San Diego State Closes Out 2008 at Home Against Arkansas-Pine Bluff in Final Pre-Conference Tune-Up

San Diego State (9-3) closes out the year 2008 with the final contest of a three-game homestand on Monday against first-time opponent Arkansas-Pine Bluff (1-9). The Aztecs, who will begin their 10th season of Mountain West Conference play on Jan. 3 at Air Force, will take on the Golden Lions inside Cox Arena at 7:00 p.m. PT. There is no television coverage for the event, but the game can be heard on AM 600 KOGO with Ted Leitner calling the action.

SDSU will be looking to extend its winning streak to three games after defeating its second straight Big West Conference opponent in Cal State Northridge, 72-56, back on Dec. 22 before the holiday break. Arkansas-Pine Bluff, meanwhile, will look to stop a two-game losing skid in what will be its final game of a season-opening 11-game road trip.

Game Tidbits:

► San Diego State is looking to match its best record after 13 games in the last 24 seasons. A 10-3 record would equal the Aztecs best record at this point in the season since the 1984-85 squad opened 11-2.

► San Diego State has won 13 home games played during the month of December. The last time the Aztecs dropped a December home game was against Washington State, 60-49, on Dec. 10, 2005, in the San Diego SLAM.

► A pair of San Diego State seniors are closing in on 1,000 points in their SDSU career. Kyle Spain enters Monday's game with 921 points, while Lorenzo Wade has 871 points in his SDSU career (1,009 in his college career).





First Wade, Next Up Spain and Then Wade Again

With his baseline slam dunk in the opening minutes of the second half against UC Santa Barbara, Lorenzo Wade surpassed the 1,000-career point mark. The transfer from Louisville currently has 1,009 points.

Kyle Spain is the next Aztec in line to reach 1,000 points for his career. The senior enters the game with Arkansas-Pine Bluff with 921 points.

As an Aztec, Wade is just behind Spain with 871 points. He is only 129 points away from becoming the 23rd player to score 1,000 points in an SDSU uniform.

20/20 Vision

In San Diego State's last outing vs. CS Northridge, Kyle Spain and D.J. Gay poured in 22 and 20 points, respectively. The duo's effort was the first time two Aztecs scored at least 20 points in a game since Feb. 22, 2007, vs. No. 21/22 Brigham Young inside Cox Arena. That night, Brandon Heath scored 30 points and a Mohamed Abukar checked in with 27.

Second-Best Division I School Record Within Reach

With Monday's victory over CS Northridge, the Aztecs matched the school's second-best record to start a season, something six other squads have done since the school earned Division I status (since 1970-71). Only two previous times (2006-07,

1984-85) has SDSU had a record better than 9-3 after 12 games and those groups boasted a 10-2 mark.

A victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff would again match the second-best record to start a season. Only the 1984-85 squad opened with a better record, 11-2, after 13 games.

Free Throws the Difference Between Winning and Losing

San Diego State went 13-for-16 from the free-throw line vs. CS Northridge in its last outing to finish the game at 81.3 percent. The charity stripe has been the difference in wins, but particularly in losses this season for the Aztecs. Collectively, SDSU has shot 71.3 percent (124-174) from the line in victories and just 53.8 percent (21-39) in defeats.

In the loss against Saint Mary's, the Aztecs were 4-for-12 from the free-throw line and eventually lost by three. And in the Arizona game, SDSU missed seven and lost by 13.

Beast Mode

Freshman Tim Shelton has been a solid force in the last six games. The Fresno, Calif., native is 30 for his last 48 (.625) and has turned in scoring performances of 17 at Northern Colorado, 12 vs. San Diego, 13 at Arizona and 17 vs. Saint Mary's. The 17 points vs. the Gaels was the front half of his first career double-double as he also grabbed a career-best 10 rebounds at the Wooden Classic.

In the six games, Shelton has also collected 40 re-

bounds (6.7 rpg) and has led the team in the category in five straight games. In those five games, Shelton has averaged 7.6 boards (38 total).

His numbers from the last six games are astonishing compared to his cumulative numbers from his first six of 2008-09. Below is a comparison.

First 6: 35 points, 30 rebounds, 12-32 FG, 0-3 3FG

Last 6: 70 points, 40 rebounds, 30-48 FG, 4-6 3FG

For the season, Shelton is averaging 8.8 points on a 52.5 percent shooting, which both rank second on the team, and 5.8 rebounds (1st on team) in just 23.3 minutes.

