This Week

The San Diego State track and field program will split this Saturday, with the majority of the team traveling to Eugene, Ore., for the Oregon Invitational and the rest heading across town for the UC San Diego Invitational. The Oregon Invite has a day and evening session with most of SDSU's athletes competing in the evening. The meet's morning session gets underway at 10:15 a.m. with the men's discus. The evening session is scheduled to begin at 3 p.m. with the women's hammer. Twenty-nine collegiate teams are scheduled to compete in the meet.

SDSU Lately

Noting the Mt. SAC Relays • SDSU recorded 13 top-five finishes, set two NCAAprovisional-qualifying marks in the 4x400-meter relay and had three athletes set career bests at last weekend's Mt. San Antonio College Relays.

• Highlighting action on Sunday, was the 4x400 relay team of Jini Hogg, Tonette Dyer, Hollann Givens and Ryan Peters, which ran to a fifth-place and NCAAprovisional time of 3:37.27.

• Sunday was a busy day for Hogg and Dyer, with Hogg recording a first-place finish in the 200 meters (24.09) and Dyer a top finish in the 400 meters (52.48). Dyer's time in the 400 is an NCAAprovisional mark and the fastest by an Aztec this season. The pair were also part of Sunday's relay squad that placed first in the 4x100 with a time of 45.48.

• Competition on Saturday, saw Hogg set a personal best of 54.32 in the 400 meters, good for second place in Heat B. Givens also set a career best in the 400 meters (55.43).

• Aztec pole vaulters Jesika Englebretson and Shayla Balentine placed fourth and seventh, respectively, on Saturday. Both cleared 11-11.75 (3.65m), with Englebretson taking fourth with fewer misses.

Noting the Mt. SAC Hepthalon

• Leslie Miller threw a personal best in the javelin on Friday to finish in fourth place in the Mt. SAC Heptathlon. Her seven-event total of 5,472 gives her the seventh-best mark in the nation this season and third-best all-time in the SDSU record book. That mark also qualifies her provisionally for nationals.

• Miller, who picked up 2,270 points in day two of the competition, threw the javelin a distance of 132-10, the best by an Aztec this season. She also leaped a distance of 18-6 in the long jump and ran the 800 meters in 2:17.93.

• Friday's strong finish came on the heels of an outstanding showing on Thursday, in which Miller set PRs in three events. The career bests came in the 100 hurdles (14.12), 200 meters (25.23) and high jump (5-3.25). She also threw the shot a distance of 37-8.75.

Looking Ahead

On May 5, the squad travels to Irvine for the Steve Scott Invitational. The team wraps up the regular season at the Oxy Invite, on May 11.

Under Consideration

The Aztecs' NCAAprovisional mark in the 4x400 this past weekend is the 12th consideration mark set by SDSU this season. The Aztecs' "A" relay squad had already set qualifying marks in the 4x100 and 4x400 at the Cal-Nevada meet in March. Tonette Dyer, a member of both those relay squads, ran an NCAA provisional mark in the 200 meters at the UNLV Desert Classic. Dyer also raced to a provisional time of 53.37 in the 400 meters at the Cal-Nevada Championships and set another in the 400 (52.48) this past weekend. Three SDSU pole vaulters, Shayla Balentine, Patricia Gutierrez and Jesika Englebretson, have cleared a provisional mark at least once this season. Leslie Miller's 5,472 points in the heptathlon this week was also a provisional mark.

Among The National Leaders

Several Aztecs are listed among the top times and marks in the nation this season. Tonette Dyer's time in the 200 meters (23.41) and 400 meters (52.48) are the ninth and sixth best this season. The team's time in the 4x100 (44.77) is the 18th fastest, to go along with the 16th best in the 4x400 (3:36.82). Shayla Balentine's 13-0.25 mark in the pole vault is 14th best. Leslie Miller's 5,472 points in the heptathlon ranks her seventh.

Aztec Honors

Leslie Miller's performance in the heptathlon this past weekend earned her Mountain West Conference player of the week honors. This is Miller's first career athlete of the week award. She is the third Aztec to be honored by the league this season, with sprinter Tonette Dyer being recognized earlier this month and pole vaulter Patricia Gutierrez being selected during the indoor season.

