Two Unbeaten Streaks on the Line This Saturday When Aztec Men's Soccer Welcomes No. 15 UCLA for Senior Day

The San Diego State men's soccer team will look to continue its four-game unbeaten streak and three-match winning streak this Saturday when it takes on No. 15 UCLA on Senior Day. The Aztecs (6-8-3, 3-3-3 Pac-10) can earn their third consecutive runner-up finish in the Pac-10 with a win and a loss by California at home against Stanford.

SDSU will look to continue its recent success against the Bruins (9-4-6, 6-1-2 Pac-10), who have already clinched the league title and are unbeaten in their last seven matches. San Diego State is unbeaten against UCLA in its last four meetings, going 1-0-3. Earlier this season in Los Angeles, the Aztecs took a two-goal lead, but lost two men to red cards in a 3-3, double-overtime thriller.

Scouting the Bruins

UCLA comes into its match against San Diego State has one of the hottest teams in the nation, going unbeaten in its last seven games. Over the seven matches, the Bruins (9-4-6, 6-1-2 Pac-10), who have already clinched the league title, have outscored the opposition, 12-1.

The Bruins are led offensively by Maxwell Griffin's 22 points on 10 goals and two assists. Among the league leaders, Griffin is first in goals per game (0.53) and game-winners (4), and fourth in points per game (1.16). Michael Stephens is second on the squad with 19 points (7 goals, 5 assists), while Jason Leopoldo has recorded 12 points (2 goals, 8 assists). Brian Perk is the team's top goalkeeper with a 9-4-4 record and 1.00 goals against average.

UCLA has dominated the all-time series, 27-4-10. However, things have begun to change the past few years. SDSU is unbeaten against the Bruins in its last four meetings, posting a 1-0-3 record. In fact, the Aztecs could easily be 3-0-2 over their last five. San Diego State played a man down for most of its game earlier this season and two men down for the final 12 minutes in a thrilling 3-3 double-overtime tie. SDSU had jumped out to a 2-0 lead before the Bruins came roaring back and the Aztecs were issued two red cards. In the Aztecs' last loss in the series (Oct. 8, 2006), SDSU once again played the majority of the match a man short because of a red card.

Last Weekend With the Aztecs

F Raymundo Reza scored three goals and assisted on another in the 4-0 win over Cal State Bakersfield It was SDSU's third consecutive victory and fourth game without a loss ... Reza connected on goals in the 17th, 47th and 80th minute and assisted on Khadim Diouf's tally in the 58th minute ... He became the first SDSU player to record a hat trick since Tyler Tinling scored four times in San Diego State's 7-0 win over Christian Heritage on Oct. 4, 2001 ... His seven points were the most in a single-game by any player in the Pac-10 this season ... D Danny Ortiz, MF Michio Akazawa and F Nick Collins also picked up helpers on the day ... The Aztecs outshot the Roadrunners, 17-2, including a 11-1 advantage on net ... Reza had a career-high six shots, including five on goal ... Diouf and MF Jamel Wallace each added two attempts ... GK Jorge Rosales (one save) and R.J. Smith each played a half to combine for the shutout ... Reza earned Man of the Match honors.

At the Helm

Lev Kirshner is in his ninth year as the head coach and 12th season overall. Kirshner, just one of three coaches in the 40-year history of the program, has brought SDSU back to the national spotlight with back-to-back runner-up finishes in the Pac-10 and two trips to the NCAA tournament in the past three seasons.

Since the men's soccer team earned its full allotment of scholarships in 2005, the Aztecs have gone 32-25-17 (.547), including a 14-12-13 (.526) mark in the Pac-10.

Over his eight seasons, Kirshner has coached two All-America selections, three Academic All-America picks, eight professional players, five all-Far West selections and 33 all-conference picks.

Aztecs Celebrate 400th Victory in Program History

On Sunday, Sept. 14, the San Diego State men's soccer team picked up its 400th victory in program history with a 2-0 shutout versus Air Force in Denver. In its 41st season of Division I soccer, SDSU is now 404-262-85 (.595), including 32-25-17 (.547) in its three-plus years in the Pac-10.

Over the 40-plus years, the Aztecs have advanced to eight NCAA tournaments (1969, 1981-82, 1987-89, 2005-06), including one final four. The final four appearance came in 1987 when San Diego State came from behind in each of its NCAA tournament games to win by 2-1 scores. The run was stopped in the NCAA championship game when host Clemson downed the Aztecs, 2-0. The 1987 squad joined the 1973 men's championship volleyball team as the only two Aztec teams to ever make a NCAA final.

