OFF THE BOUNCE (entering the 2022-23 season)

- San Diego State enters its 102nd season of basketball, its 53rd at the Division I level and the sixth under the direction of Brian Dutcher on Monday evening, when the Aztecs play host to Cal State Fullerton.
- The Aztecs and Titans are meeting for the 33rd time in school history, with the Aztecs claiming 22 of the previous contests. From Jan. 18, 1964 to Jan. 4, 1969, San Diego State won 10 straight games against Cal State Fullerton. That 10-game win streak is tied for the seventh longest in SDSU program history against a single opponent.
- San Diego State has won 15 straight season-openers against unranked teams, a run dating back to the start of the 2005-06 season. SDSU's last loss to an unranked opponent on opening night came on Nov. 19, 2004, when it came out on the wrong end of a double-overtime 80-72 defeat at the hands of UC Santa Barbara.
- San Diego State has won nine straight season openers and 16 of the last 17 to begin a campaign. The lone blemish during the stretch came at the start of the 2012-13 season when SDSU fell to No. 9/9 Syracuse on the USS Midway. Taking into account that the Syracuse game was played outdoors, on the flight deck of the USS Midway, the Aztecs have come out victorious in its last 16 season openers played indoors.
- The Aztecs are currently in an 12-game winning streak in season openers that have taken place at home.
- San Diego State, which in 2021-22 reached the Mountain West championship game for the fifth time in head coach Brian Dutcher's five seasons, looks for its unprecedented 15th Mountain West men's basketball title. Entering the 2022-23 season, San Diego State has won eight regular season and six Mountain West tournament titles.
- For the fourth time since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is ranked in the preseason AP Top 25 Poll. The Aztecs No. 19 ranking in the initial poll is the second highest in program history, trailing only the 2014-15 preseason poll in which it was No. 16. Since the start of the 2010-11 SDSU has appeared in the AP poll for 89 weeks, more than any program in the state of California, ahead of UCLA (68 weeks), Saint Mary's (44 weeks), Southern California (35 weeks) and California (11 weeks).
- San Diego State owns a 76-16 record (82.6 percent) since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. That is the third best record in the nation, trailing only Gonzaga (90-7) and Baylor (81-13).
- San Diego State prepped for the regular season with a 102-52 victory over San Diego Christian College. The Aztec defense was in regular-season form, limiting the opposition to 21 points in the first half and only allowing consecutive made field goals on four occasions during the contest.
- Senior transfer **Jaedon LeDee** announced his presence with a team-high 13 points on 4-of-6 shooting from the field, while adding a game-high nine rebounds in just under 17 minutes of action.
- Senior forward **Keshad Johnson** also contributed 13 points in an uber efficient 6-of-7 from the floor, including 1-of-2 from the bonus distance, three rebounds, four assists and a steal in just over 17 minutes.
- Senior guard **Matt Bradley** was the third Aztecs to compile 13 points on 4-of-9 from the field and made 5-of-6 free throw attempts. He added a rebound and an assist in the win.

- Among the freshmen, **Elijah Saunders**, was the top point producer with 11 on 5-of-6 shooting. He grabbed five rebounds and had a pair of assists in 14-plus minutes on the floor.
- **Brian Dutcher** enters his sixth season as San Diego State's head coach and his 24th season on the Aztec sidelines. In his five seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to four conference titles, a 119-40 overall record, has been named the national coach of the year and twice named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

AZTECS NO. 19 IN INITIAL AP TOP 25 POLL

The San Diego State men's basketball team is ranked No. 19 in the Associated Press' preseason Top 25 poll, garnering 394 points. It marks the fourth time in program history SDSU has earned inclusion on the initial AP poll and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign. The Aztecs are the only program in the Mountain West to appear in the AP's initial 2022-23 poll.

In its three previous appearances in the AP preseason poll, San Diego State was ranked No. 25 and received 158 points to start the 2010-11 season, was No. 20 with 463 points before the 2012-13 season, and No. 16, garnering 560 points, to open the 2014-15 campaign.

