## NEWS AND NOTES (all notes current entering Sept. 1 games)

- San Diego State, the defending Mountain West Conference champions, opens its 94th season of football, its 49th at the Division I level and sixth under the direction of head coach Rocky Long at home on Saturday night against New Hampshire.
- San Diego State tied a school-record in 2015 by winning 11 games, earned its second conference championship in four years, advanced to its school-record sixth consecutive bowl game and defeated Cincinnati, 42-7, in the Hawai'i Bowl.
- San Diego State enters the season on a 10-game win streak. It is the second longest active streak in the nation (Alabama, 11) and the longest for the Aztecs since a 21-game winning streak from 1968-70 under legendary coach Don Coryell.
- During the 10-game winning streak, the Aztecs have outscored their opponents 358-121 (35.8-12.1), with only one game decided by less than 14 points.
- San Diego State returns 15 starters (7 offense, 7 defense and 1 special teams) from last season's squad.
- Sixteen different Aztec players received preseason accolades, with six players (C Arthur Flores, CB Damontae Kazee, LB Calvin Munson, PR/KR Rashaad Penny, RB Donnel Pumphrey, OG Nico Siragusa) on watch lists as the top player in the nation at their position.
- Last year, San Diego State was the only team in the nation to have its league's offensive player of the year (Pumphrey), defensive player of the year (Kazee) and special teams player of the year (Penny). All three players return this year and received this season's preseason honor in the same category.
- SDSU has won five consecutive home games, outscoring the opposition 165-62 (33.0-12.4), and is 14-2 in its last 16 home games.
- SDSU is 48-40-5 all-time in season openers, including a 40-16-4 mark in home contests. The Aztecs have won their last two season openers - defeating Northern Arizona, 38-7 in 2014, and San Diego, 37-3 in 2015.
- In addition to serving as the season opener, the contest against New Hampshire will also be the annual SkyShow game with a spectacular firework display following the game. This is the 13th consecutive season SDSU has hosted the event, and the Aztecs have averaged 49,807 fans for the game affiliated with the annual event.
- Since the beginning of the 2008 season, New Hampshire owns a 73-31 record (70.2 percent). The 73 victories are tied for the third most among all FCS teams during that time frame, trailing only North Dakota State (90 and Montana (78).

**PRESEASON LOVE**

- For the second consecutive season, San Diego State was picked to win the West Division of the league (Aztecs were picked to finish second in both 2013 and 2014). The Aztecs have now finished at or higher than their position in the preseason poll in each of the previous seven seasons.
- San Diego State joined America Conference member Houston as the only teams in the country to claim every first place poll in a league's official preseason poll.
- In addition to receiving every first-place vote in the official Mountain West Conference preseason media poll, the Aztecs also received all three player of the year honors (offensive: Donnel Pumphrey, defensive: Damonte Kazee and special teams: Rashaad Penny).
- San Diego State placed a league-high six players on the 26-member preseason all-Mountain West Conference team.

**PROGRAM NOTES**

- SDSU is one of 25 schools to play in a bowl game each of the last six seasons, which is the longest streak in the Mountain West. San Diego State and Boise State are the only two current Mountain West schools to reach a bowl game in 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015.
- San Diego State has advanced to a school-record six consecutive bowl games, and is one of only 25 schools nationally and one of just three from a "Group of 5" conference (also Boise State and Northern Illinois).
- San Diego State has advanced to six consecutive bowl games. The Aztecs join Stanford as the only football teams in California - FBS or NFL - to advance to the postseason in each of the past six seasons.
- With bowl game appearances in a school-record six straight seasons, the Aztecs have equaled their total number of bowls played in the 44 prior seasons (1966 through 2009).
- Aztec head coach Rocky Long is in his sixth season as head coach and seventh year on The Mesa. The Mountain West's all-time winningest coach, Long has guided SDSU to 43 victories.
- Between 2000-09, SDSU was 38-80 (.322) and owned the nation's 106th-best winning percentage. Since 2010, San Diego State is 52-27 (.658) and owns the nation's 24th-best winning percentage.
- Since the start of the 2010 season, San Diego State's 52-27 record is exactly the same as Auburn and USC.
- With 52 wins in their last 79 games (52-27 since the beginning of the 2010 campaign), the Aztecs have equaled their win total from the previous 145 games (52-93).
- The 52 wins the last six seasons (nine in 2010, eight in 2011, nine in 2012, eight in 2013, seven in 2014 and 11 in 2015) are the most in a six-year period at San Diego State since 1972-77 (55 wins).

**UNANIMOUS**

San Diego State and Houston were the only schools in the country to receive every first-place vote in its official conference preseason poll. **OPENERS**

- San Diego State owns a 48-40-5 all-time record in season-opening games, including a 23-23-1 mark during the Division I era. The Aztecs are 7-10 in opening games since joining the Mountain West in 1999.
- That record improves when the season openers occur at home. SDSU is 40-16-4 all-time, 20-7-1 in the Division I era and 7-6 in the Mountain West era when the lidlifter occurs at home. The Aztecs have won four of their last five season-openers played at Qualcomm Stadium.
- Rocky Long owns a 7-9 record in season-opening games, including a 3-2 mark at San Diego State. The winningest coach in Mountain est history is 7-4 when the inaugural game of the season is at home.

