OFF THE BOUNCE (through games of Sunday, February 6)

- Winners of 11 of its last 13 games, including a first-place 9-2 mark in Mountain West games, the No. 25-ranked San Diego State men's basketball team faces the Utah State Aggies on Wednesday evening at the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum, a venue in which Utah State has lost just 11 times since the start of the 2019-20 season.
- Diego State has won 30 of its last 34 conference home contests (30-4), since the start of the 2019-20 campaign, and overall has emerged the victor in 12 of its last 13 and 22 of its last 24 Mountain West home games.
- The Aztecs are battle tested having played the sixth toughest schedule in the nation based on its average opponent's NET rank, through the games of February 5. Only school in the AP Top 25 to have played a tougher schedule than the Aztecs is No. 9 Kansas with the toughest schedule in the nation. Tonight's opponent, Utah State, has played the 40th most difficult schedule.**
- Since the beginning of the 2009-10 campaign, San Diego State's 98-58 (.628) record in road games is the sixth best in the nation and overall the Aztecs' 350-114 (.754) record is also the sixth best in the nation (see boxes on page 8).
- The last time out, San Diego State completed four games in a 10-day stretch (3-1) with a 72-52 destruction of Boise State. The victory snapped a three-game slide for SDSU against the Broncos, regardless of location, and it was the second worst beating Boise State had taken at the hands of a Mountain West team since it joined the league in the 2011-12 season.
- With its 72-52 win vs. Boise State (February 3), the Aztecs improved to 19-3 in their last 22 games immediately following a loss. In situations where a loss is followed immediately by a home game, San Diego State has won 25 consecutive games.**
- SDSU is 8-2 in its last 10 Mountain West road games and 23-6 since Dec. 4, 2013 as a visitor in Mountain West arenas.
- SDSU is 51-1 in its last 52 games, and has won 39 straight games in which it has shot at least 50.0 percent from the field, which it last did against Boise State (51.0 percent) on February 3 in a 72-52 win.
- San Diego State committed only three turnovers in its game against San Jose State. That is the fewest for an Aztec team, in a Division I game, since the start of the 1999-00 season, a span of 777 games.**
- On Wednesday evening, San Diego State and Utah State will meet for the 26th time overall and the second time during the 2022-23 campaign. The Aztecs own a 16-9 series advantage. At Viejas Arena, SDSU is 9-1, but just 4-5 in Logan including a 4-4 mark in the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum.
- The last time San Diego State played Utah State was on January 25, in Viejas Arena. The Aztecs defeated the Aggies 85-75. The 85 points for the Aztecs are the most it has scored since an 85-point output against San Jose State on February 8, 2021.
- San Diego State's calling card is defense, and it is again playing it at a high level according to Kenpom, which has the Aztecs ranked No. 31 nationally in adjusted defense. In addition, the SDSU offense, which ended the 2021-22 campaign ranked No. 167 in adjusted offense, slots in at No. 30 through 23 games this year and SDSU is No. 22 in adjusted efficiency margin.
- San Diego State has appeared in the Associated Press' Top 25 Poll for 96 weeks since the start of 2010-11 season. SDSU's 95 weeks in the top 25 are the 18th most nationally and are the most for any California school in that time frame (see graphic on page 9).
- SDSU enters tonight's game battle tested, including having played the fewest Quad 4 games, one, among the 363 Division I schools who

compete in men's basketball. The only team with fewer than four Quad 4 games is Kansas which has played three games against Quad 4 competition.

- San Diego State, which in 2021-22 reached the Mountain West championship game for the fifth time in head coach Brian Dutcher's five seasons, looks for its unprecedented 15th Mountain West men's basketball title. Entering the 2022-23 season, San Diego State, the most successful program in conference history, has won eight regular season and six Mountain West tournament titles.
- San Diego State has a 27-8 record (77.1 percent) in true road games since the start of the 2019-20 season. That is the second best record in the nation trailing only Gonzaga's 27-4 record.
- **San Diego State owns a 53-5 record (91.4 percent) since the start of the 2019-20 campaign in home games. That's the seventh best record in the nation, trailing Gonzaga's 55-1, South Dakota State (46-2), Liberty (56-4), Kansas (55-4), Nicholls (39-3) and Houston (57-5), and better than Baylor's 51-5.**
- Senior **Nathan Mensah** finished his Boise State win with a game-high 17 points. It was his fifth 10-plus point game of the season and the 32nd double-digit scoring effort of his career (32-4). The 17 points are also the most the Accra, Ghana native has scored in a MW game. In addition, his six rebounds were a game-high and marked the 12th time this season and 48th time in his Aztecs career he led the team in boards.
- Senior **Keshad Johnson**, against Boise State, scored in double figures for the 10th time this season, sixth time in the last eight games, and 22nd time of his career. In addition, he was perfect from the floor (5-for-5) for the first time of his career (min. 5 FGA).
- Junior guard **Lamont Butler** totaled five assists for the third straight game. Over those three games (72 minutes), he has 15 assists and three turnovers for a 5.0:1 assist-to-turnover ratio. The five assists are one shy of tying a career high.
- Guard **Darrion Trammell**, a senior, had a season-high seven assists. The last time he had seven assists in a game was Feb. 26, 2022 against Dixie State while he played for Seattle University.
- **Brian Dutcher** is now in his sixth season as SDSU's head coach and his 24th on the Aztec sidelines. In his five-plus seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to four conference titles, five MW championship game appearances, a 137-45 (.753) overall record - eighth best in the nation, has been named the national coach of the year and twice the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

QUICK HITS FROM THE BOISE STATE GAME

- San Diego State hands Boise State its worst loss (20 points) against a Mountain West team (league game or MW tournament) since a 22-point setback (78-56) at Colorado State on Jan. 27, 2021 and tied for its second-worst loss against a MW team (league game or MW tournament) since the Broncos joined the league in the 2011-12 season.
- Seven of Boise State's 20-worst losses since joining the MW have come against San Diego State (league game or MW tournament).
- San Diego State moves to 53-5 in home games since the start of the 2019-20 season, which is the fifth-best record in the nation in that time frame.
- SDSU wins the 18th of its last 21 Mountain West games overall (18-3).
- San Diego State improves to 12-1 in Viejas Arena this season and is 62-6 in its last 68 home games.
- San Diego State improves to 30-4 in Mountain West games at Steve Fisher Court since the start of the 2019-20 season.
- San Diego State has won 22 of its last 24 Mountain West home games.
- The Aztecs move to 124-9 in the Brian Dutcher era when leading with five minutes to play.
- The Aztecs move to 13-2 on the season when they score first, 96-22 under Brian Dutcher and 213-56 in their last 269 games.
- For the 12th time this year, San Diego State never trailed in the second half.
- SDSU wins its 12th game in its last 13 when leading at the half, and improves to 15-2 on the season and 119-15 under Brian Dutcher.
- SDSU wins its 13th straight game when attempting more free throws than its opponent, and improves to 15-1 this season, 60-3 in its last 63 games and 90-8 under Brian Dutcher.
- San Diego State wins its 11th straight game when shooting better than its opponent and is now 14-1 this season and 115-8 under Brian Dutcher.
- SDSU improves to 15-2 on the season when outrebounding its opponent and 100-12 under Brian Dutcher.

AZTECS REMAIN IN THE AP TOP 25; JUMP INTO THE COACHES POLL

Winners of 11 of its last 13 games, and boasting an 9-2 mark in Mountain West play and in first place, the San Diego State men's basketball team is ranked in this week's Associated Press Top 25 poll at No. 25. The Aztecs totaled 96 points in the AP poll and is the only Mountain West program to be ranked.

With its appearance in this week's AP poll, San Diego State is ranked for the 96th week since the start of the 2010-11 season, more than any other program in the state of California in that time frame.

San Diego State is ranked No. 25 for the seventh time in school history. SDSU has appeared in every position in the AP poll between No. 4 and No. 25, except for No. 12.

Today's ranking, released on February 6, marks the fifth time SDSU has appeared in the AP Top 25 on this date and for the year, the Aztecs have been included in the poll for eight weeks.

After falling out of the Coaches Poll three weeks ago, San Diego State returned this week at No. 23, a move of three spots, and similar to the AP poll, the Aztecs are the only Mountain West school to appear in the February 6 version of the poll.

TOP-25 FACTS

- San Diego State opened the 2022-23 season ranked No. 19 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. It is the fourth time that SDSU has been included in the AP's preseason poll; all coming during the Dutcher/Fisher era, and is the second highest ranking for the program in the initial poll of a year.
- The previous three occasions when San Diego State was ranked in the preseason poll by the AP voters was prior to the 2010-11 season when the Aztecs were initially No. 25; prior to the 2012-13 campaign, when SDSU was No. 20; and the most recent appearance before this year, was 2014-15 when the Scarlet and Black was No. 16, the program's highest ranking in the preseason poll.
- How important is the preseason ranking or what does it portend? The three previous Aztec teams which were ranked in the preseason AP poll, finished a combined 84-23, including a 44-3 mark in Viejas Arena. Each squad made at least the round of 32 in the NCAA tournament with the 2010-11 team reaching the Sweet 16 and finishing the season with a 34-3 record.
- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight (Dec. 2, 2013 to Dec. 15, 2014).
- Entering this season, the Aztecs had appeared in the AP Poll for 88 weeks, and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.
- As of the Monday, February 6 poll, San Diego State's 96 appearances since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, are the most of any school in California. (See box in the left column of page 5)
- Prior to this season's ranking, the last time the Aztecs appeared in the AP poll was March 15, 2021, the final poll of the 2020-21 season, and the Aztecs were ranked No. 16.
- Since the start of the 2019-20 season San Diego State has appeared in the USA Today Coaches Poll 28 times, including this year's preseason ranking of No. 20.

