

2004-05 Aztec Player Profiles





The team's lone senior and one of only two Aztecs with at least two seasons of collegiate basketball experience ...will be counted on for her leadership and maturity ... brings championship-level experience to SDSU ... member of the 2001-02 University of Oklahoma squad which advanced to the NCAA title game ... transferred to Midland College in 2002-03, leading the team to a third-place finish at the national junior college tournament ... earned MWC all-academic honors for the 2003-04 campaign.

As A Junior (2003-04): Appeared in all 28 games, earning one starting assignment in her first season on The Mesa ... third on the team in blocked shots and fourth in rebounds per game (2.6) ... six boards in the opener with Saint Mary's ... scored her first basket as an Aztec at CS Fullerton, while also chipping in five rebounds in the victory ... had six rebounds and six points, all from the free-throw line, at CSU Northridge ... scored six points for the second straight game, going 3-for-5 from the field vs. USD ... first career start against Oral Roberts ... season-best two blocks against Brown on Dec. 30 ... career-best three steals to go with four rebounds in 15 minutes versus Santa Clara ... first career game as an Aztec in double-figures, doubling her previous career best with 12 points on 5-for-8 shooting against UT-Pan Am. ... career-high four assists at UNLV ... played a career-best 31 minutes, tallving a career-high seven rebounds, icing the win over Colorado State with a pair of free throws ... 3-for-3 from the field (seven points), six rebounds and two blocks versus UNLV.

At Midland College (2002-03): Played one season at Midland College, in Midland, Texas, averaging 14 points and nine rebounds ... helped Midland to a thirdplace finish at the 2003 NJCAA National Basketball Tournament, a 31-6 record and region and conference titles ... set a schoolrecord for most rebounds in a game with 20

Getting To Know: Lindsey Casey

By Keith Kawamura, SDSU Media Relations With an impressive collegiate athletic resume, it is safe to say that the Aztecs' lone senior, Lindsey Casey, has experienced just about everything most athletes dream and dread about.

Prior to Casey's arrival at San Diego State, she spent her freshman year with the University of Oklahoma Sooners (32-3), appearing in 11 games and advancing to the 2002 NCAA title game.

Casey said that it was at Oklahoma where she played the most memorable game of her collegiate career, thus far, during the national semifinals against Duke.

"I got in during the last two minutes of the game and we had a lead against Duke. There were 40,000 people in the stands," Casey said. "I can still picture it."

After her run with the Sooners to the Final Four, Casey transferred to Midland College for her sophomore year. During the season, Casey tore her ACL [anterior cruciate ligament] in her right knee, while attempting to stay inbounds after a rebound.

"When that happened, I knew I had hurt my knee, but I didn't know to what extent," Casey said. "I was more concerned with getting back in the game than worrying about the injury itself.'

The injury was a case of deja' vu for Casey, who tore her left ACL jumping out of bounds to save another ball as a junior in high school.

After surgery and five months of rehab, she was able to play during her senior year in high school and into her freshman year with the championship-bound Sooners.

Back in a similar situation again, Casey played through the second injury to take another trip to a national championship, this time leading Midland to a third-place finish in the national junior college tournament and a 31-6 overall record.

Throughout the many ups and downs in her athletic career, Casey said that she always found the motivation and the inspiration to play in one simple phrase - play for an audience of one.

"Getting my motivation from God, knowing that he's given us great talents to go out there and do something that other people can't do, is my number one motivation."


Casey's other motivation also comes from her family, whose athletic blood lines run deep. Her father and brothers all played or play NCAA Division I college football, while her mother is an athletic trainer.

"I talk with my brothers all the time about how practices are going and to push each other when we need the encouragement. They give me a lot of motivation to get out there and play," Casey said.

With a young Aztec women's basketball team in search of leadership, Casey's experience through championships, injury and heredity will no doubt be an invaluable part of the team's success this season.

As A Sophomore (2003-04): Played in 25 games, starting 12, all in MWC regular-season or tournament play ... team-best 44.1 field-goal percentage ... tied for first in steals (38) and third in assists (43) ... 28 of 38 steals came in conference action, ranking her second in the MWC (2.15/g) ... eighth in the MWC in steals per overall games (1.52) ... scored more than 100 points for second straight year ... career-best 49 rebounds ... led team in scoring in a pair of games ... two double-figure scoring efforts ... team game high in assists eight times, tying for first on the squad ... played 12 minutes against Oral Roberts, grabbing four steals ... season-best five rebounds in only 14 minutes against UTPA ... best offensive game of the season at UNLV, recording 15 points on a perfect 6for-6 shooting ... earned first start of the year against Wyoming, recording a season high for points for the second straight game with a team-best 17 ... season-best six assists at Air Force ... missed the BYU game on Jan. 7, due to injury ... returned a game later to contribute six points and a team-best four assists versus UNLV ... made the game-winning shot in the team's 52-50 win over Air Force ... also had a team season-high five steals versus the Falcons ... matched season high with five steals against Utah in the regular season finale ... part of the Aztecs' starting five at the MWC tourney, contributing a team game-high four assists.

As A Freshman (2002-03): Played in 21 games, starting 14 times ... third on the team in scoring (7.6 ppg.) and second in steals (41) ... fourth in the MWC in steals per game (1.95) ... first injured her left knee on a fast



eight steals in a career-high 35 minutes ... eight steals, including seven in the first half, tied as the most by a player in the conference in 2002-03 and the most by an Aztec since 2000 ... scored in double-figures for the second consecutive game, posting a team-high 18 points, including 16 in the second half, against UNLV on Jan. 18 ... only player to score in double-figures in the loss to BYU, finishing with 14 points and three steals ... led SDSU with 13 points, including a 7-for-10 effort from the line at New Mexico ... 12 points and a career-high seven assists in the win at Air Force ... one rebound short of her first career double-double, getting nine boards to go with a team-best 16 points in the upset of Colorado St. on Feb. 6.


