San José State record: 3-3, 1-2 Mountain West. Most recently, the Spartans lost at Nevada, 41-38, on October 12.

San Diego State record: 5-1, 2-1 Mountain West. The Aztecs have a two-game winning streak after defeating Wyoming, 26-22, on October 12.

San José State head coach Brent Brennan: In his third season as the Spartans' head coach. Has a major college coaching record of 6-25, all at San José State. Brennan returned to San José State for 2017 after six seasons as a receivers coach at Oregon State. He was a Spartan assistant coach during the 2005 through 2010 seasons. He is 0-2 as a head coach against San Diego State.

San Diego State head coach Rocky Long: In his tenth season as the Aztecs' head coach. Has a record of 76-36 at San Diego State. Overall, he is in his 21st season as a major college head coach and has a record of 141-105. He is 6-3 as a head coach against San Jose State with six consecutive coaching victories over the Spartans'.

Series history: San Diego State leads the series, 21-19-2. The Aztecs have won the last six games, all of them Mountain West conference contests, between these teams including last year's 16-13 decision in San Diego. The three-point differential was the closest game these teams have played as Mountain West members.

San Jose State's last win in the series was a 38-34 comeback win in San Diego on September 22, 2012. The last time the Spartans defeated the Aztecs in San Jose was a 35-10 decision on September 13, 2008.

Homecoming history: San José State plays its 83rd Homecoming game on October 19 against San Diego State. The Spartans' most recent Homecoming Game win was a 33-10 triumph over UNLV in 2014. This year's Homecoming contest marks the fifth time San Diego State served as the opposition.

Another chance to be above .500: For the fourth time this season, San Jose State has the opportunity to be one-game above the .500 mark with a victory over San Diego State. The Spartans have win-loss records this season of 1-0, 2-1, and 3-2.

The last time San Jose State had a 4-3 win-loss record after seven games was in the 2013 season after defeating Wyoming, 51-44, in the annual Homecoming game.

Ring of Honor ceremony: At halftime of the San Diego State game, linebacker **David Chaney, (1969-71)**, will be enshrined into the CEFCU Stadium Ring of Honor. The two-time All-American was the first Spartan to have his jersey retired, was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame in the 1980's and was named one of the top-100 football players in San Jose State history during the Spartans' centennial celebration of the sport in 1995. Chaney still holds the school record for career tackles at 527.

San José State-San Diego State connections: Two men, **Claude Gilbert** and Olympic Games gold-medalist **Willie Steele**, are members of both school's athletics or sports Halls of Fame.

Steele was a member of the 1942 San José State freshman football team and 1942 track and field team. He set the school record in the broad jump (long jump) with a 25-feet-7 mark that stood number for 24 years until 1968 Olympic Games gold medal winner Tommie Smith bettered the mark in 1966. Following World War II, Steele completed his college career at San Diego State competing in basketball, football and track and field. He won the broad jump at the 1948 London Olympics with a 25-feet-8 mark.

San José State grad Claude Gilbert was an assistant coach and head coach at both schools. Gilbert compiled a 61-26-2 record at San Diego State during the 1973-80 seasons. At San José State, Gilbert had a 38-30-1 mark during the 1984 through 1989 seasons. He is one of just two Spartan football head coaches to lead teams to back-to-back seasons of 10 or more wins (1986 and 1987). Gilbert is the only San José State football player to earn a varsity letter, serve as a team captain (1958), later become an assistant coach and eventually be named head coach.

National leader in turnover margin: For the second consecutive week, San Jose State is the national leader in turnover margin.

The Spartans' turnover margin at +12 or 2.0 per game in games played through October 12. The Spartans have 13 interceptions, which leads the country, and five fumble recoveries.

For its first six games, San Jose State lost the ball six times, tied for eighth best in the country, on four fumbles and two pass interceptions.

