- ▶ **When & Where:** Thurs., March 2, 2006, Arena Auditorium (15,028), Laramie, Wyo., 7 p.m. (MST).
- ▶ **Webcast/Live Stats:** There will be no SDSU audio broadcast for Thursday night's game, however, Wyoming's audio is available via a subscription service. Both the Wyoming audio and live stats are available on the Aztecs' official website, www.goaztecs.com.
- ▶ **The Records:** The Aztec women's basketball team rounds out its 2005-06 regular season, as it heads to Wyoming Thursday evening for a 7 p.m. tip-off at Arena Auditorium. San Diego State is on the road for its final game prior to the MWC tournament for the third time in the last four seasons and is at Wyoming to end a league campaign for the first time since 2001. The Aztecs face their third straight opponent that is receiving votes in the latest national poll and are 3-22 overall and 0-15 in conference play in 2005-06. The Cowgirls, meanwhile, are 19-6 and 9-5 in league action with four straight victories entering Thursday night's match-up.
- ▶ **San Diego State Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the first year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She coached the Aztecs from 1989 to 1997 and has a school record of 154-105 in nine seasons. Her 14-year head coaching record stands at 235-170.
- ▶ **Wyoming Head Coach Joe Legerski:** Legerski is in his third year at Wyoming and has a school and career record of 45-36.
- ▶ **Wyoming Series History:** Wyoming leads the series 15-13 and is 9-4 in games played in Laramie (Last: Wyoming def. SDSU, 64-53, in San Diego, Calif., on Feb. 28, 2006).

SDSU Ends Regular Season With Trip To Wyoming Thursday

The San Diego State women's basketball team finishes its 2005-06 regular season with a trip to Wyoming for a Thursday night game in Laramie. The Aztecs faces their third straight team that is receiving votes in both national polls, after completing their home schedule a week ago versus No. 21 Brigham Young and No. 23 New Mexico. SDSU will be looking to upset the Cowgirls, who have won four straight and have claimed each of the last 10 games in the all-time series.

The Aztecs are making their first of two trips to the Rocky Mountain region in the next week, as SDSU will travel back to Denver for its Tuesday evening game at the 2006 Mountain West Conference championships on March 7 at 5 p.m. (MST).

Aztecs Close Home Slate With Loss To New Mexico

The 23rd-ranked New Mexico Lobos had 10 three-pointers and made 23 of 25 attempts from the free-throw line to hand the Aztec women's basketball team a 74-48 loss Saturday at Cox Arena. SDSU, which played its second straight top-25 opponent, dropped to 3-22 overall and 0-15 in the Mountain West Conference following its final home contest of 2005-06. The Lobos, meanwhile, improved to 20-7 and 10-

SDSU senior guard Veronica Shaw (Phoenix, Ariz.), who was playing in her final game at Cox Arena, led the team with 14 points, seven rebounds and three steals. Junior Desiree Johnson (Kahuku, Hawaii) continued her solid play with nine points, six rebounds and a season-high five assists. Two Aztecs, senior Michelle Strawberry (Corona, Calif.) and sophomore Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas), both added eight points, while sophomore Shanna Demus (Palmdale, Calif.) tallied five of her six rebounds in the second half.

New Mexico led the entire game, jumping out to a 7-0 advantage before San Diego State scored its first bucket on a Shaw lay-up in the paint at the 17:12 mark. The Lobos answered with five straight points to push its lead into double-figures at 12-2 and would later go up by as many as 22 points, including at the half, 45-23.

The Aztecs, who were outrebounded 21-8 in the first 20 minutes, came out of the locker room with their first offensive rebounds of the afternoon, which resulted in three straight baskets to get to within 17 points at 48-31. SDSU also trailed by 17 at 50-33, but couldn't get any closer, as the Lobos added three more triples to the seven they had in the first half and were nearly flawless from the free-throw line, converting on 23 of 25 attempts (92 percent) for the game.

Other New Mexico Notes

The Aztecs did not own a lead against the Lobos, marking just the second time in 25 contests that SDSU has not been ahead at any point in a game (also vs. Pittsburgh) ... SDSU hit five of six free throws for an 83.3 percentage, its best in league action and second-best from the line in 2005-06 ... The Aztecs were shutout on the offensive glass in the first half, but rallied with 11 in the second 20 minutes. SDSU has 10 or more offensive rebounds in the second half six times this season and has reached double-figures on the offensive glass on eight occasions in one half of play.

