Aztec Basketball Looks To Make It Two In A Row Wednesday vs. Cal Poly

- ▶When & Where: Wednesday, Dec. 21, 2011, Viejas Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 2 p.m. PT
- ▶Live Media: Live audio and video with Chris Ello, as well as live stats, will be available on goaztecs.com.
- ▶SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns: Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the seventh year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 329-241 in 20 seasons, while she is 248-176 in her 15 campaigns at SDSU.
- ► Cal Poly Head Coach Faith Mimnaugh: Mimnaugh is in her 15th season at Cal Poly and boasts a school record of 181-228. Her 17-year head coaching mark stands at 188-290.
- ▶ Series History: The Aztecs and Mustangs are meeting for the 10th time with San Diego State owning a 7-2 advantage in the all-time series. The Aztecs have won each of the last seven contests with the most recent coming in 2007, when they came out ahead 80-70 in San Luis Obispo.

NEWS & NOTABLES

- San Diego State looks to claim its second win in a row as the Aztecs play their final pre-holiday contest Wednesday against visiting Cal Poly. The game features an early 2 p.m. PT tip-off at Viejas Arena.
- SDSU is five days removed from its most recent outing, as the team ended a three-game losing skid by downing host UC Irvine, 76-57, on Friday.
- Cal Poly is the second consecutive Big West Conference squad that the Aztecs will face after taking on UC Irvine last week. SDSU is slated to join the Big West starting with the 2013-14 campaign.
- The Aztecs and Mustangs are meeting for the 10th time overall and the first time since 2007. San Diego State has won each of the last seven meetings, which is the program's longest active win streak against any opponent. The next longest is six games vs. Cal State Fullerton.
- SDSU junior Malia Nahinu (Hayward, Calif.) was

named the Mountain West Player of the Week this past Monday. The 6-6 center had the best outing of her career vs. the Anteaters, pouring in career highs in points (16), rebounds (7), blocked shots (5) and steals (2).

- For the second consecutive outing, Aztec head coach Beth Burns utilized a different starting five, giving Malia Nahinu her first career start in place of freshman Chairese Culberson (Oakland, Calif.). Four different student-athletes have logged their first career starts thus far in 2011-12.
- SDSU is rounding out the 2011 calendar year with three consecutive home games. The team is continuing its stay in the state of California which this year covers eight games and 42 days spanning.
- SDSU junior Courtney Clements (Long Beach, Calif.) continues to lead the Mountain West in scoring with her 17.6 points per outing, while classmate Chelsea Hopkins (Las Vegas, Nev.) is tops in the league in assists with a 4.8 mark, highlighted by 12 helpers in the win at UC Irvine last week.

LAST TIME OUT

San Diego State received a career game from junior center Malia Nahinu and three Aztecs scored in double figures to lead SDSU to a 76-57 victory over UC Irvine at Bren Events Center. The win lifts San Diego State's record to 5-4, while the Anteaters fall to 4-6.

Nahinu, who earned her first career start, finished with a career-high 16 points, a personal-record seven rebounds and a personal-best five blocked shots. Joining Nahinu in double figures was **Kiyana Stamps** (Moreno Valley, Calif.) and Courtney Clements. Stamps finished with 15 points and a career-high seven rebounds. Clements, meanwhile, added 17 points. Chelsea Hopkins dished out a career-high 12 assists to help the Aztecs snap a three-game losing skid.

The game was a defensive battle at the start as both teams struggled to score. Nahinu, however, got SDSU going and was effective early and often as she scored six of San Diego State's first 10 points. The Aztecs found their rhythm offensively midway through the first half and opened up a 10-point lead as they went on an 8-2 run. The aforementioned run was a part of an overall 14-4 spurt, which gave San Diego State its largest lead of the game, 14 points, with 7:32 left in the half.

The Aztecs carried their double-figure lead deep into the first half until UC Irvine's Cheyenne Cathey knocked down a three to trim SDSU's lead to nine points. Cathey's bucket was the beginning of an 8-0 spurt to end the half as San Diego State went into the locker room with a 34-30 lead.

SDSU started the second half as hot as the Anteaters ended the first and used a 14-3 run along with a stifling defense to extend its lead to 48-33 before the first media timeout. During the run, the Aztecs received five points apiece from Stamps and Clements and four from Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.).