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

With San Diego State having played 10-of-14 regular season road/neutral contests, here are some road and neutral site facts about SDSU:

- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 98-58 (.628) record in road games is the seventh best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 154-89 (.634) record in road/neutral games is the 10th best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, among teams that have played at least 80 neutral site games, San Diego State's 56-31 (.644) record is the 12th best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 98-58 (.628) record in road games against the Mountain West leads the conference.

OFF THE BENCH

San Diego State's bench scored 45 of the team's 85 points (52.9 percent) vs. Utah State (1/25), and this group of reserves may be the program's best since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-00 season).

- The Aztecs bench is averaging 26.9 points per game, 4.0 more than the 22.9 of the 2020-21 team's bench, the highest since the start of the 1999-00 season.
- The Aztecs' bench scoring ranks No. 2 in the Mountain West and No. 28 in the nation.
- SDSU's 12.8 rebounds from the bench are 1.2 more than the average of the 2015-16 reserves, the best in the Dutcher/Fisher era.
- In addition, the 2022-23 bench's, 9.0 defensive rebounds, 9.2 field goals, 3.1 three-pointers, and 5.4 free throws are all currently single-season bests for the program, since the inception of the Mountain West (1999-00).
- The 2.4 steals, 3.7 offensive rebounds, and 73.5 free throw percentage rank second for the bench since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era.

- The Aztec bench has outscored its opponents bench 618-to-404 (26.9-to-17.6 points per game).
- San Diego State's bench has matched or outscored its opponents bench in 19 of the team's 23 games and in those 19 games, SDSU has come away with 15 wins (15-4).

SEIKO...EN FUEGO VS. UTAH STATE

Senior Adam Seiko missed the team's game at Air Force on January 21, but came to Viejas ready to go from the moment he stepped on the floor for the Aztecs game against Utah State on January 25.

- He checked into the game with 15:01 on the clock, took 1:06 to get acclimated and then exploded on the Aggies.
- He hit his first shot, a 3-pointer, at 13:55; his second, a 3-pointer, at 12:47; his third, a 3-pointer, at 11:53; his fourth, a 3-pointer, at 9:50 and, a heat check 3-pointer, his fifth, at 9:30.
- In the span of 4:25 on the floor, the Boston native was 5-of-5 from the bonus distance to propel San Diego State from a 9-7 lead to a 26-11 advantage.
- To let the nets cool off, he subbed out for three minutes, and when he returned, made it an even six threes in the first half; nailing his last of the first period with 1:23 to play, making the score 42-27 at intermission.
- He sank his first triple of the second half, making him 7-of-7, all from the bonus distance.
- His seven threes equals the program record for a player coming off the bench (also: David Abramowitz, Feb. 10, 2000 vs. Utah) and was one off the program record for a game which has been achieved four times, most recently by Jordan Schakel dropped eight on Colorado State on January 4, 2021.

THE GOOD HANDS PEOPLE

In its game against San Jose State on January 28, the Aztecs committed only three turnovers. It is the fewest it has had in a game since at least the 1999-00 season, a total of 777 games. It bettered the previous best, four turnovers, which SDSU has achieved nine times, the last of which came on March 14, 2015 in the championship game of that season's Mountain West tournament against Wyoming.

- The team that holds the record for the fewest turnovers by a Mountain West program, since the inception of the league, is Wyoming which committed just one turnover in a February 28, 2012 game against TCU.

KEYS TO VICTORY

- San Diego State is 15-2 this season when leading at the half. (SDSU is 182-23 (.888) in the last 205)
- San Diego State is 14-1 this season when leading with five minutes to play. (SDSU is 377-14 (.964) in the last 391)
- San Diego State 13-2 this season when scoring first. (SDSU is 213-56 (.792) in the last 269)
- San Diego State is 15-2 this season when it outrebounds its opponent. (SDSU is 241-38 (.864) in the last 279)
- San Diego State is 15-1 this season when it attempts more free throws than its opponent. (SDSU is 228-33 (.874) in the last 261)
- San Diego State is 14-1 this season when it shoots a higher field goal percentage. (SDSU is 277-18 (.939) in the last 295)
- San Diego State is 8-1 this season when its opponent shoots 40% or lower. (SDSU is 297-39 (.884) in the last 336)
- San Diego State is 8-0 this season when it holds its opponent to under 60 points. (SDSU is 83-7 (.922) in the last 90)
- San Diego State is 14-2 this season when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponent. (SDSU is 141-25 (.849) in the last 166)

SWEET HOME CALIFORNIA

In the first 23 games of the campaign, from Cal State Fullerton (11/7) to vs. Boise State (2/3), the Aztecs have played and won 13-of-14 contests in the state of California. Here is how important that is:

- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is 213-36 (.855) in games played in the state of California.
- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is 182-24 (.883) in games played in Viejas Arena.
- Since the inception of the Mountain West, San Diego State is 149-44 (.772) in league games played in Viejas Arena, which includes a 4-14 record in its first 18 league home games.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament 10 of the last 12 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and after 13 home games this season, San Diego State has the seventh-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 196-25 home record, winning 88.7 percent of its home games during that span.

- In the midst of the 2022-23 season, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.
- In its last 232 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 206-26 mark (88.8 percent), including a 108-12 record (90.0 percent) against non-conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- Since the start of the 2002-03 season, San Diego State has a 142-30 (82.6 percent) home record against conference opponents.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 151-21 (87.8 percent) at home, including a 67-9 (88.2 percent) record in non-conference home contests during that stretch and 64-7, 90.1 percent, against non-top 25 non-conference foes.
- The Aztecs are 74-11 (87.1 percent) in their last 85 conference home games and 71-9 (88.8 percent) in their last 80 non-conference home games.

MORE HOME COOKING

- In the last 56 home games, San Diego State is 51-5, with an average scoring margin of +14.4 points in those victories. In 38 of those 51 home wins, the game was decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs current 13-game non-conference home court win streak, started on November 11, 2021, against UC Riverside, equals the sixth-longest in school history; a win streak that began on December 16, 2000 and ran to November 23, 2002.
- San Diego State is 62-6 in its last 68 home games dating back to January 1, 2019.
- The Aztecs are 44-5 in their 49 Mountain West Conference home games since Jan. 24, 2018.
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on seven occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2019-20).

ONCE IS GOOD, BUT TWICE IS NICE

Senior Keshad Johnson has played 97 games in his Aztec career and in the first 92 he compiled two double doubles: 11 points, 10 rebounds at UNLV on Jan. 1, 2022 and 14 points, 10 rebounds vs. New Mexico on Jan. 31, 2022.

- Against Utah State (1/25) Johnson recorded his fourth with 11 points and 10 boards...right on the heels of his third which came the game before that, at Air Force (1/21) with 13 points and 10 rebounds.
- Double doubles are better than good for the Aztecs. When the Aztecs, currently on the roster, reach a double double, the team is a perfect 12-0.

STREAKS ON THE LINE FOR THE AZTECS ON WEDNESDAY

When the Aztecs play Utah State on Wednesday here are some of the streaks that are on the line for SDSU:

- 39-game win streak when shooting 50 percent or better.
- 26-game win streak in games in which it scores between 80-89 points.
- 11-game win streak when leading with five minutes to play.
- 11-game win streak when it outshoots its opponent.
- 10-game win streak when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponent.
- 7-game win streak when holding its opponent less than 60 points.
- 3-game win streak in games played on Wednesday.
- 3-game win streak in games played in February.

ALL SCHEDULES AND RECORDS ARE NOT THE SAME

Through the games of February 5, San Diego State, 18-5 on the season, has played the sixth most difficult schedule in the nation, based on its opponent's NET rank.

- Of the 363 schools that are competing at the Division I level, the Aztecs have played just one game (1-0) against Quad 4 opponents. That is the fewest of any team in the nation. SDSU has played 4.3 percent of its schedule against Quad 4 teams.
- Utah State, which after its win at Colorado State on Saturday is in a three-team tie a game behind SDSU at the top in the Mountain West, has played five Quad 4 teams (3-2). Boise State has played six Quad 4 games and has a 5-1 record in those games, and Nevada has played four Quad 4 games and has gone 4-0 in them.
- Of the 22 teams ahead of the Aztecs in the NET, through the games of February 5, the only one close to the Aztecs' one (1) Quad 4 game is No. 10 Kansas which has played three (3-0).
- Houston, which is No. 1 in the NET, has feasted on Quad teams with a gaudy 9-0 record. Those nine wins equal nearly half of the team's win total this season (22).
- No. 18 in the NET, Florida Atlantic, having tested themselves nine times against Quad 4 teams, is 9-0, and those nine wins account for 45.0 percent of its 20 Division I wins. In the latest AP poll, published on February 6, Houston was ranked No. 2.

