► **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team heads on its final road trip of the regular season Saturday, when it takes on Colorado State at Moby Arena beginning at 2 p.m. MT. SDSU is coming of a much need victory at home against UNLV on Wednesday, which saw the Aztecs equal their conference win total from all of last season, as well as gain their 14th victory of the campaign, the team's most overall since 1996-97. The Rams, meanwhile, are winless in the Mountain West Conference this year, going 0-13 and are 2-24 overall in 2007-08. SDSU won the earlier meeting between the two schools by a 34-point margin, but haven't come out on top in Fort Collins since 2000.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the third year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 261-200 in 15 seasons, while she is 180-135 in her 10 previous campaigns at SDSU.

► **CSU Head Coach Jen Warden:** Warden is in her third season at CSU. Her school record is 19-65, while her six-year head coaching mark is 48-124.

► **CSU Series History:** SDSU leads the overall series, 19-15, but trails 9-6 in games played in Fort Collins. The Aztecs won the earlier meeting between the two sides, but has not come out victorious at CSU since 2000. (Last: SDSU def. CSU, 86-52, in San Diego, Calif. on Jan. 30, 2008).

## Aztec Women's Hoops Embarks On Final Regular Season Road Trip Saturday At Colorado State

The San Diego State women's basketball team heads to Fort Collins, Colo., Saturday for its final road game of the regular season against Colorado State at 2 p.m. at Moby Arena. The Aztecs are coming off a much needed win over UNLV this past Wednesday at home, 68-50, to earn their 14th victory of the year and fifth in conference action. SDSU has already tallied its most wins since 1996-97, matched its league victory total from last year and also swept a MWC foe other than Air Force for just the second time in conference history. The Aztecs are looking to go 2-0 this season versus Colorado State after beating the last place Rams 86-52 in San Diego back on Jan. 30.

## Strong Team Effort Propels SDSU To A 68-50 Win Over UNLV

The San Diego State women's basketball team used a strong team effort Wednesday to claim its third straight victory over UNLV, 68-50, at Cox Arena. The Aztecs had three players score in double-figures to help the squad match its conference win total from a year ago, improving to 5-9 and 14-12 overall. The Lady Rebels, meanwhile, dropped to 8-18 on the year and are 4-9 in the MWC.

True freshman **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** notched her best scoring effort thus far in conference play, scoring 20 points to go with eight rebounds, three steals and two blocks. Aztec sophomore guard **Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.)** had 19 points, including 11 in the first half, and also added six assists and all three of the team's three-pointers. Redshirt freshman **Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.)** was the third SDSU player in double-figures with 14 points and was second in rebounding with seven. Sophomore point guard **Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** had nine assists, seven points and five rebounds, while junior **LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.)** recorded a career-high four assists and five rebounds in her third start of the year.

The game featured nine ties and four lead changes, with SDSU owning a three-point advantage at the half, 31-28, after trailing by as many as five points early.

The Aztecs held onto their lead until the 11:40 mark of the second half, when Shamela Hampton's three-point play put the Lady Rebels up by one 41-40. After three tie scores over the next minute and a half, a jumper by Johnson put SDSU ahead for good, sparking an 11-0 Aztec run to go up by 11 at 56-45.

UNLV would cut its deficit down to nine, but the Aztecs outscored the Lady Rebels 12-3 over the remaining four minutes to come away with the 68-50 victory.

#### Other UNLV Notes

Sophomore Jené Morris' 10 three-point attempts are a team season-high and most by an Aztec since Michelle Strawberry tried 12 against Colorado State in 2006 ... Morris also tied a season-high with 21 field-goal attempts, matching her effort at UNLV earlier this year ... SDSU was called for a season-low 14 fouls ... The Aztecs had more than two players score in double-figures in the same game for the first time since the Colorado State contest the end of January.

#### 20 - A Significant Number - Reason No. 1

Paris Johnson logged her third 20-point scoring effort of the season, recording exactly 20 on 6-for-10 shooting from the floor and an 8-for-10 performance at the stripe against UNLV. Johnson also scored 20 or more points versus Indiana State, when she posted a career-high 27, and against Western Michigan, when she had 25 to help her earn all-tourney honors at the San Diego Surf 'N Slam in late December.

San Diego State has nine 20-point scoring efforts by four different players in 2007-08, including a team-high four by Jené Morris. A year ago, the Aztecs had only four such performances.

#### 20 - A Significant Number - Reason No. 2

San Diego State eclipsed the 20-mark in assists in a game for the seventh time in 2007-08, with 20 in the win over UNLV on Wednesday. The Aztecs rank first in the MWC in assists per game with 15.77 and entered the week ranked 39th nationally in that category. SDSU had a season-high 28 helpers versus Navy, the team's most since it also had 28 on Feb. 1, 1997 vs. San Jose St.

#### More On Morris

While Jené Morris fell just short of her fifth 20-point scoring outing of the year, her 19 points against UNLV marked her 12th out of 14 league contests in which the sophomore has scored in double-figures. Wyoming is the only MWC team to hold Morris to fewer than 10 points, doing so twice.

If the season were to end today, the Cal transfer's conference season scoring average of 16.6 points per game would be SDSU's highest ever since joining the MWC in time for the 1999-2000 campaign. The previous high is 14.5 points per game by Jamey Cox in the inaugural season.

#### Going Down To The Wire

With just two regular season games left, Aztec freshman Paris Johnson is close to following in her sister Desiree's Johnson's footsteps. Desiree led the Mountain West Conference in blocked shots in 2006 and 2007, while also playing in the Red & Black. In 2007-08, Paris ranks first in the league in blocked shots in overall games with a 1.73 mark, but trails Wyoming's Hanna Zavec by just one rejection in MWC outings.

Paris Johnson had already beat one of her sister's bests, tallying 45 blocks on the year compared to Desiree's career season-high of 41 in 2006-07. Paris Johnson's 45 blocks tie as the seventh-most in school history with Nicolette McCartney, who also had 45 in 2003.

### Turnover Tid-Bits

For the 22nd time this season, an SDSU opponent ended the game with 20 or more turnovers, as UNLV committed 24 on Wednesday. The four exceptions to the rule have all come during conference action with TCU tallying 15 and Utah recording 19 twice to go with Air Force's 18. On the year, Aztec opponents have committed 645 turnovers in the 26 games (24.8/g).

SDSU has had fewer or the same number of turnovers than 21 of its 26 opponents in 2007-08, ranking second in the MWC in turnover margin, averaging 5.19 fewer giveaways. The only times SDSU's has had more turnovers than its opponent was in a win over Jackson State (25-24) and losses to TCU (20-15), Utah (22-19 and 21-19) and Wyoming (22-20).

