## First-Place Aztecs Play First Home Game in Two Weeks; Carry Seven-Game Winning Streak into League Showdown with Air Force

San Diego State (15-6 overall; 8-1 Mountain West Conference), winners of a Division I era school-record seven consecutive conference games, looks to avenge its only loss of 2006 and extend the school's longest winning streak in 22 years when the Aztecs play host to Air Force on Wednesday night at Cox Arena.

The game will be televised by Channel 4 San Diego, with Steve Quis (play-by-play) and Jim Brogan (analysis) calling the action. Ted Leitner will provide the call on radio, CASH 1700-AM.

The Aztecs extended their winning streak to seven games and won its fourth consecutive league road game for the first time since 1968-70 with an 85-81 victory over Colorado State last Saturday.

Junior forward Marcus Slaughter recorded his fifth double-double in six games with 25 points and 11 rebounds. Junior guard Brandon Heath tied a career-high with five three-point field goals and a season-high 28 points. Junior forward Mohamed Abukar reached double figures for a career-best fourth straight game with 13 points and senior guard John Sharper scored 11 points off the bench.

San Diego State shot 63.8 percent from the field, its highest percentage ever in a Mountain West Conference game.

Heath earned co-Mountain West Conference Player of the Week honors for his effort Saturday. It marked the second time this season and SDSU record-tying fourth time he has earned the accolade in his career. Michael Cage and Aerick Sanders also won the honor four times.

Air Force enters the game 18-4 overall and 6-3 in league play following a 65-59 loss at Brigham Young on Saturday. The Falcons, which have won 16 of their last 19 games, are the only team to defeat San Diego State this calendar year.

The teams are meeting for the 55th time with San Diego State owning a 36-18 series lead. Earlier this season, SDSU gave Air Force its biggest scare at home, losing to the Falcons, which are 12-0 at home this season, 65-62. The Aztecs are 19-6 against the Falcons in San Diego, but just 4-3 against the Academy in Cox Arena. Air Force has won on their last two visits to San Diego (57-43 in 2004 and 77-57 in 2005).

This is the first of two home games this week against the last two teams to claim the MWC regular season titles. Following the game against Air Force, which won the 2004 regular season championship, SDSU will entertain defending league champion Utah on Saturday at noon PST. The Aztecs will be going for their first regular season sweep of the Utes since '82.

On Wednesday, SDSU will have gone 32 days since its last defeat (the loss at Air Force) and the Aztecs have lost just one game in the last 42 days (dating back to Dec. 27).

Once again this season, SDSU is teaming up with Channel 4 San Diego to produce Aztec Sports Weekly.

The 30-minute sports magazine show highlights the week in San Diego State athletics. Each week head coach Steve Fisher and a men's basketball player will review the previous week's action and look ahead to upcoming games.

## Storylines

► San Diego State carries a seven-game winning streak into Wednesday's game with Air Force. That is the longest Aztec winning streak since an eight-game winning streak from Nov. 29-Dec. 22, 1984.

► It also is the sixth longest active win streak nationally, trailing only George Washington (10), Gonzaga (10), Memphis (10), Connecticut (9) and Bucknell (9), through Monday's games.

► San Diego State improved to number 55 in the RPI following the road win at Colorado State. That marks the Aztecs highest ranting since a final rating of 39 in 2001-02. The number is even more impressive when considering the fact that SDSU was ranked 208 following a 4-4 start.

► In addition to winning seven straight games, San Diego State has also won nine of 10 and 11 of its last 13 games.

► The Aztecs have won seven consecutive conference games, their longest league winning streak in the 36 seasons at the Division I level. The last time San Diego State won seven straight was from Feb. 9-Mar. 1, 1968. The last time SDSU won eight straight league games was from Feb. 26, 1966-Feb. 17, 1967.

► San Diego State is 9-1 at home this season and has won seven consecutive games at Cox Arena. It is SDSU's longest homecourt winning streak since winning nine straight come contests during the March 3, 2001-January 19, 2002.

► Although not on line Wednesday, San Diego State has an impressive and significant road winning streak. The Aztecs have won four straight road games for the first time since winning four straight from Nov. 30, 2002-Jan. 11, 2003. The win streak has come against conference opponents making it the first time SDSU has won four straight league road games since winning six straight road games during a three season stretch from Feb. 9, 1968-Jan. 16, 1970 (streak covered a period of time when SDSU was in the CCAA, an independent and in the PCAA).

► San Diego State has won its last encounter with eight of the nine Mountain West Conference teams. Only Air Force has defeated SDSU in their most recent meeting. The Aztecs have also won on their most recent visit to six MWC facilities (Brigham Young's Marriott Center, UNLV's Thomas & Mack Center, Utah's Huntsman Center, TCU's Daniel-Meyer Coliseum, Wyoming's Arena-Auditorium and Colorado State's Moby Arena).