The Three-Ball

After making only 24 three-pointers in 10 non-conference contests (2.4/g), the Aztecs have 70 triples in 15 league games (4.7/g) to almost double their per game average. SDSU has made five or more threes in four of its last five outings and has five or more nine times in league competition. The Aztecs only had five or more threes in a game once in non-conference action when they tallied a season-best eight in a win over UC Davis.

Block Party

Not only does San Diego State have the top shot blocker in the Mountain West Conference, two other Aztecs also rank among the top 12 in the league. Senior Desiree Johnson leads the MWC in both overall (1.44/g) and league-only (1.53/g) contests and tallied four against BYU last week, marking the eighth time an Aztec has had three or more blocks in a game in 2005-06.

Johnson is joined in the top 12 by sophomore Shanna Demus (8th - 0.92/g) and freshman Audrey Green (12th - 0.65/g).

Sledge Up Next For Straw

Entering her final regular season game as an Aztec, senior Michelle Strawberry needs just three triples to move into a tie for fourth in SDSU career history for three-pointers made. Strawberry currently has 79 treys, including a career-best 37 this season, and is three behind Sophia Sledge, who had 82 from 1997-2001.

The Corona, Calif., native will most likely end her career fourth in three-point attempts, as she trails Sledge in that category by 28.

No Go To The Free Throw

In 25 games this season, SDSU has gone to the free-throw line more times than its opponent on just six occasions, including in each of its three victories. The Aztecs have attempted fewer free throws 11 times in 15 conference outings, as MWC opponents own a 328 to 224 advantage in that category.

In 2005-06, SDSU has made 268 free throws on 428 attempts, both program season lows.

Down To 10

SDSU head coach Beth Burns will have just 10 players at her disposal for the remainder of the year, as the Aztecs lost two to season-ending injuries last week. Junior **Ijlal Barnes (San Diego, Calif.)** missed the New Mexico contest and is out with severe shin splints, while freshman **Brittany Santos (Paso Robles, Calif.)** reinjured her right knee in practice prior to the BYU game. Santos missed the team's first five games of 2005-06, after having surgery on the same knee, which she injured in fall camp.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the Wyoming will mean:

- ▶ SDSU defeats Wyoming for the first time since 1997. An Aztec victory would also be their first in Laramie since 1997, a span of seven games.
- ▶ SDSU wins its regular season finale for the first time since 2000.
- ▶ SDSU head coach Beth Burns improves to 13-4 all-time against the Cowgirls.

Wyoming Tid-Bits

Wyoming enters the week with a 19-6 overall record and a 9-5 mark in MWC play... the Cowgirls have won four straight, including upsets of BYU and New Mexico to garner votes in both national polls ... Wyoming is 10-2 at home ... Wyoming is led by sophomore Hanna Zavec, who averaged 14.2 points per game, while Jodi Bolerjack chips in 13.1 per contest ... Bolerjack is the team's top three-point shooter, converting on 66 of 152 attempts (43.4 percent), while Zavec has a team-high 6.3 rebounds per game... Three Cowgirls have started all 25 contests, including Erin Hicks, Michelle Taylor and Zavec... Wyoming is fourth nationally in turnovers per game (12.8), 12th in scoring defense (54.5 ppg.) and 15th in three-pointers per game (7.1).

SDSU-Wyoming Round 1

The San Diego State women's basketball team finished the first round of conference play Saturday with a 64-53 defeat to visiting Wyoming at Cox Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 3-15 overall and 0-8 in the Mountain West Conference, while the Cowgirls improved to 14-4 overall and 4-3 in league action.

"We really hurt them inside in the first half and I talked about that at the half (with the team)," said SDSU head coach Beth Burns. "I said at the half that I don't know what they're going to do, but they're going to do something to take away our inside game. They're either going to double or triple or sag or zone or something and they did, and we needed to step up and make some shots and we just didn't do it."

SDSU redshirt sophomore **Erin Jackson (Sparks, Nev.)** recorded a career high in point for the third straight outing, tallying 16 on 6-for-10 shooting from the floor, and adding a season-best seven rebounds. Senior Michelle Strawberry reached double figures for the 15th time in 18 outings in 2005-06, scoring 12 points, while sophomore Shanna Demus finished the afternoon with nine points and a season-high nine rebounds and three steals.