**BULLET NOTES - OFFENSE**

- San Diego State returns seven starters on the offensive side of the ball - senior tight end Daniel Brunskill, junior wide receiver Chase Favreau, senior center Arthur Flores, junior wide receiver Mikah Holder, senior left tackle Kwayde Miller, senior running back Donnel Pumphrey and senior left guard Nico Siragusa - from the 2015 season.
- Jeff Horton, enters his sixth season at San Diego State is in his second season as SDSU's offensive coordinator. (served the previous four seasons as an assistant head coach and running backs coach). Among his other experience, he served as the head coach at Nevada and UNLV and interim head coach at Minnesota.
- Donnel Pumphrey was named the Mountain West Conference offensive player of the year last season and is the media's preseason pick to repeat this year. A Heisman Trophy candidate, Pumphrey is on the preseason watch lists for the Walter Camp Award (top college player), Maxwell Award (top college player) and Doak Walker (top running back).
- Pumphrey enters the 2016 campaign as the nation's active leader in rushing yards (4,272), all-purpose yards (5,145), 100-yard rushing games (22) and since the beginning of the 2,013 season, is the only player in the nation with 4,000 rushing yards and 800 receiving yards.
- Last season, Pumphrey was named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Year and a first-team all-league pick by the league's coaches and media. He's the first Aztec to be named a league offensive player of the year since George Jones in 1995 as a member of the Pacific Division of the WAC and the fourth offensive honoree in program history
- Pumphrey was also awarded the team's John Simcox Memorial Trophy as the 2015 team MVP for the second straight year, joining Kirk Morrison (2003-04), Marshall Faulk (1992-93), Todd Santos (1986-87) and Gary Garrison (1964-65) as the only repeat winners in program history.
- In addition to Pumphrey, LG Nico Siragusa also earned preseason all-conference honors in the official media poll.
- Senior LG Nico Siragusa, an Outland Trophy nominee, has 28 career starts, including 27 consecutive starts at left guard.
- San Diego State has averaged 31.5 points (598 total points) in its last 19 games (final five games in 2014 and 14 games in ). Last season, the Aztecs scored 450 points in 14 games (32.1 ppg), which ranked 46th nationally.
- The Aztecs have scored 30 or more points in seven of their last eight games (309 points total, 38.6 ppg).
- Since the beginning of 2014, SDSU is 16-2 when committing one turnover or less and 2-7 when having two or more turnovers in the game. The Aztecs had one turnover or less in six straight games and 11 of the 14 games last season.
- The Aztecs have scored a touchdown in the first quarter of 21 of their last 23 contests.
- San Diego State has enjoyed a time of possession advantage in 10 consecutive games and is 13-1 the last 14 times the Aztecs have had an advantage in this category (at California is the lone loss).
- SDSU is 42-11 in the Rocky Long era when scoring just 20 or more points.

**RUSHING OFFENSE**

- Last season, San Diego State broke the school record for rushing yards in a season (3,266) and broke the Division I era record for rushing touchdowns in a season (32).
- RB Donnel Pumphrey, who rushed for 1,653 yards and 17 touchdowns as a junior, returns for his senior campaign. In his career, the Las Vegas native has 4,272 rushing yards, 48 rushing touchdowns, 22 100-yard rushing games and 5,145 all-purpose yards. All of those figures lead all active FBS players.
- Pumphrey has been particularly effective at home, where he has rushed for 2,181 yards and 21 touchdowns. In his last 14 home games, the senior has 1,959 rushing yards (139.9 yards per game) and 20 touchdowns.
- In his last 10 games (regardless of location), Pumphrey has 1,348 rushing yards, 14 rushing TDs and is averaging 6.04 yards per carry. He has at least 90 yards rushing in all 10 of those games.
- SDSU is 21-7 over Pumphrey's career when he scores at least one rushing touchdown and 18-4 when he reaches 100 rushing yards.
- Pumphrey has 22 career 100-yard rushing games, which ranks second all-time at San Diego State and in Mountain West history, in just 40 career games.
- Pumphrey has 12 career games with multiple rushing touchdowns and 14 overall with multiple scores.
- Pumphrey also is second all-time at SDSU in overall touchdowns (50), rushing touchdowns (45) and all-purpose yards (5,145).
- San Diego State has rushed for at least 200 yards in each of the last 10 games for the first time in the Division I era. The Aztecs have won 23 consecutive games when reaching 200 rushing yards and are 31-2 in the Rocky Long head coaching era when reaching that plateau.
- In 2015, SDSU rushed for 336 yards in the victory over Utah State and 320 yards in the victory against Nevada. San Diego State is 20-0 in the Division I era when rushing for at least 304 yards in a game.
- Against Wyoming, Fresno State and Nevada last season, San Diego State had multiple 100-yard rushers (Donnel Pumphrey and Chase Price) for the 19th, 20th and 21st times in program history and is now 20-1 when it has two 100-yard rushers.
- SDSU has a rushing touchdown in 12 consecutive games (31 total) and in 21 of the last 22 games. The only game with no rushing touchdowns during that stretch was the contest at California (Sept. 12, 2015).
- San Diego State is 25-3 the last 28 times it has rushed for at least two touchdowns in a game.
- The Aztecs are 15-1 in the last 16 times they have had more rushing yards than their opponent.

**PASSING OFFENSE**

- Redshirt freshman Christian Chapman is the starter at quarterback. He started the conference championship game against Air Force and the Hawai'i Bowl contest against Cincinnati - both SDSU wins.
- In the two-plus games that Chapman played as a starter in 2015 (also includes in relief against Nevada) he completed 23-of-34 passes (67.6 percent) for 360 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions (176.0 passer rating). Among all players nationally with at least 30 pass attempts since that time, Chapman ranks fourth nationally in passing efficiency.
- Chapman's 209.66 pass efficiency rating vs. Air Force last season was the second-best mark in SDSU history among quarterbacks making their debut (Kevin McKechnie, 291.8 on Sept. 5, 1997 and Kevin Sneed, 184.1 on Sept. 21, 1974).
- Since Sept. 13, San Diego State is the only team in the nation to not have thrown an interception (Navy is second with two interceptions). By comparison, Maryland has thrown a FBS-high 25 picks during that span.
- The Aztecs have gone 12 straight games without an interception for the first time in the Division I era (since 1969). Prior to this stretch the Aztecs had never gone five straight games without throwing an interception.
- SDSU is 21-2 the last 23 games in which it has not had an interception.
- San Diego State has completed better than 70 percent of its passes in five of its last nine games.
- Wide receiver Mikah Holder has a reception in eight consecutive games and caught four touchdown passes during the streak. For his career, he has 29 receptions for 492 yards and six touchdowns.