► San Diego State shot lights out on Saturday in Fort Collins, Colo., setting a school MWC record by connecting on 63.8 percent from the field. The Aztecs also were impressive from three-point range (9-of-15, 60.0 percent) and the free throw line (16-of-20, 80.0 percent). In MWC play, the Aztecs are shooting 50.4 percent from the field, 43.0 percent from three-point range and 78.9 percent from the free throw line.

► For the season, San Diego State is shooting 47.2 percent. Only once in the past 17 seasons have the Aztecs shot that well for an entire season (2001-02, 47.6 percent). San Diego State is 8-1 this season when shooting 50 percent or better from the field, a number SDSU has reached in eight of its last 10 games.

► San Diego State claimed its fifth Mountain West Conference Player of the Week honor this season when Brandon Heath earned the honor on Monday. Juniors Heath and Marcus Slaughter have each won the award twice and freshman Kyle Spain has been honored once.

► Junior guard **Brandon Heath** earned co-Mountain West Conference Player of the Week honors on Monday marking the second time this season and the fourth time in his career he has won the award. He posted big numbers Saturday at Fort Collins, scoring a game and season-high 28 points on 10-of-13 shooting, including 5-of-7 from three-point range. He added a game-high five assists, three steals and two rebounds. Heath has been outstanding of late, averaging 20.5 points in his last 10 games and connecting on 36 of his last 75 attempts (48.0 percent) from three-point range. He is the MWC leader in scoring, three point field goals made and free throw percentage.

► With his 28 points against Colorado State, **Brandon Heath** has moved into fifth place on SDSU's all time scoring chart with 1,327 points. Next up for Heath will be Bob Brady in fourth position. Brady, who played with the Aztecs for three seasons in the early 1950s, ended his career with 1,389 points, leaving Heath 62 points shy of his mark entering Wednesday's games.

► Junior forward **Marcus Slaughter** recorded his fifth double-double in six games, the 10th of the season and the 22nd of his career with 25 points and a game high 11 rebounds against Colorado State on Saturday. With 10 double-double this season, Slaughter has matched his single-season total from last season and he now ranks third on the career charts with 22 double-doubles (trailing Michael Cage (61) and Joel Kramer (26)). He also moved into 10th place on the career rebounding chart with 639 boards. He needs just three rebounds to pass Will Connelly for ninth place (641) and four rebounds to pass Noel Mickelsen (642) for eighth place. He is currently in 18th place on the career scoring list with 1,031 points and needs just four points to pass Dave Miller in 17th place, 13 points to pass Milton Phelps in 16th position and 18 points to displace Danny Newport in 15th place.

► Through Sunday's games, **Marcus Slaughter** ranked 10th in the nation in rebounding at 10.7 boards per game. He is currently averaging a double-double and is looking to become just the third SDSU player in the Division I era to average a double-double. Chris McMurray (1971-72) and Michael Cage (1980-81, 1982-83 and 1983-84) are the only two players to average a double-double in SDSU's 36 Division I seasons.

► Junior transfer Mohamed Abukar continues to make his presence felt. He has reached double figures in scoring in four straight games for the first time in his career and the Aztecs have won seven straight when he scores at least 10 points.



### ► THE SERIES

This will be the 55th meeting between Air Force and San Diego State, with the Aztecs owning a 36-18 series lead. The Academy has won five of the last six meetings between the teams, including a 65-62 decision at Clune Arena on Jan. 7. SDSU is 19-6 all-time at SDSU; however, the Falcons have won the last two in San Diego.

### ► PLAYER NOTE

SDSU junior forward **Marcus Slaughter** has nearly averaged a double-double against the Academy, at 12.8 ppg and 9.4 rpg. Senior center **Trimaime Davis** has connected on 73.3 percent (11-of-15) of his career field goals against the Falcons... SDSU's current players are 54-of-72 from the free throw line (75.0 percent).

## Aztecs Secure Seventh Consecutive Win and Claim Fourth Victory in Fort Collins with 85-81 Victory at Colorado State

FORT COLLINS, Colo. -- San Diego State set a school record for field goal shooting in a Mountain West Conference game and juniors Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter combined for 53 points on 18-of-24 shooting as the Aztecs defeated Colorado State 85-81 at Moby Arena.

The Aztecs recorded their seventh straight victory, seventh straight Mountain West Conference win, fourth consecutive road victory and fourth consecutive road conference win.

San Diego State set a school record by shooting 63.8 percent from the field. That is the highest ever by SDSU in a Mountain West Conference game.

The Rams jumped in front early, leading 13-6 and 21-15 with 13:49 to go in the first half. San Diego State used an 18-6 run to take the lead for good and enjoyed a 45-39 half-time advantage.

