San Diego State Aztecs (6-1, 0-0 MWC) vs. San Diego Toreros (4-3, 0-0 WCC)

► **When & Where:** Wednesday, Dec. 5, 2007, Cox Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 7 p.m. (PST).

► **The Records:** The Aztec women's basketball team puts its three-game win streak on the line when it plays host to city-rival USD on Wednesday at Cox Arena at 7 p.m. San Diego State, which is unbeaten at home, defeated Cal State Fullerton 76-45 in front of a record crowd Sunday afternoon to improve to 6-1 overall, matching its best start since the 1992-93 campaign. The Aztecs face a Torero squad which is 4-3 in 2007, but has won each of the last five meetings between the two schools.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the third year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 253-189 in 15 seasons, while she is 172-124 in her 10 previous campaigns at SDSU.

► **USD Head Coach Cindy Fisher:** Fisher is in her third year at USD and her eighth season overall. Her USD record is 34-31, while her overall mark is 93-112. She is 9-1 all-time versus the Aztecs.

► **San Diego Series History:** San Diego State dominated the early series, winning 24 of the first 25 all-time meetings. USD, however, has claimed each of the last five contests, with the series now standing at 24-6 in favor of the Aztecs (Last: San Diego def. San Diego State, 76-46, at Jenny Craig Pavilion on Nov. 19, 2006).

Aztec Basketball Looks To Stay Perfect At Home Wednesday Against Rival San Diego

With a three-game win streak and an unbeaten record at home, the San Diego State women's basketball team puts both marks on the line when it plays host to rival San Diego Wednesday at Cox Arena, beginning at 7 p.m. SDSU started its month-long homestand Sunday with a 76-45 victory over Cal State Fullerton in front of a record crowd to improve to 6-1 on the season, the program's best start since the 1992-93 campaign.

The Aztecs will be looking to defeat the Toreros for the first time since 1996, as USD has won the last five meetings since the two schools renewed their season series in 2002.

SDSU Defeats Cal State Fullerton 76-45 In Front Of Record Crowd

In front of a Cox Arena record crowd of 2,397, the San Diego State women's basketball team kicked off its month-long homestand Sunday with a 76-45 victory over visiting Cal State Fullerton. The Aztecs had five players score in double-figures to help the team move to 6-1 on the season for its best start since the 1992-93 campaign. The Titans, meanwhile, dropped to 1-5 on the year, losing their sixth straight against

SDSU sophomore point guard **Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** posted her first double-double of the season and the third of her career with 10 points on 4-for-5 shooting, and a career-high 12 assists. Her 12 assists are the most by an Aztec since Shannon Lee had 14 helpers against Illinois State on Nov. 24, 2000.

Four other Aztecs logged double-figures in points, including redshirt freshman **Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.)**, who matched her career-best with 15 points, and freshman center **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)**, who added 12 points and a team-high seven rebounds. Sophomore guard **Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.)** was the fourth starter in double-figures with 10 points, while junior **LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.)** matched her career-high with 10 points off the bench.

CSF owned three, one-point advantages in the opening two minutes of the game, including at 5-4 on a layup by Ashley Richie. The Aztecs took the lead on a Quenese Davis bucket, but a Toni Thomas free-throw equalized the game at six points apiece. SDSU broke out of that tie with a 13-0 run and led by as many as 21 points, before heading into the locker room up 19 at 41-22.

Duffy opened the second half with each of San Diego State's first three baskets, as the host led by 25 with 17:47 remaining. The Aztec advantage reached 30 points on a three-pointer from **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** at the 9:37 mark and peaked at 38 points at 76-38, before SDSU finished the afternoon with its second victory of 30 points or more this season at 76-45.

SDSU shot a season-best 55.7 percent from the field and limited Cal State Fullerton to an opponent season-low 45 points.

What A Crowd

With 2,397 fans, San Diego State set a new Cox Arena attendance record for a women's basketball game on Sunday against Cal State Fullerton. The new mark is nearly double the previous high of 1,280 against Hawai'i on January 23, 1999.