- Rocky Long is serving as the team's defensive coordinator for the eighth straight season (includes all six as head coach).
- San Diego State returns seven starters off last season's squad which was one of the top units nationally. Returning in 2016 are senior DE Alex Barrett, junior LB Ryan Dunn, WAR junior Kameron Kelly, senior CB Damontae Kazee, AZT Na'im McGee, senior LB Calvin Munson and senior WAR Malik Smith.

- Kazee, who was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year by the league's head coaches and media, is the preseason player of the year in the conference. Last season, he became the first SDSU player to be named the MW Defensive Player of the Year since Kirk Morrison won it in back-to-back seasons in 2003-04. Kazee and Morrison are now the only defensive players of the year in a league in school history.
- Last season, San Diego State ranked among the top 10 nationally in nine major defensive categories: 2nd in turnovers gained (34), 2nd in passes intercepted (23), 5th in total defense (287.3), 7th in scoring defense (16.4), 7th in rushing defense (108.7), 8th in defensive touchdowns scored (4), 9th in third down percentage defense (28.9 pct.), 10th in passing yards allowed (142.0) and 10th in passing efficiency defense (108.71).
- SDSU has held 16 consecutive conference opponents to less than 400 yards of total offense. That is the longest active streak in the nation.
- SDSU held four opponents in 2015 to less than 200 yards of total offense (San Diego 188, Fresno State 89, San José State 148 and Wyoming 191).
- Since Oct. 3, 2014 (includes 23 SDSU games), San Diego State ranks second nationally in points allowed per game (17.6). Alabama is first at 17.2.
- Since Oct. 3, 2014 (includes 23 SDSU games), San Diego State ranks fourth nationally in yards allowed per game (296.1). The three teams in front of San Diego State are Clemson, Wisconsin and Boston College.
- Since the beginning of 2009, when Long took over as defensive coordinator, the Aztecs rank 20th nationally in yards per touch (6.3) and 21st nationally in yards per rush allowed (3.7). Both numbers are league bests for programs that have been in the Mountain West the last eight seasons.
- Nine Aztecs on defense were named to the all-Mountain West team last year, including CB Damontae Kazee (MW Defensive Player of the Year), DL Alex Barrett and LB Calvin Munson on the first team, LB Jake Fely and CB J.J. Whittaker on the second team, and DT Christian Heyward, DE Jon Sanchez and WAR Malik Smith as honorable-mention picks.
- Two Aztecs are on watch lists for the nation's top player at their position, including Kazee (Bednarik Watch List and Thorpe Watch List) and Munson (Nagurski Watch List, Bednarik Watch List, Butkus Watch List and Lott IMPACT Watch List).
- In 2015, SDSU held four opponents to single-digits in points in the same season for the first time since 2003.
- Alex Barrett's 62 tackles last season were the most among the Aztecs defensive linemen (next highest was 38).
- Barrett ranks eighth in the MW in tackles for loss per game (1.00) and fourth among defensive linemen in tackles per game (4.54)
- Calvin Munson had the second-most tackles (98) in the Rocky Long defensive coordinator era, trailing only Nat Berhe (99 in 2013).
- Munson had three sacks at San José State, the most by an Aztec since Heath Farwell had three vs. Nevada on Sept. 25, 2004 and tied for the 13th most in a game in FBS this year (as of Nov. 29).
- Munson's four tackles for a loss at SJSU were the most by an Aztec since Miles Burriss had four against Colorado State on Nov. 6, 2010 and tied for the 23rd most in an FBS game this year (as of Nov. 29).
- In the four Mountain West games that Randy Ricks has played, he has 4.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, three pass breakups and two forced fumbles.
- SDSU is 14-0 when holding its opponent to 166 or less yards of total offense, something it did at San José State, and 35-3 when holding their foe to 195 or less yards in the Division I era.
- The Aztecs limited Fresno State to just 89 yards of total offense, its fewest in a game since at least 1996.
- In that game, SDSU held an opponent to 100 yards or less of total offense for the first time since it limited North Texas State to 59 yards for the contest on Sept. 19, 1970.
- SDSU limited the Bulldogs to 77 yards passing, their fourth fewest since 1996.
- San Diego State limited Fresno State to 12 yards rushing, the Bulldogs' fifth fewest since 1996.
- San Diego State did not allow a third-down conversion vs. Fresno State, which was 0-for-12 on third downs, marking the first time the Bulldogs have gone 0-for-the game on third down since at least 1996. It was also just the second time since 1996 that SDSU held an opponent to zero third-down conversions (vs. San José State on Sept. 24, 2005 (0-for-17)).
- In the early 2015 campaign, the Aztecs held their opponents without a first down conversion in 20 consecutive third down attempts.
- The Aztecs held San José State to just 148 yards of total offense, its fewest in a game since putting up 121 at USC on Sept. 5, 2009, tied for SJSU's fifth-fewest in a game since 1996 and tied for its second fewest in a home game since 1996.
- San Diego State held SJSU to just 113 passing yards, the Spartans' third fewest in a home game since 1996.
- SDSU has held its opponent to seven or less points in the first half in six of the last 10 games.
- San Diego State held 10 consecutive opponents to less than 400 yards of total offense, which was tied for the second-longest active streak in the country behind Penn State. That streak was broken earlier this season at California (485 yards).
- For much of the game at California, San Diego State's defense performed well. The Aztecs allowed 271 yards in just seven plays. In

the other 54 snaps, California gained 214 total yards (3.96 ypp).

