- San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament for the 16th time in program history.
- San Diego State opened the tournament as the higher seed for the ninth time and is 11-5 in games in which it is better seeded.
- San Diego State is a single-digit seed for the ninth time.
- Brian Dutcher** guides his team to the NCAA tournament for the fifth time in the last seven years that a national champion has been crowned.
- Brian Dutcher** has been part of 21 previous NCAA tournaments; 16 as an assistant coach and fifth as head coach.
- Brian Dutcher** has coached in four Final Fours and won the National Championship in 1989

OFF THE BOUNCE (through the games of March 24)

- Advancing to the NCAA tournament for a fourth consecutive season and the Sweet 16 for the second straight time under head coach Brian Dutcher, and fourth time in program history, fifth-seeded San Diego State will face 1-seeded Connecticut in a East Regional semifinal game at the TD Garden in Boston, Mass., on March 28 at 7:30 p.m. ET.
- The Aztecs are making their 16th appearance in the Division I event, owning a 13-15 record and have won seven of its last eight games in the event. Head coach Brian Dutcher has been on the Aztec sidelines for 25 of the program's 28 all-time tournament games and all 13 of the program's victories.
- This is the fifth NCAA appearance for Brian Dutcher, the two-time Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year, in his seven seasons as head coach with a likely appearance in the 2019-20 event (San Diego State was 30-2 and a likely No. 1 or No. 2 seed), which was canceled because of the COVID pandemic.
- The Aztecs appearance in the regional semifinal game is its fourth (2011, 2014, 2023 & 2024) and the eight for a Mountain West program since the inception of the league in the 1999-00 season.
- This is the SDSU's 11th tournament appearance in the last 14 seasons that a champion has been crowned. That total does not include the 2019-20 season when SDSU was 30-2 and ranked sixth in the AP poll when the season ended prior to the tournament.
- San Diego State is competing in the East Region for the first time in program history. In first and second round games, SDSU has a 4-2 record in the South Region, a 4-5 mark in the West Region, are 0-5 in the Midwest Region and 2-0 in the East Region for an overall record in the first weekend of 10-12.
- The Aztecs metrics rank among the best in the nation. Through the games of March 24, the Aztecs were ranked No. 20 in the NET, No. 16 in KPI, No. 17 in Kenpom, No. 24 in T-Rank and No. 27 in BPI. San Diego State's NET strength of schedule is No. 25.
- San Diego State owns a 134-33 record (80.2 percent) since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. That's the THIRD-BEST record in the nation, trailing Gonzaga's 148-20 (88.1 percent), and Houston's 148-26 (85.1 percent), and ahead of Baylor's 128-35 (78.5 percent) and Kansas' 134-37 (78.4 percent) records.
- San Diego State owns the SIXTH-BEST record in the nation since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, 390-126 (.756), and is 177-100 (.639) road and neutral site contests in that time frame which is the SEVENTH BEST in the nation.
- San Diego State and Connecticut are meeting for the third time with the Huskies taking the first two games in the series. The previous meetings came in the NCAA Tournament. Connecticut beat SDSU 74-67 on March 24, 2011, in the Sweet 16 & 76-59 on April 3, 2023 in last year's national championship game.

- SDSU has won at least 19 games in 18 straight seasons.
- SDSU has advanced to the postseason in 15 of the last 17 seasons in which a champion was crowned (2006 NCAA, 2007-09 NIT, 2010-15 NCAA, 2016 NIT, 2018, 2021-23 NCAA).
- SDSU has won 80 of last 85 games when leading at the half.
- SDSU has won its last 116-of-125 when having a higher FG pct.
- SDSU is **SIXTH** nationally in winning percentage (.740) since the beginning of the 2005-06 season.
- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 16.
- Since 2006, SDSU's 14 appearances in its conference championship game are tied for second most in Division I.

- San Diego State is 4-3 all-time against the current membership of the Ivy League, and lost its last game against the conference, 82-61, against Brown at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.
- With its win over No. 18 Utah State (March 15), San Diego State improved to 14-9 (.609) under Brian Dutcher against AP Top-25 teams. The Aztecs were 29-98 (.228) against AP Top-25 teams prior to Dutcher taking over as head coach in 2017-18. SDSU's .609 winning percentage against AP Top-25 teams since the 2017-18 season is the highest in the country (min. 20 games). Rounding out the top 5 are Kansas (.602), Virginia (.591), Duke (.588) and Gonzaga (.587).
- Seven of San Diego State's 10 losses this season have come on the road against Quad 1 opponents, and six of those seven defeats have come by nine points or less. SDSU has lost Quad 1 road or neutral site games, eight in all, by 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 & 18 points. The other Quad 1 loss came in its last regular-season game, 77-79, vs. Boise State in Viejas Arena. The Aztecs lone other loss was a Quad 2 game at UNLV, 71-74, on the Rebels Senior Night.
- San Diego State's 36 conference tournament wins since the 2008-09 season are the most in the country over that span (Gonzaga is second at 33).
- Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee** is averaging 29.0 points, 8.5 rebounds and 0.5 assists in this year's NCAA Tournament. The All-American is shooting 66.7 percent from the field (20-of-30), 100.0 percent from distance (3-of-3) & 83.3 percent from the line (15-of-18).
- Senior Guard **Lamont Butler** became the 38th Aztec to pass the 1,000-career point plateau with his nine points against Yale on March 24, and enters the regional semifinal game with 1,001 points.
- Brian Dutcher** is in his seventh season as San Diego State's head coach and his 25th season on the Aztec sidelines. In his six-plus seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to five conference titles, seven Mountain West championship game appearances, a 177-57 (.756) overall record, the 2023 NCAA national championship game, has been named the national coach of the year, and twice the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

BIG NOTES FROM THE FIRST AND SECOND ROUNDS

- San Diego State advances to a second straight NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time in program history.
- The Aztecs are one of seven teams who have advanced to each of the last two Sweet 16s (also Alabama, Creighton, Gonzaga, Houston, Tennessee and Connecticut).
- SDSU advances to its fourth Sweet 16 overall (also 2011, 2014 and 2023).
- San Diego State's 85 points were its most in NCAA Tournament history, surpassing an 83-point performance in a loss to Indiana on March 16, 2006.
- SDSU's 28-point win was its largest margin of victory in a NCAA Tournament game, passing a 23-point win over Furman on March 18, 2023.
- San Diego State wins its fifth straight NCAA Tournament second round game and improves to 6-1 all-time in second round games.
- Jaedon LeDee's** 32 points vs. UAB are the most by an Aztec in NCAA Tournament history, surpassing Xavier Thames' 30 vs. North Dakota State on March 22, 2014, in this same arena (Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena).
- Jaedon LeDee's** four 30-point games this season are the most by an Aztec since Tony Ross had four in the 1986-87 campaign and tied for the third most in SDSU single-season history.
- San Diego State has back-to-back 25-win seasons for the first time since a three-campaign stretch from 2014-16 (2013-14, 2014-15 and 2015-16).
- The Aztecs record their 10th season with at least 25 victories (also 2022-23, 2019-20, 2015-16, 2014-15, 2013-14, 2011-12, 2010-11, 2009-10 and 2008-09).
- SDSU improves to 12-15 all-time in NCAA Tournament games (6-1 over the last two seasons).
- San Diego State improves to 11-5 in the NCAA Tournament with the higher (better) seed.
- The Aztecs improve to 4-0 in the Round of 64 when earning a No. 5 seed or better (2011, 2014, 2023 and 2024).
- SDSU improves to 6-1 as a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Tournament.
- San Diego State improves to 3-0 against a No. 12 seed in the NCAA Tournament.
- The Aztecs improved to 3-1 in postseason play (Mountain West Tournament and NCAA Tournament) and 11-2 over the last two seasons (6-1 in NCAA Tournament, 5-1 in Mountain West Tournament).
- SDSU improves to 3-0 all-time in the NCAA Tournament against current teams from the American Athletic Conference.
- San Diego State trailed for a total of 4 minutes, 25 seconds (4:25) tonight. In three NCAA Tournament games for the Aztecs at Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena, SDSU has trailed for a total of 12:16. That's just 9.8 percent of its 125 minutes played in the arena.**
- San Diego State improves to 176-57 (.755) under head coach Brian Dutcher, including a 28-11 (.718) mark in games played in March and a 6-4 record in the NCAA tournament (.600).
- The Aztecs won their 27th consecutive game when leading at the half (21-0 this year).

THE EAST REGION & THE CITY OF SPOKANE

- San Diego State is competing in the East Region for the first time in program history.
- While this is the Aztecs first time playing in the East Region and are now 2-0 after its 69-65 defeat of UAB and 85-57 dismantling of Yale, the city of Spokane is not new for San Diego State.
- SDSU, in the West Region in 2014, went 2-0 in Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena. As a 4-seed, the Aztecs defeated New Mexico State (73-69) and North Dakota State (63-44).
- In three regular season games at Gonzaga, San Diego State has a 2-1 mark, including an 84-74 victory on Dec. 29, 2023. The teams split the first two matchups: a 79-76 win on Nov. 16, 2010, and a 69-48 loss on Nov. 14, 2016. In each of those games Gonzaga was nationally ranked: No. 11 in the 2010 meeting, No. 14 in 2016 and No. 13 this season.

HOW WE WIN

- Once again, this season, San Diego State is trending as one of the nation's best in defense. After the games of March 24, according to KenPom, the Aztecs are ninth in adjusted defensive efficiency (93.5), 23rd in 3-point percentage defense (30.8), and 26th in effective field goal percentage defense (47.1).
- San Diego State has won 112 of its last 121 games (112-9; 92.6 percent) when holding its opponent to less than 60 points.
- San Diego State is 99-8 (92.5 percent) the last 107 times it has outrebounded its opponent.
- San Diego State has won 204 of its last 235 games (204-31; 85.5 percent) when limiting opponents to 30.0 percent or less from 3-point range.
- In its last 434 games in which it has forced at least 10 turnovers, San Diego State has won 343 times (343-91; 79.0 percent).
- San Diego State is 78-15 (83.9 percent) in its last 93 games in which it had blocked at least three shots.
- San Diego State has won 34 of its last 39 games (34-5; 87.2 percent) when it limits its opponent to five or fewer offensive rebounds.
- San Diego State is 77-21 (78.6 percent) in its last 98 games in which it has at least five steals.
- San Diego State is 39-7 (84.8 percent) when **Lamont Butler** has multiple steals in a game.
- San Diego State is 26-6 (81.3 percent) when **Jaedon LeDee** has at least five defensive rebounds.

SAN DIEGO STATE'S RESUME

Below is a look at some highlights from San Diego State's NCAA tournament resume (through the games of March 24).

- The Aztecs have impressive metrics, including 20th in the NET, 17th in KenPom, 16th in KPI, 24th in T-Rank, and 27th in BPI.
- San Diego State has played the THIRD toughest schedule in the nation based on its RPI strength of schedule.
- While the Aztecs have 10 losses, nine are Quad 1 games, eight on the road and one at home. Its other loss is a Quad 2 on the road.
- San Diego State has a 10-10 record in Quad 1 and Quad 2 games this year and has won two of its last three Quad 1 games.
- San Diego State has quality NET wins, including a 25-point win over No. 16 Saint Mary's (79-54), a 10-point win at No. 17 Gonzaga (84-74), an 11-point home win over No. 22 New Mexico (81-70), and a 16-point victory at the Mountain West Tournament over No. 38 Utah State (86-70).
- San Diego State entered the tournament with a 18-1 record in Quad 2 (6-1), Quad 3 (6-0) and Quad 4 (6-0) games.
- San Diego State's nine Quad 1 losses came by a combined total of 62 points (6.9 ppg).
- Overall, the Aztecs are 4-9 in Q1 games, but it is worth noting that only two of those 13 games were played at home.
- San Diego State has lost only one home game (vs. NET No. 26 Boise State).
- San Diego State has suffered one loss on a neutral floor (vs. NET No. 22 New Mexico).
- All of SDSU's losses have come against teams that are playing in the postseason. Nine of the Aztecs' 10 losses came against teams that are part of the 68-team field of the NCAA Tournament and the other is competing in the NIT.
- Through the games of March 16, San Diego State has the No. 25 NET strength of schedule.

- With 25 points in the title game of the Mountain West Tournament, LeDee became the 37th player in program history to score 1,000 points while wearing the Scarlet and Black and established a new program single-season scoring (696 points) & free throw attempts (286) records.
- Nationally: No. 10 in scoring (21.5/g) & No. 10 in points (754) in the top-35 of six other statistical categories.
- Ranks FIFTH in the nation in fouls drawn per 40 minutes played (7.7).
- Set a program record with 32 points in an NCAA Tournament game (vs. UAB, 3-22-24).
- His 13.6 points per game improvement (21.5 from 7.9) from last season is the second-highest improvement of any Aztec 1,000-point scorer (Jamaal Franklin, 14.5 (17.4 from 2.9 from 2010-11 to 2011-12)).

With San Diego State playing 21 neutral site and true road games during the 2023-24 regular season, conference tournament (6 neutral site and 14 true road games), and the NCAA Tournament, here are some road and neutral site facts about SDSU:

- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 107-67 (.615) record in road games is the SEVENTH best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 70-33 (.680) record in neutral site games (min. 100 games) is the SEVENTH best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, in a minimum of 250 games, San Diego State's 177-100 (.639) record in road/neutral games is the SIXTH best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 77-51 (.602) record in road games against the Mountain West, leads the conference.

THE ELITE OF THE ELITE DEFENSE

Known for one of the nation's staunchest defenses, since former head coach Steve Fisher arrived on The Mesa prior to the 1999-00 season, current Aztecs' head coach Brian Dutcher has kept the stifling defense as the calling card of his program as well.

- San Diego State has ranked in the top 25 of KenPom's Adjusted Defensive Efficiency in each of the last five seasons: No. 10 in 2019-20, No. 21 in 2020-21, No. 2 in 2021-22, No. 4 last year and No. 9 this year (through the games of March 24).
- **San Diego State is one of three programs in the nation who have been in the top 25 in KenPom's Adjusted Defensive Efficiency ranking in each of the last five campaigns. The other two are Houston and Kansas.**

SAN DIEGO STATE VS. THE MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

- San Diego State is 441-319 (.580) overall against current members of the Mountain West Conference. (H: 256-92, A: 145-206, N: 40-21)
- The Aztecs are 160-45 (.780) all-time at home against all members of the Mountain West (since the start of the 1999-00 season). Of those 160 victories, 98 have come by 10 or more points (61.6 percent).
- SDSU has won 36 of its last 38 (36-2; 94.7 percent) league games at Steve Fisher Court and has outscored its opponents by 16.3 points per game in those wins.
- **San Diego State is 100-101 all-time in road contests against all members of the Mountain West (since the start of the 1999-00 season). Of those 100 victories, 50 have come by 10 or more points.**
- In league contests against all members of the Mountain West, San Diego State has a 260-146 (.642) record.

CLOSING OUT GAMES

San Diego State is one of the elite teams when it comes to closing out opponents and chalking up the wins.

- **SDSU is 23-2 this year, 159-12 under Brian Dutcher and 412-16 in its last 428 games in which it has a lead with five minutes to play.**
- The Aztecs are 14-3 in their last 17 games that have been decided by one possession or which have gone into overtime.
- Since Brian Dutcher took control of the program (since the start of the 2017-18 season), San Diego State has won 24-of-39 games (24-15) which have been decided by one possession or which have gone into overtime.