The scoring spree from Stamps and Clements was just a glimpse of what was to come later in the half. Stamps went on to score all of her 15 points in the second half, including nine off three-pointers. Clements, meanwhile, scored 13 of her 17 points in the final 20 minutes. The defense continued to be strong throughout the half especially in the final six minutes as the Aztecs limited UC Irvine to just six points to end the game. During that final six-minute stretch, San Diego State scored 13 points to provide the final margin.

NAHINU NAMED MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

San Diego State junior center Malia Nahinu was named the Mountain West Women's Basketball Player of the Week for her performance in the team's victory over UC Irvine, the league office announced Monday. The honor is the first of her Aztec career and the second for SDSU this season.

In her first collegiate start, Nahinu posted a careerhigh 16 points, seven rebounds, five blocked shots and a pair of steals in helping the squad notch a 76-57 road victory over the Anteaters on Friday evening. Nahinu shot 58 percent from the field (7-for-12) and was 2-for-3 from the free-throw line for her first double-figure scoring outing since transferring to SDSU. She had three blocks, a steal and a rebound in the first three minutes of the second half, helping the team go from a four-point advantage at the break to a 13-point lead with just under 17 minutes left to play. Her five total blocked shots are the most by an Aztec this season and tie as the most by a player in the conference in 2011-12.

Previously, Nahinu's classmate Courtney Clements earned her first league player-of-the-week honor on Nov. 21, following the team's upset of then No. 18 De-Paul.

NEW STARTING FIVE AGAIN

For the second consecutive outing, SDSU used a different starting five against UC Irvine with junior Malia Nahinu getting her first career start at center. Nahinu took the place of freshman Chairese Culberson, who had made the line-up in the previous eight contests.

This season, four Aztecs have made their first collegiate starts in junior Chelsea Hopkins, redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps, Culberson and Nahinu.

HOPKINS' HELPERS

Just nine outings into her SDSU career, junior Chelsea Hopkins eclipsed the double-figure mark in assists in a game, compiling 12 at UC Irvine. That effort came after the 5-8 point guard was shutout in that category in back-to-back contests against Washington State and USD.

Hopkins' 12 helpers are the most by an Aztec since Quenese Davis also had 12 on Dec. 2, 2007, vs. Cal State Fullerton and are tied for 11th in program history. She currently leads the Mountain West in assists per game with a 4.8 mark that also ranks 50th nationally.

ON THE BOARDS

For the eighth time this year, SDSU did not get outrebounded, posting a +11 margin against the Anteaters.

The Aztecs currently rank second in the Mountain West in rebounding margin at +6.2 and continue to lead in both offensive rebounds (17.2/g) and offensive rebounding percentage (42.7).

San Diego State has eclipsed the 40-rebound mark seven times in the nine games, a figure it reached on only eight occasions in 29 outings in 2010-11.

Last season, the Aztecs held an advantage on the boards 16 times, accounting for eight of the 12 wins.

MWC SCORING LEADER

Despite playing only 20 minutes, San Diego State junior Courtney Clements kept her streak of consecutive games in double-figure points alive by notching a teambest 17 points in the win over UCI.

Clements has scored 10 or more points in all nine contests in 2011-12, and has more than 17 points on six occasions.

The 6-0 guard continues to lead the Mountain West Conference with 17.6 points per contest, which also ranks in the top 65 nationally.

OF NOTE

SDSU is undefeated this season when it is:

- Owns an advantage with five minutes left (5-0)
- Has more steals (5-0)
- Is leading at halftime (4-0)

- Has a better shooting percentage (4-0)
- Has more assists (4-0)
- Has more free-throw attempts (2-0)
- Scores more than 80 points (2-0)

SWEET DECEMBER

Despite dropping its first two games this month, SDSU has still sported an impressive record in the month of December. The Aztecs are a combined 24-8 during the year's final month since 2006.

Four of those losses came to teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national poll in No. 2 UConn, No. 7 Texas A&M, No. 17 George Washington and USC (rv). The other three defeats were to Washington State and USD, vs. Pepperdine in overtime in 2009, and against Quinnipiac in the opening contest of the 2007 Surf 'N Slam.

Of course, it should be noted that SDSU has played 25 of those 32 December contests at home.

WITH A WIN

An SDSU victory over the Cal Poly will mean:

- SDSU improves to 8-2 all-time against the Mustangs, claiming the last eight in a row. The eight-game win streak is the Aztecs' longest active streak vs. any opponent.
- SDSU moves to 5-0 in games played between the two sides in San Diego.
- SDSU improves to 5-1 against teams it did not face last season.
- SDSU is now 25-8 during the month of December over the last six years.
- SDSU improves to 84-76 against teams out of the Big West Conference and has won 11 of the last 12 matchups, dating back to 2005.