The appearance marks the first time since the 2020-21 season the Aztecs have found themselves among the AP Top 25. On that occasion the team was ranked No. 16 in the poll, which was published on March 15, 2021, the final poll of that season.

Overall, the Aztecs have been ranked in the AP Poll 89 weeks, which is the most by any team in the state of California since the start of the 2010-11 season: ahead of UCLA's 68, Saint Mary's 44, Southern California's 35, and California's 11.

Among Mountain West program's total of weeks in the AP Poll since 2010-11, San Diego State's 89 are more than three times more than Nevada and its 28 weeks. Others in the league who have appeared in the poll in that time frame are UNLV (27 weeks), New Mexico (25 weeks), Colorado State (10 weeks) and Boise State (two weeks).

Possible opponents on SDSU's schedule who appeared in the first AP poll are Creighton (No. 9), Arkansas (No. 10), Arizona (No. 17) and Texas Tech (No. 25).

NOW YOU KNOW...

From January 18, 1964 to January 4, 1969, San Diego State swept all 10 games between the Aztecs and Cal State Fullerton. That 10-game win streak is tied for the seventh longest in SDSU program history against a single opponent.

SDSU and Titans have played to overtime on three occasions in 32 meetings. Those three overtime games are tied for the 10th most frequent among San Diego State opponents.

COACHES POLL RANKS SAN DIEGO STATE NO. 20 IN THE PRESEASON

- For the third time in program history and first since the 2014-15 campaign, San Diego State is ranked in the preseason USA Today Coaches Poll, slotting in at the No. 20 spot.
- The ranking matches the ranking the team garnered prior to the 2012-13 season. Ahead of playing in the 2014-15 season, SDSU was a program-best No. 17 in that year's preseason poll.

AZTECS ANNOUNCE FINAL TELEVISION PACKAGE

San Diego State has announced that Cox Communications' YurView network will televise six men's basketball home games, which were not included in its national television package. The games will be carried by YurView on Cox (channel 4/1004) and Spectrum (channel 4) in San Diego.

The games will also be streamed on the Mountain West Network, through a link at www.goaztecs.com.

Among the six games, Cal State Fullerton (Nov. 7), UC Irvine (Nov. 29), Occidental (Dec. 2), Troy (Dec. 2) and Kennesaw State (Dec. 12) are scheduled for a 7 p.m. PT tipoff with Brigham Young (Nov. 11) set for a 7:30 p.m. PT start.

With this announcement, all 16 San Diego State men's basketball regular-season home games will be televised.

OPENERS

- San Diego State opens its 102nd basketball season on The Mesa with a 68-33 (.673) record in season opening games, regardless of location.
- This is the 53rd season of Division I basketball at San Diego State and the Aztecs are 33-19 (.635) in DI season-opening games.
- San Diego State has won its last 17 home openers, regardless of if the game was the season opener.
- The Aztecs have won nine consecutive season openers, regardless of location.

AZTECS PREDICTED TO FINISH FIRST IN MOUNTAIN WEST PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

- San Diego State has won an unprecedented 14 Mountain West titles in men's basketball (eight regular season & six tournament), six more than any other Mountain West program, and despite not winning either the regular season and tournament crowns in 2021-22, but returning four starters, has been predicted to finish in first by a poll of the media that regularly cover the conference.
- SDSU has been predicted to finish either first or second in the Mountain West media's preseason poll in each of the last nine years.
- It is also the 14th time in the last 18 years that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the Mountain West's preseason poll.
- San Diego State received 16 of a possible 20 first place votes.
- The Aztecs have garnered at least one first-place vote in the preseason poll in eight of the last nine years.
- Complete Mountain West media preseason predicted order of finish in located in the column on page 4.