MOUNTAIN WEST TOURNAMENT NOTES

- San Diego State's seven consecutive Mountain West championship appearances and 16 overall championship appearances are a league record.
- Jaedon LeDee becomes San Diego State's single-season scoring leader with 696 points, passing Michael Cage's 686 set in the 1983-84 campaign.
- Jaedon LeDee becomes the 37th Aztec with 1,000 career points while playing at San Diego State.
- Jaedon LeDee's 13.2 points per game improvement (21.1 from 7.9) from last season is the second-highest improvement of any Aztec 1,000-point scorer (Jamaal Franklin, 14.5 (17.4 from 2.9 from 2010-11 to 2011-12)).
- Jaedon LeDee set an Aztec record with 81 points in a Mountain West tournament, easily passing the previous team record of 62 set by Chase Tapley in the 2012 tournament.
- Jaedon LeDee was named to the all-Mountain West tournament team after averaging 27.0 points and 10.0 rebounds per game.
- San Diego State falls to 175-57 (.754) under head coach Brian Dutcher, including a 27-11 (.711) mark in games played in March.
- San Diego State falls to 7-9 all-time in Mountain West Championship games.
- San Diego State falls to 44-18 in the Mountain West tournament for a winning percentage of 71.0 percent. The 44 wins are still easily the most by any team – current or former – in league history (second currently is tournament host UNLV with 29).
- San Diego State fell to 17-4 in its last 21 Mountain West tournament games.
- San Diego State falls to 10-2 in its last 12 postseason games (5-1 in MW tournament, 5-1 in NCAA Tournament).
- San Diego State falls to 8-2 as the No. 5 seed in the Mountain West tournament. The rest of the No. 5 seeds in the Mountain West Tournament are 7-21.

BIG NOTES

- The Aztecs committed just six fouls against SJSU, their fewest against any DI team since at least the 1996-97 season.
- San Jose State's two free throw attempts on Feb. 27 match the fewest by an Aztec opponent since at least the start of the Mountain West era (1999-00). It was the ninth time an Aztec opponent has attempted only two free throws.
- San Diego State's nine blocked shots at Fresno State (Feb. 20) are the most in all games since it swatted 10 shots against No. 25 Utah on Nov. 18, 2014, and the most in a road game since it totaled 10 at UNLV on Feb. 16, 2013.
- **San Diego State is 59-37 (.615) in Mountain West road games & 88-12 (.880) in league home games since the start of the 2013-14 season (when the current configuration of the league started), which are the best records in the league in both categories in that time frame.**
- San Diego State stands at 101-101 in road games against Mountain West teams since the start of the conference (1999-00). SDSU is the only program with at least a .500-win percentage in games against Mountain West teams on the road.
- San Diego State is 28-4 in its last 32 games immediately following a loss.
- San Diego State has lost back-to-back games just four times in its last 209 games (since Feb. 14, 2018).
- **San Diego State committed just two turnovers against Wyoming (Jan. 23). The two turnovers are the fewest in program history, the fewest in Viejas Arena history, equaled the second fewest in Mountain West history (all games including league games) and is tied for the second fewest in a Division I game this season.**
- **Jaedon LeDee** has three career games with at least 20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 steals, which is tied with Jamaal Franklin for the most by an Aztec since the 2005-06 season. The complete list of Aztecs with at least 20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 steals in a game since 2005-06: Jaedon LeDee - 3, Jamaal Franklin - 3, Kawhi Leonard - 1, Jalen McDaniels - 1, Chase Tapley - 1, Billy White - 1.
- Head Coach **Brian Dutcher** has recorded at least 21 victories for the seventh consecutive season.
- The Aztecs snapped Gonzaga's 59-game home winning streak against non-conference opponents (last loss was a 71-66 setback against UCLA on Dec. 12, 2015). At the time, SDSU handed Gonzaga its second home loss in its last 92 games (90-2) (since Jan. 27, 2018).
- The Aztecs handed Gonzaga their largest home loss since an 11-point setback on Dec. 8, 2012, vs. No. 13 Illinois.
- Gonzaga had gone 173 straight home games without losing by 10 or more points prior to the Aztecs 84-74 win, which was the second-longest active streak in the country since at least the 1996-97 season.
- San Diego State is 14-9 (.609) under **Brian Dutcher** against AP Top-25 teams. The Aztecs were 29-98 (.228) against AP Top-25 teams pri-

- or to Dutcher taking over as head coach in 2017-18. SDSU's .609 win percentage vs. Top 25 teams since 2017-18 is the best in the nation.
- San Diego State has won 70 of its 76 home games (70-6) since the start of the 2019-20 season, and its six home losses are tied for the fifth fewest in the nation in that time frame.
- Against Washington, **Jaedon LeDee** became the first Aztec since at least 1996-97 to have at least 34 points and 17 rebounds in a game and is the only player in Mountain West history to do it and shoot at least 50.0 percent.
- Following the Washington game, **Jaedon LeDee** was the second Division I player over the last 10 seasons to score 20+ points on at least 55.0 percent shooting in the first five games of a season, joining Obi Toppin in 2019-20 en route to the Wooden Award.

THE AWARDS

- Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee** earned first-team all-conference honors in voting by the league's coaches and media that regularly cover the Mountain West and the Player of the Year from the media. LeDee is averaging 21.1 points, 8.4 rebounds and has shot 55.7 percent from the floor on the season and led the Aztecs, in the regular season, in points (696), points per game, field goal (235), field goal attempts (422), rebounds (277), free throws (210) and free throw attempts (286). He was second in steals (39) and third in blocks (18).
- LeDee has also received national recognition being named a second-team All-American by The Sporting News and Field of 68, third team by Associated Press, honorable mention by the USBWA, is a finalist for the Karl Malone Award, and is on the national ballot for the John R. Wooden Award.**
- Senior guard **Lamont Butler** is the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, a member of the All-Defensive Team and an honorable mention performer as voted on by the conference's coaches. Butler is the league's third consecutive Defensive Player of the Year honoree and was named an honorable mention designee in a vote of the media who regularly covers the league. Butler is averaging a career-best 9.2 points per game. He leads the team in steals (50) and is No. 2 in assists (99).

NON-CONFERENCE RECAP

Here is a brief look at the Aztecs regular season non-conference slate:

- San Diego State finished the non-conference schedule with a 6-0 home record and owns a 98-10 mark in non-conference home games since the start of the 2002-10 season.
- Since the start of the 2019-20 campaign, San Diego State is 27-1 in non-conference home games and, including this season, has not lost a non-conference home contest in four of the last five seasons. It's lone non-conference home loss since the start of the 2019-20 was a 62-72 defeat at the hands of Brigham Young on Dec. 18, 2020.
- San Diego State finished the non-conference slate 4-2 in Quad 1 & Quad 2 games, with both its losses coming in Quad 1 road games (at Brigham Young and Grand Canyon) and a Quad 1 win at Gonzaga.**
- The Aztecs went 3-0 in neutral site games and won the 2023 Continental Tire Main Event in Las Vegas after defeating Saint Mary's 79-54 and Washington 100-97. They then played California in the SoCal Showcase in San Juan Capistrano, Calif., and beat the Golden Bears 76-67 to win that event.
- Three of San Diego State's four true road games were Quad 1 games and SDSU went 2-2 on the road in those games including 1-2 in Quad 1 contests.
- Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee**, following the Continental Tire Main Event, was named Mountain West Player of the Week, NCAA March Madness National Player of the Week, Lute Olson Award National Player of the Week, ESPN National Player of the Week, Oscar Robertson Award National Player of the Week, and Continental Tire Main Event Most Valuable Player.
- Junior wing **Reese Waters** was named the SoCal Showcase Most Valuable Player.

MORE ON THE DEFENSE

San Diego State's second half defense against Colorado State, which limited the Rams to 11 points on 12.0 percent shooting was good, but just shy of some records.

- The fewest points scored in a half by a current member of the conference are nine (9) by San Jose State in the second half of its game against Wyoming on Feb. 15, 2014, and by San Diego State in the first half of a game at Wyoming on Jan. 19, 2013.
- The worst field goal percentage in a half is 8.3 percent (1-of-26) by Wyoming in the first half of its game against East Tennessee State on Dec. 21, 2018.
- In addition, Air Force totaled 10 points in the first half at Brigham Young on Feb. 23, 2003, and on four other occasions; Boise State vs. Charlotte (11-17-22), New Mexico vs. Villanova (3-18-05), Wyoming at UNLV (3-8-12) & vs. East Tennessee State (12-21-18) matched Colorado State with 11 points in a half.
- In its last three regular season road games, San Diego State held its opponents to a combined 58.7 points below their average on their home floor this year (an average of 19.6 points per game less than they normally score at home).**
- The Aztecs held Utah State (Feb. 20) to 68 points, 16.4 points below the average output in its 12 home games this year. At Fresno State, on Feb. 24, SDSU limited Fresno State to 41 points, 28.8 points below its average in home games this year and at UNLV (March 5), San Diego State kept the Runnin' Rebels to 62 points, 13.5 points below its total in home contests.

WHAT HAPPENS IN LAS VEGAS...IS USUALLY GOOD FOR SAN DIEGO STATE

- San Diego State's 47 victories at Thomas & Mack Center since the start of the 2008-09 campaign (28 neutral and 19 road wins) are the most by any team in any building in which it has not played at least one home game. Villanova is second with 37 victories at Madison Square Garden.
- Since March 5, 2014, San Diego State is 14-2 against the Rebels in TMC, while the rest of the country is 52-110 in the facility.
- Since the start of the 2008-09 season, no Division I team has won more road games against a single opponent than San Diego State's 19 victories over UNLV at Thomas & Mack Center. Saint Mary's (at Loyola Marymount) and Gonzaga (at Pepperdine) are second with 15 wins.**
- San Diego State is 19-2 in its last 21 games in Thomas & Mack and 36-9 in its last 45 games in the city, regardless of facility.
- In four regular-season MTEs in Las Vegas, San Diego State has three tournament titles (2010 Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic, 2019 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational & 2023 Continental Tire Main Event) and was the runner up at the 2015 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational.
- In going 7-1 in its Las Vegas MTEs, the Aztecs are 2-0 vs. ranked opponents with wins against No.14/13 California & No. rv/22 West Virginia in 2015.

DUTCHER KEEPS THE PARTY GOING

Brian Dutcher has been on The Mesa for now 25 seasons, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he's experienced 563 victories, 16 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 17 postseason tournaments, including 12

NCAA appearances, a three of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014, 20223) and last season past the Sweet 16, to the Elite 8, Final Four and 2023 national championship game.

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured six Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each of his seven years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first seven seasons.
- His 177 wins in his first six-plus seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first seven campaigns.
- His 177 wins to date are the most of any first-year head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.
- His .756-career winning percentage (177-57) is the SIXTH best in the nation since the start of the 2017-18 season.
- His .907-career winning percentage (97-10) at Steve Fisher Court is tied for the FIFTH best in the nation since the start of the 2017-18 season.
- At the start of the 2023-24 season, in a minimum of 100 games coached, Brian Dutcher ranked No. 4 among winningest head coaches nationally with a .763 win percentage.
- Dutcher is the No. 24-ranked head coach in the nation according to *CBSSport.com* top-25 and 1 coaches' rating.

THE VIEJAS BUMP

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament 11 of the last 13 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, San Diego State has the SIXTH-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 213-26 home record, winning 89.1 percent of its home games during that span.

At the conclusion of the 2023-24 regular season, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 249 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 223-27 mark (89.2 percent), including a 114-12 record (90.5 percent) in its last 126 home games against non-conference competition.
- Since the start of the 2002-03 season, San Diego State has a 153-31 (83.2 percent) home record against conference opponents.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 168-22 (88.4 percent) at home, including a 73-9 (89.0 percent) record in non-conference home contests during that stretch and 70-7 (90.9 percent) against non-top 25 non-conference foes.
- The Aztecs are 94-12 (88.7 percent) in their last 106 conference home games and 85-10 (89.5 percent) in their last 95 non-conference home games.

MORE HOME COOKING

- In the last 74 home games, San Diego State is 68-6 (.919), with an average scoring margin of +16.2 points in those victories. In 53 of those 68 home wins, the game was decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs are 55-6 (90.2 percent) in their 61 Mountain West Conference home games since January 24, 2018.
- San Diego State is 79-12 (86.8 percent) in its last 91 home games.
- The Aztecs current 20-game non-conference home court win streak, started on November 9, 2021, against UC Riverside, and is the second-longest in school history, trailing a 27-game win streak from Nov. 22, 2008 to Nov. 30, 2011.

San Diego State finished the regular season 14-1 in Viejas Arena and has never had an undefeated home season slate as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on 10 occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2019-20, 2021-22, 2022-23 & 2023-24).

TOP GUNS AT AIR FORCE

At Air Force, San Diego State had its sharp shooters out in the first half, and they were on target.

- The Aztecs were 14-of-20 (70.0 percent) from the field in the first 20 minutes. It was the second time in the Mountain West era that SDSU shot it at an at least 70.0 percent clip in a first half (also: 70.4 percent on Jan. 22, 2021 at Air Force)
- Overall, since the start of the 1999-00 campaign, San Diego State has shot at least 70 percent from the field in a half on four occasions, the previously mentioned two times and twice in the second half of a game: 70.8 percent vs. UNLV on Jan. 26, 2019 and 77.8 percent at Fresno State on Feb. 20, 2021.

10-PLUS POINT HALFTIME LEAD UNDER BRIAN DUTCHER...LOCK IT IN

- Under Brian Dutcher's leadership, since the start of the 2017-18 season, the Aztecs have played 228 games and in 78 of them, SDSU has taken a 10-plus point lead into halftime, including its game vs. Yale in the second round of this year's NCAA Tournament.
- The Aztecs have a 96.2 percent winning percentage (75-3) when they lead by double digits at the intermission.
- SDSU has taken a 10-point or greater lead into the break in Mountain West games 47 times and has closed out its opponent 44 times (44-3; 93.6 percent)
- In games at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena when San Diego State takes at least a 10-point advantage into the break in the Dutcher era, the team is 50-0.

TRAMMELL PLAYS BEAT THE CLOCK...AND WINS

If the Aztecs need a bucket in the last seconds of the first half Darrion Trammell is the man they call on. The senior guard has made seven shots in the last three seconds of the first half this season, the first three and last two of which came in successive games.

- Three of Trammell's last second shots broke a tie and sent the Aztecs into the intermission with a lead while the other two increased an Aztec lead and the other two cut a lead by its opponent en route to SDSU wins.
- Versus Washington (Nov. 19) Trammell splashed a 3-pointer with two seconds on the clock to send the Aztec to a 43-40 lead at the break and SDSU went on to win the game and the Continental Tire Main Event with a 100-97 victory in overtime
- Versus California (Nov. 25) Trammell sank a jumper in the paint with three seconds on the clock to push the Aztecs advantage to 39-34 en route to a 76-67 overtime win in the SoCal Showcase.
- Against Point Loma Nazarene (Nov. 27) Trammell nailed a driving layup, was fouled and completed the old school 3-point play with no time left on the clock to give the Aztecs a 41-26 lead on the way to a 71-51 decision.
- Against Stanford (Dec. 21) Trammell drove into the paint and hit a jumper, with no time on the clock, to send San Diego State to the locker room with a 34-32 advantage. SDSU would go on to win the game 74-60.
- Against Wyoming (Jan. 23), Trammell hit a fall-away jumper in the lane with three seconds to play in the half to give the Aztecs a 34-32 lead at the break, en route to an 81-65 victory.

- At UNLV (March 14), Trammell stole an inbounds pass and hit a straight-away 3-pointer with one second on the clock to just the Rebels lead to 27-22, on the way to a 74-71 overtime win.
- Against No. 18 Utah State (March 15), Trammell hoisted a 3-pointer which got nothing but net with two seconds to play before the intermission to cut the Aggies lead in half, 39-36, and SDSU erased a 17-point first half deficit and won 86-70.

SAN DIEGO STATE VS. THE MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE

- San Diego State is 442-320 (.580) overall against current members of the Mountain West Conference. (H: 255-92, A: 146-206, N: 40-22)
- The Aztecs are 160-45 (.780) all-time at home against all members of the Mountain West (since the start of the 1999-00 season). Of those 160 victories, 98 have come by 10 or more points (61.6 percent).
- SDSU has won 36 of its last 38 (36-2; 94.7 percent) league games at Steve Fisher Court and has outscored its opponents by 16.3 points per game in those wins.
- **San Diego State is 100-101 all-time in road contests against all members of the Mountain West (since the start of the 1999-00 season). Of those 100 victories, 50 have come by 10 or more points.**
- Historically, in league contests, against all members of the Mountain West, San Diego State has a 260-146 (.642) record.

