OFF THE BOUNCE (through the games of January 31)

- Looking to bounce back from a 71-79 setback at Colorado State on Tuesday, San Diego State hosts the Mountain West's top team when it hosts Utah State on Saturday at 12:30 p.m. PT at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.
- The Aztecs and Aggies are meeting for the 28th time, with SDSU owning an 18-9 advantage in the all-time series. In the Mountain West era, SDSU owns an 18-6 lead in the series, including an 9-1 mark at Viejas Arena. (complete results between San Diego State and Utah State are listed in the column on page 4)
- In its last 28 games immediately following a loss, the Aztecs are 25-3. In situations where a loss is followed immediately by a home contest, San Diego State has won 32 consecutive games.**
- At Colorado State, San Diego State went 7-of-7 from the line and in the Brian Dutcher era (since 2017-18) it is the most free throw attempts without a miss in a game. It marked just the third time since the start of the Mountain West era SDSU has been perfect from the line in a minimum of seven free throw attempts. (also: 12-of-12 at Air Force on Jan. 11, 2003 & 9-of-9 vs. Temple on March 19, 2011 in the NCAA Tournament)
- Once again San Diego State is one of the elite teams when it comes to challenging itself. According to Kenpom, the Aztecs have the No. 11 strength of schedule rating, including the No. 10 rated non-conference schedule. SDSU has faced the No. 13 rated schedule in opponents adjusted offensive efficiency and the No. 17 rated schedule in opponents adjusted defensive efficiency.
- Senior Jaedon LeDee surpassed the 1,000-career point milestone at Colorado State and enters the Utah State game with 1,011 points, 719 of which have come in 59 games with the Aztecs while in his first 79 games at both Ohio State and TCU he totaled 292 points.
- The Aztecs are among the elite programs in the country and that includes winning on their opponent's floor. Since the beginning of the 2009-10 campaign, SDSU has the seventh best road record in the nation, 104-64 (61.9 percent). **Since the start of the 2019-20 campaign, SDSU has lost just 14 times in 47 road games (33-14, 70.2 percent), which is tied for the third fewest in the nation trailing only Gonzaga (6 losses) and Baylor (13 losses) and tied with Houston in that time frame and its 70.2 winning percentage in road games is the third best in the nation trailing only Gonzaga (32-6, 84.2 percent) with one of the Zags' six losses coming at the hands of the Aztecs, 84-74 on Dec. 29, 2023 and Baylor (31-13; 70.5 percent).**
- Since the start of the 2013-14 season, when the current slate of MW members was finalized, SDSU has an 57-34 (.626) record in Mountain West ROAD games, the best mark in the conference. Boise State has the second-best record 48-45 (.516).
- Since the start of the 2013-14 season, when the current slate of MW members was finalized, SDSU has an 84-11 (.884) record in Mountain West HOME games, the best mark in the conference. Boise State has the second-best record 75-20 (.789) and Colorado State is 61-33 (.649).**
- The Aztecs metrics rank among the best in the nation. Through the games of February 1, the Aztecs were ranked No. 22 in the NET, No. 24 in Kenpom, No. 32 in T-Rank, No. 22 in KPI and No. 41 in BPI. San Diego State RPI strength of schedule is No. 5 and its strength of record is No. 26.
- San Diego State enters the Utah State game with a 6-5 record in Quad 1 & 2 games this season, including a 2-5 record in Quad 1 games.

- SDSU has won at least 19 games in 18 straight seasons.
- SDSU has advanced to the postseason in 15 of the last 17 seasons in which a champion was crowned (2006 NCAA, 2007-09 NIT, 2010-15 NCAA, 2016 NIT, 2018, 2021-23 NCAA).
- SDSU has won 73 of last 78 games when leading at the half.
- SDSU has won its last 108-of-116 when having a higher FG pct.
- SDSU is 4th nationally in winning percentage (.742) since the beginning of the 2005-06 season.
- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 16.
- Since 2006, SDSU's 14 appearances in its conference championship game are tied for second most in Division I.

Its five losses have been on the road at some of the toughest venues to play in for an opposing team. The Aztecs lost at Brigham Young (65-74) in front of its second largest crowd of the season, at Grand Canyon (73-79) in front of its largest crowd, at New Mexico (70-88) in front of the largest crowd it has had since the 2009 season, at Boise State (66-67) in front of its second biggest home crowd this year and at Colorado State (71-79) in front of its largest home crowd of the year.

- SDSU is 138-10 the last 148 times it has shot better than its opponent and the Aztecs have won 31 straight games when scoring between 80-89 points.
- San Diego State, which won both the 2022-23 Mountain West regular season and tournament titles and reached the league tournament championship game for the sixth time in head coach **Brian Dutcher's** six seasons, looks for its unprecedented 17th Mountain West men's basketball title. Entering the 2023-24 season, San Diego State has won nine regular season and seven Mountain West tournament titles.
- **San Diego State owns a 124-28 record (81.6 percent) since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. That is the third best record in the nation trailing only Gonzaga (137-18, 88.4 percent) and Houston (135-24, 84.9 percent).**
- Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee** passed the 1,000-career point plateau at Colorado State. He reached double figure scoring in the game, 13 points. It is the 20th time in 20 appearances this season and 39th time of his college career he has totaled at least 10 points in a game. Thirty one of his 39 double figure scoring games have come in the 59 games he's played for SDSU. In addition, he led the Aztecs with 7 rebounds making the 16th time this season and 35th time in his college career he has paced his team in rebounds.
- At Colorado State, senior guard **Lamont Butler** led the Aztecs with four assists and four steals. It marked the sixth time in the last 10 games he has reached double figure scoring, the ninth time this season and the 35th time in his career.
- Junior wing **Reese Waters** led the Aztecs with 17 points marking the 14th game this year he scored in double figures and 30th of his career.
- **Brian Dutcher** is in his seventh season as San Diego State's head coach and his 25th season on the Aztec sidelines. In his six-plus seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to five conference titles, six Mountain West championship game appearances, a 167-52 (.763) overall record, the 2023 NCAA national championship game, has been named the national coach of the year, and twice the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