BRADLEY AND TRAMMELL EARN PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST HONORS

In addition to SDSU being predicted to win its Mountain West-record 15th league title in 2022-23, a pair of Aztec players, Matt Bradley and Darrin Trammell, were included on the conference's list of preseason honors. Bradley was included on the All-MW Team and Trammell was named the Newcomer of the Year by the media who regularly cover the Mountain West.

- Last season, Bradley was second-team NABC All-District 17, Mountain West Newcomer of the Year (coaches & media), first-team All-MW (coaches), second-team All-MW (media), MW All-Tournament Team, Two-Time MW Player of the Week & ESPN National Player of the Week (March 7), NCAA March Madness Player of the Week (Match 7).
- Bradley's 542 points in 2021-22, are the 14th most in a single season in the program's Division I era (since the start of the 1970-71 campaign) and he led the team in points, was second in assists (85), and rebounds (174) and third in steals (33).
- Bradley is the second Aztec to be named to the preseason All-Mountain West in the last three seasons, joining Matt Mitchell who was named to the team prior to the 2020-21 campaign. Mitchell went on to be named the Mountain West Player of the Year and a first-team performer following that season.
- In 2021-22, Bradley was one of nine players in the nation and the second Aztec since the start of the 1996-97 season, to shoot at least 43.8 percent from the field (minimum 425 shots attempts) & 40.1 percent from the bonus distance (minimum 142 shot attempts).
- Trammell is one of four players in Division I who totaled at least 539 points, dished out at least 157 assists and had a 1.73:1 assist-to-turn-over ratio last season, and if you add his 5-10 height to the mix, he is the only player to accomplish those statistics in 2021-22.
- Trammell ranked as the 5th most productive pick and roll scorer in the nation (6.9 ppg) according to Synergy Sports.
- Joining Malachi Flynn (2019-20) and Matt Bradley (2021-22), Trammell becomes the third Aztec in the last four seasons to be recognized by the media as the preseason Newcomer of the Year. Both Flynn and Bradley proved the prognosticators correct by earning the award when the season was complete.
- Complete Mountain West media preseason awards are located in the column on page 4.

BRADLEY INCLUDED ON JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LIST

- For the second time in as many years, Matt Bradley has been included on the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame's initial watch list for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, the most prestigious individual honor a collegiate shooting guard can earn.
- Bradley, one of 20 men's basketball players who have been included on the watch list, transferred to The Mesa from the University of California prior to the 2021-22 season and last year led the Aztecs in points per game (16.9), 3-pointers (57), free throws (113) and minutes (1,007). In addition, he ranked second on the squad in rebounds (174), assists (85), and was third in steals (33). His 542 points are the 15th most in a season in program history.
- The native of San Bernardino, Calif., returns in 2022-23 as the No. 4 scorer and the No. 5 rebounder in the Mountain West. He reached double-figure scoring 26 times last year and in those games the team was 20-6. He enjoyed 19 games of 15 or more points, 12 games of 20 or more, and a career-high 30-point game in a 73-66 victory at Wyoming, the only home loss the Cowboys suffered last season. At the conclusion of the year, he was named a second-team NABC All-District 17 performer, the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, first-team All-Mountain West, and was included on the Mountain West All-Tournament Team.
- A 6-4, 220-pound shooting guard, he has scored 1,831 points in 117 career games and is one of five players in the nation, who still have eligibility and will compete this year, to score at least that many points in the last four seasons.

TOP-25 FACTS

- San Diego State opens the 2022-23 season ranked No. 19 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. It is the fourth time that SDSU has been included in the AP top-25 preseason poll; all coming during the Dutcher/Fisher era, and is the second highest ranking for the program in the poll.

