- Having become bowl eligible with last week's 34-10 victory over UNLV, TCU will look to enhance its postseason hopes when it closes the regular season at San Diego State.
- TCU is playing at Qualcomm Stadium for the third straight year. The Frogs won 23-20 versus the Aztecs in 2005 before last season's 37-7 victory over Northern Illinois in the Poinsettia Bowl.
- The Frogs are making their second appearance in California this season. TCU won 38-36 at Stanford (Oct. 13) the week after the Cardinal knocked off then-No. 2 USC.
- TCU is 5-1 in regular-season finales, including a 2-0 mark on the road, under head coach Gary Patterson.
- Since the start of the 2005 campaign, the Frogs are 25-3 when playing on Saturdays and 3-5 on other days of the week.
- ♦ TCU is 8-1 in November games over the last three seasons.
- The Frogs are looking for their first back-to-back wins since Sept. 22-29.

SERIES HISTORY

- TCU holds a 2-0 series lead over San Diego State. Both meetings have taken place since the Frogs began Mountain West Conference play in 2005.
 - TCU won 23-20 in San Diego in 2005 before a 52-0 victory in Fort Worth last year.
- The Frogs and Aztecs never played during the three seasons (1996-98) both teams were members of the Western Athletic Conference.

ROAD WARRIORS

- ♦ TCU is 19-11 (.633) in road and neutral-site games since 2003, placing 12th nationally.
- ♦ The Frogs are 9-5 while allowing 19.6 points per game in their last 14 road contests.

SUPER BOWL SITES

- Saturday's date at San Diego State will mark TCU's fifth contest in a 29-game stretch in which it will play in a stadium that's hosted a Super Bowl.
- During that span, in which they are 4-0, the Frogs have also taken the field at Reliant Stadium in Houston and Stanford Stadium.

FROG TIDBITS

- Mountain West Conference Defensive Player of the Year candidate Chase Ortiz received the league's weekly defensive award for his play against UNLV. A senior defensive end, Ortiz had three tackles for a loss, including two sacks, among seven total stops. He also forced two fumbles while recovering one.
- In its six wins, TCU averages the same amount of rushing yards (193.8) as passing.
- The Frogs have allowed 12 points or less in five of their six victories. TCU has won 55 in a row, including 40 under head coach Gary Patterson, when allowing 17 or fewer points.

JUST TCU, THANK YOU

Though the TCU Department of Intercollegiate Athletics is a proud and integral part of Texas Christian University, it desires to be recognized by the media simply as TCU (acronym only).

In all sports-related media references, we respectfully urge that the university's teams be identified with an appropriate appellation — TCU. In subsequent references of the same presentation, the team may be referred to by nickname — Horned Frogs. A shorter version of the nickname, Frogs, is acceptable in later usage.





DID YOU KNOW?

- TCU's total enrollment of 8,865 is 58 percent female.
- TCU has just 3,706 male students. With approximately 120 players ٠ on the football roster, 3.2 percent of all males at TCU are on the sideline in uniform during home games. If Ohio State had the same ratio of male students on the football team, the Buckeye roster would have over 1,000 players.
- The estimated annual cost, including housing, books and fees, to ٠ attend TCU is \$33,818.
- TCU's Neeley School of Business is ranked 11th by the Wall Street Journal for top U.S. regional MBA programs. It's the highest in Texas and in the top 20 for three consecutive years.
- TCU has a 14:1 student/faculty ratio.

- Famous TCU alumni include Betty Buckley (actress), Gordon England (Secretary of the U.S. Navy), Dan Jenkins (author/sportswriter), Eddie Bernice Johnson (congresswoman), Rod Roddy (Price is Right announcer), Bob Schieffer (CBS newsman and co-host of Face the Nation) and Tara Watson (Miss Texas 2000).
- The following companies are based in Fort Worth: American Airlines, ٠ Bell Helicopter-Textron, Lockheed Martin, Pier 1 Imports, Radio Shack and Travelocity.com.

FORT WORTH (AP) - Jeff Ballard threw for a school-record tying five touch downs and ran for a score as TCU beat San Diego State 52-0 for its fifth straight win.

Ballard was 20-of-23 passing for 288 yards as TCU (8-2, 4-2 Mountain West) posted its most lopsided win since defeating SMU 62-7 in 2000.

