San Diego State Aztecs (7-3, 0-0 MWC) vs. No. 17/16 George Washington Colonials (10-2, 0-0 Atlantic-10)

► **When & Where:** Saturday, Dec. 30, 2006, at Cox Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 4 p.m. (PST)

► **Webcast/Live Video:** Bill Earley (play-by-play) and Tammy Blackburn (analysis) will have the live audio broadcast of the SDSU game on www.goaztecs.com. A live video feed will also be available via the Aztecs' official website for all of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic contests.

► **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team (7-3) faces its toughest challenge so far this year when it takes on its first-ranked opponent in No. 17/16 George Washington (10-2) Saturday in the championship game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic. The Aztecs round out 2006 and their non-conference schedule versus the Colonials, looking for their seventh-straight victory, which would be the team's longest win streak since 1996-97.

SDSU is coming off a hard-fought 63-52 win against Brown on Thursday afternoon, while George Washington upset No. 11/10 Georgia, 66-54, in the second half of the doubleheader. The SDSU-GW game follows the Georgia-Brown contest, which kicks off a day of three college basketball games at Cox Arena, starting at 2 p.m.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the second year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 242-175 in 15 seasons, while she is 161-110 in 10 campaigns at SDSU.

► **George Washington Head Coach Joe McKeown:** McKeown is in his 18th season with the Colonials and has a school record of 396-145. His overall record is 464-165 in 21 years. McKeown, however, did not make the trip to San Diego after having knee surgery. Assistant coach Mike Bozeman is filling in for him on the sideline.

► **GW Series History:** This is the first all-time meeting between the two schools. SDSU is a perfect 3-0 against teams currently in the Atlantic 10 Conference.

Aztec Women's Hoops Vies For Tournament Title Saturday Against No. 17/16 George Washington



The San Diego State women's basketball team goes for its seventh-straight victory Saturday when the Aztecs take on the No. 17/16 George Washington University Colonials in the championship game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic at Cox Arena. SDSU will round out the 2006 calendar year and its non-conference schedule against GW, the Aztecs' first ranked opponent so far this season.

San Diego State advanced to the championship contest by defeating Brown University, 63-52, while George Washington upset No. 11/10 Georgia, 66-54, on Thursday. Brown and Georgia will square off in the consolation game Saturday, beginning at 2 p.m. PST.

Fast Facts: SDSU In Regular Season Home Tournaments

► This year marks the second straight season that SDSU has played host to a tournament. Prior to 2005-06, the last time the Aztecs had a home tournament was in November 2000, when SDSU went 1-1 at the Pacific Bell Classic.

► SDSU's last non-conference tournament away from home was during the 2003-04 campaign when the team traveled to Birmingham, Ala. for the Lady Blazer Invitational. Interestingly, Brown was one of the Aztecs' foes at that event.

► SDSU did not play host to a regular-season tournament in Beth Burns' first stint as head coach from 1989-97.

► SDSU women's hoops has played host to 17 home tournaments in its 31 years of existence... SDSU is 16-1 in the first game of a home tournament... the Aztecs have won the team title nine times, including each of the first four.

► SDSU has split each of its last four home tournaments. The team won the first game and lost the second in 1998, 1999 and 2000. Last season, the Aztecs did the opposite, falling to Loyola (Md.), before defeating UC Davis.

Last Time Out: Aztecs Advance To Tournament Championship With Win Over Brown

The San Diego State women's basketball team pulled off its sixth-straight win Thursday afternoon, defeating Brown University, 63-52, in the first game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic at Cox Arena.

SDSU had three players finish with double-figure points against Brown to even the all-time series between the two schools at one game apiece. Junior **Jennifer Layton (Sacramento, Calif.)** had a team-high 17 points with 15 of those coming in the second half. Layton was helped by junior **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)**, who tallied a season-best 14 points on 4-for-5 shooting from beyond the arc. Freshman **Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** added 11 points, six assists and six steals in 36 minutes of action. Davis was one of three Aztecs with five or more steals in the game for SDSU, which fell one short of its season high with 19.