SEEING DOUBLES

Through the conclusion of the first two rounds of the 2024 NCAA Tournament, four Aztecs have combined to record 14 double doubles.

- **San Diego State's 15 double doubles in 2023-24 are the most in a season since the 2012-13 squad totaled 16.**
- The Aztecs' record for double doubles in a season since the start of 1975-76 is 36 in 2010-11, followed by 30 in 1983-84 and 1975-76.
- The most players in a single season to achieve a double double since the start of the 1975-76 campaign is seven in the 1976-77 season.
- Senior forward Jaedon LeDee leads the team with 12 double doubles in 33 appearances, Lamont Butler, Reese Waters and Micah Parrish have one each.
- Prior to LeDee this season, the last Aztec to record 10 or more double doubles in a season was Jalen McDaniels in the 2018-19 campaign when he accomplished it 11 times.
- The record for consecutive games with a double double in a single season, since the start of 1975-76, is EIGHT by Michael Cage in 1983-84...and he did it twice that year.
- The most consecutive double doubles for the program are Michael Cage's NINE, which covered the final game of 1982-83 and the first eight of 1983-84.

TO 1,000-CAREER POINTS AND BEYOND

The Aztecs have four players who have scored 1,000-plus points in their college careers: **Darrion Trammell, Jaedon LeDee, Micah Parrish and Lamont Butler.**

- At New Mexico (Jan. 13), senior guard **Trammell** finished the game 12 points, eclipsed the 1,500-career point milestone and enters the Sweet 16 matchup with Connecticut with **1,653-career points.**
- Trammell is one of two active players, who stand less than 5-11, that has scored at least 1,600 points since the start of the 2020-21 season.
- **LeDee**, a senior forward, entered the Colorado State (Jan. 30) game with 998-career points, got to 1,000 on his first shot and enters the NCAA Tournament with **1,355 career points.**
- **LeDee** became the 37th player in program history to score 1,000 points in his Aztec career when he finished the title game of the Mountain West Tournament with 25 points and comes into the team's game against Connecticut with **1,063 points as an Aztec.**
- When the Aztecs played at Grand Canyon on Dec. 5, **Parrish**, a senior wing, started the game with 996-career points, scored 10 in the game to pass the 1,000-point milestone and starts the NCAA Regional Semifinal with **1,242-career points.**
- **Butler** came into the Aztecs second round game with 992 career points, finished with nine in that game and comes into Thursday nights contest with **1,001-career-points.**
- Parrish, LeDee Butler are the fifth, sixth and seventh players, respectively, to reach 1,000-career points while wearing an Aztec kit, since the start of the 2019-20 season. (also: Malachi Flynn & Matt Mitchell in 2019-20, Jordan Schakel in 2020-21 and Matt Bradley in 2022-23). Note: Flynn scored 564 of his 1,355-career points while at SDSU, Bradley, who scored 2,322-career points, had 1,033 at San Diego State and 1,289 at California, **Parrish** has scored 625 in Scarlet and Black & 617 at Oakland, and **LeDee** totaled 292 points in 79 games at Ohio State and TCU and 1,063 in the 74 games he has competed in for SDSU.
- **Butler** 1,001-career points have all come in San Diego State's Scarlet and Black.

TOP-25 FACTS

- San Diego State opened the 2023-24 season ranked No. 17 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. It was the fifth time that SDSU has been included in the AP top-25 preseason poll; all coming during the Dutcher/Fisher era, and is the second highest preseason ranking for the program in the poll. The program's highest preseason ranking is No. 16, prior to the 2014-15 season.
- The previous four occasions when San Diego State has been ranked in the preseason poll by the AP voters were prior to the 2010-11 season when the Aztecs were initially No. 25; prior to the 2012-13 campaign (No. 20); before 2014-15 (No. 16) and last season at No. 19.
- How important is the preseason ranking or what does it portend? The four previous Aztec teams which were ranked in the preseason AP poll, finished a combined 116-30, including a 59-4 mark in Viejas Arena. Each squad made at least the round of 32 in the NCAA tournament with the 2010-11 team reaching the Sweet 16 and finishing the season with a 34-3 record and last season's run to the national championship game.
- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight (Dec. 2, 2013, to Dec. 15, 2014).
- At the conclusion of the regular season, the Aztecs have appeared in the AP Poll for 109 weeks, and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.
- San Diego State's 109 appearances in the AP poll are the most of any school in California.
- Since the start of the 2019-20 season SDSU has appeared in the USA Today Coaches Poll 42 times, including eight times this season.

After getting thumped in the national title game last April, the Aztecs earned another shot at defending champion Connecticut. "We're heading on the road to play a road game against Connecticut in Boston and I've got a group that I think will be up for the task," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said.

LeDee had 26 points and nine rebounds, Darrion Trammell added 18 points and fifth-seeded San Diego State used a fast start to overwhelm 13th-seeded Yale, rolling to an 85-57 win in the second round of the NCAA Tournament on Sunday night.

The Aztecs scored the first 10 points of the game, led by 24 at halftime and removed any chance of another potential March Madness, bracket-busting upset.

"I think we just got the hardest game out of the way. First game is definitely always the hardest," Trammell said. "Obviously, we go out there and play confident, but I feel like getting that first one under our belt, we come out much more loose and much more confident."

San Diego State (26-10) earned a rematch with the No. 1 seed in the tournament in what will be a heavily partisan crowd in Boston. The Huskies beat the Aztecs 76-59 last April in Houston, denying San Diego State a chance at its first title.

The Aztecs will be playing in the Sweet 16 in consecutive years for the first time in school history.

"This is the time of year to be fearless and don't worry about making a mistake. Play your best," Dutcher said. "And we have experience in the tournament and I think some of that experience showed over the last two games."

LeDee was again the star for the Aztecs after he scored 32 points in the first-round win over UAB. He made 9 of 12 shots, including a pair of 3s, and in two tournament games is 20-for-30 shooting.

But some of the outside shooting that was absent in the tourney opener returned and San Diego State hit a season-high 13 3-pointers. Trammell had just four points and took four shots against UAB, but hit four 3s against Yale.

"They're not known to be a great 3-point shooting team, but they saw me coming and they figured they would make them all today," Yale coach James Jones joked.

Bez Mbeng led Yale with 12 points and Matt Knowling added 11. But even with borrowing the University of Idaho band for a second time, there was no magical late comeback after the Bulldogs (23-10) rallied from down 10 in the final 7½ minutes to top No. 4 seed Auburn in the opener.

For the second straight year, San Diego State didn't allow a No. 13 seed seeking a landmark second-round upset the chance to breathe. The Aztecs suffocated Furman last year after the Paladins knocked off Virginia in the first round.

They did the same to Yale.

John Poulakidas, the star of Yale's upset win over Auburn, wasn't able to match the same level of shot-making he displayed on the way to 28 points in the first round. Poulakidas missed all five shots in the first half and was scoreless at the break. He finally scored early in the second half, but finished with only nine points.

"It hurts a lot right now. I think we had big expectations and got a little greedy. We wanted more, we knew we could get more," Knowling said. "But I'm really proud of our guys and the team and what we were able to accomplish this year."

THE WATERS LINE

Junior wing Reese Waters began the season a perfect 40-of-40 from the free throw line through the 12th game of the year.

- At Gonzaga, Waters pushed the streak to 43-of-43, but with 23 seconds to play saw his final attempt rim out.
- **Nationally, through the games of March 24, he has made 65-of-72 attempts (90.3 percent) from the charity stripe which, if he met the minimum of 2.5 made per game, would be the 14th best percentage in the nation.**

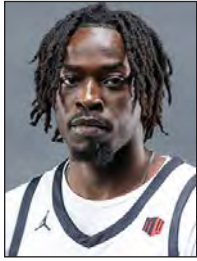

BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

Seventh Season • 25th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his seventh season as head coach after leading the Aztecs to six Mountain West title games, their conference-high 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th and 16th Mountain West titles and four trips to the NCAA tournament, including a run to the 2023 national championship game.

Dutcher, who ascended to head coach following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Over the course of his 24 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 17 times, including 12 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 16 Mountain West titles and record 18 seasons of at least 20 victories. He is the only coach in the 102-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first six seasons and his 151 victories are the most of any first-time Division I head coach who began at their current institution since the start of the 2017-18 season.

His .763-win percentage (151-47) entering the 2023-24 season is the best in program history, as is his .550-win percentage (11-9) against top-25 opposition.

In 2017-18, Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors, Trey Kell and Malik Pope, that had won multiple league titles and had NCAA tournament experience. The Aztecs won six consecutive games to end the regular season and captured the program's 11th crown, the Mountain West tournament title, and returned to the NCAA tournament. Dutcher was the only first-year head coach to guide his team to the 2018 NCAA tourney and one of six to have won at least 20 games. SDSU finished the campaign with a 22-11 record, with the 22 wins representing the most by a first-year Aztec men's basketball head coach and the second-most among first-year coaches that season.

The 2018-19 season saw the Aztecs return to the Mountain West championship game after twice defeating nationally ranked Nevada, including a 65-56 victory over the Wolf Pack in the semifinal of the MW tournament. The team was 21-13, the 13th consecutive season with at least 19 victories.

In 2019-20, his squad ripped off a program-record 26 straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at No. 4 in both the AP and Coaches top-25 polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2 on the year, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), NABC Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and USBWA District IX Coach of the Year. In addition, he was a finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, the team's 30 wins are the fifth most and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in MW play are the most in program history. Its one loss in league action is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak also which set a Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus All-American Malachi Flynn, who would be a first-round selection of the NBA Toronto Raptors, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blowout victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. In addition, the Aztecs handed Utah a 28-point loss in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic, three days after the Utes beat No. 6 Kentucky.

In the COVID-affected season of 2020-21, the Aztecs were once again the cream of the Mountain West crop posting a 23-5 record, including a 14-3 mark in league play. San Diego State earned the league's regular season and tournament crowns an in the NCAA tournament were a 6-seed. For the second consecutive campaign, Dutcher was named Coach of the Year of both the Mountain West and NABC Division I District 17.

The Aztecs opened 2020-21 with a win over No. 22 UCLA and later won at No. 23 Arizona State. The team reached the MW title game for the fourth straight season earning a measure of revenge in the championship game, defeating Utah State, 68-57, which had knocked them off in the previous two league title games.

The team was led by seniors Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel, who became the 34th and 35th players in program history, respectively, to score 1,000 points in their careers. Mitchell was named an honorable-mention AP All-American honors, Mountain West Player of the Year, first-team All-Mountain West, Mountain West All-Defensive Team, NABC first-team All-District 17, USBWA first-team All-District IX, Basketball Times West Coast All-District Team, Mountain West Tournament Most Valuable Player, Mountain West All-Tournament Team and was the sixth player, and first Aztec, in Mountain West history to earn Player of the Year & Tournament MVP in the same year. Schakel was second-team All-Mountain West, NABC second-team All-District 17 and a Mountain West All-Tournament Team honoree.

The 2021-22 campaign demonstrated that despite losing its top three scorers from the previous

season, the Aztecs reload while other programs rebuild. For the fifth consecutive year, Dutcher guided the Aztecs to 20-plus wins (23-9), and a bid to the NCAA tournament, the third since taking the helm of the program. If not for the cancellation of the 2020 NCAA tournament, SDSU, which was projected to be a No. 1 or No. 2 seed with a 30-2 record, the 2021-22 season would have marked the program's third straight, and fourth overall, NCAA appearance under Dutcher.

San Diego State authored a 79-49 dismantling of No. 20 Colorado State at Viejas Arena, the worst beating SDSU has ever handed to a ranked opponent, and a 63-58 win over the No. 23 Rams in the semifinal of the Mountain West Championship. Entering 2022-23, Dutcher was 5-0 against top-25 opponents in Viejas Arena and 9-6 overall against ranked teams.

Matt Bradley, a transfer from California, slipped seamlessly into the Aztecs offense, led the team in scoring, 16.9 points per game, and was named the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, first-team All-Mountain West, second team NABC All-District 17 and earned both ESPN and NCAA March Madness National Player of the Week honors. In addition, sophomore guard Lamont Butler was a Mountain West All-Defensive Team designee and Chad Baker was the league's sixth man of the year.

The years leading to 2022-23 set the stage for men's basketball history. Following its 15th and 16th Mountain West Crowns, San Diego State earned a No. 5-seed in the NCAA Tournament and began the most epic run in program history. In its 10th appearance in the last 13 NCAA Tournaments, the Aztecs ended five multi-game win streaks in snapping the College of Charleston's 10-game win streak in the NCAA First Round and Furman's seven-game win streak in the second round. It then ended No. 1/2 Alabama's five-game win streak in the Sweet 16, Creighton's three-game win streak in the Elite 8 and Florida Atlantic's 11-game win streak in the Final Four.

SAN DIEGO — Jaedon LeDee scored six of his career-high 27 points in the first three minutes of the second half and No. 17 San Diego State broke open a close game to beat Cal State Fullerton 83-57 in their season opener Monday night.

LeDee also pulled down 10 rebounds for SDSU, runner-up for last season's national title. Before the game, the school unveiled banners for being an NCAA finalist and for winning the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns. The Aztecs reached their first Final Four, beat Florida Atlantic 72-71 on Lamont Butler's buzzer-beater and then lost to UConn 76-59 in the championship game.

"It's great. I'm going to look at it every day and then go to work," coach Brian Dutcher said. "Step onto Steve Fisher Court and look at a Final Four banner. A lot of good stuff's happened here. And the crowd tonight, come on. The energy in the building was incredible. We feed off that. It's a fun place to play and a fun place to come watch a game. It was exciting."

Micah Parrish had five 3-pointers and scored 17 for SDSU, while newcomer Reese Waters added 15.

The Aztecs went on a 15-4 run after the Titans closed to 39-38 on Grayson Carper's 3 early in the second half. The spurt started when LeDee scored six straight points, including a coast-to-coast dunk and a 3-point play. Elijah Saunders had a steal and dunk, Parrish hit a 3 and Butler sank a jumper to make it 54-42.

The Aztecs say it's time to move on from last year's thrilling run through March Madness.

Dominic Brewton scored 13 for the Titans. Max Jones had 11 points and Donovan Oday added 10.

San Diego State lost five key players from last season's team, including leading scorer Matt Bradley and leading rebounder Nathan Mensah. Aztecs guard Darrion Trammell, the leading returning scorer, has been sidelined with a shoulder injury since early October.

SDSU is at former league rival BYU on Friday night, where the Aztecs are 4-30 overall but have split the last two games there.

PROVO, Utah — Dallin Hall scored 16 of his 18 points in the second half to lead BYU to a 74-65 victory over No. 17 San Diego State on Friday night.

Jaxson Robinson, Richie Saunders and Fousseyni Traore each finished with 12 points for the Cougars and Traore grabbed a team-high eight rebounds as BYU earned just its fifth victory over an AP Top 25 opponent in coach Mark Pope's tenure.

Hall and Trevin Knell combined for three 3-pointers to fuel a 9-0 run that gave BYU a 57-50 lead with 5:30 left.

Micah Parrish cut the deficit to two on back-to-back baskets, but the Aztecs were unable to draw closer. Hall made a pair of free throws and followed with a pair of baskets to help boost BYU's lead to 66-57 with 2:34 remaining.

Hall, who is working his way back from a knee injury, played for 25 minutes.

Jaedon LeDee led San Diego State with 21 points and seven rebounds and Reese Waters chipped in 15 points.

Keeping BYU off the glass proved to be a chore for the Aztecs. The Cougars outrebounded San Diego State 42-32.