The last time San Jose State finished a season with a turnover margin of +10 or more was in 2007 when current head coach Brent Brennan was a Spartan assistant coach coaching the wide receivers and special teams units. That team finished with a +13 turnover margin.

Breaking down 18 takeaways in 2019: The San Jose State defense has had at least one takeaway in five of the team's six games this season.

Points off of turnovers: After six games, San Jose State has scored 51 points off of opponent turnovers. The first opponent points off a Spartan turnover came in the October 12 Nevada victory on an interception return for a touchdown.

San Jose State's 30-point games: The October 12 game at Nevada is the fourth time this season San Jose State scored 30 or more points. The Spartans are 3-1 in games scoring 30 or more points this season.

Last year, San Jose State scored 30 or more points four times and was 1-3 in those games. The 2016 season was the last time the Spartans scored 30 or more points in five games.

Consecutive 400-plus yard passing games: For the first time since the end of the 2013 season, San Jose State produced consecutive games with at least 400 passing yards. The Spartans passed for 412 yards in the October 4 win over New Mexico and 405 yards in the October 12 loss at Nevada.

The Nevada game is the third time this season San Jose State had at least 400 passing yards. The Spartans did it the first time against Arkansas with 402 yards in the air.

A passing fancy: For the first time since 2013, San Jose State has more than one game in a season with more than 400 passing yards. In three of the Spartans' last four games, team passing yardage exceeded 400 yards with 402 yards in the Arkansas win (9/21), a season-high 412 yards in the New Mexico victory (10/4) and 405 in the loss at Nevada (10/12).

In 2013, San Jose State had five games of 400 or more passing yards and went five years without one until the 2018 season. There are 27 games in which a Spartan passed for 400 or more yards.

National honors for Josh Love: At the halfway point of the season, **Josh Love** is the first San Jose State quarterback since David Fales in 2013 to be recognized by the Davey O'Brien Award for Quarterback of the Week, the Manning Award "Star of the Week," and the Mountain West as the conference's "Offensive Player of the Week."

The Spartan signal caller was named to the Davey O'Brien Award Great 8 for his 405 passing yards and two touchdowns in the October 4 New Mexico win. He was named to the Manning Award "Star of the Week" list after the Arkansas triumph on September 21. Love was honored as the Mountain West "Offensive Player of the Week" after both wins.

Most Mountain West Football Player of the Week honors since 2013: This season, San Jose State players have earned four Mountain West football "Player of the Week" honors. Quarterback **Josh Love**, twice; defensive back **Bobby Brown, II**, once after the Arkansas win; and placekicker **Matt Mercurio**, following the New Mexico victory. This is the first season since joining the Mountain West that three Spartans received a conference "Player of the Week" honor.

The most Mountain West Football "Player of the Week" honors San Jose State won in one season was in 2013 when quarterback **David Fales** was a three-time winner and placekicker **Austin Lopez** was honored twice.

Back-to-back weeks blocking a kick: If it's a Friday, it must mean the San Jose State University will execute a blocked kick. In the Friday, September 27 game at Air Force, linebacker **Hadari Darden** was credited with deflecting an Air Force extra-point attempt after a Falcons' third-quarter touchdown.

On Friday, October 4 against New Mexico, wide receiver **Bailey Gaither** blocked a first-quarter punt for the second time in his career.

Spartans and individual national statistical leaders: Five times in eight weeks this season, a San Jose State player is a national leader or shares the national lead in a Football Bowl Subdivision statistical category.

School record tied vs. New Mexico: For the fourth time in school history, a San Jose State player kicked four field goals in a game when freshman **Matt Mercurio** converted on tries of 24, 33, 49 and 24 yards after missing from 41 yards in the New Mexico win. He joins **Austin Lopez** who did it twice and the late **Jens Alvernik**, who was the first Spartan to kick four field goals in a game in the 2011 Utah State contest.

Spartans break inside trend: For the first time since the November 1, 2014 Colorado State game, San Jose State recovered an onside kick when **Christian Webb** came up with the football in a successful attempt in the Tulsa game (9/7).

