► SDSU enters '13-14 having advanced to the NCAA tourney a school-record four straight seasons and won 23 or more games in five straight after last season's 23-11 effort.

► SDSU heads into the new season having earned a post-season berth and won 20 or more games eight years running. Both streaks are program records.

► Head coach Steve Fisher returns two starters and six letterwinners, and welcomes six others, half of which were with the program a season ago. The other three consist of one high-major Division I graduate student transfer and a pair of highly regarded prep teammates who garnered national recognition as seniors.

► The two returning starters represents Fisher's fewest since welcoming one back at the start of the 2011-12 campaign. What did Fisher and the Aztecs do that season? They went on to capture a share of the Mountain West regular-season title, earned an at-large berth to the NCAA tournament and finished with a 26-8 record, which equaled the second-most victories in program history.

► The Aztecs feature a roster that includes just two seniors, five juniors, a pair of sophomores and three freshmen. Ironically, the last time SDSU had just two seniors on the squad was in 2011-12, when they had a graduate transfer (Garrett Green) and an Aztec veteran (Tim Shelton), and went 26-8. This season, San Diego State has graduate transfer **Josh Davis** and SDSU vet **Xavier Thames**.

► The 2013-14 Aztecs enter the upcoming season having played in 450 career Division I games, which includes 220 starts. Among those on the active roster (12), half have played in the postseason (6), while 10 have been a part of programs that advanced to postseason play.

► Even though San Diego State is set to lose 1,461 points, 649 rebounds and 64 blocked shots from a year ago, it will replenish a big chunk of those figures with the addition of **Josh Davis**. Last year, the Tulane transfer scored 617 points, which would make up 42.2 percent of the lost scoring, grabbed 374 rebounds, which is 57.6 percent of the departed rebounding, and blocked 30 shots, which is 46.9 percent of the lost rejections.

► SDSU also returns its leading shot blocker (**Skylar Spencer**) and second-leading assist man (**Xavier Thames**) and rebounder (**JJ O'Brien**) from a year ago.

# Team Notes

- ▶ San Diego State returns six letterwinners off a squad which...
  - Finished 23-11 and advanced to the school's fourth consecutive NCAA tournament.
  - Held a national ranking for 15 consecutive weeks.
  - Won at least 23 games for the fifth consecutive season.
  - Won 20-plus games for a school-record eighth straight season and reached the 20-win plateau for the ninth time during Steve Fisher's tenure and the 11th time in SDSU's Division I history.
  - Reached the postseason for an eighth straight season (5 NCAA, 3 NIT).
  - Reached the third round of the NAAs for the second time in three seasons and was one of just two MW schools to advance past the second round.
  
- ▶ SDSU is one of 16 schools nationally to have won 20 or more games eight straight seasons (Akron, Brigham Young, Butler, Duke, Florida, Gonzaga, Kansas, Louisville, Marquette, Memphis, North Carolina, Ohio State, Pittsburgh, Syracuse, Utah State).
  
- ▶ The Aztecs are the class of California having won 33 straight games vs. schools from the state. Last year, San Diego State went 10-0 vs. California schools, which included victories over USC (away) and UCLA (neutral). SDSU also went 2-1 vs. the Pac-12 Conference in 2012-13 and have won 11 of the last 12 vs. the current Pac-12 configuration.
  
- ▶ San Diego State loses a lot of staples from an NCAA tournament team, but returns solid core as it heads into the 2013-14 season. Gone are starters Jamaal Franklin, Chase Tapley and DeShawn Stephens, and part-time starter James Rahon. Back are starters **Xavier Thames** and **JJ O'Brien** and one huge get in Tulane graduate transfer **Josh Davis**. Throw in the ultra-versatile **Winston Shepard** and one of the Mountain West's top shot blockers in **Skylar Spencer**, and the Aztecs looked poised to compete for a league championship and a fifth-straight NCAA berth.
  
- ▶ **Thames** returns for his senior campaign as the team's top returner in scoring (9.5), assists (2.4), three-point field goals made (37), three-point field-goal percentage (.356) and free-throw percentage (.815), while sharing the honor in steals (31) with O'Brien. A two-year SDSU starter and one the most experienced point guards in the West, Thames is aiming to return to his sophomore season form (All-Mountain West) after a back injury suffered right before conference limited his time on the floor throughout the MW slate and into the postseason as a junior a year ago.
  
