AZTEC HEADLINES

- San Diego State's quest for a third straight Mountain West regular-season championship begins this week when it locks horns with Colorado State on Thursday, Jan. 2, at Viejas Arena. Game time is set for 6 p.m. PT, and a live video stream featuring Chris Ello on play-by-play will be available at www.goaztecs.com.
- The Aztecs kick off their MW schedule at home for the fourth year in a row. The last time SDSU opened conference play on the road came on Jan. 6, 2010, when it defeated New Mexico, 61-39.
- The Aztecs are coming off an 84-67 setback at the hands of North Carolina State on Monday in the finals of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam. SDSU held a 23-19 first-half lead, but was unable keep pace with the Wolfpack, who shot 13-for-28 from three-point range.
- For the third consecutive game, the Aztecs received double-digit scoring efforts from four players, including 14 points apiece by Khristina Hunter and Cierra Warren. In addition, the SDSU cause was aided by all-tournament honoree Danesha Long, who tossed in 12 points, while Deajanae Scurry finished with 10.
- The last time the Aztecs had four players reach double figures in three straight games occurred in 2009 vs. Pepperdine, Long Beach State and LMU.
- Warren leads the Mountain West with a .604 fieldgoal percentage (55-91) and ranks eighth with 13.9 points per game. The SDSU center has eclipsed the 20 point-barrier on three occasions this season.
- As a team, SDSU tops the MW with a .433 field-goal percentage and ranks first in rebounding defense as well, allowing just 34.8 boards per game.

#AztecWBB Opens MW Play vs. CSU on Thursday

San Diego State opens its 15th year of Mountain West competition on Thursday when takes on Colorado State at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs were picked to finish third in the MW preseason poll, while the Rams landed in the seventh spot. SDSU captured both meetings against CSU last year to grab a 27-18 lead in the all-time series and owns a 16-5 mark against the Rams in San Diego. The Aztecs have faced CSU just once in a MW opener, dropping a tough 68-65 decision at Fort Collins on Jan. 5, 2006.

The Aztecs hold a 4-4 record at home and a 1-5 mark on the road in all-time MW lid-lifters. The four home wins came against BYU in 2001, vs. preseason favorite UNLV in 2005, against Air Force in 2009 and vs. TCU in 2012.

Thursday's clash will mark the fourth straight year and fifth time in the last eight seasons that SDSU has commenced league play at home. The Scarlet and Black is 19-18 all-time in conference openers, including a 5-4 mark in the Western Collegiate Conference (1976-85), a 2-3 record in the Big West (1985-90) and a 7-2 mark in the Western Athletic Conference (1990-99).

Scouting the Rams

Colorado State (8-3) has won four straight, including a 59-54 triumph at home over Weber State in its last outing on Dec. 22.

Individually, sophomore Caitlin Duffy leads the Rams with 11.7 points and 6.5 rebounds per game, while senior Sam Martin, a preseason all-Mountain West selection, has been averaging 11.2 points and 5.0 boards per contest. In additon, Duffy tops the MW with a stellar .894 free-throw percentage, while Martin ranks fifth in field-goal percentage (.491) and is tied for sixth in blocks (1.4/gm). Similarly, junior Gritt Ryder leads the conference with a .450 three-point field-goal percentage (18-40) and is averaging a team-best 4.3 assists per outing, which is tied for fourth in the MW.

Ryder, who hails from Denmark, is one of seven Europeans on the CSU roster, joining fellow Dane Emile Hesseldal, Ellen Nystrom, Gabby Frykbo and Elin Gustavsson of Sweden, Hanne Mestdagh of Belgium and Stine Austgulen of Norway.

As a team, the Rams are shooting 40.5 percent from the field, including a 29.6 percent clip from three-point range and 76.9 percent from the charity stripe. Despite leading the MW in defensive rebounding percentage (.715), CSU ranks only seventh in the league with an overall rebounding margin of minus-1.5 per game.