Q With The Assist

After leading the nation in assists by a freshman last season, Aztec sophomore Quenese Davis had a career-high 12 assists in just 24 minutes of action Sunday against Cal State Fullerton. Davis beat her previous high of 10 set in last season's opener versus Nevada and her 12 helpers are the most by an Aztec since Shannon Lee tallied 14 against Illinois State on Nov. 24, 2000. Davis ranks 53rd nationally in assists per game in 2007-08 with a 4.9 per game average.

They're A Steal

With 15.9 steals per game, San Diego State not only leads the Mountain West Conference, but it ranks fourth among 326 schools in NCAA Division I. The Aztecs have 111 steals on the year, tallying at least 13 in all seven contests.

The team's 23 steals versus Southern Utah and 18 steals against Nevada remain the two best performances by an MWC school thus far in 2007-08. The 23 steals are the team's most since also posting 23 versus Long Island University on Dec. 27, 1996. The total is second all-time in the MWC since the league began, trailing only Colorado State's 24-steal effort in 2001 against Sacramento State.

Individually, Jené Morris and Quenese Davis are tied for first in the conference and 23rd nationally in steals per game (3.43). Teammate Allison Duffy isn't far behind with 2.57 thefts per outing to rank her third in the league and 86th in the nation.

A year ago, San Diego State had 10 or more steals in a game 13 times. The school record for most steals in a season is 555 by the 1983-84 team.

Turnover Town

Another category in which the Aztecs continue to lead the Mountain West Conference is in turnover margin. SDSU is averaging six fewer turnovers per game than its opponents, forcing 198 overall (28.3/g). The Aztecs have forced at least 23 turnovers in all seven games, including highs of 37 against Nevada and 35 versus Southern Utah. A year ago, San Diego State opponents had 20 or more turnovers on 11 occasions.

Another Block Party?

After leading the MWC in blocks per game in both overall and league-only outings in 2006-07, San Diego State looks like it is well on its way to doing the same again this season. In the opening seven games, the Aztecs has 40 total blocks by eight different players, ranking first in the league and 14th nationally with 5.7 per outing.

True freshman Paris Johnson has provided the bulk of the work with 15 to her credit, including five at Nevada, which tied for eighth in school single-game history.

San Diego State ranked 35th nationally with 4.6 blocks per game a year ago. The team's 129 blocks were the program's most since tallying 159 in 1994-95.

Five Is For Us

For the second time this season, San Diego State had five players score in double-figures in the same game on Sunday versus Cal State Fullerton. The Aztecs accomplished the same feat against Saint Mary's and has had at least four players score 10 or more points in the same outing three times in their seven games.

Offensive Outburst

In a stark contrast from a year ago when the Aztecs averaged just 56.1 points per game and shot only 37 percent from the field, SDSU is leading the Mountain West with 74.7 points per outing and is second with a 45.7 field-goal percentage thus far in 2007-08.

► SDSU's 86 points and 34-point margin of victory versus Southern Utah are its most in a game since beating Utah Valley State, 91-45, on Feb. 10, 2005. The Aztecs have recorded two games with more than 80 points for the first time since 2001-02, when the team had 89 points against Radford and 83 versus Air Force. SDSU has two wins of 30 points or more for the first time since 1998-99.

► SDSU has shot above 50 percent twice and above 40 percent from the field in five of seven games. The Aztecs only reached the 40 percent mark 11 times a year ago, posting an 8-3 record in those outings. The last time San Diego State shot over 40 percent from the field in four straight games was in 2001, when the Aztecs opened the campaign with five straight performances.

► San Diego State has scored 60 or more points in seven consecutive games for the first time since also posting a seven-game stint in 1995-96 from Dec. 27-Jan. 13.

- ▶SDSU claimed its first victory on a neutral court since Nov. 29, 2002, when the Aztecs defeated Murray State in Fresno, 59-54. The Aztecs had dropped their previous seven outings in neutral site games.
- ▶The Aztecs have won three road games, its most in a season since the 2003-04 squad won four times in opponent's arenas.
- ▶SDSU won its season-opener for the first time 2002, and claimed its home-opener for the first time in the last three years.
- ▶The Aztecs are 4-0 against teams it also faced last season. SDSU was 3-1 versus Nevada, Saint Mary's, Southern Utah and Cal Poly a year ago.
- ▶The Aztecs are 12-2 in their last 14 games against non-conference opponents with the lone losses coming earlier this year versus Indiana State and in the championship game of the 2006 Surf 'N Slam tournament against No. 17/16 George Washington.