The Cougars missed 13 of their first 17 shots as they struggled to create a consistent rhythm against a stifling Aztec defense.

Once Robinson got going, however, San Diego State struggled to cool off the Cougars.

BYU took its first lead midway through the half, going up 17-15 on Robinson's 3-pointer that capped a 7-0 run. Robinson then made back-to-back baskets to fuel a 10-0 run that put the Cougars up 29-20.

The Aztecs went 5 1/2 minutes without making a basket late in the first half. They missed seven straight shots and committed four turnovers in that stretch.

BYU outscored San Diego 42-9 in bench points. Hall, Robinson, and Saunders — three of the Cougars' top four scorers — did not start. Hall and Robinson combined for six of BYU's 10 3-pointers.

The Aztecs were thin on bench depth because of injuries to rotation players Miles Byrd and Demarshay Johnson, Jr.

San Diego State: Prolonged scoring droughts and a lack of depth put the Aztecs in a tough position. San Diego State has some work to do to reach a similar level it enjoyed a season ago when it reached the national championship game.

SAN DIEGO — Senior forward Jaedon LeDee matched his career-high with 27 points to lead the San Diego State Aztecs in an 88-76 win over Long Beach State on Tuesday evening at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

LeDee also contributed 11 rebounds and three steals for the Aztecs who improve to 2-1 on the year. Reese Waters scored 15 points for the third time in as many games while shooting 5-of-10, including 3-of-6 from beyond the arc. Lamont Butler had 14 points and shot 5-for-10 (2-of-6 from 3-point range) and 2-of-3 from the free throw line. Micah Parrish added 13 points also on 5-of-10 from the floor and Elijah Saunders set a career-best with 11 points and pulled down six rebounds. Each of the aforementioned five players started the game and the contest marked the first time all five SDSU starters reached double digits in the scoring column since Feb. 16, 2020, when the Aztecs won 72-55 at Boise State.

SDSU won its 36th straight game against a current Big West school. In addition, SDSU defeated Long Beach State for the 16th time in the last 17 meetings between these programs, regardless of location, and for the eighth straight time.

San Diego State got the first bucket of the contest, a LeDee layup just 16 second in, and never trailed in the game for the second time in three games this season. SDSU used a 10-0 run over 2:08 of the first half to turn a 15-12 lead into a 25-12 advantage with 10:36 to play before intermission and took a 47-39 lead into the break.

The Beach (1-2) which were led in scoring by Marcus Tsohonis, who finished with 17 points, cut the lead to three twice early in the second half. But the Aztecs put together a 12-2 run midway through the half to go up 78-63 and never looked back in the 12 point victory.

San Diego State returns to action on Friday, when it plays Saint Mary's College in its opening game at the Continental Tire Main Event in Las Vegas.

Elijah Saunders made 3 of 3 from 3-point range and scored 16 points for San Diego State (4-1). Micah Parrish added 15 points and Reese Waters 13.

Keion Brooks Jr. scored eight of his 22 points in overtime, Sahvir Wheeler finished with 19 points and six assists, and Moses Wood added 18 points for Washington (3-2). Paul Mulcahy had 11 points and tied his career-high with 13 of the Huskies' 27 assists - their most since recording 30 against California on February 10, 2011.

LeDee made two free throws with 1:17 to play and hit layup with 36 seconds left gave the Aztecs the lead for good at 98-97. Waters made two free throws to cap the scoring with 9 seconds left and Moses Wood missed a potential tying 3-point shot as time expired.

Wheeler made a layup with 50 seconds left in regulation, Mulcahy also made a layup and Wheeler followed with a third that trimmed Washington's deficit to 85-84 with 7 seconds left. After a tie-up on the inbound, Washington gained possession, threw the ball in to Mulcahy, who drove into the lane and drew a foul on a fadeaway with 1.0 seconds left. The grad transfer from Rutgers missed the first of two free throws but made the second to force overtime.

San Diego State plays California at the SoCal Showcase on Saturday and Washington is off until the Huskies play host to UC San Diego on Nov. 28.

SAN DIEGO — Three Aztecs scored in double figures led by senior forward Jaedon LeDee’s 15 points, 13 rebound double double, his fourth in seven games this season, as San Diego State beat Point Loma Nazarene 71-51 on Monday evening at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

“That was a good game for us” Aztec head men’s basketball coach Brian Dutcher said. “Point Loma is a ranked Division II program. They played us without their best player tonight. They stretch the floor, they shoot threes, and they provide a whole different challenge than we have faced this year. We’ve played teams where we’re not even guarding certain players because they can’t shoot, and we’re trying to over-help, and this is a game where you really can’t help off anybody because they shoot the ball so well. They do a good job spreading the floor, they run a good offense, and they have a good team. We played a pretty good first half, even though we got down, we had 15 baskets, and 13 of them assisted. We shot 51% from the field, made a lot of threes, and we played good offensive basketball.”

Junior wing Reese Waters shot 4-of-9 from the floor, including 3-of-6 from 3-point range, and was 3-of-3 from the free throw line for 14 points and added four rebounds, two assists and a steal. Lamont Butler, a senior guard, had 10 points shooting 4-of-9 from the field with three rebounds, three assists and a steal. Senior guard Darrion Trammell finished with game-highs of five assists and three steals while totaling eight points.

Point Loma Nazarene hit two early 3-pointers to forge a 6-2 lead, but the Aztecs (6-1) responded with a 14-0 run over the next 3:38 of game time to turn that four-point deficit into a 16-6 advantage and never looked back. SDSU led by 15 at the half on its way to a 20-point victory.

San Diego State shot 45.6 percent for the game (26-of-57) while limiting the Sea Lions (4-3) to just 29.3 percent (17-of-58). It is SDSU’s 15th straight win when holding its opponent to under 35 percent and the team improved to 50-2 in Brian Dutcher era when holding its opponent to less than 35 percent.

Luke Smith led the way for the Sea Lions with 19 points. Zack Paulsen added 13 points, six rebounds and two steals.

LeDee had a layup with 38 seconds left to play to pull the Aztecs (7-1) within 62-61. Bryce Pope missed a 3-pointer with 10 seconds to go and LeDee grabbed the rebound. Lamont Butler misfired from beyond the arc at the other end with two seconds remaining, but LeDee was there to grab the miss and score the winning basket.

Parrish topped San Diego State with 15 points and 10 rebounds. LeDee and Elijah Saunders scored 13 apiece with LeDee adding 10 boards. Butler scored 10 with five assists.

Francis Nwaokorie, Hayden Gray and Pope all finished with 15 points for the Tritons (4-4). Gray added five assists.

Prior to LeDee’s game winner, San Diego State only led for 28 seconds at the beginning of the second half. With 7:36 remaining in the game, the Aztecs trailed 57-43 following a 10-0 Triton run. The Aztecs did not lose faith, going on a 13-0 run to bring the score to 57-56 with just over two minutes to go.

“We’ve got to weather the storm.” Parrish said on the team’s attitude when they trailed by 14. “We knew they were going to come in here and play hard. They had a great environment tonight. They have a great team. We knew we had to come in and step it up. We knew that we had to get stops and rely on defense getting stops and getting stops. We got three stops in a row at the end of the game. We knew we were going to go down and score. We just needed to get stops.”

The Scarlet and Black outshot UC San Diego 41.3 percent (26-of-63) to 39.7 percent (23-of-58) from the field and 38.1 percent (8-of-21) to 34.5 percent (10-of-29) from beyond the arc. The biggest Aztec advantage came in rebounds, where SDSU led by a 43-28 margin overall and 14-5 on the offensive glass.

San Diego State faces a tough road test in its next matchup, when it travels to Phoenix to face the Grand Canyon Antelopes at 7 p.m. MT on Tuesday night. The game will be broadcast by ESPNU on television and San Diego Sports 760 on radio.

“We didn’t make enough plays to win a game like this,” Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher said. “We played well in the second half. We shot 48% and scored one more basket than them. They beat us at the foul line. We both made eight threes. Rebounding was a little difference, but we had 13 offensive and they had 10. The difference was that they scored on theirs and we didn’t score on ours.”

Joining LeDee in double figure scoring were Reese Waters and Darrion Trammell, each with 11 points, and the aforementioned Parrish who finished the game the 10 points.

The game started as a defensive struggle and turned into an offensive outburst to start the second half.

The Antelopes (7-1) got hot and didn’t stop until late, using a 17-4 run to take a 13-point lead with 4 1/2 minutes left. Grand Canyon kept the Aztecs at bay from there despite not hitting a field goal over the final 4:27 to win its first game in 10 tries against ranked opponents.

Tyon Grant-Foster added 18 points for the Antelopes, off to their best start since joining Division I in 2013-14.

The Aztecs made shots early in the second half but faded during a key stretch, going more than four minutes without a field goal while the Antelopes revved up the crowd even more.

San Diego State has been one of the nation’s best defensive teams, a hard-nosed identity that took the Aztecs to last season’s national championship.

Grand Canyon collapsed in the lane to force difficult shots and the Aztecs missed several open 3s. San Diego State missed 13 of its first 16 shots and went scoreless over the final 2:54 of the first half.

McGlothian scored the final four points of a closing 9-0 run that put Grand Canyon up 35-28.

The teams switched gears to start the second half, trading baskets and leads until GCU went on an 17-4 run to go up 69-56.

The Aztecs (8-2) were playing without leading scorer Jaedon LeDee. Reese Waters recorded his first career double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds. Pal scored 15 points, his most while playing with San Diego State. Trammell chipped in 10 points of his own.

Hohn banked in a 3-pointer with 58.4 seconds left for a 62-57 lead but missed two free throws with 41.5 seconds to go. Pal made a free throw and Trammell hit a 3-pointer with 30.5 seconds to pull the Aztecs within one before Parrish's winning shot.

Hohn had 16 and Derin Saran 14 for UC Irvine (6-4), which lost its third straight game. Prior to that, the Anteaters had won six straight, including a 10-point upset win at then-No. 16 Southern California on Nov. 14.

SDSU beat the Anteaters on a Parrish shot for the second straight season.

The Aztecs led 42-26 with 16:40 left before the Anteaters came racing back behind Saran to tie it at 50-50. The Anteaters then took the lead on a 3-pointer by Hohn.

LeDee, the nation's sixth-leading scorer with an average of 22.8 points, sprained his right elbow in a 79-73 loss at Grand Canyon on Tuesday night.

SDSU hosts Saint Katherine on Dec. 19.

SAN DIEGO – Four Aztecs scored in double figures highlighted by Jaedon LeDee's 17 points as San Diego State cruised by Saint Katherine 91-57 on Tuesday evening at Viejas Arena.

Reese Waters dropped 15 points and Jay Pal and Darrion Trammell each scored 10 to join him in double figures.

Saint Katherine was led by Maur Tablada's 23 points and Xavier Cooper's 13 points.

True to their name, the Firebirds (9-3) started out hot, making their first four attempts, including a trio of 3-pointers, to take an 11-7 lead. Their shots went cold as they finished the first half 4-of-21. The Aztecs (9-2) led by 30 at halftime, the 13th time that they have accomplished the feat since 1996-97, and coasted the rest of the way.

Miles Heide and Demarshay Johnson Jr. each set a career-high with nine and eight rebounds, respectively.

San Diego State's younger players earned more experience with Cade Alger scoring his first points of the season and BJ Davis and Cam Lawin both making their first collegiate baskets.

The Aztecs outshot Saint Katherine from the field: 45.8 percent (33-72) to 32.8 percent (19-58). The Firebirds shot better from deep: 35.7 percent (10-28) to 30.4 percent (7-23) and from the line: 100 percent (9-9) to 90 percent (18-20). SDSU led in most other facets of the game: 42-4 in bench points, 46-12 in the paint, 33-2 off turnovers and 19-2 on second chance points. San Diego State had twice as many rebounds as Saint Katherine 50 (19 offensive, 31 defensive) to 25 (five offensive, 20 defensive).

San Diego State does not have a lot of time to prepare for its next game with a home matchup against the Stanford Cardinal set for 6 p.m. on Thursday night at Viejas Arena. The game will be broadcast on CBS Sports Network and San Diego Sports 760.

SAN DIEGO – San Diego State opened the second half on a 15-3 scoring run to pull away from Stanford, defeating the Cardinal 74-60 on Thursday night.

The Aztecs (10-2) started the game on just 2-of-9 shooting but rallied to end the half with four makes on their final five attempts. Darrion Trammell sent SDSU into the break with a two-point lead, hitting a floater at the buzzer to make it 34-32 at half.

SDSU carried that momentum into the second half, increasing their lead to double digits within the first three and a half minutes. From that point on, Stanford (5-5) never brought it back to a single-digit game the rest of the night.

Lamont Butler led all scorers with 18 points on 7-of-13 shooting. He also led the game with four assists on the night. Jaedon LeDee put up 16 points despite playing just 1:34 in the first half after being called for two quick fouls out of the gate. Micah Parrish also finished in double-figures with 10 points to go along with five rebounds and three assists.

The Aztecs outshot Stanford 45% to 41% on the back of a 53.8% shooting effort in the second half. They were 8-of-27 (30%) from beyond the arc compared to the Cardinal's 3-of-20 (15%). The Scarlet and Black also held the advantage in bench points (20-10), points off forced turnovers (15-6), and second chance points (10-4).

San Diego State will end the calendar year and their non-conference slate on the road at No. 15 Gonzaga on Friday, December 29.

SPOKANE, Wash. — Reese Waters scored 15 of his 22 points in the second half, Jaedon LeDee added 20 points, and San Diego State used a big second half to beat No. 13 Gonzaga 84-74 on Friday night.

The Aztecs (11-2) won their fourth straight and dominated long stretches late in the first half and early in the second half to take the nonconference matchup between two of the better programs on the West Coast.

"We're definitely happy. We came into a hostile environment, a team that's really good, ranked high and we came out and did what we were supposed to do," Waters said. "I think we're a really good team. We had two losses unfortunately but I don't think that defines who we are as a team."

San Diego State handed Gonzaga (9-4) its first nonconference loss on its home floor since falling to UCLA on Dec. 12, 2015. It was just the third home loss overall for the Zags since the start of the 2017 season and their first double-digit home loss since falling to Illinois 85-74 in December 2012.

"I thought we fought and hung in there and battled and played with great spirit, but we didn't play smart enough during this whole game," Gonzaga coach Mark Few said. "They deserve a lot of credit to come on the road and they played great."

After reaching the national title game last season, the Aztecs played a difficult nonconference schedule and lost road games at No. 14 BYU and at Grand Canyon. Winning at Gonzaga will likely be significant for San Diego State's NCAA tournament resume come March.

"We challenged ourselves. Most teams play a lot of these games at neutral sites and we decided we were going to go to Grand Canyon, we were going to go to BYU, we were going to go to Gonzaga and challenge ourselves," San Diego State head coach Brian Dutcher said.

Darrion Trammell added a season-high 17 points, including 15 in the first half and kept the Aztecs hanging around through some early struggles. But it was the end of the first half and start of the second half where the Aztecs took control and built a big enough lead to withstand Gonzaga's late rally.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State opened Mountain West play with a commanding 74-47 win over Fresno State on Wednesday night. The 27-point victory is the second-largest margin of victory for the Aztecs in series history.

The Aztecs (12-2, 1-0 Mountain West) had three scorers in double-figures led by Jaedon LeDee's 21, his eighth 20-point game this season. Micah Parrish and Lamont Butler each added 11 points in the victory. Parrish also pulled down a game high seven rebounds while Butler dished out a game high four assists.

As a team, SDSU shot 53% from the field while holding Fresno State to 35% shooting. The Aztecs also dominated the glass, 39-28 with 31 coming on the defensive end.

Fresno State (7-7, 0-1 MW) put points on the board first, but the Scarlet and Black responded with a 9-0 run to put them in front by eight. From there, SDSU never looked back taking a 13-point lead into halftime.

Similar to how the night started, the Bulldogs scored first coming out of the break, but the Aztecs responded with another huge scoring run to give themselves a 20-point advantage by the first media timeout of the second half.