- The previous three occasions when San Diego State was ranked in the preseason poll by the AP voters was prior to the 2010-11 season when the Aztecs were initially No. 25; prior to the 2012-13 campaign, when SDSU was No. 20; and the most recent appearance before this year, was 2014-15 when the Scarlet and Black was No. 16, the program's highest ranking in the preseason poll.
- How important is the preseason ranking or what does it portend? The three previous Aztec teams which were ranked in the preseason AP poll, finished a combined 84-23, including a 44-3 mark in Viejas Arena. Each squad made at least the round of 32 in the NCAA tournament with the 2010-11 team reaching the Sweet 16 and finishing the season with a 34-3 record.
- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight (Dec. 2, 2013 to Dec. 15, 2014).
- Entering this season, the Aztecs have appeared in the AP Poll for 89 weeks, and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.
- **San Diego State's 89 appearances in the AP poll are the most of any school in California. (See box on page 5)**
- Prior to this season's ranking, the last time the Aztecs appeared in the AP poll was March 15, 2021, the final poll of the 2020-21 season, and the Aztecs were ranked No. 16.
- Since the start of the 2019-20 season San Diego State has appeared in the USA Today Coaches Poll 21 times, including this year's preseason ranking of No. 20.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 126-34 (.788) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but four of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 94 home games against those same 24 opponents, and also starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 83-11 (.883).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 460-324 (.587) overall.
- San Diego State opens the 2022-23 season hosting an in-state foe in Cal State Fullerton. In the history of that series, SDSU has won 22 of the 32 previous match-ups.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament 10 of the last 12 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and entering this season, San Diego State has the seventh-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 184-24 home record, winning 88.5 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2022-23 season kicking off, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 212 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 187-25 mark, including a 86-10 record against non-conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 139-20 at home, including a 61-9 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch (46-7 against non-top 25 non-conference foes).
- The Aztecs are 57-10 in their last 67 non-conference home games.

MORE HOME COOKING

- In the last two seasons, San Diego State is 27-3 at home, with an average scoring margin of +15.1 points. Of the 30 home games, 21 were decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs 11-game non-conference home court win streak, snapped on Dec. 18, 2020 by Brigham Young, is the seventh-longest in school history and longest since a 13-game win streak from Dec. 16, 2000 to Nov. 23, 2002.
- San Diego State is 34-4 in its last 38 home games dating back to Jan. 1, 2019.
- The Aztecs are 31-3 in their 34 Mountain West Conference home games since Jan. 24, 2018.
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on seven occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2019-20).

SERIES HISTORY VS. CAL STATE FULLERTON

- San Diego State leads in the all-time series with Cal State Fullerton, 22-10, and will be looking for its fourth straight win on its home floor against the Titans and its 14th in 18 total meetings on its home floor in the series.
- The last three match-ups, all in Viejas Arena and all Aztec wins, have resulted in a 66-56 decision last season (Dec. 8, 2022), a 82-68 win on Dec. 9, 2009, where Kawhi Leonard set career-highs with 23 points and 18 rebounds, and a 63-60 victory on Dec. 21, 2004.
- The series started in 1964 with the Aztecs winning the first 10 meetings and half of those match-ups coming on San Diego State's home court. Over the next dozen match-ups, from Jan. 4, 1969-to-Feb. 11, 1978, the Titans were more competitive in limiting SDSU to eight wins, and in the last 10 games Cal State Fullerton has reversed the trend earning six wins.
- In its 13 home wins, the Aztecs average margin of victory is 16.8 points, while its four losses have been by an average of 9.3 points.
- All-time series meetings against Cal State Fullerton can be found in the column on page 4.

SAN DIEGO STATE VS. THE BIG WEST

- San Diego State is 233-122 vs. current members of the Big West Conference and has won 31-straight match-ups against those conference opponents. The last time an Aztec team lost to a Big West opponent was a 71-63 defeat at Pacific on Nov. 25, 2009.
- On its home floor, the Aztecs have won its last 25 games against Big West opponents and have an average margin of victory of 16.0 points per game.
- The Aztecs are 30-2 at home against members of the Big West since the start of the 1999-00 season. Of those 30 victories, 22 have come by 10 or more points, including 11 of the last 13.
- This is the first of three match-ups against Big West opponents this season. Against those three teams: Cal State Fullerton, UC Irvine & UC San Diego, the Aztecs are a combined 45-17 (.723) and have won 18 straight.
- Overall San Diego State has won 65.6 percent (233-122) of its games against the current Big West teams (H: 152-48, A: 80-73, N: 1-1).