Five San Diego State foes have 30 or more turnovers in a single outing, including Nevada (37), Southern Utah (35), BYU (31), Colorado State (30) and Navy (30). Even the No. 1-ranked team in the country, Connecticut, had 28 turnovers in its game with the Aztecs. UConn's 28 turnovers are still its most in a single outing since also having 28 in a loss to North Carolina in 2004.

The Aztecs' season-low for turnovers in a game is 10 against Navy, the team's fewest since it had nine versus Canisius in Jan. 2005. SDSU's 14 giveaways versus Wyoming are its fewest in MWC action in 2008.

### Best Since ...

As the season winds down, the Aztecs have already posted some of their best statistical numbers in several categories in recent memory. Below is a few of SDSU's improvements:

- ▶ SDSU's team scoring average of 64.7 is its best since recording 67.5 points a contest in 1996-97.
- ▶ SDSU's 631 field goals are its most since the 1996-97 squad had 771.
- ▶ SDSU's 41.7 field-goal percentage is its highest since shooting 42.0 percent in 2000-01.
- ▶ SDSU's 410 assists are its most since the 1996-97 squad had 490.
- ▶ SDSU's 323 steals are its most since the 1996-97 team posted 410.

### For The Record

With just two games remaining in the regular season, a few Aztecs are close to entering or moving up the SDSU career and season record books. Here is a quick glance:

- ▶ Senior Kate Eveland is two games away from entering the top 10 for most games played in a career. Eveland has seen action in 107 contests, trailing Jamey Cox who is 10th all-time with 109 games.
- ▶ Eveland needs four more three-pointers to move from sixth to fifth in career triples.
- ▶ Quenese Davis needs **four** more assists to tie for 10th in the school's career history. She enters the Colorado State contest with 125 on the year after tallying 149 as a true freshman in 2006-07.
- ▶ Paris Johnson needs **two** more blocked shots to tie for sixth in Aztec single-season history with 47. She would need nine more to tie for the fifth-place spot.
- ▶ If the season were to end today, Jené Morris' 38.1 three-point shooting percentage would rank seventh and Allison Duffy's 84.1 free-throw percentage would rank fourth in Aztec single-season history.

### Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over CSU will mean:

- ▶ SDSU's six Mountain West Conference victories are its most ever in the league's nine-year history.
- ▶ SDSU has assured itself of at least a .500 overall record for the first time since 1996-97.
- ▶ SDSU wins in Fort Collins and goes 2-0 vs. the Rams in regular-season play for the first time since 2000.
- ▶ SDSU sweeps the regular season series against two league opponents in the same year for the first time in Mountain West Conference history.
- ▶ SDSU wins three conference road games for the first time since the 1996-97 squad claimed seven.
- ▶ SDSU head coach Beth Burns improves to 16-7 all-time against CSU.

The Rams' lone victories have come against Navy and Pacific, with both coming at home ... CSU is led by Sara Hunter, who averages 9.4 points a game ... Kandy Beemer along with Hunter are the squad's top three-point threats ... Junior center Amaka Uzomah is her team's top rebounder with 7.2 per game, despite appearing in just 16 of 26 contests ... CSU is shooting 33.7 percent from both the field and is averaging only 53.9 points an outing ... Sophomore Juanise Cornell and Aztec freshman **Christen Myles (Chino, Calif.)** both attended Bishop Amat High School.

**CSU Round One Notes**

- SDSU had four players score in double-figures in a 86-52 romp at Cox Arena on Jan. 30.
- Redshirt freshman Allison Duffy had a career-high 22 points, while three others turned in 16 apiece.
- The Aztecs fell one short of a season-high in assists with 27, as three players had six apiece.
- SDSU never trailed in the game, leading by as many as 23 points in the first half and going into the locker room up by 21 at 43-22. CSU cut its deficit down to just 15 with 16:11 left, before the Aztecs pulled away.
- The Rams were led by forward Elle Queen and guard Sara Hunter's 11 points, as CSU shot 46.5 percent from the field, but could not overcome its 30 turnovers.

**19 And Counting**

San Diego State has 19 or more steals in 26 outings in 2007-08. The Aztecs entered the week ranked 10th in the nation and has a league-best 323 steals, which is 49 more than second-place TCU's 274 steals in 27 contests. The Aztecs have eclipsed the 300-mark for the first time since Beth Burns' 1996-97 squad had 410 in 30 contests. SDSU is the only team in league play to average in double-figures (10.43/g).

The Aztecs own the top two steals totals in the conference in 2007-08, with 23 against Southern Utah, ranking second in league history, and 20 versus Navy. SDSU also has the No. 1 effort in league-only games with their 17 thefts in a win over BYU.

Individually, Jené Morris (2.8/g) is first in the conference and entered the week 39th nationally in steals per game. Redshirt freshman Allison Duffy (2.08) and sophomore Quenese Davis (2.04) are fourth and fifth in the league respectively. A year ago, San Diego State had 10 or more steals 13 times. The school record for most steals in a season is 555 by the 1983-84 team.

**Offensive Production 101**

With its 16th game with 60 or more points this season on Wednesday night, SDSU is third in the Mountain West in both scoring offense (64.7 ppg.) and in field-goal percentage (41.7). These numbers far surpass last year's when SDSU averaged just over 56 points and shot 37 percent from the field.

Below are a few notes about the Aztecs' offensive number so far this season:

- ▶ SDSU's 91 points vs. Navy are its most since also tallying 91 in a win over Utah Valley State on Feb. 10, 2005. The Aztecs have recorded five games with 80 or more points for the first time since 1996-97, when SDSU had five such outings.
- ▶ SDSU also has four wins of 30 points or more

for the first time since the 1996-97 team had six. The 58-point margin of victory over Navy is San Diego State's highest since a 97-35 win over Fresno State in 1995.

▶ SDSU has shot above 50 percent five times and above 40 percent from the field in 15 of 26 games. The Aztecs only reached the 40 percent mark 11 times a year ago, posting an 8-3 record in those outings. San Diego State has shot over 40 percent in four straight games on two occasions this year, accomplishing that feat for the first time since 2001, when the Aztecs opened the campaign with five straight performances. SDSU's 56.7 shooting percentage versus Navy is the program's highest since the Utah Valley game (57.1).

- ▶ San Diego State scored 60 or more points in seven consecutive games for the first time since also posting a seven-game stint in 1995-96 from Dec. 27-Jan. 13.
- ▶ The Aztecs have scored 40 or more points in a half 11 times after doing so just twice a year ago.