- ▶ **O'Brien**, who is one the smartest basketball players in America, is back for his second season at SDSU as a junior. The versatile forward, who can play 1-5 on the floor, is the Aztecs' returning leader in rebounding (4.5) and field-goal percentage (.526), and second-leading returner in scoring (7.2). Having sat out the previous year after transferring from Utah, last season O'Brien picked up his game as the year progressed, averaging 9.1 points and 5.6 rebounds in conference games. In fact, his three double-digit rebounding games and two double-doubles came against the top MW opposition (Colorado State, New Mexico, UNLV).
  
- ▶ **Davis** is on Montezuma Mesa expected to fill the void left by the departed seniors. Tough task. But if anyone can accomplish it, Davis is the guy, especially after the season he had at Tulane last year when he averaged 17.6 points and 10.7 rebounds, shot 49.2 percent from the floor, 71.6 percent from the free-throw line and posted 19 double-doubles. To put it in perspective, Davis averaged more points, more rebounds, shot a higher percentage from the floor, and had more blocked shots and double-doubles than two-time All-American and Mountain West first-teamer Jamaal Franklin. At 6-8, 215-pounds, expect Davis, who was tabbed as the No. 2 transfer by ESPN's Jeff Goodman, to give SDSU the size and impact not seen around these parts since Kawhi Leonard graced the Viejas Arena floor.
  
- ▶ **Shepard** is one of the most exciting players in the Mountain West with his above-average ability to do all things well. Need a ball-handler? Check. Need a stop defensively? Check. Need to get to the rim? Check. Need a post touch? Check. You get the picture. As a true freshman last year, Shepard showed glimpses of what he can do (third-leading returning scorer, second-leading returning assist man) and with a Division I season under his belt, the sophomore should be even that much more impactful in 2013-14.
  
- ▶ **Spencer** was one of three Aztecs to play in all 34 games last season as a true freshman and made his mark on the defensive end of the floor. The 6-9, 235-pound fly swatter blocked a San Diego State-freshman-record 51 shots, which eclipsed the previous record of 45 (1982). In fact, Spencer's 51 blocks was 31 more than Michael Cage's freshman total in 1981 and four more than Cage's senior-year figure before he went on to become a first-round NBA Draft pick in 1984. Still raw offensively, one can expect him to shoot a high percentage after connecting on 66.2 percent of his field-goal attempts in 2012-13.
  
- ▶ The team will also welcome back **Dwayne Polee II** and **James Johnson**, a pair of high-level Division I transfers who made their debut with the Aztecs last season. Polee II saw limited time on the floor, but played in 26 of SDSU's 34 games last season. The ultra-athletic wing is expected to see plenty of time as a junior with the graduation of Tapley and the void left by Franklin after declaring for the NBA Draft. Johnson, meanwhile, became eligible at mid-season last year and saw action in 13 games. With a full season with the Aztecs under his belt, Johnson should benefit and be able to use his 6-9, 235-pound frame down low.
  
- ▶ Not new to the program, but new to the floor are **Matt Shrigley** and **Aqeel Quinn**. Shrigley redshirted last season, but at times was the best player on the practice court. The local product out of La Costa Canyon High can fill it up from deep and beat defenders off the bounce and get to the rack. Expect him to see plenty of minutes on the wing. Quinn, meanwhile, will be eligible after sitting out last year following his transfer from Cal State Northridge. The guard averaged nearly seven points for the Matadors during his sophomore campaign and will compete for time at shooting guard. His time with the Aztecs in 2012-13 will prove invaluable this season.
  
- ▶ Making their debut for SDSU will be a pair of high school teammates in Dakarai Allen and D'Erryl Williams out of Sheldon High in Sacramento. Allen is a decorated four-star standout, according to Rivals.com, while Williams is a three-star performer. The duo led Sheldon to the semifinals of the California state tournament and ultimately a 27-6 record, a No. 27 national ranking and No. 5 state ranking (MaxPreps.com). Both are expected to come in and compete immediately for time with Allen on the wing and Williams at point. Sacramento has been good to the Aztecs of late, producing a 1,000-point scorer in the recently departed Tapley and returning starter Thames.
  
- ▶ **Angelo Chol** will sit out this season, but his impact on the practice floor cannot be denied. A local product out of San Diego, Chol returns home after a two-year stay at Arizona. His presence, which covers 6 feet, 9 inches and weighs 225 pounds, will undoubtedly help SDSU in skill building and game planning.