The Froas were forced to punt on their first possession, but scored points on their next eight drives. San Diego State (2-8, 2-4) couldn't mount much against the TCU defense. The Aztecs only had

87 yards of offense and turned the ball over twice. They also had a punt blocked in the first half. San Diego State had two first downs on its opening drive and only one - by penalty - the next seven times it touched the ball.

And while the Aztecs were misfiring offensively, Ballard was having one of the best games of his career.

Ballard completed 14 straight passes before missing late in the first half. On the next play, Ballard found Quentily Harmon for 30 yards. That set up Ballard's 4-yard touchdown run which put the Horned Frogs ahead 38-0 at halftime.

Ballard's 18-yard pass to Donald Massey gave TCU a 7-0 lead. He followed with scoring passes of 44 yards to Shae Reagan, 30 yards to Harmon and five yards to Massey

On TCU's first drive after halftime, Ballard threw a 33-yard strike to Massey for his fifth TD pass to tie a Frog mark.

FROG OFFENSIVE NOTES

BROWN SIDELINED

- 2007 Preseason Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Year Aaron Brown saw his injury-plagued season come to an end against UNLV. Prior to his latest injury, Brown had already missed two games and played sparingly in several others.
- Despite seeing limited action, Brown still tops the Frogs in rushing (490 yards, 4.6 per carry) while placing second in receptions (24). He led TCU in receiving in four games.
- Brown rushed for at least 91 yards three times this season. The Frogs were 3-0 in those contests.
- Brown's streak of at least one reception in 11 straight games that he played came to an end against UNLV. It was the longest current streak on the Frogs. He has a catch in 19 of his last 21 contests.
- Brown is just the 12th player in TCU history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards. He is 12th on the Frogs' all-time list with 2,049.
- Brown posted the fifth 100-yard rushing game of his career in the 24-12 win over Colorado State. TCU is 5-0 in those contests.

FLASHING THE WHEELS

Quarterback Andy Dalton has led TCU in rushing in two straight games after running for just 22 yards on the season through the opening nine contests:

RECORDS AND MILESTONES

- Andy Dalton has set a TCU freshman record for most passing yards with 1,912.
- Dalton needs 88 yards in the air to become just the seventh quarterback in TCU history to throw for 2,000 yards in a season.

DALTON FARES WELL WITH OTHER ROOKIES

Andy Dalton places fifth among freshman quarterbacks nationally in pass attempts (302) while ranking sixth in completions (178), yards (1,912) and completion percentage (58.9).

- ♦ TCU is 6-0 when rushing for at least 142 yards this season.
- The Frogs are 5-1 when passing for 205 yards or less. TCU threw for 344 yards at Stanford to win for the only time this season when passing for over 205 yards.
- The Frogs are 4-0 when rushing for more yards than passing. TCU is 2-5 when it throws for more yards.
- TCU was at 512 yards of offense at Stanford before taking 18 yards in losses while running out the clock to preserve the win.

SIGNAL CALLER DEPTH

 Coming off-the-bench, Marcus Jackson has led touchdown drives in three straight games. He's completed 12-of-18 (66.7 percent) pass attempts in the last two contests.

DALTON CONTINUES TRADITION

- The 27-0 win over Baylor made Andy Dalton the fifth-straight quarterback to win his first start under head coach Gary Patterson. Dalton became the first TCU signal caller in the Patterson era to make his collegiate debut as a starter.
- The last redshirt freshman quarterback to start for TCU was Tye Gunn in 2002.
- Dalton's 320 yards passing at Air Force and 344 at Stanford are the most by a Frog since Gunn had 368 yards in a 48-45 double-overtime win over Northwestern in 2004.
- The 344 yards at Stanford place Dalton eighth on the Frogs' single-game passing list.

HE'S BACK

- Tight end Shae Reagan played against UNLV for his first action since Oct. 6 at Wyoming when he suffered a leg injury on the Frogs' first snap of the game. He missed the last four contests.
- Reagan had a 32-yard pass reception in the first quarter.
 A converted quarterback, Reagan has a 20.6 career yards per
- A converted quarterback, Reagan has a 20.6 career yards per catch mark to rank third all-time at TCU.