The Aztecs pushed the advantage to 15 points at 80-65 with 5:49 to play before a 14-0 Colorado State run closed the advantage to just one point with 1:16 to play.

The Aztecs made five of six free throws in the final 52 seconds, including two free throws by John Sharper with two seconds remaining to provide the final margin.

Heath earned Mountain West Conference Player of the Week honors after scoring a season high and game high 28 points on 10-of-13 shooting from the field. He tied a career high with five three-point field goals and added five assists.

Slaughter recorded his fifth double-double in six games with 25 points and a game-high 11 rebounds. He was 8-for-11 from the field and 9-for-11 from the free throw line.

SDSU won in Fort Collins for just the fourth time in school history and completed the school's second road sweep of Wyoming and Colorado State.

### San Diego State-Air Force: The Series

► San Diego State and Air Force are meeting for the 55th time, with the Aztecs holding a 36-18 series lead.

► The Aztecs own a 19-6 advantage in games played in San Diego; however, the Falcons have won the last two games played at Cox Arena (57-43 in 2004 and 77-57 in 2005). San Diego State is 4-3 against the Academy in Cox Arena.

► It used to be like clockwork. When SDSU and Air Force got together, the team with the halftime lead would go on to win the game. In fact, the team leading at intermission had won 10 straight coming into the 2004-05 campaign. But last year the team with the halftime advantage lost all three games. The Aztecs led at the break in Colorado Springs (Jan. 29), 25-24, only to lose, 62-50. A month later, on Feb. 28, in San Diego, SDSU went into the locker room up three, 33-30, but could not overcome 27.3 percent shooting in the second half and wound up losing, 77-57. In the MWC quarterfinals, Air Force led 29-27 at intermission only to see the Aztecs battle back and win 73-68. In this season's earlier game, Air Force reverted to the old trend, and despite losing an 11-point halftime advantage, the Falcons were victorious, 65-62.

► In eight of the last nine years in which the teams have met, one team has swept the regular season series from the other. In 1996, 1997, 1998, 2001 and 2003, the Aztecs broke out the broom, while in 2000, 2004 and 2005, Air Force won both meetings. The only time since 1996 that there was not a season sweep was in 2002 when each team defended its home court.

► The series with the Falcons is the only MWC match-up in which the Aztecs hold the all-time lead. The 36-18 lead is 13.5 games better than the Aztecs' next closest series against a conference foe, a 24-33 deficit to Wyoming.

► Reaching 60 points in Wednesday's game seems to be a key to victory for the Aztecs against the Falcons. Going back to the 1990-91 season over 29 meetings, SDSU has won all but two games (17-2) against Air Force in which it scored 60 or more points.

► Series Trends: The team ahead at the half has won 11 of the last 14 games in the series (all three losses came last season)... The team with the fewest turnovers has won eight of the last 10 games in the series... Since Feb. 24, 2000, teams that reach 60 points are 11-2... Since the formation of the MWC, SDSU is 6-3 vs. the Falcons when committing 18 or less turnovers in a game and 0-5 vs. Air Force when committing 19 or more turnovers... Four of the last seven games that SDSU has lost, the Aztecs have turned the ball over exactly 19 times... Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter have combined to score 140 career points against Air Force, 52 of which came in SDSU's victory last March in the MWC tournament... Sophomore guard Matt Thomas recorded his career high of 20 points vs. Air Force last season (Feb. 28, 2005).

USAFA, Colo. -- Air Force connected on half of its 26 three-point field goal attempts to win for the 35th time in its last 36 home games, holding off San Diego State, 65-62.

The Aztecs, playing with MWC preseason player of the year Marcus Slaughter (recovering from a second-degree MCL injury to his left knee) and MWC preseason newcomer of the year Mohamed Abukar (102 degree temperature) less than 100 percent, took Air Force to the games' final possession before the Falcons were able to win for the 35th time in 36 home games.

San Diego State led 21-13 with 9:08 to play in the first half, before the Academy ended the half on a 21-2 run, to take a 34-23 lead into intermission.

Air Force led by six points with less than a minute left when Brandon Heath stole the ball and scored on a layup to cut the deficit to four points. Following a Falcon missed free throw, Abukar made a pair of free throws to cut the Air Force lead to two points with 21 seconds remaining.

Dan Nwaelele made a pair of free throws to push the advantage to four points before a Richie Williams trey cut the deficit to one point with six seconds left.

Matt McCraw made two free throws for the Academy to put the lead at three with four seconds left and secured the victory for Air Force by stealing in the inbound pass.

Heath led all scorers with 21 points on 5-of-7 shooting from three-point range. Slaughter added 10 points and nine rebounds.