The Spartans had gone 0-for-10 in onside kick attempts during the 2015 through 2018 seasons.

A San Jose State first since 2007: In the Air Force game, freshman **Nick Nash** became the first San Jose State quarterback since **Adam Tafralis** in 2007 to have rushing and passing attempts and catch a pass thrown by a teammate in the same game.

Nash was San Jose State's leading rusher against Air Force with 62 yards on 11 carries and had the Spartans' longest run of the game at 19 yards. He completed 5-of-7 passes without an interception for 82 yards and two touchdowns. In the first quarter, he caught a Josh Love pass for 4 yards.

Nash joins former San Jose State quarterbacks Tafralis, **Scott Rislov** in a 2002 win over UTEP and current University of Oregon offensive coordinator **Marcus Arroyo** in a 2001 NCAA record-setting victory against Nevada as Spartan signal callers to display their offensive versatility rushing, passing and receiving in the same game since the 1976 season.

Since 1976, the feat now has been accomplished 16 times. Former San Jose State running back and current Arizona Cardinals running backs coach **James Saxon** did it four times, three times in 1987 and once in 1986.

Sharing the wealth: Twice this season in the Northern Colorado and Air Force games, at least 10 Spartans caught had a pass reception. In the Northern Colorado victory, 10 Spartans had a pass reception. At Air Force, 11 Spartans were credited with a catch.

Historic win at Arkansas: San Jose State's 31-24 victory at Arkansas on September 21 was its first against a member of the Southeastern Conference (SEC) and more.

- San Jose State was named the Reveal Suits National Team of the Week presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). The recognition was the first time the Spartans as a team were honored by the FWAA since the program began in 2002.

- San Jose State now has a 1-6 win-loss record against teams from the SEC. The Spartans are 0-2 vs. Auburn and Florida, each, and 0-1 vs. Alabama and LSU, each.

- San Jose State's 31 points vs. Arkansas are the most points the Spartans scored in a game against a SEC opponent. The team's previous high was 21 points once each against Florida, LSU and Auburn.

- San Jose State picked up its first win over an opponent affiliated with the Pac-12, Big Ten, SEC, ACC and Big 12 since a 35-34 triumph over Stanford on September 9, 2006. Between victories, the Spartans were winless 26 times against teams affiliated with those five conferences.

- San Jose State earned its first road win since defeating Fresno State, 16-14, on November 26, 2016. The Spartans stopped a 13-game road losing streak.

- San Jose State's first non-conference road win since defeating Navy, 12-0, on September 29, 2012.

- San Jose State's first FBS non-conference road against a school affiliated with the Pac-12, Big Ten, SEC, ACC, and Big 12 win since defeating Illinois, 38-35, on September 21, 2002, the same day on the calendar as San Jose State's win over Arkansas.

Spartans close out Arkansas win with fourth-quarter game-winning drive: For the first time since defeating Nevada, 14-10, in 2016, San Jose State's offense executed a late fourth-quarter game-winning touchdown drive in the Arkansas victory. With 2:56 remaining in the game and the score tied, 24-24, the Spartans drove 75 yards in five plays in 1:43 and scored on a 19-yard touchdown run by **DeJon Packer** with 1:13 to go.

Five pass interceptions key defense vs. Arkansas: For the first time since a September 27, 2008 win at Hawai'i, 20-17, San Jose State intercepted at least four passes in a game when the Spartans came up with five interceptions at Arkansas. **Bobby Brown, II** accounted for a game-high two interceptions. **Nehemiah Shelton, Ethan Aguayo,** and **Jay Lenard** each had one. The program's single-game school record is six accomplished twice.

Sharing weekly-high national honors: San Jose State wide receiver **Tre Walker** shared national honors for most receptions in a game for games played on the weekend of September 21 with a personal single-game best 12 receptions for 161 yards against Arkansas. Walker shared the honor with Devin Duvernay of Texas and Colorado State's Warren Jackson, each of whom also caught 12 passes in a game the week of September 21.