So all schedules and records are not the same.

SOMETIMES SIX ASSISTS ARE ENOUGH

When San Diego State defeated Air Force 70-60 on January 21, it marked the third time since the start of the 2017-18 season the SDSU recorded six or fewer assists in a Mountain West game. SDSU is 2-1 in those three games.

- Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, the Aztecs are 10-6 in league games when they tally no more than six assists in a game.
- Since the start of the Mountain West era (1999-00), the Aztecs have totaled six or fewer assists in a league game 24 times and earned 11 victories in those games.
- The fewest assists San Diego State has recorded and earned a win in a league game was four against Fresno State (58-47) on January 27, 2015.
- Overall since at least the start of the 1996-97 season, the fewest assists San Diego State has recorded in a win are four. The Aztecs have done it three times; the aforementioned Fresno State game, vs. No. 25 Utah (53-49) on November 18, 2014 and vs. Wyoming (69-64 in overtime) on March 11, 2006.

SEIKO THE BIGGEST WINNER IN LEAGUE HISTORY

Playing in the Aztecs 82-76 win at Colorado State on January 18, senior guard **Adam Seiko** racked up his 56th career win in a Mountain West game. Those 56 wins are the most for any player in Mountain West & Aztec history (The league's initial year of existence was 1999-2000).

- Entering the game at Utah State, Seiko has been a part of 59 wins in Mountain West games.
- With seven Mountain West games remaining on the schedule for the Aztecs and if SDSU goes 5-2 in those contests (below the program's conference winning percentage since 2009-10 - 74.6 percent) and the Boston native stays healthy, Seiko could complete his career with 64 conference wins.
- San Diego State has eight of the top-10 players on the all-time league games won list.
- The only non-Aztecs among the top-10 of the most Mountain West wins are Justin Bean (Utah State) and Chandler Hutchinson (Boise State) who are tied for sixth place with 50 victories.
- Current SDSU players Nathan Mensah (49 wins), Aguek Arop (48 wins) and Keshad Johnson (42 wins) are also high on the all-time list.

MENSAH SWATS HIS WAY TO HISTORY

Senior forward **Nathan Mensah**, the reigning Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, cemented his place in Aztec history in SDSU's 82-76 overtime victory on Jan. 18, 2023 at Colorado State.

- With his second blocked shot of the game, with 16 seconds remaining in the extra period, the Accra, Ghana native reached 200 blocked shots for his career achieving the final milestone of a three part record. He became the second Aztec in the 102 years of the program to score at least 800 points, grab at least 700 rebounds and block at least 200 shots. He joined Leonard Allen, who accomplished the triumvirate during his career from 1982-1985, as the only two SDSU players to reach all three milestones.
- Mensah enters the Utah State game with 893 career points, 7803 rebounds (No. 3 on the program's career list) and 205 blocked shots (No. 3 on the program's career list).
- With 9 more blocks he will equal Allen's 214 career rejections as the No. 2 shot blocker in the annals of SDSU basketball.

WELCOME BACK MATT

Senior **Matt Bradley** is one of the nation's elite scoring guards. In 2021-22 he was one of six players in the nation to average 16.9 points

and 5.4 rebounds, while shooting 43.8 percent from the floor, 40.1 percent from the bonus distance, 77.9 percent from the line. In addition, he was one of two players, who in a minimum of 15 home games, averaged 18.2 points while shooting at least 48.2 percent from the floor (with a minimum of 195 shot attempts) and 46.4 percent (on a minimum of 69 3-point attempts)...and is the only Division I player who has returned in 2022-23 with those stats.

- In the team's first eight games, he averaged 8.8 points on 15-of-52 FG (28.8 percent), with 3.4 rebounds and 1.0 assist.
- Since then, in the last 15 games, he is averaging 13.6 points on 70-of-171 FG (40.9 percent), including 25-of-70 3PFG (35.7 percent), with 3.7 rebounds and 2.3 assists and tallied his first double double of the season (17 points and 10 rebounds vs. Nevada - 1/10/23) and second as an Aztec.
- For his career, Bradley is a 15.2 points per game scorer on 42.9 percent shooting with 4.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game.

MORE ON BRADLEY

Senior **Matt Bradley** finished the team's game against Air Force with a season-high 27 points on 9-of-12 shooting, including 6-of-7 from beyond the arc, 3-of-5 from the charity stripe and added three rebounds, an assist, a steal and did not turn the ball over in 31 minutes of action. He is the eighth Aztec, since at least the start of the 1996-97 season, to enjoy a game of at least 25 points without a turnover and is the first to do so since Jeremy Hemsley (2016-19) scored 30 points in 33 minutes at Nevada without a turnover on January 4, 2017. The other Aztecs to accomplish those minimums are:

- Xavier Thames (January 25, 2014 at Utah State) 31 points, zero turnovers in 39 minutes.
- Xavier Thames (January 15, 2014 vs. Fresno State) 28 points, zero turnovers in 34 minutes.
- Chase Tapley (December 22, 2012 vs. San Francisco) 33 points, zero turnovers in 35 minutes.
- Brandon Heath (January 24, 2004 vs. Colorado State) 26 points, zero turnovers in 43 minutes.
- Aerick Sanders (December 31, 2003 vs. Portland) 34 points, zero turnovers in 40 minutes.
- Evan Burns (February 24, 2003 vs. New Mexico) 31 points, zero turnovers in 34 minutes.
- Jason Richey (December 2, 1997 vs. Oregon) 25 points, zero turnovers in 38 minutes.

TO 2,000 POINTS AND BEYOND

Senior **Matt Bradley** emerged from the UNLV game (12/31) the eighth active player in Division I to score 2,000 career points.

- The product of San Bernardino, Calif., enters the Utah State game with 2,125 points is one of 12 players who have reached the milestone this season.
- Among the group, there are nine players who stand 6-4 or shorter, Bradley among them. Within that group he reached the milestone in the fewest field goal attempts (1,509) and has overall grabbed the most rebounds (635).
- San Diego State will play a minimum of eight more games this season, if he scores at his career average (15.3 points per game), he will add 122 more points and would complete his college career with 2,247 points.

HEAT CHECK FROM THE BONUS DISTANCE

San Diego State has hit 10 or more 3-pointers in seven contests this season, including five of the team's last 11 games, and has won each of the seven contests when it knocks down double digit treys. How effective has the 3-point shooting been in the last nine games?

- In the last 12 contests, the Aztecs have totaled 97 treys and have shot 38.5 percent from the bonus distance (97-of-252).
- In its four previous games against Division I opponents, before this surge, SDSU made 13 threes and shot 25.6 percent (21-of-82).

DUTCHER KEEPS THE BALL ROLLING...AND ROLLING

Brian Dutcher is on The Mesa in now his 24th season, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he's experienced 522 victories, 14 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 15 postseason tournaments, including 10 NCAA appearances and a pair of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014).

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured four Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each of his five years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first five seasons.
- His 119 wins in his first five seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first five campaigns.
- **His 137 wins to date are the most of any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.**

SERIES HISTORY VS. UTAH STATE

- This is the 26th meeting between the schools, with San Diego State winning 16 of the last 22 and overall holding a 16-9 advantage in the all-time series.
- San Diego State owns a comfortable 9-1 lead in games played in Viejas Arena but in the last seven in Logan, SDSU is 4-5, having lost four of the last five meetings on the Aggies home floor. On a neutral floor, SDSU and Utah State are tied 3-3, with the Aztecs, having broken through in the 2021 Mountain West Championship game after losing the previous two to the Aggies (2019 & 2020 MW title game).
- SDSU has won the regular-season series (home-and-home) four times, it has been tied twice, and the Aggies have won once, in the seven seasons in which both teams have been members of the MW. The Aztecs won the first game of this season's home-and-home series, 85-75 on January 25 at Steve Fisher Court.
- In 2020-21, San Diego State suffered its only season series loss to the Aggies.
- The series began in 1962 with Utah State winning the first meeting 101-57, and went on to win the next two matchups. Beginning with the fourth game of the series, in 2014, the Aztecs won 11 straight. During that 11-game span, San Diego State had an average winning margin of 13.2 points. The streak included a 73-39 victory in the quarterfinal game of the 2014 Mountain West Tournament. The 34-point win is SDSU's largest margin of victory in 52 MW tourney games. The Aggies had won three straight meetings prior to SDSU's 2021 Mountain West Tournament championship game and last season each team held serve on its home floor.

AZTEC HISTORY ACHIEVED

Senior **Nathan Mensah** entered the 2022-23 season on the precipice of Aztec history and at Colorado State he achieved it.

With two blocked shots he became the second player in program history to amass at least 800 points, 700 rebounds and 200 blocked shots in the course of a career.

At the start of this season, Mensah had 732 points, has added 161 more in the first 23 games, and surpassed the 800 point plateau, currently at 893 career points.

The Accra, Ghana native, has grabbed 136 rebounds since the start of the season to eclipse the 700-rebound milestone. He surpassed 700 boards vs. No. 14 Arizona in the Maui Invitational, and currently sits at 803 (No. 3 in program history).