DENVER -- Brandon Heath scored 28 points and Marcus Slaughter added 24, helping sixth-seeded San Diego State upset third-seeded Air Force 73-68 in the first round of the Mountain West Conference tournament at the Pepsi Center.

With the victory, the Aztecs advanced to face New Mexico in the semifinals.

SDSU led by as much as 13 in the second half before the Falcons cut the lead to 65-62 on Matt McCraw's 3-pointer with 58 seconds left.

Air Force seemed destined to take control when Matt Thomas subsequently missed two free throws. However, the Falcons couldn't control the rebound and Jacob Burtschi was called for a technical foul for arguing the call. Heath then hit two free throws and Slaughter added two more, all but ending Air Force's chances.

Antoine Hood scored 17 points for Air Force, which committed 15 turnovers.

Slaughter hit 9-of-14 shots and grabbed nine rebounds, while Heath added seven assists and six rebounds.

San Diego State struggled with Air Force's methodical offense early on as the Falcons hit five 3-pointers in the first 11 minutes and went on an 11-4 run to go up 19-11.

However, the Aztecs quickly adjusted to disrupt Air Force's passing lanes and closed within 29-27 by halftime. SDSU kept it going in the second half, forcing four straight turnovers early to start a 20-8 run that put them up 47-37.

State battled back on senior night and used a 24-11 run to build a six-point advantage before settling for a 33-30 lead at intermission.

San Diego State scored its first 27 points of the game without tapping into its two leading scorers on the season. Brandon Heath (18.0) and Slaughter (17.3), who had accounted for 50.9 percent of SDSU's points this season, did not score a point until Heath converted made a pair of free throws with 3:39 to play in the first half.

After committing just three turnovers in the first half, SDSU turned the ball over three times in the first 4:20 of the second half. Air Force tied the game at 37 on Antoine Hood's layup off a pass from Nick Welch. That was part of an 11-0 Falcon run, which resulted in a 46-39 Air Force lead with 12:41 remaining.

San Diego State cut an 11-point deficit to eight with 3:08 to play, but was unable to get any closer. The Falcons shot 52.8 percent from the field in the contest, while the Aztecs converted on just 40.0 percent from the field.

SDSU was led by true freshman Matt Thomas, who connected on 12-of-13 free throws and ended the game with 20 points. Heath and junior forward Triamine Davis each contributed 10 points and five rebounds.

**2005 MEETING AT USAFA**

**Air Force 62, San Diego State 50 | Jan. 29, 2005 | Clune Arena**

USAFA, Colo. -- Jacob Burtschi scored 16 points to lead Air Force to a 62-50 win over San Diego State at Clune Arena. With the win, Air Force moved into sole possession of second place in the conference and captured its 23rd consecutive win at home, the nation's second-longest home winning streak.

The Falcons started cold from three-point range and trailed by a point at the half. Air Force's Nick Welch made a layup with 13:48 left in the game to start a 10-1 run for the Falcons early in the second half. Welch finished with 10 points.

A three-pointer by Tim Keller put Air Force up 41-30 with 10:10 left to play. The Falcons made 4-of-15 shots from three-point range in the first half but in the second half made 6-of-11.

A three-pointer by the Falcons' Marc Holum with 9:14 to play started another run that ended with a 3-pointer by Matt McCraw at 2:41 that put Air Force up 54-37. Keller finished with 12 points, while McCraw finished with 11. Burtschi also contributed on defense with five defensive rebounds and four steals.

Hitting shots from the low post and mid-range, SDSU shot 64 percent from the field in the first half, with Marcus Slaughter going 4-for-4 for eight points, while Brandon Heath went 3-for-5 for eight points in the half.

The Aztecs led 25-24 at the break and could have led by more had it made more than 1-of-8 free-throw attempts in the first half.

**LAST SDSU REGULAR-SEASON VICTORY**

**San Diego State 49, Air Force 47 | Mar. 2, 2003 | Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl**

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State shredded the NCAA's top scoring defense with a season-best 61.4 percent shooting performance and snapped a three-game losing skid with a 67-53 win over Air Force at Cox Arena.

The Aztecs completed the season series sweep of the Falcons behind a 28-point performance from Tony Bland while making 27-of-44 field goal attempts for the highest percentage yielded by Air Force to date.

Mike Mackell chipped in 16 points as SDSU gained its third straight win over the Academy and improved to 7-0 in 2002-03 when holding the opposition to fewer than 60 points.

The teams traded the lead 10 times and were tied on seven other occasions as the Falcons hit 8-of-10 three-pointers and the Aztecs shot the ball at a 66.7 percent clip in the first half. Neither team led by more than three points over the first 17 minutes of the first period, until the Aztecs went on an 8-0 run behind five straight Bland points and a Steve Sir three-pointer to take a 39-32 lead.

