► Head coach Steve Fisher returns five starters for just the third time in his coaching career. While at Michigan, the 1992-93 squad returned everyone from the season before, reached the NCAA championship game and finished with a 31-5 record. In 2008-09, Fisher's Aztecs had all five starters back and that group went on to win a school-record 26 games and advanced to the NIT semifinals.

► The 2010-11 campaign represents the 10th time Fisher has brought back at least four starters from the previous year. The other nine times have resulted in postseason appearances (6 NCAA, 3 NIT) and at least 21 victories each time. This is the fifth time Fisher has had at least four starters return while on Montezuma Mesa.

► When at least four starters from the previous season return, Fisher's teams have gone a combined 220-83 (.726).

► San Diego State enters the 2010-11 campaign in the midst of its most successful run in school history. The Aztecs have won 20 or more games and advanced to the postseason five straight years for the first time in school history.

► The 2010-11 Aztecs enter the upcoming campaign having played in 523 career Division I games, which includes 322 career starts. In comparison, last year's team entered the 2009-10 slate with 391 career games and 178 all-time starts under their belts and still managed to win 25 games.

► SDSU's projected starting lineup includes **Kawhi Leonard** (All-MWC first team, MWC freshman of the year, MWC tournament MVP, MWC all-tournament team, USBWA all-District IX, NABC all-district first team, Sporting News all-freshman second team), **Malcolm Thomas** (All-MWC second team, NABC all-district second team), **Billy White** (honorable mention all-MWC, three-time all-MWC pick), **D.J. Gay** (honorable mention all-MWC), and **Chase Tapley** (17 starts, 1.87 assist-to-turnover ratio). The aforementioned group combined to make 152 of the 180 possible starts (84.4 percent) last year.

Team Notes & Awards Candidates

San Diego State

- ▶ San Diego State returns all five starters and nine letterwinners off a squad which...
 - Went 25-9, won the MWC tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, its fifth consecutive postseason tournament berth.
 - Won 20+ games for the fifth straight season, reaching the 20-win plateau for the sixth time during Steve Fisher's tenure and the eighth time in SDSU's Division I history.
 - Won at least 20 games for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in school history.
 - Advanced to postseason play for the fifth consecutive season for the first time in school history.
 - Set school records for most victories in a six-year period (128) and a five-year span (117).
 - Won 11 MWC games, marking the first time in school history that an SDSU team posted a winning league record in five straight seasons.
- ▶ San Diego State returns 2010 MWC freshman of the year, MWC first-teamer and MWC tournament MVP **Kawhi Leonard**, three-time all-MWC selection **Billy White** and 2010 MWC all-conference players **D.J. Gay** and **Malcolm Thomas**.
- ▶ The Aztecs also return guard **Chase Tapley**, who played in 33 games, while making 17 starts as a freshman last year, **Brian Carlwell**, **Mehdi Cheriet**, **Tim Shelton** and **Alec Williams**. **Tapley** brings the team's top assist-to-turnover ratio (1.85) into the season and is one of the team's top three-point shooters at 37.6 percent. The Sacramento native enters the year as one of only two sophomores who finished their freshman campaign by averaging at least seven points, had an assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.50 or better and shot at least 50.0 percent from the field. **Carlwell**, meanwhile, was solid in his first season at SDSU averaging 13.1 points and 7.8 rebounds per 40 minutes, and **Cheriet** should provide an extra big body with three-point range after redshirting a year ago. **Shelton**, when healthy (knee), has proven during his three years on campus to be a positive contributor, and **Williams** played in 12 games during his freshman campaign.
- ▶ San Diego State returns eight players from last year's team (nine total with Santa Clara transfer **James Rahon**) that have started a Division I basketball game over the course of their career. Overall, SDSU will have 10 players on this season's squad with Division I experience with the addition of **Rahon**.
- ▶ **Rahon** is eligible this season after sitting out the 2009-10 campaign following his transfer from Santa Clara. The San Diego native played in 32 games, starting 17, and averaged 11.3 points, 1.7 rebounds and 1.3 assists for the Broncos as a freshman in 2008-09. Joining **Rahon** as newcomers this season are freshmen **Jamaal Franklin** (wing) and **LaBradford Franklin** (guard).
- ▶ **Leonard** and **Thomas** are the top returning rebounding duo in NCAA Division I, averaging 17.5 rebounds per game (Leonard: 9.9; Thomas: 7.6).