THE DUAL-THREAT

Wide receiver Jeremy Kerley, the only true freshman to see action on offense, has a pair of 27-yard pass completions for a quarterback rating of 326.8. He also has four receptions.

THE WORKHORSE

- ♦ TCU is 4-0 when Joseph Turner rushes for at least 56 yards.
- Turner was impressive in his first career start in the 37-0 win over New Mexico.
- Turner's 28 rushing attempts (115 yards) were the most by a Frog since Robert Merrill had 29 carries for 170 yards in a 23-20 win at San Diego State on Oct. 29, 2005.
- Turner equaled his season total for rushes entering the New Mexico game. He had 28 carries for 153 yards prior to the contest. Turner posted his first 100-yard game at TCU.

THE TOUCHDOWN MAKER

- Redshirt freshman wide receiver Bart Johnson has three touchdowns on his first five collegiate touches.
- Johnson's first touch came when he scooped up a blocked punt against SMU and returned it 17 yards for a touchdown.
- Johnson's first two collegiate receptions were at Wyoming. He had a pair of catches for 23 yards, including a 5-yard score.
- A native of Brownwood, Texas, Johnson had two grabs for 23 yards at BYU. His second reception was a 7-yard touchdown.
- Johnson's two receiving touchdowns are tied for second on the team. He has four catches for 46 yards on the season.

THERE'S ENOUGH FOR EVERYONE

- TCU ranks in a tie with Colorado for third nationally with 18 players having at least one reception this season. Nebraska leads with 20, while Troy is second at 19.
- TCU is tied for 14th with eight players having a scoring grab.
- TCU's top four receivers are separated by just 10 catches.
- Eight Frog receivers have at least 13 receptions.

NUMBERS THAT LEAD TO WINS

- TCU has won 20 in a row when rushing for at least 167 yards.
- Under Gary Patterson as head coach, the Frogs are 28-2 when totaling 200 or more yards on the ground.

GROUND FROGS

- ♦ TCU is 6-0 when attempting 34 or fewer passes in a game.
- The Frogs are 5-0 when completing 18 or less pass attempts. TCU's lone win when having more than 18 completions was 38-36 at Stanford, when Andy Dalton was 23-of-34 for 344 yards and the eighth-best single-game passing total in Frog history.

TOTING THE PIGSKIN

 In the first half of the UNLV game, TCU set a season-high with four rushing touchdowns. The Frogs' previous best for rushing scores in a game was three at Stanford.

MR. CONSISTENT

 Graduate student Ervin Dickerson tops TCU in receptions (33), receiving yards (426) and touchdowns (four) despite leading the team in receiving in just three of 11 games.

NEW FACES

Thirteen Frogs on offense (WR Walter Bryant, TB Ryan Christian, TE Quinton Cunigan, WR Ervin Dickerson, QB Andy Dalton, TE Evan Frosch, QB Marcus Jackson, WR Bart Johnson, OT Marshall Newhouse, OG Preston Phillips, OT Nic Richmond, C Tony Savino and TB Joseph Turner) have made their first collegiate starts this season.

THE TWO-HEADED MONSTER

- Aaron Brown and Joseph Turner, TCU's top-two ground gainers, have run for a combined 851 yards on a 4.6 per carry average. They represent 51.5 percent of TCU's season rushing total. The remainder of the Frogs have totaled 802 yards with a 2.9 per carry mark.
- Brown (490 yards) and Turner (361 yards) have both missed significant time due to injury.

DRIVE CHART

- The Frogs' two-longest scoring drives of the season have come in the last two games.
- TCU's eight-play, 92-yard touchdown drive on its initial series versus UNLV was its second-longest of the season. It trailed only the 94 yards on 11 plays for a touchdown on the Frogs' final scoring drive at BYU.
- Against UNLV, the Frogs scored on their opening drive of the game for the third time this season. It was their second time with a touchdown.

NO FRIEND OF RUNNING BACKS

- TCU is 42-5 under head coach Gary Patterson when holding its opponent under 100 yards rushing.
- During his 85-game tenure as head coach, Patterson has seen just 17 100-yard rushing games by opposing players.
- Nearly half (71) of Air Force's 146 rushing yards came on one carry. The other 41 attempts gained 75 yards (1.8 per rush).
- Only 11 of TCU's last 27 foes surpassed 86 yards rushing. During that span, TCU has surrendered 79.1 yards per game.