In addition to its many team awards, SDSU has garnered numerous individual accolades as well. The program has produced two National Soccer Hall of Fame Members, five World Cup participants and/or Olympians, 26 national team members, four Hermann Trophy Candidates and 10 All-American selections.

Junior Nick Cardenas Named to 2008 M.A.C. Hermann Trophy Watch List

Junior defender Nick Cardenas (Thornton, Colo.) has been named to the 2008 Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy Watch List. Considered the highest individual honor in inter-collegiate soccer, the recipients of the MAC's Hermann Trophy are selected by Division I head coaches who are current members of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA). Cardenas is one of 11 defenders and 18 juniors on the list.

Cardenas, a two-time NSCAA/adidas all-Far West team selection and all-Pac-10 pick, has eight goals and six assists over his two-plus seasons. The 2006 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and a U.S. U-20 National Team Camp call-up, Cardenas has started 52 collegiate games, anchoring a defense that has posted 18 shutouts over the past two-plus years.

This season, Cardenas has four assists, which rank him second on the team, while playing the most minutes (1,556) of the entire squad.

On Oct. 14, Cardenas was named *College Soccer News* National Team of the Week and the *TopDrawerSoccer.com* Men's Team of the Week for his play in helping the Aztecs to two crucial road results in Pac-10 action.

A list of 15 semifinalists will be selected by a coaches committee in November, with three finalists announced in early December. They will be invited to the Missouri Athletic Club in St. Louis, Mo., for a news conference on Jan. 9, 2009, where the winner will be announced, with a presentation banquet following.

Three Aztecs - Chris Keenan (1987), Marcelo Balboa (1988-89) and Kyle Whittemore (1988) - have been named Hermann Award finalists, but no SDSU athlete has ever won the award. Most recently, Tally Hall was a semifinalist in 2006.

Aztecs Picked to Finish Fifth in Pac-10

Despite returning 10 starters, including five all-conference selections, from last season's runner-up squad, the San Diego State men's soccer team has been picked to finish fifth in the Pac-10 Conference in the preseason poll voted on by the league's coaches in August.

SDSU picked up 11 points, two behind fourth-place Washington (13). California was selected to repeat as league champions with 24 points, including four of the six first-place votes.

The Golden Bears were followed by UCLA (20 points) and Stanford (17 points), which each picked up one first-place vote. The Huskies (13), Aztecs (11) and Oregon State (5) rounded out the conference.

Last season, San Diego State finished 8-7-4 overall and 4-4-2 in Pac-10 play, ending up in a three-way tie for second with Stanford and UCLA.

SDSU, which has never been picked higher than fourth in its four preseason polls, has finished the season better than each of its predicted finishes. In its inaugural Pac-10 season in 2005, the Aztecs were picked sixth, yet managed a fourth-place finish. San Diego State finished second in each of its past two seasons despite being picked fourth and fifth, respectively, in the preseason poll.

This season, SDSU will once again prove the critics wrong. The Aztecs will finish no worse than fourth and could finish as high as second, which would be the program's third consecutive Pac-10 runner-up finish. If San Diego State wins and California loses at home to Stanford, SDSU will tie for second (although the Aztecs would win the tiebreaker).

SDSU's Raymundo Reza Named Pac-10 Player of the Week

San Diego State's Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) has been named the Pac-10 Player of the Week, Commissioner Tom Hansen announced Tuesday. The award is the second consecutive weekly honor for an Aztec and the team's third conference accolade of the season. Senior Jorge Rosales won the award last week (Nov. 4), while redshirt junior Matt McManus received recognition on Oct. 7.

A sophomore, Reza had a career day Sunday in leading SDSU to a 4-0 win over Cal State Bakersfield, its third consecutive victory and fourth straight decision without a loss. Reza had a hand in every goal with three tallies and an assist to become the first Aztec to record a hat trick since Tyler Tinning scored four times against Christian Heritage on Oct. 4, 2001. His seven points were also the most in a match by a Pac-10 player this season.

Reza connected on goals in the 17th, 47th and 80th minute, respectively, and assisted on sophomore Khadim Diouf's strike in the 58th minute. For the game, Reza had a career-high six shot attempts, including five on net.

More Reza...

San Diego State sophomore Raymundo Reza has put together a solid season after a fantastic first weekend. Reza, who had one point on an assist in his first season on The Mesa in 2007, picked up two goals and an assist for five points to help the Aztecs to a runner-up showing at the Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central Tournament the weekend of Sept. 5-7.