Vaulting To Success

Freshman Shayla Balentine recorded her seventh NCAAprovisional qualifying mark of the season in the pole vault at the All-Women Invite on April 13. Her first-place mark of 3.97 meters (13-00.25) at the Aztec Classic on March 23 was her fourth NCAAprovisional vault in as many meets and tied her best this season. The 13-00.25 mark places her second all-time in SDSU's record book. The mark also puts her atop the Mountain West Conference's list of bests in the event this season. Included in her four-meet NCAAmark streak is winning the MWC's indoor title at the league championships in February with a MWC record vault of 3.84 meters (12-07.50). Earlier in the indoor season she set the SDSU indoor record in the vault with a 3.90 meter (12-09.50) mark at the National Pole Vault Summit in Reno.

Tourney Time

For the second consecutive season, the 28thranked San Diego State men's tennis team, 15-8 overall and 4-1 in Mountain West play, will enter the Mountain West Conference Championship as the top seed. The Aztecs defeated Brigham Young on April 13th, on the final day of the conference season, to clinch the number one seed. The Aztecs receive a firstround bye at the league championship, which begins April 25th in Las Vegas. San Diego State will face the winner of the UNLV-Utah match on Friday, April 26th. SDSU enters the league championship with plenty of momentum, having won a conference-best five straight matches and eight of its last nine overall.

Weekly Rewind

San Diego State completed its regular-season with a busy three-day stretch that saw the Aztecs travel to Utah for matches on April 12th and April 13 before returning home for a nonconference match on April 14.

The Aztecs blanked Utah 7-0 in Salt Lake City. Although the Aztecs' top doubles team of Oliver Maiberger and Ryan Redondo were upset, San Diego State still claimed the doubles point and swept all six singles matches in straight sets.

San Diego State clinched the conference tournament's top-seed by defeating Brigham Young, 6-1. The Cougars entered the match unbeaten in league play, but were only able to win at number two singles.

The Aztecs concluded the busy stretch with a 7-0 shutout of Big West Conference member Pacific. San Diego State was pushed to three sets in only one singles match, in handing the Tigers their sixth loss of the season.

Maiberger and Friends Earn League Honors

Junior Oliver Maiberger was named the player of the year for the second consecutive season and John Nelson earned coach of the year honors as the Mountain West Conference announced its league award winners at the annual banquet on Wednesday night in Las Vegas. Joining Maiberger on the all-MWC singles team were sophomore Felix Hardt and junior Valentino Pest. The three Aztec players named to the all-league singles team tied for league-high honors. In addition, the Aztecs were the only school to place two doubles tandems on the all-conference doubles team. Maiberger and sophomore Ryan Redondo, ranked third nationally, were honored, as was

the 53rd-ranked duo of Hardt and Pest. Since the inception of the Mountain West Conference three years ago, the Aztecs have placed eight players and five doubles teams honored as allleague selections. No school has placed more players on the all-MWC singles team and no school has had as many doubles teams selected as San Diego State.

In The Polls

For the second consecutive week, the San Diego State men's team is ranked 28th in the Omni Hotels Collegiate Tennis Rankings released Wednesday. The current ranking is just three spots below the Aztecs' season-best mark of 25th, established late last month prior to the illness to Oliver Maiberger. One week after falling from 19th to 24th, Maiberger moved up seven positions to 17th in the singles rankings, without playing a match. The junior can earn his second All-America honor in as many seasons by finishing the campaign ranked among the top 20. Maiberger and Ryan Redondo remained at number three in the doubles poll, While Valentino Pest and Felix Hardt are in the poll for the second consecutive week at No. 53.

Quick Volleys

The Aztecs are 15-8 after 23 matches this season, last year SDSU was 14-9 at this point during the season... Last year at this time the Aztecs were ranked 59th in the national polls, this season they are currently 28th... The loss at UNLV on March 31st snapped the Aztecs' 10 match Mountain West Conference win streak and marked the only league defeat for SDSU this season... Felix Hardt, who posted a 3-2 record at number one singles during Maiberger's absence, is 16-7 during the dual campaign... The 16 victories are the most on the squad three more than Ryan Redondo... The Aztecs are 14-1 as a team when winning at number one singles... The doubles combo of Felix Hardt and Valentino Pest are 13-2 during the dual campaign and have won nine straight matches... All three of the current Aztec doubles teams have posted impressive records, including an impressive 11-7 record against ranked opponents... The Aztecs have won the doubles point in nine straight matches.