The lead never dropped below 20 the rest of the night as the Aztecs cruised to a 74-47 win for their ninth consecutive victory over Fresno State.

It also marks the largest margin of victory over the Bulldogs since Jan 6, 1940, the second-ever meeting between the two programs.

Up next for San Diego State is UNLV on Saturday. Tip-off from Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena will be at 1 p.m. on CBS.

Lamont Butler added 16 points and Micah Parrish had 13 for the Aztecs (14-2, 3-0 Mountain West).

Jay Pal scored 10 points and blocked a potential tying layup by Trey Anderson with three seconds remaining to secure the victory for San Diego State.

"He went from goat, and I'm not saying greatest of all-time, to hero," Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher joked. "He basically messed the (defensive) switch up. ... To his credit, he kept playing and made a timely block."

Alvaro Cardenas led the Spartans (7-9, 0-3) with 21 points and six assists, but San Jose State lost its third in a row.

Myron Amey Jr. added 20 points and Tibet Gorener had 15.

San Jose State forced a shot clock violation with 13.6 seconds remaining to get the ball trailing 80-78. Cardenas found Anderson inside, but Pal swatted away his layup attempt and Butler recovered the loose ball for the Aztecs.

Butler was fouled and made one of two free throws. Diogo Seixas attempted a full-court heave for the tie but missed wide left.

"As crazy as it may sound, this is exactly how I thought the game would go," Dutcher said. "They're dynamic offensively. ... Tim Miles has got a good team this year. They just have not won the close game. And that's the difference between having the year we're having and the year they're having."

San Diego State won the rebound battle 37-28 and outscored San Jose State 38-24 in the paint.

The game featured 15 lead changes and 14 ties.

The Aztecs have won 12 in a row against the Spartans and 18 of 19 since San Jose State joined the Mountain West in 2013.

The Aztecs survived a scare to keep a couple of streaks alive. They've won 19 straight games when leading at halftime and 19 in a row when leading with five minutes remaining. San Diego State led 42-41 at the half and 70-67 with five minutes left.

Jaedon LeDee led the Aztecs (14-3, 3-1) with 15 points while Miles Byrd scored a career-high 13 points and Darrion Trammell chipped in 12.

The difference in the game was at the foul line, where the Lobos made 21 of 31 attempts. San Diego State was 11 of 20.

The Aztecs struggled with foul issues throughout the game, with starters Lamont Butler, Reese Waters and Micah Parrish spending significant time on the bench.

"I mean, obviously, we saw a couple guys I haven't seen, but it's a hard job. Officiating is a hard job," added Dutcher. "They do the best they can and sometimes the environment affects them too. Sometimes it doesn't, but I thought they did as good a job as they could. Obviously, we're wishing we got to the foul line more in the first half. Especially Jaedon [LeDee], he draws a lot of contact and just because you're big and strong doesn't mean you're not getting fouled. They just don't want to call as much when you're big and strong. Hopefully he'll get some more calls in our next game."

The game turned with five minutes remaining in the first half when New Mexico went on a 17-0 run, reversing a 35-23 San Diego State lead that was built on two 8-2 runs.

Trailing 40-37 at the half, the Aztecs never got any closer after the break. The Lobos took control with an 11-1 run seven minutes into the half and their advantage never fell below double digits.

San Diego State hosts Nevada at 8 p.m. PT on Wednesday night at Viejas Arena. There will be a halftime ceremony to hang the jerseys of Michael Cage, Milky Phelps and Judy Porter in the rafters of Viejas Arena next to Kahii Leonard's #15 jersey. SAN DIEGO — San Diego State topped Nevada 71-59 on Wednesday night to move to a perfect 12-0 against the Wolf Pack in Viejas Arena during the Mountain West era.

The Aztecs (15-3, 4-1 Mountain West) dominated the glass, out-rebounding the Wolf Pack (15-3, 2-2 MW) 44-25 including a 20-7 advantage on the offensive end. San Diego State also owned a 15-2 advantage in fast break points and made 22 free throws compared to Nevada's seven from the stripe.

The game started with a Nevada score on the first possession of the night, but the Aztecs responded with 10 unanswered points to take control early. They would have a hot hand for the entirety of the first half, shooting 52.0% (13-of-25) from the field while holding the Wolf Pack to 37.5% (9-of-24) including 0-of-10 from beyond the arc. It led to a 14-point SDSU advantage heading into halftime.

However, Nevada came out of the break red hot, hitting 10 of their first 13 shots in the second half to tie the game with 11 minutes remaining.

In need of a momentum change, Lamont Butler managed a strip steal and fastbreak the other direction for a layup to end the SDSU scoring drought immediately followed by a Reese Waters three-pointer from to force a Nevada timeout.

The Wolf Pack came out of their personal timeout and scored five straight points of their own to even the score once again. After the under-eight media timeout, Jaedon LeDee took over with a 6-0 scoring run by himself to put the Aztecs back in front for good.

San Diego State wrapped up the night on a 18-6 scoring run to polish off their 71-59 triumph for their fourth win in Mountain West play.

LeDee recorded his ninth double-double of the year, leading the game with 22 points and 12 rebounds. It is his sixth game this season with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds.

Waters and Jay Pal nearly recorded double-doubles of their own in the win. Waters finished the night with 14 points and seven rebounds while Pal had eight points and 10 rebounds.

The Aztecs are back on the road for their next game heading into Idaho for a matchup against Boise State. Tipoff will be at 10 a.m. PT on CBS.

Boise State survived a late game comeback by SDSU. The Aztecs went on a 12-4 run over the final two minutes but ran out of time, falling by one. San Diego State’s defense held the Broncos to just one made field goal over the final 5:30 of the game.

“Basketball is a game of runs,” said Head Men’s Basketball Coach Brian Dutcher following the game. “Like I said, we didn’t get the stops we needed down the stretch, and they did. Chibuzo Agbo was 2 of 6 shooting, including 1 for 5 from 3-point range, and went 6 for 8 from the line to finish with 11 points.

The Aztecs (15-4, 4-2) were led by Jaedon LeDee, who recorded 13 points and eight rebounds. Reese Waters added 10 points for San Diego State. In addition, Darrion Trammell had nine points and six rebounds.

Boise State went into the half leading San Diego State 34-31 due to ten points from Stanley in the first half. The game featured ten lead changes but San Diego State only led for three minutes. The Aztecs outscored the Broncos 16-3 on fast breaks and 24-10 off the bench but it was not enough.

SDSU outshot Boise State from the field (43.1 percent-39.3 percent) and the free throw line (84.2 percent-70.0 percent) but the Broncos were better from deep (37.5 percent-25.0 percent). San Diego State had two more rebounds (34-32).

“These guys are veterans. You don’t have to say a whole lot at halftime,” said Head Coach Brian Dutcher following the win. “We just give them a few adjustments. There’s no rah-rah pep talk, they’re ready to go. They play hard. They know they play the right way. The ball started going, and Darrion Trammell came in and was dynamic offensively. Lamont tied a career-high tonight with 23 points. These guys are hard to guard. They’re very good players, so it’s not for me to motivate them, it’s for me to put them in positions to be successful.”

Reese Waters made the first shot of the second half but Wyoming responded with a 9-0 run on three consecutive three-pointers. However, the Aztecs immediately answered with a 9-0 scoring run of their own to reclaim the lead and never looked back. Outscoring the Cowboys by 21 across the final 17:53 of the game, SDSU cruised to their 81-65 victory.

Lamont Butler recorded his second career game with 20-plus points, leading all scorers and matching his career-high with 23. It is the second time this season he has led the Aztecs in scoring with SDSU winning both contests. He filled out the stat sheet with five rebounds, four assists, and three steals.

Jaedon LeDee scored 17 points in the win, his 17th game this season with 15-plus points this season and had a team-high seven rebounds. Trammell also reached double-figures with 12 points on 5-of-6 shooting from the field.

The Aztecs will have the rest of the week and weekend off from game action as they get ready for a trip to Colorado State next Tuesday, Jan. 30. Tip from Fort Collins will be at 7 p.m. MT (6 p.m. PT).

SAN DIEGO — Jaedon LeDee had 16 points and nine rebounds to lead San Diego State to an 81-67 win against Great Osobor and No. 17 Utah State on Saturday to pull the defending Mountain West champion Aztecs within one game of the first-place Aggies.

LeDee scored nine points in the second half of the showdown between the conference's top two scorers and rebounders. Osobor had 17 points and seven rebounds for the surprise conference leaders, who were picked ninth in the preseason media poll.

The Aztecs (17-5, 6-3 Mountain West) beat the Aggies (19-3, 7-2) for the fifth straight time. That streak includes a win in the conference tournament championship game, and the Aztecs went on to reach their first Final Four, where they lost to UConn in the national championship game.

Jay Pal scored a season-high 16 points to go with seven rebounds for the Aztecs while Micah Parrish added 14 and Darrion Trammell had 12.

SDSU has won 33 straight games when a loss is followed by a home game.

Mason Falslev scored 16 and Darius Brown II had 13 for Utah State.

SDSU took a 42-36 halftime lead on Reese Waters' corner 3-pointer with four seconds left.

LeDee took over by scoring nine points in the first 4 1/2 minutes of the second half, including a 3-pointer, to help the Aztecs take a 54-44 lead.

The Aggies pulled within seven points with seven minutes to go before Elijah Saunders made consecutive shots for the Aztecs, including a 3-pointer that pushed the lead to 70-58.

While the big matchup was LeDee vs. Osobor, Dutcher shook up his lineup by starting Pal and Trammell over Parrish and Saunders.

The Aztecs improved to 10-0 at home against Utah State since it joined the Mountain West in 2013-14. Eight have been by double digits.

San Diego State held a 39-30 rebounding margin in the game. The Aztecs outshot the Aggies from the field (47.3%-41.0%) and from deep (45.0%-26.1%) while USU was better from the free throw line (84.6%-71.4%).

Next up for San Diego State is a road game at Air Force on Tuesday night, February 6, at 8:30 p.m. MT/7:30 p.m. PT. The game will be broadcast on FS1 and San Diego Sports 760.

AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. — Reese Waters scored 15 points, making five of San Diego State's season-high 11 3-pointers, and the 24th-ranked Aztecs cruised to a 77-64 win over Air Force on Tuesday night.

The Aztecs (18-5, 7-3 Mountain West) took 5 1/2 minutes to settle in and grab their first lead, but once they did they never looked back. They broke open the game with a 13-0 first-half run and eventually led by 25 in winning their ninth straight over the Falcons (8-14, 1-9).

San Diego State moved into a four-way tie for first place in the conference standings, joining No. 25 New Mexico, No. 22 Utah State and Boise State.

The physical presence of Jaedon LeDee down low proved too much for Air Force to handle as he finished with 14 points and nine rebounds. San Diego State played hounding defense, too, and forced 14 turnovers - including three shot-clock infractions.

Beau Becker and Jeffrey Mills both had 15 points to lead Air Force. Two of the Falcons' top scorers, Rytis Petraitis and Ethan Taylor, were held to a combined 10 points. Petraitis got into foul trouble trying to help contain LeDee.

Micah Parrish added 14 points and Lamont Butler tacked on 11 for the Aztecs. Waters' five 3-pointers were a career-high and the most by an Aztec since the first game of the season on November 6.

San Diego State was dominant in the first half, leading 45-20 at the break. It was the second time since 1996-97 that the Aztecs led a Division One team on the road by that much at halftime. To build that lead, SDSU shot 70.0% from the field, 72.7% from beyond the arc and 75.0% from the free throw line while Air Force turned the ball over 11 times.

The Aztecs outshot the Falcons from the field (51.0%-45.7%) and from the free throw line (72.7%-57.1%) while both teams made half of their three point attempts. San Diego State had more rebounds (29-25) and fewer turnovers (9-14).

San Diego State heads to Reno, Nevada, to face the Wolf Pack on Friday, February 9, at 5 p.m. PT. The game will be broadcast on CBS Sports Network and San Diego Sports 760.

RENO, Nev. — After trailing for the majority of the game, No. 24-ranked San Diego State came back to take a late lead but ran out of steam in overtime, falling 70-66 at Nevada on Friday evening.

San Diego State (18-6, 7-4 Mountain West) was led by Jaedon LeDee, who scored 20 points and grabbed seven rebounds. Darrion Trammell totaled nine points for the Aztecs while Micah Parrish neared a double-double with nine points and ten rebounds. Parrish and Trammell also combined for eight of SDSU's ten assists.

For the Wolf Pack (19-5, 6-4), Kenan Blackshear scored 22 points including eight of the team's ten points in overtime. Jarod Lucas scored 15 and Nick Davidson tacked on 14.

Nevada led from the first possession of the game until there was 6:46 remaining in regulation, when SDSU evened the score at 46. The Aztecs claimed their first lead on a three-point play by Jay Pal with 3:47. The game remained close, with Nick Davidson making a layup with five seconds remaining to force overtime. San Diego State had a chance to win in regulation but Trammell was unable to get a shot off.

In the overtime period, SDSU started out by scoring the first four points before the Wolf Pack responded with six unanswered to take a two point lead. San Diego State tied things up with a pair of free throws before Tre Coleman scored a go-ahead layup with 12 seconds remaining. Trammell missed a three at the end for SDSU before a Nevada rebound and pair of free throws ended the game.

In a very physical game, San Diego State finished with 27 fouls and Nevada had 25 while both team had a starter foul out (Lamont Butler, SDSU; K.J. Hymes, Nevada). A defensive battle, each team turned the ball over 16 times and struggled from deep, hitting just three 3-pointers each (all in the first half) despite the first three baskets of the game coming from beyond the arc.

As Dutcher alluded to, Nevada outscored SDSU 15-6 on second chance points. The Aztecs outshot the Wolf Pack from the bonus stripe (85.2%-46.2%) but Nevada was better from the field (46.2%-40.8%) and long range (23.1%-15.8%).

San Diego State returns home to Viejas Arena for a pair of big Mountain West matchups next week. SDSU hosts Colorado State at 6 p.m. PT on Tuesday evening and No. 25-ranked New Mexico at 7 p.m. PT on Friday night. Tuesday's game will be televised on CBS Sports Network with a radio broadcast on San Diego Sports 760.

LeDee was the second half spark after missing majority of the first 20 minutes due to early foul trouble. The senior forward put up 21 points in the second half, including 14 of the team's first 16. His 27 total points led all scorers.

Lamont Butler recorded the first double-double of his career with 11 points and a career-high 10 rebounds. He also had three of SDSU's eight steals. Darrion Trammell was the third and final Aztec in double-figures, scoring 11 points and adding a game-high five assists.

San Diego State remains at home to close out the week as they welcome New Mexico to Viejas Arena on Friday night. Tip-off will be at 7 p.m. on FS1.

Jaalen House had 22 points to lead the way for New Mexico (20-6, 8-5). JT Toppin (18 points, ten rebounds) and Mustapha Amzil (10 points, 11 rebounds) logged double-doubles and Donovan Dent scored 11 for the Lobos.

San Diego State shot 61.5% in the first half to take a 39-28 lead into the break. The Aztecs' defense held New Mexico to just 35.5% from the field and 22.7% from deep in the game while SDSU shot 56.9% and 41.2% from beyond the arc. New Mexico was better from the free throw line (91.3%-69.6%).

SDSU's bench played a big role in the victory, outscoring New Mexico's reserves 25-15 while San Diego State's defense blocked six shots to the Lobos' 0. Each team was sloppy with the ball as the Aztecs turned it over 20 times and New Mexico did so 19 times. SDSU spread the ball around, with every player who saw the court making at least one basket and the team totaling 20 assists on 29 made baskets.

San Diego State outscored Utah State off turnovers (20-7) and in bench points (28-6) but the Aggies scored more in the paint (36-26).

FRESNO, Calif. — No. 19-ranked San Diego State scored the first 12 points of the game and did not look back from there as it dismantled Fresno State 73-41 at Save Mart Center in Fresno, Calif., on Saturday night.

