's fewest since the 1990 squad gave up 12 goals in 13 games.

Prior to coming to San Diego State, Friesen spent five years working with the UC Santa Barbara women's program.

Upon arriving in Santa Barbara, Friesen helped turn the Gaucho program around, going from a 7-29-2 mark and scoring just 27 goals the two seasons prior to his arrival, to a 24-11-6 mark in 2002-03, tallying 105 scores.

Friesen has a great deal of experience coaching at a variety of levels. Before his time at UCSB, he guided the under-19 Santa Rosa United Aftershocks to the 1999 girls' California State Cup championship. In 1997, he directed Ursuline High School in Santa Rosa, Calif., to the CIF North Coast Section championship game.

LAST TIME WE MET

Last season, SDSU faced New Mexico twice and were unable to walk away with a win both times. During the regular season, the Lobos blanked SDSU, 2-0, and in the first round of the conference tournament the two teams played to a 1-1 tie before New Mexico advanced in the shootout.

Against the No. 15 Utes, SDSU lost, 2-0, at the SDSU Sports Deck. The loss pushed the Aztecs winless streak against Utah to seven games.

LAST TIME OUT

The San Diego State women's soccer team is coming off its most successful week of the season where it swept No. 19 BYU and Wyoming at the SDSU Sports Deck. The win over BYU was the Aztecs first over a ranked opponent in seven tries. In the first televised event at the Sports Deck, seniors Jessica Girdner and Jackie Ragudos handled the scoring duties and freshman goalkeeper Aubree Southwick made five saves for her seventh shutout of the season.

Against Wyoming, SDSU struggled in the first half, but Ragudos was able to net her fourth-game winning goal of the year in the 72nd minute. Southwick continued her stellar play by saving three shots and recording her eighth shutout.

FROSH SENSATION

Breaking in a new goalkeeper might worry some coaches, but the SDSU coaching staff has had little to fret about as freshman Aubree Southwick has shined,

showing why she was one of the top goalkeeper recruits in the country.

Southwick has been a mainstay in the net, starting all 16 of the Aztecs' games in 2007. She has played in over 1,416 minutes of action and leads the Mountain West Conference with 83 saves. She owns a 0.89 goals against average and stopped .856 percent of the opposition's shots on goal, which places third in both categories in the MWC, respectively.

The Danville, Calif., native became the first Aztec goalie since Sophia Perez in 2004 to post three consecutive shutouts and ran her personal scoreless streak to 429 minutes. Southwick currently has eight shutouts, the third highest total in SDSU single season history.

Southwick was the 2006 NSCAA California high school state player of the year and an NSCAA All-American. The 2004 U.S. Soccer Golden Glove Award recipient earned recognition on *Soccerbuzz.com* top-50 recruits list last season.

EIGHT AND COUNTING

With the wins over BYU and Wyoming, the Aztecs improved to 8-6-2 overall and in the process surpass last season's win total (6) with three regular-season contests remaining.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Aztecs spent the majority of their first half of the season, six games, on the road.

Last year, the Aztecs struggled on the road winning only three of 11 games. With the victory at Air Force, SDSU surpassed that number with two away from Montezuma Mesa. If the Aztec can beat either New Mexico or Utah it would give them their second winning record on the road in the last eight campaigns.

A GREAT NIGHT FOR TV

Not only did SDSU claim a victory against No. 19 BYU in the first televised event at the SDSU Sports Deck, the Aztecs also snapped their seven game winless streak (0-6-1) against ranked opponents.

The last time SDSU beat a ranked team was on August 27, 2006, at No. 21 Purdue. The Aztecs beat the nationally ranked Boilermakers, 4-0, to claim the Boilermaker Challenge Cup.

RAGUDOS RECEIVES HONORS

This season, the Aztec soccer team has always been able to count on senior forward Jackie Ragudos to shoulder the offensive load.

Last week was no exception as the San Diego, native's two goals help spark the team to victories over No. 19 BYU and Wyoming. For her efforts, Ragudos earned both the Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Week Honors and was also named to the *Soccer Buzz* Elite Team this week.