SDSU maintained at least a seven-point lead the rest of the way as the Aztecs never yielded back-to-back baskets in the second half. Air Force cut the lead to 55-48 with 6:19 left, but San Diego State responded with a 12-2 run highlighted by an alley-oop dunk from Trimaine Davis.

Bland and Mackell combined for 44 of the Aztecs' 67 points and shot 18-for-22. Tommy Johnson came off the bench to provide a defensive spark with a career-high three steals.

**Aztec Cliff Notes**

The preseason favorite to win the Mountain West Conference, San Diego State has overcome playing without key components of the team during the non-conference campaign to post an 15-6 overall record and a 8-1 MWC mark. San Diego State has played great of late, winning seven straight, 11 of its last 13 games and is 8-1 since having all three of its main scoring weapons - Brandon Heath, Marcus Slaughter and Mohamed Abukar.

The Aztecs have played without MWC preseason player of the year Marcus Slaughter (missed three games), MWC newcomer of the year Mohamed Abukar (10 games) and team captain Trimaine Davis (four games) due to injuries (Slaughter and Davis) and NCAA transfer rules (Abukar). The result was nine different players earning starts and seven different lineups in the first 13 games of the season. The lineup has been more consistent of late with SDSU going with two guards (Brandon Heath and Richie Williams) and three forwards (Marcus Slaughter, Mohamed Abukar and Kyle Spain) starting the last seven of nine games. With Spain serving a team suspension, the Aztecs have looked to sophomore Matt Thomas in the starting lineup.

Despite missing three games, junior forward Marcus Slaughter has enjoyed a tremendous season. He is averaging a double-double at 17.4 ppg and 10.7 rpg. Prior

to an injury in the Dec. 17th game against UC Santa Barbara, he had scored 22 or more points in four consecutive game for the first time in his career and had three consecutive double-doubles. The injury, a second degree MCL sprain to the left knee, kept him sidelined until he played in the league opener against Colorado State. He has posted double-doubles in five of his last six games and has 127 points and 80 rebounds in his last six games. He earned his second MWC player of the week honor of the season last month.

Slaughter is joined in the frontcourt by Mohamed Abukar. The junior transfer from Florida scored in double figures in his first three games in an Aztec uniform. Against Colorado State, he tied a career high with 22 points on 10-of-12 shooting from the field. He is averaging 12.6 points and 4.0 rebounds and has reached double figures in a career best four straight games.

The surprise of the season may be true freshman forward Kyle Spain. Spain is averaging 10.2 points, 6.2 rebounds and has played the second most minutes on the team behind Heath. He has connected on 51.1 percent of his field goal attempts and the Aztecs are 9-1 when he scores in double figures. He will miss his third straight game on Wednesday as he serves a team suspension.

Junior Brandon Heath heads up the backcourt. He leads the MWC in scoring at 18.2 ppg and is shooting 42.6 percent from three-point range. Heath also leads the league in free throw percentage at 84.8. He has scored 20 or more points 11 times this season and 32 times in his career.

Another true freshman, Richie Williams, starts at the point guard position for the Aztecs. Williams has played in all 21 games and made 20 starts for SDSU. He leads the team in assists (69) and in steals (37), while averaging 5.7 points and 2.4 rebounds. He has had six assists on four occasions this season.

With the starting lineup now secure, San Diego State has quality experience off the bench.

Senior guard John Sharper may be the best three-point field goal shooter in the league. He is 51-of-120 (42.5 percent) this season and is among the league leaders in treys. He has made at least two three-point field goals in 17 of his last 20 games and has averaged just one turnover every 30.7 minutes this season. Sharper is averaging 8.6 ppg.

Senior center Trimaine Davis serves as the team captain and is instant energy when he enters the game. A 69.1 percent field goal shooter, Davis is averaging 5.4 ppg and 2.7 rpg. He has started six games this season and is averaging 17.2 minutes per game.

Senior center Mohamed Camara is one of the most improved players in the league. A big man that gives SDSU a wide body presence in the paint, he is averaging 2.9 ppg and 4.2 rpg. He has turned into an offensive threat but still continues to excel on the defensive end of the court.

## One of the Best MWC Teams Ever?

It's a bit premature to make that statement, but what San Diego State has done through the first half of the league rotation can not be ignored. The Aztecs have posted a 8-1 record, aided by winning four league road games. San Diego State (and UNLV) join eight other teams as the only MWC squads to post three conference road wins in the first half of the league season. The other eight teams went on to either win or share the league title.

As impressive, is San Diego State's scoring margin of +9.2 would rank second in league history behind only Utah's +12.1 margin set last season. Wednesday's opponent, Air Force is also on the list with a league scoring margin of +7.8, good for fifth place. Below is a look at the all-time best scoring margins in league history.