CAL POLY TIDBITS

Cal Poly (3-8) is completing a six-game stint away from home, including five outings over the last 11 days ... The Mustangs have traveled to Connecticut and New York on this trip before playing three contests in California vs. USD, LMU and SDSU ... Cal Poly has dropped six consecutive outings after winning three of its first five games ... The two sides have played one common opponent this season in San Diego with both sides falling ... The Mustangs are led by redshirt senior Kristina Santiago, who is averaging 21.9 points per game to go with 10.8 rebounds an outing ... She also has 14 assists, 13 blocks, 13 steals and six double-doubles, despite playing in only nine games due to injury ... Senior guard Ashlee Burns is the team's top 3-point threat with 27 to her credit, followed by teammate Christine Martin, who had 37 to her credit ... Cal Poly is shooting over 40 percent from the field, 37 percent from beyond the arc and 70 percent at the stripe ... Mustang athletic director Don Oberhelman previously worked at SDSU from 2007-11 ... Cal Poly junior Kayla Griffin and Aztec junior Malia Nahinu both attended Moreau Catholic High School in the Bay Area ... Wednesday's outing is Cal Poly's final non-conference game prior to starting Big West play against UCSB on Dec. 31.

RECEIVING VOTES

SDSU received votes in both national top-25 polls Nov. 21-22 after opening the season with a 3-1 mark, including an upset of then No. 18 DePaul. The Aztecs garnered 13 votes in the Associated Press top-25 poll, while they also received one vote in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll.

The last time San Diego State received votes in either poll was on Nov. 22, 2010, in the AP Top 25. The Aztecs were last listed in both polls in the same week during the 2010-11 preseason.

SDSU was last ranked in the top 25 in 2010, when it finished 20th in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll. It marked the first time the Aztecs had been ranked in the final coaches poll in program history.

BEATING RANKED FOES

San Diego State's win over No. 18/18 DePaul on Nov. 18 is the program's first vs. a ranked foe since 2010, when it knocked off No. 10 West Virginia in the NCAA Second Round.

Overall, the victory against the Blue Demons is the Aztecs' sixth against a top-25 squad over the last four seasons. SDSU wins have come against Texas twice

Prior to the win over Texas in December 2008, San Diego State had not beaten a ranked team since Dec. 28, 1994, when it handed No. 6 Alabama a 79-76 loss in a tournament held at St. John's in Jamaica, N.Y.

OTHER SEASON NOTES

■ With its wins over UAPB and No. 18 DePaul, SDSU scored over 80 points in back-to-back outings for the first time since scoring 85 in consecutive wins over Montana State and Loyola Marymont in Dec. 2008.

The team did not surpass the 80-point barrier all of last season and that streak dates back to a 87-52 win over Air Force on March 6, 2010.

- The Aztecs' 43-point margin of victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff is SDSU's largest margin of victory since defeating Air Force by 51 in 2009.
- SDSU's 86 points vs. UAPB are the most in a season-opening game since scoring 101 against McNeese State on Nov. 23, 1990 (101-55 victory). The 86 points are the most in any game since it lit up Air Force for 87 in the 2010 regular-season finale.
- The Aztecs claimed the tournament title at the Jack In the Box Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Nov. 18-20. It is the first time SDSU has won a non-conference event since going 2-0 at its own San Diego Surf 'N Slam in 2009.
- Courtney Clements and Kiyana Stamps, were named to the six-player all-tournament squad at the Rainbow Wahine Classic. Clements was tabbed the tournament MVP, becoming the first Aztec so honored since 2010.

This is the first time in both Clements and Stamps' Aztec careers that they have been named to an all-tournament team.

■ Clements was named the Mountain West Player of the Week for the first time in her career on Nov. 21, after averaging 21.3 points and shooting .536 (30-for-56) from the field, including a .522 (12-for-23) mark from 3-point range, and .813 (13-for-16) from the free-throw line in the team's opening four outings.

PRESEASON POINTS

For the fourth straight season, the San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish in the top two in the Mountain West in 2012, earning its second consecutive second-place selection and third in the last four years in a vote by the league's eight head coaches and select media members.

The preseason poll, which was released Oct. 11, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo., had the Aztecs with 127 total points and seven of the 20 first-place votes.