BIG NOTES

- San Diego State stands at 147-142 in Mountain West road games since the start of the conference and remains the only program in league history with a winning road record in conference play.
- With its win against Wyoming, San Diego State improved to 25-3 in its last 28 games immediately following a loss and wins its 32nd consecutive game when a loss is immediately followed by a home game.
- San Diego State committed just two turnovers against Wyoming. The two turnovers are the fewest in program history, the fewest in Viejas Arena history, equaled the second fewest in Mountain West history (all games including league games) and is tied for the second fewest in a Division I game this season.**
- Jaedon LeDee** now has three career games with at least 20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 steals, which is tied with Jamaal Franklin for the most by an Aztec since the 2005-06 season. The complete list of Aztecs with at least 20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 steals in a game since 2005-06: Jaedon LeDee - 3, Jamaal Franklin - 3, Kawhi Leonard - 1, Jalen McDaniels - 1, Chase Tapley - 1, Billy White - 1.
- Jaedon LeDee** is the fifth player in the country this year with at least 20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 steals, while attempting nine or less field goals (vs. Nevada).
- Senior guard **Darrion Trammell** passed 1,500-career points at New Mexico and is one of two active players who stand 5-11 or less to have reached the milestone (also: California's Jalen Cone).
- Forward **Jaedon LeDee** recorded his second game of at least 30 points and at least 10 rebounds of the season (also: vs. Washington - 11/19/23) at San Jose State and is one of two players in the country who have accomplished the feat twice this season (also: Kansas' Hunter Dickinson).
- At San Jose State, **Jaedon LeDee** had San Diego State's eighth game of at least 30 points and at least 10 rebounds since the start of the 1996-97 campaign. LeDee and Jamaal Franklin have done it twice (Franklin did it on 2/25/12 vs. Colorado State and on 3/3/12 vs. TCU).
- San Diego State's 27-point win against Fresno State was its largest margin of victory of the season against a Division I opponent and largest since a 34-point triumph over Kennesaw State on Dec. 12, 2022 (W, 88-54).
- The Aztecs are 50-5 (.909) in their last 55 Mountain West home games and 28-2 (.933) in their last 30 MW home contests.
- The Aztecs snapped Gonzaga's 59-game home winning streak against non-conference opponents (last loss was a 71-66 setback against UCLA on Dec. 12, 2015). SDSU handed Gonzaga its second home loss in its last 92 games (90-2) (since Jan. 27, 2018).
- The Aztecs handed Gonzaga their largest home loss since an 11-point setback on Dec. 8, 2012 vs. No. 13 Illinois.
- Gonzaga had gone 173 straight home games without losing by 10 or more points prior to the Aztecs 84-74 win, which was the second-longest active streak in the country since at least the 1996-97 season.
- San Diego State is 12-9 (.571) under Brian Dutcher against AP Top-25 teams. The Aztecs were 29-98 (.228) against AP Top-25 teams prior to Dutcher taking over as head coach in 2017-18.
- San Diego State has won 65 of its 70 home games (65-5) since the start of the 2019-20 season, and its five home losses are tied for the third fewest in the nation in that time frame.
- The 14-point victory over Stanford is the Aztecs largest over a Pac-12 opponent since beating No. 20 UCLA by 15 points (73-58) on Nov. 5, 2020.
- San Diego State committed just seven turnovers in the game against Stanford. In its three games against Pac-12 opponents this season, SDSU had only 20 turnovers (6.7 per game) while its three Pac-12 opponents had 43 (14.3 per game).
- Micah Parrish** (15 points, 10 rebounds) and **Jaedon LeDee** (13 points, 10 rebounds) finished the UC San Diego game with double doubles. It marked the 54 time since 1979 that two Aztecs had a double double in the same game and first since Winston Shepard (20 points, 10 rebounds) and Malik Pope (10 points, 12 rebounds) did it against Washington on March 21, 2016, in the second round of the 2016 NIT.
- Reese Waters** was named the SoCal Showcase MVP; scored a career-high 24 points and grabbed a career-best seven rebounds while also going 10-of-10 from the charity stripe vs. California.
- Against Washington, **Jaedon LeDee** became the first Aztec since at least 1996-97 to have at least 34 points and 17 rebounds in a game and is the only player in Mountain West history to do it and shoot at least 50.0 percent.
- Following the Washington game, **Jaedon LeDee** was the second Division I player over the last 10 seasons to score 20+ points on at least 55.0 percent shooting in the first five games of a season, joining Obi Toppin in 2019-20 enroute to the Wooden Award.
- Jaedon LeDee** was named the Tournament MVP and along with **Micah Parrish** were selected for the all-tournament team at the Continental Tire Main Event.

LEDEE PICKS UP LATE SEASON WATCH LIST ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

- Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee** has earned inclusion on Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame's 2024 Karl Malone Award Top-10 and the John R. Wooden Award Late Season Top 20.
- LeDee is one of the top 10 candidates for the Karl Malone Award, an annual honor, in its 10th year, which recognizes the top power forward in Division I men's college basketball.
- The John R. Wooden Award, presented by Principal and announced by the Los Angeles Athletic Club, is chosen by a poll of national college basketball experts based on their performances during the 2023-24 season thus far, the list comprises of 20 student-athletes who are front-runners for the sport's most prestigious honor.

10-PLUS POINT HALFTIME LEAD UNDER BRIAN DUTCHER...LOCK IT IN

- Under Brian Dutcher's leadership, since the start of the 2017-18 season, the Aztecs have played 219 games and in 74 of them, SDSU has taken a 10-plus point lead into halftime.
- The Aztecs have a 95.9 percent winning percentage (71-3) when they lead by double digits at the intermission.
- In games at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena when San Diego State takes at least a 10-point advantage into the break in the Dutcher era, the team is 49-0.

HOME FLOOR DOMINANCE IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

- The 10 teams in the Mountain West the combined home court record of 93-26 this season.
- Nine of the 10 programs have a .500 or better record on its home floor, with Air Force the lone team with a losing record (4-7).
- Colorado State and New Mexico have won the most games on their home floor (11).
- San Diego State and Utah State are the only programs which have yet to lose on its home floor, each is 10-0 entering the weekend.
- In conference home games, four teams have yet to suffer a loss; San Diego State, Wyoming, Colorado State and Utah State are all 4-0.
- Nevada is 2-1, while Boise State, Fresno State, and UNLV are 2-2. Only two teams Air Force and San Jose State have yet to win a home league contest (0-4).

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament 10 of the last 12 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, San Diego State has the seven-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 209-25 home record, winning 89.3 percent of its home games during that span.

In the midst of the 2023-24 season, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 245 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 219-26 mark (89.4 percent), including a 114-12 record (90.5 percent) in its last 126 home games against non-conference competition.
- **Since the start of the 2002-03 season, San Diego State has a 149-30 (83.2 percent) home record against conference opponents.**
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 164-21 (88.6 percent) at home, including a 73-9 (89.0 percent) record in non-conference home contests during that stretch and 71-7 (91.0 percent) against non-top 25 non-conference foes.
- The Aztecs are 81-11 (88.0 percent) in their last 92 conference home games and 79-9 (89.8 percent) in their last 88 non-conference home games.

MORE HOME COOKING

- In the last 69 home games, San Diego State is 64-5 (.928), with an average scoring margin of +16.9 points in those victories. In 50 of those 64 home wins, the game was decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
 - The Aztecs current 19-game non-conference home court win streak, started on November 9, 2021, against UC Riverside, and is the second-longest in school history, trailing a 27-game win streak from Nov. 22, 2008 to Nov. 30, 2011.
 - **The Aztecs are 51-5 (91.1 percent) in their 56 Mountain West Conference home games since January 24, 2018.**
 - **San Diego State is 75-6 (92.6 percent) in its last 81 home games dating back to January 1, 2019.**
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home enroute to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on nine occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2019-20, 2021-22 and 2022-23).