**What The W's Mean**

▶ SDSU has already exceeded its win total of 12 from all of last season. The Aztecs' 14 victories are their most since the 1996-97 team had 23 in Beth Burns' first stint on Montezuma Mesa.

▶ SDSU has recorded just its second 10-win season since 2001-02, and its second in a row. The last time the Aztecs had consecutive 10-win campaigns was in 2000-01, when the team won 13, and in 2001-02, when it had 10 victories.

▶ SDSU defeated BYU for the first time since 2001, ending a 13-game skid. The Aztecs' victory over UNLV was its first in Las Vegas since 1997, and first conference win on the road since beating Air Force on Feb. 26, 2005. SDSU has claimed two MWC road games in the same year for the first time in league history.

▶ SDSU's nine non-conference victories are the program's most since the 1995-96 team had 11, including one in the league tournament.

- ▶ The Aztecs are 19-11 in games played at Cox Arena over the last two campaigns.
- ▶ SDSU recorded its first victory on a neutral court since Nov. 29, 2002, when the Aztecs defeated Murray State in Fresno, 59-54. The Aztecs had dropped their previous seven outings in neutral site games.
- ▶ The Aztecs' six overall victories away from home (away and neutral) are its most since the 1996-97 team won 12 times, including three at the conference tournament.
- ▶ SDSU won its season-opener for the first time 2002, and claimed its home-opener for the first time in the last three years.
- ▶ The Aztecs were 5-0 against non-conference teams it also faced last season. SDSU was 3-2 versus Nevada, Saint Mary's, USD, Southern Utah and Cal Poly a year ago.
- ▶ The Aztecs are 15-4 in their last 19 games against non-conference opponents with the lone losses coming this year vs. Indiana St., Quinnipiac, No. 2 UConn and last year against No. 17/16 George Washington.

### Young Guns

SDSU has started two freshmen, two sophomores and one senior in 23 of 26 games in 2007-08. The Aztecs' current lineup of Quenese Davis, LaSandra Dixon, Allison Duffy, Paris Johnson and Jené Morris entered this season with only 29 combined career starts in the Scarlet and Black with 27 of those being logged by Quenese Davis a year ago.

The Aztecs' starting five of Quenese Davis, Shanna Demus, Duffy, Johnson and Morris in the season-opener at Nevada was the program's youngest since the 1983-84 campaign, when the team had three freshmen, one sophomore and one junior among the starting five. That group also had just five years of experience, with only four coming at the Division I level as Demus played her first season at Div. II Cal State Los Angeles.

The Aztecs' four newcomers, **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)**, Duffy, Johnson and Morris, have combined for 58.6 percent of the team's scoring and 49.4 percent of its rebounding. Johnson, Morris and Duffy are the team's three-leading scorers, while in 14 MWC games thus far, the trio have combined for all but three of the team's 27 double-figure scoring outings.

### What A Crowd

In 14 home games, over 14,500 people have turned out to see the Aztecs in action, already the highest total home attendance since 1994-95. SDSU is averaging 1,048 fans per home game, compared to last year's 499 average.

The Aztecs set a single-game home attendance record with 5,271 fans against Connecticut. The mark beat the previous record of 4,311 versus UCLA at the San Diego Sports Arena on Jan. 28, 1978. It was the second time this season that SDSU has set a Cox Arena attendance record, after also doing so earlier this month versus Cal State Fullerton (2,397).

### SDSU Selected To Play Host To 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball First & Second Rounds

San Diego State University and Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl will play host to the 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball First & Second Rounds, the NCAA announced Tuesday. SDSU was one of eight additional venues selected for 2009 by the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee, which voted last summer to expand from eight to 16 first- and second-round sites, beginning next year. The championships will take place either March 21 and 23 or March 22 and 24, 2009, and will each feature four schools vying to advance to the NCAA regionals.

### Listen/Watch Live

For the seventh straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at [www.goaztecs.com](http://www.goaztecs.com). SDSU alum Chris Eilo will take over the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road. Again in 2007-08, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the two televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Cox Arena on [www.goaztecs.com](http://www.goaztecs.com).

### SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 2005. In just two short years, she already has the program headed in the right direction, as the Aztecs' were the 11th-most improved team in the nation in 2007, and recorded the school's most wins since 2000-01.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 261-200, while her school record stands at 180-135 over 10 seasons. Burns recently earned her 250th career victory with the team's win vs. Southern Utah.

**RENO, Nev.** - In a game featuring two schools with high pressure defenses, the San Diego State women's basketball team survived a stern test in its 2007-08 opener, defeating host Nevada, 67-61, Sunday afternoon at the Lawlor Events Center. The Aztecs claimed their first game of a campaign for the first time since 2002, to improve to 1-0, while the Wolf Pack dropped to 1-1 overall.

San Diego State got a huge game from a pair of players making their collegiate debuts. Freshman center Paris Johnson had 16 points, nine rebounds and five blocks in 38 minutes. Redshirt frosh Allison Duffy scored 10 of her 14 points in the second half, while sophomore Quenese Davis was the third Aztec in double-figures with a team-best 17 points.

Sophomore Jené Morris, who played her first game in an Aztec uniform, notched a game-high seven steals. Junior guard Tamika Lipford provided a solid performance off the bench, recording six points, two steals and two rebounds, one of which came on a critical play with 12 seconds left in the game.

SDSU started off the year by scoring the first basket on a jumper by Morris. Nevada countered with a pair of free throws, but the Aztecs answered again in a back-and-forth first half.

The visitors led by as many as five points at the 7:53 mark at 26-21, but the host went into the locker room on a 15-8 run to end the half with a two-point 36-34 advantage.

The Aztecs struggled to find their offensive rhythm coming out of the break, taking five and a half minutes to hit their first field goal. SDSU used that bucket to start a 9-0 run to knot the game at 43-43 and take a two-point lead at 45-43 with 11:32 remaining.

The two sides were tied again at 45 points, but the Aztecs maintained an advantage the rest of the way. SDSU was up by five points on four occasions, including as late as 59-54, but Nevada came to within a pair with 2:39 left and again with 45 seconds remaining. The Aztecs made six of their final eight free-throw attempts to preserve the 67-61 victory.

Nevada was led by Cherlanda Franklin's 12 points and seven rebounds. The Aztecs avenged a loss to the Wolf Pack in last year's season-opener in San Diego.

**MORAGA, Calif.** - The San Diego State women's basketball team had five players score in double-figures in a 83-60 victory over Saint Mary's in Moraga, Calif. SDSU is now 2-0 for the first time since the 1992-93 season, while the Gaels fell to 2-2.