Reza, who moved to his natural position of midfield this year after playing in the back most of last season, scored his first collegiate goal just 6:34 into the opener against Michigan on Sept. 5. The Denver, Colo., later chipped in with an assist on a Daniel Steres goal in the 87th minute which effectively put the game into overtime. In the Michigan match, Reza set career highs in points (3), goals (1), shots (5) and shots on goal (4). Against Albany on Sept. 7, Reza added other tally in the 59th minute. He added two shots in 66 minutes. For his efforts, Reza was named to the all-tournament team.

Last Sunday, Reza exploded for seven points on three goals and an assist in the team's 4-0 win over Cal State Bakersfield.

For the season, Reza is ranked among the league leaders in points per game (T-2nd, 1.18), goals per game (T-2nd, 0.47), shots per game (9th, 2.12) and assists per game T-10th (0.24). Reza's 20 points (eight goals, four assists) are the most by an Aztec since Aaron Susi recorded 21 points (seven goals, seven assists) in the 1996 campaign. In addition, Reza is the only Aztec to start all 16 games this season.

Bring 'em On

Year after year the Aztecs play one of the toughest schedules on the West Coast and this year is certainly no exception.

In fact, the 2008 schedule may be the toughest of Kirshner's nine-year tenure as eight of the 18 games (44.4 percent) are against teams who made the 2007 NCAA tournament. In addition, nine of the contests (50 percent) are versus teams who finished the season with a 37 RPI rating or better.

"It is one of the best, if not the best, schedules we have had in San Diego State history in terms of quality, the diversity of teams we are playing and the breadth of the location of where we are playing," Kirshner said. "We would not do this if we didn't think our team was prepared for it."

Of SDSU's 13 opponents thus far this season, seven are currently nationally-ranked and another has been ranked this season. In fact, five of its losses, two ties and a victory have come against teams in the top 43 of the latest edition of the RPI (released Nov. 10). The road doesn't get any easier as the Aztecs still have to meet UCLA to end their season, a team who has already clinched the Pac-10 title.

An Offensive Machine

Head coach Lev Kirshner said before the season that he thought this would be the most athletic and versatile team he has been a part of in his 12 seasons (ninth as head coach) at San Diego State. It looks like he may have been right.

The Aztecs have put up 28 goals in 17 games and are scoring 1.65 goals per contest. After scoring twice in a tough, 3-2 overtime loss to Michigan in the opener on Sept. 5, in which SDSU outshot the visitors, 15-10, it tacked on six more goals in a 6-0 rout on Sept. 7 against Albany. The following weekend in Denver, San Diego State had three goals in two matches, including two in a shutout against Air Force. Four weeks ago, the team managed just one goal in two games, despite outshooting the opposition, 32-19. After getting shut out at Dartmouth on Sept. 28,

SDSU rebounded with three goals in the team's 3-3 tie at UCLA on Oct. 5. The next two weekends, the Aztecs scored in each of their two games. After being held scoreless at Oregon State on Oct. 24, SDSU rebounded for two tallies in the team's 2-2 tie at Washington two days later. Two weeks ago, the Aztecs scored three times in a pair of wins, despite playing more than 25 percent of the two games one man short. On Sunday, the Aztecs exploded for four tallies in a 4-0 triumph over Cal State Bakersfield. Last season, the team only scored 21 goals.

The 28 tallies have come from seven different Aztecs, including a team-best eight by sophomore Raymundo Reza. Redshirt junior Matt McManus is second with five, while redshirt junior Jamel Wallace, junior Evan Toft, sophomore Khadim Diouf, freshmen Joe Corona and Daniel Steres each have three tallies apiece. Overall, 14 different players have contributed at least one point on the season for San Diego State.

In the Pac-10 rankings, the Aztecs lead the league with 15.24 shots per game. They are also second in goals per game (1.65), and third in points (4.94) and assists per game (1.65).

What Could Have Been

Although head coach Lev Kirshner and the 2008 Aztec men's soccer team refuses to use excuses to explain their disappointing season, it's hard not to look at what could have been. Consider the following:

- SDSU's opponents have combined for a .551 winning percentage (144-112-57) this season, by far the highest of any of the six Pac-10 schools. Stanford has played the next toughest scheduled at .540, followed by UCLA (.531), Oregon State (.500) and California (.494).