Tourney Time

The 28th-ranked San Diego State women's tennis team, 16-7 overall and 7-0 in Mountain West Conference play, concluded an 11-2 home campaign with victories over 72nd-ranked Loyola Marymount (6-1) and San Diego (6-1). For the second time in three seasons the Aztecs enter the Mountain West Conference tournament as the top-seed after posting a perfect 7-0 record during the regular season. The Aztecs will battle eighth-seeded Wyoming in the first round of the league championship on April 25th in Provo, Utah. Match time is set for 2 p.m. MDT.

Weekly Rewind

San Diego State won a pair of matches and enters the league tournament having won 11 of 12 matches to end the regular-season campaign. The Aztecs have lost just once since beginning the stretch, which includes a victory over 18thranked Notre Dame on March 15th.

The Aztecs defeated 72nd-ranked Loyola Marymount by a 6-1 score on April 13th. San Diego State won the doubles point and five singles matches, including four in straight sets.

San Diego State disposed of its cross-town rival San Diego, 6-1, on April 16th at the SDSU Courts. Seniors Katey Clark-Becker and Julie Ann Chidley both claimed singles matches for the Aztecs in their final regular-season home match.

Tornier And Co. Honored By League

Junior Silvia Tornier was named player of the year and led a list of five Aztecs that earned allconference recognition as the Mountain West Conference announced its league award winners at the annual banquet on Wednesday night in Provo. Tornier was joined on the all-conference singles team by junior Lindsey Hedberg. Both players made their second consecutive appearance on the squad. San Diego State was the only school to produce two of the six doubles teams honored by the league as all-conference. Junior Katja Karrento and sophomore Katalina Romero were honored, as was the duo of Tornier and freshman Indra Erichsen.

In The Polls

Despite not playing a match in eight days and not losing a match in more than three weeks, the San Diego State women's tennis team dropped two positions in the Omni Hotels Collegiate Tennis Rankings this week. The Aztecs, ranked 28th nationally, have fallen two positions in each of the last two polls despite winning four straight matches during that time frame. The Aztecs are still well above their preseason ranking of 44th. Although the off week was rough on the team rankings, it was apparently time well spent for the individuals in the rankings. Silvia Tornier jumped 10 positions in the ranking from 82 to 72.

Winning At Doubles

One area where San Diego State has received outstanding play has been at doubles. The three current doubles pairings have combined to post a 36-7 record during the dual season. At number one doubles, Katja Karrento and Katalina Romero have posted a 16-6 record, including a 7-2 mark since moving to the top doubles position. Indra Erichsen and Silvia Tornier are undefeated since teaming up, posting a 9-0 record while Julie Anna Chidley and Lindsey Hedberg are 8-1 at number three doubles. The Aztecs combined to win 18 consecutive doubles matches earlier this season and SDSU has been victorious in 33 of its last 36 matches.

Quick Volleys

The Aztecs 16-7 record this season is exactly the same record as the team had after 23 matches last season... The difference is last season the Aztecs were ranked 46th with a 16-7 mark while this season SDSU is 26th, based largely on an increased strength of schedule ... Silvia Tornier, who has played 20 of her 22 dual matches at number one singles, is 16-6 in the dual campaign with five victories over ranked opponents... Katja Karrento and Katalina Romero have combined to post a 16-6 record in dual doubles competition this season... The 16 victories are the most by any Aztec pair this season, seven more than any other tandem... The two knocked off the 53rd-ranked doubles team from Kansas State in their first match playing number one doubles.