After the Aztecs scored the first basket of the game, the Bears tallied the next two and added one more on a free-throw for a 5-2 advantage. SDSU responded with a lay up by freshman **Lauren Hoisington (Las Vegas, Nev.)** and the first of Eveland's four triples to move back into the lead 7-5. After a tie at 7-7, the Aztecs remained ahead for the rest of the first half, going into the locker room up by three at 24-21.

SDSU saw its advantage cut to as few as one point on three occasions in the second half, but used a 6-0 run starting with just over five and a half minutes left to play to build an eight-point cushion at 51-43. The Aztecs finished out the game by successfully converting a pair of three-point plays and Layton added a late jumper with 17 seconds left to give SDSU a 13-point lead, before finally securing the 63-52 win.

Other Brown University Notes

- The Aztecs matched their largest margin of victory this season with the 11-point win over Brown ... SDSU has won each of its last two games by 11 points apiece ... Prior to the two-game span, the Aztecs' previous five victories have all been by seven or fewer points.

- SDSU led by 13 points twice in the final minutes of the second half ... It is the team's largest lead this season with the previous being a 12-point advantage against UC Davis.

- The Aztecs' 39 points are the team's most in the second half of a game in 2006-07 ... The team's previous high coming out of the locker room is 38 against Saint Mary's.

- SDSU had a season-best six three-pointers versus Brown ... Its 46.2 percent performance from beyond the arc was also a team season-high.

What About That Win Streak?

- SDSU's current six-game win streak matches its six-game streak in 2000-01 ... With one more victory, the Aztecs would have their longest win streak since the 1996-97 team claimed 11 in a row from Jan. 30 to March 8.

- With a 7-3 record, SDSU is off to its best start since 1995-96, when the team opened the campaign with a 6-2 record through its first eight outings and then reeled off six straight wins for a 12-2 start.

Non-Conference Numbers

With a victory Saturday, SDSU can claim its eighth non-conference win, the team's most since the 2001-02 team also won eight en route to a 10-18 record.

The Aztecs have history on their side in the game against George Washington, as SDSU has won each of its last seven non-conference season finales. The streak dates back to the 1998-99 campaign, when the Aztecs fell at UC Santa Barbara, 78-50.

A win Saturday would also be the Aztecs 10th straight victory in its final non-conference home games of a season. That streak dates back to coach Beth Burns' first tenure on The Mesa in 1996-97, when the Aztecs fell to Arizona on Dec. 19, 1996.

They're A Steal

With 19 steals against Pepperdine, the Aztecs have combined for 84 in their last five outings (16.8/g). SDSU has now tallied double-figures in steals on six occasions in 2006-07, and ranks first in the conference in that category with an 12.60 per game average. A year ago, SDSU had 10 or more steals eight times, including in each of its first four games to open the year.

In 2006-07, six different SDSU players have recorded three or more steals in a game 14 times. Three different players have six steals in a single game this season, with the most recent addition being freshman Quenese Davis, who did so against Brown. Junior **Shanna Demus (Palmdale, Calif.)**, who had five versus Brown, had a career-best six against Pepperdine, while freshman **Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif.)** was the first to accomplish the trick with six in the win over Wichita State.

Sophomore **LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.)** and juniors Kate Eveland and Jennifer Layton have each turned in at least one game with three steals or more this year.

Double-Double Trouble

For the second straight outing, an SDSU player did not record a double-double in the win over Brown. Still, four different Aztecs have combined to record eight double-doubles this season, a figure that leads the Mountain West Conference in 2006-07. All four players have accomplished the feat twice, including Quenese Davis, Lauren Hoisington, **Desiree Johnson (Kahuku, Hawaii)** and Jennifer Layton. The double-doubles are the first career efforts for each of the four, while SDSU has had two players turn the trick in the same game on two occasions.

The last time SDSU had four separate players record a double-double in the same season was in 2001-02, when five Aztecs combined for five double-doubles.

Block Party

While the Aztecs have just seven blocks in their last three games, SDSU is still tied for the conference lead with New Mexico in blocked shots with 5.00 per outing. The team had a season-high 10 rejections against Cal Poly, the team's most in a single game since also tallying 10 on Dec. 22, 2002 against Creighton. SDSU now has 50 blocks on the season by eight different players. The 50 blocks are already over 52 percent of the team's 27-game total of 95 from a year ago. The school's team season record for blocks is 162 by the 1987-88 squad in 31 outings.

