

The San Diego State men's soccer team travels to the Bay Area this weekend for key Pac-12 Conference games against Stanford and California. The Aztecs (10-4-2, 4-3 Pac-12), who are ranked 27th in the latest *College Soccer News* national poll, will play the Cardinal (4-9-2, 1-5-1 Pac-12) in Palo Alto, Calif., at 7 p.m. PT Friday before meeting the Bears (3-7-4, 0-5-2 Pac-12) in Berkeley at 2 p.m. PT Sunday.

Noting the Aztecs

* With three games to play in the regular season, San Diego State is 10-4-2 (.688) start, its best 16-game start to a season since 2005, when the Aztecs began the campaign with a 9-2-5 mark (.714) ... It is the second-best start by an SDSU team in 20 years (since 1991) ... The .688 winning percentage is tied for the 29th-best record in the country.

* San Diego State is 4-3 in the Pac-12 Conference ... The .571 winning percentage in league play is the Aztecs' second-best record in their seven seasons in the Pac-12 ... The only other team with a better winning percentage was the 2006 squad, which went 5-2-3 (.650) en route to a runner-up finish ... SDSU's four league victories is its most since 2007 and tied for the second most in its Pac-12 history (five wins in 2006) ... San Diego State currently sits in third place in the Pac-12 standings with 12 points and three games to go ... UCLA leads the league with a perfect 7-0-0 record and 21 points, while Washington is second at 6-3-0 and 18 points ... A win in either game this weekend will give the Aztecs at least a top-half finish in league standings, their first since finishing third in 2008 ... Additionally, SDSU still has a chance to share either the Pac-12 title or a runner-up finish with some victories and some help from other teams.

* San Diego State is 3-1 against 2010 NCAA tournament teams this year with wins over NCAA semifinalist Michigan, and quarterfinalist California and Penn ... The Aztecs' only loss to a team that made last year's tourney was UCLA ... SDSU still has games against Cal (Nov. 6) and UCLA (Nov. 12) this year.

* Earlier this season, San Diego State had an eight-game unbeaten streak ... Over the streak, which lasted from Sept. 9-Oct. 7, the Aztecs outscored the opposition, 18-4 ... The eight-game unbeaten streak was the longest since an eight-match undefeated span in 2007 (Sept. 9-Oct. 14) and tied for the sixth longest in program history.

* SDSU dropped seven places in the *College Soccer News* poll, but is still ranked 27th in the nation ... Four weeks ago, San Diego State was ranked in all five polls for consecutive weeks, marking the third season in program history that the Aztecs were ranked in all five polls at once (also 2005, 2010) ... SDSU has been ranked as high as No. 18 by *Soccer America*, No. 20 by NSCAA/Continental Tire and *College Soccer News*, No. 21 by *Soccer Times* and No. 28 by *Top Drawer Soccer*.

* San Diego State is sixth in the latest NSCAA/Continental Tire Far Region poll, trailing New Mexico (No. 1), UCLA (No. 2), UC Irvine (No. 3), Washington (No. 4) and UC Santa Barbara (No. 5).

* The Aztecs saw their four-match winning streak snapped on Sept. 24 when they tied Central Arkansas, 0-0, in double-overtime ... The four-game winning streak was SDSU's fourth since it joined the Pac-12 (other times were in 2005, 2007 and 2010) ... The last time the program won five straight games was 2005.

* San Diego State has scored 30 goals this season in just 16 games (1.88 goals per game) ... The 30 goals matches the Aztecs' total from last year, which was done over 19 matches (1.58 goals per game) ... The 30 goals matches the most by an SDSU team since the 2001 squad scored 38 times in 20 games (1.90 goals per game) ... San Diego State still has at least three games remaining ... The 1.88 goals per game rank in a tie for 25th in the nation.

* The Aztecs are outscoring the opposition, 30-18, this year ... It is SDSU's largest scoring margin (+12) since the 1991 team outscored its opponents by 14 goals (35-21) ... The +12 scoring margin is second in the Pac-12 behind Washington's +13.

* San Diego State won the Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central Tournament on Sept. 9-11 after going 2-0 ... It was the Aztecs' first outright CMSDC title in four tries ... SDSU was co-champions in 2009 and runner-ups (via goal differential) in 2010 ... San Diego State is 6-1-1 all-time at the Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central Tournament and is unbeaten over its last seven in the tourney ... The Aztecs' only loss in the tournament was a 3-2 overtime setback to Michigan on Sept. 5, 2008 ... SDSU is an impressive 10-0-2 in tournament games since 2009.

* San Diego State has won 17 consecutive matches when leading at the half and nine straight when scoring first.