TCU was tabbed as the preseason favorite with 136 points and 12 first-place votes. Colorado State was selected third behind the Aztecs, earning the final first place vote, and was followed by New Mexico, UNLV, Wyoming, Air Force and newcomer Boise State.

INDIVIDUAL ACCOLADES

For the second campaign in a row, San Diego State swept both the preseason newcomer and freshman of the year awards, which were released at the league's annual media day in October.

Junior guard Chelsea Hopkins was chosen as the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, following in the footsteps of current teammate Courtney Clements and recent graduate Jessika Bradley, who earned the honor both in the preseason and at the end of the year in 2010 and 2011.

SDSU's Chairese Culberson was chosen as the conference's top freshman, after leading Berkeley High School to a runner-up performance at the California state Division I tournament this past March. The 6-0 forward was the top ranked recruit in the Mountain West by *Hoopgurlz*, receiving a rating of 46th overall and seventh at the wing position.

SCURRY TO REDSHIRT

Head coach Beth Burns announced last month that freshman forward **Deajanae Scurry (Los Angeles, Calif.)** will redshirt the upcoming 2011-12 season.

Scurry will continue to practice with the Aztecs, but will not compete in any games in her first year on campus.

NOTING THIS YEAR'S TEAM

- San Diego State returns two starters and six other letterwinners from last year's squad. Only three Aztecs had played more than one season in the Red & Black entering 2011-12.
- Of the 15 student-athletes on this year's roster, seven players did not compete for San Diego State a year ago. Two of the seven were on campus, but junior Chelsea Hopkins sat out after transferring from Duke and redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps missed part of the campaign due to injury and the other half to concentrate on academics. Stamps competed in only two games in 2009-10 after tearing her ACL.
- The Aztecs' roster boasts five true freshmen, including four post players in forwards Erimma Amarikwa (Vacaville, Calif.), Chairese Culberson, Khristina Hunter (Fairfield, Calif.) and Deajanae Scurry to go with guard Ahjalee Harvey (Mountain View, Calif.). The last time SDSU had five true freshman on its roster was 2008-09, when the squad also had five.
- Entering this season, five players accounted for 280 of the 338 total career games played (82.8 percent) in an Aztec uniform by the entire SDSU 2011-12 roster.

AZTECS SIGN PAIR TO NLIS

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 9, of forward Aleiah Brandon (Corona, Calif.) and point guard Tia Levi-Dixon (San Diego, Calif.) to National Letters of Intent.

The two high school seniors will join the Aztecs in 2012.

10-11 RECRUITING CLASS EARNS PRAISE

San Diego State's 2010-11 recruiting class was rated best in the Mountain West and 18th nationally according to Espn.com's HoopGurlz rankings, which are based solely on high school prospect signings. The Aztecs are also the only team in a "non-automatic BCS qualifying" conference rated in the top 30.

The 2010-11 recruiting class included three, four-star recruits according to HoopGurlz, including forward Chairese Culberson, who was the No. 7 rated wing and 46th overall, forward Deajanae Scurry (No. 31 forward) and point guard Ahjalee Harvey (No. 32 point guard).

Forwards Khristina Hunter and Erimma Amarikwa both received three stars and round out the class.

A year ago, San Diego State's 2010 recruiting class was ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and 31st nationally, while the Aztecs did not appear in the websites rankings in either 2008 or 2009.

THE WELCOME MAT

Aztec head coach Beth Burns added one new member to her staff over the summer with the hiring of assistant coach Tammi Reiss (pronounced Reese).

Reiss, who works with the Aztec guards, was an assistant coach for the WNBA Utah Starzz from 2001-02, before joining the franchise in its move to San Antonio in 2003.

The Eldred, N.Y., native spent three seasons as an assistant coach at her alma mater, when Virginia advanced to the Elite Eight in 1995 and 1996, made it to the Sweet 16 in 1994 and claimed a pair of ACC regular-season titles in 1994 and 1995.

One of the all-time greats in Virginia basketball history, she played for the Cavaliers from 1988-92, when the team made three consecutive Final Four appearances and earned two ACC regular-season and tournament titles. Reiss garnered both Kodak and USBWA All-America honors as a senior in 1992.

Following her collegiate career, Reiss was chosen by the Utah Starzz in the first round (fifth pick overall) of the inaugural WNBA Draft in 1997.

WOODS PROMOTED

San Diego State head basketball coach Beth Burns announced this past April that Jualeah Woods has been promoted to the position of associate head coach.

