OFF THE BOUNCE (entering the 2023-24 season)

- San Diego State enters its 103rd season of basketball, its 54th at the Division I level and the seventh under the direction of Brian Dutcher on Monday evening, when the Aztecs play host to Cal State Fullerton.
- The Aztecs and Titans are meeting for the 34th time in school history, with the Aztecs claiming 23 of the previous contests. From Jan. 18, 1964, to Jan. 4, 1969, San Diego State won 10 straight games against Cal State Fullerton. That 10-game win streak is tied for the seventh longest in SDSU program history against a single opponent.
- San Diego State has won 16 straight season-openers against unranked teams, a run dating back to the start of the 2005-06 season and includes an 80-57 victory over the Titans in the 2022-23 season opener. SDSU's last loss to an unranked opponent on opening night came on Nov. 19, 2004, when it ended up on the wrong end of a double-overtime 80-72 defeat at the hands of UC Santa Barbara.
- San Diego State has won 10 straight season openers and 17 of the last 18 to begin a campaign. The lone blemish during the stretch came at the start of the 2012-13 season when SDSU fell to No. 9/9 Syracuse on the USS Midway. Taking into account that the Syracuse game was played outdoors on the flight deck of the USS Midway, the Aztecs have come out victorious in its last 17 season openers played indoors.
- The Aztecs are currently on a 13-game win streak in season openers that have taken place at home.
- San Diego State, which won both the 2022-23 Mountain West regular season and tournament titles and reached the league tournament championship game for the sixth time in head coach **Brian Dutcher's** six seasons, looks for its unprecedented 16th Mountain West men's basketball title. Entering the 2023-24 season, San Diego State has won nine regular season and seven Mountain West tournament titles.
- For the fifth time since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is ranked in the preseason AP Top 25 Poll. The Aztecs No. 17 ranking in the initial poll is the second highest in program history, trailing only the 2014-15 preseason poll in which it was No. 16. Since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, SDSU has appeared in the AP poll for 102 weeks, more than any program in the state of California, ahead of UCLA (86 weeks), Saint Mary's (53 weeks), Southern California (36 weeks) and California (11 weeks).
- San Diego State owns a 108-23 record (82.4 percent) since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. That is the third best record in the nation, trailing only Gonzaga (121-13, 90.3 percent) and Houston (116-22, 84.1 percent). The 10 winningest programs since 2019-20 are listed in the box below.
- San Diego State prepped for the regular season with an 81-50 victory over Cal State San Marcos on October 30. The Aztec defense was in regular-season form, limiting the opposition to 20 points in the second half and only allowing consecutive made field goals on two occasions during the contest.
- Senior **Jaedon LeDee** led the Aztecs with 20 points, eight rebounds and drew an unbelievable 11 fouls. He was 8-of-10 from the line, had a steal, an assist and knocked down two 3-pointers.
- Freshman forward **Miles Heide** finished with 10 points on 4-of-5 shooting from the floor, grabbed seven rebounds and blocked two shots. Sophomore forward **Elijah Saunders** was 3-of-5 from the field, including 1-of-2 from the bonus distance and 1-of-1 from the line, for a total of eight points to go along with eight rebounds and two blocks. Sophomore forward **Demarshay Johnson Jr.** had nine points on 3-of-3 shooting from the floor, knocked down three free throws and pulled down three boards.

- SDSU has advanced to the postseason in 15 of the last 17 seasons in which a champion was crowned (2006 NCAA, 2007-09 NIT, 2010-15 NCAA, 2016 NIT, 2018, 2021-23 NCAA).
- SDSU has won 59 of last 64 games when leading at the half.
- SDSU has won its last 96-of-102 when having a higher FG pct.
- SDSU is 6th nationally in winning percentage (.760) since the beginning of the 2010-11 season.
- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 16.
- Since 2006, SDSU's 14 appearances in its conference championship game are tied for second most in Division I.