Kawhi Leonard

*** All-America Candidate ***

Sophomore, Forward, 6-7, 225, Riverside, Calif. (King High)

- ▶ 12.7 ppg, 9.9 rpg, 1.9 apg, 1.4 spg, 0.7 bpg, 45.5 FG Pct., 72.6 FT Pct., 31.3 mpg
- ▶ Returns as the second-leading sophomore rebounder and 22nd-leading sophomore scorer in NCAA Division I.
- ▶ Enters 2010-11 ranked in a tie for 18th place among active career double-double leaders (17) and third among active career rebounding average leaders (9.9).
- ▶ 2009-10 MWC first team, freshman of the year, all-tournament team, tournament MVP.
- ▶ Was one of four freshmen in 2009-10 to lead their team in points and rebounds, and the only one from a 2010 NCAA Tournament team.
- ▶ In NCAA Division I, ranked 13th in double-doubles (17, SDSU freshman school record) and 22nd in rebounding (9.9).
- ▶ For all games, ranked 1st in rebounding, 1st in offensive rebounding, 6th in steals, 7th in scoring, 8th in field-goal percentage, 8th in free-throw percentage and 8th in minutes played. In conference games only, ranked 1st in offensive rebounding, 2nd in rebounding, 3rd in defensive rebounding, 5th in scoring, 5th in field-goal percentage, t-7th in steals, 9th in blocked shots, 10th in free-throw percentage and 10th in minutes played.
- ▶ Is the MWC's leading returner in rebounding (9.9), offensive rebounding (3.5) and defensive rebounding (6.4).
- ▶ Returns as the team's top scorer (12.7), rebounder (9.9), steals man (47) and ranks second in blocks (24).
- ▶ Reached double figures in scoring 24 times and in rebounding 19 times, including 18 vs. CS Fullerton and 21 at UNLV in the MWC final.
- ▶ Led the team in scoring 11 times, in rebounding on 19 different occasions and in assists four times.

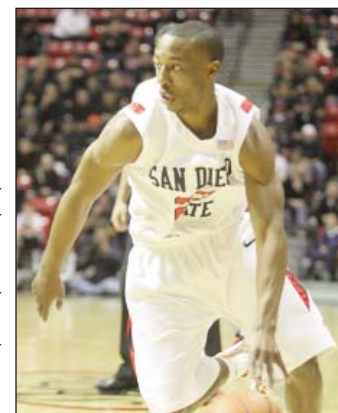

- ▶ 10.5 ppg, 2.2 rpg, 3.2 apg, 1.1 spg, 1.80 A-TO ratio, 37.0 FG Pct., 38.1 3FG Pct., 71.8 FT Pct., 34.6 mpg
- ▶ 2009-10 Mountain West Conference honorable mention pick.
- ▶ For all games, ranked 2nd in minutes played, 3rd in assist-to-turnover ratio, 8th in assists and t-10th in three-pointers made. In MWC games only, ranked 2nd in minutes played, 3rd in assist-to-turnover ratio, 5th in three-point percentage, 8th in three-pointers made, 8th in assists and 18th in scoring.
- ▶ Played and started in all 34 games, while averaging a team-best 34.6 minutes a game.
- ▶ Scored in double figures 19 times, including two 20-point outings, and led the team in scoring on 11 different occasions in 2009-10.
- ▶ Returns as the team's leader in assists (108), assists average (3.2), three-point field-goal percentage (.381) and three-point field goals (61). Is the No. 2 returner in steals (37).

- ▶ 10.9 ppg, 7.6 rpg, 2.3 apg, 1.5 bpg, 0.9 spg, 1.17 A-TO ratio, 54.3 FG Pct., 31.3 mpg
- ▶ 2009-10 Mountain West Conference second-team choice.
- ▶ For all games, ranked 2nd in blocked shots, 3rd in offensive rebounding, 3rd in field-goal percentage, 4th in rebounding, 4th in defensive rebounding, 9th in minutes played and 17th in scoring. In MWC games only, ranked 1st in field-goal percentage, 2nd in offensive rebounding, 3rd in rebounding, 3rd in blocked shots, 4th in defensive rebounding, t-10th in assists and t-13th in scoring.
- ▶ Is the MWC's second-leading returner in rebounding (7.6), defensive rebounding (5.0) and blocked shots (1.5).
- ▶ Played in all 34 games (33 starts), while averaging 31.3 minutes a game.
- ▶ Posted four double-doubles, including a 23-point, 13-rebound performance at Utah.
- ▶ Scored in double figures 17 times, including a team-best four 20-point outings in which the Aztecs went 4-0, and led the team in scoring on eight different occasions in 2009-10.
- ▶ Had seven games with 10 or more rebounds and led the team in rebounding 13 times last season. At 6-9, he also led the team in assists 10 times.
- ▶ Returns as the team's leader in blocks (52). Is the No. 2 returner in points scored (370), rebounding (7.6), assists (77) and field-goal percentage (.543).