The Aztecs began the game with a 7-0 deficit, but rallied to take the lead with a 12-2 run, capped by a

Demus lay-up to go up by three at 12-9 at the 13:59 mark. The Cowgirls scored the next two baskets to put themselves back in front and later lead by a many as six points on two occasions, including at 22-16. SDSU responded to the deficit with three baskets by three different players as the game was tied at 22, 24 and 29, before the second of two Jackson free throws gave the Aztecs a 30-29 advantage heading into the locker room.

In the second half, Wyoming broke out of a 34-34 tied with a Megan McGuffey three-pointer to kick start what would turn into a 7-0 run, to put the visitor's ahead 44-37. The Aztecs got one of the points back with a Jackson free-throw, but the Cowgirls tagged on three more for their biggest lead of the game thus far at 48-38.

SDSU got to within seven on three occasions, including as late as 56-49 with under five minutes remaining, but missed eight of its last nine shots from the field, eventually falling by an 11-point margin at 64-53.

The Aztecs outrebounded the Cowgirls 37-30, including a 16-7 margin on the offensive glass, but Wyoming shot 52.2 percent from the field in the second half, compared to the home team's 28.6 shooting percentage.

Aztecs To Face Air Force Or Colorado State At 2006 MWC Championships

The 2006 conference campaign culminates in the MWC championships in Denver, Colo., March 7-11. The tournament will span five days (one day off) for the first time in league history, while it will take place in Denver for the third and final year before returning to Las Vegas, Nev., in 2007.

San Diego State will play its first game of the MWC tournament on Tues., March 7, at 5 p.m. (MST) versus either Air Force or Colorado State. The Falcons currently have one more win than the Rams, but the two sides still have to face one another at Air Force on the final day of the regular season on March 4. A meeting with either school would be the first for the Aztecs in MWC championship play.

This year's conference tournament will be one of the most competitive as three teams are currently ranked in the top 25, while a fourth is receiving votes in both polls. The MWC is ranked sixth overall by both collegerpi.com and college basketball news and six of nine teams are in the top 65 of the three different RPI indexes.

Other 2005-06 Aztec Notes Thus Far

- SDSU's 79 points at Wichita State are the program's most in a season-opener since scoring 101 versus McNeese State in 1990. The Aztecs have scored 79 points or more just six times in their first previous campaigns with two of those coming a year ago.

- Wichita State attempted an SDSU opponent record 50 free-throws beating the previous mark of 48, held by Louisiana Tech on Jan. 19, 1986 (L, 87-43).

- Michelle Strawberry's 29 points at Wichita State are the most by an SDSU player since Jamey Cox had 30 against Cal State Fullerton in 1999. Her 12 field goals are the most since Jodi Nowlin-Tres had 12 versus Air Force in Feb. 1997, while her 21 attempts are the most since Nowlin-Tres had 25 at Fresno State in 1996.

-The SDSU-USD game attracted 971 fans to Cox Arena, the largest Aztec home crowd since 1,062 people saw the Aztecs beat Air Force back on Jan. 26, 2002. It is the best attendance for a non-conference home game since Dec. 11, 1998, when there were 972 fans to watch SDSU play UCLA.

-The Aztecs' 93.8 percent free-throw percentage against USD is the team's best when attempting 10 or more in a game since the 1988-89 campaign. The Aztecs made 22 of their 23 attempts (95.7) in a 78-56 win over Tennessee Tech on Dec. 3, 1988, in the second game of the SDSU Classic in Peterson Gym.

- Michelle Strawberry was named Mountain West Conference player of the week on Dec. 19, following her 22-point, 11-rebound performance in the team's win over Portland State. Strawberry is the first Aztec to be named Mountain West Conference player of the week since December 2002. She became the fifth SDSU player in the league's seven-year history to be named player of the week.

-Michelle Strawberry and Veronica Shaw were both selected to the all-tournament team at the San Diego Surf 'N Slam. Strawberry averaged 12 points and 4.5 rebounds in the two contests, while Shaw put up comparable numbers at 11.0 ppg. and 6.5 rpg. The pair are the first Aztecs to earn all-tournament honors since 2003.

-The game with Air Force on Jan. 7 was San Diego State's first overtime effort in its seven years as a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Aztecs also went to the extra five-minute period for the first time since the 2002-03 campaign.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02) and has an overall record of 235-170 (.580). Her current SDSU record stands at 154-105 (.595).