- **Brian Dutcher** is in his seventh season as San Diego State's head coach and his 25th season on the Aztec sidelines. In his six seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to five conference titles, six Mountain West championship game appearances, a 151-47 overall record, the 2023 NCAA national championship game, has been named the national coach of the year, and twice the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

AZTECS NO. 17 IN INITIAL AP TOP 25 POLL

The San Diego State men's basketball team is ranked No. 17 in the Associated Press' preseason Top 25 poll, garnering 529 points. It marks the fifth time in program history SDSU has earned inclusion on the initial AP poll and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.

The Aztecs are the only program in the Mountain West to appear in the AP's initial 2023-24 poll.

In its four previous appearances in the AP preseason poll, San Diego State was ranked No. 25 and received 158 points to start the 2010-11 season, was No. 20 with 463 points before the 2012-13 season, No. 16, garnering 560 points, to open the 2014-15 campaign and No. 19 last season with 394 points.

The appearance marks the eighth consecutive week the Aztecs have found themselves among the AP Top 25, dating back to the final poll of the 2022-23 season. On that occasion the team was ranked No. 18, which was published on March 13, 2023.

Overall, the Aztecs have been ranked in the AP Poll 102 weeks, which is the most by any team in the state of California since the start of the 2010-11 season: ahead of UCLA's 86, Saint Mary's 53, Southern California's 36, and California's 11.

Among Mountain West program's total of weeks in the AP Poll since 2010-11, San Diego State's 102 are more than three times more than Nevada and New Mexico's 28 weeks. Others in the league who have appeared in the poll in that time frame are UNLV (27 weeks), Utah State (12 weeks), Colorado State (10 weeks) and Boise State (two weeks).

Possible opponents on SDSU's schedule who appeared in the first AP poll or were receiving votes are Gonzaga (No. 11), Saint Mary's (No. 23), Xavier (8 votes), Boise State (4 votes) and New Mexico (1 votes).

COACHES POLL RANKS SAN DIEGO STATE NO. 15 IN THE PRESEASON

For the fourth time in program history and the second consecutive campaign, San Diego State is ranked in the preseason USA Today Coaches Poll, slotting in at the No. 15 spot.

The ranking is the highest in program history in the Coaches' preseason poll. Previously, a No. 17 rank to open the 2014-15 season was the program best and twice, in 2012-13 and last year, the Aztecs were ranked No. 20 in the first Coaches Poll.

OPENERS

- San Diego State opens its 103rd basketball campaign on The Mesa with a 69-33 (.676) record in season opening games, regardless of location.
- This is the 54th season of Division I basketball at San Diego State and the Aztecs are 34-19 (.642) in DI season-opening games.
- San Diego State has won its last 18 home openers, regardless of if the game was the season opener.
- The Aztecs have won 10 consecutive season openers, regardless of location.

AZTECS PREDICTED TO FINISH FIRST IN MOUNTAIN WEST PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

- San Diego State has won an unprecedented 16 Mountain West titles in men's basketball (nine regular season & seven tournament), double the next highest Mountain West program (New Mexico - 8), and after its run to the 2023 NCAA Tournament national championship game, but losing despite losing five seniors and 50.7 percent of its scoring from a year ago, has been predicted to finish in first by a poll of the media that regularly cover the conference.
- SDSU has been predicted to finish either first or second in the Mountain West media's preseason poll in each of the last 10 years.
- It is also the 15th time in the last 19 years that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the Mountain West's preseason poll.
- San Diego State received 25 of a possible 31 first place votes.
- The Aztecs have garnered at least one first-place vote in the preseason poll in nine of the last 10 years.
- Complete Mountain West media preseason predicted order of finish is located in the column on page 6.

