# Final Score: New Mexico 88, No. 19/19 San Diego State 70

## **Big Notes**

- Senior guard **Darrion Trammell** passed 1,500-career points and is one of two active players who stand 5-11 or less to have reached the milestone (also: California's Jalen Cone).
- Sophomore guard **Miles Byrd** scored a career-high 13 points, including 3-of-4 from 3-point range.
- Senior guard Lamont Butler reached the 800-point scoring plateau,
- SDSU is at 27-8 (.771) in their last 35 Mountain West road games.
- San Diego State stands at 146-141 in Mountain West road games since the start of the conference and remains the only program in league history with a winning road record in conference play.

# <u>Team Notes</u>

- SDSU is now 42-26 under Brian Dutcher in road contests.
- Under Brian Dutcher, the Aztecs move to 37-15 in games in January and as a program has won 81 of its last 107 (81-26) games in the first month of the year.
- SDSU now stands at 252-140 (.643) all-time in Mountain West games.
- San Diego State is now 110-22 under Brian Dutcher when it scores the first bucket of the game and as a program is 125-54 in its last 179 games in which it get the first bucket.
- SDSU is 53-72 of their last 125 when trailing at intermission.
- SDSU stands at 110-24 under Brian Dutcher and 236-49 in its last 285 games when outscoring the opponent's bench.
- The Aztecs move to 47-21 (.691) on Saturdays under Brian Dutcher.

- SDSU is 37-38 under Brian Dutcher when it is outrebounded the opponent and 77-68 in the last 145.
- All nine of the Aztecs who saw action in the game appeared in the scoring column.
- SDSU outscored New Mexico in the following situations:
  - 31-18 in bench points

## Series Notes

- San Diego State now trails in the all-time series 50-44 against New Mexico and has split its last four games
  against the Lobos.
- SDSU falls to 13-31 all-time in games against New Mexico on the Lobos home floor.
- Head coach Brian Dutcher' record against New Mexico is 6-4, including a 2-3 mark at The Pit.
- San Diego State is now 7-6 as a ranked team when playing New Mexico, which includes a 4-2 record at The Pit.

# **Game Flow**

- New Mexico won the tip.
- San Diego State scored the first points of the game on a layup by Lamont Butler at 19:06.
- In the final 4:55 of the first half, New Mexico used a 17-2 run to erase a 12-point deficit and take a 3-point lead into the break.
- Trailing 47-40 with 18:16 to play, San Diego State cut the lead to one point on a Micah Parrish 6-0 run to make it 47-46 with 15:50 to play.
- From the 15:50 mark of the second half until 3:54 to play San Diego State was outscored 31-12.

# **Player Notes**

# Jaedon LeDee – 15 points, 6-15 FG, 2-2 FT, 5 rebounds, 1 assist

Scored in double figures for the 16th time this season in 16 appearances... Now has 35 career double-figure scoring games, 27 of which have come in the 55 games he has played as an Aztec... Led the Aztecs in scoring for the 12th time of the season.

## Miles Byrd – 13 points, 5-9 FG, 3-4 3FG, 3 rebounds, 2 steals

Reached double figures for the first time in his career... Led the team in 3-point baskets and steals.

### Darrion Trammell – 12 points, 5-11 FG, 3 rebounds, 3 assists, 2 steals

Passed 1,500-career points and is one of two active players who stand 5-11 or less to have accomplished the feat...Recorded his sixth double digit scoring game this year and 73<sup>rd</sup> of his career... In two games at the Pit is averaging 15.0 points on 11-of-26 shooting (.423), including 5-of-14 from distance (.357) and has grabbed 2.0 rebounds and dished out 3.0 assists.

## Lamont Butler – 7 points, 2-5, 5 assist, 1 steal

Reached 800 career points with the first basket of the game... Led the team in assists for the  $10^{th}$  time this season and  $32^{nd}$  time in his career.