San Diego State (21-7, 10-5 Mountain West Conference) has won three of its last four.

Jaedon LeDee finished with 22 points on 8-of-11 shooting including 15 points in the first half and grabbed 11 rebounds for his 10th double-double of the season. He is the first Aztecs player to accomplish the feat since Jalen McDaniels in 2018-19. LeDee also had a season-high three blocks.

Jay Pal added 14 points for the Aztecs highlighted by a pair of dunks, Reese Waters had 12 and Micah Parrish 10.

It was the second straight double-digit loss for Fresno State (11-16, 4-10), which had a 27-point loss to the Aztecs on Jan. 3.

Isaiah Hill led the Bulldogs with 12 points. Xavier DuSell added 10.

San Diego State opened on a 29-5 run and led 42-16 at the break. LeDee was 5 of 7 from the floor, made all four of his free throws and grabbed eight rebounds in the first half. Fresno State shot 24% (6 of 25) and missed 11 of 13 3-point attempts before the break. The Bulldogs' 16 points in the first half was the second lowest total in a half allowed by SDSU on the season. The Aztecs also grabbed 25 rebounds and had eight assists to go with five blocks in the opening period.

The Aztecs outscored Fresno State 28-12 in the paint, 14-8 on second chance points, 17-0 on the fast break and 18-2 off the bench. SDSU also finished ahead of the Bulldogs in rebounds (52-34), assists (13-3) and blocks (9-4). San Diego State shot better in all three facets of the game: from the floor (41.8%-24.6%), from deep (29.6%-18.5%) and from the line (81.8%-66.7%).

San Diego State hosts San Jose State on Tuesday night on Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs' Black History Month Celebration game will be broadcast on CBS Sports Network and San Diego Sports 760.

SAN DIEGO — Jaedon LeDee had 27 points - 21 in the second half - and 11 rebounds for No. 20 San Diego State, which held off last-place San Jose State 72-64 on Tuesday night to keep pace in the tight Mountain West Conference race.

The defending regular-season and MWC Tournament champion Aztecs (22-7, 11-5) beat the Spartans for the 13th straight time to remain just behind conference co-leaders Utah State and Boise State. The Aztecs get six days off before playing at UNLV next Tuesday night and then finishing the regular season at home against Boise State on March 8.

LeDee helped the Aztecs to a 52-35 lead midway through the second half before the Spartans clawed back to 57-52. He rebounded Micah Parrish's missed 3-pointer and then had a steal and slam dunk as part of a three-point play to give SDSU a 62-54 advantage.

LeDee finished with his 11th double-double of the season.

"He's a dangerous player and to his credit, everybody knows it, and he still ends up with another double-double," Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher said. "That's a first-team All-American to me."

Dutcher called it "a quiet 27" for LeDee.

"He did it however he could. He rebounded the ball and got some putbacks, he ran the floor, got some baskets, and he scored a lot of different ways, which good players do. It's not just one-dimensional scoring," the coach said.

A 3-pointer by Alvaro Cardenas and a putback by Latrell Davis pulled the Spartans to 64-60 with 2:20 to go.

Elijah Saunders had 10 points for SDSU, including a huge dunk with 50 seconds left following a San Jose State turnover to give the Aztecs a 66-60 lead. They made six free throws in the final 31 seconds.

Myron Amey Jr. scored 17 points for San Jose State (9-20, 2-14), and Trey Anderson had 14.

LeDee, continually pounded inside by double teams, made a turnaround jumper and a bank shot in the opening minute of the second half, giving the Aztecs a 33-22 lead. He then scored five points during a 15-2 run that pushed it to 52-35.

The Aztecs remained in The Associated Press Top 25 for a second straight week, dropping just one spot after a week in which they lost 68-63 at Utah State and won 73-41 at Fresno State.

Elijah Saunders led San Diego State (22-8, 11-6 Mountain West) with 14 points, one of four Aztecs to score in double figures. Saunders' four three-pointers were a career-high. Jaedon LeDee added 12 points and seven rebounds while Micah Parrish scored 11 points and Butler put up ten and four steals. Jay Pal also had seven rebounds for SDSU and Darrion Trammell tallied seven assists and four swipes for the Scarlet and Black.

"It felt good," said Saunders on his shooting. "My shots have been feeling really good lately. I was in rhythm."

It was the fourth win against a ranked team for the surging Rebels (19-10, 12-5), who have won 10 of 11 overall. Keylan Boone had 16 points and 11 rebounds. Dedan Thomas led UNLV with 19 points.

San Diego State has dominated this rivalry in recent years, beating the Rebels in 37 of the previous 48 meetings including 13 of 14 at the Thomas & Mack Center.

UNLV took an early 27-10 lead to begin the game but the Aztecs got back into contention, going on a 13-1 run to close the gap to five points.

The Rebels held onto the lead until Lamont Butler made a 3 and then stole the ball and put in a layup to tie it at 58 with 44.6 seconds left.

Thomas then answered with a jumper with 18 seconds remaining to put UNLV back in front, and Kalib Boone blocked Micah Parrish's 3-point attempt. Thomas' two free throws with 6.5 seconds remaining sealed the victory.

SDSU dominated on the offensive glass, matching a season-high by grabbing 20 offensive rebounds. The Aztecs spread the ball around, earning 14 assists on 18 made baskets. San Diego State also had ten steals defensively to UNLV's seven.

The Rebels shot better from the field (40.0%-28.1%) and from beyond the arc (44.4%-33.3%) while the Aztecs were better from the free throw line (73.3%-66.7%).

San Diego State wraps up its regular season with one last game at Viejas Arena on Friday night against Boise State. The game is scheduled for 7 p.m. PT and will be televised on FS1 and San Diego Sports 760. The Aztecs will be honoring their seniors prior to tipoff.

In OT, Boise State's Max Rice heaved in a long 3-pointer as the shot clock expired to give BSU a 77-72 lead with 1:58 to go.

The Aztecs tied it with a shot off a rebound by Micah Parrish and a 3-pointer by Darrion Trammell. However, the Broncos' made a pair of free throws with just 1.7 seconds left and blocked the Aztecs' final shot at the buzzer to end the game.

Jaedon LeDee scored a game-high 21 points for the Aztecs while Butler scored 13, Micah Parrish 12 and Trammell 11. LeDee and Butler also pulled down six rebounds.

San Diego State will find out after Saturday's final league games what seed they will be for next week's conference tournament in Las Vegas.

For the sixth time this season, Trammell made a field goal in the final three seconds of the first half as he closed the Aztecs' deficit to five points at the break. LeDee's 18-point second half helped San Diego State finish off the three-point victory.

San Diego State was dominant on the glass, outrebounding UNLV 50-31 and outscoring the Rebels 20-8 on second chance points. The Aztecs were better in the paint by a 32-20 scoring margin. SDSU also excelled in transition, with nine steals to UNLV's four and 11 points to the Rebels' four on fast breaks.

UNLV was the better shooting team in the game, with a higher percentage than SDSU from the field (40.0%-36.6%), from beyond the arc (36.8%-26.1%) and from the free throw line (75.9%-61.5%).

Utah State led 34-17 when Osobor left the game with 6:22 left in the half. At that time, the MWC Player of the Year had 11 points. San Diego State immediately went on a seven-point run, sparked by a dunk by LeDee.

LeDee, who scored 34 points on Thursday against UNLV, played only eight minutes in the first half and scored five points.

SAN DIEGO STATE: The Aztecs had only five points off their bench on Thursday against UNLV, but had five in the first half against Utah State. Reese Waters scored 11 points off the bench against Utah State.

UTAH STATE: The Aggies, under first-year coach Danny Sprinkle, finished as regular-season champions and will wait until Sunday to find out their their NCAA Tournament fate.

San Diego State will play the winner of New Mexico and Colorado State in the championship game on Saturday.

LAS VEGAS (AP) Jaelen House had 28 points, Jamal Mashburn Jr. scored 21 and JT Toppin posted a double-double to propel sixth-seeded New Mexico to a 68-61 victory over No. 5 seed San Diego State in the championship game of the Mountain West Conference Tournament on Saturday at the Thomas & Mack Center, earning the Lobos an automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament.

New Mexico (26-9) had already made history by becoming the first team in the conference to win three games to reach the final. The Lobos won all three games by double digits and trailed for a total of 42 seconds. They were on the short end for just 6:38 against the Aztecs.

House had 15 points and Mashburn scored 13 to lead New Mexico to a 36-30 advantage at halftime. The Lobos led by as many as 14 and never trailed before intermission. Jaeden Ledee had a three-point play and scored five to spark a 10-2 run to close out the half for San Diego State (24-10).

New Mexico stayed in front in the second half until Reese Waters followed a three-point play with a 3-pointer to give the Aztecs a 44-43 lead with 12:12 remaining. The lead changed hands six times until Ledee made four straight free throws to put the Lobos up 54-51 with eight minutes left.

San Diego State took a 59-57 lead on two Ledee foul shots before House hit a pair to tie it. Toppin had a rebound basket for the lead and a layup and House added a three-point play in a victory-clinching 8-0 spurt and New Mexico led 67-59 with 36 seconds left.

House made 10 of 22 shots with three 3-pointers for the Lobos, adding five rebounds and three steals. Mashburn hit 6 of 16 shots with three 3-pointers. Toppin totaled 13 points and 11 rebounds.

Ledee finished with 25 points - going 11 for 11 at the free-throw line - for the Aztecs. Ledee sank 7 of 12 shots, while his teammates made just 13 of 44.

New Mexico won the tournament for the first time since it made its last NCAA Tournament appearance in 2014. It will be the school's 16th appearance in the event.

San Diego State, last season's national runners-up to UConn, upset top-seeded and 18th-ranked Utah State to reach the final.

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP) Within the first 5 minutes, Jaedon LeDee scored at the rim, hit a midrange jumper, threw down a powerful dunk and knocked down a 3-pointer.

This was bound to be a big game for LeDee, and San Diego State needed everything the third-team AP All-American had to offer.

LeDee dominated inside on the way to 32 points, Lamont Butler added 15 and the Aztecs - last year's national runners-up - held off 12th-seeded UAB 69-65 on Friday in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Again seeded No. 5 after their march to last year's title game, the Aztecs saw a 12-point second-half lead disappear before putting together a late surge behind LeDee to avoid a March Madness surprise in the East Region.

Quiet for most of the second half, LeDee scored on three straight possessions for the Aztecs (25-10) after UAB took a 56-53 lead. Butler hit a difficult fallaway, and LeDee climbed for an offensive rebound and was fouled with 1:01 left. LeDee hit both free throws to give SDSU a 66-63 lead, and he added two more foul shots with 20 seconds left.

UAB's Efreem Johnson had a contested look at a tying 3-pointer with 8 seconds left, but it rimmed off, and Reese Waters' free throw with 3 seconds remaining allowed the Aztecs a chance to exhale.

LeDee made 11 of 18 shots, was 9 of 10 at the free throw line and had eight rebounds. He topped 30 points for the fourth time this season and finished two short of his career high.

San Diego State will play No. 13 seed Yale, which knocked off highly regarded Auburn, in the second round on Sunday.

Johnson led UAB (23-12) with 19 points, but was scoreless over the final nine minutes. The Blazers' leading scorer, Yaxel Lendeborg, got into early foul trouble trying to defend LeDee and finished with 11 points. He fouled out in the closing seconds.

Eric Gaines added 14 points for the Blazers, who fell in the opening round for their second straight NCAA Tournament appearance. UAB lost two years ago to Houston in the first round, also as a No. 12 seed.

UAB trailed 44-32 early in the second half before a 17-5 run gave the Blazers their first lead of the game and set up the tense closing minutes.

For the second straight year, the Aztecs will face a No. 13 seed in the second round. Last year, the Aztecs beat 13th-seeded Furman after knocking off 12th-seeded Charleston.

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP) Jaedon LeDee had 26 points and nine rebounds, Darrion Trammell added 18 points and fifth-seeded San Diego State used a fast start to overwhelm 13th-seeded Yale and rolled to an 85-57 win in the second round of the NCAA Tournament on Sunday night.

The Aztecs scored the first 10 points of the game, led by 24 at halftime and removed any chance of another potential March Madness, bracket-busting upset.

San Diego State (26-10) earned a rematch with No. 1 seed and defending national champion UConn on Thursday in Boston in the Sweet 16. The Huskies beat the Aztecs 76-59 last April in Houston, denying San Diego State a chance at its first title.

The Aztecs will be playing in the Sweet 16 in consecutive years for the first time in school history.

LeDee was again the star for the Aztecs after he scored 32 points in the first-round win over UAB. He made 9 of 12 shots, including a pair of 3s, and in two tournament games is 20-for-30 shooting.

But some of the outside shooting that was absent in the tourney opener returned and San Diego State hit a season-high 13 3-pointers. Trammell had just four points and took four shots against UAB, but hit four 3s against Yale.

Bez Mbeng led Yale with 12 points and Matt Knowing added 11.

For the second straight year, San Diego State didn't allow a No. 13 seed seeking a landmark second-round upset the chance to breathe. The Aztecs suffocated Furman last year after the Paladins upset Virginia in the first round.

They did the same to Yale.

While the teams are different, the Aztecs will need to start better against UConn this time than they did in the title game. San Diego State trailed by 16 in the first half of that game and could only close within five points in the second half before UConn pulled away late.

Abukar led all scorers with 24 points and also had nine rebounds. Heath scored 15 with Marcus Slaughter contributing 13 points and 10 rebounds.

The second-seeded Gators never trailed in the game and opened the game on a 7-2 run, before the seventh-seeded Aztecs tied the score at nine with 14:12 remaining in the first half. SDSU, however, would never get closer than three points the rest of the way and Florida went into the half with a 35-23 cushion.

In the second half, the Gators' lead ballooned to 21 points with less than 10 minutes gone. San Diego State managed to cut the lead to 17 points with 5:42 left in the game, but Florida kept the Aztecs at bay as they cruised to the 24-point victory.

SDSU found itself down 34-26 at halftime after shooting 32.1 percent from the field, including a 2-for-12 effort from three-point range. Despite the poor shooting, the Aztecs were in the game until a 12-7 Volunteer run to end the half propelled the SEC school to its advantage at intermission.

The Aztecs, who went 15,713 days between NCAA tournament victories and entered the tourney having never won a Division I NCAA tournament game, found themselves with two wins in nearly 50 hours and a spot in the Sweet 16.

Getting to the regional semifinals looked like a lock in the first half as SDSU was rolling and enjoying an 11-point lead with 3:13 left before halftime. Temple, however, closed the gap in a hurry, rattling off six straight points to trail, 36-31, at the break.

In the second half, things still looked promising for the Aztecs as they led, 52-45, with 7:16 remaining in regulation. But as the clock ticked, San Diego State had a hard time finding the bottom of the net and defending the Owls. After Billy White's jumper with 7:16 left, Temple went on a 9-2 run to tie the game at 54. SDSU's Chase Tapley had a chance to win the game in the final seconds, but his driving layup was contested and off the mark.

In the first OT, Juan Fernandez immediately hit a three and scored the Owls' first five points, but Kawhi Leonard answered with four straight points and was followed by a three-point play from Malcolm Thomas. Again, the Aztecs had a chance to win the game in the final moments, but Thomas' bubby jumper missed.

In what proved to be the final five minutes, SDSU buckled down defensively and continued to go to the hoop, which resulted in it outscoring Temple, 10-3, to secure the victory.

SDSU found itself down by just four, 33-29, at the half despite shooting 37.9 percent from the field. The Aztecs, however, shot 40 percent from three-point range compared to the 16.7 percent by the Wolfpack. NC State's 51.9 shooting percentage and 20-13 rebound advantage made up for the lack of three-point shots.

Coming out of the break, San Diego State managed to cut the deficit to one on a three-pointer by Chase Tapley. That would be short lived as North Carolina State used an 8-2 run to extend its lead to 43-36.