At Colorado State, he swatted three shots to move past 200 blocks as an Aztec and currently sits at 205 for his career (No. 3 in program history).

Mensah joined **Leonard Allen** (1982-85) as the only Aztec to compile those combined numbers in their careers. Allen ranks No. 32 in points (1,019), and No. 8 in rebounds (716) and No. 2 in blocks (214).

SAN DIEGO — Adam Seiko drained seven three pointers, including six in the first half, and the Aztecs beat Utah State on Wednesday night, 85-75. Seiko finished seven of nine from bonus distance and totaling a career-high 25 points.

Seiko's seven 3-pointers tie David Abramowitz (Feb. 10, 2000 vs. Utah) for the most in a game by an Aztec coming off the bench since at least the 1996-97 season.

In addition to Seiko, it was the Keshad Johnson show early in the game. The junior forward set the tone with a monster block in the opening minute, had five points and three rebounds in the first four minutes, helping the Aztecs (16-4, 7-1 MW) to an early 7-3 lead. He would finish with his second double double in as many games, (11 points & 10 rebounds) and cracked double figure scoring for the fourth time in the last five games.

Up next it was Seiko who took over for the Aztecs. The senior made three straight from bonus distance to give the Aztecs an 18-11 lead with 11:40 remaining in the first half. He then hit his next two to give him five made threes over seven minutes played as the Aztecs lead ballooned to 17, 28-11 with 7:30 left in the opening stanza.

Utah State (16-5, 5-3 MW) would go on a run of their own to close the gap to 12, 39-27 with 1:30 left in the half, before Seiko hit his sixth triple in the first 20 minutes, tying his career-high. He finished the half a perfect 6-6 from deep and the Aztecs took a 42-27 lead into the break.

The Aggies would begin a comeback in the second half, and cut the Aztecs advantage to nine, 64-55 with just under 10 minutes left in the game. Micah Parrish then hit a deep three to give San Diego State a double-digit advantage again, this time 69-55 with 7:28 left in the game.

Utah State would make another run to cut it to six, 72-66, but Darrion Trammell made a basket to put the SDSU back up eight with 3:20 left. A few possessions later, Lamont Butler drilled another three, San Diego State's 12th of the night, putting SDSU up by double digits again, 79-68 with 2:05 remaining.

Down eight with 1:05 left, the Aggies were forced to foul, but the Aztecs knocked down their last six free throw attempts and emerged 85-75 winners.

The victory is the 16th for San Diego State in the last 22 games against the Aggies and in Viejas Arena, SDSU has defeated Utah State in each of its last nine meetings.

LAST TIME OUT

No. 22 San Diego State 72, Boise State 52

SAN DIEGO — Nathan Mensah scored 17 points as No. 22 San Diego State raced past Boise State 72-52 Friday night in a showdown of the Mountain West Conference's top two teams despite an off night by Aztecs' leading scorers Matt Bradley and Darrion Trammell.

Keshad Johnson added 10 for SDSU (18-5, 9-2), which regained sole possession of first place. Bradley came in leading the Aztecs at 13.2 points per game but didn't score until making a jumper with 9:16 to play, finishing with three points. Trammell came in averaging 11.1 and didn't score until making a shot earlier in the second half, finishing with four.

Max Rice scored 16 for Boise State (18-6, 8-3), which was without its leading ball handler, point guard Marcus Shaver Jr., who was out with a high ankle sprain. Shaver had a walking boot on his right foot.

BSU beat SDSU three times last year, including in the championship game of the conference tournament.

The Aztecs raced to a 43-21 halftime lead despite getting zero points from Bradley and Trammell. Mensah led the way with 12 points and Adam Seiko had nine.

"I'm extremely pleased with our performance tonight. I thought we put 40 minutes together," said coach Brian Dutcher, whose Aztecs were coming off a nine-point loss at Nevada in which they didn't play well in the second half. "We've obviously played 20 minutes of great basketball most games, usually the first half, but in the second half I thought we came out and competed at a higher level than we had. That said, we got outscored by two points. But we didn't see the drastic give up 10, 12 extra points that we have in these other games."

Mensah had six points during a 14-0 run that carried the Aztecs to a 29-10 lead with 5:47 left before halftime. Seiko made two 3-pointers, including a 27-footer to cap the run just before a timeout. An SDSU team manager who goes to the scorer's table to get stats during timeouts was whistled for a technical for putting his thumb and pinkie up to his ear as if to say, "Dial up a 3," and BSU's Max Rice made both free throws.

Dutcher said he didn't see it, but figured the ref probably thought the manager was taunting BSU.

"I'm glad it wasn't at the end of a two-point game and glad we had a cushion," Dutcher said. "No technical is good, but I'm sure he'll have a memory for the rest of his life."

The combination of SDSU's defense and the absence of Shaver was too much for the Broncos. BSU shot only 33.3% in the first half and was called for a 10-second violation late in the first half. The Aztecs blocked three shots in the first 20 minutes, two by Aguek Arop and one by Mensah.

Mensah blocked a shot with three minutes left that set up a slam dunk by Johnson on an alley-oop pass from Seiko for a 70-50 lead. Mensah drew 10 fouls and made 9 of 12 free throws.

"It's because he was aggressive," Dutcher said. "Some of them were because we threw it to him, and two or three of them were because he was going to the offensive glass and they had to push him to box him out. I thought he played as good a game as he's played all year tonight."

BSU shot only 36.5% from the field, while SDSU shot 51%.

BIG PICTURE

Boise State: The Broncos clearly missed Shaver, who besides being third on the team in scoring at 13.2 points was leading the Broncos with 6.3 rebounds and had a team-high 79 assists.

San Diego State: It'll be touch-and-go whether the Aztecs remain in the AP Top 25. After popping back into the poll on Monday, the Aztecs lost 75-66 at Nevada on Tuesday night.

WHAT HAPPENS IN LAS VEGAS...IS USUALLY GOOD FOR SAN DIEGO STATE

- Overall, San Diego State has a 42-37 lead in the all-time series with UNLV. At one time, the Aztecs trailed 26-6 in the series, but is 36-11 in the last 47 meetings between the teams.
- Since the start of the 2008-09 campaign, San Diego State has 42 victories at Thomas & Mack Center. That is the most victories by any school in the nation in any venue in which they have not played a home game during that span. In second place is Villanova in Madison Square Garden with 34 victories.
- San Diego State is 13-1 in its last 14 games at UNLV (games played at Thomas & Mack Center).
- San Diego State is 20-2 in the last 22 games played between the Aztecs and Rebels.
- Brian Dutcher has been on the sidelines for 37 of San Diego State's 41 victories in the series. While Dutcher has been on the Aztec sidelines for the 36 series wins, the victories have come against nine different UNLV head coaches (Bill Bayno, Max Good, Charlie Spoonhour, Jay Spoonhour, Lon Kruger, Dave Rice, Todd Simon, Marvin Menzies, T.J. Otzelberger and Kevin Kruger).

- **Made 10 consecutive 3-pointers over the course of three games (from Cal State Fullerton (12/22/21) to UC San Diego (12/28/21)).** In available information, was the only player to reach double-digit consecutive made 3-pointers in 2021-22 and the first to do it since Kyle Guy (Virginia) made 11 in a row in the 2018-19 season.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 129-35 (.787) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but four of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 96 home games against those same 24 opponents, and also starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 85-11 (.885).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 463-325 (.588) overall.

San Diego State opened the 2022-23 season hosting an in-state foe in Cal State Fullerton and improved to 23-10 against the Titans in the all-time series. The Aztecs won at Stanford on Nov. 15, 74-62, to capture its first win against the Cardinal in five tries and downed UC Irvine 72-69 on Nov. 29. After a 16-68 defeat against Saint Mary's in the Jerry Colangelo Classic at Phoenix, SDSU has three games remaining on the schedule against in-state Division I opponents, including a game against UC San Diego on Dec. 20 at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

BRADLEY NAMED MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior Matt Bradley was named the Mountain West men's basketball Player of the Week, for the week ending on Sunday January 1.

- A native of San Bernardino, Calif., Bradley shot 57.7 percent from the field (15-of-26), 64.7 percent from beyond the arc (11-of-17) and sank 69.2 percent of his free throws (9-of-13) in a home win over Air Force and a road victory at UNLV last week. In addition, he averaged 3.4 rebounds, 2.0 steals and 1.0 assists in 33 minutes of action per game.
- Last Wednesday, the 6-4 guard opened the 2022-23 MW slate with a season-high 27 points against Air Force. He was 9-of-12 (75.0 percent) from the floor, including 6-of-7 (85.7 percent) from distance, and 3-of-5 from the line without turning the ball over once. In doing so, he became the eighth Aztec since at least the 1996-97, the ninth time overall, to score at least 25 points without committing a turnover. Out of those eight players and nine occasions, he accomplished it in the fewest minutes, 31.
- **With 23 points in a 76-67 victory at UNLV last Saturday, Bradley became the eighth active player in Division I to surpass 2,000 career points.**
- He finished the game shooting a comparatively pedestrian 6-of-14 from the floor (42.9 percent), including 5-of-10 from long range (50.0 percent) and was successful on 6-of-8 free throws (75.0 percent). He added four rebounds, three steals and an assist in the 76-67 win at Thomas & Mack Center.