- After a subpar first half, the San Diego State defense excelled after intermission at Penn State. The Nittany Lions amassed 103 yards, four first downs and just three offensive points in the final 30 minutes of the contest. The Aztecs held Penn State to 1-for-7 on third downs in the second half and forced four three-and-outs.

**RUSHING DEFENSE**

- Last season, SDSU finished seventh in FBS play in rushing yards allowed per game (108.7) and fifth in yards per rush (3.2).
- During the last 11 games, opponents have rushed 361 times for 1,038 yards and 2.88 yards per carry. Since Sept. 26, 2015, San Diego State ranks fourth nationally in rushing yards allowed per game (94.4) and in yards per carry (2.9).
- Eight of San Diego State's last 11 opponents in 2015 failed to rush for more than 80 yards.
- Since Rocky Long began his tenure as the team's defensive coordinator (prior to the 2009 campaign), San Diego State is 13-4 when holding the opposition to less than 75 yards rushing and 16-4 when the opposition averages less than 2.50 yards per carry.
- Prior to the Utah State game, the Aztecs had held four consecutive opponents to less than 100 yards rushing (72 at Penn State, 12 vs. Fresno State, 53 at Hawai'i and 35 yards at San José State).
- Against SJU last year, the Aztecs limited the Spartans to 35 yards rushing on 35 carries.
- Against Fresno State, San Diego State held an opponent to 50 yards or less rushing for the first time since it limited Fresno State to 43 yards back on Oct. 26, 2013.
- SDSU held Nevada to 35 yards rushing, its fewest since rushing for seven yards at Louisiana Tech in on Sept. 6, 2004 and seventh fewest in game since 1996.
- For the game at Penn State, PSU rushed for 72 yards on 34 carries and no touchdowns. That equates to 2.12 yards per rush. It marked just the 29th time in the last 20 seasons that an unranked team held Penn State to less than a 100 yards rushing.
- [Calvin Munson](#) led SDSU with 68 tackles on rushing plays.

**PASSING DEFENSE**

- Under head coach Rocky Long, San Diego State is 26-5 in games in which the opponent has a passing efficiency rating of 116.50 or less.
- San Diego State ranked in a tie for third in the nation with three interception returns for touchdowns last season.
- Since 2010, the Aztecs are 36-7 when holding the opponent to 200 or fewer passing yards.
- Prior to the Colorado State game last year, San Diego State had held four consecutive opponents to a passer rating of less than 92.0. That is the first time an SDSU squad has done that since the 2003 season.
- In 10 of the last 16 games, SDSU has held its opponent to a passer rating of less than 100.
- [Damontae Kazee](#) has 20 PBUs over his past 24 games after recording just two over the first 15 games of his career.
- Among active career players in FBS, Kazee is ranked in a tie for 12th in interceptions (10) and 28th in forced fumbles (6). Kazee is also tied for sixth all-time at SDSU in career forced fumbles (6) and ninth in interceptions (10).
- [Kazee](#) had eight interceptions in 2015, which tied for the second most in the nation (0.54 per game), the most in Aztecs' Division I era (since 1969) and in Mountain West history.
- [Kazee](#) had three interceptions in the opener vs. San Diego, the most by an Aztec since Ed Ricketts had three on Oct. 13, 1951 vs. the Marines and are ranked in a tie for the second most in a game in program history. Only Dick Adair's four-interception game bettered Kazee's output and that came on Oct. 15, 1949 vs. New Mexico State. The three picks also matched the most in FBS play since Middle Tennessee's Damon Nickson had four against Louisiana-Lafayette on Oct. 28, 2006.
- [Kazee](#) is now one of 30 players since 2011 with three interceptions in the same game.
- [Kyle Kelley](#) had a team-high eight quarterback hurries, despite only starting twice last year.
- [Calvin Munson](#) has three interceptions returned for a touchdown during his career, which are tied with Ricky Parker (1993-96) for the most in program history and tied for the third most in FBS history among linebackers.
- [Munson](#) is also fifth all-time at SDSU with 232 interception yards.
- [Munson](#) is tied for the most interceptions returned for a touchdown in Aztec single-season history (Leon McFadden - 2012, Tory Nixon - 1984) after returning two last season.
- [Munson's](#) two interceptions returned for a touchdown - 19 and 67 yards - vs. San Diego tied an NCAA single-game record for a line-

- backer, tied for the second most in a game among all players in NCAA history and were the most in a game in San Diego State history. Since 1996, only 24 other players in FBS play have returned two interceptions for a touchdown in a game (as of Dec. 13).
- **Munson** became the seventh linebacker in FBS history with two interceptions returned for a touchdown in the same game.
- **Munson** ranks second in the MW in sacks per game (0.69 (T-32nd in FBS)) and fifth in the league in tackle for loss per game (1.12).
- **Munson** had three sacks against SJSU, the most by an Aztec since Heath Farwell had three vs. Nevada on Sept. 25, 2004 and tied for the 13th most in a game in FBS this year (as of Dec. 10).
- **Munson's** four tackles for a loss were the most by an Aztec since Miles Burris had four against Colorado State on Nov. 6, 2010 and tied for the 24th most in an FBS game last year.
- **Malik Smith** led the team in tackles on passing plays (38).
- **Smith** had an interception in three straight games last year from Oct. 23-Nov. 14, which was tied for the third-longest streak in FBS all season, and had five picks over the final seven games.
- **Smith** was a part of a forced turnover in six of the last seven games in 2015 (five interceptions and a fumble recovery).
- In the 2015 opener, San Diego State defended the long pass well as USD was 0-for-6 with three interceptions in passes thrown 14 or more yards past the line of scrimmage. Ten of the Toreros' 13 completions were within six yards of the line of scrimmage.