Accuracy Beyond The Arc

While SDSU may average just over 4.5 three-pointers per game, the Aztecs have been more accurate than in recent seasons from beyond the arc, making 34.4 percent of their shots, which ranks second in the Mountain West Conference. SDSU was 4-for-7 (55.7 percent) from three-point land on Sunday against Cal State Fullerton, the second straight game and the third time this season that the Aztecs have made more than half of their three-point attempts.

On The Glass

The Aztecs have owned an advantage in the rebounding column in five games so far this season, including a slight 33-31 edge against Cal State Fullerton. For the season, the team is +3.4 in rebounding margin and has posted 20 or more boards on the offensive glass twice. San Diego State outrebounded its opponent only eight times in 28 outings in 2006-07.

Winning ... The Second Half

The Aztecs have won the scoring battle in the second half in each of their seven contests thus far. SDSU is outscoring its opponents, 261-188, in the second 20-minute period. In 2006-07, San Diego State was 9-1 when scoring more points in the second half, with the lone exception being against BYU in late January.

Young Guns

SDSU has started two freshmen, two sophomores and one senior in its first seven games of 2007-08. The Aztecs' starting lineup in its season opener with Nevada was the program's youngest since the 1983-84 campaign, when the team had three freshmen, one sophomore and one junior among the starting five.

This year's group has just five years of experience, with only four coming at the Division I level as **Shanna Demus (Palmdale, Calif.)** played her first season at Div. II Cal State Los Angeles. The Aztecs' four newcomers, Coco Davis, Allison Duffy, Paris Johnson and Jené Morris, have combined for 54 percent of the team's scoring and 49 percent of its rebounding.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the San Diego will mean:

- ▶SDSU is 7-1 to start a year for the first time since the 1992-93 team was also 7-1.
- ▶SDSU snaps a five-game losing streak to San Diego, winning for the first time since 1996. The Aztecs improve to 25-6 all-time against USD, including a 16-3 mark at home.
- ▶Aztec head coach Beth Burns improves to 8-3 all-time versus the Toreros.
- ▶The Aztecs are 5-0 against teams it also faced last season.

San Diego Tid-Bits

San Diego enters the evening with a 4-3 record thus far in 2007-08 ... USD has played two common opponents with the Aztecs in Southern Utah and Cal Poly with both sides going a perfect 2-0 in such outings ... The Toreros were picked to finish first in the West Coast Conference, after advancing to the WNIT a year ago and ending the season with a 21-9 overall record ... USD is led by center Amber Sprague, who averages 14.3 points per game and 8.6 rebounds an outing ... Junior Kiva Herman (13.9) and senior Amanda Rego (12.0) also both average in double-figures ... Rego led the nation in assists a year ago, and is averaging 7.9 per game this season ... The Toreros average 43.4 rebounds per outing and are shooting just over 40 percent from the field ... USD head coach Cindy Fisher used to be the head coach at Wyoming.

Preseason Points

SDSU women's basketball center Paris Johnson was picked as the Mountain West Conference's top freshman for the upcoming season in a vote by the league's nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 17, at the conference's annual media day in Littleton, Colo. As a team, the Aztecs were tabbed to finish seventh for the third year in a row in the MWC preseason poll. SDSU, which ended up seventh during the 2006-07 regular season, earned 93 points from the panel. Wyoming was tabbed as the preseason favorite for the first time in MWC history after winning the WNIT championship a year ago, receiving 24 of 30 first-place votes and 203 total points.

Sports At Lunch

San Diego State women's basketball and head coach Beth Burns will be featured at Sports at Lunch on Thursday, Dec. 20, beginning at 12:30 p.m. at the San Diego Hall of Champions Sports Museum in Balboa Park. Burns will be joined by Geno Auriemma, a 15-time national coach of the year, who has won five NCAA titles, in the first-ever Sports at Lunch headlined by women's sports.

Check-in begins at noon at the Hall of Champions, with the program getting underway at 12:30 p.m. Tickets for Sports at Lunch are \$32 for Hall of Champions members, \$40 for non-members in advance and \$45 at the door. The HOC is a non-profit 501c(3) organization and tickets are tax deductible.