## Starting Conference Strong

At 8-1, San Diego State is off to its best conference start in its 36 seasons at the Division I level. The last time SDSU won eight of its first nine conference games was when the 1966-67 NCAA Division II quarterfinal squad opened with an identical 8-1 mark and finished league play at 9-1.

No Aztec squad has ever won its first seven league games, meaning the Aztecs have matched their best league start in the 85-season history of San Diego State basketball.

This marks just the eighth time in the Division I era that the Aztecs have a winning conference record after eight games.

If history is any indication, the solid league start is a good indicator the season will end up well for SDSU. In the Division I era, only four Aztec teams have opened up by winning six of their first eight conference games. Of those four, two went on to the NCAA Tournament and one advanced to the NIT. Three of the four ended the season with a winning record and two won at least 20 games.

How far has the San Diego State program come? The eight conference wins this season are more than the Aztecs posted in the entire conference seasons in the past nine years. The eight league victories match SDSU's highest conference win total since 1995-96 when the Aztecs went 8-10 in the Western Athletic Conference. San Diego State's last winning league record came in 1984-85 (11-5) and the Aztecs last regular-season conference title was a share for the PCAA crown in 1977-78 (11-3).

In nine conference games this season (8-1), SDSU has matched its victory total (8) from the previous 27 league games (8-19).

### The 21-Game Start

At 15-6, San Diego State is off to its best 21-game start since opening the 1984-85 season with a 16-5 record. Since that time the Aztecs best record after 21 games was 13-8 in both 1995-96 and 2001-02, meaning that regardless of the outcome on Wednesday, SDSU already has clinched its best 22-game record since the 1984-85 campaign.

This marks the third best start in the Division I era, with the two previous best starts yeilding trips to the postseason (NCAA in 1984-85 and NIT in 1981-82).

### Nice Jump

By winning 11 of its last 13 games, San Diego State has moved from 226 in the RPI on Nov. 30 and No. 208 in the rating on Dec. 10 to its current position of 55 (as of Sunday, Feb. 5).

During the 2003-04 season, the Aztecs peaked at 68 following a victory over Iowa State on Jan. 3 of that season and this marks the Aztecs' highest ranking since finishing the 2001-02 season at 39.

San Diego State has seen its RPI improve or stay the same following nine of its last 10 games. The Aztecs have improved 153 spots from their Dec. 10 RPI of 208. The Aztecs now own the second best RPI in the league behind Air Force.

This shows a rather significant improvement over where the Aztecs have finished the previous couple of seasons in the RPI. After finishing 39 in the 2001-02 NCAA Tournament season, the Aztecs ended the last three campaigns at 99 (2002-03 NIT season), 117 (2003-04) and 186 (2004-05) in the RPI.

### Winning Big

With the 27-point victory vs. Brigham Young on Jan. 21, San Diego State recorded its 10th double-digit victory of the season.

During the Steve Fisher era, the number of double-digit victories has been a good indicator to the total number of victories. In the 2001-02 NCAA Tournament season, the Aztecs went 21-12 and had 13 victories by 10 or more points. The following season, SDSU was 16-14, advanced to the second round of the NIT and had 11 double-digit wins. The last two seasons, the Aztecs combined for just 10 double-digit win totals.

This season, San Diego State has brought back the blowout win, already having recorded 10 double-digit victories. Through just 21 games this season, the Aztecs have posted their highest season total in the category since the 2002-03 season.

The 10 double-digit wins in 21 games this season equals the total number San Diego State had in the 64 games prior to this season.

San Diego State also claimed three straight wins by at least 10 points from Jan. 14-21 (actually, all three wins were by at least 16 points) for the first time since defeating Monmouth (Nov. 22), UC San Diego (Nov. 27) and San Diego (Dec. 1) in the 2004-05 campaign. The last time SDSU posted three straight double-digit conference wins was Air Force (Feb. 22), New Mexico (Feb. 24) and Wyoming (Mar. 1) of the 2002-03 campaign.

### Heath Claims Mountain West Conference Player of the Week Honor

San Diego State junior guard Brandon Heath has been named co-Mountain West Conference Player of the Week for the period ending February 5 after guiding the Aztecs to a conference road win at Colorado State this past Saturday. Heath, who is being honored for the fourth time in his career and second time this season, shares the award with

Heath's four career weekly awards ties Michael Cage and Aerick Sanders for most player of the week awards in school history.

A native of Los Angeles, Heath played all 40 minutes en route to a season-high 28 points on 10-of-13 shooting, including 5-for-7 from 3-point distance in leading San Diego State (15-6/8-1 MWC) to its seventh straight victory. His 10 field goals and three steals were season highs, while his five 3-point baskets tied a career high. Heath also joined guards Matt Thomas and Richie Williams for game-high honors with five assists. For the game, Heath either scored or assisted on half of San Diego State's 30 field goals.