BUTLER AND WATERS EARN PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST HONORS

- In addition to SDSU being predicted to win its Mountain West-record 17th league title in 2023-24, a pair of Aztec players, **Lamont Butler** and **Reese Waters**, were included on the conference's list of preseason honors. Butler was included on the All-MW Team and Waters was named the Newcomer of the Year by the media who regularly cover the Mountain West.
- Last season Butler, a physical guard, was a member of the league's All-Defensive Team and a third-team all-league performer who exploded in the postseason being named to the NCAA All-South Regional Team and a spot on the NCAA All-Tournament Team after hitting the biggest shot in program history, the game winner against Florida Atlantic to send the Aztecs to the national championship game.
- Butler led the Aztecs in 2022-23 in assists (126) and steals (57), ranked No. 2 in field goals (128), and No. 3 in points (345) and minutes (1,010). Among returners from last year's team, he leads the squad in made baskets, assists, steals and ranks second in points, minutes, and assists-to-turnover ratio (1.59:1), and is third in 3-pointers (40) and rebounds (105).
- Butler is the third Aztec to be named to the preseason All-Mountain West in the last four seasons, joining Matt Mitchell who was named to the team prior to the 2020-21 campaign and Matt Bradley, who garnered the distinction prior to the 2022-23 season. Mitchell went on to be named the Mountain West Player of the Year and a first-team performer following the 2021-22 season and Bradley was a first-team all-league honoree last season.
- Waters, a transfer from Southern California and the reigning Pac-12 Sixth Player of the Year, is one of four players in the nation in the last two seasons to have shot at least .439 from the field, .359 from the distance, and .809 from the line while playing in at least 62 games and starting no more than eight times.
- In 2022-23, Waters, the Trojans' third leading scorer, averaged 9.8 points, 3.2 rebounds and 1.1 assists in 25.3 minutes per game. A starter in eight of 29 appearances, the native of Long Beach, Calif., shot 43.8 percent (102-of-233) from the field, 29.6 percent (24-of-81) from beyond the arc, and 77.5 percent (55-of-71) from the line. In addition, he set career-bests in rebounds (93), steals (21), blocks (12) and minutes (734). He reached double figure scoring in 13 contests, including a career-best 20 points vs. Long Beach State on December 14.
- Joining Malachi Flynn (2019-20), Matt Bradley (2021-22), and Darrion Trammell (2022-23), Waters becomes the fourth Aztec in the last five seasons to be recognized by the media as the preseason Newcomer of the Year. Both Flynn and Bradley proved the prognosticators correct by earning the award when the season was complete.

DUTCHER KEEPS THE BALL ROLLING...AND ROLLING

Brian Dutcher has been on The Mesa for now 25 seasons, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he's experienced 537 victories, 16 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 17 postseason tournaments, including 12 NCAA appearances, a three of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014, 20223) and last season past the Sweet 16, to the Elite 8, Final Four and 2023 national championship game.

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured six Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each of his six years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first six seasons.
- His 151 wins in his first six seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first six campaigns.
- His 151 wins to date are the most of any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.

TOP-25 FACTS

- San Diego State opens the 2023-24 season ranked No. 17 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. It is the fifth time that SDSU has been included in the AP top-25 preseason poll; all coming during the Dutcher/Fisher era, and is the second highest preseason ranking for the program in the poll. The program's highest preseason ranking is No. 16, prior to the 2014-15 season.
- The previous four occasions when San Diego State has been ranked in the preseason poll by the AP voters were prior to the 2010-11 season when the Aztecs were initially No. 25; prior to the 2012-13 campaign (No. 20); before 2014-15 (No. 16) and last season at No. 19.
- How important is the preseason ranking or what does it portend? The four previous Aztec teams which were ranked in the preseason AP poll, finished a combined 116-30, including a 59-4 mark in Viejas Arena. Each squad made at least the round of 32 in the NCAA tournament
- with the 2010-11 team reaching the Sweet 16 and finishing the season with a 34-3 record and last season's run to the national cham-

pionship game.

- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight (Dec. 2, 2013, to Dec. 15, 2014).
- Entering this season, the Aztecs have appeared in the AP Poll for 102 weeks, and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.
- San Diego State's 102 appearances in the AP poll are the most of any school in California. (See box on page 4)
- Since the start of the 2019-20 season San Diego State has appeared in the USA Today Coaches Poll 35 times, including this year's preseason ranking of No. 15.

KEEPING IT THE FAMILY

With an opening on the coaching staff following the national championship game at the 2023 NCAA Tournament, head coach **Brian Dutcher** didn't look too far to fill the vacancy when he announced the hiring of one of the most beloved Aztecs of all time, **Aguek Arop**. Arop's responsibility to the program includes scouting, film preparation, camps and academics.