Five players reached double-figures in scoring for the Aztecs, who jumped out to a 46-29 lead at the half.

Sophomore Jené Morris led the way with a game-high 17 points on 7-of-12 shooting, including 2-of-3 behind the 3-point arc.

Redshirt freshman Allison Duffy, playing in her second career game, had 13 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for her first double-double. Senior Shanna Demus had 13 points and three steals, while sophomore Quenese Davis chipped in with 12 points, five rebounds, five steals and three assists in just 24 minutes. Senior Shannon Clay added 10 points off the bench.

SDSU started out the game on an 11-2 run on a layup by Davis with 17:46 remaining in the first half. Saint Mary's made a late run and got to within nine with 3:24 left, but an 11-4 run, capped by a LaSandra Dixon layup late in the first half, gave the Aztecs the 46-29 lead at the break.

The Gaels never got closer than 12 in the second half, as San Diego State won its second road game of the season for the first time since it won four away from Montezuma Mesa in the 2003-04 campaign.

Saint Mary's was led by Jontelle Smith, who scored 12 points on 4-of-10 shooting, while Louella Tomlinson had 11 points and four blocks.

**SAN DIEGO** - The San Diego State women's basketball team forced 35 turnovers and had all 11 of its players score points, as the Aztecs cruised to an 86-52 victory over Southern Utah in their home opener Tuesday at Cox Arena. SDSU improved to 3-0 on the season, giving head coach Beth Burns her 250th career win, while the Thunderbirds fell to 1-3 overall in 2007-08.

San Diego State had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer freshman center Paris Johnson, who had 14 points and a team-best six rebounds and two blocks. Senior forward Shanna Demus recorded 10 of her 12 points in the first half, while freshman forward Allison Duffy contributed 10 points off the bench.

The Aztecs logged a season-high eight 3-pointers, 23 steals and 26 assists. Sophomore Jené Morris led the defensive effort with a career-tying seven steals to go with her team-high nine assists and no turnovers in just 21 minutes of action.

SDSU got off to a quick start and never looked back, jumping out to an early 12-0 lead, before Southern Utah could get on the board with a layup at the 16:21 mark. The Aztecs went on an 18-7 run over the next seven minutes to go up by 21 at 30-9, and led by 25 at the break, 43-18.

The Thunderbirds cut their deficit down to as few 17 points with 9:19 remaining at 59-42, but the Aztecs responded with a 4-0 run with back-to-back baskets from Duffy and finished on a 21-8 scoring streak to claim their fifth-straight in the series, 86-52.

Southern Utah's Anne Westwood had a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds, while Erin Heuett contributed 11 points and four assists in the losing effort.

## Season Box Scores ■ Games 7-9

### San Diego St. 76, CS Fullerton 45 Game 7 ■ Dec. 2 ■ Cox Arena ■ San Diego, Calif.

**SAN DIEGO** - In front of a Cox Arena record crowd of 2,397, the San Diego State women's basketball team kicked off its month-long homestand with a 76-45 victory over visiting Cal State Fullerton at Cox Arena. The Aztecs had five players score in double-figures to help the team move to 6-1 on the season for its best start since the 1992-93 campaign. The Titans, meanwhile, dropped to 1-5 on the year, losing their sixth straight against the Aztecs.

SDSU sophomore point guard Quenesse Davis posted her first double-double of the season and the third of her career with 10 points on 4-for-5 shooting, and a career-high 12 assists. Her 12 assists are the most by an Aztec since Shannon Lee had 14 helpers against Illinois State on Nov. 24, 2000.

Four other Aztecs logged double-figures in points, including redshirt freshman Allison Duffy, who matched her career-best with 15 points, and freshman center Paris Johnson, who added 12 points and a team-high seven rebounds. Sophomore guard Jené Morris was the fourth starter in double-figures with 10 points, while junior LaSandra Dixon matched her career-high with 10 points off the bench.

Cal State Fullerton owned three, one-point advantages in the opening two minutes of the game, including at 5-4 on a layup by Ashley Richie. The Aztecs took the lead on a Quenesse Davis bucket, but a Toni Thomas free-throw equalized the game at six points apiece. SDSU broke out of that tie with a 13-0 run and led by as many as 21 points, before heading into the locker room up 19 at 41-22.

Duffy opened the second half with each of San Diego State's first three baskets, as the host led by 25 with 17:47 remaining. The Aztec advantage reached 30 points on a three-pointer from Coco Davis at the 9:37 mark and peaked at 38 points at 76-38, before SDSU finished the afternoon with its second victory of 30 points or more this season at 76-45.

San Diego State shot a season-best 55.7 percent from the field and limited Cal State Fullerton to an opponent season-low 45 points. The Aztecs also forced 27 turnovers, had 21 assists and made four of their seven shots from beyond the arc.

### San Diego St. 58, San Diego 53 Game 8 ■ Dec. 5 ■ Cox Arena ■ San Diego, Calif.

**SAN DIEGO** - The San Diego State women's basketball team won their fourth straight and remained perfect at home following a tough 58-53 victory over rival University of San Diego at Cox Arena. The Aztecs won for the first time in their last six meetings with the Toreros to improve to 7-1 on the year, while the visitors fell to 4-4 on the season.

SDSU redshirt freshman Allison Duffy led the Aztecs in both scoring and rebounding with 14 points and six boards. Freshman center Paris Johnson and sophomore guard Quenesse Davis both reached double-figures with 10 and 11 points, respectively. Davis had a game-high seven assists, while classmate Jené Morris contributed four of the Aztecs' 13 steals in just 18 minutes of action.

USD's Sam Child began the game with the hot hand, scoring each of her team's first nine points as the Toreros led by four early at 9-5. The visitors were up by as many as five at 16-11, before the Aztecs came storming back with an 8-2 run to take their first lead of the night at 19-18. The advantage changed hands two more times, before SDSU headed into the locker room up four at 29-25.

After a bucket by Torero Kiva Herman to open the second half, SDSU scored 11 unanswered points to build its largest lead of the evening at 40-27. USD would get to within three points on two occasions, including as late as 39 seconds remaining and the score 56-53. After securing a critical defensive rebound, Davis made both of her free-throw shots with 10 seconds left, as the Aztecs claimed the 58-53 win.

San Diego State held USD without a three-point field goal, as the Toreros were 0-for-4 from beyond the arc, compared to the Aztecs' 4-for-9 performance, three of which came in the second half. USD is the second SDSU opponent this season to fail to record a three-pointer, as Southern Utah also went without a triple.