**BULLET NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS**

- ESPN Team Efficiencies ranked San Diego State's special teams unit as the 23rd best in the country last year.
- Associate head coach and special teams coordinator Bobby Hauck is in his second season with the Aztecs after serving as the head coach at UNLV (2010-14) and Montana (2003-09). This is the 23rd time in the last 24 seasons that he has served as the special teams coordinator.
- Two Aztecs were represented as special teams all-conference selections, led by returning KR **Rashaad Penny** as the MW Special Teams Player of the Year and a first-team selection.
- KR **Rashaad Penny** tied for second nationally with two kickoff returns for touchdowns last season. Penny, who took a kickoff against San Diego, Penn State and Cincinnati, to the house, became just the second player in school history to have multiple KOR for touchdowns in a season (Colin Lockett returned two for TDs in 2012). He was second in the nation in kick return average (33.5) and San Diego State was second in the nation as a team (29.1).
- **Tanner Blain** had a long punt of 63 yards last year, which is the longest by an Aztec since Brian Stahovich's 89-yarder at Missouri on Sept. 18, 2010.
- Among active career kick returners in FBS, **Rashaad Penny** is ranked first in kick return average (29.6 (min. 24 returns)).
- **Penny** was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Year by the league's head coaches and media (and a first-team all-league pick as a kick returner) last season, the first Aztec to be named a league special teams player of the year in program history.
- **Billy Vaughn, Jr.** has SDSU's most special teams tackles (21) and kickoff tackles (21) over the last two seasons in just 21 games.
- **Vaughn, Jr.**, led SDSU in kick return tackles (9) last year.
- **Parker Baldwin** ranked second on the team in special teams tackles last year (10) and tied for second in punt return tackles (3).



**ROCKY LONG**

- Rocky Long is in his sixth season as San Diego State's head coach, his eighth with the Aztecs and his 17th season as a head coach.
- Long, a three-time Mountain West Coach of the Year, is the all-time winningest coach in league history. He owns 104 career Mountain West wins, 26 more than former Boise State coach Chris Peterson in second place. Amazingly, Long's 104 career wins are 37 more than the next active coach, Air Force's Troy Calhoun (67).
- Long has guided San Diego State to six bowl games in his first six seasons. His six bowl appearances while leading SDSU is two more than Don Coryell for the most in school history.
- Long is one of 13 coaches in the country to guide his current team to a bowl game in each of his first five seasons.
- Long won his 100th career game last season at Hawai'i.
- With 43 victories at San Diego State, Long already ranks fifth on the school's all-time victory list and has more victories as the Aztecs' three previous head coaches, combined (Tom Craft 19, Chuck Long 9 and Brady Hoke 13).

The Aztecs enter the 2016 campaign as the Mountain West favorites to repeat as West Division champions. SDSU received all 29 first-place votes in the league media poll, which was announced in early August at the conference's media days at The Cosmopolitan of Las Vegas.

SDSU is coming off an 11-3 season where it tied a school record for the most wins in a single year, finished with a 10-game winning streak (second-longest active FBS streak heading into 2016), won the MW title (20th conference title in program history) and beat Cincinnati, 42-7, in the Hawai'i Bowl.

**SDSU PICKED TO WIN MW WEST; SWEEPS PRESEASON AWARDS**

The San Diego State football team swept the preseason awards and captured all 29 first-place votes en route to being picked to win the West Division of the Mountain West in the 2016 preseason poll, the league announced July 26 in Las Vegas. The Aztecs became just the second unanimous preseason pick in MW history (TCU in 2010).

SDSU was the only team in FBS receive all of the possible first-place votes in a divisional or league poll.

The preseason poll and all-conference team are voted on by media representatives who cover the conference.

Senior Donnel Pumphrey (Las Vegas) was named the preseason offensive player of the year, while senior Damontae Kazee (San Bernardino, Calif.) was chosen as the defensive player of the year and junior Rashaad Penny (Norwalk, Calif.) as the special teams player of the year. The three players captured all three postseason awards in 2015.

Last year, Pumphrey rushed for 1,653 yards and 17 touchdowns on 309 attempts (5.3 avg.), while leading the team with 28 catches for 416 yards and three touchdowns en route to being named a Sports Illustrated Honorable-Mention All-American, the MW Offensive Player of the Year and an all-MW first-team selection for a second straight season. He was one of just four players in all of FBS to lead his team in rushing yards and receptions.

A cornerback, Kazee had eight interceptions in 2015, which tied for the second most in the nation, the most in Aztecs' Division I era (since 1969) and in Mountain West history. He also added 75 tackles (team-high 58 solo stops), seven pass breakups, 5.5 tackles for loss and two forced fumbles, eventually being named a second-team USA Today All-American, a honorable-mention Sports Illustrated All-American, the MW Defensive Player of the Year and a first-team all-MW pick.

Penny, meanwhile, returned 24 kicks for 804 yards (33.5 avg.) and three touchdowns last season. He was one of five players last year in FBS play to have at least three kick return touchdowns, ranking second in the nation in kick return average (33.5) and being named the MW Special Teams Player of the Year. He also added 368 rushing yards and four scores on 61 attempts (6.0 avg.) and eight catches for 120 yards (15.0 avg.) and another score.