- San Diego State has played against teams from five other conferences besides the Pac-10. Of the five, two have the best record in their conference (Denver - MPSF and UC Irvine - Big West), two are currently in second place (Michigan - Big Ten and Albany - America East) and one is in third (Dartmouth - Ivy). The Aztecs also played UC Davis, which, although is currently fourth in the Big West, is ranked 15th in the nation by adidas/NCAA.

- The injury bug as also hit SDSU hard this season. Of the 10 returning starters from last year, only one (Raymundo Reza) has started in all 17 contests this year. In fact, the Aztecs' 10 returning starters have missed a combined 39 matches this year (14 - Brad Byrns, 13 - Steve Beitashour, 7 - Myles Davis, 2 - Danny Ortiz, 1 - Khadim Diouf, Evan Toft and Jamel Wallace). The 10 have also missed 54 starts (16 - Beitashour, 14 - Byrns, 10 - Davis, 5 - Diouf, 4 - Ortiz, 2 - Toft, 1 - Cardenas, Sanchez and Wallace).

- Of the Aztecs' eight losses this season, three have been in overtime and seven have been by just one goal.

- Five times this season SDSU has yielded a goal in the opening five minutes of the match. The Aztecs have lost four of those and tied one. After the opening goal, San Diego State and the opposition have each played even with five goals apiece.

- San Diego State has had to play shorthanded in two games this season because of untimely red cards, including two short at UCLA on Oct. 5. In fact, SDSU has played almost one regulation game (86:28) of shorthanded soccer (12:02 two-men short). Excluding a penalty kick goal by UCLA right after a red card, the Aztecs have tied the opposition, 1-1, over that span. In comparison, San Diego State has played a man up only once on Sept. 7, 2008. Over that 88:88, SDSU outscored Albany, 6-0.

A Look at the Seniors

Saturday's game against UCLA will be the final home match for five Aztec seniors - Nick Collins, Myles Davis, Danny Ortiz, Jorge Rosales and Dennis Sanchez. The group has combined to go 32-25-17 (.547) over their four-year career, including a 14-12-13 (.526) mark in the Pac-10. Over the four years, SDSU advanced to two NCAA tournaments and finished runner-up in the Pac-10 in back-to-back seasons with a chance for another second-place finish this year. The group has combined to appear in 231 games with 166 starts.


Collins, a Paso Robles, Calif., native, has played in 52 career games with 12 starts to his credit. Collins, who has three career assists, is arguably having his best season in 2008. He has set season highs with 16 appearances, five starts, 11 shots and three shots on goal. A scholar-athlete and criminal justice major, Collins played his high school ball at Paso Robles. He is the son of Marsha and Reggie Collins.

Davis came to San Diego State after playing two seasons at UC Santa Barbara. Over the past two years, Davis has started 23 times of his 28 appearances, including the final 15 matches of 2007. A Delta, British Columbia, native, Davis has four shots from the back, including two on net. Davis, who spent four years as a member of Canada's U-17 national team, earning 15 caps, is a sociology major. His parents are Rosemary and Lloyd Davis.

A co-captain, Ortiz has been a regular in the back over the past three seasons. Ortiz, has played in 62 career games with 49 starts, including 49 of his past 52 chances. A 2006 honorable mention all-Pac-10 selection, Ortiz has two career assists, including the game-winning helper in SDSU's win over Cal State Bakersfield on Sunday. A Palmdale, Calif., native, Ortiz played high school for Highland. A scholar-athlete, Ortiz is the son of Ana and George Ortiz.

Rosales has made a major impact in his two seasons on The Mesa after transferring from Canada College. Over this two seasons, Rosales has started 17 times and appeared in 18 games. He has posted a 1.19 goals against average, which puts him ninth on the Aztec career chart. Rosales has 78 saves, tied for the ninth-most in school history. This year the Redwood City, Calif., native is 4-3-2 with a 0.97 goals against average and 84.0 save percentage. Rosales is tops among all Pac-10 players in save percentage and saves per game, and is second in goals against average. Jorge is the son of Anabel and Juan Rosales.

Sanchez leaves SDSU as the most experienced Aztec, having played in 71 games with 65 starts. Like Ortiz, Sanchez is a co-captain and was a 2006 honorable mention all-Pac-10 selection. Sanchez has amassed nine points on one goal, which was a game-winner, and seven assists. He has attempted 51 career shots, including 16 on net. This year, Sanchez started 16 of his 17 appearances, registering one assist with 13 shots. Sanchez, a Redmond, Wash., native who played his high school ball at Bishop Manogue, is majoring in public administration and is the son of Carrie and Dennis, Sr.