Among the National Leaders

In the most recent NCAA statistical report for games through Dec. 21, San Diego State found itself in eighth place in scoring defense, allowing just 55.5 points through. National leader Washington State allows 48.0 points. Among teams who have played at least 11 games, SDSU ranked second nationally. San Diego State is now allowing 55.6 points a game.

The Aztecs also ranked 29th in turnover margin at +4.3, 54th in steals per game at 8.5 and 68th in scoring margin (9.8). The Scarlet and Black are now at +4.5, 8.6 and 10.3, respectively.

Individually, Kyle Spain was in 16th place in free-throw percentage at 89.8 percent (minimum 2.5 free throws made per game). Spain is now shooting 90.3 percent from the stripe.

Richie Williams is also among the nation's leaders in steals per game, checking in at 72nd place after averaging 2.1. The senior now averages 3.5 thefts per contest after collecting nine in his last two games.

A Look at the Golden Lions

▶ Arkansas-Pine Bluff is concluding a season-opening stretch of 11 consecutive road games on Monday night in San Diego. The Golden Lions schedule to date has been rated as the third most difficult according to the Jeff Sagarin ratings and the seventh most difficult according to the RPI. The RPI rating of the schedule strength is particularly impressive because it does not take in to account the location of the games.

▶ This is the final non-conference game for Arkansas-Pine Bluff. Following the game against the Aztecs, the Golden Lions will play three straight games at home and five of the next seven games in Pine Bluff.

▶ With the challenging schedule, first-year head coach George Ivory has the Golden Lions off to a 1-9 start.

▶ To date, Arkansas-Pine Bluff is shooting 34.1 percent from the field, including 26.7 percent from three-point range. The Golden Flashes average a 9.6 turnover margin.

▶ As of Dec. 21, the Golden Lions rank last out of 330 schools in offensive scoring (current average is 50.7 points) and turnovers per game (current average is 23.8).

Notes from the CS Northridge Game

▶ The game marked the seventh time this season the Aztecs have won a game in which it did not trail in the second half.

▶ San Diego State won its 13 consecutive December home game (last December home loss, Dec. 10,

2005).

▶ The Aztecs won their 16th straight home game against teams from the state of California (last loss: Dec. 14, 2004).

▶ San Diego State snapped a two-game losing streak in the last game prior to Christmas (in 2006 SDSU lost at Washington State and in 2007 the Aztecs fell at 19th-ranked Arizona).

▶ In winning nine of its first 12 games, San Diego State matched the third-best start in 39 seasons at the Division I level (only better starts: 10-2 in 2006-07 and 1984-85).

▶ San Diego State won its 20th straight game when scoring 70 or more points. The streak dates back to the 2006-07 campaign.

▶ SDSU held its ninth opponent of the season to 59 points or below. The Aztecs improved to 8-1 when doing so.

▶ The Aztecs continued their success against schools from California... SDSU improved to 19-3 over its last 22 games versus California schools.

▶ The game marked the fourth time this season the Aztecs enjoyed at least a 10-point advantage at halftime... The 12-point lead at intermission, was the fourth-largest lead after 20 minutes of play for the Aztecs this season... SDSU's largest lead at the midway point of a game this season was a 21-point lead over Hampton (37-16) on Nov. 29.

▶ Kyle Spain reached the 20-point plateau for the third time this season and the sixth time in his career... The senior reached double figures for the 11th time in 12 games this season and the 45th time in his career... He has scored 10 or more points in all six home games this season and in three straight contests overall... Spain extended his team best streak of consecutive games with a trey to 12... The 12 straight games with a three-point field goal tied his career high, set last season... The game marked the ninth time this season he has made multiple three-pointers in a game... Spain's five three-pointers is a career best.

▶ D.J. Gay reached double figures for the second time this season (he had a season-high 20 points vs. Hampton in the championship game of the Great Alaska Shootout)... Gay now has 10 career double-digit scoring games in his career... The game marked the third time this season that Gay has made multiple treys in a game... He now has 14 multiple trey games in his career... The sophomore tied Tim Shelton for team-high honors in assists with four.

▶ Mehdi Cheriet continued his strong play of late, pouring in nine points, his second-highest point total as an Aztec.

▶ Tim Shelton led the team in both rebounds (seven) and assists (four)... It marked the fifth consecutive game that he led the team in rebounds and the first time he had been the team leader in assists... The four assists were a season high and tied a career high.