## Josh Davis

**\*\*\* All-America, All-Conference, All-Region Candidate, Newcomer of the Year \*\*\***

**Senior, Forward, 6-8, 215, Raleigh, N.C. (Tulane)**

- ▶ **17.6 ppg, 10.7 rpg, 1.7 apg, 49.2 FG pct., 71.6 FT pct.**
- ▶ Averaged a double-double for Tulane last season, while shooting nearly 50 percent from the floor, en route to all-Conference USA first-team honors.
- ▶ Would return as SDSU's leading scorer and rebounder and the Mountain West's second-leading returning scorer (by 0.01 point) and top rebounder had he competed for the Aztecs in 2012-13.
- ▶ Recorded 19 double-doubles, scored in double figures 31 times (11 20-point efforts) and pulled down at least 10 rebounds 21 times last season.
- ▶ Finished fourth nationally in double-doubles and eighth in rebounds per game.

## Xavier Thames

**\*\*\* All-Conference, All-Region Candidate \*\*\***

**Senior, Guard, 6-3, 190, Sacramento, Calif. (Pleasant Grove HS)**

- ▶ **9.5 ppg, 2.7 rpg, 2.4 apg, 1.0 spg, 81.5 FT pct.**
- ▶ San Diego State's top returner in scoring, assists, steals, three-point field-goal percentage, free-throw percentage.
- ▶ Reached double figures in scoring 15 times and led the team in assists eight times.
- ▶ Had one turnover or less 13 times and had a positive assist-to-turnover ratio 18 times.
- ▶ Made at least one three-point field goal in 23 of his 30 games played and multiple threes eight times.
- ▶ Earned all-Mountain West accolades as a sophomore (2011-12).

## JJ O'Brien

**\*\*\* All-Conference, All-Region Candidate \*\*\***

**Junior, Forward, 6-7, 225, Rancho Cucamonga, Calif. (Utah)**

- ▶ **7.2 ppg, 4.5 rpg, 1.5 apg, 1.0 spg, 52.6 FG pct.**
- ▶ SDSU's leading returner in rebounding, offensive rebounding, steals and field-goal percentage, and second-leading returner in scoring.
- ▶ Is the ninth-leading returner in the MW in rebounding (seventh in conference games only) and top returning player in the league in offensive rebounds (3.4; conference games only).
- ▶ Upped his production in conference play and returns as the team's leading scorer (9.1; MW games only). Scored in double figures 10 times in league action, compared to three in non-conference games
- ▶ His two double-doubles and his three double-figure rebounding efforts occurred against Mountain West foes.
- ▶ Led the team in scoring twice, in rebounding five times and in assists six times.

## Winston Shepard

**\*\*\* All-Conference \*\*\***

**Sophomore, Forward, 6-8, 210, Houston, Texas (Findlay Prep)**

- ▶ **5.7 ppg, 3.5 rpg, 2.0 apg**
- ▶ Returns as SDSU's second-leading rebounder, assists and steals man from a season ago, and third-leading scorer.
- ▶ Led the team in assists four times and rebounding once.
- ▶ Scored in double figures six times last season, including his career-high 18 points to go along with five rebounds and five assists vs. UNLV.
- ▶ Had a positive assist-to-turnover ratio 13 times and had four or more assists five times as a true freshman.
- ▶ Production increased in Mountain West play (non-conference-MW splits): scoring (4.3-7.3), rebounding (2.7-4.1), assists (1.9-2.3), field-goal percentage (33.3-44.3), three-point percentage (25.0-26.3), free-throw percentage (50.0-63.0).
- ▶ Per 40-minute averages in 2012-13: 11.3 ppg, 7.0 rpg, 3.9 apg.

## Skylar Spencer

**\*\*\* All-Conference, Conference Defensive Player of the Year \*\*\***

**Sophomore, Forward, 6-9, 235, Inglewood, Calif. (Price HS)**

- ▶ **2.9 ppg, 2.9 rpg, 1.5 bpg, 66.2 FG pct.**
- ▶ Returns as SDSU's top shot blocker and the No. 2 shot blocker in the Mountain West, while averaging just 14.2 minutes.
- ▶ Is the second-best returning offensive rebounder on the team after grabbing 40 last season.
- ▶ Owns the top shooting accuracy, percentage wise, after connecting on 66.2 percent of his attempts last year.
- ▶ Pulled down a career-high 11 boards at USC in 30 minutes of action.
- ▶ Per 40-minute averages in 2012-13: 8.0 ppg, 8.3 rpg, 4.2 bpg.