Since Woods' arrival in May of 2005, the Aztecs have won a Mountain West Conference regular season and tournament title, and recorded back-to-back NCAA appearances, including a trip to the Sweet Sixteen in 2010. On the court, she helped tutor four-time all-conference center Paris Johnson, who finished her career as the school's all-time leader in blocks and consecutive starts. Woods also mentored 2010 MWC Newcomer of the Year forward Jessika Bradley, who was tabbed a third-team all-league pick as a senior.

2010-11 REWIND

Here are some of team's notes from last season:

■ SDSU won at least 12 games for the fifth consecutive season and advanced to the championship game of each of its three non-conference tournaments.

- The Aztecs had 11 contests decided by five or fewer points and nine by three or less, including six in league play. Only five of the team's 17 losses were by more than 10 points and the 10 regular-season conference defeats were by 74 total points. SDSU also had at least a four-point lead in 13 of 17 losses.
- SDSU set a Mountain West record for most blocked shots in league play with 115 to its credit. The Aztecs easily surpassed the previous high of 101 set by the 2008-09 SDSU squad.
- San Diego State finished fifth nationally with 6.4 blocks per game. The Aztecs trailed only Baylor (7.4), Saint Mary's (6.8), High Point (6.7) and North Carolina (6.5) in that category and had 34 more blocks than any other Mountain West squad, despite playing the fewest number of games.
- SDSU led the MWC and ranked 27th nationally in three-point field-goal defense (28.1). Opponents failed to shoot above 30 percent from three-point land in 17 of the 29 contests.
- Senior Coco Davis led the Mountain West and ranked fifth nationally in assists per game with a 6.3 mark. Her 428 career assists rank third in school history.
- Senior center Paris Johnson capped a phenomenal collegiate career by becoming the school's all-time leader in career blocks (267) and consecutive starts (126). She also was only the third player in school history to score 1,500 points.

AZTECS OVERSEAS

San Diego State currently has five of its recent standouts playing professionally overseas. Guard Jené Morris (Girona) and forward Jessika Bradley (Arixil) both compete in Spain, while guard Quenese Davis (PAOK) plays in Greece and center Paris Johnson (Gorzow Wlkp.) is in Poland. Quenese's younger sister, Coco, also recently joined a team in Israel.

A year ago, Morris was in both Poland and Israel after playing for the Indiana Fever, who made her the first-ever Aztec to be selected in the WNBA Draft (first round/11th pick overall) in 2010. Davis, the Aztecs' all-time career assists leader, competed professionally in Austria and was named the *Eurobasket.com* All-Austrian AWBL Guard of the Year with the Flying Foxes.

THE NEW LEAGUE LOOK

For the first time since TCU joined the conference in 2005, the Mountain West will have a new look this season.

Gone are BYU and Utah, who claimed the league regular-season and tournament titles a year ago, while Boise State is the newcomer after participating in the Western Athletic Conference.

The Aztecs will now have just 14 league games instead of 16, meaning the MW regular-season slate will start a week later in January and finish up three days earlier in late February. San Diego State will have additional days to prepare for the Mountain West Championships, which will be one day shorter and feature four quarterfinal games on Wednesday, before the semifinals on Friday and the finale on Saturday.

In addition, three of The Mtn. games will also be broadcast locally on Channel 4 San Diego and the opening contests of the 2012 Mountain West Conference Championships in Las Vegas next March will be carried on The Mtn.

LISTEN/WATCH LIVE

For the 11th straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alum Chris Ello will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the fifth straight season.

Again in 2011-12, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of certain televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

BURNS TABBED WBCA SECRETARY

This past July, San Diego State head coach Beth Burns was appointed as the secretary of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors' Executive Committee. Burns previously served as a Division I at-large representative on the organization's 23-member board the last two years.

SDSU HEAD COACH BETH BURNS

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the seventh season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

Most recently, Burns has taken the program to new heights, including a trip to the 2010 NCAA Sweet Sixteen, back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances (2009, 2010) and both a conference regular-season (2009) and tournament title (2010).

The Aztecs advanced to three straight Mountain West Conference championship games from 2008-10, after not winning one tournament game in the league's first eight years of existence. SDSU has scored five wins over top-25 foes, including two vs. teams in the top 10 in No. 4 Texas and No. 10 West Virginia.

Including 2010-11, SDSU has recorded at least 12 victories in five consecutive seasons with Burns at the helm, highlighted by back-to-back campaigns with at least 23 victories.

In her first stint as Aztec head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular season titles.

A four-time conference coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (199702). She has a 20-year overall head coaching record of 328-241, while her school record stands at 247-176 over 14 seasons.