▶ Richie Williams posted his eighth straight game with at least three assists... The senior ended his night with three.

The Defense Never Rests

Aztec opponents this year have had a rough time reaching 60 points as only three of 12 have surpassed the mark. Prior to Northern Colorado scoring 62 on Dec. 3, SDSU held six straight opponents to 59 or less, something that had not been

done since the 1949-50 campaign.

The other San Diego State foes to score more than 60 was Arizona, which put up 69, and Saint Mary's (67). The UA point total was tied for its second-fewest points scored on the season and the Wildcats came into the game averaging 75.0 points a contest. Similarly, SMC was held to its second-fewest points on the season and they entered the tilt averaging 81.1 points.

As a result of the Aztecs' defensive prowess, San Diego State is the top team in the Mountain West Conference in scoring defense as it allows just 55.6 points a game (as of Dec. 25).

70 and Above is a Good Thing

San Diego State has had tremendous success when scoring at least 70 points in a game. Dating back to the 2006-07 season, SDSU has won 20 straight games when reaching 70 points. Since the beginning of that year, the Aztecs have won 35 of 37 when scoring 70. This season, the Scarlet and Black is undefeated in five tries this season when hitting the 70-point mark.

Free-Throw King

Kyle Spain has been near perfect from the free-throw line this year. At 6-5, Spain has made 56-of-62, is shooting 90.3 percent from the stripe and ranks first in the Mountain West Conference (as of Dec. 25).

Spain has three streaks of 10 or more makes this season, including a season-best 18 straight. His career high is 20 in a row.

Against Western Carolina, Spain tied his career high with 10 free-throws, marking just the second time he has accomplished the feat. The last time he nailed 10 was vs. Portland at the World Vision Classic in Fresno, Calif.

When it counted the most in the championship game of the Great Alaska Shootout (Nov. 29), Spain went 8-for-8 from the line to prevent any sort of Hampton comeback.

Against Fresno State (Nov. 22), Spain went 8-for-8 from the free-throw line, equaling the most free-throw makes without a miss in a game in his career. The last time he went 8-for-8 was during his freshman year against Wyoming on March 1, 2006.

Spain's numbers are not surprising considering he came into the season as a career 73.7-percent shooter and was coming off a junior campaign where he shot 80.0 percent.

Butler-Hancock Brings Out Best in Shelton

It may have been below 20 degrees outside of Butler-Hancock Sports Pavilion on the campus of Northern Colorado, but Tim Shelton's shooting certainly wasn't. The freshman was perfect in all aspects when it came to shooting as he finished with a stat line that read: 6-6 FG, 2-2 3FG, 3-3 FT.

All of that led to a career-high 17 points, 12 of which came in the first half to help the Aztecs to a 34-30 lead at the half. Besides establishing a new personal best in scoring, Shelton set new career highs in field goals and three-pointers.

Considered as the team's sixth starter by coach Steve Fisher, Shelton played a season-high tying 26 minutes and added two rebounds, an assist and five charges drawn.

Dead On

Sophomore forward Billy White has been dead on when it comes to shooting, not only this season, but last year as well. Through 12 games, the Las Vegas native is shooting 55.6 percent from the field (first on team) and is among the Mountain West leaders. Last season as a freshman, White set the school record for field-goal percentage at 61.5 percent.

Spain Named MWC Player of the Week

Kyle Spain was named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week, the league office announced Dec. 1. The award is the third of Spain's career and first this season.

Spain helped the Aztecs win the Great Alaska Shootout tournament title by averaging 18.0 points, 6.3 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.0 steals in just 25.0 minutes per game in a starting role. Spain was also named the Great Alaska Shootout Most Outstanding Player.

In the first game of the tournament against Western Carolina, Spain tied his career-highs in points (22) and assists (five) while pulling down a team-best eight rebounds and collecting a season-high two steals. With 11 seconds to go, Spain knocked down the game-tying and go-ahead free throws to give the Aztecs the 59-58 victory.

In game two of the event, Spain led the team with 15 points on 6-of-9 shooting from the floor, while going 3-for-3 from behind the arc. He also tallied three rebounds and two steals in the Aztecs' 75-56 semifinal win over Seattle.