At The Top

Two Aztec newcomers remain at the top of a pair of stat categories in the Mountain West Conference. SDSU boasts the league's assist leader in freshman Quenese Davis, who chips in 5.70 per contest. The Aztecs occupy the top two spots in blocked shots per game with Jennifer Layton (1.70/g) holding a slight advantage over teammate Desiree Johnson (1.50/g).

Interesting Notes

- San Diego State has trailed in six of its seven victories this season, including four times in the second half. The Aztecs' trailed Cal Poly by 10 points, its largest deficit in a victory since Jan. 7, 2005, when the team was behind by 14 in the second half in a 63-59 victory against Eastern Washington.

- SDSU is a perfect 6-0 since head coach Beth Burns first used the starting five of guards Tamika Lipford and Quenese Davis, forwards Shanna Demus and Jennifer Layton and center Desiree Johnson.

- Aztec opponents have attempted 20 or more free throws in all but two games this season. The year started out with 23 free throws by each of SDSU's first three opponents, followed by 22 by its next two foes. Since then, opponent's trips to the charity stripe have bounced from a season-low 21 attempts by Wichita State to a season-high 40 by Saint Mary's. Pepperdine went to the stripe just 10 times on Dec. 21, while

Brown attempted an SDSU opponent low eight.

-SDSU shot exactly 45.3 percent from the field in both of its first two games of the season, with one being a win and the other a loss. In 2005-06, the Aztecs shot above 45 percent from the field just once in a victory over Portland State, when SDSU logged a 53.1 field-goal percentage. San Diego State has broken the 40 percent mark five times in nine games this season, after turning the trick just six times in 27 outings a year ago.

-SDSU has outrebounded its opponent in six games this season, after doing so on only eight occasions in 27 games in 2005-06.

-SDSU has had a player reach double-figures in rebounds in a game on nine occasions this season. In 2005-06, the Aztecs to only managed to meet the 10-rebound mark in a game five times, with three going to Michelle Strawberry and two by Desiree Johnson.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the George Washington will mean:

►SDSU has won seven straight games for the first time since 1996-97, when the Aztecs claimed 11 in a row from Jan. 30 to March 8.

►SDSU is 8-3 overall, its best record through 11 games since the 1995-96 team was 9-2.

►SDSU can win eight non-conference games for the first time since 2001-02.

►SDSU improves to 9-2 in home games played in the month of December since Beth Burns' return. The Aztecs could finish December 2006 with a perfect 6-0 mark.

►SDSU improves to 5-2 against teams it did not face a year ago.

►SDSU wins its first non-conference tournament since 1993, when the team went 2-0 at the Santa Clara Diet Pepsi Shoot-Out in Santa Clara, Calif.

►SDSU head coach Beth Burns is 1-0 all-time against George Washington.

George Washington Tidbits

George Washington enters Saturday's contest with a 10-2 record with its only losses coming to No. 1 Maryland and No. 6 Tennessee ... GW's win over Georgia is its first over a ranked opponent in 2006-07 ... The Colonials have played one other Mountain West Conference school this season in TCU, which it defeated 82-77 in a tournament in Maryland ... GW is led by Sarah-Jo Lawrence, who averages 14.3 points per game ... Jessica Adair is the team's leading rebounder (7.0/g) and second-leading scorer (13.6) ... Two other Colonials average in double-figure scoring, including Kimberly Beck, who has a team-best 66 assists ... Beck had a team-best 18 points in the win over Georgia ... George Washington is the Aztecs' highest ranked opponent since SDSU faced No. 17 Colorado State in Feb. 2002 (L, 60-69).

Injury Update

For the first time this season, Aztec head coach Beth Burns had all 12 players on the team's active roster at her disposal against Pepperdine on Dec. 21. Freshman guard **Chelsea Williamson (Boulder, Colo.)**, who has battled stress reactions in both of her feet, suited up for the first time, but did not see any action. Junior forward **Shannon Clay (Inglewood, Calif.)** was also back in uniform after playing her first career game against Cal Poly and then sitting out the Saint Mary's contest due to soreness in her foot.