SAN DIEGO - Three Aztecs scored in double figures and the San Diego State men's basketball team hit a season-best eight three pointers in a 66-56 victory over the Cal State Fullerton Titans on Wednesday night in Viejas Arena.

"I know I've said this before and I'm gonna say it again. 'It's hard to win a college basketball game,'" Aztec head coach Brian Dutcher said. "I don't care where you're playing, who you're playing, it's hard to win a game. And to our credit, we found a way to win. Everybody deals with adversity. You know, not having Lamont (Butler); Tairou (Daibate) is out; AG (Aguek Arop), he couldn't go. At our pregame meal today, Josh (Tomaic) said he didn't think he could play because his hip was bothering him. He missed two days of practice and just went to walk-through today and he found a way to get it out and give us valuable minutes when Keshad got in foul trouble. So, can we play better? 100 percent we can play better. But did we play well enough to win tonight? Yes, we did. And so, I'm happy with that."

Matt Bradley led the offensive charge with his second consecutive game with 22 points. He also chipped in with a share of the team lead with three assists and added two rebounds and a steal. Trey Pulliam finished with 15 points, career-bests with seven boards and four steals as well as three assists and a block. Adam Seiko with 11 points, his first double digit scoring effort of the year and chipped in with three rebounds, two steals and an assist.

Leading by a point, 52-51 with 3:57 to play, Bradley took over. He made the second and third of three straight buckets from the San Bernardino native, and he then assisted on a Seiko 3-pointer to give San Diego State (6-3) a six-point cushion which it pushed to double digits by the final horn.

The Aztecs limited the Cal State Fullerton (4-5) to 38.9 percent shooting in the game; the sixth time in eight games this season SDSU has held its opponent to less than 40 percent from the floor. San Diego State equaled a season-best with 15 assists and used those on 24 made baskets.

Both its 11 steals and 16 turnovers forced are the second most in a game this year by the Aztecs and led to 21 points for San Diego State. The Titan offense was led by Tray Maddox Jr.'s 15 points and Vincent Lee topped the squad with seven rebounds.

DUTCHER KEEPS THE BALL ROLLING...AND ROLLING

Brian Dutcher has been on The Mesa for 23 seasons, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time he's experienced 505 victories, 14 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 15 postseason tournaments, including 10 NCAA appearances and a pair of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014).

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured four Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each of his five years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first five seasons.
- His 119 wins in his first five seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first five campaigns.
- **His 119 wins to date are the most of any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.**

San Diego State 102, San Diego Christian 52

SAN DIEGO - The No. 19/20 San Diego State men's basketball team opened their 2022-23 season on Tuesday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena with a 102-52 exhibition win over San Diego Christian College.

SDSU had four players in double figures, led by a triumvirate of seniors, Matt Bradley, Keshad Johnson and Jaedon LeDee, who all finished with a team-high 13 points.

In addition to his scoring output, LeDee pulled down a game-high nine rebounds in 16:44 of court time. Johnson was an uber efficient 6-of-7 from the floor, including 1-of-2 from the bonus distance, and he also had four assists and one steal, playing a total of 17:15.

While the Aztecs would go on to dominate the Hawks, it was San Diego Christian who led 4-2 at the first media timeout. After that San Diego State went on a 15-2 run, highlighted by a LeDee 3-pointer to push the lead to 17-6 with just under 12 minutes to go in the half.

A few minutes later, Johnson stretched SDSU's advantage to double-digits when he threw down a ferocious dunk off a pin-point pass from Lamont Butler. The bucket put SDSU 24-14 with 7:58 to go before the intermission, and a 20-7 run to end the half sent the teams to the break with the Aztecs out in front 44-21. Butler and fellow starting point guard combined to dish out 10 assists and commit only four turnovers, while also picking up seven steals and 12 points.