Burns Gets New Contract

Beth Burns, the winningest head coach in Aztec women's basketball history, signed a new five-year contract, San Diego State Director of Athletics Jeff Schemmel announced Sept. 12. The contract is effective immediately and runs through the 2011-12 campaign.

Pair Added To Aztec Coaching Staff

SDSU head coach Beth Burns added a pair to her staff this past summer. Heidi VanDerveer, who has over 20 years of experience on both the collegiate and professional levels, was named associate head coach on Aug. 29. VanDerveer comes to San Diego State from the Seattle Storm, where she recently completed her second season as an assistant coach. Tara Morrison joined the staff as the team's head manager after two seasons as an assistant coach at Binghamton University in New York and four at the University of Maine.

Last Year's Team Milestones

- ▶ SDSU finished as the 11th most-improved team in Division I, going from 3 to 12 victories in 2006-07.
- ▶ The Aztecs posted the biggest turnaround in back-to-back seasons in league history, claiming five Mountain West Conference victories after going winless in 2005-06.
- ▶ SDSU's 12 wins are the program's most since 2000-01 ... The team's 11 victories at home are the most since 1996-97 ... The five conference victories are the most since 2000-01 ... The Aztecs' six-game win streak is the team's longest since 2000-01 ... Its seven non-conference wins are its most since 2001-01.
- ▶ SDSU led the MWC in blocks in both overall and conference only contests, ranking 35th nationally.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 2005. In just two short years, she already has the program headed in the right direction, as the Aztecs' were the 11th-most improved team in the nation in 2007, and recorded the school's most wins since 2000-01.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 253-189, while her mark school record stands at 172-124 over 10 seasons. Burns recently earned her 250th career victory with the team's win vs. Southern Utah.

RENO, Nev. - In a game featuring two schools with high pressure defenses, the San Diego State women's basketball team survived a stern test in its 2007-08 opener, defeating host Nevada, 67-61, Sunday afternoon at the Lawlor Events Center. The Aztecs claimed their first game of a campaign for the first time since 2002, to improve to 1-0, while the Wolf Pack dropped to 1-1 overall.

San Diego State got a huge game from a pair of players making their collegiate debuts. Freshman center Paris Johnson had 16 points, nine rebounds and five blocks in 38 minutes. Redshirt frosh Allison Duffy scored 10 of her 14 points in the second half, while sophomore Quenese Davis was the third Aztec in double-figures with a team-best 17 points.

Sophomore Jené Morris, who played her first game in an Aztec uniform, notched a game-high seven steals. Junior guard Tamika Lipford provided a solid performance off the bench, recording six points, two steals and two rebounds, one of which came on a critical play with 12 seconds left in the game.

SDSU started off the year by scoring the first basket on a jumper by Morris. Nevada countered with a pair of free throws, but the Aztecs answered again in a back-and-forth first half.

The visitors led by as many as five points at the 7:53 mark at 26-21, but the host went into the locker room on a 15-8 run to end the half with a two-point 36-34 advantage.

The Aztecs struggled to find their offensive rhythm coming out of the break, taking five and a half minutes to hit their first field goal. SDSU used that bucket to start a 9-0 run to knot the game at 43-43 and take a two-point lead at 45-43 with 11:32 remaining.

The two sides were tied again at 45 points, but the Aztecs maintained an advantage the rest of the way. SDSU was up by five points on four occasions, including as late as 59-54, but Nevada came to within a pair with 2:39 left and again with 45 seconds remaining. The Aztecs made six of their final eight free-throw attempts to preserve the 67-61 victory.

Nevada was led by Cherlanda Franklin's 12 points and seven rebounds. The Aztecs avenged a loss to the Wolf Pack in last year's season-opener in San Diego.

MORAGA, Calif. - The San Diego State women's basketball team had five players score in double-figures in a 83-60 victory over Saint Mary's in Moraga, Calif. SDSU is now 2-0 for the first time since the 1992-93 season, while the Gaels fell to 2-2.

Five players reached double-figures in scoring for the Aztecs, who jumped out to a 46-29 lead at the half.

Sophomore Jené Morris led the way with a game-high 17 points on 7-of-12 shooting, including 2-of-3 behind the 3-point arc.