Quarterback versatility: In each of San Jose State's five games, senior **Josh Love** and freshman **Nick Nash** have played quarterback. Love is completing a personal season best of 60.7 percent of his passes. Nash is at 71.4 percent on 14 pass attempts.

First-time starters: Ten Spartans now can claim starting in a major college football contest. Offensive guard **Tyler Stevens**, running back **DeJon Packer**, wide receiver **Isaiah Hamilton**, tight end **Brett Foley**, defensive lineman **Viliami Fehoko**, linebacker **Rico Tolefree**, and cornerback **Brandon Ezell** made their first major college starts in the Northern Colorado game.

In the Arkansas win, **Derrick Deese, Jr.**, made his first major college start at tight end.

At Air Force, cornerback **Nehemiah Shelton** made his first career start.

Isaiah Holiness was the starting running back against Nevada.

The Spartans also began the year with special teams newcomers freshman **Andrew Gonneville**, long snapper; redshirt freshman placekicker **Matt Mercurio**, and sophomore **Chris Wood** as a kickoff specialist. Punter and kick-scoring holder **Alex Galland** is a graduate transfer from Yale University.

Ground game moves ahead in opener: San Jose State's 158 rushing yards against Northern Colorado were its most rushing yards since gaining 173 yards at Nevada on November 17, 2017. Quarterback **Nick Nash** led the Spartans with 67 yards on five carries. His 49-yard run was the Northern Colorado game's longest play from scrimmage.

Nash on a dash: San Jose State freshman **Nick Nash** is the first Spartan quarterback to rush for as many as 50 yards since Kenny Potter gained 52 yards and scored three touchdowns on 22 carries in a 41-38 loss to Air Force on November 19, 2016 in CEFCU Stadium.

Nash's 67 rushing yards are the most by a San Jose State quarterback since Potter gained 69 yards and scored a touchdown on 15 carries in the 2015 Cure Bowl victory over Georgia State. Nash's 49-yard run against Northern Colorado was the first time a San Jose State quarterback ran for more than 40 yards in one play since Potter ran for 42 yards against Georgia State.

Pressuring the passer: San Jose State's 4.0 quarterback sacks in the Northern Colorado win was its first time with 4.0 sacks in a game since the 2017 loss to Utah State. Linebackers **Ethan Aguayo, Tysyn Parker,** and **Jessie Osuna,** and defensive lineman **Demanuel Talauati** were credited with a quarterback sack against Northern Colorado.

The Spartans picked up their first quarterback sack since the opener in the Nevada game with one against the Wolf Pack on October 12.

2019 opponents: San Jose State is the only Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) school with games in five different time zones this season. The Spartans will exceed 16,000 travel miles in 2019 with short trips to Nevada and UNLV in the Pacific Time Zone, Air Force in the Mountain Time Zone, Arkansas in the Central Time Zone, Army West Point in the Eastern Time Zone and Hawai'i in the Hawaiian Time Zone.

The only other year San Jose State played in five time zones was in 2015 with road games at Oregon State, Nevada and UNLV (PT), Air Force (MT), Auburn (CT), Hawaii (HT), and Georgia State in the inaugural Orlando, Fla., Cure Bowl (ET).

The 2019 season also marks the first time San Jose State plays two of the three service academies (Air Force, Army West Point and Navy) in the same season and the Spartans' first trip to state of New York.

Coordinator continuity: For the first time since the 2008 and 2009 seasons, San Jose State has the same offensive coordinator, defensive coordinator and special teams coordinator in consecutive seasons with **Kevin McGiven** in the offensive coordinator role, **Derrick Odum** as defensive coordinator and **Fred Guidici** as special teams coordinator.