Recapping The S.D. City Championships

SDSU won its seventh straight city championship April 13 on Mission Bay, sweeping the competition in all five events. The event serves as championship between in-city rivals SDSU, USD and UCSD. The Aztecs' varsity eight boat took first after a slow start. The team made a power move at the halfway point of the race to win in open water with a time of 7:07.07. USD clocked in at 7:13.20. SDSU's A and B boats placed 1-2 in the novice four competition with times of 8:15.84 and 8:29.12, respectively. For the second straight year, the three-day, 54-hole championship will be played April 29th - May 1st on the Sunriver Resort's Crosswater Course (par 72; 7,188 yards) and features one 18-hole round each day. Play begins at 9 a.m. (PDT) on Monday and Tuesday, with Wednesday's third and final round slated for an 8 a.m. (PDT) start.

The Field

The 25th-ranked Aztecs are one of three Mountain West Conference teams ranked in this week's *Golfweek* top-50 poll. No. 22 New Mexico is the league's highest ranked team with No. 35 UNLV also included in the most recent poll. The other five teams competing at next week's championship are: Air Force, Brigham Young, Colorado State, Utah, and Wyoming.

Poll Watch: SDSU Stays the Course

San Diego State dropped slightly in both polls this week, falling to No. 25 in the *Golfweek* rankings and No. 23 in the GCAACoaches Poll.

Back Spin: Aztecs Struggle at Stanford

John Lieber was the only Aztec to shoot a round of par or better during the entire 54-hole tournament as the Aztecs posted their lowest finish of the season with a ninth at the US Intercollegiate last weekend. Lieber and Mark Warman both placed in the top 25, but SDSU could only manage a 26-over 878 on the par-71 Stanford Golf Course. Scott Henderson was the only other Aztec to crack the top 50, placing 38th in the 91player field.

Aztec Chip Shots

Despite being ranked in the top 25 for most of the 2001-02 campaign, SDSU has just one player ranked in *Golfweek's* top 100--No. 82 John Lieber.
Two Aztecs are ranked in the Mountain West's top 10 in stroke average. John Lieber is No. 2 at 72.3 and Mark Warman checks in at No. 6 with a 72.7 average.

• Eight of the nine players who have appeared in at least two tournaments this season own stroke averages under 74.0.

Just over one stroke separates SDSU's starting five. Lieber leads the way at 72.3 with Brandon Kearney posting the highest average at 73.4.
After not cracking the top 20 since the Aztecs' spring opener in Hawaii, No. 4 player Brandon Kearney has turned the trick twice in two of the last three tournaments, placing third at Oregon and 16th in Texas.

• John Lieber, SDSU's stroke average leader among players with at least nine competitive rounds this season, has placed in the top 25 in 9of-11 events, including five top-5s. The junior has also carded 13 rounds of par or better in the last eight tournaments.

• Lars Johansson has been SDSU's top finisher in two of the last four tournaments, placing second at the USD Invitational and eighth at the Border Olympics.

Head Coach Dale Walker

Head coach Dale Walker is in his second season at the helm of th SDSU golf program. A standout performer for the Aztecs from 1975-79, he has guided the Aztecs to six tournament titles since taking over as head coach.

• Lisa Weise came to SDSU after spending two years at Riverside Community College. As an Aztec, the two-meter has totaled 40 steals, 10 assists, and eight goals in two seasons. As a senior, Weise has seen action in 30 games.

· Whitney Winlow is the lone four-year senior on the Aztec squad. The Nevada native has seen action in every game since her freshman year, playing 146 games as an Aztec. The senior has amassed 57 goals, 27 assists and 134 steals in her four years at San Diego State. Winlow was named all-MPSF as a freshman, and is currently fifth on the record list for career steals.

• Beth Merlo transferred to SDSU from Merced Junior College. In her two years as an Aztec, Merlo has seen action in 61 games, recording 33 steals, 11 assists and eight goals.

• Katie Clark spent two years at Riverside Community College before joining the Aztec squad. In 31 games, the senior has totaled eight assists and two goals. Out of the pool, Clark has achieved academic excellence in the classroom and is a Big Red Award winner for her academic success.

•Heather Stiles came to San Diego State via Sierra Community College. As the leading goalie for the Aztecs, Stiles has recorded 210 saves in her two years on the squad, placing second on the career list. Her 199 saves this year places her fourth on the single season record list and 191 saves as a junior places her fifth. An all-around player, Stiles has added two assists and 10 steals while in the cage this season.