Pumphrey, Kazee and Penny were joined on the preseason all-MW team by seniors Alex Barrett (Mesa, Ariz.), Calvin Munson (St. Charles, Mo) and Nico Siragusa (Chula Vista, Calif./Mater Dei Catholic High). The six players on the preseason all-conference team were the most in the league (Utah State was second with four picks) and SDSU's second-highest total in league history, one behind the 1999 squad's seven selections.

Barrett came up with 62 tackles a year ago with 13 tackles for loss, 5.5 sacks, two interceptions (one for a touchdown) and seven quarterback hurries. Barrett backed a defense that finished among the top 10 in FBS in each of the four main categories, including fifth in total (287.3),

SDSU is coming off an 11-3 season where it tied a school record for the most wins in a single year, finished with a 10-game winning streak (second-longest active FBS streak heading into 2016), won the MW title (20th conference title in program history) and beat Cincinnati, 42-7, in the Hawai'i Bowl.

It is the second straight year that San Diego State has been picked to win the league, although this is the fourth year of the two divisions in the MW. The Aztecs, who averaged a predicted finish of 6.5 from 2005-12, have been picked to win the West Division each of the last two years and were predicted second in both 2013 and 2014. SDSU has won two of the past four MW regular season titles (2012 and 2015).

San Diego State has ended up at or better than its predicted finish in seven straight seasons and 10 times over the past 11 years.

The Aztecs garnered 174 points, including all 20 first-place votes. Nevada was picked to finish second in the West Division with 129 points, followed by San José State (122), Fresno State (76), UNLV (73) and Hawai'i (35).

Boise State paced the Mountain Division by amassing 172 points, including 27 first-place votes. The Broncos were followed by Air Force, which won the Mountain Division a year ago, with 126 points and the other two first-place votes. Utah State (111), Colorado State (95), New Mexico (74) and Wyoming (31) rounded out the Mountain side.

San Diego State conducted its annual Fan Fest scrimmage on a warm Saturday afternoon at Qualcomm Stadium. The workout was SDSU's sixth of fall camp and the first day in pads.

"The biggest thing is that this is our very first day in pads," head coach Rocky Long said. "It's really different when you actually start tackling and all of those sorts of things because we do so much 'stay on your feet,' it doesn't relate to the real game. The only way you learn to tackle is to tackle. This is our first day in pads so most of them haven't tackled for nine months, maybe more.

"It's nice to have the fans come out," Long added. "I wish we could've done this a week from now because then all of the players would be used to this by now and the scrimmage would've looked a lot sharper, a lot quicker, a lot faster. We probably wouldn't have played as many guys in the scrimmage as we played today so you'd see more of the veteran guys play so the game would've looked better. But it's nice for the fans to come out."

The scrimmage went 44 plays and the substitutions were aplenty. Five quarterbacks took snaps under center and five running backs carried the ball. In the passing game, the ball was spread amongst nine receivers.

Christian Chapman attempted only five passes, connecting on his first three, and finished with 24 yards. Ryan Agnew, meanwhile, attempted a team-high nine passes. Chase Jasmin, in his first season with SDSU, carried the ball three times and recorded the game's lone touchdown, a series after John Baron II connected on a 42-yard field goal. Receiving wise, David Wells and Taylor Dodds each had two catches.

Defensively, 20 players recorded a stat. Dwayne Johnson led the team with four tackles (three solo) and a half tackle for loss. Trenton Thompson was second in tackles with three for the afternoon. A trio of Aztecs logged one sack apiece (Jay Henderson, Kyle Kelley, Randy Ricks), while two were credited with a half sack (Ryan Dunn, Dru Mathis).

## FSSD'S AZTEC FOOTBALL WITH ROCKY LONG TO AIR EVERY THURSDAY

The third season of Aztec Football with Rocky Long debuted on Thursday, Aug. 25 on Fox Sports San Diego. The weekly show is highlighted by player and coach features, behind the scenes footage, X's and O's with Long, previews of upcoming games, recaps of past games and much more.

The first episode featured NFL Hall of Fame inductee and Aztec alum Marshall Faulk alongside senior running back Donnel Pumphrey. The pair previews the upcoming season for SDSU and discusses their respective careers. Pumphrey currently has the second most rushing yards in school history (4,272), trailing only Faulk (4,589 from 1991-92).

Additionally, the show meets with other Aztecs to discuss their excitement about the 2016 campaign.

The Aztecs swept the preseason awards and captured all 29 first-place votes en route to being picked to win the West Division of the Mountain West in the 2016 preseason poll released last month. SDSU became just the second unanimous preseason pick in MW history (TCU in 2010) and is the only FBS team to receive all of the possible first-place votes in a divisional or league poll.