- ▶ 11.1 ppg, 4.3 rpg, 1.4 apg, 1.0 spg, 0.8 bpg, 58.3 FG Pct., 63.2 FT Pct., 27.6 mpg
- ▶ Enters 2010-11 as the NCAA Division I leader in career field-goal percentage (active players only), shooting 61.7 percent in his three seasons at SDSU.
- ▶ 2009-10 Mountain West Conference honorable mention pick; three-time all-MWC selection.
- ▶ For all games, ranked 1st in field-goal percentage, 9th in offensive rebounding, 16th in scoring, 19th in rebounding. In conference games only, ranked 10th in blocked shots and t-10th in offensive rebounding.
- ▶ Is the MWC's returning leader in field-goal percentage (.583).
- ▶ Returns as the Aztecs' returning leader in field-goal percentage (.583). Returns as the team's No. 2 player in scoring average (11.1) and blocks (24).
- ▶ Scored in double figures 17 times, including three 20-point performances, and led the team in scoring eight times last season.
- ▶ Led the team in rebounding three times and had one 10-rebounding effort in 2009-10.

Entering 20th-Full Season • 12th Season at SDSU • Illinois St., 1967

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In 11 seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs knocking on the door of the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that the school exercised its contract option on Fisher in the fall of 2009, which keeps the coach on Montezuma Mesa until 2012-13.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher has guided San Diego State to the postseason seven times, including the last five seasons (2002 NCAA Tournament, 2003 NIT, 2006 NCAA Tournament, 2007 NIT, 2008 NIT, 2009 NIT, 2010 NCAA Tournament). In addition, the Aztecs have a solid core returning, including all five starters and eight of their top nine scorers from 2010, that will keep SDSU competitive this season and seasons ahead.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82

(.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

In 2006-07, he led SDSU to the MWC regular season and tournament crowns and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That team finished with a Division I then-school-record 24 wins. And the last four seasons, Fisher has led the Aztecs to four additional 20-win seasons and postseason appearances, including a 2010 NCAA berth after winning the MWC tournament, and he doesn't look like he is stopping anytime soon.

Brian Dutcher
Assistant Head Coach
12th Season at SDSU

One of Steve Fisher's first moves as head coach at San Diego State was to hire Brian Dutcher as his top assistant. Dutcher, 50, was a regional scout for the Sacramento Kings before assuming the role of assistant head coach at SDSU.

Dutcher served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Steve Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native headed up UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship and a Big Ten tournament title (1998).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

His efforts at SDSU have quickly gained accolades as well. The first full-year recruiting effort by Steve Fisher, Brian Dutcher and Co., resulted in a class that was a consensus top-40 group. Their second effort resulted in a top-25 recruiting class without counting a pair of high-profile transfers. Seven seasons ago, Dutcher helped attract SDSU's first McDonald's All-American. In 2004, freshmen Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter earned starting spots and earned all-league recognition. Dutcher was also instrumental in the recruitment of Ryan Amoroso, who earned all-MWC honors in 2007, and the two most recent highly touted incoming classes.

Dutcher is firmly entrenched as one of the nation's top recruiters after showing that his rapport is as strong with potential student-athletes on the West Coast as it was in the vaunted Big Ten Conference.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Bloomington (Minn.) Jefferson High School and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Minnesota head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.



Justin Hutson
Assistant Coach
5th Season at SDSU
CS Bakersfield '94

Justin Hutson enters his fifth year at San Diego State after helping the Aztecs reach the postseason for a fifth consecutive season. Hutson is instrumental in player instruction, skill development and assisting in all areas of the program.

His duties as an assistant coach include on-court coaching, opponent scouting and recruiting.

In his first four years at SDSU, Hutson helped the Aztecs to a quartet of 20-plus win seasons, three straight berths in the NIT, the last of which resulted in a semifinal appearance, and last year's NCAA Tournament invitation. It marked the fifth season in a row in which SDSU posted 20-plus victories and advanced to the postseason.

On the recruiting side, Hutson was instrumental in the signing of SDSU's nationally recognized 2007-08 incoming class, which included Kelvin Davis, D.J. Gay, Tim Shelton and Billy White, and this season's top-15 class. Last year's incoming group, which featured the California Player of the Year in Kawhi Leonard, was ranked No. 15 in the nation by The HOOP SCOOP Online and was rated as the No. 1 class among non-automatic qualifying BCS schools by The HOOP SCOOP Online and Rivals.com. Meanwhile, ESPN.com slotted the Aztec incoming class at No. 4 in its "mid-major recruiting."