Head coach Ryun Williams is in his second season at the helm of the Rams after a four-year stint at his alma mater South Dakota, where he guided the Coyotes to the second round of the WNIT in 2012. Prior to his tenure at South Dakota, Williams spent 10 seasons at Division II Wayne State (Neb.), highlighted by a berth in the 2008 NCAA regional semifinals

Stacie Terry has coached against Colorado State on one previous occasion when she was an assistant at Louisville. The Rams posted an 82-72 victory over Terry's Cardinal squad in the finals of the Women's Sports Foundation Classic in Columbus, Ohio, on Dec. 15, 2001.

With a Victory...

An SDSU win over Colorado State on Thursday will mean:

- Head coach Stacie Terry collects her first conference coaching victory in her first attempt.
- SDSU wins its third straight against Colorado State and fourth in the last five meetings.
- The Aztecs raise their record to 28-18 vs. the Rams, including a 17-6 mark in San Diego.
- SDSU wins its fourth MW opener in the last six years.
- The Aztecs improve to 20-18 all-time in conference lid-lifters.
- SDSU posts its first victory of the 2013-14 campaign against a team with a winning record.
- The Aztecs improve to 27-10 in January games since 2009.

Dissecting the Non-Conference Slate

The fact that San Diego State sits at 3-7 heading into Mountain West play can be at least partially attributed to the following factors:

► Turnovers - The Aztecs are committing over five turnovers more per game (20.4-15.2) than their foes this season, which ranks last in the MW. Last season, SDSU was just one of three teams in the league to finish with a positive turnover margin (+2.9), along with Fresno State and Colorado State. Opponents have capitalized on the Aztecs' miscues by maintaining a combined 220-143 advantage in points off turnovers

However, SDSU has made progress in recent games, committing a combined 15 fewer miscues (25-40) in victories over Miami (OH) and UC Riverside.

- ▶ Offensive Rebounds Over the first seven games, San Diego Stte got outrebounded by an average margin of 15.6-9.9 on the offensive glass. As a result, the Aztecs' foes maintained a 110-55 advantage in second-chance points during that stretch. However, SDSU has shown signs of reversing that trend, out-rebounding their last three foes on the offensive boards by a 57-26 margin and maintaining a 44-21 spread in second-chance points.
- ▶ Three-Point Field Goals The Aztecs' opponents have drained a staggering 81 three-pointers on the season for an average of 8.1 per game. The Aztecs have allowed opponents to shoot 38 percent from beyond the arc, which ranks near the bottom of 343 Division I teams entering the weekend. Conversely, the Scarlet and Black has connected on just 29 treys for the year and combined for just 14 in the six

games prior to the UCLA game.

▶ Schedule - The Aztecs have played one of the toughest schedules in the country so far this year, featuring a pair of games against AP Top 25 foes in No. 19 South Carolina and No. 23 Texas A&M. In addition, NC State continues to receive votes in both the AP and USA Today polls following Monday's clash. As of Jan. 1, SDSU's strength of schedule was rated 12th in the nation, according to Jeff Sagarin/ Collegiate Basketball News, while realtimerpi.com ranked the Aztecs' slate the 16th toughest. Entering Thursday's contest, the combined record of SDSU's first 10 opponents stands at 83-42.

► <u>Experience</u> - San Diego State's starting lineup against NC State featured five players who have combined for just 35 starts in an Aztec uniform prior to Dec. 30. With that lack of experience, growing pains are certainly inevitable.

Despite the adversity, four of the Aztecs' seven losses have come by a scant 12 points. The youthful SDSU squad has displayed much resiliency during the early part of the season, overcoming a 14-point deficit on Dec. 28 against UC Riverside and nearly rallying from a pair of 19-point deficits at Sacramento State and USC. In fact, the Aztecs owned late leads at Sac State and against San Diego, only to cede go-ahead three-pointers by the opposition.

Nothin' Like Home Cookin'

Despite its 2-4 home record to start the season, SDSU has posted a 61-19 ledger on the Viejas Arena court since the beginning of the 2008-09 campaign and has captured 29 of its last 35 on The Mesa.

January Gems

San Diego State has compiled a 26-10 overall record in January games played since 2009, including a 6-1 mark last season.

The Last Time Out - SDSU vs. NC State

Despite having four players produce double-digit scoring totals for the third game in a row, San Diego State was unable to match the long-range fire-power of North Carolina State, dropping an 84-67 decision in the championship final of the ninth annual San Diego Surf `N Slam Monday night at Vieias Arena.