The junior guard's hot shooting was a major reason SDSU shot 63.8 percent for the game, its highest ever in an MWC contest. He scored 17 first-half points as San Diego State overcame a seven-point deficit to take a six-point halftime advantage. As the game tightened up down the stretch, Heath once again took over, scoring six consecutive points during the second half to help the Aztecs secure the victory.

With Saturday's performance, Heath recorded his 11th 20-plus scoring game of the season and the 32nd of his career. In his last 11 games, he has scored 225 points (20.5 ppg). For his career, Heath has 1,327 career points and is fifth on SDSU's all-time scoring list.

### The New Look Aztecs

Since San Diego State has started all three of its preseason award winners - MWC preseason player of the year Marcus Slaughter, MWC preseason first-team member Brandon Heath and MWC preseason newcomer of the year Mohamed Abukar - the Aztecs have posted a 8-1 record.

Included in that stretch are SDSU's first victory at Utah since 1982, just its fifth ever victory at Wyoming, fourth ever win at Colorado State and a seven-game conference winning streak, which tied the school's Division I record.

In looking at the numbers to the right, the most impressive thing is that SDSU has made improvements in many statistical categories despite playing a much tougher schedule.

In addition to Abukar entering the lineup, the time frame also corresponds with when Marcus Slaughter returned to the lineup from his second degree MCL injury, which forced him to miss three games.

### Starting the Year Right

With the win at Wyoming on Jan. 28, San Diego State has opened the 2006 calendar year in style, posting a 7-1 record to date. The seven victories are the most in a single month since the Aztecs posted an 8-2 record in January, 1985.

With its 7-1 record in January, it marks the best winning percentage in a full month of games (does not count partial months like November) since February of 1978, when SDSU posted an identical 7-1 record.

### Freshman Contributions

It is easy to get lost in preseason hype and the dynamic duo of Marcus Slaughter and Brandon Heath and think that San Diego State is a team made up of upperclassmen. But that is not the case as two of the three leaders in minutes played are true freshmen.

So far this season, the Aztecs' three true freshmen have played major roles and have impressed up to this point. Point guard Richie Williams has started 20 games and is averaging 5.7 points and a team-high 3.3 assists per game in 26.4 minutes of action. He has also recorded six or more assists on four occasions. The freshman point guard had his best game of the season against Loyola Marymount posting career highs in points with 16 and rebounds with seven. He also tied his season high for assists with six against the Lions and dished out another six against Colorado State in the MWC opener and at Air Force.

Kyle Spain is another who has played significant minutes and has started 18 games. Spain has played the fourth-most minutes on the team (528) and is averaging 10.2 points and 6.2 rebounds. So far this season, Spain has a double-double at TCU (10 points, 10 rebounds), 10 double-digit scoring games to his credit, including a career-best 18 at Providence, and two double-digit rebounding game (10 vs. Illinois-Chicago, 10 at TCU). He leads the MWC among freshmen in rebounding and is fourth among the league's class in scoring. Thanks to his 17 point, seven rebound and five steal performance against UC Santa Barbara, the freshman earned his first Mountain West Conference Player of the Week award joining former Aztec Evan Burns and Utah's Andrew Bogut as the only freshmen in the conference's history to win the weekly honor.

Brett Hoerner is the third freshman of SDSU's nationally ranked recruiting class and has played well in limited minutes. The freshman from Fullerton, Calif., has seen action in 13 games and is averaging 6.5 minutes per contest. In 85 overall minutes this season, Hoerner has 25 points, 13 rebounds and four blocks. Per 40 minutes this season, Hoerner is

averaging 11.1 points, 5.8 rebounds and 1.9 blocks per game. Against UC Santa Barbara when Marcus Slaughter went down with a knee injury, Hoerner stepped in and contributed a career high nine points in 14 minutes of action. He has been an important piece to San Diego State's start as he has been able to come into the game off the bench and play well when called upon.

Two redshirt freshmen are also contributing. Tim McGrath has played in 13 SDSU games, logging double-digit minutes in four of the last nine contests he has played. He has nine points and 14 rebounds in 94 total minutes this season. Meanwhile, Chris Lamb has played in five games this season and posted a career-high 13 minutes against Washington State in the San Diego Slam.

### Slaughter's 20-20 Performance

Marcus Slaughter, the Mountain West Conference preseason player of the year, proved that he is fully recovered from his MCL injury last month following 20 points, 20 rebounds and five blocked shots against UNLV.

The 20-rebound performance was the first by an Aztec player since Michael Cage pulled down 21 rebounds at Wyoming on Feb. 6, 1984.