In the championship game against Hampton, Spain scored 17 points while recording a game-high tying eight rebounds and two steals in only 17 minutes of action. His two steals matched a season high and marked the third game in a row that he reached that total. Spain also went a perfect 8-for-8 from the line in the Scarlet and Black's 76-47 victory. The Aztecs posted the largest margin of victory (29) in a Great Alaska Shootout title game.

On the week, Spain shot 50 percent (15-for-30) from the field, including 6-for-13 (46.2 percent) from three-point range and 18-of-19 (94.7 percent) from the charity stripe.

Three Honored at Great Alaska Shootout

Three Aztecs, Kyle Spain, Ryan Amoroso and D.J. Gay, were named to the Great Alaska Shootout All-Tournament team.

Spain was named the tourney's most outstanding player after averaging 18.0 points and 6.3 rebounds in 25.0 minutes in the three games.

Gay and Amoroso were all-tournament selections after averaging 9.7 and 8.0 points, respectively. Gay tied the tournament record for most three-pointers made with six in the title game vs. Hampton.

Amoroso: A Great Alaska Shootout Trivia Question Answer

won two GAS championships after already winning the 2005 title while at Marquette.

In six Great Alaska Shootout games (three with Marquette, three with San Diego State), Ryan Amoroso scored 67 points and averaged 11.2 points in those contests. He finished his GAS career just outside the all-time scoring average leaders top-20 list for those players who have played in at least two Shootouts.

More from the Shootout

► Steve Fisher became one of 10 coaches in the history of the Great Alaska Shootout to have won a national championship and win a Shootout title.

► The Aztecs won their first tournament-style event under Steve Fisher. Prior to the win, SDSU had been 0-for-3 in such tournaments, finishing in third place at the 2005 BP Top of the World Classic and the 2003 EA Sports Maui Invitational and in second at the 2001 Ford Red Raider Classic.

► San Diego State gave up just 161 points in the three games and that total places them third all-time in fewest points allowed behind Kansas' 1984 total of 155 and the 1984 Maryland team (159).

Notes From Great Alaska Shootout Championship Game vs. Hampton

► SDSU set a tournament record for fewest points allowed in a championship first half when it gave up 16 Hampton points. The 16 points also ranks third for the fewest points allowed in the first half of any game.

► D.J. Gay put up a game-high 20 points, to post his second career 20-point game... The sophomore hit a career-high tying five three-pointers in the first half and finished a new personal best of six... Gay also had three assists, marking the fifth straight game in which he has finished with at least three assists.

► Kyle Spain scored 17 points to reach double figures for the sixth straight game... The Aztecs improve to 32-8 when scores at least 10 points in a game... His two steals matched a season high and marked the third game in a row that he has reached that total... Spain also collected a game-high tying eight rebounds and went 8-for-8 from the line for the second time this season.

► Ryan Amoroso grabbed a season-best eight rebounds and led the team in the category for the second time this year.

► Billy White, who scored 12 points, reached double figures in scoring for the first time since logging 12 against Arizona State.

Multiple-Game In-Season Events Good for SDSU

With the Great Alaska Shootout win, San Diego State ran its winning streak in multiple-game in-season events to 10. Prior to going 3-for-3 in Anchorage, the Aztecs swept the three games at the World Vision Classic (2007-08) and Shamrock Invitational (2006-07). The first game of the streak actually occurred in Alaska, when the Scarlet and Black defeated Southern Miss in the third-place game of the BP Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks.

During the Steve Fisher era, the Aztecs have fared well in multiple-game in-season events as Fisher's team have gone a combined 14-3.

Aztec Signing Class of 2009 Ranked No. 15; Tops Among Non-BCS Schools

San Diego State's recruiting class of 2009 has been ranked No. 15 in the nation and No. 1 among non-BCS schools by The HOOP SCOOP Online in their exclusive rankings. Rivals.com, meanwhile, ranked SDSU's class No. 1 among mid-majors ahead of MWC institutions UNLV (No. 2), BYU (No. 11), Utah (No. 13) and New Mexico (No. 18).

The Aztecs signed five players, which included Eric Lawton, Kawhi Leonard, Chase Tapley, Malcolm Thomas and Alec Williams, during the early signing period.

Additionally, Paul Biancardi of ESPN.com said that San Diego State was one of the non-BCS schools that made the most noise in the early signing period.

"Consistently and quietly, Steve Fisher keeps bringing talent to the Aztecs," Biancardi said. "His four-man class is led by wing Kawhi Leonard, who is a tough player and gifted scorer."