- San Diego State is 11-2 this season when it outrebounds its opponent. (SDSU is 262-40 (.868) in the last 302)
- San Diego State is 12-0 this season when it attempts more free throws than its opponent. (SDSU is 247-33 (.882) in the last 280)
- San Diego State is 12-2 this season when it shoots a higher field goal percentage. (SDSU is 298-20 (.937) in the last 318)
- San Diego State is 8-1 this season when its opponent shoots 40% or lower. (SDSU is 314-40 (.887) in the last 354)
- San Diego State is 6-0 this season when it holds its opponent to under 60 points. (SDSU is 97-7 (.933) in the last 104)

- San Diego State has won 109 of its last 118 games (108-9; 92.4 percent) when holding its opponent to less than 60 points.
- San Diego State is 90-6 (93.8 percent) the last 96 times it has outrebounded its opponent.
- San Diego State has won 200 of its last 229 games (199-29; 87.3 percent) when it limits its opponent to 30.0 percent or less from 3-point range.
- In its last 421 games in which it has forced at least 10 turnovers, San Diego State has won 335 times (335-86; 79.6 percent).
- San Diego State is 68-11 (86.1 percent) in its last 79 games in which it had blocked at least three shots.
- San Diego State has won 32 of its last 36 games (32-4; 88.9 percent) when it limits its opponent to five or fewer offensive rebounds.
- San Diego State is 69-18 (79.3 percent) in its last 87 games in which it has at least five steals.
- San Diego State is 35-5 (87.5 percent) when **Lamont Butler** has multiple steals in a game.
- San Diego State is 19-4 (82.6 percent) when **Jaedon LeDee** has at least five defensive rebounds.

RESUME BUILDING

If there is anything that represents a good loss, then the Aztecs have got five of them.

- San Diego State has lost five times this year and each of the losses have come on the road and against Quad 1 opponents.
- The Aztecs losses are at Brigham Young (65-74, Nov. 10), Grand Canyon (73-79 on Dec. 5), at New Mexico (70-88 on Jan. 13), at Boise State (66-67 on Jan. 20) & at Colorado State (71-79 on Jan. 30).
- Among teams in the top 25 of the NET, through the games of Jan. 31, that have played at least seven Quad 1 games, San Diego State's five losses are the fourth fewest behind Purdue, Houston & Connecticut with two Quad 1 losses and Arizona, Wisconsin, & Kansas with three Quad 1 losses & Tennessee, Brigham young, Alabama, Iowa State, Illinois, Marquette & Baylor with four Quad 1 losses.
- Among the teams in the top 25 of the NET, San Diego State is one of nine teams which has not lost a Quad 2, 3, 4 or non-DI game (also: Houston, Purdue, Dayton, Connecticut, Iowa State, Auburn, Utah State & Iowa State).
- **Through the games of Jan. 31, San Diego State has the No. 11 NET strength of schedule.**

NON-CONFERENCE RECAP

Here is a brief look at the Aztecs non-conference slate:

- San Diego State finished the non-conference schedule with a 6-0 home record and owns a 98-10 mark in non-conference home games since the start of the 2002-10 season.
- Since the start of the 2019-20 campaign, San Diego State is 27-1 in non-conference home games and, including this season, has not lost a non-conference home contest in four of the last five seasons. It's lone non-conference home loss since the start of the 2019-20 was a 62-72 defeat at the hands of Brigham Young on Dec. 18, 2020.
- **San Diego State finished the non-conference slate 4-2 in Quad 1 & Quad 2 games, with both its losses coming in Quad 1 road games (at Brigham Young and Grand Canyon) and a Quad 1 win at Gonzaga.**

- The Aztecs went 3-0 in neutral site games and won the 2023 Continental Tire Main Event in Las Vegas after defeating Saint Mary's 79-54 and Washington 100-97. They then played California in the SoCal Showcase in San Juan Capistrano, Calif., and beat the Golden Bears 76-67 to win that event.
- Three of San Diego State's four true road games were Quad 1 games and SDSU went 2-2 on the road in those games including 1-2 in Quad 1 contests.
- Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee**, following the Continental Tire Main Event, was named Mountain West Player of the Week, NCAA March Madness National Player of the Week, Lute Olson Award National Player of the Week, ESPN National Player of the Week, Oscar Robertson Award National Player of the Week, and Continental Tire Main Event Most Valuable Player.
- Junior wing **Reese Waters** was named the SoCal Showcase Most Valuable Player.

CLOSING OUT OPPONENTS

San Diego State is one of the elite teams when it comes to closing out opponents and chalking up the wins.

- SDSU is 14-0 this year, 150-10 under Brian Dutcher and 403-14 in its last 417 games in which it has a lead with five minutes to play.
- The Aztecs are 13-1 in its last 14 games that have been decided by one possession or which have gone into overtime.
- Since Brian Dutcher took control of the program (since the start of the 2017-18 season), San Diego State has won 23-of-36 games (23-13) which have been decided by one possession or which have gone into overtime.

SEEING DOUBLES

Through its first 21 games, three Aztecs have combined to record 11 double doubles.

- San Diego State's 11 double doubles so far in 2023-24 are the most in a season since the 2018-19 squad totaled 13.
- If SDSU maintains its current pace of a double double every 0.5 games, it will finish the regular season with 16, tied for seventh most since the start of the 1975-76 season.
- The Aztecs' record for double doubles in a season since the start of 1975-76 is 36 in 2010-11, followed by 30 in 1983-84 and 1975-76.
- The most players in a single season to achieve a double double since the start of the 1975-76 campaign is seven in the 1976-77 season.
- Senior forward Jaedon LeDee leads the team with nine double doubles in 17 appearances, Reese Waters and Micah Parrish have one each.
- LeDee has a double double in three of his last four games. The record for consecutive games with a double double in a single season, since the start of 1975-76, is eight by Michael Cage in 1983-84...and he did it twice that year.
- The most consecutive double doubles for the program are Michael Cage's nine, which covered the final game of 1982-83 and the first eight of 1983-84.

TRAMMELL PLAYS BEAT THE CLOCK...AND WINS

If the Aztecs need a bucket in the last seconds of the first half Darion Trammell is the man they call on. The senior guard has made five shots in the last three seconds of the first half, the first three of which came in three successive games.

- Versus Washington (Nov. 19) Trammell splashed a 3-pointer with two seconds on the clock to send the Aztec to a 43-40 lead at the break and SDSU went on to win the game and the Continental Tire Main Event with a 100-97 victory in overtime
- Versus California (Nov. 25) Trammell sank a jumper in the paint with three seconds on the clock to push the Aztecs advantage to 39-34 en route to a 76-67 overtime win in the SoCal Showcase.
- Against Point Loma Nazarene (Nov. 27) Trammell nailed a driving layup, was fouled and completed the old school 3-point play with no time left on the clock to give the Aztecs a 41-26 lead on the way to a 71-51 decision.
- Against Stanford (Dec. 21), with no time on the clock, Trammell drove into the paint and hit a jumper to send San Diego State to the locker room with a 34-32 advantage. SDSU would go on to win the game 74-60.
- Against Wyoming (Jan. 23), Trammell hit a fall-away in the lane with three seconds to play in the half to give the Aztecs a 34-32 lead at the break, en route to an 81-65.

LEDEE GARNERS INCLUSION ON MID-SEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LISTS

Senior forward Jaedon LeDee received national recognition when both the Lute Olson and John R. Wooden Awards released their mid-season watch lists and LeDee earned inclusion on both.

A senior out of Houston, LeDee is the nation's fifth leading scorer, averaging 22.0 points per game, and ranks in the top-20 nationally in six additional statistical categories, including No. 9 in free throw attempts (128), No. 12 in points (330), free throws (94) and double doubles (8). In addition, he is No. 17 in field goals (113), and No. 19 in offensive rebounds per game (3.60).