MOUNTAIN WEST OPENERS

With its 71-55 victory over Air Force in its 2022-23 Mountain West Conference opener on Wednesday, here is some San Diego State Mountain West opener info:

- In its 24 openers to Mountain West play, the Aztecs have a 16-8 record.
- San Diego State is 8-5 when its league opener is at home.
- San Diego State head coach Brian Dutcher is 3-3 in league openers, with only two of those games played at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.
- San Diego State and Air Force have played in a Mountain West opener four times, in 2002-03 & 2008-09 in Clune Arena, SDSU defeated the Falcons 63-48 and 61-44, respectively, and in Viejas Arena in 2014-15, 53-49, and on Wednesday, 71-55.

Brian Dutcher enters his sixth season as San Diego State head men's basketball coach, building on the previous five years in which he led the Aztecs to five title games in Mountain West tournament, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th & 14th Mountain West crowns, and to a bid to the NCAA tournament three times. He is the only coach in the 101-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first five seasons. His 119 victories in five seasons (119-40) are the most for any Division I head coach whose first year guiding his current program was 2017-18 and the accompanying win percentage, 74.8 percent, is the highest for any head basketball coach in San Diego State history.

Dutcher has been recognized twice, following the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons, with Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year in both those years as well. In addition, Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year distinction following the 2019-20 campaign and was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naimsmith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

His teams have faced top-25 ranked opponents on 15 occasions and posted a 9-6 record (60.0 percent) and includes wins over Gonzaga, UCLA and Arizona State as well as Nevada (four times) and Colorado State (twice). Since the start of the 2018-19 season, his Aztecs are 4-2 against Pac-12 opponents and 8-4 in multi-team events in season. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, SDSU has the 14th best home win percentage in the nation (88.3 percent), and in the last three years, San Diego State has posted a 91.1-win percentage (41-4) in Viejas Arena, the ninth best in the nation.

The team's success on the court is reflected in the honors his players have earned under his tutelage. In 2020 Malachi Flynn was a consensus All-American, the third Aztecs to earn that honor and the following season Matt Mitchell was recognized by the Associated Press with the All-American moniker.

San Diego State put a player on the USBWA's All-District IX first team in 2020 (Flynn) and 2021 (Mitchell). The NABC has bestowed its All-District 17 honors seven times to an Aztec in the last five years. In 2019, Jalen McDaniels earned first team designation. Flynn, Yannii Weitzell were first team and Mitchell was second team in 2020. In 2021, Mitchell and Jordan Schakel earned first team and second team honors, respectively and in 2022 Matt Bradley was a second team performer.

Within the Mountain West, Flynn was named the 2020 Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year and a member of the All-Defensive Team. In the same season, KJ Feagin was named to the all-defensive team and one year prior, Jeremy Hemsley was included on the league's all-defensive team. In 2021, Mitchell earned Mountain West Player of the Year, first team All-Mountain West and inclusion on the all-defensive team along with Nathan Mensah. In 2022, Mensah was the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a member of the all-defensive team. Bradley was the Newcomer of the Year. Chad Baker-Mazara was named the Sixth Man of the Year and Lamont Butler garnered all-defensive team honors.

His players have earned 14 all-Mountain West designations and 15 player of the week honors. Two Aztecs, Trey Kell in 2018 and Mitchell in 2021, were named Mountain West tournament MVP among 10 SDSU players who have been included on the league's all-tournament team. In his five seasons, his charges have garnered 14 league all-academic team distinctions with Flynn being named to the 2020 NABC Honors Court.

The 2021-22 campaign featured a 23-9 record and SDSU's second straight appearance in the NCAA tournament and its second consecutive single-digit seed, No. 8. Six of its nine losses were by 6 points or less and after Dec. 8, 2021, five of the team's six defeats were by six points or less. Twice during that stretch, the Aztecs defeated nationally ranked Colorado State.

The team's No. 2 ranking in KenPom's adjusted defensive efficiency was the best for a Dutcher coached team and matched the program's best rating since the start of the 2006-07 season (the team was No. 2 following the 2010-11 campaign). Among its national rankings, SDSU was No. 2 in scoring defense, No. 4 in field goal percentage defense, No. 25 in 3-point field goal percentage defense and No. 32 in blocks per game.

The defensive success was in part due to Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year Nathan Mensah. The Accra, Ghana native averaged 2.2 blocks per game to lead the Mountain West, totaled a career-high 71 blocks for the season, and was No. 5 in offensive rebounds, No. 7 in total rebounds and No. 13 in defensive boards.

Offensively, the team was led by first year player Matt Bradley, who transferred into the program in the summer of 2021. The Mountain West Newcomer of the Year and first-team all-league designee, led the team in virtually every offensive statistical category, including points (542), field goals (186), 3-pointers (57) and free throws (113).

In 2020-21, he guided San Diego State to the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns and earned a No. 6-seed in the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs went 23-5 and finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in field goal percentage defense (.387), No. 8 in scoring defense (60.6), No. 12 in scoring margin (+13.5), No. 14 in total steals (233), and No. 16 in turnover margin (+3.9) nationally. Among the Mountain West teams, San Diego State led the league in turnovers forced (15.15), steals per game (8.19), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), three-point field goal percentage (.381), field goal percentage defense, scoring defense, scoring margin, turnover margin and total steals. The team posted a 14-game win streak, which is the fourth longest in school history and is the third at least nine games under Dutcher.

The 2019-20 squad ripped off a program-record 26-straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both national polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2, including 17-1 in Mountain West play.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game

winning streak, which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus second-team All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blowout victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, three days after Utah defeated then No. 6 Kentucky, the Aztecs handed the Utes a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the corona virus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his first season as head coach, he was the only Division I coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Over the course of his 23 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 16 times, including 11 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 14 Mountain West titles and record 17 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, SDSU has twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured 11 MW championships (seven regular season, four tournament).

In his first year on The Mesa (1999-00) the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep. The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

SAN DIEGO - Darrion Trammell hit three 3-pointers during a 29-10 run to open the second half and finished with 18 points for No. 19 San Diego State, which beat Cal State Fullerton 80-57 Monday night to begin one of the most eagerly anticipated seasons in school history.

Fellow newcomer Jaedon LeDee and Lamont Butler scored 11 points apiece and Nathan Mensah had 10 for the Aztecs, who won their 10th straight opener and their 17th in 18 seasons.

Vincent Lee scored 11 and Jalen Harris 10 for the Titans, the defending Big West Conference champions.

SDSU was the preseason pick to win the Mountain West Conference and Trammell was selected preseason newcomer of the year.

"I just play basketball," Trammell said. "All the accolades are nice but I came here to win. I have bigger things on my mind, tournament dreams. I'm all about the team."

Trammell made a 3-pointer to open the game. The Titans stayed close throughout the first half and the Aztecs made only two shots in the last five minutes to lead 32-25 at halftime.

But SDSU came to life in the opening minutes of the second half. Trammell hit a 3 and Keshad Johnson and Matt Bradley had slam dunks for a 44-29 lead that prompted the Titans to call a timeout. SDSU continued to pour it on with two more 3-pointers from Trammell and 3s from Butler and Micah Parrish. The Aztecs pushed the lead to 61-35 with 11:25 to go.

"We can wear teams down," Trammell said. "We've got a very deep team. Everyone has their own thing that they do. That's definitely going to carry us deep all year."

San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said the Aztecs had too many turnovers in the first half so he called more set plays in the second half to get them into a pattern.

"I don't want to do that. I want to run, I want to play free and I want them to make better decisions on the break," Dutcher said. "I think that will come as the season goes on."

SAN DIEGO - Jaedon LeDee scored 26 points and Darrion Trammell added 21 to help No. 19 San Diego State beat rival BYU 82-75 on Friday night.

San Diego State led by two with 2 minutes left when Trammell hit a 3-pointer with the shot clock winding down to almost zero. BYU then respond to get back within two with 83 seconds left.

LeDee sealed the game with a layup that gave the Aztecs a five-point lead.

Spencer Johnson scored 17 points and Rudi Williams added 15 for BYU.

After a lackluster opening half, the Aztecs turned up their offense in the back-and-forth second half, but were unable to solve BYU's aggressive defense until the final minutes.

"I don't know if it was poetry, but it was hard-fought basketball," said Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher. "We've worn teams down in the first couple of games. We continue to play hard, even though we don't play great all the time. We just made enough plays to get a win today."

For BYU, San Diego State proved to be "a different animal" than Idaho State, the Cougars' season-opening opponent last Monday, reflecting Pope's post-game warning to his team after that tight five-point win.

Last Monday, when San Diego State opened its season with a convincing 80-57 win at home over Cal State Fullerton, 14 of its roster players saw action. That wasn't the case against BYU, as Dutcher went with his core starting lineup, with only four subs coming off the bench.

The Aztecs more than lived up to their preseason billing as a Top 20 team, which gave their raucous 2,500-strong student cheering section known as "The Show" plenty to cheer and jeer about.

Despite the loss, the Cougars retain a 50-26 overall advantage against SDSU. A year from now, the two teams are scheduled to meet in a non-conference game after BYU's move to the Big 12, ending 11 seasons in the WCC.

Friday night's first half ended with BYU holding a 4-point lead, 40-36 lead.