* The Aztecs are outshooting their opponents, 247-166, through 16 games, including a 102-78 advantage on net ... SDSU leads the Pac-12 in goals per game (1.88), and is ranked second in points per game (5.75), assists per game (2.00) and shots per game (15.44) ... Individually, redshirt sophomore goalkeeper Blake Hylen (San Diego/Torrey Pines HS) ranks third in goals against average (1.11), saves per game (3.80) and shutouts (4), sophomore Miles Byass (Highland, Calif.) is third in shots per game (3.25), fourth in points per game (0.94), tied for fourth in goals per game (0.31) and fifth in assists per game (0.31), and senior Daniel Steres (Calabasas, Calif.) and redshirt sophomore Jordan Ongaro (Edmonton, Alberta) are tied for fourth in goals per game (0.31).

* Hylen had a streak of 356 minutes, 24 seconds played without allowing a goal snapped on Oct. 2 in a 2-1 win over California.

* Junior Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) and sophomore Casey Meuser (Granite Bay, Calif.) have each started 35 consecutive games, the longest active streaks on the team. Steres has the next longest at 27.

Scouting the Cardinal

Stanford is 4-9-2 and 1-5-1 in the Pac-12 heading into Friday's game with San Diego State. The Cardinal took a three-game unbeaten streak into conference play, but has just one win over the seven matches since. Stanford has had a bit of bad luck as six of its nine losses have been by one goal, including two in overtime.

Garrett Gunther leads the team with eight points on three goals and two assists. Adam Jahn has seven points on three goals and an assist, while Dersu Abolfathi and Alexander Binnie have two goals apiece. Jason Dodson has played almost the entire season in net (1,071:46) and owns a 1.51 goals against average and 43 saves.

* **THE SERIES:** San Diego State leads the all-time series between the two schools, 12-5-5, including a 7-4-2 advantage in its Pac-12 era (since 2005) ... The Aztecs are 7-1-3 all-time against the Cardinal at home and 5-1-1 in the Pac-12, but 5-4-2 in Palo Alto and 2-3-1 there in the Pac-12 ... SDSU has won two consecutive games in the series for the first time since 2008 ... Each of the last seven matches have been decided by one goal with San Diego State winning five of them ... There hasn't been a tie in the series since 2005, when the teams tied, 1-1, in San Diego and 0-0 in Palo Alto.

A Glance at the Bears

A year after winning the Pac-12 Conference and advancing all the way to the quarterfinals of the NCAA tournament, California is 3-7-4 this season, including a 0-5-2 mark in league action. Like Stanford, the Bears have run into some tough luck. Five of Cal's seven losses have been by one goal, including each of its last five setbacks. California has played in six overtime matches, going 0-2-4.

John Fitzpatrick has been the team's top point scorer, recording 10 points on five goals. Michael Munoz has six points on three goals, while Seth Casiple leads the league with six assists. Tony Salicci has added five points on two goals and an assist. Kevin Peach (1-3-0, 1.00 GAA, 360:59 minutes) and Robby Gogatz (2-4-4, 1.62 GAA, 1,000:49 minutes) have split time in net.

* **SERIES:** SDSU leads the all-time series between the two schools, 18-13-3, including a 8-3-2 mark since it joined the league in 2005 ... San Diego State is 6-0-1 in home matches against the Bears since joining the conference and 3-1-2 in Berkeley ... After winning, 2-1, on Oct. 2 in San Diego, the Aztecs are looking for the season sweep for the third time since 2005 (also 2006 and 2009).

No. 20 San Diego State picked up its 10th victory of the season with a 3-0 win over Oregon State Friday at SDSU Sports Deck ... The Aztecs now have back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time since 1991-92 ... MF John Pegg, D Daniel Steres and F Tyler Smith each scored for SDSU, which swept the Beavers in the season series for the first time in its seven years of the Pac-12 ... San Diego State scored all three of its goals on its final four shot attempts ... The assists went to MF Jose Altamirano, F Jordan Ongaro and D Robbie Freise ... Ongaro, Pegg and Steres had two shots apiece to pace the Aztecs, who won their 17th consecutive game when leading at the half ... Steres, D Casey Meuser, D Evyn Hewett and Freise each started and played all 90 minutes in the back to help GK Blake Hylen record his fourth shutout of the season .. Hylen had six saves.

At the Helm

Lev Kirshner is in his 12th year as head coach at San Diego State and 15th season overall. Kirshner, just one of three coaches in the 43-year history of the program, has brought SDSU back to the national spotlight with two trips to the NCAA tournament since he helped orchestrate the program's move to the Pac-10 (now Pac-12) in 2005.

Since the men's soccer team earned its full allotment of scholarships (2005), the Aztecs have gone 58-43-27 (.559), including a 24-26-17 (.485) mark in the competitive Pac-12.

Over his 11 seasons, Kirshner has coached two All-America selections, three Academic All-America picks, 10 professional players, eight all-Far West selections and 57 all-conference picks.

SDSU Ranked No. 27 by College Soccer News

San Diego State is still ranked in the *College Soccer News* national poll, coming in at No. 27 on Monday. On both Oct. 4 and Oct. 11, the Aztecs were ranked in all five national polls for the third season that has happened since they joined the Pac-12 in 2005. The other times were 2005 and 2010.