He earned a bachelor's degree in interdisciplinary studies in 2022 and is working on completing a master's degree in homeland security at San Diego State.

The native of Omaha, Neb., finished his five-year playing career at the national championship game of the 2023 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament. A team captain in both the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons, he completed his career ranked No. 5 in conference victories (54), No. 6 in games played (135) and No. 7 in total victories (102) in the 102 years of SDSU men's basketball.

STREAKS ON THE LINE FOR THE AZTECS ON MONDAY

When the Aztecs play at Cal State Fullerton on Monday here are the streaks that are on the line for SDSU:

- 41-game win streak when shooting 50 percent or better.
- 26-game win streak when scoring between 80-89 points.
- 20-game win streak when attempting more free throws than its opponent.
- 20-game win streak when it shoots a higher percentage than its opponent.
- 18-game win streak in home openers.
- 17-game win streak when holding its opponent 40.0 percent or less shooting from the floor.
- 12-game win streak when scoring first.
- 11-game win streak in games in which SDSU holds its opponent to between 50-59 points.
- 10-game win streak in season openers.
- 4-game win streak against Cal State Fullerton.

SERIES HISTORY VS. CAL STATE FULLERTON

- San Diego State leads in the all-time series with Cal State Fullerton, 23-10, and will be looking for its fifth straight win on its home floor against the Titans and its 15th in 19 total meetings on its home floor in the series.
- The last four matchups, all in Viejas Arena and all Aztec wins, have resulted in an 80-57 win last season (Nov. 7, 2022), a 66-56 decision (Dec. 8, 2022), a 82-68 win on Dec. 9, 2009, where Kawhi Leonard set career-highs with 23 points and 18 rebounds, and a 63-60 victory on Dec. 21, 2004.
- The series started in 1964 with the Aztecs winning the first 10 meetings and half of those matchups coming on San Diego State's home court. Over the next dozen matchups, from Jan. 4, 1969-to-Feb. 11, 1978, the Titans were more competitive in limiting SDSU to eight wins, and in the last 11 games Cal State Fullerton has reversed the trend, earning six wins.
- In its 14 home wins, the Aztecs average margin of victory is 17.2 points, while its four losses have been by an average of 9.3 points.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 133-35 (.792) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but four of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 96 home games against those same 24 opponents, and starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 87-11 (.888).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 467-325 (.590) overall.

San Diego State opens the 2023-24 season hosting an in-state foe in Cal State Fullerton and will also play Long Beach State (11/14), vs. Saint Mary's (11/17), vs. California (11/25), at UC San Diego (12/1), UC Irvine (12/9), Stanford (12/21), Fresno State (1/3), at San Jose State (1/9), at Fresno State (2/24) & San Jose State (2/27).

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament 10 of the last 12 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, San Diego State has the seven-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 199-25 home record, winning 88.8 percent of its home games during that span.

In the midst of the 2022-23 season, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 235 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 209-26 mark (88.9 percent), including a 108-12 record (90.0 percent) in its last 120 home games against non-conference competition.
- **Since the start of the 2002-03 season, San Diego State has a 145-30 (82.9 percent) home record against conference opponents.**
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 154-21 (88.0 percent) at home, including a 67-9 (88.2 percent) record in non-conference home contests during that stretch and 64-7 (90.1 percent) against non-top 25 non-conference foes.
- The Aztecs are 77-11 (87.5 percent) in their last 88 conference home games and 71-9 (88.8 percent) in their last 80 non-conference home games.

MORE HOME COOKING

- In the last 59 home games, San Diego State is 54-5, with an average scoring margin of +14.4 points in those victories. In 46 of those 59 home wins, the game was decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs current 13-game non-conference home court win streak, started on November 11, 2021, against UC Riverside, equals the sixth-longest in school history; a win streak that began on December 16, 2000 and ran to November 23, 2002.
- **San Diego State is 65-6 in its last 71 home games dating back to January 1, 2019.**
- **The Aztecs are 47-5 in their 50 Mountain West Conference home games since January 24, 2018.**
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on nine occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2019-20, 2021-22 and 2022-23).

