No. 17 Ranked Aztecs to Host Annual Barona Creek Collegiate Cup

• The 17th ranked San Diego State men's golf team will open the Barona Collegiate Cup at the 7,088 yard, 72 par Barona Creek Golf Course, in Lakeside, Calif. on Monday, Oct. 24 at 7:30 a.m. PDT. The tournament will begin with two, 18 hole rounds on Monday and end with the final 18 holes on Tuesday.

The Aztecs will be represented by two teams at their home tournament. The first team will include Andrew Scott, David Palm, Josh Warthen, Aaron Goldberg and John Gray, while the second team will feature Chris Cole, Chad Moscovic, Jamie Puterbaugh, Jason Puterbaugh and Cory Segall.

Although the Aztecs are returning to the familiar greens of Barona Creek, they will have several obstacles to overcome. The first will be a competitive field that features BYU, Louisville, Missouri and Texas Tech, all of whom are currently ranked in the top 50 nationally.

"This tournament will be really good for us," head coach Ryan Donovan said. "We're going to be challenged by several top tier teams that include teams such as BYU, who won the tournament and individual competition last year. But I definitely expect our team to be in contention for the top spots."

Along with the competitive field, the Aztecs also has focus on trying not getting ahead of themselves in their own home tournament. Donovan noted that the teams' biggest challenge will be to stay in the moment of the game, and not become too relaxed because the tournament is held on a familiar course.

SDSU Men's Golf Closes Out Lexus Classic in Second

• After closing out the first day of competition in the lead, the 17th ranked San Diego State men's golf team fell to second place on the second and final day of play at the Fresno State Lexus Classic, held on the 6,776 yard, par 71 course at the San Joaquin Country Club in Fresno, Calif.

During the first two rounds on Friday, Oct. 14, the Aztecs were in a tight race for first with the University of Denver, before the Aztecs pulled ahead to end the first day of play three strokes under Denver and in first.

The second and final day proved to be more challenging due to intensified, stormy weather conditions. SDSU finished with a final team score of 283 284 298 865. This was SDSU's third consecutive second place finish in the Lexus Classic. SDSU has never placed below the top 5 in this tournament since the 1999 00 season.

Andrew Scott led the Aztecs with a 3 over par final score of 216 and a sixth place finish. Scott has led all Aztec players in the previous two appearances at the Lexus Classic, carding two consecutive second place finishes (2003, 2004).

Along with Scott, sophomore Aaron Goldberg and junior John Gray also finished in the top 10, tying for 7th with a 4 over, 217.

David Palm and Josh Warthen, who shared co medalist honors at the Club Glove Intercollegiate last week, tied for 23rd after finishing 8 over par (221).

History in Barona Collegiate Cup

• Before fall 2001 season, the Aztec's home tournament was called the Aztec Invitational originally held in Murrieta, Calif. During fall 2001 season, the Aztecs' home tournament was moved to the Barona Creek Golf Course and renamed to the Barona Collegiate Cup.

• During the first year of the Barona Collegiate Cup, the Aztecs finished in second place, with then Aztec John Lieber taking fourth. The following year, the Aztecs won the team and individual tournament.

• In the history of the Barona Collegiate Cup, SDSU has placed within the top 10 three times over the past four years.