SDSU began the year with just eight players available for its first two games. Sophomore Tamika Lipford upped that number by one when she returned against USD on Nov. 14, after recovering from offseason ACL surgery. Her classmate, LaSandra Dixon, missed the first four games before playing at Southern Utah following surgery to repair a torn meniscus.

Welcome To The Family

The Aztec basketball family officially welcomed a new addition to the roster last week. Guard **Christen Myles (Chino, Calif.)** joined the team on the practice court for the first time on Wednesday. Myles, who will wear jersey No. 31, graduated from Bishop Amat High School in La Puente, Calif., in 2006, and originally signed with Oregon State. She will be able to practice with the team the rest of this year and is eligible to compete in December 2007 with 3.5 years of eligibility remaining.

Recapping 2006-07 So Far

- Against Nevada, Jennifer Layton and Quenese Davis became the first Aztecs to record double-doubles in the same game since 2002, when Nicolette McCartney and Ashlee Dunlap did so against American University. It was also the first double-double by an Aztec since Michelle Strawberry had 22 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Portland State on Dec. 16, 2005.

- An Aztec true freshman has recorded 10 or more assists in a game in each of the last two seasons. Quenese Davis did so in her first career outing against Nevada, logging assists, while Tamika Lipford had 11 versus Portland State in 2005-06.

- A true freshman has started at the point guard position in a season-opener in each of SDSU's last four campaigns. Davis is joined by Lipford (2005), current junior Kate Eveland (2004) and Courtney Fritz (2003).

- Jennifer Layton went 10-for-10 from the field in the second half of the UC Davis game, finishing the night with 20 points. She averaged a double-double in her first three career outings (15.7 ppg., 10.0 rpg.).

-The Aztecs' 20 assists versus UC Davis are the most by SDSU in a single-game since the team had 23 in a 91-45 victory against Utah Valley State in Feb. 2005.

-San Diego State logged a season-best 20 steals against Wichita State. The 20 steals are the team's most in a single outing since Jan. 27, 2005, when the Aztecs logged 21 in a 48-44 loss to Air Force at Cox Arena.

- Freshman Lauren Hoisington was named the Mountain West Conference co-basketball player of the week on Dec. 4. Hoisington helped the Aztecs rally from a six-point deficit with less than three minutes remaining in regulation in the team's overtime win over Wichita State on Dec. 3. She scored eight of the team's final 10 points of the second half and ended the afternoon with a career-high 18 points and 11 rebounds. She became the sixth SDSU player in the league's eight-year history to be named player of the week.

- San Diego State played back-to-back overtime games for the first time in program history against Wichita State and Cal Poly.

-With its victory over Pepperdine on Dec. 21, the Aztecs doubled their win total from all of last season. This marks the second time Beth Burns has had an SDSU team double its win total from her first to her second season at the helm. In her first stint on The Mesa (1989-97), Burns' first squad in 1989-90 won seven games, while her second doubled that with 14 victories in 1990-91.

Pick Seven

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish seventh in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Thursday at the league's basketball media day in Las Vegas, Nev. The voting panel consisted of the MWC's nine head coaches, as well as selected media.

The Aztecs, who ended up ninth in the 2005-06 regular season, earned 41 points from the panel, beating out eighth place Air Force by two points. New Mexico was picked to win the conference title, garnering eight of the 19 first-place votes. The Lobos edged BYU by just one first-place nod and three overall points. The Cougars are followed by TCU (126 pts.), Utah (102), Wyoming (96) and UNLV (71). Colorado State rounded out the poll with a ninth-place point total of 36.

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 8 of four highly-rated recruits - centers **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** and **Geneshia Dunbar (Dallas, Texas)** and guards **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** and **Christen Myles (Chino, Calif.)**. Johnson, Dunbar and Davis will join the Aztecs in 2007, while Myles, who is eligible to compete in December 2007, has already begun practicing with the team.

SDSU alum Bill Earley will have the play-by-play, while former Aztec women's basketball standout Tammy Blackburn will provide analysis at home games and selected road contests. Blackburn and Earley are in their 13th year of covering SDSU women's basketball.

Starting in 2006-07, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the Air Force game, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Cox Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 242-175, while her mark school record stands at 161-110 over 10 seasons.
