## SDSU Women's Golf Set for MW Championship Defense

The San Diego State women's golf team will be aiming for its second straight conference title next week when it ventures to the Palm Springs area for the Mountain West Championship, April 18-20, in Rancho Mirage, Calif. The 54-hole event will be conducted at Mission Hills Country Club on the renowned Dinah Shore Tournament Course, home of one of the LPGA Tour's majors, the ANA Inspiration, formerly known as the Kraft Nabisco Championship.

The nine-team field will play 18 holes on the par-72, 6,291-yard track each of the three days, following a practice round on Sunday. The Aztecs received the No. 2 seed and are slated to tee off with No. 5 Colorado State and No. 8 Nevada in the second group on Monday, starting at 7:45 a.m. PT, while the pairings for the final two rounds will be based on team standings. A live scoring link will be available courtesy of Golfstat on GoAztecs.com.

The MW Championship returns to Mission Hills for the fourth straight season after a two-year run in 2011 and 2012 at the Wigwam Resort in Litchfield Park, Ariz., just outside of Phoenix. During the 2009 and 2010 campaigns, the event was conducted at the Black Horse Golf Club in Seaside, Calif., near Monterey. In the league's 17-year history, the championships have also been held in three other states: Oregon, Utah and New Mexico.

## Aztec Lineup For This Week

Fifth-year San Diego State head coach Leslie Spalding will accompany five golfers to the Coachella Valley next week, featuring senior Emma Henrikson (Malmö, Sweden), junior Sirene Blair (South Jordan, Utah) and sophomores Georgia Lacey (Del Mar, Calif.), Mila Chaves (Asunción, Paraguay) and Haleigh Krause (Eugene, Ore.).

Henrikson will be making her fourth and final appearance at the MW Championship, while Blair finds herself in the thick of the fight for the third consecutive season. In addition, Chaves and Lacey will be competing at the conference tournament for the second year in a row, joining Krause, a first-time participant.

Henrikson occupies the third spot nationally in the latest Golfstat Cup standings and enters the week with a No. 11 ranking by *Golfweek*.

## SDSU At The MW Championship

The Aztecs captured the first Mountain West championship in program history in 2015 after topping runner-up New Mexico by five strokes. San Diego State established a school record for a conference tournament by shooting a 12-over 876, including a new 18-hole standard of 287 in the final round.

Despite falling on the first hole of a sudden-death playoff, Mila Chaves shattered the Aztec record for best individual score in a 54-hole league tournament last season after firing a 6-under 210, surpassing Jenna Wilson's total of 2-over 215 set in 2004. With her first-place tie in regulation, Chaves matched the finish of Christine Wong, who also came up short on the fourth hole of a playoff in 2012.

In 15 previous installments of the MW tournament, SDSU has finished fifth on seven occasions, second, third and seventh twice, while placing fourth and sixth once each.

In 2014, the Aztecs landed in a three-way tie for third after occupying the fifth position in 2013. SDSU also posted back-to-back fifth-place performances in 2010 and 2011 to go along with another third-place effort in 2012. In addition, the Scarlet and Black wound up seventh in both 2008 and 2009, following a sixth-place result in 2007. The program was also fifth in 2003, 2005 and 2006, fourth in 2004 to go along with consecutive runner-up efforts in 2001 and 2002. The Aztecs were disqualified in the inaugural tournament in 2000, after two players turned in incorrect scorecards in the third and final round.

## The Competition

Six of SDSU's opponents at the MW Championship are among the top 100 teams in the latest Golfstat rankings released April 12. UNLV is

the highest rated squad in the field, landing in the 17th spot this week, while Aztecs check in at No. 22, followed by New Mexico (52) San José State (55), Colorado State (68), Fresno State (76) and Nevada (96). In addition, SDSU will lock horns with Boise State (102) and Wyoming (136), while the two remaining MW members, Air Force and Utah State, do not sponsor women's golf programs.

The Aztecs own a 9-4 record in head-to-head results against six conference foes during the 2015-16 campaign, including a 2-0 mark against both Colorado State and San José State. SDSU also possesses an unblemished record this year vs. Fresno State (1-0) and Nevada (1-0), while maintaining the upper hand against New Mexico (3-1). Conversely, the Scarlet and Black has come out on the wrong side in three previous encounters with UNLV this season and has not faced Boise State or Wyoming.

Individually, five of the top-10 finishers return from last year's conference championship, including medalist Manon Molle of New Mexico, who defeated SDSU's Mila Chaves in a sudden-death playoff to claim the title. Fellow Aztec Emma Henrikson (4th) is also back in the mix, joining the UNM duo of Ingrid Gutierrez and Alexandra Moisand, both of whom tied for eighth a year ago.

UNLV freshman Kaylee Benton, who enters the week ranked second in the MW, is also expected to contend, along with fellow teammates Mackenzie Raim and Elizabeth Prior, Fresno State's Kristin Simonsen, Hannah Sodersten and 2014 medalist Guðrun Björgsvindóttir, My Leander and Regina De Guzman of San José State, SDSU's Sirene Blair and Georgia Lacey, as well as Katrina Prendergast of Colorado State.