SDSU is 27th in the *College Soccer News* poll, seven spots lower than it was the previous week. San Diego State is ahead of Cal State Bakersfield (No. 28), Bradley (No. 29) and Northwestern (No. 30), and behind Iona (No. 24), Cornell (No. 25) and Alabama-Birmingham (No. 26).

The Aztecs are also receiving votes in the NSCAA/Continental Tire poll, the fifth straight week they have either been nationally ranked or receiving votes. SDSU has been as high as No. 20 in the Oct. 4 edition of the poll.

In the *Soccer Times* national poll, San Diego State dropped out of consideration after receiving votes with 11 the previous week. The Aztecs were 21st on Oct. 4 in the *Soccer Times* poll.

SDSU was once again left out of the *Soccer America* poll after being ranked 22nd in the Oct. 11 edition. On Oct. 4, San Diego State was ranked 18th, the highest of any of the five polls this season.

In the *Top Drawer Soccer* poll, which is a running attempt to project the postseason NCAA tournament, including every automatic berth, the Aztecs were left out after being ranked three times this season. SDSU was as high as No. 21 on Oct. 4.

Start Me Up

The Aztecs are off to a 10-4-2 (.688) start this season, their best 16-game start to a season since 2005, when they began the campaign with

a 9-2-5 mark (.719). It is SDSU's second best start since the 1991 season (10-2-4, .750).

San Diego State's .688 winning percentage through its first 16 games is tied for the 10th-best start in its storied history.

Of the nine teams in program history that have started with a better winning percentage through 16 games, five - 1981, 1982, 1987, 1988 and 2005 - have made the NCAA tournament.

Unbeaten No More

San Diego State had its eight-game unbeaten streak snapped on Oct. 9 with a 3-2 heartbreaking loss at Washington. The streak matches its longest streak since a nine-game undefeated span in 2005 (Sept. 2-Oct. 2) and is the longest since 2007 (Sept. 9-Oct. 7).

It is tied for the program's sixth-longest unbeaten streak (also Oct. 14-Nov. 6, 1988). Three of the teams - 2005, 1988 and 1969 - with the same or longest unbeaten streaks in a season ended up making the NCAA tournament.

Captaining the Aztecs

Redshirt senior Pedro Adan (San Diego/Preuss HS) and senior Daniel Steres (Calabasas, Calif.) joined the long list of captains in the storied program when they were announced to the team in the spring.

Now in his fifth season (he redshirted 2007), Adan has played in 61 games, earning starts in 49 of the them. He has tallied seven points on a goal and five assists, while controlling possession in the midfield. Last year, Adan played a career-high 1,055 minutes and also set a career best in shots (16) and tied a career high in shots on goal (three). This season, Adan has two assists in 1,132 minutes (sixth on team and second most of non-defenders and non-goalkeepers).

Steres, meanwhile, became the first two-time captain since Raul Bautista captained the squad in 2005 and 2006 (both NCAA tournament teams). Steres is a two-time all-Pac-10 honoree, including a second-team selection last year as a junior. He has started 64 times over his 68 appearances, registering 34 points on 13 goals and eight assists. Last year, Steres started all 18 games he appeared in, and had 10 points on four goals and two assists, despite playing mainly in the back. This season, Steres is tied for second on the team with 13 points on five goals and three assists, while his 1,469 minutes played are more than anyone else on the squad.

Three San Diego State men's soccer players have been named to the Top Drawer Soccer Upperclassmen Top 100, the website announced on Oct. 26. The rankings include all seniors, juniors and sophomores across the country.

In the Oct. 26 rankings, senior co-captain Daniel Steres (Calabasas, Calif.) is 38th, junior Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) is 60th and sophomore Miles Byass (Highland, Calif.) is 73rd. Only Altamirano (67th) was on the website's preseason rankings on Aug. 22.

Altamirano, meanwhile, has contributed three goals and three assists for nine points this year, while logging 1,208 minutes in the midfield (the most by a non-defender or goalkeeper). His 44 corner kicks lead the team and he has 33 shots in 16 games (all starts). Last season, Altamirano had 11 points on one goal and nine assists en route to being named a second-team all-Pac-12 selection and a first-team Pac-12 All-Academic Team pick. He was an honorable mention all-Pac-12 selection as a freshman in 2009.

Byass, who was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week for the second time this season last Tuesday, leads San Diego State in points (15), assists (5), shots (52) and shots on goal (22), and is tied for the team lead in goals (5). Among the Pac-12 leaders, Byass is third in shots per game (3.25), fourth in points per game (0.94), tied for fourth in goals per game (0.31) and fifth in assists per game (0.31). He has 25 career points on 10 goals and five assists, all over his last 21 matches dating back to last season.



SDSU Picked Fourth in Pac-12 Poll

San Diego State has been picked to finish fourth in the 2011 Pac-12 preseason poll, the league announced on Aug. 16.

The Aztecs garnered 13 points, three behind third-place Washington (16). UCLA has been selected to win the regular season title with 25 points, including five first-place votes, while California was picked second (21) with the other first-place vote. Stanford's 10 points were fifth in the poll and Oregon State was sixth with five points.