Ragudos recorded her team-leading sixth and seventh goals, including her fourth game-winner, in the two-game span. Ragudos scored the second goal in a 2-0 win over the Cougars in a nationally televised game and added the lone tally in San Diego State's 1-0 triumph over the Cowgirls.

After not recording a point last season, Ragudos leads the 2007 Aztecs in points (17), goals (seven), assists (three), shots (23), shots on goal (14) and game-winning goals (four).

TRIBBEY MAKES HISTORY

When freshman forward Katie Tribbey scored her first collegiate goal in the season opener versus Toledo, she made SDSU history. Tribbey scored 24 seconds into the contest and became the fastest player to score the Aztecs' first goal of a new campaign.

The previous record was held by Shawn Vioria who scored at the 5:40 mark in SDSU's 1993 season-opening victory over CS Fullerton.

SOUTHWICK CLAIMS MWC HONORS

Following a weekend where she recorded consecutive shutouts on the road versus Creighton and Nebraska, San Diego State freshman goalkeeper Aubree Southwick (Danville, Calif./San Ramon Valley High) was named Mountain West Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 10.

Southwick led the Aztecs to their first win of the season, 2-0, by blanking the Bluejays in Omaha, Neb., and followed that up with a 10-stop performance in a double overtime tie, 0-0, against the Cornhuskers in Lincoln.

The Danville, Calif., native hadn't given up a goal in her last 286 minutes of action, spanning three games, and had made 19 saves while registering a 0.45 goals against average on the season.

Southwick shared the honors with BYU senior goalkeeper Erika Woodbury who also posted a pair of shutouts this weekend.

On Monday, Oct. 22, Southwick claimed her second Defensive Player of the Week honor and first outright recognition.

Southwick continued her solid play, making eight saves en route to picking up her seventh and eighth shutouts of the season over the weekend. Southwick recorded five stops against Brigham Young and added three saves in the Wyoming match. Against the Cowgirls, she added her first career assist on a free kick that landed deep in Wyoming territory.

On the season, Southwick is 8-6-2 with a 0.89 goals against average in 1,416-plus minutes. She has 83 saves and an 85.6 save percentage. Among the Aztec single-season leaders, Southwick is currently second in goals against average, third in shutouts and fifth in saves.

AZTECS ON NATIONAL TELEVISION

The San Diego State women's soccer team's match versus Utah on Sunday will be the second contest of the season broadcasted on The Mtn.-The Mountain West Sports Network.

The first was last Thursday's 2-0 win over No. 19 BYU at the SDSU Sports Deck.

Sunday's game will have Bill Riley of Sports Radio 700 The Zone in Salt Lake City, Utah, and SDSU Sports Network analyst Tammy Blackburn on the call. Kick-off is slated for noon PT with the replay to be shown

SDSU PICKED FOURTH IN MWC

The Mountain West Conference preseason coaches poll picked SDSU to finish fourth. BYU and Utah were tabbed co-favorites as each received 46 points and four first place votes.

Last season, Utah had a perfect 7-0-0 record and captured the regular-season crown but fell in the championship game of the MWC tournament to UNLV.

WALKER OUT FOR SEASON

San Diego State sophomore midfielder Cat Walker will miss the 2007 women's soccer season after injuring her left knee.

Walker, who tied for second on the team with three goals scored in her initial campaign on The Mesa, suffered damage to her anterior cruciate ligament during the team's exhibition game versus Cal State Northridge. The Folsom, Calif., native was expected to be one of the team's top play makers after starting 17 of 19 contests as a freshman.

Walker will apply for a medical redshirt which will leave her with three years of eligibility remaining in her Aztec career.

CSUN DEFEATS SDSU IN EXHIBITION

Senior Jessica Girdner scored the Aztecs' lone goal of the afternoon, but it wasn't enough as the San Diego State women's soccer team fell, 2-1, against Cal State Northridge in exhibition play Aug. 24, at the SDSU Sports Deck.

The Aztecs finished with the 1-0 lead after 80 minutes, but the Matadors rallied in the extra 35-minute third period behind two goals from sophomore Adriene Dickerson.