Also included in the 2009 incoming class are a pair of Division I transfers in Tyrone Shelley (Pepperdine) and Brian Carlwell (Illinois), who are currently sitting out the 2008-09 campaign due to NCAA transfer guidelines. If HOOP SCOOP were to include transfers in their rankings, which would then include 6-10 Carlwell and 6-5 Shelley, the Aztecs would have had a top-five nationally ranked recruiting class.

Four or More Starters Returning for Fisher Equals Postseason

In his coaching history, Steve Fisher plus four or more returning starters has resulted in tremendous success. Eight previous times Fisher has returned four or more starters from a team coached, with those clubs advancing to the NCAA Tournament on six occasions and winning the postseason NIT championship once. Below is a look at those clubs.

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In eight seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs knocking on the door of the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that Fisher signed a new five-year contract prior to the start of the 2006-07 season that will keep him in San Diego for the foreseeable future.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, the postseason NIT in 2003, the 2006 NCAA Tournament and the NIT the last two seasons. In addition, the Aztecs have a solid core returning and a nationally ranked recruiting class, that will keep SDSU competitive this season and seasons ahead.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

In 2006-07, he led SDSU to the MWC regular season and tournament crowns and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That team finished with a Division I school-record 24 wins. And the last two seasons, Fisher has led the Aztecs to two additional 20-win seasons and postseason appearances and he doesn't look like he is stopping anytime soon.

ANCHORAGE, Alaska - San Diego State earned a berth in the Great Alaska Shootout championship game by defeating Seattle, 75-56.

The game got off to a slow start as neither team could connect until the 16:07 mark when Ryan Amoroso had a fastbreak dunk off a Kelvin Davis steal. SDSU later enjoyed a big lead at half, 36-21.

The Scarlet and Black never looked back at the Redhawks, going on an 11-2 run led by Ryan Amoroso to open the second half.

SDSU connected on more than half of its field goal attempts for the first time of the season. The Aztecs shot 50.9 percent for the game after going 27-for-53. San Diego State was able to move above the 50 percent mark after shooting 71.4 percent (15-21) from the floor in the second half. SDSU also shot 57.1 percent from beyond the arc (8-14), its highest percentage of the year.

Kyle Spain led the way as he scored a game-high 15 points for his fifth double-figure scoring game in a row.

Ryan Amoroso and his front-court teammate, Mehdi Cheriet, combined for 24 points. Amoroso tied a career high with three steals and scored a season-high 13-points. Cheriet's 11 points were a personal best and came off of 4-of-6 shooting.

The win against Seattle was the fourth straight against the Redhawks, as the Aztecs have never lost to them. In addition, San Diego State held its fifth straight opponent this season to 59 points or less.

ANCHORAGE, Alaska - D.J. Gay helped San Diego State to the Great Alaska Shootout title as the Aztecs dismantled Hampton, 76-47, to win the 31st edition of the Thanksgiving week tournament.

Gay made five of his six three-pointers in the first half and finished with a game-high 20 points to post his second career 20-point game. His career-best six three-pointers tied a tournament record for most in a championship game. Gay also tallied three assists on his way to being named the player of the game.

The Scarlet and Black's defense was just as impressive as the offense. SDSU held Hampton scoreless for the first 6:45 of the game, building a 15-0 lead that was never challenged. In only allowing Hampton to score 47 points, San Diego State held its sixth straight opponent to 59 points or less. It was the first time an Aztec squad has accomplished the feat since the 1949-50 season.

SDSU became the first MWC team to win the Great Alaska Shootout allowed just 161 points over the course of three games to rank third all-time in Shootout history.

Kyle Spain scored 17 points and had a game-high tying eight rebounds as he was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Joining Spain on the all-tournament team were Gay and Ryan Amoroso.

The Aztecs forced 17 turnovers, 11 of which came off steals, and finished the game with a 28-2 advantage in points off turnovers.

The increased offensive touches opened up the game and increased San Diego State's lead to double-figures with 10 minutes to go as the Aztecs cruised to the finish line.

San Diego State shot a season-best 53.8 percent from the floor due in large part to Lorenzo Wade's 17-point performance on 6-of-8 shooting. Senior teammate Ryan Amoroso, meanwhile, went 6-for-10 from the floor en route to 13 points.

Kyle Spain added 11 points and Richie Williams filled the stat sheet with six points, four rebounds, a game-high four assists and a season-best five steals.