STANFORD, Calif. — Jaedon LeDee scored 10 of his 14 points in the first half and No. 17 San Diego State beat Stanford for the first time, 74-62 on Tuesday night.

The Aztecs (3-0) never trailed to improve to 1-4 in the series. "We play pretty hard against anybody we play," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "I told them that we're on a really hard five-game stretch — BYU at home, Stanford at home and then three in Maui. Let's see how we do, if we're ready for that kind of challenge."

Lamont Butler had 11 points and six assists and Keshad Johnson added 11 points for the Aztecs.

Spencer Jones led Stanford (1-2) with 15 points, six rebounds and three blocks. Harrison Ingram had 11 points.

"We knew coming in it would be a battle and we'd have to play our A game to be able to get there," Stanford coach Jerod Haase said. "I don't think we played our A game but I also think that they certainly deserve a lot of credit for playing really well."

San Diego State had a 10-0 run early to open a 17-5 advantage and led by 17 in the first half.

Stanford closed the half on a 6-0 spurt to cut it to 41-30. The Cardinal later had a 10-2 run to get within six with 10:10 remaining, but the Aztecs answered with a 16-6 surge to put it out of reach.

"We kind of jumped on them in that first half a little bit and then they kind of fought back, as I thought," LeDee said. "We knew that they were going to fight back. They're at home. They're talented. It's just a little adversity for us. But we just kept wearing them down."

San Diego State scored 21 points off 17 Stanford turnovers. The Aztecs shot 51% from the field, making 8 of 21 3-point attempts. "I was most pleased that our point guards had 12 assists and one turnover," Dutcher said. "That kind of play from the point guard position will get you wins."

BIG PICTURE

The Aztecs were victorious in their first road game of the season, fighting off every Stanford run in the second half. San Diego State displayed its depth and balance offensively, along with its usual tenacious defense. The Aztecs showed why they were picked first in the preseason Mountain West poll.

Darrion Trammell of SDSU then made two free throws with 1:49 left.

In a crazy sequence with more than 13 minutes left, the Buckeyes closed within four points but then saw SDSU extend the lead back to double digits. Sensabaugh made a 3-pointer and there was a foul away from the play allowing the Buckeyes to keep the ball, and McNeil made a jumper to pull OSU to 51-47.

But the Aztecs came back to score eight points in less than a minute to jump ahead 59-47. Parrish had consecutive 3s and Butler had a steal and fed Aguek Arop for a layup. The Aztecs extended the run to 17-5 on a 3-pointer by Seiko.

Bradley made 4 of 6 3-pointers, including one to start the second half for a 40-26 lead. He scored 10 points in the first half, when the Aztecs missed their first eight shots and fell behind 5-0 before Seiko made a jumper about five minutes in to get SDSU on the board. Bradley began to heat up, including hitting two 3-pointers.

Seiko and Lamont Butler also hit big 3s to help the Aztecs to a 37-26 halftime lead.

Pelle Larsson sank a 3-pointer, Trammell missed a 3 and Oumar Ballo followed with a three-point play to put Arizona up 46-42. The Wildcats upped their lead to 10 on a Ballo free throw with 11:43 remaining and pushed it to 71-56 on a Cedric Henderson jumper with 6:58 left to play.

Ramey, a graduate transfer from the University of Texas, hit all five of his 3-point shots in his second game with Arizona. Kerr added five assists. Ballo finished with 12 points and nine rebounds before fouling out. Henderson scored 10.

Trammell topped San Diego State with 21 points. Micah Parrish scored 10.

Arizona, which came in leading the nation shooting 62.9% from the floor, shot 58.6% against the Aztecs and made 9 of 20 from beyond the arc. SDSU shot 38% overall and made only 3 of 19 from distance.

"Players are just tired from the flight. It is a long trip," Mensah said of the journey back from Hawaii and having to face a tough Anteaters squad. "It was not just a hangover from Maui but also we played good competition in UC Irvine."

DJ Davis scored 28 points to lead the Anteaters (6-2), who had a three-game winning streak snapped.

"UC Irvine's guards are dynamic," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "You go out there to take away the three away, you can't give him (Davis) the three."

Davis was 4-for-6 on threes despite the attempt by the Aztecs defense to limit his perimeter shots.

"He shot so far away I couldn't believe it," Dutcher said of Davis. "So you are going to give him angles. You are guarding him 30 feet from the hoop and he is going to get by you."

It was a tight game throughout, especially in the second half when the lead see-sawed between the teams. San Diego State maintained a small advantage throughout the first half and lead 32-30 at the break.

"The first game after Hawaii is always tough. I have been around long enough to know that. It's super tough when you schedule a team that is 6-1 and playing really good basketball," Dutcher said. "We made a lot of mistakes in the first half. Offensively too careless with the ball."

Matt Bradley had 14 points for the Aztecs and had the crucial assist to Parrish for the game-winner.

"Matt is one of the best passers on the team. I know last year he led the team in assists and he doesn't get enough credit for that," Parrish said. "He is a brilliant passer when he doesn't have a shot." San Diego State shot 6-for-21 for three-point shooting but hit several huge threes in the final minutes, which clinched the win.

SAN DIEGO - Matt Bradley scored 19 points and No. 22 San Diego State beat Troy 60-55 on Monday night.

Darrion Trammell made a layup in traffic, converted two free throws and forced a key steal in the final three minutes to seal the win for the Aztecs (7-2).

"Another hard-fought game," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "The schedule has been tough on us, there is no question about that. We knew Troy was good, they had our full attention."

Aamer Muhammad scored 21 points for the Trojans (6-4).

"Muhammad was dynamic," Dutcher said. "He created space and shoots it. Whether we had a guard or a big on him, you weren't doing anything about that."

Both teams had been averaging about 80 points per game. Troy relied on a pesky defense to limit the Aztecs to 4-for-22 shooting on 3-pointers.

"Troy took away all of our entries, they do a great job denying," Dutcher said. "We were 12 of 13 from the line, that is really good free throw shooting in a close game so that was part of the win."

San Diego State's defense limited the Trojans to 32.8% shooting for the game. The Aztecs shot 41.5% from the floor.

"The key to the game is Troy hit seven 3s in the first half and if they would have made seven in the second half they would have won, but they only made two," Dutcher said. "We guarded like crazy tonight. ... Our defense won the game."

Troy played without guard Duke Miles and forward Nate Tshimanga, who were both in concussion protocol. Additionally, forward Lydell Geffrard left the game with an apparent right knee injury after playing only two minutes in the first half.

"We are grinding games out -- we have had a hard schedule. We have played a lot of great teams," Trammell said. "But we are a tough group of guys, so it is going to pay off."

The Aztecs won points in the paint versus Troy, 30-16, allowing them to get just enough offense to win.

"We our pulling out a lot of tough games," Bradley said. "It's been tough but I'm happy with our record and where we sit right now."

PHOENIX — Aidan Mahaney scored 20 points, Alex Ducas added 17 and Saint Mary's knocked off No. 22 San Diego State 68-61 in the Jerry Colangelo Classic on Saturday.

Two of the nation's best defensive teams got offensive early at the home of the NBA's Phoenix Suns before the Gaels (8-3) tightened up to take a nine-point second-half lead.

The Aztecs (7-3) took their turn clamping down to pull within 59-56, but Saint Mary's quickly pushed the lead back to seven. Saint Mary's hit 7 of 8 free throws down the stretch to knock off the Aztecs a week after playing a close game again top-ranked Houston.

Matt Bradley had 13 points and Keshad Johnson added 12 to lead San Diego State, which shot 3 of 15 from the 3-point arc.

Saint Mary's arrived in the desert No. 8 in defensive efficiency according to KenPom.com, and San Diego State was No. 18.

So, of course, the game turned into an offensive showdown.

Ducas scored in a variety of ways, putting up 10 points in the first 7 1/2 minutes and 14 by halftime. Johnson took his turn next, scoring eight quick points, and the Gaels shot 13 of 24 in the first half.

San Diego State made 13 of 26 shots in the first half, the last Micah Parrish's 3-point half-court heave at the buzzer to tie the game at 35-all.

Saint Mary's started clamping down defensively in the second half, holding San Diego State scoreless for more than five minutes to build a five-point lead. The Aztecs finally hit a shot, but went on another scoreless drought of nearly four minutes, falling behind 59-50 on a 3-pointer by Ducas.

San Diego State tried to fight back, but the Gaels pushed them away to pull out a key nonconference win.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State's men's basketball team, led by a game-high 19 points off the bench from Micah Parrish, defeated Kennesaw State 88-54 on Monday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

"Well, it felt great to be back in Viejas, we had a great crowd," Aztec head coach Brian Dutcher said. "They brought the energy and that's what I put on the board: we have to bring energy. Joining Parrish in double-digits were Darrion Trammell and Jaedon LeDee, who each finished with 14 points. LeDee was 10-for-11 from the free throw line and pulled down seven rebounds.

Up 18-14 with 11:03 to play in the first half, SDSU went on an 11-0 run over the succeeding 3:30 to take its first double digit lead, 29-14 and had a 14-point advantage going into the half.