Senior Cierra Warren and junior Khristina Hunter led the Aztecs with 14 points apiece, but it wasn't enough as the Wolfpack connected on 13-of-28 three-point field goals (46.4 percent) to win their seventh straight en route to the tournament title.

SDSU (3-7) also received 12 points from senior Danesha Long, while sophomore Deajanae Scurry notched 10 points of her own in the loss. Hunter, who shot 6-for-13 from the floor, pulled down five rebounds as well to tie Long and junior Desi Culberson for team-high honors.

Collectively, the Aztecs maintained a 30-24 rebounding advantage and outscored NC State, 46-33, in the paint. However, the Wolfpack (13-1) shot 54.5 percent from the field (30-55), including a crisp 61 percent (14-23) in the second half to break open a tight game at intermission. In addition, NC State converted 16 SDSU turnovers into 27 points and held a 9-2 advantage in fast-break opportunities to help fuel its win.

Tournament MVP Markeisha Gatling led the Wolfpack with 24 points on 9-of 12 shooting, while Myisha Goodwin-Coleman tallied 20 points, highlighted by a 6-for-13 effort on three-pointers, to go with five assists and a game-best four steals. Elsewhere, Kody Burke chipped in 14 points and five assists, while Len'Nique Brown registered 11 points and a game-high seven assists for the visitors.

NC State set the tone early, sinking four of its first six shots from downtown to build a 19-12 lead by the 11:52 mark of the first half. Yet the Aztecs stood their ground, fashioning an 11-0 surge over the next four-and-a-half minutes as a Hunter layup put the host school in front by a 23-19 count with 7:27 remaining in the period.

However, the Wolfpack promptly short-circuited SDSU's momentum after the Scarlet and Black misfired twice on the same possession. NC State made the Aztecs pay with a pair of three-balls courtesy of Ashley Williams and Brown during a 14-6 surge that put the Wolfpack back in front, 32-29, with 3:24 left. The Aztecs tied the score on two occasions, including a 34-34 deadlock following another Hunter basket with 1:20 left, before NC State reeled off seven straight points, capped by a Brown free throw. Then with just four seconds remaining, freshman Ariell Bostick drove the length of the court and beat the horn with a layup to give the contest its 41-36 score at halftime.

SDSU was unable to draw any closer, however, as the Wolfpack engineered a sizeable 16-8 run over the first four-plus minutes of the second half,

building a 57-44 bulge after another Goodwin-Coleman three-pointer at the 15:46 mark.

The Aztecs trimmed the deficit to eight on three occasions, including a 69-61 spread following a Warren layup with 6:15 left, but could only muster six points for the remainder of the contest. Conversely, Gatling scored eight points down the stretch, including a 4-for-4 clip from the free-throw line to help put the game out of reach for NC State.

Warren Tabbed MW Player of the Week

Senior Cierra Warren (Rancho Cucamonga, Calif.) was named the Mountain West Women's Basketball Player of the Week on Dec. 2 for her dominating performance in the Aztecs' 71-67 victory at UC Santa Barbara.

With her award, the SDSU center garnered her first career weekly conference accolade and the first for an Aztec player this season.

Against UCSB on Nov. 30, Warren scored a teamhigh 21 points on 9-of-10 (.900) shooting from the floor and a 2-for-2 effort at the free-throw line. She also added one assist, one block and a steal to help SDSU notch its first win of the season.

In the second half, Warren tallied 11 straight points, including the first three-point basket of her career, during a 22-9 run that overturned a 42-33 deficit and catapulted SDSU into the lead for good at 55-51. She also secured the game-clinching rebound after the Gauchos missed a potential game-tying three-pointer with nine seconds remaining in the contest.

Scorching the Nets

San Diego State has finished with a .600 or better field-goal percentage in two games already this season (.623 - at Sacramento State and .652 - at UCSB) after recording just two since the 2000-01 campaign.

For the season, the Aztecs are shooting a collective .433 from the floor, which ranks among the top 60 in the nation entering Thursday's game. Individually, Cierra Warren ranks among the top 20 nationally with a sparkling .604 field-goal percentage on 55-of-91 shooting.

