Is tied for ninth on SDSU's all-time list with 29 career sacrifice hits.

2005: Batted a career-high .267, good for fifth on the team...Second on the squad and tied for fifth in the Mountain West Conference with nine sacrifice hits...Started 47 of the 50 games she played in...43 of her starts were in left field... Established a career high with a .313 on-base percentage...Batted .290 in the ninth position of the lineup...Tied a career high with three hits against Oregon State on Feb. 17...Her two RBI in the Aztecs' 5-3 win over Towson on March 19 also tied a career high...Had a season-long five-game hitting streak from March 11-13.

2004: Almost doubled her batting average from her freshman year (.252 compared to .128)...Fourth on the team in batting average...16 sacrifice hits tied for team lead...Went 7-for-14 and hit her first home run on a trip to New Mexico and Colorado State on April 23 and 25, compiling a .714 slugging percentage...Hit at a .636 clip at the San Diego Classic...Went 3-for-3 in SDSU's homeopening 5-3 victory over Mississippi State on Feb. 13...5-of-12 (.417 batting average) at the Aztec Invitational...Started last 23 games in right field...Also saw time as a designated player for the Aztecs.

2003: Played in 24 games, starting 13...Made her first collegiate start against Cal State Northridge on Feb. 9...Started in right field against No. 1 Arizona on March 2, going 1-for-2...Had her best outing of the year against conference rival Utah on April 19, notching a hit in one of her two at-bats and scoring a run.

High School: Four-year letterwinner at Marina High School in Huntington Beach, Calif....Earned first-team all-league honors in 2000, 2001 and 2002...Named allleague second team in 1999...Selected as the team's 2002 MVP and best offensive player in 2001...Chosen for Marina High School Hall of Fame in 2002...Also played field hockey for the Vikings.

Pitcher • Senior • 5-6 • Tucson, Ariz. (University HS)

Ranks among the all-time career leaders in all 16 pitching categories, including first in saves (11), walks per inning (0.125), strikeout-to-walk ratio (7.147) and solo shutouts (19)...Is also second in wins (45), win percentage (.643), total shutouts (24), strikeouts (436) and opponents average (.203).

2005: Had one of the best seasons statistically in SDSU history...Named to the all-Mountain West Conference team for the third consecutive season after going 14-12 with a 1.19 ERA in 188.2 innings...1.19 ERA was the 26th lowest in the nation and her six saves were eighth...Of all MWC pitchers, ranked first in ERA (1.19), opponent batting average (.174), strikeouts (211), saves (six), games finished (18) and games in relief (18)... Was second in the league in innings pitched (188.2) and appearances (42)...Aztec all-time single season leader in combined shutouts (12), solo shutouts (10), strikeout to walk ratio (10.05), strikeouts, saves and opponent batting average...Tossed her first career no-hitter in a 5-0 SDSU victory over Southern Utah on March 4...Had nine strikeouts in the game and didn't allow a batter past first base...Did not give up a run in her first 25.2 innings from Feb. 4-12...Threw 44.2 scoreless innings from March 1-13...Named MWC Pitcher of the Week on four occasions and has won the honor 10 times in her career...Struck out 11 or more batters on five occasions including a careerhigh 15 against North Carolina on Feb. 25, while allowing only one hit and one walk in seven innings...Posted a 1.13 ERA in 43.1 innings of relief and a 1.20 ERA in 145.1 innings as a starter.