In 2008 and 2009, the Spartans' offensive coordinator was **Steve Morton**. **Keith Burns**, the current defensive secondary coach at UTEP, was the defensive coordinator, and current San Jose State head coach **Brent Brennan** was coordinated special teams while coaching the wide receivers.

National Football Foundation honors five Spartans with bachelor's degrees: Tight end **Brett Foley**, punter **Alex Galland**, defensive back **Chandler Hawkins**, and offensive linemen **Deano Motes** and **Quinn Oseland** were five San Jose State football players among more than 1,400 honored by the National Football Foundation on August 27 as college graduates playing a final season for their respective schools at the NCAA Divisions I, II and III levels and in the NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics).

Foley and Motes are enrolled in a San Jose State M.B.A. program; Galland and Oseland, in a master's in public administration curriculum; and Hawkins, in educational counseling.

New CEFCU Stadium look: During the summer, nearly 9,000 spectator seats were removed from the east grandstand to complete Phase #1 of the Spartan Athletics Center project at CEFCU Stadium. Scheduled to open in 2023, the Center will be the new home for San Jose State football, women's soccer and men's soccer and be available for use by the entire Spartan student-athlete population.

Phase #2, demolition of the east side of CEFCU Stadium, begins after the 2019 season is over. The Spartan Athletics Center will be under construction from 2020 to 2022. In 2023, the east side of CEFCU Stadium will be rebuilt with bleacher seating, concession stands and other amenities.

Versatile Spartans: Center **Kyle Hoppe**, defensive linemen **E.J. Ane** and **Deano Motes**, and defensive back **Zamore Zigler** are four San Jose State players to play both offense and defense for the Spartans.

Ane played on both sides of the ball in the 2018 UNLV and Nevada games.

Zigler was a running back his first two seasons before moving to a cornerback role in 2018.

Motes was a defensive lineman in his first two seasons before moving to the offensive side last season and started eight games.

Hoppe, last year's starting center, played a reserve defensive lineman in 2017.

Family ties: This year's San Jose State team has a range of internal family ties.

- Offensive line coach **Joe Bernardi** is the son of former SJSU offensive line coach Gary Bernardi.

- Head coach **Brent Brennan**, is the son of former SJSU wide receiver the late Steve Brennan.

- Running backs coach **Alonzo Carter** is the stepfather of freshman wide receiver **Malikhi Miller**.

- Safeties **Tre Jenkins** and **Andrew Jenkins** are twin brothers. They line up side-by-side on the kickoff cover team.

- Running back **Brendan Manigo** is the second Manigo brother to play football for SJSU. His brother, Alex Manigo, was a linebacker on the 2015 and 2016 San Jose State teams.

A master's degree in their future: Tight end **Brett Foley**, punter **Alex Galland**, defensive back **Chandler Hawkins**, and offensive linemen **Quinn Oseland** and **Deano Motes** are five San José State players playing as graduate students.

Foley, Hawkins and Motes are San Jose State University graduates. Foley and Motes are in their first semester as M.B.A. candidates. Hawkins is pursuing his master's degree in educational counseling.

Galland, a mechanical engineering major at Yale University, and Oseland, a business marketing major at the University of Minnesota, are enrolled in San Jose State's public administration master's program.

Beyond Football: The San José State University "Beyond Football" program encompasses personal growth, identifying career objectives and fostering community service. From August 1, 2018 through July 31, 2019, the Spartans logged more than 5,000 hours of activities, an average of about 50 hours a player.

Home stadium name history: San José State and Citizens Equity First Credit Union (CEFCU, pronounced SEFF-cue) are in year three of a 15-year naming rights agreement for the university's football stadium, built in 1933, to be called CEFCU Stadium - Home of the Spartans. CEFCU and San José State Athletics first became partners in 2011 with signage on the stadium scoreboard and at the West gate entry point.

Apparel: In July 2017, San José State University began a six-year, all-sports apparel agreement with adidas. The 2019 season is the Spartans' third with adidas.