UNFAMILIAR SCENES

- TCU has allowed a touchdown on the opponent's opening drive of the game just twice this season and in a span of 13 games dating back to Nov. 25, 2006 at Colorado State.
- Only three times this year have TCU opponents scored on their first offensive series. Utah and BYU had touchdowns, while Colorado State kicked a field goal.

ORTIZ FOR MWC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- Despite facing double teams on blocks most of the season, defensive end Chase Ortiz is second in the MWC in tackles for a loss (14.5). Air Force's John Rabold, who has played one more game (12), has 16.5.
- Ortiz's 8.0 sacks are tied for second in the MWC, trailing BYU's Jan Jorgensen (8.5).
- Ortiz topped the MWC in tackles for a loss (14.0) and sacks (9.0) in 2005.

GRAD STUDENTS LEAD THE WAY

- David Hawthorne (73 stops) and David Roach (68), TCU's top-two tacklers, have already earned their degrees and are graduate students this fall.
- Hawthorne and Roach have posted career-best tackle totals. Hawthorne's previous top mark was 43 last season, while Roach had 41 stops in 2005.
- Hawthorne is third on TCU in sacks (4.0) and fourth in tackles for a loss (6.5). Roach is tied for second with two forced fumbles and tied for third with five pass break-ups.

SACK TERROR

- Safety Stephen Hodge has 6.0 sacks in the last five games. His 7.0 sacks on the season are second on TCU to Chase Ortiz (8.0) and top all MWC defensive backs.
- In the last four games, Hodge has taken part in defensive and special teams scores.
- Hodge has accomplished the following since being inserted into the starting lineup:

Nov. 3, vs. New Mexico - Making his first collegiate start, Hodge earned Co-MWC Defensive Player of the Week honors as he led TCU with seven tackles, including a sack, and three pass break-ups. He also forced a fumble that was returned 13 yards for a touchdown by Rafael Priest.

Nov. 8, at BYU - Hodge totaled eight tackles, including six solo. He also forced and recovered a fumble while adding a pass break-up.

Nov. 17, vs. UNLV - Hodge had a career-high and team-best 11 tackles (nine solo). He also combined for 1.5 sacks.

- In addition to two sacks against Utah, Hodge also registered his first collegiate touchdown when he returned a blocked punt 31 yards for a score.
- Hodge had 1.5 sacks as part of two tackles for a loss and seven stops at Stanford.

TEAMWORK

• The Frogs have had 23 players record a tackle for a loss this season, while 14 players have combined for the team's 35 sacks.

FROGS SHINE IN RED ZONE

In its last 19 games, TCU has allowed only 18 touchdowns on the opponent's 50 trips (36.0 percent) to the red zone. Six failed possessions came from Frog interceptions.

MAGIC NUMBERS

- The Frogs are 19-1 in their last 20 games when allowing less than 333 yards of offense.
- Prior to the 27-20 loss to Utah in which the Utes had just 227 yards of total offense, TCU had won 17 in a row when holding its opponent under 333 yards.
- With head coach Gary Patterson, the Frogs are 37-5 when their opponent is at or below 300 yards of total offense.

NEW FACES

Nose tackle Kelly Griffin is the first true freshman to start at TCU since Gary Patterson became head coach prior to the 2000 GMAC Mobile Alabama Bowl.

PICK PARTIES

- TCU's MWC-leading 16 interceptions are by 10 different players.
- Rafael Priest had the Frogs' lone pick against UNLV, enabling him to tie Steven Coleman for the team lead with three interceptions on the season.
- Brian Bonner is the Frogs' active career leader with seven picks.
- Torrey Stewart returned an interception 45 yards for a touchdown at Texas. It was his second career score off a pick.

- Drew Combs, who was born with a left arm that ends just below the elbow, is the Frogs' kickoff specialist after winning the competition in preseason camp.
- Combs, a straight-on kicker, has six touchbacks and one solo tackle this season. Combs originally attended Arkansas and was a walk-on to the Razorback football team, but he did not see game action before transferring to TCU.