AztecWBB Inks Pair to NLIs

San Diego State head coach Stacie Terry inked her first pair of recruits on Nov. 15, with the signing of Cheyenne Greenhouse (Riverside, Calif.) and Lexy Thorderson (Castle Rock, Colo.) to National Letters of Intent. The two high school seniors are set to join the Aztecs for the 2014-15 season.

Greenhouse signs with SDSU out of Canyon Springs High School, where she captured CIF Division 1A co-player of the year honors as a junior last season after leading the Cougars to the Southern Section championship and a berth in the semifinals of the CIF regional tournament.

A 5-11 guard, Greenhouse averaged 18.4 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 2.1 steals during the 2012-13 campaign, earning first-team all-state CIF Division 1A recognition while landing a spot on Max-Preps all-state first team.

"Cheyenne is going to be very important to us because she has can play multiple positions," Terry said. She will add tremendous athleticism to our program with her great leaping ability. Cheyenne is also a very intelligent player and her basketball IQ is off the charts."

Greenhouse makes her signing official as a threestar recruit, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. A threetime all-Inland Valley League selection for head coach Gail Hale at Canyon Springs, Greenhouse also brings

three years of club experience with her to The Mesa, having played for Cal Swish in 2011, followed by a two-year stint with the West Coast Premier program. She intends to study biology or pre-medicine at San Diego State.

Thorderson, meanwhile, garnered first-team all-Continental Leagues accolades as a junior last year at Rock Canyon High School after averaging a teambest 16.1 points to go along with 5.7 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 1.3 steals. Under the tutelage of head coach Robbie Ballard, the 6-0 guard/forward received Colorado 5A honorable mention all-state distinction on two occasions in 2011 and 2013.

In a game against eventual state champion Regis Jesuit last February, Thorderson scored 32 points to earn player of the game honors by MaxPreps. Earlier in the season, she also gained recognition as the Denver Post's female student-athlete of the week.

"Lexy's addition will enable us to extend our offense because she is deadly from three-point range," Terry said. "Her ability to knock down that jumper will also help open up the game for our post players."

Thorderson, who also competed at the USA Basketball U16 national team trials in 2011, has a basketball pedigree in her family. Her father Eric Thorderson played collegiately at Wayne State (Mich.) from 1980-85, while two of her sisters, Ali and Abby, earned varsity letters at Weber State. She is undecided on a major at San Diego State, but is considering a career in physical therapy and physical education.

Noting the Newcomers

Of the 12 student-athletes on the current roster, five players will be wearing an Aztec uniform for the first time this season. Cierra Warren practiced with the squad last year but did not compete after transferring from Louisville, while Deidra Smith utilized her redshirt campaign as well, following her transfer from Boston College. In addition, sophomore Deajanae Scurry missed the latter half of the 2012-13 campaign to concentrate on academics.

With San Diego State losing nearly 67 percent of its scoring offense from a year ago, three true freshmen

look to gain significant experience this season. Guard Ariell Bostick (Oakland, Calif.) led Bishop O'Dowd High School to a pair of CIF titles, while forward Alyssa Lawrence (New Rochelle, N.Y.) was an all-league and all-section honoree during her prep career. Not to be outdone, Chloe Johnson (Phoenix, Ariz.), who was named the Mountain West preseason freshman of the year, brings strong credentials with her to The Mesa after earning all-state honors for prep powerhouse St. Mary's High, which finished with a No. 1 national ranking in 2011-12.

Meet the New Staff

The talent at Viejas Arena is not just limited to the playing court as head coach Stacie Terry has assembled a prolific staff in her first season on The Mesa. Assistant coaches Jesse Clark, Aisha Veasley and Ciara Carl bring a vast array of experience with them to "America's Finest City", while Mike Bynum returns for his fourth season as the Aztecs' director of player development.

A native of Tacoma, Wash., Clark spent seven years as an assistant at Saint Mary's College, where he helped the Gaels to four straight WNIT berths, including a quarterfinal appearance in 2012-13. He also had stints at Stanford, San Francisco, CSU Bakersfield and Pacific Union.

Veasley, who enjoyed a successful playing career at UCLA, returns to her Southern California roots after two productive stops as an assistant at Tulsa and Colorado. While at CU, Veasley played a pivotal role as the team's recruiting coordinator, helping to land three top-40 classes.