In the nets, SDSU used three goalkeepers starting with freshman Aubree Southwick, followed by junior Christi Yount and senior Melissa Deckers. Southwick, the Danville, Calif., native played the first 55 minutes and turned away five shots.

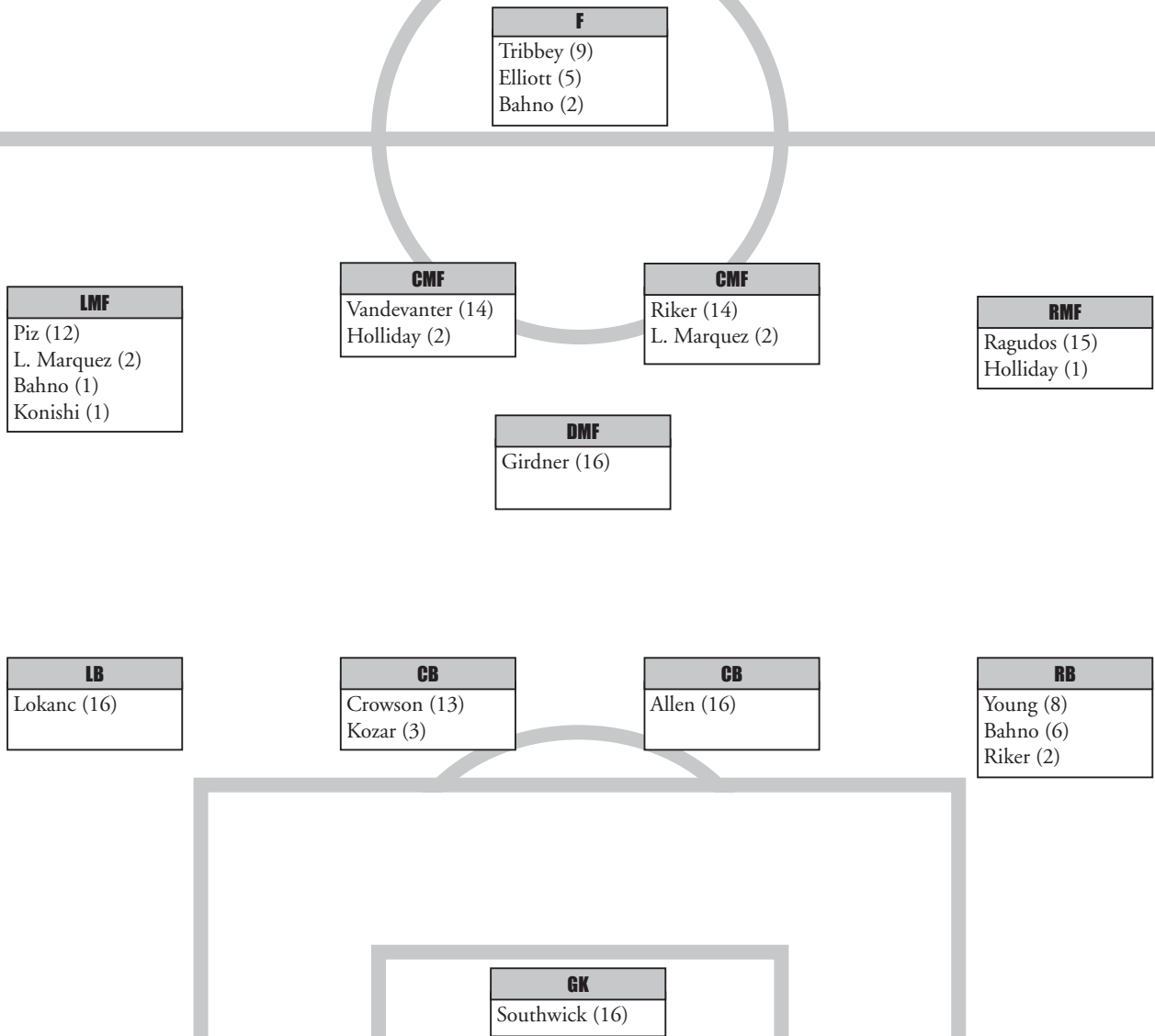