Last fall, Burns signed a five-year contract extension to stay as SDSU's head coach through the 2014-15 campaign.

SAN DIEGO - For the fourth time in the last five years, the San Diego State women's basketball team started the season off on the right foot, defeating visiting Arkansas-Pine Bluff 86-43 at Viejas Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs moved to 1-0 overall, while the Golden Lions dropped to 0-2, following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

SDSU had three players finish with double-figure points, including leading scorer Courtney Clements, who notched 21 points on 7-for-13 shooting for her third career 20-point outing as an Aztec. Redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps added 17 points in her first contest since 2009, while junior co-captain Gabrielle Clark contributed a career-high 12 points by making four of her seven attempts.

Forward Chairese Culberson hauled in a team-high nine rebounds and point guard Ahjalee Harvey tallied seven assists in their collegiate debuts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat led the defensive effort with four of the Aztecs' 14 steals on the night.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, going up by 13 points at the 12:29 mark of the first half. The Lady Lions used a pair of triples from Markita Quarles and a jumper from Jenise Gentry to cut their deficit down to only seven at 18-11, but the Aztecs then went on a 14-1 run to build a 20-point advantage before settling for a 41-24 lead at the break.

Čoming out of the locker room, the UAPB offense continued to struggle as it did not record a field goal until six and a half minutes into the second half on a 3-pointer by Lakendra Marsh at 52-28. The Aztecs would eventually lead by as many as 43 and outscored the visitors 45-19 in the final 20 minutes to secure the 86-43 season-opening win.

SDSU shot over 41 percent from the field, made nine 3-pointers and posted a phenomenal 91.3 free-throw percentage (21-for-23). On the flip side, UAPB shot just 22.2 percent for the game, converting only five second-half field goals.

HONOLULU - The San Diego State women's basketball team went on a 10-0 run with just over five minutes remaining in the game to turn a two-point contest into a 12-point advantage and went on to claim a 82-74 upset victory over 18th-ranked DePaul in the first game of the Jack In The Box Rainbow Wahine Classic. The win was the Aztecs' sixth over a top-25 team in the last four seasons and improved them to 2-0 overall in 2011-12, while the Blue Demons dropped to 2-1.

The Aztecs had four players score in double-figures, led by junior Courtney Clements, who eclipsed the 20-point mark for the second consecutive outing with 25, including 13 in the first half. Sophomore Kiyana Stamps continued to give the Aztecs an offensive punch off the bench with 17 points for the second game in a row. Sophomore Melissa Sweat and freshman Chairese Culberson both chipped in career highs with 14 and 10 points respectively.

Sweat was a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc and Cúlberson hauled in nine boards to fall just one rebound short of a double-double. Clements tied a career high with eight rebounds, junior Chelsea Hopkins had seven assists and senior Kalena Tutt added three steals.

After the game was tied three times in the first four minutes, the Aztecs utilized a three-point play from Sweat to spark a 12-0 run at 18-6. DePaul eventually caught up with the help of three triples to knot the contest at 27 points apiece. The Blue Demons took the lead on the pair of free throws, but the Aztecs managed to even the score heading into the locker room at 33-33.

The two sides traded free throws coming out of the break, before SDSU's Culberson made a jumper and hit a pair at the line to give the team a lead they would never end up relinquishing. The Aztecs had two nine-point advantages, but saw that cut down to only a pair with 5:50 remaining in the game.

From there, San Diego State started a 10-0 run with baskets by four different players to go up by 12 and go on to secure an eight-point upset victory 82-74.

The Aztecs attempted just one free throw in the first half, but tried 29 in the second half to go 24-for-30 (80.0 percent) at the stripe. SDSU owned a 47-38 advantage on the boards and hit six 3-pointers, which was two more than a De-Paul squad that had a combined 25 in its opening two contests this season.

Portland did not take a timeout and quickly got the ball up the court, missing on its first shot, but Day got the rebound and was fouled. Day then made both free throws to secure the 59-58 victory as the Aztecs' full-court baseball pass was intercepted to end the game.

Despite the loss, SDSU got another standout offensive performance from junior Courtney Clements, who surpassed the 20-point mark for the third time in four outings this season. Clements was 5-for-6 from beyond the arc and 8-for-13 from the field to end up with 21 of the team's 58 points. She was the only Aztec in double-figures as Stamps had eight points and Tutt contributed seven to go with her SDSU-best seven rebounds.