Carl also has ties to the area, having graduated from Point Loma Nazarene and coaching with San Diego club teams. Most recently, she served an assistant at Metro State in Denver, Colo., following a two-year run at Division II power Cal Poly Pomona.

Aztecs Garner MW Preseason Honors

San Diego State received three preseason Mountain West individual honors on Oct. 15, as forward Erimma Amarikwa was named to the all-conference team, center Cierra Warren was selected newcomer of the year, while guard Chloe Johnson was tabbed the MW preseason freshman of the year.

As a team, the Aztecs were picked to finish third in the MW preseason poll, which was conducted in a combined panel of the league's 11 head coaches and select conference media members. SDSU collected 196 points and picked up two first-place votes, trailing second-place Wyoming, which received 212 points and four first-place votes, while preseason favorite Fresno State garnered 238 points and 17 first-place votes.

Basketball Performance Center On the Docket

San Diego State Director of Athletics Jim Sterk announced on Nov. 12 that a proposed 23,500-square-foot basketball performance center is under design, with a plan to break ground on the project in late spring 2014.

The \$14.5 million facility, which will be located just south of the Fowler Athletics Center and east of the football practice fields, will include two full-length courts, eight baskets, locker rooms, film rooms, team lounges, athletic training room and coaches locker rooms to help support the Aztec men's and women's championship basketball programs.

Although a majority of the funds have been pledged, fundraising continues for the project which is tentatively scheduled to be completed in 2015.

"This is an exciting day to be able to announce this project is moving forward," Sterk said. "It is a project that will greatly benefit our already successful men's and women's basketball programs. It is also an important day because we are going public with our drive to raise funds for the project and hope that the community that has enjoyed San Diego State basketball will get behind this project."

"The basketball performance center is more than just a building, it is our classroom," SDSU women's basketball head coach Stacie Terry said. "The facility will provide an opportunity for our student-athletes to enhance their individual games, which will in turn benefit our program. It also keeps San Diego State competing at the highest level not only in basketball, but in recruiting as well."

Two For The Show

Former SDSU All-Americans Courtney Clements and Chelsea Hopkins both earned roster spots with the WNBA this past season after completing their illustrious careers for the Scarlet and Black following the 2012-13 campaign. Clements joined the Atlanta Dream as a free-agent rookie last May, while Hopkins was signed by the San Antonio Silver Stars in September.

Clements appeared in 30 games for Atlanta in 2013, becoming the first former Aztec to compete for a WNBA title after the Dream advanced to finals against the eventual champion Minnesota Lynx. The Long Beach native totaled 59 points (2.2/gm) on the year to go with 26 rebounds, eight assists and five steals. Against the Seattle Storm on July 14, Clements recorded a season-best 12 points before logging season highs of five rebounds and 29 minutes played vs. San Antonio on Sept. 15.

Hopkins, meanwhile, averaged 14.3 minutes in three games during a late-season tour of duty with the Silver Stars, finishing with six points, six rebounds and five assists.

What's New in the Mountain West

With the addition of newcomers San José State and Utah State, the Mountain West will have a different look for the third year in a row. Following the departures of Brigham Young and Utah in 2011, the league added Boise State, while Fresno State and Nevada joined the circuit last year after the defection of TCU. The latest realignment means the Aztecs will now have 18 league games this season instead of 16, with the Scarlet and Black facing Wyoming (home) and Nevada (road) just once, while completing a home-and-home slate with the rest of the conference.

The Mountain West Championship, scheduled for March 10-15, 2014, has also been revamped to include three games with the six lowest-seeded teams during the first round. In addition, the four surviving squads from the quarterfinals will have two days to prepare for the semifinal round.

SDSU alumus Chris Ello will handle the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the seventh straight season.

In addition, all Aztec home contests during the 2013-14 regular season will feature a live video stream via the Mountain West Network to supplement the audio call from Viejas Arena.

After playing three games in six days, SDSU will have five days off before embarking on its first road trip in over a month when it travels to Boise State on Wednesday, Jan. 8. Tipoff at Taco Bell Arena is set for 7 p.m. MT (6 p.m. PT).