LeDee has scored in double figures in each of his 15 appearances this season, reached 20 points in 10 of those contests, and totaled 30-plus points twice. He is one of two players in the nation who have multiple 30-plus point, 10-plus rebound games (also: Kansas' Hunter Dickinson). He has led the Aztecs in scoring in 11 games, in rebounding 12 times and in assists twice.

Sponsored by the Los Angeles Athletic Club and chosen by a poll of national college basketball experts based on their performances during the 2023-24 season thus far, the list comprises 25 student-athletes who are front-runners for the sport's most prestigious honor, the John R. Wooden Award. The winner of the Award will be announced following the NCAA Tournament in April.

The Lute Olson Award is named in honor of Hall of Fame coach Lute Olson, who won 776 games in 34 seasons, and was enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2002. The recipient of the award is determined by a 10-member voting committee, which consists of current and former head coaches, as well as two senior staff members of collegeinsider.com. The Lute Olson Award winner will be announced at the 2024 Final Four in Phoenix, Ariz.

BECAUSE YOU CAN NEVER HAVE ENOUGH LEDEE INFO

- Nationally Jaedon LeDee: No. 21 in scoring (20.5/g) & in the top-25 of four other statistical categories.
- One of three players in the nation w/ two games of at least 30 point and at least 10 rebounds this season, who shot 50.0 percent or better in each game (also: Kansas' Hunter Dickinson & Purdue's Zach Edey).
- Through Feb. 1 - Is one of two players in the nation to average at least 20.5 pts and 8.5 rebs while shooting at least 55.9 percent from the floor (also: Purdue's Zach Edey).
- Only player in the nation who is averaging at least 20.5 points and 8.5 rebounds while also have hit 11 3-pointers.
- The first Aztec since at least 1996-97 to have at least 34 points and 17 rebounds in a game (vs. Washington) and is the only player in Mountain West history to do it and shoot at least 50.0 percent.
- The first Aztecs to score 34 points in a game since Aerick Sanders vs. Portland on Dec. 31, 2003.
- The second Division I player over the last 10 seasons to score 20+ points on at least 55.0 percent shooting in the first five games of a

season, joining Obi Toppin in 2019-20 who did it en route to the Wooden Award.

STREAKS ON THE LINE FOR THE AZTECS ON SATURDAY

When the Aztecs play Utah State on Saturday here are the streaks that are on the line for SDSU:

- 44-game win streak when shooting 50 percent or better.
- 33-game win streak when attempting more free throws than its opponent.
- 25-game win streak when wearing its white uniforms.
- 22-game win streak when holding its opponent to under 60 points.
- 21-game win streak when leading with five minutes to play.
- 20-game win streak when leading at the half.
- 16-game win streak at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.
- 9-game win streak in games played on Saturday.
- 7-game win streak when committing fewer turnovers than its opponent.
- 4-game win streak against Utah State, regardless of location.

SERIES HISTORY VS. UTAH STATE

- This is the 28th meeting between the schools, with San Diego State winning 18 of the last 24 and overall holding a 18-9 advantage in the all-time series.
- San Diego State owns a comfortable 9-1 lead in games played in Viejas Arena but in the last six in Logan, SDSU is 2-4 in its last six meetings on the Aggies home floor. On a neutral floor, SDSU leads 4-3, with the Aztecs, having won the 2021 & 2023 Mountain West Championship games after losing the previous two to the Aggies (2019 & 2020 MW title game).
- SDSU has won the regular-season series (home-and-home) five times, it has been tied twice, and the Aggies have won once, in the eight seasons in which both teams have been members of the Mountain West. The Aztecs swept the regular season home-and-home series, 85-75 on January 25 at Steve Fisher Court and 63-61 in Logan on February 8 and defeated Utah State in the 2023 Mountain West Championship game 62-57 on March 11.
- In 2020-21, San Diego State suffered its only season series loss to the Aggies.
- The series began in 1962 with Utah State winning the first meeting 101-57, and then went on to win the next two matchups. Beginning with the fourth game of the series, in 2014, the Aztecs won 11 straight. During that 11-game span, San Diego State had an average winning margin of 13.2 points. The streak included a 73-39 victory in the quarterfinal game of the 2014 Mountain West Tournament. The 34-point win is SDSU's largest margin of victory in 55 MW tourney games. The Aggies had won three straight meetings prior to SDSU's 2021 Mountain West Tournament championship game and in 2021-22 each team held serve on its home floor.

LAS VEGAS - Matt Bradley scored 16 points and Jaedon LeDee added 13 to lead No. 20 San Diego State to a 62-57 victory over Utah State in Saturday's Mountain West Tournament championship game.

The Aztecs (27-6) claimed their seventh tournament title, and second in three years. This also was their conference-record 15th appearance in the title game.

San Diego State clinched the conference's bid to the NCAA Tournament, though it was never in doubt the Aztecs would be selected. What kind of seed San Diego State receives remains to be seen.

Utah State (26-8) also figures to be headed to the tournament when the selections are announced Sunday.

This was the fourth time in the last five years the teams have played each other in the Mountain West championship game. Utah State won the 2019 and 2020 title games, and San Diego State went home with the 2021 trophy. Boise State temporarily ended the monopoly last season by beating the Aztecs 53-52.

Neither team shot well Saturday, with San Diego State making 33.3% of its shots compared to 37.1% for the Aggies.

No San Diego State players reached double-figure scoring other than LeDee and Bradley. For Utah State, Steven Ashworth scored 13 points and Trevin Dorius 12.

The Aggies were hot early, however, going on a 12-2 run in the first half to take a 26-15 lead with 6:57 left, but then went cold. They failed to make another field goal until 1:43 into the second half, but somehow didn't fall behind during that stretch.

But the Aztecs got close, and eventually went back and forth with Utah State in the second half. San Diego State nearly put away the game by going up 53-46 with 3:03 left, but the Aggies got back to within three points with 48 seconds remaining and two points with 30.3 seconds to go.

San Diego State closed out the game at the free throw line by making 9 of 10 free throws in the final 43 seconds.

THE BIG PICTURE

San Diego State: The Aztecs come in waves. Nine players were in the game, and each was on the floor for at least 16 minutes and eight at least 19. All nine scored and collected rebounds.

Utah State: The Aggies entered the game fourth nationally in 3-point percentage at 40.1, but struggled badly against San Diego State's long, athletic defense. Utah State made just 4 of 24 3-point attempts.

UP NEXT

San Diego State: A potential six seed could be coming San Diego State's way, but the Aztecs also might have worked their way into a No. 5.

Utah State: The Aggies have a NET ranking of No. 18, so it would be quite a surprise if they aren't selected to the NCAA Tournament.

SAN DIEGO STATE VS. THE MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

- San Diego State is 434-315 (.579) overall against current members of the Mountain West Conference. (H: 252-91, A: 143-203, N: 39-21)
- San Diego State is 98-98 all-time in road contests against all members of the Mountain West (since the start of the 1999-00 season). Of those 98 victories, 48 have come by 10 or more points.
- The Aztecs are 156-44 (.780) all-time at home against all members of the Mountain West (since the start of the 1999-00 season). Of those 156 victories, 95 have come by 10 or more points.
- SDSU has won 28 of its last 30 (28-2; 93.3 percent) league games at Steve Fisher Court and has outscored its opponents by 16.5 points per game in those contests.
- Historically in league contests, against all members of the Mountain West, San Diego State has a 254-142 (.641) record.