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

San Diego State will play three neutral site and 13 true road games during the 2023-24 regular season and here are some road and neutral site facts about SDSU:

- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 101-59 (.631) record in road games is the fifth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 165-91 (.637) record in road/neutral games is the seventh best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 101-59 (.631) record in road games against the Mountain West, leads the conference.

SAN DIEGO – The No. 17-ranked San Diego State men's basketball team opened their 2023-24 season on Monday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena with an 81-50 victory over Cal State San Marcos.

Jaedon LeDee led all scorers with 20 points on 5-of-12 shooting and 8-of-10 at the free throw line. Miles Heide was the only other player on the home side in double figures with 10 points off the bench. Of the 14 Aztecs to see time on the court, 11 made at least one field goal.

In addition to their scoring, LeDee brought down eight rebounds and Heide grabbed seven. Elijah Saunders also recorded eight rebounds in the victory to go along with his eight points.

The Aztecs got off to a slow start with Cal State San Marcos owning a 9-4 lead at the first media timeout and leading by as many as six points through the first five and a half minutes. Momentum shifted after a Miles Byrd second chance layup with 14:17 on the clock sparked a quick 6-0 run to even the score. The rest of the half saw SDSU outscore San Marcos by 13, ending on a BJ Davis three with nine seconds to play. The Aztecs went into the break with a 43-30 lead.

The second half was all scarlet and black as their lead jumped out to 20 points by the second media timeout. The scoring run peaked at 14-1 over a 5:32 span that saw San Diego State lead 69-38 with seven and a half minutes to play. Part of that stretch included the defense forcing Cal State San Marcos to miss 11 consecutive shots and just one in 18 attempts.

The Aztecs cruised down the stretch with their lead never falling below 29 points in the final eight minutes on their way to the 81-50 victory.

As a team, San Diego State shot 45.8% from the field while outrebounding the Cougars, 53-21, including a 17-4 advantage on the offensive side that led to a 21-0 difference in second chance points. SDSU also controlled the inside game, outscoring the opposition 36-12 in the paint, and points off turnovers with a 21-7 advantage.

AZTECS FINISH AT A PROGRAM-BEST NO. 2 IN FINAL 2022-23 COACHES POLL

Reaching the 2023 NCAA Tournament national championship game, San Diego State garnered a No. 2 rank in the final Coaches Poll of the 2022-23 season.

The ranking is the highest in program history in the Coaches' final poll and the sixth time SDSU has been ranked at the end of the year by the coaches. The previous high ranking at the end of a season was No. 5 in 2010-11. The Aztecs have also slotted in at No. 6 (2019-20), NO. 11 (2013-14), No. 18 (2020-21) and No. 23 (2011-12).

BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

Seventh Season • 25th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his seventh season as head coach after leading the Aztecs to six Mountain West title games, their conference-high 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th and 16th Mountain West titles and four trips to the NCAA tournament, including a run to the 2023 national championship game.

Dutcher, who ascended to head coach following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Over the course of his 24 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 17 times, including 12 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 16 Mountain West titles and record 18 seasons of at least 20 victories. He is the only coach in the 102-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first six seasons and his 151 victories are the most of any first-time Division I head coach who began at their current institution since the start of the 2017-18 season.

His .763-win percentage (151-47) entering the 2023-24 season is the best in program history, as is his .550-win percentage (11-9) against top-25 opposition.

In 2017-18, Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors, Trey Kell and Malik Pope, that had won multiple league titles and had NCAA tournament experience. The Aztecs won six consecutive games to end the regular season and captured the program's 11th crown, the Mountain West tournament title, and returned to the NCAA tournament. Dutcher was the only first-year head coach to guide his team to the 2018 NCAA tourney and one of six to have won at least 20 games. SDSU finished the campaign with a 22-11 record, with the 22 wins representing the most by a first-year Aztec men's basketball head coach and the second-most among first-year coaches that season.