In the second half, San Diego State eliminated all doubt.

On 23-of-35 shooting (65.7 percent), the Aztecs scored 58 points in the final 20 minutes, led by nine points from both Bradley and Elijah Saunders. Saunders, a freshman who was playing in his first game as an Aztec, was perfect from the floor in the final period, going 4-4 and finishing 5-of-6 for the game. His final bucket of the night was a 3-pointer that stretched the SDSU's lead to 91-41 with 5:36 left to play.

San Diego State would cruise from there, getting valuable court time for all 17 players on the roster and beat San Diego Christian, 102-52. The Aztecs totaled 24 assists on 38 buckets and scored 38 points on 26 Hawks turnovers. SDSU also had a 43-26 advantage on the boards.

- Became the 37th Aztec to score at least 30 points in a game when he totaled 30 at Wyoming (2/28).
- Led the team in scoring 18 times (14-4), in assists 13 times (8-5) & rebounds nine times (7-2).

Senior Forward **Nathan Mensah**

2021-22 - Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, Mountain West All-Defensive Team, Third-Team All-MW

- Is utilizing the extra year of eligibility offered by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Ranks No. 3 on the program's list for career blocked shots (171) and has averaged 1.6 blocks per game in his 107 career games. At that pace, he can pass Leonard Allen (1982-85), who is No. 2 with 214 blocks, in 27 games. The program leader in career blocked shots is Skylar Spencer who swatted 303 shots in his Aztec career (2013-16).
- Last season, was one of five players nationally who are 6-10 or taller to block at least 71 shots and make at least one 3-pointer.
- Among seven double-digit scoring games in 2021-22, he established a career-high vs. UC San Diego (12/22) with 19 points.
- Six of his 15 career double-digit rebounding games came in 2021-22 led by a pair of 13 rebound games: vs. Saint Mary's (12/17) and vs. San Jose State (2/25).
- Equaled a career-high with seven offensive boards vs. Boise State (3/12) in the championship game of the Mountain West tournament.

- Was the only Aztec true freshman (2020-21) to start back-to-back games since Nathan Mensah on March 15 & 16, 2019 and is just the third freshman in the last five seasons to start a game for SDSU (Matt Mitchell & Nathan Mensah).
- A starter in 25 of his 27 appearances last year.
- Averaged 7.3 points, 2.1 rebounds and 2.1 assists in 25.4 minutes per outing in 2021-22.

Brian Dutcher enters his sixth season as San Diego State head men's basketball coach, building on the previous five years in which he led the Aztecs to five title games in Mountain West tournament, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th & 14th Mountain West crowns, and to a bid to the NCAA tournament three times. He is the only coach in the 101-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first five seasons. His 119 victories in five seasons (119-40) are the most for any Division I head coach whose first year guiding his current program was 2017-18 and the accompanying win percentage, 74.8 percent, is the highest for any head basketball coach in San Diego State history.

Dutcher has been recognized twice, following the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons, with Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year in both those years as well. In addition, Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year distinction following the 2019-20 campaign and was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naimsmith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

His teams have faced top-25 ranked opponents on 15 occasions and posted a 9-6 record (60.0 percent) and includes wins over Gonzaga, UCLA and Arizona State as well as Nevada (four times) and Colorado State (twice). Since the start of the 2018-19 season, his Aztecs are 4-2 against Pac-12 opponents and 8-4 in multi-team events in season. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, SDSU has the 14th best home win percentage in the nation (88.3 percent), and in the last three years, San Diego State has posted a 91.1-win percentage (41-4) in Viejas Arena, the ninth best in the nation.

The team's success on the court is reflected in the honors his players have earned under his tutelage. In 2020 Malachi Flynn was a consensus All-American, the third Aztecs to earn that honor and the following season Matt Mitchell was recognized by the Associated Press with the All-American moniker.