DUTCHER KEEPS THE PARTY GOING

Brian Dutcher has been on The Mesa for now 25 seasons, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he's experienced 553 victories, 16 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 17 postseason tournaments, including 12 NCAA appearances, a three of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014, 20223) and last season past the Sweet 16, to the Elite 8, Final Four and 2023 national championship game.

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured six Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each of his six years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first six seasons.
- His 151 wins in his first six seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first six campaigns.
- His 167 wins to date are the most of any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.**
- His .763-career winning percentage is the sixth best in the nation since the start of the 2017-18 season.**
- At the start of the 2023-24, in a minimum of 100 games coached, Brian Dutcher ranked No. 4 among winningest head coaches nationally with a .763 winning percentage.
- Dutcher is the No. 24-ranked head coach in the nation according to *CBSSport.com* top-25 and 1 coaches' rating.

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

San Diego State will play three neutral site and 13 true road games during the 2023-24 regular season and here are some road and neutral site facts about SDSU:

- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 104-64 (.619) record in road games is the seventh best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 67-32 (.677) record in neutral site games (min. 95 games) is the sixth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, in a minimum of 250 games, San Diego State's 171-96 (.640) record in road/neutral games is the sixth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 74-48 (.607) record in road games against the Mountain West, leads the conference.

WATERS MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK & ON OSCAR ROBERTSON NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK

For leading all scorers with 22 points with five rebounds, two assists and two steals without committing a turnover or foul in the Aztecs' 84-74 victory at No. 13/16 Gonzaga on Dec. 29, junior wing **Reese Waters** was named the Mountain West Men's Basketball Player of the Week and was included on the USBWA's Oscar Robertson National Team of the Week.

- Waters went 8-of-11 from the floor (.727), including hitting 3-of-5 three-pointers (.600) and was 3-of-4 (.750) from the free throw line in a team-high 35:28 of action.
- Scored 15 of his 22 points in the second half, including nine points in an 18-3 run over 3:40 (from 17:0- to-13:26), which gave SDSU its largest lead of the game, 15-points at 62-47.
- Four of his eight buckets came with the scored tied or SDSU up or down by three points, including a 3-pointer with 6:03 to play and the Zags within three, 68-65.
- He became just the second Aztec under Brian Dutcher to record at least 20 points, two assists, two steals and zero turnovers in a game (also Malichi Flynn at UNLV on Jan. 26, 2020).
- The honors are the first for Waters this year and the second each for an Aztec this season.

PERFECT FROM THE LINE GOES BY THE WAYSIDE

Junior wing Reese Waters began the season a perfect 40-of-40 from the free throw line through the 12th game of the year.

- At Gonzaga, Waters pushed the streak to 43-of-43, but with 23 seconds to play saw his final attempt rim out.
- Nationally through the games of Jan. 27, he has made 49-of-53 attempts (92.5 percent) from the charity stripe which, if he met the minimum of 2.5 made per game, would be the seventh best percentage in the nation.**
- The Aztecs single-season free throw percentage leader at San Diego State is Kim Goetz who was 74-of-82 (90.2 percent) from the charity stripe in the 1978-79 campaign.

1,000-CAREER POINTS AND BEYOND

At New Mexico, senior guard **Darrion Trammell**, who finished the game 12 points, eclipsed the 1,500-career point milestone and enters the Utah State game with 1,531-career points.

- Trammell is one of two active players, who stand 5-11 or less, who have scored at least 1,500 career points (also: California's Jalen Cone).
- When the Aztecs played at Grand Canyon on Dec. 5, senior wing **Micah Parrish** started the game with 996-career points, scored 10 in the game to pass the 1,000-point milestone and enters the Utah State matchup with 1,116-career points.
- Senior forward Jaedon LeDee entered the Colorado State game with 998-career points, got to 1,000 on his first shot, finished the game with 13 points and enters the Utah State game with 1,011 career points.
- Parrish is the fifth and LeDee is the sixth player to reach 1,000-career points while wearing an Aztec kit since the start of the 2019-20 season. (also: Malachi Flynn & Matt Mitchell in 2019-20, Jordan Schakel in 2020-21 and Matt Bradley in 2022-23). Note: Flynn scored 564 of his 1,355-career points while at SDSU, Bradley, who scored 2,322-career points, had 1,033 at San Diego State and 1,289 at California, Parrish has scored 499 in Scarlet and Black & 617 at Oakland, and LeDee totaled 292 points in 79 games at Ohio State and 719 in the 59 games he has competed in for SDSU.

- Senior guard **Lamont Butler** comes into the game against the Aggies with 863-career points and would need to average 12.5 points per game in the remaining 11 games guaranteed to the Aztecs to reach 1,000-career points.

LAST TIME OUT

Colorado State 79, San Diego State 71

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - Isaiah Stevens and Nique Clifford each scored 20 points as Colorado State knocked off San Diego State 79-71 at Moby Arena on Tuesday evening.

After trailing by as many as 14 points, San Diego State came all the way back to take the lead at 61-60 with seven minutes and change remaining in the game. However, Colorado State came back with a 19-10 run to close out an eight point win.

"We have to execute. They executed," said SDSU Head Coach Brian Dutcher following the defeat. "They did enough to win and 15 turnovers is too many after two last game. They had 10. They shot 54 percent. They're a good team. I mean, this was a ranked team a week ago, on their home court."

Clifford added ten rebounds for the Rams (16-5, 4-4 Mountain West Conference). Stevens tacked on six rebounds to lead CSU. Joel Scott (15 points) and Isaiah Strong (10 points) also finished in double figures for Colorado State.

The Aztecs (16-5, 5-3) were led by Reese Waters, who scored 17 points on 7-of-9 shooting while making all three of his three point attempts. Lamont Butler added 16 points, five rebounds and four assists just a game after matching a career-high with 23 points. Jaedon LeDee posted 13 points and seven rebounds to continue his streak of ten or more points in every game this season. LeDee's first basket of the night made him a member of the 1,000 point club, with 708 of those points coming over his past two seasons in the Scarlet and Black.

SDSU outshot Colorado State from beyond the arc (43.5 percent-33.3 percent) and the free throw line (100.0 percent-72.7 percent) but the Rams were better from the field (53.8 percent-45.0 percent). San Diego State had three more rebounds (31-28).

San Diego State returns to Viejas Arena to play No. 17-ranked Utah State on Saturday, February 3 at 12:30 p.m. The game will be broadcast on FOX and San Diego Sports 760.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 142-35 (.802) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but four of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 103 home games against those 24 opponents, San Diego State is 92-11 (.893).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 476-325 (.594) overall.

San Diego State is 9-0 against in-state competition this year, having already defeated Cal State Fullerton, Long Beach State, Saint Mary's, California, UC San Diego, UC Irvine, Stanford, Fresno State, at San Jose State, with games at Fresno State (2/24) and vs. San Jose State (2/27) to come.

SOCAL SHOWCASE

On its 76-67 overtime victory over California on Saturday, Nov. 25 in San Juan Capistrano, Calif., SDSU won the inaugural SoCal Showcase.