The match-up was tied twice within the first three minutes before Portland notched three consecutive lay-ups over a span of just over a minute to take a six-point lead at 10-4. San Diego State responded with three baskets by Clements, including a lay-up, a jumper and a 3-pointer out of the left corner to put the team up by one at 11-10.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team had three players notch career highs in scoring to stay perfect at home with a 63-51 victory over visiting Washington at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, who are receiving votes in both national top-25 polls, improved to 4-1 overall, while the Huskies dropped to 3-2 on the year following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

Four of the five SDSU starters scored in double-figures including three with career-high point totals. Coming out of the locker room, the two sides traded baskets before Tutt sparked a 6-0 Aztec run with a jumper and a basket following a UW turnover to give her team a 14-point advantage at 40-26. The San Diego State lead would grow out to as many as 16 points at the 8:17 mark until Washington made a final push in the final four minutes on four lay-ups in the paint from Rogers to close to within eight at 57-49.

Sophomore Kiyana Stamps restored the SDSU lead into double figures just 21 seconds later and both Clements and Hopkins hit a pair of free throws each to close out the 63-51 victory.

LOS ANGELES - The San Diego State women's basketball team rallied from a 16-point deficit to take a three-point second-half lead, but wasn't able to come out with a victory, as the Aztecs fell 78-71 to host UCLA at the John Wooden Center. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 4-2, while the Bruins improved to 4-2 after defeating the visitors for the second year in a row.

Aztec junior Courtney Clements led the team in scoring with 19 points, but made just seven of her 24 field-goal attempts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat matched her career high with 14 points, highlighted by 12 in the second half, while freshman Erimma Amarikwa and junior Chelsea Hopkins both finished with eight points apiece. Hopkins had six of the team's nine assists and she, along with Clements and senior Kalena Tutt all added six rebounds.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start with a 6-0 lead on baskets from three different players, but the Bruins finally got on the board at the 17:35 mark and took their first lead of the night at 9-8. UCLA then utilized some hot shooting and got a number of second-chance buckets, putting together what would later amount to be a 22-0 run to go up by 16 points with the score at 24-8.

San Diego State, however, would battle back, as a jumper from junior Malia Nahinu ended a near seven-minute. Clements then notched 10 of SDSU's next 12 points and received help from three of the squad's freshmen, who contributed a basket apiece to cut the deficit all the way to just four points at 35-31. The Bruins converted on a 3-point play in the final eight seconds by Rhema Gardner to extend the lead back out to 38-31 heading into the locker room.

Coming out of the break, the Aztecs quickly made a dent in their deficit, getting a bucket from Clements and two lay-ups from Hopkins in under a minute. SDSU successfully completed the come back on a 3-point play from Amarikwa to take its first lead since the first half at 40-39 with 17:48 remaining.

The two sides were tied twice and traded advantages three times before UCLA outscored the Aztecs 15-4 to push it once again to a double-figure Bruin lead at 59-49. The home squad reached the double bonus by the 9:45 mark and made good on four of six free throws while adding a wide-open triple from Thea Lemberger to open the gap to 14 points on two occasions.

The Aztecs cut that deficit in half with under 30 seconds remaining before ultimately falling by that same seven-point margin, 78-71.

PULLMAN, Wash. - The Aztec women's basketball team cut a 23-point deficit down to just 11 points, but was never able to overcome a poor shooting performance as the Aztecs dropped their third game of the season 65-50 to host Washington State at Beasley Coliseum. With the loss, SDSU fell to 4-3, while the Cougars avenged last year's Aztec victory to improve to 5-4 overall.

SDSU was led by junior Chelsea Hopkins' career-high 14 points. The team's leading scorer entering the night, junior Courtney Clements, was limited to only 13 all in the second half, but did manage a career-best nine rebounds. Clements was helped on the glass by senior Kalena Tutt, who added seven.

After Chairese Gulberson scored the Aztecs' first basket of the night to tie the score at two, SDSU missed its next eight shots and fell behind 14-2 until Hopkins finally ended the drought with a lay-up at the 13:43 mark. The two sides traded buckets, but the visitors' shooting woes continued as they missed nine of their next 11 field-goals attempts and also committed seven turnovers during that same span to fall behind by 20 points at 31-11.