Redshirt freshman Allison Duffy, playing in her second career game, had 13 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for her first double-double. Senior Shanna Demus had 13 points and three steals, while sophomore Quenese Davis chipped in with 12 points, five rebounds, five steals and three assists in just 24 minutes. Senior Shannon Clay added 10 points off the bench.

SDSU started out the game on an 11-2 run on a layup by Davis with 17:46 remaining in the first half. Saint Mary's made a late run and got to within nine with 3:24 left, but an 11-4 run, capped by a LaSandra Dixon layup late in the first half, gave the Aztecs the 46-29 lead at the break.

The Gaels never got closer than 12 in the second half, as San Diego State won its second road game of the season for the first time since it won four away from Montezuma Mesa in the 2003-04 campaign.

Saint Mary's was led by Jontelle Smith, who scored 12 points on 4-of-10 shooting, while Louella Tomlinson had 11 points and four blocks.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team forced 35 turnovers and had all 11 of its players score points, as the Aztecs cruised to an 86-52 victory over Southern Utah in their home opener Tuesday at Cox Arena. SDSU improved to 3-0 on the season, giving head coach Beth Burns her 250th career win, while the Thunderbirds fell to 1-3 overall in 2007-08.

San Diego State had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer freshman center Paris Johnson, who had 14 points and a team-best six rebounds and two blocks. Senior forward Shanna Demus recorded 10 of her 12 points in the first half, while freshman forward Allison Duffy contributed 10 points off the bench.

The Aztecs logged a season-high eight 3-pointers, 23 steals and 26 assists. Sophomore Jené Morris led the defensive effort with a career-tying seven steals to go with her team-high nine assists and no turnovers in just 21 minutes of action.

SDSU got off to a quick start and never looked back, jumping out to an early 12-0 lead, before Southern Utah could get on the board with a layup at the 16:21 mark. The Aztecs went on an 18-7 run over the next seven minutes to go up by 21 at 30-9, and led by 25 at the break, 43-18.

The Thunderbirds cut their deficit down to as few 17 points with 9:19 remaining at 59-42, but the Aztecs responded with a 4-0 run with back-to-back baskets from Duffy and finished on a 21-8 scoring streak to claim their fifth-straight in the series, 86-52.

Southern Utah's Anne Westwood had a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds, while Erin Heuett contributed 11 points and four assists in the losing effort.

SAN DIEGO - In front of a Cox Arena record crowd of 2,397, the San Diego State women's basketball team kicked off its month-long homestand Sunday with a 76-45 victory over visiting Cal State Fullerton at Cox Arena. The Aztecs had five players score in double-figures to help the team move to 6-1 on the season for its best start since the 1992-93 campaign. The Titans, meanwhile, dropped to 1-5 on the year, losing their sixth straight against the Aztecs.

SDSU sophomore point guard Quenese Davis posted her first double-double of the season and the third of her career with 10 points on 4-for-5 shooting, and a career-high 12 assists. Her 12 assists are the most by an Aztec since Shannon Lee had 14 helpers against Illinois State on Nov. 24, 2000.

Four other Aztecs logged double-figures in points, including redshirt freshman Allison Duffy, who matched her career-best with 15 points, and freshman center Paris Johnson, who added 12 points and a team-high seven rebounds. Sophomore guard Jené Morris was the fourth starter in double-figures with 10 points, while junior LaSandra Dixon matched her career-high with 10 points off the bench.

Cal State Fullerton owned three, one-point advantages in the opening two minutes of the game, including at 5-4 on a layup by Ashley Richie. The Aztecs took the lead on a Quenese Davis bucket, but a Toni Thomas free-throw equalized the game at six points apiece. SDSU broke out of that tie with a 13-0 run and led by as many as 21 points, before heading into the locker room up 19 at 41-22.

Duffy opened the second half with each of San Diego State's first three baskets, as the host led by 25 with 17:47 remaining. The Aztec advantage reached 30 points on a three-pointer from Coco Davis at the 9:37 mark and peaked at 38 points at 76-38, before SDSU finished the afternoon with its second victory of 30 points or more this season at 76-45.

San Diego State shot a season-best 55.7 percent from the field and limited Cal State Fullerton to an opponent season-low 45 points. The Aztecs also forced 27 turnovers, had 21 assists and made four of their seven shots from beyond the arc.