- With the win, SDSU has won each of its three regular-season neutral site games in the 2023-24 season.
- The Aztecs complete a regular season sweep of its neutral site games, a minimum of three games played, for the fifth time in the Dutcher/Fisher era (also: 2019-20, 3-0; 2016-17, 3-0; 2011-12, 3-0; 2010-11, 5-0)
- Junior wing **Reese Waters** was named the game's inaugural Most Valuable Player, finishing with career-highs with 24 points and seven rebounds.
- In combination with its 100-97 overtime win against Washington at the Continental Tire Main Event, San Diego State has played in back-to-back overtime games for the first time since Feb. 12, 2005 vs. UNLV & Feb. 19, 2005 at Colorado State.
- San Diego State won back-to-back overtime games for the first time since Dec. 21, 1993 vs. CSUN & Dec. 23, 1993 at Loyola Marymount.

OVERTIME GAMES

When San Diego State went to overtime in its 76-67 win against California at the SoCal Showcase in San Juan Capistrano, Calif.

- It improved its overtime record to 42-41 since it went to the Division I level prior to the 1970-71 season.
- In the California game, the Aztecs won their straight overtime affair and since the 2005-06 season SDSU is 27-4 in overtime games.
- In neutral site games which have gone into overtime, San Diego State improved to 8-3.
- Since the start of the 1970-71 campaign, the Aztecs are 5-4 in double overtime contests and 0-2 in triple overtime games.

CONTINENTAL TIRE MAIN EVENT

With its 100-97 win in overtime against Washington on Nov. 19, San Diego State won the Continental Tire Main Event at T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas.

- With the win, SDSU has emerged the champion in three of its four MTEs (Multi-Team Event) played in Las Vegas - 2010 Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic, 2019 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational & 2023 Continental Tire Main Event & was the runner-up at the 2015 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational.
- Jaedon LeDee, in two games, averaged 29.5 points, 12.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists while adding three steals and a block. LeDee shot 54.1 percent from the floor (20-of-37), 33.3 percent from the bonus distance (1-of-3) and 78.3 percent from the line (18-of-23). Among his 25 boards, 12 were on the offensive glass and he drew 19 fouls.
- LeDee was named the Most Valuable Player for the event and earned inclusion on the all-tournament team.
- Michah Parrish was named to the all-tournament team after averaging 13.0 points, 3.5 assists, 3.0 rebounds and added seven assists, three steals and a block. Parrish shot 42.9 percent from both the floor and 3-point range, knocking down 6-of-14 shots from the field and 3-of-7 from distance, and 91.7 percent from the line (11-of-12).

A JAEDON LEDEE WEEK

For **Jaedon LeDee**, his three games during the week of Nov. 14 are to be remembered for a number of reasons:

- LeDee matched his career-high in points on Nov. 14 vs. Long Beach State and then bettered it on Sunday against Washington with 34 and also grabbed a career-best 17 rebounds.
- LeDee is the first Aztec since at least 1996-97 to have at least 34 points and 17 rebounds in a game and is the only player in Mountain West history to do it and shoot at least 50.0 percent (10-of-20 FG).

- Is the first Aztecs with at least 34 points in a game since Aerick Sanders vs. Portland on Dec. 31, 2003.
- Had two of his four double doubles on the year: 27pts/11 rebs vs. Long Beach State & 34 pts/17 rebs vs. Washington.

JAEDON LEDEE NAMED MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee** was named the Mountain West Conference Player of the Week for the week ending Sunday, November 19. The announcement was made for the conference office in Colorado Springs, Colorado on Monday, Nov. 20.

The Houston, Texas native, led the Aztecs to a 3-0 record while averaging 28.7 points, 12.0 rebounds, 2.3 assists, 2.0 steals and added a block. In three games he shot 57.1 percent from the floor (28-of-39), including 50.0 percent from the bonus distance (2-of-4) and 84.8 percent from the line (28-of-33). In addition, he dished out seven assists, had six steals and a block.

After wins over Saint Mary's on Friday night and Washington on Sunday evening at the Continental Tire Main Event in Las Vegas, LeDee earned inclusion on the all-tournament team and was honored as the tournament MVP.

In the championship game, a 100-97 overtime thriller against Washington on Sunday evening, he became the first Aztec since at least the start of the 1996-97 season to total at least 34 points and 17 rebounds in a game and is the only player in Mountain West history to do it and shoot at least 50.0 percent from the field. It was his second double double of the week. He shot 50.0 percent from the field (10-of-20), and 77.8 percent from the charity stripe (14-of-18), with three assists, a steal and a block.

His 34 points against the Huskies marked the first time that an Aztec had scored 34 points in a game since Aerick Sanders versus Portland on Dec. 31, 2003.

To start the week, LeDee equaled his career-high with 27 points against Long Beach State where he was 8-of-12 (66.7 percent) from the field, including 1-of-1 from beyond the arc, and 10-of-10 from the line with eight rebounds, three steals and two assists.

In the opener of the Continental Tire Main Event against Saint Mary's, LeDee went for 25 points on 10-of-17 shooting (58.8 percent), including 1-of-2 from distance (50.0 percent) and 4-of-5 from the line (80.0 percent). He had eight boards, two assists and two steals.

LeDee is the second Division I player over the last 10 seasons to score 20+ points on at least 55.0 percent shooting in the first five games of a season, joining Obi Toppin in 2019-20 en route to the Wooden Award.

This is LeDee's first Mountain West Player of the Week award of the year and his career and the first for an Aztec this season.

JAEDON LEDEE NAMED CONTINENTAL TIRE MAIN EVENT MVP: PARRISH HONORED

For averaging 29.5 points, 12.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists while adding five steals and a block in wins over Saint Mary's, 79-54, and Washington, 100-97 in overtime, **Jaedon LeDee** was named the Most Valuable Player of the tournament and was included on the all-tournament team. He totaled 77 minutes and committed just three turnovers while drawing 19 fouls.

Micah Parrish scored at a 13.0 points per game clip at the tournament while dishing out 3.5 assists and grabbing 3.0 rebounds to go along with three steals and a block to garner all-tournament team honors.

THE CENTURY MARK

When San Diego State defeated Washington 100-97 on Sunday, Nov. 19, it was the 43rd time in its Division I history that the Aztecs reached the century mark.

- With the win, San Diego State moves to 40-3 when it scores at least 100 points in a game and has won 28 straight when reaching 100 points.
- SDSU cracked triple digits for the first time in 169 games: a first since a 103-64 win over Texas Southern on Nov. 14, 2018.
- All three losses, when scoring at least 100 points, occurred in the 1976-77 season and within a six-game span. The first two came within nine days and three games of each other: a 113-118 loss to then No. 5-ranked UNLV on Dec. 11, 1976 in the Sports Arena and a 104-107 defeat at New Mexico on Dec. 20, 1976. The third came on Jan. 3, 1977 against North Texas in Peterson Gym with the final score of 100-108.

BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

Seventh Season • 25th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his seventh season as head coach after leading the Aztecs to six Mountain West title games, their conference-high 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th and 16th Mountain West titles and four trips to the NCAA tournament, including a run to the 2023 national championship game.

Dutcher, who ascended to head coach following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Over the course of his 24 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 17 times, including 12 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 16 Mountain West titles and record 18 seasons of at least 20 victories. He is the only coach in the 102-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first six seasons and his 151 victories are the most of any first-time Division I head coach who began at their current institution since the start of the 2017-18 season.