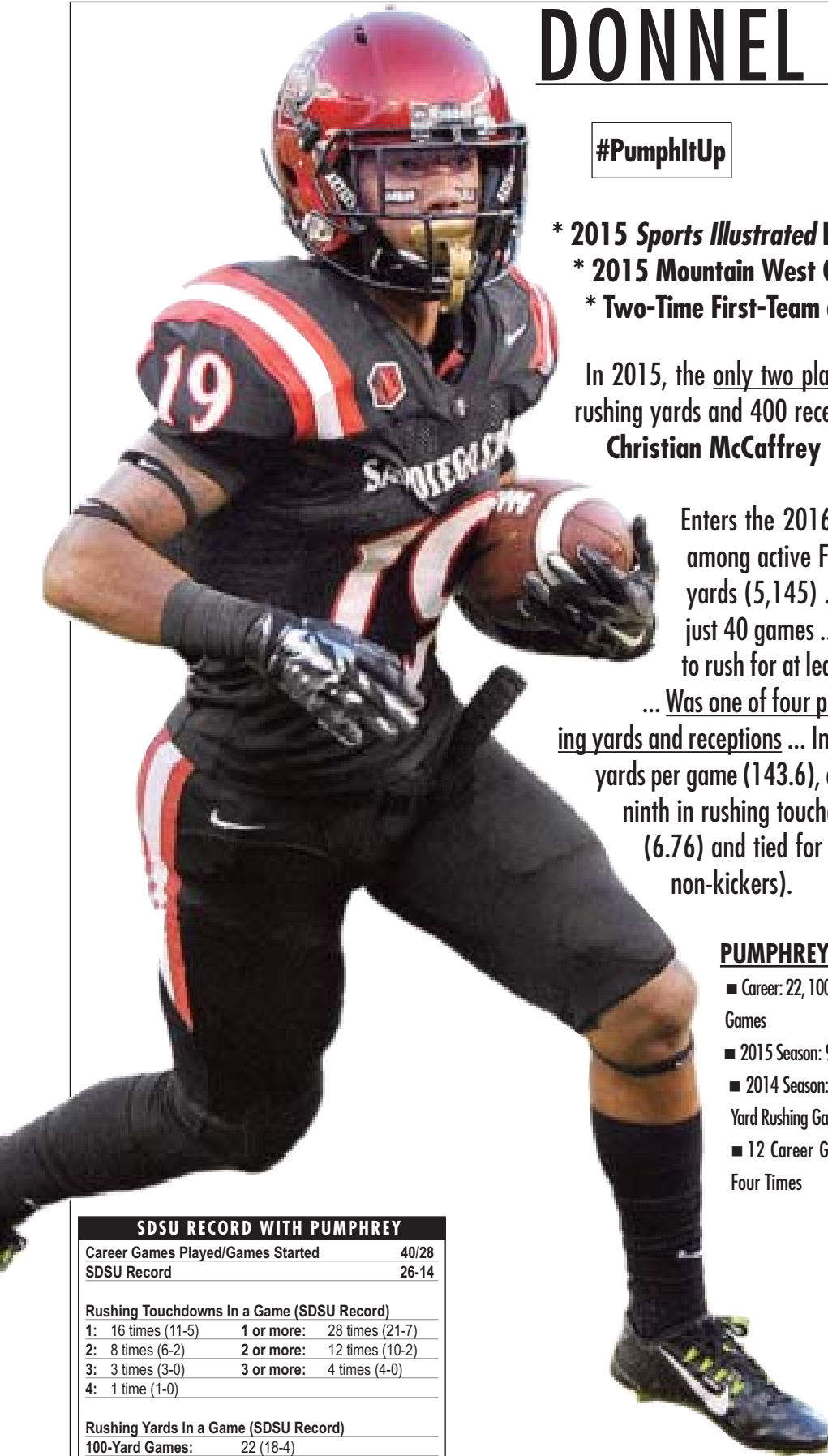

## Aztecs Rising

Over the past several seasons, San Diego State has established itself as one of the premier athletic programs in the country.

- Since 2010, SDSU has had nine different athletic programs finish in the top 25 of an NCAA Championship — men's basketball (four times), women's basketball, men's golf (five times), women's soccer, softball (three times), men's tennis, women's indoor track and field (two times), women's outdoor track and field (five times) and water polo.
- Since the beginning of the 2012-13 academic year, SDSU has claimed 32 Mountain West championships, more than any other conference member during that span.
- SDSU is one of three teams in the country to have advanced to six straight bowl games and play in an NCAA sponsored men's basketball postseason event each of the last 11 seasons (also Brigham Young and Michigan State).

## 2015-16 Update

- **Cross Country (0-0; 0-0 MW)** - The Aztecs will open the 2016 campaign at the Mark Covert Classic on Sept. 3, in Brea, Calif. SDSU plays host to the 72nd annual Aztec Invitational at Tecolote Shores on Mission Bay, Sept. 17.
- **Women's Soccer (0-1; 0-0 Mountain West)** - The Aztecs, the three-time defending Mountain West regular-season champion, are coming off a 5-0 loss to UCLA on Aug. 19 in front of 2,079 fans. SDSU began the new year as the favorite to repeat as Mountain West regular-season champions for a fifth straight year. The Aztecs play the first of four consecutive matches away from Montezuma Mesa on Monday, Aug. 29 at Long Beach State.
- **Men's Soccer (1-0-1; 0-0 Pac-12)** – At the Gonzaga Soccer Tournament last weekend, the Aztecs opened their season undefeated for the second consecutive year. SDSU kicked off the campaign with a 1-1 draw against UIC before shutting out Bradley, 1-0, behind redshirt junior Adam Allmaras' 11th career shutout and senior Michael Savers' first goal as an Aztec. San Diego State makes its 2016 home debut on Friday, Sept. 2 at 7 p.m. against Akron.
- **Volleyball (1-2; 0-0 Mountain West)** - SDSU posted a 1-2 record at the Aztec Invitational last weekend, beating Marist in straight sets, 3-0, before falling to Michigan State, 3-1, and Denver, 3-2. The Aztecs, who were picked fifth in the MW preseason poll, return six starters and the libero from a team that compiled a mark of 12-19 overall and 9-9 in Mountain West play (tie-5th).

# SAN DIEGO STATE FOOTBALL



Under the direction of sixth-year head coach Rocky Long, San Diego State has made a dramatic turnaround.