STACIE TERRY

Head Coach First Season Texas-Arlington (1999)

Stacie Terry was named the eighth head coach in the history of the San Diego State women's basketball program on May 15, 2013. A native of San Diego, Terry gained a wealth of experience as an assistant coach at the Division I level over the past 14 years, including the last five under head coach Nikki Caldwell, who transformed UCLA into a powerhouse before restoring LSU to national prominence.

During Terry's two seasons at LSU, the Lady Tigers compiled a 45-23 overall record and earned two NCAA tournament bids, including a Sweet 16 appearance during the 2012-13 campaign. This past season, the Lady Tigers also posted six victories against ranked opponents and finished with their second-highest scoring average (69.0) in the last seven years. Under Terry's guidance, forward LaShondra Barrett garnered first-team all-Southeastern Conference accolades and received honorable mention All-America distinction in 2012 before becoming a first-round draft choice of the WNBA's Washington Mystics.

"I am honored and humbled to be the next head coach at San Diego State University," Terry said. "I want to thank Jim (Sterk) and his staff for this amazing opportunity. This is such a special place for me. Not only is this my dream job, but it is home. SDSU is a first class university that has all the resources in place to be successful. I am so eager to get started and confident that we can continue the winning tradition that Aztec supporters have become accustomed to both on and off the court."

Prior to her arrival at LSU, Terry served as an assistant under Caldwell at UCLA from 2008-11, helping the Bruins gain national acclaim with a pair of NCAA tournament appearances. During Terry's tenure, UCLA posted 72 overall victories, as the 2010-11 squad finished with a 28-5 record, setting a school record for fewest losses in a single season to go with a No. 7 national ranking. In addition, the Bruins signed the fourth-ranked recruiting class that season, according to ESPN HoopGurlz, while Terry helped mentor first-team all-Pac-10 performers in Doreena Campbell, Darxia Morris and Jasmine Dixon, a 2012 honorable mention AP All-America selection, as well as all-conference freshman honorees Atonye Nyingifa and Markel Walker.

Terry spent the 2007-08 campaign at Southern Mississippi, as the Golden Eagles posted a 21-14 record and earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). While at Southern Miss, Terry spearheaded the development and coordination of the Lady Eagle recruiting campaign. Her responsibilities also included working with the perimeter players, scouting opponents and film breakdown, as well as coordinating all of the team's community service events.

Terry also coached for three seasons from 2004-07 as an assistant under Hall of Fame head coach Theresa Grentz at Illinois, where the Fighting Illini had three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 25 in

the nation, according to Blue Star Basketball, and made three consecutive trips to the WNIT. Her primary duties included defensive instruction and working with the perimeter players.

In addition, Terry coached at Dayton during the 2003-04 season following a three-year stint at Louisville from 2000-03. With the Cardinals, Terry's responsibilities encompassed recruiting, scouting, player development, summer camps and serving as a liaison for the program's community service outreach. Louisville captured the Conference USA regular-season title and earned a trip to the NCAA tournament in 2001 before making a WNIT appearance in 2002. She also assisted in signing the nation's 21st-ranked recruiting class in 2002-03, according to All-Star Girls Report. Terry recruited and coached all-Conference USA honoree Lori Nero, a draft choice of the WNBA's Houston Comets, as well as Sara Nord, who finished her collegiate career as the Cardinals' all-time assist leader and ranks among the top 15 scorers in school history.

Terry enjoyed a successful collegiate playing careerat Texas-Arlington, winning four varsity letters from 1994-98 under head coach Mike Dean. She earned first-team all-Southland Conference honors after leading the Mavericks in scoring with 17.4 points per game as a senior in 1997-98. Terry scored 1,169 points during her career at UTA and still ranks among the school's top 10 in three-point field goals made (third), assists (sixth), steals (seventh) and free-throw percentage (10th). She is just one of 17 players in Maverick history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau, while her .335 career three-point field-goal percentage is also a school and Southland Conference career record.

Terry played one season of professional basketball in Warsaw, Poland, averaging 12.0 points and 6.0 assists with the Polonia Phoenix, before returning to Texas-Arlington to begin her coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1999.

Terry, who graduated from El Capitan High, stills holds the Vaqueros' career scoring record and was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2008.