## Backspin: 2015 MW Championship

The San Diego State women's golf team secured its first-ever conference title last year after shooting a 1-under-par 287 during the final round the 2015 Mountain West Championship at Mission Hills Country Club. The Aztecs finished the three-day, 54-hole event with a combined 12-over 876, topping New Mexico (+17) by five strokes on the par-72, 6,291-yard Dinah Shore Tournament Course.

"Bringing the conference championship trophy home to San Diego State for the first time ever in women's golf is an incredible honor," said Aztec head coach Leslie Spalding. "This team is capable of accomplishing many great things, and today they proved it. They will always be the first conference champions in women's golf at SDSU and their legacy will last forever."

The Aztecs boasted three players in the top 15 on the individual leaderboard, led by Mila Chaves, who tied for the top spot in regulation with New Mexico's Manon Molle at 4-under 210, before falling on the first hole of a sudden-death playoff.

Chaves entered the final day with a three-shot advantage over her Molle, but was unable to avoid a playoff after carding a 70, while her UNM counterpart posted a 67. The SDSU freshman carded five birdies against three bogeys, but Molle closed the gap with a spot-free day, draining five birdies of her own to go with 13 pars.

The two golfers returned to the 18th hole for the sudden-death playoff, where Molle sank a birdie putt to claim medalist honors, while Chaves made par.

Despite the outcome, Chaves still established an Aztec record for lowest 54-hole score in a conference tournament, eclipsing Jenna Wilson's total of 215 set in 2004 at Sunriver, Oregon. In addition, the native Paraguayan matched SDSU's highest finish at the event after Christine Wong tied for first as well in 2012 at Litchfield Park, Arizona.

Not to be outdone, Emma Henrikson posted her second straight top-five performance at the MW Championship after tying for the fourth position with a collective 1-over 217. Henrikson, who landed in the runner-up spot a year ago, equaled Chaves' effort with a 70 of

her own, highlighted by three birdies, including the Aztecs' lone conversions of the day at Nos. 12 and 18, which ranked among the toughest holes of the final round. With her effort, the SDSU junior finished seven strokes in back of the leaders with San José State's Megan Osland, one shot behind Dana Finkelstein of UNLV (E), who wound up in the third spot.

Meanwhile, Paige Spiranac tied for 14th at 9-over 225 after firing a 76 over the final 18 holes. The Aztec senior captain was 4-over at the turn, but played even par on the back nine, offsetting two bogeys with a pair of birdies, including a crucial make on the par-4, 351-yard No. 15, which played as the third-most difficult hole of the final round.

Sirene Blair also figured in SDSU's final tally, saving her best round for last with a 71. The Aztec sophomore, who endured a sluggish start with atypical scores of 84 and 81 over her first 36 holes, found her rhythm on Wednesday, carding two birdies compared to just one bogey. Blair reeled off 12 consecutive pars during one stretch to climb nine places into 34th at 20-over 236.

Rounding out the Aztec delegation was freshman Georgia Lacey, who posted a final-round 78 to finish the championship in a tie for 24th at 15-over 231. The Torrey Pines High alumnus was plagued by eight bogeys, but managed to finish relatively strong with a pair of birdies on her final three holes in her first conference tournament action.

**Mountain West History 101**

• In 2015, San Diego State became the first team other than New Mexico, UNLV and former conference member TCU to capture the Mountain West Women's Golf Championship.

• Prior to last season, New Mexico and UNLV owned at least a share of all 12 MW championship records. However, the Aztecs' Mila Chaves etched her name into the history books a year ago, opening with a 66 to set a conference tournament standard for lowest first-round score.

• New Mexico dominated the first four years of the MW Championship, claiming the team title by at least 11 shots in each of the first three years before coming back to defeat UNLV in 2003 by one stroke. The Rebels got their revenge against UNM over the next three years, edging the Lobos by two shots in both 2004 and 2005 to capture the conference crown before winning by five strokes in 2006. After TCU registered a one-shot victory over Brigham Young in 2007, New Mexico topped the Cougars by 19 strokes on its home course in the 2008 installment to usher in a three-year reign, which included two straight decisions over runner-up TCU in 2009 and 2010. However, the Horned Frogs managed to capture two consecutive championships of their own in 2011 and 2012 before bolting for the Big 12. The MW tournament witnessed a return to form in the following two seasons as UNLV and New Mexico captured titles in 2013 and 2014, respectively, before the Aztecs busted that oligarchy a year ago.

• Six different schools have had a player collect medalist honors, including New Mexico (2001, 2003, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2013, 2015), UNLV (2004, 2005, 2006, 2011), Wyoming (2000, 2009) Colorado State (2002, TCU (2012) and Fresno State (2014).