# Steve Fisher

Entering 23rd-Full Season • 15th Season at SDSU • Illinois St., 1967

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In 14 seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become one of the best programs in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that the school exercised its contract option on Fisher prior to the 2011-12 season, which keeps the coach on Montezuma Mesa through 2014-15.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher has guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament six times, including four straight with third-round appearances in two of the last three years. In 2011, he led SDSU to a 34-3 record and a berth in the Sweet 16. Fisher has also taken the Aztecs to the NIT four times, including their run to the national semifinals in 2009. San Diego State has currently been to the postseason eight straight years.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene when it introduced Fisher as its new coach. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, which put him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket after his stint in Ann Arbor. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to a NIT title as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

In 2006-07, he led SDSU to the MW regular season and tournament crowns and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That team finished with a Division I then-school-record 24 wins. And the last seven seasons, Fisher has led the Aztecs to seven additional 20-win seasons, including five straight 23-win campaigns, and seven consecutive postseason appearances. In 2012, in what was perceived as a rebuilding year, Fisher led SDSU to a 26-8 record, a spot in the NCAA Tournament and its second straight Mountain West regular-season title. Then last season, Fisher and the Aztecs advanced to the third round of the NCAAs for the second time in three years with their third-ever NCAA tournament win.

### Brian Dutcher

Associate Head  
Coach/Head Coach in  
Waiting  
15th Season at SDSU  
Minnesota '82

One of Steve Fisher's first moves as head coach at San Diego State was to hire Brian Dutcher as his top assistant. Dutcher, 53, was a regional scout for the Sacramento Kings before assuming the role of assistant head coach at SDSU.

When Fisher decides to retire, Dutcher will assume head coaching duties as he was anointed "head coach in waiting" in August of 2011.

Dutcher served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Steve Fisher on the bench.

Dutcher headed up UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship and a Big Ten tournament title (1998).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years.

His efforts at SDSU have gained accolades as well. The first full-year recruiting effort by Fisher, Dutcher and Co., resulted in a consensus top-40 group. Their second resulted in a top-25 class without counting a pair of high-profile transfers. Ten seasons ago, Dutcher helped attract SDSU's first McDonald's All-American. In 2004, freshmen Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter earned starting spots and all-league recognition. Dutcher was a key figure in bringing in classes that produced two NBA draft picks the last three seasons and the No. 24 class in 2012. He also helped land Tulane transfer Josh Davis and Arizona transfer Angelo Chol at the start of summer.

Dutcher is firmly entrenched as one of the nation's top recruiters after showing that his rapport is as strong with potential student-athletes on the West Coast as it was in the vaunted Big Ten.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Bloomington (Minn.) Jefferson High School and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Minnesota head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten title, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.



### Mark Fisher

Assistant Coach  
12th Season at SDSU  
Michigan '01

Mark Fisher enters his seventh season as assistant coach and 12th overall at San Diego State.

The son of 15th-year head coach Steve Fisher, Mark Fisher has taken on assistant coach duties after being the program's director of operations the five prior seasons.

Fisher's responsibilities include on-court coaching and skill development with SDSU's post players, opponent scouting, player development and recruiting. Fisher also plays a huge role in the Aztecs' offensive concepts, such as ball screening, spacing and the like.

In his first six years of coaching at SDSU, Fisher helped the Aztecs to their eighth straight 20-win season and eighth consecutive appearance in the postseason, including 2011's 34-3 record and Sweet 16 appearance.

When not on the practice court, Fisher can be found on the road in high school gyms around America recruiting.

The seventh-year assistant helped secure the 2009-10 incoming group, which featured the California Player of the Year in Kawhi Leonard. The class was ranked No. 15 in the nation by The HOOP SCOOP Online and was rated as the No. 1 class among non-automatic qualifying BCS schools by The HOOP SCOOP Online and Rivals.com. Meanwhile, ESPN.com slotted the Aztec incoming class at No. 4 in its "mid-major recruiting." The 2012 class, meanwhile, was rated the 24th-best by Rivals and the last three classes have produced two NBA draft picks.

As the director of operations, Fisher handled many of the day-to-day operations, including scheduling, summer camps and organizing all aspects of team travel. He represented the basketball program with the athletic administration.