The Aztecs kept it close despite being down by as many as nine points and managed to pull within three after scoring on five consecutive possessions. Wolfpack head coach Mark Gottfried then called a timeout that sparked a 9-4 run and extended NC State's lead to 10 with 5:37 remaining.

From there, the Wolfpack never looked back and eventually won by a 14-point margin.

PHILADELPHIA - Seventh-seeded San Diego State rallied from a nine-point first-half deficit to beat 10th-seeded Oklahoma, 70-55, in the second round of the NCAA Tournament at Wells Fargo Center.

The win marked the third in program history and the third in the last three seasons for SDSU, which was 0-6 in the NCAA tournament prior to the 2011 campaign.

Jamaal Franklin led the way for the Aztecs with 21 points, eight rebounds, five assists and two steals. James Rahon added 17 points in 19 minutes off the bench and DeShawn Stephens collected a career-high 11 boards.

The Sooners broke the game open midway through the first half as a 12-0 surge propelled them to a 23-14 lead with 9:40 to go in the first half. The Aztecs, however, closed on a 17-10 run to trail, 33-31, at halftime.

In the final 20 minutes, SDSU took control of the boards, aided by five offensive and defensive rebounds by Stephens, and subsequently took control of the game.

Oklahoma led 36-35 with 18:03 left in regulation and it marked the final time the Sooners would have the lead. After OU tied the game at 48-48, SDSU went on an 8-0 run and never looked back. Romero Osby temporarily stopped the Aztec surge with a three-pointer, but San Diego State responded with seven unanswered points to move ahead by 12 with 2:11 to play and eventually sealed the 15-point victory.

SDSU finished with a 40-29 rebounding advantage after being minus-2 in the category at halftime. The Aztecs also held the Sooners to 37.0-percent shooting in the second half, while shooting 46.2 percent in the final 20 minutes themselves. SDSU also set a season-high for free-throw accuracy, finishing at 94.1 percent.

PHILADELPHIA - Looking to advance to the Sweet 16 for the second time in three seasons, seventh-seeded SDSU's bid fell short as it fell to 15th-seeded Florida Gulf Coast, 81-71, in the third round of NCAAs.

With the win, the Eagles became the first 15-seed in NCAA history to reach the Sweet 16. For the Aztecs, the loss ended their season with a 23-11 record.

SDSU received 20 points and 11 rebounds from Jamaal Franklin and Chase Tapley poured in 17 points. James Rahon and DeShawn Stephens, meanwhile, added 12 and 10 points, respectively.

The first half was a fairly close affair. Florida Gulf Coast jumped out to an early 7-2 lead, but San Diego State answered with a 12-0 run to take a five-point lead of its own. No team led by more than four points the rest of the half until a 7-3 SDSU spurt propelled the Aztecs to a 35-29 lead with 2:20 to go. The Eagles, however, closed the first half with five straight points and San Diego State led, 35-34, at halftime.

The game remained tight over the course of the first eight minutes of the

second half. An Xavier Thames jumper in the point brought the Aztecs to within, 54-52, with 11:33 to play. FGCU, however, caught fire from the field and forced San Diego State into quick shots, which turned into a 17-0 Eagles run.

During the deciding surge, SDSU went scoreless for 7:14 before Thames made a layup with four minutes left in regulation. At this juncture, the Aztecs trailed by 17 and their hole was too deep.

ANAHEIM, Calif. - Fourth-seeded San Diego State led top-seeded Arizona with under eight minutes to play, was tied with seven minutes left and trailed by one with 3:30 remaining in regulation, but could not pull the upset as the Wildcats came from behind to win, 70-64. The victory sent Arizona to the Elite Eight.

The rematch from the second game of the season was a see-saw affair until SDSU turned a 22-20 deficit into a 29-22 lead. After a Rondae Hollis-Jefferson lay-up to break the 9-0 run, Dwayne Polee II clobbered a three-pointer to put San Diego State ahead by eight, 32-24.

The Aztecs had an opportunity to put the Wildcats away right before halftime,

but missed their final three shots and committed two turnovers. Arizona, meanwhile, scored four points the rest of the way to trail San Diego State by just four at halftime.

Despite the missed chance to pull away, the Aztecs stuck to the game plan in the second half and eventually got their head back up to eight points with 16:41 left in the second half thanks to six points from Xavier Thames.

In just over two minutes, however, Arizona was back within two. A Thames jumper temporarily halted the Wildcats' momentum, but the teams traded baskets over the next few minutes with Arizona taking its first lead, 50-49 (7:19), since 7:47 left in the first half.

Nick Johnson, the Pac-12 Player of the Year, missed his first nine shots, but with SDSU trailing by three points, Winston Shepard lost control of the ball near midcourt and Johnson was wide open for a lay-up to put Arizona up, 56-51, with 2:44 left. Johnson scored 13 consecutive points for UA and 15 of the team's final 16.

The Aztecs were buoyed by an impressive shooting display from deep in the first half. Dwayne Polee II was 4-for-6 and Matt Shrigley was 3-for-3 from behind the arc to help San Diego State take a 40-33 lead at halftime.

In the second half, SDSU opened with another three-pointer from Polee II to bump its lead to double figures, a margin the Aztecs would enjoy for most of the period. The Red Storm twice cut its deficit to seven points, the last of which occurred with 6:57 left in regulation. San Diego State, however, answered with six straight points to take a 66-53 lead with 3:22 to go.

St. John's responded by going on a 7-2 spurt to get its hole down to eight points with two minutes left, but SDSU made its next seven free-throws to put the game away.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. - Eighth-seeded San Diego State could not solve top-seeded Duke's front line and fell, 68-49, in the third round of the NCAA tournament.

The Blue Devils' front court of Jahlii Okafor and Justise Winslow put up dominating performances. Okafor finished with a game-high 26 points, while adding six rebounds and three blocked shots. Winslow, meanwhile, had 13 points, game highs of 12 rebounds, five assists and four steals, and three blocked shots.

Duke asserted itself early by scoring the first eight points and led, 15-4, after consecutive buckets from Quinn Cook, which forced SDSU to call timeout.

The Blue Devils took a 28-13 lead with 5:15 left in the first half on an Okafor layup. The freshman's basket gave him 14 points, which was one more than SDSU had as a team. San Diego State closed the half on a 7-2 run to make the score 37-24 entering the locker room.

INDIANAPOLIS - The decades-old zone defense of Syracuse coach Jim Boeheim claimed another frustrated victim Friday night.

The No. 11 seed Orange held 6-seeded San Diego State without a field goal for nearly a quarter of the game, Buddy Boeheim hit seven 3-pointers and finished with 30 points, and Syracuse cruised to a 78-62 victory.

Boeheim finished 7-of-10 from beyond the arc and 11-of-15 from the field, and Marek Dolezaj added 11 points, as Syracuse advanced to play third-seeded West Virginia or No. 14 seed Morehead State for a spot in the Sweet 16.

The Orange were trailing 18-14 midway through the first half when they clamped down on defense, holding San Diego State without a field goal the rest of the half. And when the Aztecs threatened to trim their deficit to less than 10 early in the second half, the son of the Syracuse coach was there to provide an answer.

Boeheim hit three quick threes to put the game out of reach.

Jordan Schakel had 17 points, but the nation's third-best 3-point shooter was just 5-of-13 from distance. Matt Mitchell also had 17 points on 8-of-19 shooting.

SDSU made it clear from the moment it put up three treys on its first couple of possessions that the plan was to break Syracuse's zone by shooting over the top.

Problem was the Aztecs didn't make many.

Beginning with Boeheim's own 3-pointer with 9:17 left, the Aztecs never scored again in the first half. They missed their final 10 attempts from beyond the arc, finished 3 of 20 from the 3-point line in the first half, and even missed the front end of a one-and-one with a few seconds left before the break.

"Buddy Buckets" nearly outscored San Diego State by himself. Boeheim had 16 points as Syracuse built a 32-18 halftime lead; it was the fewest points Dutcher's high-scoring, perimeter-oriented team had scored in a half all season.

Schakel got a 3-pointer to go right out of halftime, giving the San Diego State fans a long-awaited reason to cheer. But the Aztecs promptly went into another long slump, and the Orange' built a 56-30 lead before coasting to the finish.

FORT WORTH, Texas - Trey Alexander converted a go-ahead, three-point play late in overtime, and Creighton rallied for a 72-69 victory over San Diego State in an NCAA Tournament opener Thursday night.

The Bluejays hadn't led since the first five minutes of the game when Alexander, who also had the tying bucket late in regulation, drove right and was fouled on the layup. The free throw put Creighton ahead 71-69 with 1:08 remaining.

Down by two, the Aztecs had the ball with 4.3 second left when Matt Bradley inbounded to Ageuk Arop, then ran around him for the handoff. Bradley lost control of the ball before getting a shot off, and Creighton secured it with 0.8 to go.

Alexander scored 18 points, and Ryan Kalkbrenner had 16 points and 10 rebounds before leaving with an apparent left leg injury in overtime.

The ninth-seeded Bluejays (23-11) will play Saturday against the winner between Kansas, the top seed in the Midwest Region, and Texas Southern. Creighton reached the Sweet 16 last year.

Chad Baker-Mazara scored 15 of his 17 points in the first half for the Aztecs (23-9), who were in position for their first tournament win since 2015. Gus Bradley added 15.

Bradley had a chance to give San Diego State the lead on free throws with 6.4 seconds left in regulation when Alex O'Connell fouled him on a drive. Bradley missed the front end of a one-and-one, and Arthur Kaluma dribbled the length of the court before lofting an air ball from the baseline as time expired.

The Aztecs had led by at least five points since the middle of the first half when O'Connell hit just the second 3-pointer of the game for Creighton to get the Bluejays within four just inside the two-minute mark.

After a steal led to a layup from Kalkbrenner, Creighton forced another turnover before getting two shots blocked at the other end. The Bluejays thought they had the tying basket on another steal after the second block, but an official ruled San Diego State called timeout.

That ruling was reversed on replay, and Alexander hit the tying layup with 11 seconds to go.

Kalkbrenner went down and grimaced after a posting up Arop as they made contact with each other early in overtime. The 7-foot-1 sophomore got up, tried to take a couple of steps and went back down, holding his left knee. After several minutes, Kalkbrenner was helped off the floor without putting weight on his left leg.

Baker-Mazara had a bucket and a three-point play during a 7-2 run that gave the Aztecs their first double-digit lead in the first half, then converted a four-point play to get the margin back to double digits at 27-15.

ORLANDO, Fla. -- Matt Bradley scored 17 points, including two free throws in the final minute, and No. 5 seed San Diego State held on to beat 12th-seeded College of Charleston 63-57 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on Thursday.

The victory was a measure of redemption for Bradley, whose turnover in the waning seconds of overtime last year cost the Aztecs in a three-point loss to Creighton.

The senior provided pivotal plays down the stretch in this one, helping the Aztecs (28-6) win their first game in the Big Dance since 2015. They ended a four-game losing streak in the tournament and snapped an 11-game skid for the Mountain West Conference.

"Everybody makes us aware of (the losing streak)," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "The thing that you can't lose sight of is every team and every season is different. You know, there is no history."

"This team is creating its own history right now," Dutcher continued. "So there are some returning players off our last year's team that experienced some things that were disappointing, but you learn from that. And so we're not worried about past failures or successes. We're only focused on the moment, and that's how you win games."

The Cougars (31-4) lost for the first time in six weeks and have not won an NCAA tournament game since 1997.

San Diego State advanced to face 13th-seeded Furman in the South Region at the Amway Center on Saturday. The Paladins used a late steal and 3-pointer to stun No. 4 seed Virginia four years to the day since the Cavaliers became the first and only No. 1 seed to lose in the opening round.

Charleston looked to provide another upset in Orlando, but coach Pat Kelsey's scrappy team simply couldn't do enough down the stretch.

San Diego State did. Bradley scored on a driving layup coming out of a timeout with 2:37 to play, breaking a tie and ending a nearly 3-minute scoring drought for the Aztecs. Micah Parrish followed with a huge 3-pointer, giving them a little breathing room in the final minutes.

Charleston looked like it might be able to rally, but Jaylon Scott was called for a foul as Bradley shot a 3. He hit two of three from the charity stripe to essentially seal it.

Ante Brzovic led Charleston with 12 points and eight rebounds. Ryan Larson added 11 points, and seventh-year senior Dalton Bolon finished his college career with 10 points.

Bradley, one of four senior starters for San Diego State, chipped in seven rebounds and four assists.

BIG PICTURE

Charleston: The Cougars had three graduate-senior starters who carried them to the tournament, and coach Pat Kelsey will probably turn to the transfer portal to find replacements. The one glaring weakness against San Diego State was a post presence as the team got outscored by 12 points in the paint.

San Diego State: The Aztecs salvaged what looked to be another rough start for the Mountain West. Nevada lost in a play-in game Wednesday night to extend the league's losing skid to double digits, and Utah State made it 11 straight with a loss to Missouri early Thursday. But the conference champs stepped up and got the league back in the win column.

ORLANDO, Fla. - San Diego State had little trouble ending the run of March Madness darling Furman, getting 16 points from Micah Parrish to pace a balanced scoring attack and pulling away for a 75-52 win on Saturday in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Darrion Trammell had 13 points, Lamont Butler added 12 and leading scorer Matt Bradley finished with 10 for San Diego State (29-6), which is heading to its first Sweet 16 since 2004.

The fifth-seeded Aztecs have won 11 of their past 13 games and will play top overall seed Alabama next week in the South Region semifinals in Louisville, Kentucky.

"You should play your best at the end of the season, and we're playing our best basketball at the end of the season," coach Brian Dutcher said.

"Obviously we hang our hat on defense. That's the one thing that we do every game," Dutcher added. "Then when we get the opportunity, we start making shots and play good offensively, then we're very good."

San Diego State is the first Mountain West Conference team to reach the Sweet 16 since Nevada in 2018. It'll be the third regional semifinal appearance for the Aztecs and the seventh for the Mountain West overall.

Two days after struggling off cold shooting and overcoming a 12-point, second-half deficit to shock No. 4 seed Virginia 68-67 on JP Pegues' bracket-busting 3-pointer, Furman was outmuscled and gradually worn down by the much more physical Aztecs.

San Diego State led 39-25 at the half, getting 14 points off the bench from Parrish and limiting Furman to one field goal over the final 11 minutes leading into the break.

The Aztecs took control during a 15-0 run that turned a two-point deficit into a 30-17 lead. Furman missed seven straight shots and turned the ball over four times during a 9:56 field goal drought that dumped the Paladins into the big halftime hole.

Southern Conference player and the year Jalen Slawson picked up his fourth foul with 16:27 remaining and fouled out shortly after returning midway through the second half. The super senior stomped the floor in frustration, drawing a technical foul that gave San Diego State a pair of free throws that put the Aztecs up 60-37.

Mike Bothwell led the 13th-seeded Paladins (28-8) with 15 points. Alex Williams had 11 and Pegues finished with 11 as Furman shot 32%, including 6 of 26 from 3-point range.

Like Slawson, Bothwell is a super senior who returned to Furman for a fifth season after the Paladins were denied the Southern Conference's automatic NCAA Tournament berth by a buzzer-beater in their league championship game.

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher has insisted throughout the NCAA Tournament that if his team plays to its strengths, it doesn't matter what the opposition does.

The Aztecs certainly played the way they wanted to against the top overall seed in March Madness. Dutcher said the Aztecs played the way they wanted to against the top overall seed in March Madness. Darrion Trammell and San Diego State used a dominant defensive performance to knock Alabama out of the tournament, bottling up All-America freshman Brandon Miller in a 71-64 victory in the Sweet 16.

Trammell scored 21 points while Miller, whose outstanding season was marred by off-the-court complications, was held to nine points on 3-of-19 shooting and had six turnovers.