- SDSU is one of 25 schools nationally to appear in bowl games each of the last six seasons. San Diego State is one of only two California schools to appear in five consecutive bowl games (Stanford) and is one of only two current Mountain West schools to appear in bowl games in 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015 (Boise State), and one of three from the "Group of 5" conferences (Boise State and Northern Illinois).
- With bowl game appearances in a school-record six straight seasons, the Aztecs have equaled their total number of bowls played in the 44 prior seasons (1966 through 2009).
- Long's impact has been felt almost immediately, first as the defensive coordinator in 2009-10 and then as the head coach since 2011. SDSU went without a winning season for the 10 straight years from 2000-09 when it won 32.2 percent of its games and owned one of the nation's worst records. Below is a look at the dramatic turnaround.

- With 52 wins in their last 79 games (52-27 since the beginning of the 2010 campaign), the Aztecs have equaled their win total from the previous 145 games (52-93).
- The 52 victories since 2010 is the highest win-total over a five-year span since the Aztecs went 55-9-2 from 1972-77.

SDSU is one of three schools to play in six straight football bowl games and play in a NCAA sponsored men's basketball event (NCAA or NIT) each of the last 11 seasons.



SDSU is one of two California football teams - FBS or NFL - to reach the postseason in each of the last six seasons. SDSU is tied with USC for the second-best football record in California, trailing only Stanford, since the start of the 2010 campaign.

**DID YOU KNOW?**

- Was one of four NCAA players who visited U.S. servicemen in Vietnam in the summer of 1971, spending two weeks visiting different U.S. bases
- Bobby Knight paid Long a home visit and recruited the two-sport athlete to play basketball at Army
- Left New Mexico as the all-time leading rusher (2,071 yards) and threw just 23 interceptions in 30 career games

**COACHING HIGHLIGHTS**

- Has the most all-time victories in the Mountain West with 99.
- Was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year in 2002 and again in 2012.
- In his 16th season as a head coaching experience and has spent 18-plus seasons as a defensive coordinator.

**AT SAN DIEGO STATE**

- Became San Diego State's 18th head football coach on Jan. 12, 2011.
- Was the defensive coordinator at SDSU from 2009-10.
- In 2012, led the Aztecs to a share of the Mountain West title at 7-1. It was San Diego State's 19th conference title, first Mountain West championship and first league title since 1998. The Aztecs were picked fifth in the preseason poll.

**COACHING PRIOR TO SAN DIEGO STATE**

- Compiled a school-record 65 victories and led the Lobos to five bowl game appearances in his final seven seasons. His teams were bowl eligible in seven of his last eight campaigns.
- In his final nine seasons in Albuquerque, Long's defensive units ranked among the top 30 in fewest yards allowed six times and among the top 40 against the rush every year. In both 2001 and 2003, New Mexico's defense ranked fifth nationally in fewest rushing yards allowed per game.
- While at New Mexico, he coached 13 players selected in the NFL Draft, 10 players who earned All-America honors and had a MWC-high 34 first-team all-conference selections since 2003.
- Prior to accepting the head coaching position at New Mexico, Long served as defensive coordinator for 12 seasons at three different schools. He was the defensive coordinator for two years under Bob Toledo at UCLA in 1996-97, for five seasons at Oregon State from 1991-95, and for five campaigns at Wyoming from 1981-85.
- Also served as an assistant coach at TCU, with the CFL's British Columbia team and started his career at New Mexico as a graduate assistant coach in 1972.

**PLAYING EXPERIENCE:**

- Originally a defensive back, Long became a three-year starter at quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71. He earned team most valuable player honors and was the Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year as a senior.
- Long played professionally in the CFL with British Columbia in 1972-73 and 1975-76. He also competed in the World Football League with the Detroit Wheels in 1974.
- Attended Alta Loma High School in Alta Loma, Calif.

**PERSONAL:**

- Both of Long's daughters are head coaches at the university level. Roxanne was hired in July of 2012 as the head women's basketball coach at Rogers State University (NAIA) in Claremore, Okla., after four years in the same position at Texas Lutheran (NCAA Division III). Hannah, meanwhile, is the head volleyball coach at Southwestern University, an NCAA Division III school in Georgetown, Texas. She is a four-time conference coach of the year, having compiled a 306-79 (.795) record in 10 years, including a pair of regional finals appearances in 2008 and 2009.

- **2015 (Junior):** Was the team's starting punter in all 14 games ... Punted 77 times for 3,102 yards, averaging 40.3 yards per boot ... Twenty-five of his 77 punts landed inside the 20-yard line, including nine inside the 10 and two inside the 5 ... Twenty-four of his 77 punts were fair caught ... Had eight 50-plus-yard boots ... Just 19 of his 77 punts were returned for 95 yards (5.0 avg.) ... Had a long punt of 63 yards, which was the longest by an Aztec since Brian Stahovich's 89-yarder at Missouri on Sept. 18, 2010 ... Posted a 42.0 net average as the one punt that was returned was muffed for a 3-yard loss, where long snapper Jeff Overbaugh pounced

on it for the recovery ... SDSU later scored on the drive ... Had a long of 44 yards ... The three picks also matched the most in FBS play since Middle Tennessee's Damon Nickson had four against Louisiana-Lafayette on Oct. 28, 2006 ... Kazee became the 25th FBS player this decade (since 2011) with three interceptions in the same game (as of the end of the season, there were 30) ... Came up with seven tackles (five solo) and a PBU at California ... Had a career-high and game-high-tying 11 tackles, including 10 solo, against South Alabama ... Also recorded two pass breakups and his fifth forced fumble of his career ... Had eight tackles (six solo) and 0.5 tackles for loss at Penn State ... The eight tackles tied teammate Kameron Kelly for the second most in the game ... Had four tackles (three solo) against Fresno State ... Had a tackle and his fourth interception of the season at Hawai'i ... Finished with nine tackles (seven solo), an interception and a tackle for loss at San José State ... It was his second straight game with an interception ... Had another solid outing against Utah State with four tackles (three solo) and a pass breakup ...