**SAN DIEGO** - After a 13-day break for final exams, the San Diego State women's basketball team retook the court in convincing fashion, posting a 91-33 victory over Navy Tuesday at Cox Arena. With the win, the Aztecs claimed their fifth straight and improved to 8-1 on the year, while the Midshipmen, who suited up a depleted squad due to illness, fell to 2-10 in 2007-08.

San Diego State had three players finish in double-figure scoring, including senior Shanna Demus, who scored a team-high 15 points on 7-for-8 shooting in just 16 minutes of action. Freshman center Paris Johnson chipped in 12 points, while sophomore guard Kim Spinardi came off the bench to add a career-high 11 points, including a 3-for-3 performance from beyond the arc.

The Aztecs, who are entered the week ranked second in the nation in steals per game, had 20 against the Mids, with five of those coming via redshirt frosh Allison Duffy. Senior Shannon Clay had a game-high nine rebounds and sophomores Quenesse Davis and Jené Morris each added five assists.

After the two-sides traded buckets to open the evening, San Diego State went on a 20-0 run just over five minutes into the game for the 20-2 advantage. The Aztecs led by as many as 31 in the opening half, including at intermission, 45-14.

SDSU scored the first 11 points coming out of the locker room to go up by 42 at 56-14 at the 16:13 mark. The Aztec lead would grow to as many as 58 points before securing the 91-33 victory.

The Aztecs' 91 points are a season-high and the program's most since also scoring 91 versus Utah Valley State in 2005. The 58-point margin of victory is San Diego State's highest since a 97-35 win over Fresno State in 1995, while the Midshipmen's 33 points are the fewest the Aztecs have allowed since a 57-30 victory against Air Force in 2001.

### No. 2 Connecticut 85, San Diego St. 53

**SAN DIEGO** - The visiting Connecticut Huskies lived up to their No. 2 national ranking, handing San Diego State its first home loss of the season, 85-53, Friday evening in front of a record 5,271 fans at Cox Arena. The Aztecs forced 28 UConn turnovers, but could not overcome a 49-23 halftime deficit, falling to 8-2 on the season, while the Huskies improved to 9-0.

Freshman center Paris Johnson was the lone SDSU player to finish in double-figures, scoring 14 points to go with her team-high seven rebounds. Classmate Coco Davis added eight points on a perfect 3-for-3 shooting performance from the floor. Sophomore Jené Morris had six assists and senior Shannon Clay recorded three of the team's 12 steals.

Connecticut hit nine of its first 13 shots, scoring the first seven points and taking a 23-8 lead just over six minutes into the game. SDSU cut its deficit to 11 at 25-14 on a jumper by Johnson, but trailed by 26 points, 49-23, heading into the locker room.

The Huskies outscored the Aztecs by just six points in the second half, 36-30, but used their 54.1 field-goal percentage and 53-25 edge on the boards to cruise to the 85-53 victory.

Despite the loss, San Diego State became just the second opponent to reach the 50-point barrier against UConn in 10 contests this season, as the Huskies entered the game outscoring their opponents by a nation's-best 41.6 points per outing.

SDSU set a single-game attendance record and broke the Cox Arena mark for the second occasion in 2007-08, as 5,271 fans turned out for the second all-time meeting between the schools.

### Quinnipiac 78, San Diego St. 69

**SAN DIEGO** - Quinnipiac had nine three-pointers, including eight on 10 attempts in the first half, to defeat host San Diego State Friday, 78-59, in the opening game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam at Cox Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped their second straight to fall to 8-3 on the year, while the Bobcats improved to 9-1 on the season following the two schools' first-ever meeting.

SDSU got a career-high 20 points from sophomore guard Jené Morris, who made a team season-high four three-pointers on just six tries from beyond the arc. Two other Aztecs finished in double-figure scoring with Paris Johnson tallying 15 points, while sophomore guard Quenesha Davis had 12 points and a team-best seven rebounds and five assists.

Quinnipiac opened the afternoon with a 5-0 run, including the first of eight triples in the half via Brianna Rooney. SDSU scored its first three points at the free-throw line, before finally making its first field goal at the 16:21 mark on a Johnson lay-up. The Bobcats followed up that basket by outscoring the Aztecs 21-2, making five triples during that span, to go up by 22 points at 29-7. SDSU cut its deficit down to 13 at 31-18, but went into the locker room trailing by 16 at 44-28.

The Aztecs made it interesting in the second half, getting to within 11 at 54-43 with 12:13 remaining, but the Bobcats immediately responded with 10 more points over the next four minutes to go up by 19, and never looked back, winning 78-59.

The Aztecs shot a season-low 31.6 percent from the field and were outrebounded by 10 (42-32). SDSU did manage to own a positive margin in both the turnover (22-16) and steals column (12-10), but the Bobcats shot an Aztec opponent season-high 55.4 percent from the field, which included a 60 percent mark from three-point land (9-for-15).

### San Diego St. 77, Western Michigan 72

**SAN DIEGO** - The San Diego State women's basketball team rounded out its non-conference schedule by holding on to defeat Western Michigan 77-72 Sunday in the consolation game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam at Cox Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs finished 1-1 in its own tournament, improving to 9-3 on the season. The Broncos fell to 3-10 on the year following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

The Aztecs got 25 points, including 14 in the first half, from freshman center Paris Johnson, who was named to the six-player all-tournament team. Johnson was helped offensively by senior Kate Eveland's season-high 16 points and freshman Allison Duffy's 14 points. Duffy was one rebound short of her third double-double of the season with a team-best nine and also tallied four of SDSU's nine steals.

The host logged the first basket of the afternoon by Johnson, but the Broncos responded with five straight points for the 5-2 lead. SDSU then went on a 7-0 run to retake the lead at 9-5. The Aztecs stayed ahead for the remainder of the first half, going up by as many as 19 points at 36-17 with 3:41 left, before heading into the locker room up 12 at 40-28.

Western Michigan came out of the break with the first four points to cut its deficit to single-digits at 40-32 at the 19:22 mark. The Broncos took advantage of San Diego State's foul trouble, getting to within four on two occasions within the first 10 minutes. At 62-56, the visitors scored nine straight points to jump ahead by three on a Chandra Smith triple.

The lead switched hands three more times and the game was tied at 71 all with just 3:16 left. Coming out of the tie, SDSU got back-to-back baskets from its two freshmen front court players, Duffy and Johnson, and never trailed again, winning by five points, 77-72.

San Diego State was outshot (47.3 to 46.9) and outrebounded (39-34), but forced Western Michigan into 23 turnovers. The Aztecs have won the turnover battle in all but one game this season and also added 22 assists in the victory.