The Aztecs put together another double-digit scoring run in the second half, 10-0, led by eight points from LeDee. San Diego State pushed its lead to 40 points with 5:11 to play before earning the 34-point win.

SDSU used a size advantage to outscore the Owls 40-to-16 in the paint and 14-2 in second chance points.

SDSU outrebounded the Owls 39-28 with Nathan Mensah pulling down a game-high nine boards and added three blocked shots.

Kennesaw State was led by Kasen Jennings' 17 points.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State wrapped up non-conference play Tuesday with a 62-46 triumph over UC San Diego at Viejas Arena.

With the victory, the Aztecs remain unbeaten in 13 all-time meetings against the Tritons.

Darrion Trammell was the lone player to reach double figures for SDSU (9-3), finishing with 18 points on 6-of-11 from the floor, including a 4-of-6 from beyond the arc, while Jaedon LeDee grabbed a career-high 12 rebounds.

However, both teams witnessed their share of offensive struggles, with the Aztecs shooting 36.1 percent from the floor (22-61) compared to the Tritons' 31.6 percent pace (18-57).

SDSU connected on 10-of-24 tries from three-point range (41.7 percent), while UCSD (5-7) was just 5-for-28 (17.9 percent) on its long-range attempts.

In addition, the Scarlet and Black maintained a sizeable 47-31 advantage in rebounds and a 17-10 edge in points off turnovers to help fuel their win.

The Aztecs never trailed, opening a 11-0 lead through the first five-plus minutes, capped by a Keshad Johnson dunk.

SDSU limited the Tritons to 22.2 percent shooting (6-27) in the first half, including draining just 2-of-15 from three-point range (13.3 percent).

Conversely, Trammell shouldered much of the Aztecs' offensive burden, nailing triples on three consecutive possessions late in the half to give the hosts a commanding 35-16 lead by intermission.

SDSU missed its first nine shots of the second period; however, UCSD could draw no closer than 13 points after Justin DeGraaf's layup cut the margin to 35-22 with 15 minutes remaining.

Unfazed, the Aztecs responded with a 16-3 blitz to quash any Triton comeback hopes. Nathan Mensah scored all six of his points during the run, including his first trey of the season at the 10:05 mark to give SDSU its largest lead of the night at 51-26.

In addition to Trammell's production, which included four assists, the Aztecs received nine points from Johnson, while Matt Bradley and Micah Parrish pulled down six rebounds apiece, with the latter notching a collegiate best.

After a slow start, UCSD's Bryce Pope scored 16 of his game-high 20 points on 7-of-11 shooting in the second half, while Francis Nwaokorie totaled nine points and seven boards for the Tritons in the loss.

SAN DIEGO - Senior guard Matt Bradley scored a season-high 27 points as the San Diego State Aztecs leaned on his strong shooting night to beat Air Force 71-55 on Thursday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

The win was SDSU's 15th straight at Steve Fisher Court, the eighth longest streak in program history, and improved to 31-1 in its last 31 games played at home. In addition, the Aztecs have defeated Air Force for the 16th consecutive time in Viejas Arena and overall is 20-3 in the venue against the Falcons.

Bradley finished the game 9-of-12 from the field, including 6-of-7 from the bonus distance and 3-of-5 from the line. He added three rebounds and an assist and a steal without turning the ball over. He the eighth Aztec, since at least the 1996-97 season, to score at least 25 points without committing a turnover. Of those eight, he played the fewest minutes (31).

The Aztecs (10-3, 1-0 Mountain West) started the game knocking down five of its first six shots to take a 12-2 lead capped off by a Bradley first of a career-high six 3-pointers. With just over 12 minutes left in the half, Bradley continued his hot start when he drove into the lane, beat the first defender, and then acrobatically put the ball in the basket to extend the Aztecs lead to 21-9.

Air Force (9-5, 0-1 Mountain West) would respond with an 11-4 run of its own to cut its deficit to five points with six minutes to go before the half. Bradley would again respond with another triple, his third of the half, to push the Aztecs' advantage to 28-20. After a Jaedon LeDee bucket on the next possession the lead back to double digits, 30-20. Adam Seiko would hit the Aztecs fifth triple of the half, and SDSU took a 36-23 advantage into the break.

Both teams would find buckets hard to come by to begin the second half, but Bradley put the Aztecs offense into high gear again. He sank a 3-pointer on back-to-back possessions to push the lead to a game-high 19 points, 44-25, with 15:13 left in the game.

The teams would trade buckets over the next few minutes, and each time Air Force would close the gap, SDSU would respond with a triple. First it was Micah Parrish nailing a corner three, before Seiko re-established the 19-point advantage on his second trey of the night to put the Aztecs up 59-40 with 7:58 remaining.

Bradley would sink his sixth and final three with just over four minutes to play, putting SDSU out front 66-47 and from there the Aztecs finished the game with a 71-55 victory.

LAS VEGAS — Matt Bradley surpassed 2,000 career points and the Aztecs had another strong offensive performance on Saturday afternoon, en-route to a 76-67 win over UNLV at the Thomas and Mack Center.

The Aztecs (11-3, 2-0 MW) and Rebels (11-3, 0-2 MW) traded buckets early on, with Bradley and Lamont Butler scoring five early points each, before UNLV used an 8-0 run to take a 17-10 lead with just over 12 minutes to play in the first half.

Aguek Arop ended the Rebels run with a dunk off a nice feed from Darrion Trammell to make it a 17-12 game. Trammell would get on the scoresheet himself a few minutes later, connecting on a tough three pointer, making it a two point UNLV lead, 19-17, with 10 minutes to go in the half.

Arop would tie the game at 21-21 and then give the Aztecs the lead 23-21 when he scored on two straight possessions before Trammell made another three to give the Aztecs a 26-23 lead with 7:02 left in the first half. Bradley then sank his second triple of the game to give the Aztecs a 31-23 lead, which capped a 14-2 San Diego State run to retake control of the game. That three gave Bradley 2,000 career points for his career, making him the eighth active player to reach that milestone.

San Diego State would end the half on a 34-16 run over the final 12 minutes to take a 44-33 lead at the halftime break. Bradley finished the half with 14 points, while Arop was a perfect 5-5 from the field for 10 points.

Both teams would find scoring hard to come by to begin the second half, with only the Rebels able to sink a basket in the opening four minutes of the half. Arop then came through again, for his sixth bucket of the game, this one a monster slam to get the Aztecs on the board in the half, and still lead 48-36.

UNLV would then go on a 7-0 run to make it a 48-43 game with 12:30 left, before Bradley and Trammell would answer with a run of their own, sinking back-to-back threes, extending the Aztecs lead to 57-43.

The Rebels would go on another run to make it a five point game, 59-54, with 4:08 left before Bradley made two free throws to bring the SDSU lead back to seven, 61-54. Trammell would then ice the game with another three with 1:40 to go to make it a 66-57 game. UNLV would result to fouling for the remainder of the game, but the Aztecs made their free throws to secure the 76-67 win.

LARAMIE, Wyo. — Lamont Butler scored a career-high 23 points, and the Aztecs played tough at altitude to earn an 80-75 win at Wyoming on Saturday afternoon.

The Aztecs (12-3, 3-0 MW) and Cowboys (5-10, 0-3 MW) traded buckets early on, with Butler scoring nine early points and was 3-3 from the three-point line as SDSU took a 14-11 lead early.

Wyoming would respond with a 7-2 run to take a 18-16 lead before Darrion Trammell hit another three for the Aztecs, who took a 19-18 lead with 12:36 left in the first half. San Diego State started the game 5-6 from beyond the arc.

SDSU would stretch the lead to seven, 31-24 with 9:40 remaining in the half when Adam Seiko sank another three. The teams would continue their hot shooting for the rest of the first half, and the Aztecs took a 43-42 lead into the halftime break. In total the Aztecs finished the half 17-29 (58.6%) from the field and 8-14 (57%) from behind the arc.

Wyoming would take an early second half lead, 48-47, with 17 minutes to go before Nathan Mensah made a contested basket at the rim to give SDSU a 49-48 lead. A few possessions later, Seiko picked off a pass and fed Micah Parrish who drilled the triple, giving the Aztecs a 54-50 lead with 15 minutes left in the game.

The Cowboys would respond with a 7-0 run of their own to take a 57-54 lead before Butler sank back-to-back triples, making it a 60-59 Aztecs advantage. Wyoming then took a 69-68 lead with 5:31 remaining before the Aztecs forced their 13th turnover of the game and followed that up with a Jaedon LeDee bucket down low to edge in front, 70-69. On the next possession, Matt Bradley drove to the basket and scored, giving SDSU a 72-69 lead with 3:54 remaining.

Bradley would come up clutch on the next possession to put the game out of reach for the Aztecs when he drained a three to give SDSU a 75-70 lead, and the Aztecs left Laramie with a 80-75 win.

Bradley and Butler finished with a combined 41 points in the win, and the Aztecs made 12 threes on Saturday afternoon.

SAN DIEGO – Matt Bradley had 17 points and 10 rebounds and Lamont Butler added 15 points for No. 23 San Diego State, which beat Nevada 74-65 Tuesday night to take sole possession of first place in the Mountain West Conference.

“We’ve got to hold onto it,” Bradley said. “We have a big target on our back now.”