THE RETURN GAME

All-MWC safety Brian Bonner is also an all-league return specialist who is 17th nationally with a 12.5 punt return average, including a long of 64 yards against Baylor.

THE TURNOVER STORY

- Over the last three seasons, TCU is 24-1 when ahead (21-1) or even (3-0) in turnover margin. The Frogs are 4-7 when on the negative side.
- Against BYU, TCU lost for the first time since Oct. 15, 2004 at UAB when holding the edge in turnover margin. The Frogs had two takeaways while committing one turnover at BYU.
- Since the start of the 2005 season, TCU is 28-8. In five of the eight defeats, the Frogs have been at minus-2 or worse in turnover margin.
- TCU's streak of 15 consecutive games with at least one takeaway was snapped at Stanford. The Frogs have posted at least one takeaway in 37 of their last 39 contests.

TRUE STUDENT-ATHLETES

- The TCU football team ranked ninth nationally among 2006 bowl teams with a 78 percent Graduation Success Rate. Overall, the Frogs were 20th among Division I-A programs.
- Among bowl teams in Texas, TCU was second behind Rice in its GSR. TCU trailed only Air Force in the MWC.
- In May 2007, the AFCA recognized TCU for graduating 70 percent or more of its football players who entered as freshmen in 2001-02. The Frogs were well above the national average of 60 percent and the median graduation rate of 59 percent.

- During that stretch, the Frogs are 3-5 on other days of the week (1-0 on Sundays, 1-0 on Tuesdays, 1-5 on Thursdays).
- ♦ Five of TCU's eight losses over the last three years have come in Thursday games. Since 2005, the Frogs are 1-5 on Thursdays and 27-3 on other days of the week.
- The Frogs are 14-1 in daylight over the last three years and 14-7 at night. The Oct. 6 loss at Wyoming snapped TCU's 12-game winning streak in day games. The NCAA constitutes a night game as starting at 5 p.m.

CLOSE CALLS

- Dating back to the 2003 campaign, TCU is 17-7 in its last 24 games decided by seven points or less.
- The Frogs' four MWC losses this season are by a combined total of 18 points. Each defeat has been by seven points or less.
- Two of the Frogs' MWC losses were by three points with TCU's final snap resulting in a missed field goal that hit the upright.

BOUNCING BACK

- TCU is 16-6 in regular-season games following a loss under seventh-year head coach Gary Patterson.
- The Frogs have never lost three in a row under Patterson. TCU hasn't dropped three straight contests since a four-game skid in the 1998 campaign.

CONFERENCE SUCCESS

- TCU's 12-6 record (.667) over its last 18 league games ranks in a tie for 18th nationally for best record in conference play over that span.
- ♦ Ohio State, BYU and Boise State are tied for the lead at 17-1 (.944).

DEFENDING THEIR HOME

- Since 2000, TCU is 39-6 in home games at Amon G. Carter Stadium.
- TCU has recorded three shutouts in its past eight home dates. The Frogs blanked Baylor (27-0) and New Mexico (37-0) this season.
- Dating back to the 2005 campaign, the Frogs have held the opposition without a touchdown in seven of their last 14 home games.
- In their last nine home contests, the Frogs have outscored their opponents 279-73 (an average margin of 31-8).

QUICK STARTS

- The Frogs have allowed only 11 first-half touchdowns through 11 games this season. TCU has surrendered just 16 touchdowns in the opening three quarters.
- In the first half of its last 19 contests, TCU has outscored its opponents 361-102 (an average margin of 19-5). TCU's advantage is 169-89 in 2007. That includes a 129-48 difference in the second quarter.
- ♦ TCU has scored first in seven of 11 games in 2007 and 13 of its last 18 contests.
- The Frogs have scored in the first quarter in 26 of their last 33 games.
- ♦ Since 2002, TCU has tallied first in 71.2 percent (52-of-73) of its contests.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

TCU has won 18 consecutive games when holding the edge in time of possession.

BONUS FOOTBALL

TCU is 5-5 since the NCAA adopted overtime play in 1996.