**FT. WORTH, Texas** - Facing the top scoring offense in the conference, the San Diego State women's basketball team dropped its first league game of 2008 to TCU, 86-63, Wednesday at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 9-4 overall and 1-0 in league action, while the Lady Frogs improved to 8-7 and 1-0 in MWC play.

Three Aztecs who made their Mountain West Conference debuts scored in double-figures, including leading scorer redshirt freshman Allison Duffy, who had 14 points on 5-for-8 shooting. Freshman center Paris Johnson tallied her second double-double of the year, recording 13 points and matching her season-high with 13 rebounds to go with four blocks and four assists. Sophomore Jené Morris added 11 points, while senior Shanna Demus had six rebounds. Texas native Kate Eveland was a perfect 3-for-3 from the field, including a pair of three-pointers, for eight points.

TCU opened the evening with a 3-0 lead until SDSU got on the board with two free throws by Morris. The Aztecs missed their first four field goals, before Duffy scored on a lay up at the 16:53 mark and the score 10-4 in favor of the Lady Frogs. The host, meanwhile, made seven of their first 10 shots from the field and built an 11-point advantage at 17-6 and was up by as many as 16 on three occasions.

San Diego State continued its struggles from the field going over five minutes without a field goal mid-way through the half, but finally found its groove on both sides of the ball, putting together a 12-0 run to close to within four points at 28-24. The Lady Frogs went scoreless for 5:26, but managed to hold onto the 33-26 halftime advantage.

Coming out of the locker room, TCU used a pair of three-pointers and outscored SDSU 13-7 through the first media timeout for a 48-33 edge. The Lady Frogs continued to push the pace, running out to a 20-point lead with 10 minutes left and never looked back, claiming an 86-63 victory.

**SAN DIEGO** - The San Diego State women's basketball team was held to a season-low 47 points, including an 0-for-11 effort from beyond the arc, as visiting New Mexico claimed a 60-47 victory Saturday afternoon in the Aztecs' 2008 conference home opener at Cox Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 9-5 overall and 0-2 in league action, while the Lobos improved to 9-6 and 1-1 in MWC play.

SDSU sophomore Jené Morris scored in double-figures for the second straight outing, posting a team-high 17 points, six rebounds and three steals in 36 minutes of action. ### Utah 74, San Diego St. 62

**SALT LAKE CITY** - Despite a career-high 25 points from Aztec sophomore Jené Morris, the San Diego State women's basketball dropped a 74-62 decision at Utah Wednesday evening at the Huntsman Center. With the loss, SDSU fell to 9-6 overall and 0-3 in conference play, while the Utes, who shot over 64 percent from the field in the second half, improved to 13-3 and 2-0 in league action.

Morris scored 16 of her career-best 25 points in the second half, beating her previous high of 20 points set earlier this season against Quinnipiac. The guard recorded her third straight double-figure scoring outing in as many chances in league action. Morris was 10-for-18 from the field and made all but two of her seven free-throw attempts, while also contributing a team-best five rebounds and two steals in 37 minutes.

Two SDSU starters, forward Allison Duffy and guard Quenele Davis, scored nine points apiece. Davis added three assists and Duffy chipped in three of the team's eight steals on the night.

The Aztecs opened the game with the first bucket on a jumper by Duffy. The Utes responded with two straight baskets to go up by two, before a Morris jumper tied the score at four points apiece. Utah broke out of the tie with one of three triples in the first 20 minutes from Morgan Warburton.

The Utes remained ahead the rest of the half, but the Aztecs, who trailed by eight points on two occasions at 18-10 and 20-12, cut their deficit down to just a pair at 26-24, following three straight Morris free throws with 3:34 remaining. Utah, however, finished the half strong, going on an 8-0 run and owning a 10-point advantage of 34-24 at the break.

Coming out of the locker room, SDSU got the Utah lead down to single-digits on a three-point play by Morris at 38-31. Utah then went on a 9-0 run to jump out to its biggest lead of the night at 16 points at 47-31, and was up by 17 at 54-37 with just under 11 minutes left in the game.

The Aztecs rallied from that point, using a pair of free throws by senior Shanna Demus to jump start an 8-0 run, while keeping the Ute offense scoreless for nearly four and a half minutes, as SDSU trailed by just nine at the 8:51 mark.

The nine point margin would be as close as the Aztecs could get the rest of the way, as Utah made 12-of-14 free-throw attempts in the final three minutes to secure the 74-62 victory.

San Diego State owned a 14-7 edge on the offensive boards and committed just three more turnovers than Utah, but could not overcome the Utes' 55.8 field-goal percentage on the night.

**LARAMIE, Wyo.** - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 19-point halftime deficit down to just 10 against Wyoming, the No. 20 team in the country, but was unable to complete the come back as the Aztec fell to the host Cowgirls, 65-49 Saturday afternoon at Arena-Auditorium. With the loss, SDSU was dropped to 0-4 in league action and 9-7 overall, while the Cowgirls improved to 16-1 and 4-0 in the MWC.

The Aztecs were led by redshirt freshman forward Allison Duffy, who scored 10 of her 14 points in the second half. Senior Shanna Demus had nine points, including a pair of three-pointers, while Jené Morris tallied seven points. Freshman Paris Johnson logged a team-high nine rebounds, while Demus contributed four steals.

The Aztec offense struggled to get going to start the afternoon, as SDSU missed its first nine shots from the field until getting on the board at the 13:01 mark on two Morris free throws, trailing 13-2. San Diego State's first field goal of the game didn't come until the 8:30 mark when Morris nailed a three-pointer from straight away to put the visitors down by 15 at 20-5.

While SDSU may have struggled on the offensive end, the Aztecs' offensive rebounding kept them in the game owning a 12-3 edge at half, but trailing on the scoreboard by 19 going into the locker room at 37-18.

San Diego State was undeterred coming out of the break, as Duffy scored the first points on a pair of free throws. Wyoming countered with a lay-up, but Duffy once again answered with a basket of her own to get back to a 17-point deficit with 17:11 left.

The Aztecs got to within 11 points on two occasions, before finding themselves trailing by only 10 twice at both 51-41 and 53-43. A three-pointer by Justyna Podziemka restored the Cowgirl lead to 13 and SDSU was never able to get to within single-digits, falling 65-49.

Despite the loss, San Diego State grabbed a season-best 23 offensive boards to Wyoming's five. The Aztecs owned a 42-29 advantage on the glass and forced 20 Cowgirl turnovers.