The Aztecs (13-3, 4-0 MWC) dominated on both ends of Steve Fisher Court in a showdown between the last two undefeated teams in the conference to extend their winning streak to six games. Keshad Johnson added 11 points for SDSU, which has beaten Nevada nine straight times.

Nick Davidson had 17, Kenan Blackshear 12 and Jarod Lucas 11 or Nevada (14-4, 4-1), whose six-game winning streak was snapped.

SDSU led 65-43 with 9:10 left before Nevada began pressing in the closing minutes, forcing the Aztecs into turnovers and bad shots and allowing the close to single digits. SDSU didn’t make a field goal in the final 5:09.

“That was a great performance,” coach Brian Dutcher said. “I thanked them after the game for the last three minutes. I said if they’d have played 40 minutes like they did the whole game, then they wouldn’t need any coaching. I thanked them because now I get to coach them a little bit again. We’ll work on the press offense.”

The Aztecs marked their return to The AP Top 25 by dominating from the opening minute. Keshad Johnson had a steal and scored on an alley-oop slam dunk on a pass from Lamont Butler. Johnson and Butler hit consecutive 3-pointers to give the Aztecs a 10-0 lead and force Wolf Pack coach Steve Alford to take a timeout.

Johnson had a steal and slam dunk for a 42-23 lead late in the first half. It was 44-27 at halftime.

SDSU shot 50% while holding Nevada to 39.7%. The Aztecs outrebounded Nevada 33-29 and made 8 of 21 3-pointers.

BIG PICTURE

Nevada: The Wolf Pack committed three early turnovers in falling behind 10-0 and never recovered. They had six turnovers total in the first half and, although they enjoyed a height advantage, were outrebounded 19-13.

San Diego State: The Aztecs improved to 11-0 at home against Nevada in the MWC era and to 13-1 all-time at home against the Wolf Pack.

The Aztecs pulled within four points before Udeze scored inside. Mashburn hit a jumper and two free throws in the final 1:20.

SAN DIEGO — Adam Seiko drained seven three pointers, including six in the first half, and the Aztecs beat Utah State on Wednesday night, 85-75. Seiko finished seven of nine from bonus distance and totaling a career-high 25 points.

Seiko’s seven 3-pointers tie David Abramowitz (Feb. 10, 2000 vs. Utah) for the most in a game by an Aztec coming off the bench since at least the 1996-97 season.

In addition to Seiko, it was the Keshad Johnson show early in the game. The junior forward set the tone with a monster block in the opening minute, had five points and three rebounds in the first four minutes, helping the Aztecs (16-4, 7-1 MW) to an early 7-3 lead. He would finish with his second double double in as many games, (11 points & 10 rebounds) and cracked double figure scoring for the fourth time in the last five games.

Up next it was Seiko who took over for the Aztecs. The senior made three straight from bonus distance to give the Aztecs an 18-11 lead with 11:40 remaining in the first half. He then hit his next two to give him five made threes over seven minutes played as the Aztecs lead ballooned to 17, 28-11 with 7:30 left in the opening stanza.

Utah State (16-5, 5-3 MW) would go on a run of their own to close the gap to 12, 39-27 with 1:30 left in the half, before Seiko hit his sixth triple in the first 20 minutes, tying his career-high. He finished the half a perfect 6-6 from deep and the Aztecs took a 42-27 lead into the break.

The Aggies would begin a comeback in the second half, and cut the Aztecs advantage to nine, 64-55 with just under 10 minutes left in the game. Micah Parrish then hit a deep three to give San Diego State a double-digit advantage again, this time 69-55 with 7:28 left in the game.

Utah State would make another run to cut it to six, 72-66, but Darrion Trammell made a basket to put the SDSU back up eight with 3:20 left. A few possessions later, Lamont Butler drilled another three, San Diego State’s 12th of the night, putting SDSU up by double digits again, 79-68 with 2:05 remaining.

Down eight with 1:05 left, the Aggies were forced to foul, but the Aztecs knocked down their last six free throw attempts and emerged 85-75 winners.

The victory is the 16th for San Diego State in the last 22 games against the Aggies and in Viejas Arena, SDSU has defeated Utah State in each of its last nine meetings.

SAN DIEGO — Keshad Johnson scored 16 points and had eight rebounds, while Matt Bradley added 14 points, as the Aztecs beat San Jose State 72-51 on Saturday evening.

In the opening 12 minutes the Aztecs (17-1, 8-1 MW) limited the Spartans (13-9, 4-5 MW) to 5-17 from the field and 1-8 from deep.

Aguek Arop got the crowd into it with a nice pass to Jaedon LeDee who slammed it home to spark an Aztec run, and SDSU took a 22-13 lead with 6:20 left in the first half. Johnson then had another slam, putting the Aztecs up double digits, 24-13.

On the defensive end both Johnson and Arop had blocks in the first half. Arop’s came with just under 3 minutes to go in the half, keeping the Aztec advantage in the double digits, 27-14. Then with 1:48 left in the first half, Darrion Trammell picked up a loose ball on the defensive end, threw it ahead to Micah Parrish, who threw a perfect lob to Johnson for his second slam of the night.

SDSU held the Spartans to 0-14 from the field in the final 10 minutes of the first half, taking a 33-14 lead into the halftime break. The Aztecs held San Jose State to 5-20 (25%) from the field in the first half and finished the first half on a 25-3 run.

San Diego State would open the second half on another run, outscoring the Spartans 13-5 over the opening 4:14 in the half, taking a 46-19 lead. During that span Matt Bradley scored six points, while Nathan Mensah added another dunk for the Aztecs.

San Jose State would then punch back, and go on a 18-4 run of their own, cutting the deficit to 51-37 with 10:40 left in the game. The Spartans would continue to chip away at the lead, and made it a 13 point game with 5:31 to play, 59-48.

A few minutes later, Adam Seiko, fresh off of his career-high 25 points on Thursday, drilled a three to give the Aztecs a 66-48 lead and they never looked back from there. Lamont Butler followed that up with a three on the next possession and put SDSU up 69-48 with 3:00 to play. Between the 6:45 mark and the 3:00 mark the Aztecs did not give up a point, and went on a 13-0 run to reestablish control of the game.

RENO, Nev. — Jarod Lucas scored 26 points and Will Baker had 19 points and eight rebounds as Nevada beat No. 22 San Diego State 75-66 on Tuesday night.

Kenan Blackshear added 18 points and seven assists for the Wolf Pack (17-6, 7-3 MW), who won their second consecutive home game against a ranked opponent for the first time in program history. Nevada defeated then-No. 25 New Mexico 97-94 in double overtime last week.

Matt Bradley scored 16 points to lead the Aztecs (17-5, 8-2 MW).

Neither team had more than a three-point lead from the 9:27 mark of the second half until Blackshear made a layup to give Nevada a 67-62 advantage with 1:57 to play.

The Wolf Pack went 6 for 6 from the free throw line in the final 69 seconds to seal it.

Nevada's victory snapped SDSU's nine-game winning streak in the series.

Baker scored five points as Nevada opened the second half with a 14-5 spurt to take a 42-35 lead. But then Lamont Butler drained a 3-pointer and Aguek Arop made a layup as SDSU quickly answered and tied it at 42 with 12:52 to play.

SDSU's Darrion Trammell was assessed a technical foul in the opening minutes when Lucas was knocked down after a whistle in front of the Nevada bench. Some jawing ensued and San Diego State coaches had to restrain some Aztecs players from leaving their bench.

Lucas and Bradley each had 11 points at the 7:23 mark of the first half, more than half their team's total in a 20-20 game.

Lucas, a senior who transferred from Oregon State following the 2021-22 season, scored seven points during a 10-1 Nevada run that erased the Aztecs' 11-4 lead. But neither team had more than a four-point edge the rest of the half and SDSU took a 30-28 advantage into the break.

SAN DIEGO — Nathan Mensah scored 17 points as No. 22 San Diego State raced past Boise State 72-52 Friday night in a showdown of the Mountain West Conference's top two teams.

Keshad Johnson added 10 for SDSU (18-5, 9-2), which regained sole possession of first place. Bradley came in leading the Aztecs at 13.2 points per game but didn't score until making a jumper with 9:16 to play, finishing with three points. Trammell came in averaging 11.1 and didn't score until making a shot earlier in the second half, finishing with four.

Max Rice scored 16 for Boise State (18-6, 8-3), which was without its point guard Marcus Shaver Jr., who was out with a high ankle sprain.

The Aztecs raced to a 43-21 halftime lead despite getting zero points from Bradley and Trammell. Mensah led the way with 12 points and Adam Seiko had nine.

Mensah had six points during a 14-0 run that carried the Aztecs to a 29-10 lead with 5:47 left before halftime. Seiko made two 3-pointers, including a 27-footer to cap the run just before a timeout.

The combination of SDSU's defense and the absence of Shaver was too much for the Broncos. BSU shot only 33.3% in the first half and was called for a 10-second violation late in the first half. The Aztecs blocked three shots in the first 20 minutes, two by Aguek Arop and one by Mensah.

Mensah blocked a shot with three minutes left that set up a slam dunk by Johnson on an alley-oop pass from Seiko for a 70-50 lead.

Mensah drew 10 fouls and made 9 of 12 free throws.