San Diego State put a player on the USBWA's All-District IX first team in 2020 (Flynn) and 2021 (Mitchell). The NABC has bestowed its All-District 17 honors seven times to an Aztec in the last five years. In 2019, Jalen McDaniels earned first team designation. Flynn, Yannik Weitzell were first team and Mitchell was second team in 2020. In 2021, Mitchell and Jordan Schakel earned first team and second team honors, respectively and in 2022 Matt Bradley was a second team performer.

Within the Mountain West, Flynn was named the 2020 Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year and a member of the All-Defensive Team. In the same season, KJ Feagin was named to the all-defensive team and one year prior, Jeremy Hemsley was included on the league's all-defensive team. In 2021, Mitchell earned Mountain West Player of the Year, first team All-Mountain West and inclusion on the all-defensive team along with Nathan Mensah. In 2022, Mensah was the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a member of the all-defensive team. Bradley was the Newcomer of the Year. Chad Baker-Mazara was named the Sixth Man of the Year and Lamont Butler garnered all-defensive team honors.

His players have earned 14 all-Mountain West designations and 15 player of the week honors. Two Aztecs, Trey Kell in 2018 and Mitchell in 2021, were named Mountain West tournament MVP among 10 SDSU players who have been included on the league's all-tournament team. In his five seasons, his charges have garnered 14 league all-academic team distinctions with Flynn being named to the 2020 NABC Honors Court.

The 2021-22 campaign featured a 23-9 record and SDSU's second straight appearance in the NCAA tournament and its second consecutive single-digit seed, No. 8. Six of its nine losses were by 6 points or less and after Dec. 8, 2021, five of the team's six defeats were by six points or less. Twice during that stretch, the Aztecs defeated nationally ranked Colorado State.

The team's No. 2 ranking in KenPom's adjusted defensive efficiency was the best for a Dutcher coached team and matched the program's best rating since the start of the 2006-07 season (the team was No. 2 following the 2010-11 campaign). Among its national rankings, SDSU was No. 2 in scoring defense, No. 4 in field goal percentage defense, No. 25 in 3-point field goal percentage defense and No. 32 in blocks per game.

The defensive success was in part due to Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year Nathan Mensah. The Accra, Ghana native averaged 2.2 blocks per game to lead the Mountain West, totaled a career-high 71 blocks for the season, and was No. 5 in offensive rebounds, No. 7 in total rebounds and No. 13 in defensive boards.

Offensively, the team was led by first year player Matt Bradley, who transferred into the program in the summer of 2021. The Mountain West Newcomer of the Year and first-team all-league designee, led the team in virtually every offensive statistical category, including points (542), field goals (186), 3-pointers (57) and free throws (113).

In 2020-21, he guided San Diego State to the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns and earned a No. 6-seed in the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs went 23-5 and finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in field goal percentage defense (.387), No. 8 in scoring defense (60.6), No. 12 in scoring margin (+13.5), No. 14 in total steals (233), and No. 16 in turnover margin (+3.9) nationally. Among the Mountain West teams, San Diego State led the league in turnovers forced (15.15), steals per game (8.19), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), three-point field goal percentage (.381), field goal percentage defense, scoring defense, scoring margin, turnover margin and total steals. The team posted a 14-game win streak, which is the fourth longest in school history and is the third of at least nine games under Dutcher.

The 2019-20 squad ripped off a program-record 26-straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both national polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2, including 17-1 in Mountain West play.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game

winning streak, which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus second-team All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blowout victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, three days after Utah defeated then No. 6 Kentucky, the Aztecs handed the Utes a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the coronavirus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his first season as head coach, he was the only Division I coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Over the course of his 23 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 16 times, including 11 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 14 Mountain West titles and record 17 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, SDSU has twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured 11 MW championships (seven regular season, four tournament).

In his first year on The Mesa (1999-00) the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep. The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.