• The first Mountain West Championship took place in 2000 at the Sunbrook Golf Club in St. George, Utah. The tournament then moved to Sunriver Resort in central Oregon over the next five seasons; however, the first round of the 2003 event was conducted at the Awbrey Glen Golf Course in Bend, Ore., due to inclement weather. The tournament has also been played at the Entrada at Snow Canyon Resort in St. George (2006-07), the UNM Championship Course in Albuquerque, N.M. (2008), the Black Horse Golf Course in Seaside, Calif. (2009-10) and the Wigwam Resort in Litchfield Park, Ariz. (2011-12).

**2015-16 Highlights**

• Despite a roster with just one senior and a schedule brimming with high-level competition, San Diego State enjoyed another banner season in 2015-16, posting top-10 team finishes in six of seven stroke-play tournaments, highlighted by a pair of team titles during the fall slate.

• Buoyed by Emma Henrikson's superlative performance, the Aztecs captured both the team and individual crowns at the Golfweek Conference Challenge, held Sept. 21-23 in Wolcott, Colo. The SDSU senior collected medalist honors with a tournament-record 10-under-par 206, while Sirene Blair (+2) tied for fourth, followed by Haleigh Krause (+4), who landed in the eighth position.

• Coupled with her impressive Colorado finish and a third-place

tie earlier at the season-opening Branch Law Firm/Dick McGuire Invitational in Albuquerque, N.M., Henrikson was named Mountain West Women's Golfer of the Month for September.

• SDSU kept the momentum rolling in its next tournament, rallying for a spirited five-shot victory over California at the University of Washington's Edean Ihanfeldt Invitational in suburban Seattle. The Aztecs found themselves trailing by 10 strokes at the start of the final round, before surging past the Golden Bears on the back nine despite a steady rain. Mila Chaves was the Scarlet and Black's top finisher, tying for fifth on the individual leaderboard at 5-over 221, while Georgia Lacey (+9) wound up in the ninth spot.

• With its second straight team title secured, SDSU was ranked as high as 13th nationally by *Golfweek* in late October.

• In addition, the Aztecs collected two tournament crowns in the same season for the second year in a row, but just the third time since the 2005-06 campaign.

• SDSU wrapped up its fall schedule with a solid third-place finish at the Las Vegas Collegiate Showdown in late October. Under ideal playing conditions, the Aztecs set a team record with a collective 30-under 834, while Blair established an individual 54-hole standard after carding an 11-under 205.

• SDSU opened its second semester slate in late February at the University of Wisconsin's Westbrook Spring Invitational in Peoria, Ariz., where Henrikson notched her second victory of the year and third as a collegian after tying the host Badgers' Brooke Terrell for medalist honors with a 5-under 211.

• Henrikson continued her remarkable campaign a week later at the Bruin Wave Invitational, finishing a solo third at 1-under 215 to lift the Scarlet and Black to a fourth-place tie in the team standings. With her two previous results, Henrikson received MW Women's Golfer of the Week honors.

• After a three-week hiatus, the Aztecs conducted their fourth annual home tournament under a new name, the SDSU March Mayhem, which featured a match-play format for the second year in a row. In a stacked field that included 10 top-40 schools, San Diego State finished a respectable fifth with a 3-1 record. The Aztecs emerged triumphant with exciting wins over TCU, Kansas and Arizona State, but came up short against eventual third-place finisher UCLA in the second round.

• Entering the MW Championship, Henrikson leads the conference with a 71.24 scoring average, while Blair (73.90) checks in at No. 8.

**Just A Chip Shot Away**

The winner of next week's Mountain West Championship earns an automatic bid to the NCAA regional tournament. If SDSU claims the MW title, it will head to the NCAA regionals, May 5-7, in either Palo Alto, Calif., Bryan, Texas, Baton Rouge, La., or Shoal Creek, Ala. The trip to the NCAAs would be the team's sixth in the last seven years after three individuals, Christine Wong, Emma Henrikson and Paige Spiranac, were invited to compete in the Central Regional in 2013.

Each of the four regional tournaments will include 18 schools, along with six individuals not on those qualifying teams. The participants will be selected by the NCAA women's golf committee and will be announced on Monday, April 25 at 6 p.m. ET (3 p.m. PT) on the Golf Channel.

The top six squads and the three highest finishing individuals not on those teams from each region will advance to the NCAA championships, May 20-25, in Eugene, Ore.

**Head Coach Leslie Spalding**

Leslie Spalding, who was hired in August of 2011, is in her fifth season as head coach of the Aztecs.

A native of Billings, Mont., Spalding played on the LPGA Tour from 1996 to 2005, competing in 215 events with seven top-10 finishes and earning more than \$600,000 in prize money. After completing her playing career, she served as the head women's golf coach at Montana State from 2007-11.

As a collegian, Spalding attended the University of Alabama on a golf scholarship from 1987 to 1991 and received her bachelor's degree in telecommunication/film with a minor in marketing in 1992.

Last season, Spalding was named Mountain West Women's Golf Coach of the Year after guiding SDSU to its first-ever conference championship.