The fifth-seeded Aztecs (30-6) will face either Creighton or Princeton on Sunday in the West Region final as they seek their first Final Four in program history. Roughly 30 minutes later, the tournament's final remaining No. 1 seed, Houston, lost 89-75 to Miami, leaving March Madness without a single top seed among its final eight teams for the first time since seeding began in 1979. The other top seeds, Purdue and Kansas, lost during the tournament's opening weekend.

"It's just parity," Dutcher said. "That's what it is. There's not a lot of difference between the best team in the country and the worst team in the country. You're seeing that on this stage."

San Diego State trailed 48-39 midway through the second half before going on a 12-0 run and controlling the game from there. The Aztecs finished with eight blocked shots - five by Nathan Mensah - and forced 14 turnovers.

Trammell scored the first eight points of SDSU's big run. He made a 3-pointer, stole the ball from Miller and converted a layup, and then buried another 3.

"We're going to go on our run," Trammell said, "and I just took the opportunities they gave me. I took my shot, and I just made a play on defense. From there, our team was in it. That's when the momentum changed."

So did the Crimson Tide's season.

The March Madness run of Alabama (31-6) was clouded by its response to the Jan. 15 fatal shooting of a 23-year-old woman in Tuscaloosa, which led to capital murder charges against a then-Crimson Tide player, Darius Miles.

Miller was at the scene of the shooting and has not been charged, but police have said in court documents that Miles texted Miller to bring him his gun. Authorities have said Miller is a cooperating witness, and he did not miss any playing time. Miller received armed security protection during the tournament.

Mark Sears had 16 points and Jahvon Quinerly and Charles Bediako scored 10 each for Alabama, which shot 32% overall and a miserable 3 of 27 (11.1%) from 3-point range. The Crimson Tide fell short of the second Elite Eight berth in school history.

"We came to this game prepared as much as we could possibly," Miller said. "I think our shot-making could have been better. Our shot choices could have been better, but it's just that San Diego's a good group of guys. They're vets, so they have a lot of experience. I feel like they came out and played hard."

San Diego State's players knew they had to impose their will on Alabama's deep and gifted roster.

"Alabama's a great team. They have a lot of talented players and individuals," Trammell said. "We knew it was going to be hard. It was a dogfight. Very physical."

Sears' layup got Alabama within 66-64 with 46 seconds remaining, but Matt Bradley made two free throws and Micah Parrish followed by making three of four attempts, including two with 17 seconds left.

After the final buzzer sounded, Aztecs players and coaches rushed the court and hugged each other in a joyous celebration.

Jaedon LeDee finished with 12 points for the Aztecs.

San Diego State shot just 38% overall and was outrebounded 52-48, but made clutch shots to rally when Alabama seemed in control behind a faster pace after halftime. A technical foul on Dutcher also seemed to spark his seasoned team, which maintained its physical play and thwarted every attempt by the Tide to rally.

BLOCK PARTY

Mensah and Johnson had emphatic rejections with San Diego State ahead 53-50.

Both blocks came on layup attempts by Quinerly. Mensah swatted the first and Johnson rejected a subsequent attempt seconds later. Trammell followed with a step-back jumper for a five-point cushion.

BIG PICTURE

San Diego State: The Aztecs never seemed fazed by Alabama or Miller. More impressive was their resilience when the game seemed to be slipping away.

Alabama: Other than the second-half run that put them ahead briefly, the Crimson Tide seemed out of sorts in multiple ways. The team's reliance on 3-pointers showed its desperation.

LOUISVILLE, Ky. - Darrion Trammell converted a go-ahead free throw after he was fouled on a floater with 1.2 seconds left, and San Diego State muscled its way into its first Final Four, grinding out a 57-56 victory over Creighton on Sunday in the NCAA Tournament's South Region final.

Lamont Butler scored 18 points and Trammell had 12 for the fifth-seeded Aztecs (31-6), who slowed down the high-scoring, sixth-seeded Bluejays (24-13) and became the first Mountain West Conference team to reach the national semifinals.

The experienced Aztecs, in their sixth season under coach Brian Dutcher, will play the surprising East Region champion, ninth-seeded Florida Atlantic, on Saturday in Houston for a spot in the national title game.

With the game tied at 56-all on San Diego State's final possession, Trammell drove toward the free-throw line, elevated for the shot and was fouled by Creighton's Ryan Nembhard. Trammell missed the first free throw but converted the second.

"I've been dreaming this my whole life, grateful to be here and thankful to everyone who believed in me," Trammell said.

Creighton's Baylor Scheierman threw the ensuing inbound pass the length of the floor. San Diego State's Aguek Arop and Creighton's Arthur Kaluma both jumped for it and the ball deflected out of bounds. Officials reviewed the play and determined that time had expired, and the celebration was on for the Aztecs.

"I wasn't given an explanation other than there was no time on the clock," Creighton coach Greg McDermott said. "They made no call on the floor but officiating is part of the game and we're not gonna go there."

Scheierman had tied the game at 56-all when he stole an inbounds pass and converted a layup with 34 seconds remaining.

Ryan Kalkbrenner scored 17 points and Scheierman and Kaluma had 12 apiece for the Bluejays, who went 2 of 17 from 3-point range.

The Aztecs, who got this far thanks to defense and physical play, held the Bluejays to 23 second-half points on 28% shooting as they won for the 14th time in 15 games. Creighton shot 40% overall.

San Diego State shot 38% but got clutch baskets from Nathan Mensah, whose jumper gave the Aztecs a 56-54 lead with 1:37 left, and Arop, who made two straight shots for a 54-50 advantage with 3:03 remaining.

Creighton, which beat San Diego State in overtime in the first round of last year's NCAA Tournament, fell just short of joining Big East rival UConn in the Final Four.

The teams didn't appear to share any hard feelings from last year's meeting. They shared a round-trip flight to Hawaii last fall for the Maui Invitational, and there were no dustups during a tight, physical game in which no team led by more than eight points.

DIVIDED LOYALTIES

Kaluma played against his brother, San Diego State's Adam Seiko. Their parents sat a few rows up at midcourt, sitting quietly before joining Seiko to celebrate.

Creighton's offense started well enough as the Bluejays built a 33-28 halftime lead and extended their advantage to seven in the second half. But Creighton didn't make a single 3-pointer after halftime.

San Diego State proved again that defense matters, especially since the Aztecs also suffled for points. Their experience as depth showed as Mensah and Arop, who averaged just 6.1 and 4.5 points per game respectively, converted the last three baskets.

"It's unbelievable," Butler said. "This is what I came here to do. I'm glad the shot went in. I'm just happy for my team right now."

The Aztecs (32-6) appeared to be in trouble as the free-flowing Owls (35-4) picked them apart while building a 14-point lead.

San Diego State got back in it, as it always does, with defense.

The Aztecs shut down FAU and pulled within one when Jaedon LeDee hit a short jumper with 36 seconds left. After FAU's Johnell Davis missed a contested layup, the Aztecs didn't call timeout and got the ball to Butler.

The clock ticking down, Butler dribbled to the baseline, found that cut off and circled back. He stepped back to create a little room and hit a jumper that sent the Aztecs racing out onto the floor - and into Monday's championship game against UConn or Miami.

"The plan was just to get downhill," Butler said. "They cut me off a little bit. I looked up, there was two seconds left, so I got to a shot that I'm comfortable with. And I hit it."

San Diego State's defense has played a key role in its run to the final. It clamped down on four straight opponents to open the NCAA Tournament.

The Aztecs had no answer for the swaggy Owls in the first half, allowing them to hit 5 of 11 from 3-point range to build a 40-33 halftime lead.

FAU stretched the lead to 14 midway through the second half.

Then the Aztecs got gritty.

Contesting nearly every shot and pass while pulling down a string of offensive rebounds, San Diego State rallied into a tie at 65. Matt Bradley led the offense in the second half and finished with 21 points after struggling with his shot in the previous three games.

Alijah Martin kept FAU in it, scoring 19 of his 26 points in the second half, seeming to have an answer for every Aztecs move.

He didn't get a chance for a final one.

HOUSTON - After six games and 240 minutes of pure dominance that ran through March, then part of April, it finally became clear there was only one thing that could stop the UConn Huskies.

The final buzzer.

The team from Storrs, Connecticut, topped off one of the most impressive March Madness runs in history Monday night, clamping down early, then breaking things open late to bring home its fifth national title with a 76-59 victory over San Diego State.

"We knew we were the best team in the tournament going in, and we just had to play to our level," said Dan Hurley, who joined Jim Calhoun and Kevin Ollie as the third coach to lead UConn to a title.

UConn's lanky star forward, Adama Sanogo, won Most Outstanding Player honors, finishing with 17 points and 10 rebounds in the final. Tristen Newton also had a double-double with 19 points and 10 boards.

The Huskies (31-8) became the fifth team since the bracket expanded in 1985 to win all six NCAA Tournament games by double-digits on the way to a championship. They won those six games by an average of an even 20 points, only a fraction less than what North Carolina did in sweeping to the title in 2009.

UConn built a 16-point lead late in the first half, only to see the Aztecs (32-7) trim it to five with 5:19 left. But Jordan Hawkins (16 points), - whose cousin, Angel Reese, won MOP honors the night before to help LSU take the women's title - answered with a 3 to trigger a 9-0 run.

"It's absolutely amazing that we both get this opportunity," Hawkins said. "The family reunion is going to be crazy."

Keshad Johnson scored 14 points for San Diego State, which came up one win shy in this, its first trip to the Final Four. Darrion Trammell and Lamont Butler, he of buzzer-beater fame in the semifinal against Florida Atlantic, had 13 apiece.

San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher was an assistant with Michigan back in the Fab Five days, when the Wolverines lost in the final two years in a row. One of the Fab Five, current Wolverines coach Juwan Howard, was there to console his former coach.

"We had to be at our best. We weren't at our best," Dutcher said. "A lot had to do with UConn."

UConn, the favorite and best-seeded team at No. 4 for this Final Four full of underdogs, set the stage for this win over an 11:07 stretch in the first half during which the Aztecs didn't make a basket. Unable to shoot over or go around this tall, long UConn team, they missed 14 straight shots from the floor.

They went from leading by four to trailing by 11, and when they weren't getting shots blocked (Alex Karaban had three and Sanogo had one) or altered on the inside, they were coming up short - a telltale sign of a team that was out of hops after that 72-71 buzzer-beater win two nights earlier.

UConn fan Bill Murray, whose son is an assistant for the Huskies, was one of the few celebrities on hand to watch them make it five for five in title games. This one marked the last that Jim Nantz would call after 37 years behind the mic.

"The one thing I learned through all of this is, everybody has a dream and everybody has a story to tell. Just try to find that story. Be kind," Nantz said as part of his final sign-off from the Final Four.

He's had a lot of UConn stories to tell over the years, though this certainly wasn't the most dramatic.

Even with that brief bout of uncertainty midway through the second half, UConn never truly let the fifth-seeded Aztecs, who overcame a 14-point deficit

in the semifinal, start thinking about any more last-second dramatics.

They didn't even think much about 3-point shooting at the start - didn't make one until more than 13 minutes into the game - instead skip passing into Sanogo on the post and wearing down SDSU while building the early lead two points at a time.

The Aztecs were too good a team to cave, and an over-pursuing defense is what triggered the late run to within five. But a team built on defense finished the game only shooting 32% from the floor.

"We cut it to five. I think there were people in the stands that thought, 'Hey, they're capable of doing it again,' and we were," Dutcher said. "But we ran into too good of a team."

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP) Within the first 5 minutes, Jaedon LeDee scored at the rim, hit a midrange jumper, threw down a powerful dunk and knocked down a 3-pointer.

This was bound to be a big game for LeDee, and San Diego State needed everything the third-team AP All-American had to offer.

LeDee dominated inside on the way to 32 points, Lamont Butler added 15 and the Aztecs - last year's national runners-up - held off 12th-seeded UAB 69-65 on Friday in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

"He's hard to guard," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said of his 6-foot-9, 240-pound forward. "He puts a lot of fouls on people. We find him and to his credit, he plays unselfishly. He moves the ball easily, but when his time comes, he was ready for it."

San Diego State will play No. 13 seed Yale, which knocked off highly regarded Auburn, in the second round on Sunday.

Johnson led UAB (23-12) with 19 points, but was scoreless over the final nine minutes. The Blazers’ leading scorer, Yaxel Lendeberg, got into early foul trouble trying to defend LeDee and finished with 11 points. He fouled out in the closing seconds.

“I tried to match LeDee’s physicality. As soon as I did, boom, foul, and it messed with my head all game,” Lendeberg said. “It took me a while to even start being aggressive again because I was scared of the charge call or anything with just messing up for my team any more than I already did.”

Eric Gaines added 14 points for the Blazers, who fell in the opening round for their second straight NCAA Tournament appearance. UAB lost two years ago to Houston in the first round, also as a No. 12 seed. This season, UAB joined the American Athletic Conference and unexpectedly won the league tournament.

UAB trailed 44-32 early in the second half before a 17-5 run gave the Blazers their first lead of the game and set up the tense closing minutes.

UP NEXT

For the second straight year, the Aztecs will face a No. 13 seed in the second round. Last year, the Aztecs beat 13th-seeded Furman after knocking off 12th-seeded Charleston.

SPOKANE, Wash. (AP) Another big game from Jaedon LeDee and some sizzling outside shooting landed San Diego State a matchup it has waited a year to get.

After getting thumped in the national title game last April, the Aztecs earned another shot at defending champion UConn.

“We’re heading on the road to play a road game against UConn in Boston and I’ve got a group that I think will be up for the task,” San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said.

LeDee had 26 points and nine rebounds, Darrion Trammell added 18 points and fifth-seeded San Diego State used a fast start to overwhelm 13th-seeded Yale, rolling to an 85-57 win in the second round of the NCAA Tournament on Sunday night.

The Aztecs scored the first 10 points of the game, led by 24 at halftime and removed any chance of another potential March Madness, bracket-busting upset.

“I think we just got the hardest game out of the way. First game is definitely always the hardest,” Trammell said. “Obviously, we go out there and play confident, but I feel like getting that first one under our belt, we come out much more loose and much more confident.”

San Diego State (26-10) earned a rematch with the No. 1 seed in the tournament in what will be a heavily partisan crowd in Boston. The Huskies beat the Aztecs 76-59 last April in Houston, denying San Diego State a chance at its first title.

The Aztecs will be playing in the Sweet 16 in consecutive years for the first time in school history.

“This is the time of year to be fearless and don’t worry about making a mistake. Play your best,” Dutcher said. “And we have experience in the tournament and I think some of that experience showed over the last two games.”

LeDee was again the star for the Aztecs after he scored 32 points in the first-round win over UAB. He made 9 of 12 shots, including a pair of 3s, and in two tournament games is 20-for-30 shooting.

But some of the outside shooting that was absent in the tourney opener returned and San Diego State hit a season-high 13 3-pointers. Trammell had just four points and took four shots against UAB, but hit four 3s against Yale.

“They’re not known to be a great 3-point shooting team, but they saw me coming and they figured they would make them all today,” Yale coach James Jones joked.

Bez Mbeng led Yale with 12 points and Matt Knowing added 11. But even with borrowing the University of Idaho band for a second time, there was no magical late comeback after the Bulldogs (23-10) rallied from down 10 in the final 7½ minutes to top No. 4 seed Auburn in the opener.

For the second straight year, San Diego State didn’t allow a No. 13 seed seeking a landmark second-round upset the chance to breathe. The Aztecs suffocated Furman last year after the Paladins knocked off Virginia in the first round.

They did the same to Yale.

John Poulakidas, the star of Yale’s upset win over Auburn, wasn’t able to match the same level of shot-making he displayed on the way to 28 points in the first round. Poulakidas missed all five shots in the first half and was scoreless at the break. He finally scored early in the second half, but finished with only nine points.

“It hurts a lot right now. I think we had big expectations and got a little greedy. We wanted more, we knew we could get more,” Knowing said. “But I’m really proud of our guys and the team and what we were able to accomplish this year.”