Slaughter's 20-rebound effort were also a Cox Arena record, a Steve Fisher era record and the most by an Aztec player in a Mountain West Conference game.

By scoring 20 points, Slaughter recorded just the fifth 20-20 game in the school's Division I history. This marked the third time it has occurred in a conference game following Steve Malovic in 1979 and Michael Cage in 1984.

Below is a list of the five 20 point-20 rebound games since SDSU went to the Division I ranks prior to the 1970-71 campaign.

Just for good measure, Slaughter added five blocked shots to his stat line against the Rebels. That tied a Cox Arena record for most blocked shots and were the most blocks for an Aztec player in a Mountain West Conference game.

In the next game, Slaughter flirted with the 20-20 mark against TCU, settling for 23 points, 18 rebounds and four assists. Couple those two efforts with 17 points and 14 rebounds against Brigham Young and Slaughter had a three-game total of 60 points, 52 rebounds seven blocked shots, seven assists and four steals.

### In Good Company

With Kyle Spain being named Mountain West Conference Player of the Week on Dec. 19, the freshman joins some elite company. In the conference's seven year history, only two first-year players have received the conference's weekly award, former Aztec Evan Burns in 2003 and Utah's Andrew Bogut in 2004.

Burns, a former McDonald's All-American, helped San Diego State to the second round of the 2003 postseason NIT after posting a 16-14 regular season record. Burns also earned the MWC Freshman of the Year award in addition to league honorable mention accolades.

Bogut guided the Utes to a 24-9 record in 2004 and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. Like, Burns, he also won the MWC's Freshman of the Year award and was named to the all-conference second team.

### The Difference

San Diego State is showing quite an improvement from last season's 11-18. A statistical comparison between last season and this season squads is listed left. One noticeable difference is improvements in all three shooting categories (field goal, three-point field goal and free throw).

Defensive the Aztecs have also improved in defensive field goal percentage and defensive three-point field goal percentage.

Below is a look at the Aztec defensive numbers in wins and losses. Opponents score 10 fewer points and shoot 15.7 percent lower from behind the arc, in Aztec wins.

### The Blowouts

For the first time since 1981, San Diego State has recorded consecutive victories by at least 25 points. Aztec wins over Southern Mississippi (79-51) and Albany (80-53) also give SDSU as many 25-point-plus victories in the last two games as the Aztecs had in their previous 60 games combined.

The 55-point margin in consecutive victories is the fourth largest in San Diego State Division I era (beginning in 1970-71) and the largest during the Steve Fisher era.

You could make a case that although the recent two-game margin ranks fourth all-time, it may be more impressive than the three wider margins on the list. The record, set in 1981, was aided by playing a game against UC San Diego, which at the time competed at the Division III level. The second and third streaks were aided greatly by a 60-point victory over Morgan State and SDSU did not win either accompanying game by double figures.

#### Aztecs Picked to Win MWC in 2005-06

The San Diego State men's basketball team was selected by members of the Mountain West Conference media to win the MWC crown for the upcoming 2005-06 men's basketball season the conference released on Oct 13. This marks the first time in school history that the Aztecs have been picked to win the title.

SDSU received 10 out of a possible 22 first place votes and a total of 173 points to earn the top spot in the annual poll. Defending regular season champion Utah was tabbed second with 159 points (six first place votes), while UNLV, last year's preseason pick, finished third with 137 points (three first place votes). Rounding out the poll are Air Force (123 points; two first place votes), New Mexico (120 points), TCU (89 points), Wyoming (74 points; one first place vote), Colorado State (65 points) and Brigham Young (50 points).

In addition to being picked to win the league, San Diego State took home a trio of individual honors at the annual pre-season gathering. Junior forward Marcus Slaughter (17.8 ppg, 9.0 rpg in 04-05) was voted as the conference's top returning player, junior center Mohamed Abukar was selected as the conference's top newcomer while junior guard Brandon Heath (18.3 ppg, 3.7 apg in 04-05) earned a spot on the preseason all-MWC team.

#### Aztec Tidbits

San Diego State has been tied or held a lead in the rebound category in 15 of its last 18 games... Through 21 games this season, SDSU has held a lead at halftime 15 times, trailed five times (at California, at Providence, at Air Force, at Utah and UNLV) and has been tied once (vs. Illinois-Chicago)... SDSU has rallied to win the last two times it has trailed at halftime... The Aztecs overcame 13-point deficits in Mountain West Conference play twice this season (at Air Force rallied from 13 down but loss the game and at Utah)... Brandon Heath is the only Aztec player to score in every game this season... The four players who have seen the most court time this season are two juniors (Marcus Slaughter and Heath) and two true freshmen (Spain and Richie Williams)... 