His .763-win percentage (151-47) entering the 2023-24 season is the best in program history, as is his .550-win percentage (11-9) against top-25 opposition.

In 2017-18, Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors, Trey Kell and Malik Pope, that had won multiple league titles and had NCAA tournament experience. The Aztecs won six consecutive games to end the regular season and captured the program's 11th crown, the Mountain West tournament title, and returned to the NCAA tournament. Dutcher was the only first-year head coach to guide his team to the 2018 NCAA tourney and one of six to have won at least 20 games. SDSU finished the campaign with a 22-11 record, with the 22 wins representing the most by a first-year Aztec men's basketball head coach and the second-most among first-year coaches that season.

The 2018-19 season saw the Aztecs return to the Mountain West championship game after twice defeating nationally ranked Nevada, including a 65-56 victory over the Wolf Pack in the semifinal of the MW tournament. The team was 21-13, the 13th consecutive season with at least 19 victories.

In 2019-20, his squad ripped off a program-record 26 straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at No. 4 in both the AP and Coaches top-25 polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2 on the year, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), NABC Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and USBWA District IX Coach of the Year. In addition, he was a finalist for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, the team's 30 wins are the fifth most and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in MW play are the most in program history. Its one loss in league action is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak also which set a Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus All-American Malachi Flynn, who would be a first-round selection of the NBA Toronto Raptors, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blowout victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. In addition, the Aztecs handed Utah a 28-point loss in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic, three days after the Utes beat No. 6 Kentucky.

In the COVID-affected season of 2020-21, the Aztecs were once again the cream of the Mountain West crop posting a 23-5 record, including a 14-3 mark in league play. San Diego State earned the league's regular season and tournament crowns and in the NCAA tournament were a 6-seed. For the second consecutive campaign, Dutcher was named Coach of the Year of both the Mountain West and NABC Division I District 17.

The Aztecs opened 2020-21 with a win over No. 22 UCLA and later won at No. 23 Arizona State. The team reached the MW title game for the fourth straight season earning a measure of revenge in the championship game, defeating Utah State, 68-57, which had had knocked them off in the previous two league title games.

The team was led by seniors Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel, who became the 34th and 35th players in program history, respectively, to score 1,000 points in their careers. Mitchell was named an honorable-mention AP All-American honors, Mountain West Player of the Year, first-team All-Mountain West, Mountain West All-Defensive Team, NABC first-team All-District 17, USBWA first-team All-District IX, Basketball Times West Coast All-District Team, Mountain West Tournament Most Valuable Player, Mountain West All-Tournament Team and was the sixth player, and first Aztec, in Mountain West history to earn Player of the Year & Tournament MVP in the same year. Schakel was second-team All-Mountain West, NABC second-team All-District 17 and a Mountain West All-Tournament Team honoree.

The 2021-22 campaign demonstrated that despite losing its top three scorers from the previous

season, the Aztecs reload while other programs rebuild. For the fifth consecutive year, Dutcher guided the Aztecs to 20-plus wins (23-9), and a bid to the NCAA tournament, the third since taking the helm of the program. If not for the cancellation of the 2020 NCAA tournament, SDSU, which was projected to be a No. 1 or No. 2 seed with a 30-2 record, the 2021-22 season would have marked the program's third straight, and fourth overall, NCAA appearance under Dutcher.

San Diego State authored a 79-49 dismantling of No. 20 Colorado State at Viejas Arena, the worst beating SDSU has ever handed to a ranked opponent, and a 63-58 win over the No. 23 Rams in the semifinal of the Mountain West Championship. Entering 2022-23, Dutcher was 5-0 against top-25 opponents in Viejas Arena and 9-6 overall against ranked teams.

Matt Bradley, a transfer from California, slipped seamlessly into the Aztecs offense, led the team in scoring, 16.9 points per game, and was named the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, first-team All-Mountain West, second team NABC All-District 17 and earned both ESPN and NCAA March Madness National Player of the Week honors. In addition, sophomore guard Lamont Butler was a Mountain West All-Defensive Team designee and Chad Baker was the league's sixth man of the year.

The years leading to 2022-23 set the stage for men's basketball history. Following its 15th and 16th Mountain West Crowns, San Diego State earned a No. 5-seed in the NCAA Tournament and began the most epic run in program history. In its 10th appearance in the last 13 NCAA Tournaments, the Aztecs ended five multi-game win streaks in snapping the College of Charleston's 10-game win streak in the NCAA First Round and Furman's seven-game win streak in the second round. It then ended No. 1/2 Alabama's five-game win streak in the Sweet 16, Creighton's three-game win streak in the Elite 8 and Florida Atlantic's 11-game win streak in the Final Four.

SAN DIEGO - Jaedon LeDee scored six of his career-high 27 points in the first three minutes of the second half and No. 17 San Diego State broke open a close game to beat Cal State Fullerton 83-57 in their season opener Monday night.

LeDee also pulled down 10 rebounds for SDSU, runner-up for last season's national title. Before the game, the school unveiled banners for being an NCAA finalist and for winning the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns. The Aztecs reached their first Final Four, beat Florida Atlantic 72-71 on Lamont Butler's buzzer-beater and then lost to UConn 76-59 in the championship game.

"It's great. I'm going to look at it every day and then go to work," coach Brian Dutcher said. "Step onto Steve Fisher Court and look at a Final Four banner. A lot of good stuff's happened here. And the crowd tonight, come on. The energy in the building was incredible. We feed off that. It's a fun place to play and a fun place to come watch a game. It was exciting."

Micah Parrish had five 3-pointers and scored 17 for SDSU, while newcomer Reese Waters added 15.

The Aztecs went on a 15-4 run after the Titans closed to 39-38 on Grayson Carper's 3 early in the second half. The spurt started when LeDee scored six straight points, including a coast-to-coast dunk and a 3-point play. Elijah Saunders had a steal and dunk, Parrish hit a 3 and Butler sank a jumper to make it 54-42.

The Aztecs say it's time to move on from last year's thrilling run through March Madness.

Dominic Brewton scored 13 for the Titans. Max Jones had 11 points and Donovan Oday added 10.

San Diego State lost five key players from last season's team, including leading scorer Matt Bradley and leading rebounder Nathan Mensah. Aztecs guard Darrin Trammell, the leading returning scorer, has been sidelined with a shoulder injury since early October.

SDSU is at former league rival BYU on Friday night, where the Aztecs are 4-30 overall but have split the last two games there.

PROVO, Utah - Dallin Hall scored 16 of his 18 points in the second half to lead BYU to a 74-65 victory over No. 17 San Diego State on Friday night.

Jaxson Robinson, Richie Saunders and Fousseyni Traore each finished with 12 points for the Cougars and Traore grabbed a team-high eight rebounds as BYU earned just its fifth victory over an AP Top 25 opponent in coach Mark Pope's tenure.

Hall and Trevin Knell combined for three 3-pointers to fuel a 9-0 run that gave BYU a 57-50 lead with 5:30 left.

Micah Parrish cut the deficit to two on back-to-back baskets, but the Aztecs were unable to draw closer. Hall made a pair of free throws and followed with a pair of baskets to help boost BYU's lead to 66-57 with 2:34 remaining.