When not on the recruiting trail, Hutson is busy on the practice court where he is working with the team's guards. In 2007, he helped Richie Williams rank first in the MWC in steals, second in assists and sixth in assist-to-turnover ratio. He was also instrumental in Brandon Heath ranking second in scoring, sixth in assists, third in steals and three-point field goals made per game and seventh in assist-to-turnover ratio. The last three seasons, he has tutored Gay, as he played in all 103 games (83 starts), and helped Williams become the MWC's and SDSU's all-time leader in assists and steals.

The last three seasons, Hutson has taken on the role of defensive coordinator and helped the Aztecs rank first in the MWC in scoring defense the last two years. On a national level, SDSU has had one of the stingiest defenses in the country ranking 15th in scoring defense in 2008-09 and 36th in 2009-10.

Prior to arriving on campus in July 2006, Hutson served as an assistant coach at Cal Poly. He was responsible for recruiting the 2006 Big West Freshman of the Year and landing two freshmen on the Big West all-freshmen team, along with bringing two first-team all-Big West selections and the defensive player of the year to San Luis Obispo in 2006-07.

Before arriving at Cal Poly, Hutson served as the head varsity coach at Bakersfield High School where he led it to a CIF Central Section Championship and four appearances in the playoffs in four seasons. His 2004 team was ranked as high as No. 22 in the nation and fourth in California and his 2003 squad finished the season with a 25-5 record and won the section title. Prior to entering the high school ranks, he was an assistant coach at his alma mater, Cal State Bakersfield, for two seasons (1999-00).

As a collegiate player, Hutson enjoyed a storied career, winning two NCAA D-II championships at CS Bakersfield. In the 1993 championship season, the Roadrunners were undefeated with a 33-0 record and followed that up with a 27-6 record in 1994.

A native of Bakersfield, Hutson earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1994 and teaching credential in 1995 from Cal State Bakersfield.

9th Season at SDSU
Michigan '01

Mark Fisher enters his fourth season as assistant coach and ninth overall at San Diego State. The son of 12th-year San Diego State head coach Steve Fisher, Mark Fisher has taken on assistant coach duties after being the program's director of operations the five prior seasons.

Fisher's responsibilities include on-court coaching and skill development with SDSU's post players, opponent scouting, player development and recruiting. Fisher also plays a huge role in the Aztecs' offensive concepts, such as ball screening, spacing the like.

In his first two years of coaching at SDSU, Fisher helped the Aztecs to their fourth straight 20-win season and fourth consecutive appearance in the postseason.

When not on the practice court, Fisher can be found on the road in high school gyms around America recruiting.

The fourth-year assistant helped secure last season's incoming group, which featured the California Player of the Year in Kawhi Leonard, was ranked No. 15 in the nation by The HOOP SCOOP Online and was rated as the No. 1 class among non-automatic qualifying BCS schools by The HOOP SCOOP Online and Rivals.com. Meanwhile, ESPN.com slotted the Aztec incoming class at No. 4 in its "mid-major recruiting."

As the director of operations, Fisher handled many of the day-to-day operations, including scheduling, summer camps and organizing all aspects of team travel. He represented the basketball program with the athletic administration.

During his time supervising scheduling, the Aztecs have played high-profile games against Arizona, California, Providence, Iowa State, Washington and Washington State among others. In addition, he has arranged San Diego State to play in the BP Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks, Alaska, the Shamrock Invitational in Moraga, Calif., the World Vision Classic in Fresno, Calif., and the prestigious John R. Wooden Classic in Anaheim, Calif., in past seasons.

In previous years, when San Diego State had two assistant coaches, Fisher officially took on coaching responsibilities, including conducting individual workouts and off-campus recruiting.

Fisher, the oldest of Steve Fisher's two sons, graduated from Michigan in December of 2001. A member of Psi Chi, a psychology honors fraternity, he graduated with a bachelor's degree in psychology.

Around basketball a majority of his life, Mark Fisher has amassed a variety of experience in a short period of time.

From 1998-2001, Fisher worked in a variety of capacities for Lincoln High School in Ann Arbor, Mich. He served as the varsity assistant head coach, head junior varsity coach and the head freshman coach during his tenure, assisting in all areas of the program.

He served as associate head coach for an Ann Arbor AAU team in the summer of 2001. Many of the players on that squad went on to play college basketball. He has also assisted in numerous camps, including the Steve Fisher Basketball Camps - both in Ann Arbor and in San Diego.