### San Diego St. 62, BYU 39

**SAN DIEGO** - Senior Shanna Demus and sophomore Jené Morris each scored 17 points to lead the San Diego State women's basketball team to its first victory over BYU since the 2001 season, 62-39, Wednesday at Cox Arena. With the win, the Aztecs improved to 10-7 overall and 1-4 in the Mountain West, while the Cougars dropped to 8-8 and 2-2 in league action.

Demus had a season-high 17 points on 5-for-8 shooting from the floor, including a 3-for-5 performance from beyond the arc, while also tallying a team-best five steals. Morris scored 11 of her 17 points in the first half and had four of the Aztecs' 17 steals on the night. SDSU sophomore Quenesa Davis finished with nine points, seven assists, five boards and four steals in 32 minutes of action. Freshman center Paris Johnson led the Aztecs in rebounding with nine for the second game in a row to go with three blocked shots.

San Diego State got off to a quick start, jumping out to an 8-0 lead before BYU could score its first points of the evening following a steal in the back court by Mindy Nielson at the 14:46 mark. The Aztecs responded with a three-pointer by Demus, which kick started a 9-0 run, as SDSU led by 15 just a little over eight minutes into the game.

The home team's lead would grow to as many as 27 points at 37-10, before heading into the half up by 26 at 37-11. SDSU forced 21 BYU turnovers in the first 20 minutes of play and the Cougars shot just 15 percent from the field on 3-for-20 shooting.

Brigham Young more than doubled its shooting percentage in the second half, but SDSU's advantage still grew to as many as 35 points on two occasions at 55-20 and 59-24. The Cougars ended the night on a 15-3 run in the final seven minutes, but was only able to get to within 23 points, as the Aztecs claimed a 62-39 win, their first in the two schools' last 14 meetings.

BYU did not have a player score in double-figures, as Cassie King had eight for the Cougars, who had a season-high 31 turnovers and were held to their second-fewest points of the year.

### San Diego St. 75, UNLV 55

**LAS VEGAS** - Sophomore Jené Morris converted seven consecutive three-point attempts and scored a career-high 35 points to lead the San Diego State women's basketball team to its second straight win, as the Aztecs defeated host UNLV, 75-55, Saturday evening at Cox Pavilion. With the victory, SDSU claimed its first league road game since 2005 to improve to 11-7 and 2-4 in conference play, while the Lady Rebels fell to 6-12 and 2-3.

After missing her first three-point attempt of the night, Morris hit her next seven, as the guard notched the Aztecs' first 30-point scoring outing since 1999. Morris finished the evening 7-for-9 from beyond the arc and 13-for-21 from the field, beating her previous career high for scoring by 10 points. Her seven three-pointers trailed the San Diego State school record by one and nearly doubled her previous career best of four set earlier this season against Quinnipiac.

In addition to the 35 points, Morris added five rebounds, three assists and three of the team's seven steals on the night. She was helped offensively by redshirt freshman Allison Duffy's eight points, while freshman Paris Johnson and sophomore Quenesa Davis each chipped in seven. Senior Shanna Demus had a career-best eight assists and tied Morris for the team lead in rebounding with five.

Through the first four and a half minutes, San Diego State attempted 10 shots making just four, but did its job on the defensive end of the floor, forcing six UNLV turnovers for the early 8-4 advantage. The Aztecs maintained a slight edge before putting together a 7-0 run with a Morris three-pointer and two straight baskets from Demus. The Lady Rebels ended their drought with three free throws, as UNLV trailed by seven despite attempting only nine shots from the field through the first 12 and a half minutes.

SDSU caught fire from beyond the arc in the second part of the first half. Morris hit five in a row to go with Kate Eveland's triple at the 3:44 mark, as the Aztecs were up by 11 at 38-27 heading into the locker room.

Morris continued her assault from three-point land, making two more in the first three minutes coming out of the break to put her team ahead by 17 at 48-31 with 16:48 remaining. San Diego State increased its lead to as many as 27 points on two occasions, including at 70-43, before winning for the first time in Las Vegas since 1997, 75-55.

Colorado State did not back down coming out of the break, cutting its deficit down to just 15 with 16:11 left and the score 47-32. The Aztecs restored order 13 seconds later on a Duffy jumper and the team's lead hovered around 20 points before three baskets by Clay highlighted an 8-0 run to put them up by 26 at 69-43. San Diego State would go on to claim a 34-point win over Colorado State, 86-52, for its second straight victory over the Rams in San Diego.

### San Diego St. 62, Air Force 45

**COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo.** - Freshman Paris Johnson had a game-high 18 points and seven rebounds to lead the San Diego State women's basketball team to a 62-45 victory over Air Force Wednesday night at Clune Arena. SDSU won its fourth straight game to improve to 4-4 in Mountain West Conference play and 13-7 overall, while the Falcons dropped to 1-7 and 7-13.

With the win, the Aztecs exceeded their win total of 12 from last season and now have their most victories since the 2000-01 team also won 13 times. It was also San Diego State's first four-game winning streak in conference play since it won eight consecutive contests to finish the 1997 campaign as members of the Western Athletic Conference.

Johnson started out hot for SDSU, scoring the team's first seven points and connecting on her first seven shots from the field. She finished the game 8-of-13 from the floor and a perfect 2-for-2 from the free-throw line. Sophomore Jené Morris had 11 points and a game-high four steals, while sophomore Quenese Davis added seven points and a game-high 10 assists.

The Aztecs, who never trailed in the game, jumped out of the gate fast thanks in part to Johnson's impressive start and a staunch defense. A Shannon Clay lay-up at the 12:10 mark of the first half gave San Diego State a 16-7 lead, its largest lead of the game at that point.

Air Force called a timeout to try and stop SDSU's momentum and it seemed to work as it closed to within three at 16-13 on Chasmine Jones' lay-up with 10:22 left in the first half. The Aztecs, however, went on a 14-4 run to close the half and take a 30-16 lead heading into intermission.

The Falcons got to within 12 points on Brooke Cultra's 3-pointer with 16:55 left, but senior Kate Eveland's 3-pointer with 9:39 remaining capped a 14-4 San Diego State run to stretch its lead to 48-26. Air Force would get no closer than 17, giving the Aztecs their first victory over the Falcons in Colorado Springs since the 2004-05 season.

**SAN DIEGO** - Visiting TCU outscored the San Diego State women's basketball team 50-23 in the second half to erase a six-point halftime deficit, as SDSU saw its four-game conference win streak come to an end with a 75-54 loss to the Lady Frogs Saturday afternoon at Cox Arena. The Aztecs fell for the first time this season when holding an advantage at the half, dropping to 13-8 overall and 4-5 in league play, while TCU improved to 14-9 and 7-2 in conference action, sweeping the two-game season series between the two schools.