The 2018-19 season saw the Aztecs return to the Mountain West championship game after twice defeating nationally ranked Nevada, including a 65-56 victory over the Wolf Pack in the semifinal of the MW tournament. The team was 21-13, the 13th consecutive season with at least 19 victories.

In 2019-20, his squad ripped off a program-record 26 straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at No. 4 in both the AP and Coaches top-25 polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2 on the year, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), NABC Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and USBWA District IX Coach of the Year. In addition, he was a finalist for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, the team's 30 wins are the fifth most and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in MW play are the most in program history. Its one loss in league action is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak also which set a Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus All-American Malachi Flynn, who would be a first-round selection of the NBA Toronto Raptors, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blowout victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. In addition, the Aztecs handed Utah a 28-point loss in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic, three days after the Utes beat No. 6 Kentucky.

In the COVID-affected season of 2020-21, the Aztecs were once again the cream of the Mountain West crop posting a 23-5 record, including a 14-3 mark in league play. San Diego State earned the league's regular season and tournament crowns in the NCAA tournament were a 6-seed. For the second consecutive campaign, Dutcher was named Coach of the Year of both the Mountain West and NABC Division I District 17.

The Aztecs opened 2020-21 with a win over No. 22 UCLA and later won at No. 23 Arizona State. The team reached the MW title game for the fourth straight season earning a measure of revenge in the championship game, defeating Utah State, 68-57, which had had knocked them off in the previous two league title games.

The team was led by seniors Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel, who became the 34th and 35th players in program history, respectively, to score 1,000 points in their careers. Mitchell was named an honorable-mention AP All-American honors, Mountain West Player of the Year, first-team All-Mountain West, Mountain West All-Defensive Team, NABC first-team All-District 17, USBWA first-team All-District IX, Basketball Times West Coast All-District Team, Mountain West Tournament Most Valuable Player, Mountain West All-Tournament Team and was the sixth player, and first Aztec, in Mountain West history to earn Player of the Year & Tournament MVP in the same year. Schakel was second-team All-Mountain West, NABC second-team All-District 17 and a Mountain West All-Tournament Team honoree.

The 2021-22 campaign demonstrated that despite losing its top three scorers from the previous

season, the Aztecs reload while other programs rebuild. For the fifth consecutive year, Dutcher guided the Aztecs to 20-plus wins (23-9), and a bid to the NCAA tournament, the third since taking the helm of the program. If not for the cancellation of the 2020 NCAA tournament, SDSU, which was projected to be a No. 1 or No. 2 seed with a 30-2 record, the 2021-22 season would have marked the program's third straight, and fourth overall, NCAA appearance under Dutcher.

San Diego State authored a 79-49 dismantling of No. 20 Colorado State at Viejas Arena, the worst beating SDSU has ever handed to a ranked opponent, and a 63-58 win over the No. 23 Rams in the semifinal of the Mountain West Championship. Entering 2022-23, Dutcher was 5-0 against top-25 opponents in Viejas Arena and 9-6 overall against ranked teams.

Matt Bradley, a transfer from California, slipped seamlessly into the Aztecs offense, led the team in scoring, 16.9 points per game, and was named the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, first-team All-Mountain West, second team NABC All-District 17 and earned both ESPN and NCAA March Madness National Player of the Week honors. In addition, sophomore guard Lamont Butler was a Mountain West All-Defensive Team designee and Chad Baker was the league's sixth man of the year.

The years leading to 2022-23 set the stage for men's basketball history. Following its 15th and 16th Mountain West Crowns, San Diego State earned a No. 5-seed in the NCAA Tournament and began the most epic run in program history. In its 10th appearance in the last 13 NCAA Tournaments, the Aztecs ended five multi-game win streaks in snapping the College of Charleston's 10-game win streak in the NCAA First Round and Furman's seven-game win streak in the second round. It then ended No. 1/2 Alabama's five-game win streak in the Sweet 16, Creighton's three-game win streak in the Elite 8 and Florida Atlantic's 11-game win streak in the Final Four.