During his time supervising scheduling, the Aztecs have played high-profile games against Arizona, California, Providence, Iowa State, Washington and Washington State among others. In addition, he has arranged San Diego State to play in the BP Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks, Alaska, the Shamrock Invitational in Moraga, Calif., the World Vision Classic in Fresno, Calif., and the prestigious John R. Wooden Classic in past seasons.

In previous years, when San Diego State had two assistant coaches, Fisher officially took on coaching responsibilities, including conducting individual workouts and off-campus recruiting.

Fisher, the oldest of Steve Fisher's two sons, graduated from Michigan in December of 2001. A member of Psi Chi, a psychology honors fraternity, he graduated with a bachelor's degree in psychology.

Around basketball a majority of his life, Mark Fisher has amassed a variety of experience in a short period of time.

From 1998-2001, Fisher worked in a variety of capacities for Lincoln High School in Ann Arbor, Mich. He served as the varsity assistant head coach, head junior varsity coach and the head freshman coach during his tenure, assisting in all areas of the program.

He served as associate head coach for an Ann Arbor AAU team in the summer of 2001. Many of the players on that squad went on to play college basketball. He has also assisted in numerous camps, including the Steve Fisher Basketball Camps - both in Ann Arbor and in San Diego.



### Justin Hutson

Assistant Coach  
6th Season at SDSU  
CSU Bakersfield '94

Justin Hutson, a former San Diego State assistant coach, returned to Montezuma Mesa for a second stint on April 15, 2013. Hutson, who served as assistant coach at SDSU from 2006-2011, returns to the Aztecs after serving as an associate head coach at UNLV the past two seasons. The 2013-14 campaign will be his sixth overall at San Diego State.

Hutson is reunited with Fisher, Brian Dutcher and Mark Fisher, a coaching group with which he spent five seasons previously. During that staff's five-year tenure, the Aztecs earned postseason berths and won 20 or more games in each of those five campaigns (25.4 wins per year). SDSU also won six postseason tournament games, including three in the 2009 NIT where they appeared in the national semifinals and two in the 2011 NCAA tournament in a year in which San Diego State finished with a 34-3 record, advanced to the Sweet 16 and ended with a national ranking of No. 6/11 (AP/Coaches). At the Mountain West level, the Aztecs won the 2010 and 2011 tournament titles and the 2011 regular-season crown.

Hutson was part of a staff that set numerous school records, including many that still stand today. Among those are wins, conference wins, most games above .500, longest winning streaks, highest winning percentage, most points, highest scoring margin, lowest opponent scoring average, highest rebound margin, most field goals, most three-point field goals made, most blocked shots and most steals. During the latter part of his time with the Aztecs, Hutson took on the role of defensive coordinator and helped SDSU lead the MW in scoring defense in 2009, 2010 and 2011.

While on The Mesa, Hutson played a pivotal part in San Diego State's recruiting efforts. He was instrumental in securing a pair of nationally recognized recruiting classes, including the No. 15 class leading into the 2009-10 campaign, which included 2011 NBA first-round draft pick Kawhi Leonard and the recently departed and four-year starter Chase Tapley. That class was also rated the top group among non-automatic qualifying BCS schools by a pair of recruiting sites. He also recruiting Jamaal Franklin, who was drafted by Memphis in June.

Prior to his decision to return to San Diego State, Hutson helped UNLV to a pair of 25-plus-win seasons and two NCAA tournament appearances. He played a key role in helping the Rebels bring in a highly regarded recruiting class last year.

Before arriving at SDSU in July 2006, Hutson served as an assistant coach at Cal Poly.

The Mustangs went 10-19 in 2005-06, doubling their previous season's win total. He was responsible for recruiting the 2006 Big West Freshman of the Year and landing two freshmen on the Big West all-freshmen team, along with bringing two first-team all-Big West selections and the defensive player of the year to San Luis Obispo in 2006-07.

Prior to his stint at Cal Poly, Hutson served as the head varsity coach at Bakersfield High School where he led it to a CIF Central Section Championship and four appearances in the playoffs in four seasons. His 2004 team was ranked as high as No. 22 in the nation and fourth in California and his 2003 squad finished the season with a 25-5 record and won the section title. Prior to entering the high school ranks, he was an assistant coach at his alma mater, CSU Bakersfield, for two seasons (1999-00).

As a collegiate player, Hutson enjoyed a storied college career, winning two NCAA Division II championships at CSU Bakersfield. In the 1993 championship season, the Roadrunners were undefeated with a 33-0 record and followed that up with a 27-6 record during the 1994 season.