She was helped offensively by freshman Paris Johnson's 10 points, while sophomore Quenese Davis added nine, but was limited to only 16 minutes of action due to foul trouble. Sophomore LaSandra Dixon came off the bench to contribute a career-high five rebounds and three assists, while Morris also added three assists and three steals in 36 minutes.

TCU got out to the early 6-0 advantage until SDSU notched its first points of the afternoon on a Morris jumper at the 17:34 mark. The Lady Frogs increased their lead to as many as eight points on three occasions, but a Dixon free throw sparked a 7-0 Aztec run to close to within a point at 18-17.

The scored was tied at 19 and 21 points, before the Aztecs went into the locker room on a 10-4 run, highlighted by a pair of Morris 3-pointers, as SDSU led by six at 31-25.

Coming out of the break, the two sides traded points, but TCU followed that up with a pair of lay-ups and a free throw to get back to within one at 33-32. SDSU responded to the Lady Frog flurry with two layups of its own by Davis and senior Shannon Clay. A three-pointer and then a lay-up off a steal started a 12-0 TCU scoring run, as the visitors led by seven at 44-37 with just over 11 minutes remaining.

The Aztecs got to within five points less than a minute later, but that would be as close as they would get as TCU got back-to-back triples from Helena Sverrisdottir and never looked back, winning by 21 points, 75-54.

**ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.** — In a game pitting two teams tied for fifth place in the Mountain West Conference standings entering the night, the host New Mexico Lobos used a 42-31 advantage on the glass to defeat the visiting San Diego State women's basketball team 63-54 Wednesday evening at The Pit. With the loss, the Aztecs, who had a one-point advantage at the half, dropped to 13-9 overall and 4-6 in conference action, while the Lobos improved to 13-10 and 5-5 in the MWC.

Aztec sophomore Jené Morris scored in double-figures for the sixth straight game and the ninth time in 10 conference outings, ending up with 22 points for her fourth career 20-point scoring game. Morris scored 16 of her 22 points in the second half and also added four of the team's 11 steals on the night.

Senior Shanna Demus, who started the contest 4-for-4 from the field, ended up with nine points, while redshirt freshman Allison Duffy recorded her third career game with double-figure rebounds, notching 12 boards, just one short of her season-best of 13.

SDSU got off to a quick start getting on the board with three free throws and two Demus baskets, including a three-pointer, to lead by seven at 8-1 at the 16:22 mark. New Mexico raced back to knot the score at eight apiece and the game was tied on three more occasions in the first 20 minutes of action.

The Aztecs carried a slim one-point advantage at 26-25, into the locker room, despite making 11 of 18 shots (61.1 percent) from the field to the Lobos' 36.0 shooting percentage.

The lead changed hands for the third time on the night, when New Mexico opened the second half with a 7-0 run before Morris could score SDSU's first points at the 15:58 mark trailing 32-28. Morris followed that bucket with another and the Aztecs had the game down to just a single point at 33-32.

Both sides went scoreless for over three minutes, as a jumper by UNM's Jessica Kielpinski broke the drought in the Lobos favor, which was then followed by six straight Dionne Marsh points, as the host built its largest lead of the night at 11 points at 45-34.

UNM went up by as many as 17 points at 59-42 with just over two minute remaining. The Aztecs cut the deficit to as few as 10 points with 39 seconds left, but ended up running out of time, falling, 63-54.

**SAN DIEGO** — Despite owning a halftime lead for the seventh consecutive game, the San Diego State women's basketball team was unable to pull the upset Saturday, as the Aztecs fell to the visiting No. 19/20 ranked Utah Utes, 63-51, at Cox Arena. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 13-10 on the year and 4-7 in conference action, while the Utes, who have the nation's longest active win streak at 16 games, improved to 21-3 and 1-0 in MWC play.

SDSU freshman center Paris Johnson logged her third double-double of the season with 11 points and 11 rebounds. The Aztecs defense then turned it up a notch, employing a stifling zone press that limited Utah to just one free throw the remainder of the half, as SDSU owned a 26-24 advantage heading into the locker room.

The Utes, which had trailed only once prior at the half in MWC play, regrouped coming out of the break, going on a 15-2 run to go up by 11 at 39-28 with 10:55 left. The Aztecs cut their deficit to six twice, including with 50 seconds remaining on a Davis three-pointer at 55-49, but Utah made all eight of its free throws to earn the 63-51 win.

### Wyoming 55, San Diego St. 44

**SAN DIEGO** — Playing its second consecutive opponent earning votes in both national polls, the San Diego State women's basketball team dropped its fourth straight Mountain West Conference game Thursday against visiting Wyoming, 55-44, at Cox Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 13-11 on the season, including a 4-8 mark in league action, while the Cowgirls improved to 21-4 and 9-3 in conference play.

Sophomore point guard Quenese Davis scored a game-high 19 points for SDSU, with 15 coming in the second half, for her best offensive output in conference action this season. She was helped in the scoring column by redshirt freshman Allison Duffy's 10 points, but sophomore Jené Morris, who entered the night ranked second in the MWC in scoring in league games (17.6 ppg.), was limited to just five points.

Duffy contributed six rebounds, while Morris and senior Kate Eveland each had three of the team's 10 steals. SDSU played without senior co-captain Shanna Demus, who sat out with a knee injury, snapping a string of 88 consecutive games played and 70 straight starts.

San Diego State's only lead of the evening came in the opening minutes of the first half, as the Aztecs went up 2-0 on a pair of Duffy free throws and then again at 4-2 on a Duffy jumper. Wyoming went on an 11-2 run with the help of six points by Aubrey Vandiver to jump ahead by seven at 13-6. The Cowgirls advantage grew to as many as 13 on two occasions, but a Morris lay-up at the buzzer had the Aztecs trailing by just nine going into the break, 27-18.

Coming out of the locker room, SDSU was within seven points on a jumper by Davis at 29-22 at the 14:27 mark, but Justyna Podziemska nailed a pair of three pointers, the first by either side in the game, and also added two lay-ups in a span of less than three minutes to give the host a 12-point advantage at 39-27. The Aztecs got to as close as nine points on the second of two Morris free throws with 1:08 left in the game, before the Cowgirls made four straight free throws to close out the victory, 55-44.

Neither team had much rhythm offensively, as Wyoming shot just 33.3 percent from the field to SDSU's 30 percent. The Aztecs forced 20 Cowgirls turnovers, but Wyoming owned a +19 advantage on the boards and made 21 of 28 free throws to avenge a loss to SDSU last season in San Diego.