- Eleven former Horned Frogs are currently active in the NFL: Anthony Alabi (OT, Miami), Drew Coleman (CB, New York Jets), Zarnell Fitch (DT, Baltimore Ravens), Aaron Schobel (DE, Buffalo), Bo Schobel (DE, Arizona), Matt Schobel (TE, Philadelphia), Herb Taylor (OT, Kansas City), LaDainian Tomlinson (RB, San Diego), Michael Toudouze (OT, Indianapolis), Ryan Tucker (OT, Cleveland) and Marvin White (S, Cincinnati).

THE BCS

- The Frogs are 10-2 in their last 12 games against teams from BCS-automatic qualifying conferences.
- TCU (20) is second behind only Boise State (24) for most appearances in the BCS standings by a school playing in a conference without an automatic BCS bid.
- Since Gary Patterson arrived at TCU as defensive coordinator in 1998, the Frogs are 14-7 against teams from leagues with automatic BCS bids.
- If last year's new BCS rules were in effect in 2005, TCU would have been in a BCS bowl. The Frogs were 14th in the final 2005 BCS standings and ahead of ACC-automatic qualifier Florida State.

HOME GROWN

 TCU is sixth nationally with 87.4 percent of its players being in-state products.

WIN-LOSS UPDATES

- After just three winning seasons in 13 years (1985-97), TCU has won 70.2 percent (85-36) of its games since 1998 when head coach Gary Patterson arrived as defensive coordinator.
- TCU has an all-time record of 544-509-57 (.516) in its football history which began in 1896.
- The 27-0 win over Baylor marked the 1,100th contest in TCU football history.

HONORARY BIG 12 MEMBERS

- TCU had its five-game winning streak against Big 12 teams snapped at Texas. The run of five straight victories over Big 12 foes trailed only Oklahoma (eight).
- Dating back to 2005, the Frogs went 5-1 in a stretch with six out of 27 games against Big 12 opponents. TCU allowed just 13.0 points per game in that span with 34 of the 78 points surrendered coming against Texas.
- In a stretch of 15 games (Sept. 3, 2005-Sept. 16, 2006), TCU was 4-0 against the Big 12. Only Texas, Texas Tech, Oklahoma and Colorado won more games against Big 12 foes in that span.

ANY DAY OF THE WEEK

- Since the start of the 1996 season, the Frogs are 12-11 in non-Saturday, regular-season games. Under Patterson, TCU is 9-10 and has played on every day of the week.
- TCU has played 19 of its 79 regularseason contests (24.1 percent) under Patterson on non-Saturdays.



TCU HEAD COACH GARY PATTERSON



Gary Patterson is the only coach in TCU history to record more than two 10-win seasons. He has four in the last five years and is also the fastest Horned Frog coach to reach 50 victories.

Patterson's 60-25 (.706) record is the best mark of any TCU head coach after 85 games. Dutch Meyer, coach of the 1935 and 1938 national championship teams, is second (.659, 54-27-4, 1934-40). Patterson's 60 wins are third on the Frogs' career victory list. His .706 winning percentage is second among TCU coaches with more than 20 games under their belt and 14th among active coaches in the Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly called Division I-A).

The Frogs have won four conference titles with Patterson on staff in addition to posting five of the school's nine 10-win seasons. He was TCU's defensive coordinator from 1998-00.

Patterson was the 2002 Conference USA and 2005 Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year. He was a 2003 finalist for Eddie Robinson and Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year honors.

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) - Even without standout defensive end Tommy Blake on the field, TCU's dominating defense pitched a season-opening shutout.

The No. 22 Horned Frogs gave up some yards before halftime, but not any points in a 27-0 victory Saturday over Baylor -- the first

of three former instate Southwest Conference rivals TCU plays in the opening month of the season. Andy Dalton threw for 205 yards and a touchdown in his first college start, and Justin Watts and Ryan Christian ran for scores as the Frogs won their ninth straight game. Chris Manfredini kicked two field goals after missing wide right on a 29-yard attempt during the opening drive.

The Frogs had three of their four interceptions and held Baylor to only 78 yards after halftime. Baylor had 204 yards in the first half.

Chase Ortiz, TCU's other All-MWC defensive end, got to quarterback Blake Szymanski and knocked the ball loose on the first play after halftime. The play was initially called a fumble recovered by the Frogs. Even though the play was overturned and made an incomplete pass after being reviewed, the tone was set for the second half.

TCU's last shutout was a 52-0 win at home against San Diego State last November. Baylor was shut out for the first time since 2005, when it was blanked in consecutive games against Texas Tech (28-0) and Texas (62-0).