Hall, who is working his way back from a knee injury, played for 25 minutes.

Jaedon LeDee led San Diego State with 21 points and seven rebounds and Reese Waters chipped in 15 points.

Keeping BYU off the glass proved to be a chore for the Aztecs. The Cougars outrebounded San Diego State 42-32.

The Cougars missed 13 of their first 17 shots as they struggled to create a consistent rhythm against a stifling Aztec defense.

Once Robinson got going, however, San Diego State struggled to cool off the Cougars.

BYU took its first lead midway through the half, going up 17-15 on Robinson's 3-pointer that capped a 7-0 run. Robinson then made back-to-back baskets to fuel a 10-0 run that put the Cougars up 29-20.

The Aztecs went 5 1/2 minutes without making a basket late in the first half. They missed seven straight shots and committed four turnovers in that stretch.

BYU outscored San Diego State 42-9 in bench points. Hall, Robinson, and Saunders — three of the Cougars' top four scorers — did not start. Hall and Robinson combined for six of BYU's 10 3-pointers.

The Aztecs were thin on bench depth because of injuries to rotation players Miles Byrd and Demarshay Johnson, Jr.

San Diego State: Prolonged scoring droughts and a lack of depth put the Aztecs in a tough position. San Diego State has some work to do to reach a similar level it enjoyed a season ago when it reached the national championship game.

SAN DIEGO - Senior forward Jaedon LeDee matched his career-high with 27 points to lead the San Diego State Aztecs in an 88-76 win over Long Beach State on Tuesday evening at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

LeDee also contributed 11 rebounds and three steals for the Aztecs who improve to 2-1 on the year. Reese Waters scored 15 points for the third time in as many games while shooting 5-of-10, including 3-of-6 from beyond the arc. Lamont Butler had 14 points and shot 5-for-10 (2-of-6 from 3-point range) and 2-of-3 from the free throw line. Micah Parrish added 13 points also on 5-of-10 from the floor and Elijah Saunders set a career-best with 11 points and pulled down six rebounds. Each of the aforementioned five players started the game and the contest marked the first time all five SDSU starters reached double digits in the scoring column since Feb. 16, 2020, when the Aztecs won 72-55 at Boise State.

SDSU won its 36th straight game against a current Big West school. In addition, SDSU defeated Long Beach State for the 16th time in the last 17 meetings between these programs, regardless of location, and for the eighth straight time.

San Diego State got the first bucket of the contest, a LeDee layup just 16 second in, and never trailed in the game for the second time in three games this season. SDSU used a 10-0 run over 2:08 of the first half to turn a 15-12 lead into a 25-12 advantage with 10:36 to play before intermission and took a 47-39 lead into the break.

The Beach (1-2) which were led in scoring by Marcus Tsohonis, who finished with 17 points, cut the lead to three twice early in the second half. But the Aztecs put together a 12-2 run midway through the half to go up 78-63 and never looked back in the 12 point victory.

San Diego State returns to action on Friday, when it plays Saint Mary's College in its opening game at the Continental Tire Main Event in Las Vegas.

SPOKANE, Wash. - Reese Waters scored 15 of his 22 points in the second half, Jaedon LeDee added 20 points, and San Diego State used a big second half to beat No. 13 Gonzaga 84-74 on Friday night.

The Aztecs (11-2) won their fourth straight and dominated long stretches late in the first half and early in the second half to take the nonconference matchup between two of the better programs on the West Coast.

"We're definitely happy. We came into a hostile environment, a team that's really good, ranked high and we came out and did what we were supposed to do," Waters said. "I think we're a really good team. We had two losses unfortunately but I don't think that defines who we are as a team."

San Diego State handed Gonzaga (9-4) its first nonconference loss on its home floor since falling to UCLA on Dec. 12, 2015. It was just the third home loss overall for the Zags since the start of the 2017 season and their first double-digit home loss since falling to Illinois 85-74 in December 2012.

"I thought we fought and hung in there and battled and played with great spirit, but we didn't play smart enough during this whole game," Gonzaga coach Mark Few said. "They deserve a lot of credit to come on the road and they played great."

After reaching the national title game last season, the Aztecs played a difficult nonconference schedule and lost road games at No. 14 BYU and at Grand Canyon. Winning at Gonzaga will likely be significant for San Diego State's NCAA tournament resume come March.

"We challenged ourselves. Most teams play a lot of these games at neutral sites and we decided we were going to go to Grand Canyon, we were going to go to BYU, we were going to go to Gonzaga and challenge ourselves," San Diego State head coach Brian Dutcher said.

Darrion Trammell added a season-high 17 points, including 15 in the first half and kept the Aztecs hanging around through some early struggles. But it was the end of the first half and start of the second half where the Aztecs took control and built a big enough lead to withstand Gonzaga's late rally.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State opened Mountain West play with a commanding 74-47 win over Fresno State on Wednesday night. The 27-point victory is the second-largest margin of victory for the Aztecs in series history.

The Aztecs (12-2, 1-0 Mountain West) had three scorers in double-figures led by Jaedon LeDee's 21, his eighth 20-point game this season. Micah Parrish and Lamont Butler each added 11 points in the victory. Parrish also pulled down a game high seven rebounds while Butler dished out a game high four assists.

As a team, SDSU shot 53% from the field while holding Fresno State to 35% shooting. The Aztecs also dominated the glass, 39-28 with 31 coming on the defensive end.

Fresno State (7-7, 0-1 MW) put points on the board first, but the Scarlet and Black responded with a 9-0 run to put them in front by eight. From there, SDSU never looked back taking a 13-point lead into halftime.

Similar to how the night started, the Bulldogs scored first coming out of the break, but the Aztecs responded with another huge scoring run to give themselves a 20-point advantage by the first media timeout of the second half.

The lead never dropped below 20 the rest of the night as the Aztecs cruised to a 74-47 win for their ninth consecutive victory over Fresno State.

It also marks the largest margin of victory over the Bulldogs since Jan 6, 1940, the second-ever meeting between the two programs.

Up next for San Diego State is UNLV on Saturday. Tip-off from Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena will be at 1 p.m. on CBS.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State took control from the opening tip and never looked back in a 72-61 victory over UNLV on Saturday afternoon.

Jaedon LeDee led the game with 20 points and 11 rebounds for his seventh double-double of the season. The senior forward nearly had the double-double in the first half alone with 11 points and eight boards at the half.

Micah Parrish and Darrion Trammell each reached double-figures as well with 14 and 10, respectively.

The Aztecs (13-2, 2-0 Mountain West) jumped out to a commanding 15-point lead through the first seven minutes of the contest. In that stretch, they shot 6-of-9 (66.7%) from the field while the defense held the Rebels (7-6, 0-1 MW) to a measly 1-of-11 (9.1%). At the break, the SDSU defense was holding UNLV to just 14% shooting from the field leading to a 10-point advantage for the Scarlet and Black.

UNLV came out of halftime with a 13-6 scoring run to shrink the Aztec lead to six points, but that is the closest they would get as San Diego State took their advantage back into double-digits and cruised the rest of the way for the 71-61 victory.

Up next for San Diego State is their first road competition of Mountain West play as they head to San Jose State for a matchup with the Spartans. Tip will be at 8 p.m. on CBS Sports Network.