After trailing by 19 at the break, SDSU came out strong from the locker room, putting together a 9-2 run, including Clements' first five points of the game to trim the deficit to 12. SDSU also trailed by 12 with 13:05 remaining, but missed four shots on one possession alone and Washington State took advantage with an 11-0 run, including its first three triples of the night for its largest lead at 51-28. A three-point play from Culberson sparked the Aztecs' final charge of the game

A three-point play from Culberson sparked the Aztecs' final charge of the game as they shaved 12 points off that deficit to get to within only 11 with just under five minutes to play at 57-46. After each side hit a 3-pointer, San Diego State managed only one more point the rest of the way and ultimately ended up falling by 15 points, 65-50.

SAN DIEGO - The SDSU women's basketball team were limited to just 17 second-half points, including only two in the first 12 minutes after the break, as the Aztecs dropped a 56-45 decision to visiting San Diego at Viejas Arena. With the loss, SDSU saw their overall record move to 4-4 on the year, while the Toreros broke a two-game losing streak in the series to improve to 6-2 in 2011-12.

Two players accounted for 23 of San Diego State's season-low 45 points on the night. Junior Courtney Clements scored in double-figures for the eighth time in as many outings this year, notching 13, but was limited to only a pair after the break. Classmate Chelsea Hopkins played only 15 minutes due to foul trouble and still ended up with 10 points on 4-for-6 shooting. Freshman Chairese Cu Iberson matched her season-best with nine boards to go with three blocks, while senior Kalena Tutt recorded seven rebounds and three blocks of her own.

Both sides notched scoring runs coming out of the gate, as the Toreros went up by five points at 7-2 only to have the Aztecs answer with a 15-2 swing to give the home team its largest lead of the night at 17-9 with 8:20 remaining in the first half. USD converted on a pair of free throws and then hit three buckets in a row to tie the game at 17 points apiece.

The score was tied at 19 and 21 and also at the break, as San Diego State erased a five-point deficit with under a minute and a half remaining to go into the locker room all square at 28 points apiece.

USD scored the first point of the second half on a free throw, but the Aztecs bounced back ahead on a jumper from Clements at the 17:52 mark at 30-29. SDSU then went scoreless over nearly a 10-minute span, missing its next 13 shots. Luckily for the home team, the Toreros also had their own streak of cold shooting, as San Diego State finally broke the drought on a triple from sophomore Melissa Sweat to put them down by only five with 8:02 left to play.

The Aztecs cut it to as little as a two-point margin at 39-37 and trailed by just three with 4:55 remaining, but never got any closer as San Diego went to the free-throw line 14 more times, hitting 10 of them to secure the 56-45 victory.

IRVINE, Calif. - San Diego State received a career game from junior center Malia Nahinu and three Aztecs scored in double figures to lead SDSU to a 76-57 victory over UC Irvine at Bren Events Center. The win lifts San Diego State's record to 5-4, while the Anteaters fall to 4-6.

Nahinu, who earned her first career start, finished with a career-high 16 points, a personal-record seven rebounds and a personal-best five blocked shots. Joining Nahinu in double figures was Kiyana Stamps and Courtney Clements. Stamps finished with 15 points and a career-high seven rebounds. Clements, meanwhile, added 17 points. Chelsea Hopkins dished out a career-high 12 assists to help the Aztecs span a three-game losing skid

added 17 points. Chelsea Hopkins dished out a career-night 12 assists to help the Aztecs snap a three-game losing skid.

The game was a defensive battle at the start as both teams struggled to score. Nahinu, however, got SDSU going and was effective early and often as she scored six of San Diego State's first 10 points. The Aztecs found their rhythm offensively midway through the first half and opened up a 10-point lead as they went on an 8-2 run. The aforementioned run was a part of an overall 14-4 spurt, which gave San Diego State its largest lead of the game, 14 points, with 7:32 left in the half.

The Aztecs carried their double-figure lead deep into the first half until UC Irvine's Cheyenne Cathey knocked down a three to trim SDSU's lead to nine points. Cathey's bucket was the beginning of an 8-0 spurt to end the half as San Diego State went into the locker room with a 34-30 lead.

SDSU started the second half as hot as the Anteaters ended the first and used a 14-3 run along with a stifling defense to extend its lead to 48-33 before the first media timeout. During the run, the Aztecs received five points apiece from Stamps and Clements and four from Kalena Tutt.

Stamps went on to score all of her 15 points in the second half, including nine off three-pointers. Clements, meanwhile, scored 13 of her 17 points in the final 20 minutes. The defense continued to be strong throughout the half especially in the final six minutes as the Aztecs limited UC Irvine to just six points to end the game. During that final six-minute stretch, San Diego State scored 13 points to provide the final margin.