Linebacker Jason Phillips made a nifty pickoff early in the fourth quarter, reaching back to grab Szymanski's pass thrown behind the intended receiver. Phillips returned it 34 yards to the Baylor 20, setting up Dalton's 14-yard TD pass to Ervin Dickerson that made it 24-0.

Dalton was 18-for-30 passing. But he had an interception and a fumble, losing the ball at the Baylor 1 on a keeper later in the first quarter.

Szymanski won a four-quarterback battle this fall, a competition that included a 25-year-old senior transfer from Kent State and a junior college transfer. He was 23-of-47 passing for 216 yards with three of the interceptions.

Watts (1 yard) and Christian (12 yards) scored in the second quarter to give TCU a 14-0 lead. Both teams had missed field goals on their first drives. Baylor's Shea Brewster also missed a 35yard kick in the third quarter.

TCU has won its last five games against Big 12 teams, a streak that started with a season-opening victory at Oklahoma in 2005. But a week after that upset of the Sooners, the Frogs lost to SMU -- the opponent when they play their next home game in three weeks.

The Falcons gave up great field position to TCU when Horned Frogs up-man Derek Moore recovered the onside kick, but Air Force forced a three-and-out and took over at its 20.

On fourth-and-1 from the Falcons 29, Carney pitched to Ollis, who scampered 71 yards for the tying touchdown with 5:55 left.

TCU capitalized on a blocked punt and an interception to take a 10-3 halftime lead despite an offense without tailback Aaron Brown, who missed his second straight game with a knee injury. Stephen Hodges sliced through the Falcons' widespread punt formation to block Harrison's first punt, and Andy Burrell recovered at the Air Force 27. But the Frogs managed to move just five yards and had to settle for Manfredini's 39-yard field goal.

Manfredini's 20-yarder in the third quarter was blocked by Chris Thomas, the 100th blocked kick by Air Force since 1990.

After Steven Coleman's interception at midfield, TCU again had trouble moving the ball. The Frogs committed three penalties and a fumble but still managed to drive downfield for the touchdown on Dalton's 5-yard fade pass to Ervin Dickerson just before he tumbled out of bounds.

After Harrison was wide right on a 50-yard field goal try that was plenty long enough, the Horned Frogs drove to the Falcons 22 before Garrett Rybak forced and recovered a fumble by Christian at the end of an 11-yard scamper.


Harrison then nailed a career-long 57-yarder with 1:31 left before halftime, which was nothing like the thrilling 33-yarder he would hit in overtime.



down pass to Damon Morton. The two-point conversion failed, leaving the score at 24-12 a minute into the fourth quarter.



The Horned Frogs (5-4, 2-3 Mountain West) also scored on a 7-yard pass from Marcus Jackson, who shared time at quarterback with Dalton, to Marcus Brock during a 17-point second quarter. Chris Manfredini kicked field goals of 28, 25, and 17 yards to help TCU end a three-game winning streak by New Mexico (6-3, 3-2).

TCU hounded Lobos quarterback Donovan Porterie and held running back Rodney Ferguson to 13 carries for 28 yards, 81 below his season average. Porterie was 7-for-23 passing for 76 yards and was sacked twice.

Even completed passes turned disastrous for New Mexico. Travis Brown fumbled after a catch, and Frogs cornerback Rafael Priest returned it 13 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter. Joseph Turner led TCU's balanced offense with a career-high 115 yards on 28 carries. The Frogs

had 421 total yards -- 238 rushing and 183 passing -- while holding the Lobos to 119.

The rushing yards and total offense were New Mexico's lowest since a 55-14 loss to Oregon State in the 2003 Las Vegas Bowl. The Lobos hadn't been shut out since 2002 against Texas Tech. New Mexico has lost all three games against TCU in the Mountain West. Each time, the Frogs have led at least 24-0, although the Lobos came back to make things interesting the past two years.

BYU's defense came up with another key stop when TCU went for it on fourth-and-1 at the BYU 32 and Aaron Brown got knocked back a yard. The Cougars got the ball back and drove to the 11 for Mitch Payne's 29-yard field goal, which put BYU ahead 27-15 with 13:06 left.