2004: MWC Pitcher of the Year... Led pitching staff in wins (16), winning percentage (.762, 16-5) and saves (five)...The .762 winning percentage was also the highest in SDSU history...Tossed three shutouts...0.85 ERA in MWC games was the third lowest in conference history, just behind her freshman season in 2003 (0.81) and former Aztec Bre DeSanta's freshman campaign in 2002 (0.83)...In MWC games in which she came in from the bullpen, had an amazing 0.22 ERA with a 5-0 record and five saves...Stranded 14 of 15 inherited runners in conference action...Tied for 15th in NCAA Division I with her five saves...Threw 27.2 consecutive scoreless innings from April 9-May 1...Allowed two earned runs in a 68-inning span from March 13-May 8...Gave up one earned run in 42-inning span from April 9-May 8...Named

MWC Pitcher of the Week four times (Feb. 16, April 13, April 27 and May 3)...In weekend home doubleheaders against Colorado State and New Mexico, she entered all four games in relief and earned two wins and two saves, while not allowing a run in 11.2 innings...Came two outs away from first career no-hitter in 4-1 victory over No. 21/24 Oklahoma State on Feb. 13.

2003: Mountain West Conference Pitcher of the Year...League's freshman of the year...Second-team NFCA all-West Region...Had a conference record low 0.81 ERA in MWC games...Had a league-best .144 opposing batting average in MWC contests...Had six complete games in which she did not walk a batter...Only walked 19 of 603 batters faced...Won eight straight games in as many decisions from March 26-April 19...Had an impressive outing against conference foe UNLV on April 12, as she pitched a career-high 10 innings while striking out a career-high nine batters for her fourth complete game shutout of the year...Twotime MWC pitcher of the week...Pitched 10.2 innings on the final day of the MWC tournament, appearing in all three games with two starts...Went 2-1 over the course of the tournament with a 1.12 ERA...Named to the MWC all-tournament team.

High School: Four-year letterwinner at University High School in Tucson, Ariz....Named first-team all-state her junior and senior years... *Tucson Citizen* and *Arizona Daily Star* player of the year... The Rangers won the 2001 and 2002 5A state championships and were 18-A national champions in 2001... MVP of the 2001 18A Nationals... An honor roll student.


2005: Led the team in at-bats (157) and was second on the squad in runs (17), walks (12) and stolen bases (five)...Batted .242 with 38 hits...Swung the bat well in May with a .348 average in the final seven games of the season...Tied a career-high by hitting safely in eight consecutive games from Feb. 5-17...Was 12-for-26 (.462) over the eight games with eight runs and three RBI...Batted .348 when she played in the outfield...Went 3-for-3 against Colorado State with an RBI on May 8...Had three hits in a SDSU win over Southern Utah on March 6...Was 3-for-4 and scored two runs in a game against Oregon State on Feb. 17...Had a solo home run versus Kentucky on Feb. 11...Went 2-for-3 with two runs scored against UC Riverside on Feb. 5.

2004: Led the Aztecs in at-bats (176), on-base percentage (.462), slugging percentage (.477), runs (37), hits (64), doubles (13), triples (2), total bases (84) and walks (28)...Her 28 walks tied for the most in school history...The 13 doubles finished one short of tying the school record of 14, shared by Tiffany Goudy (2002), Kellie Nordhagen (2000) and Shanon Pouelsen (1994)...Hit total increased by 62 from her freshman season...64 hits rank fifth in the SDSU single-season record book...Her .364 average ranked the sophomore third on the school record chart...Her .462 on-base percentage tied the school record with Trish Mang's 1998 mark...37 runs scored is third in Aztec record book...Hit first career home run in an April 2 victory at BYU, 5-2...March 2004 Amateur Athlete of the Month at the San Diego Hall of Champions.

2003: Got her first collegiate start in the Aztecs' 5-2 win over CS Northridge, playing in both left and right field...Played a key role in SDSU's 2-1 win over Colorado State, clinching the MWC regular season title, with a crucial seventh-inning assist, as she fielded a ball in left field and connected with shortstop Bianca Cruz who in turn threw to catcher Danielle Touhey to tag the potentially tying run out at home plate.

High School: Four-year letterwinner at Granite Hills High School...First and second-team all-league...Posted a .350 batting average...The Eagles were the Grossmont South League champions her senior campaign... San Diego Union-Tribune scholar-athlete with a 3.5 GPA...Also lettered in soccer.
