San Diego State Aztecs (6-3, 0-0 MWC)  
vs. Brown Bears (2-8, 0-0 Ivy League)► **When & Where:** Thursday, Dec. 28, 2006, at Cox Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 2 p.m. (PST)► **Webcast/Live Video:** Bill Earley (play-by-play) and Tammy Blackburn (analysis) will have the live audio broadcast of the SDSU game on www.goaztecs.com. A live video feed will also be available via the Aztecs' official website for all of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic contests.► **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team rounds out its 2006-07 non-conference schedule by playing host to the four-team San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic, Dec. 28 and 30, at Cox Arena. The tournament, sponsored by Basketball Travelers, Inc., is in its second season and includes a pair of top-25 teams in No. 11/10 Georgia and No. 17/16 George Washington, along with SDSU and Brown. The Aztecs, who have won five straight, take on Brown at 2 p.m., followed by the Georgia-George Washington game at 4 p.m. on Dec. 28. The winners will meet in the championship game on Dec. 30 at 4 p.m., which comes after the consolation game at 2 p.m.

SDSU is a week removed from its most recent outing, a 64-53 victory over Pepperdine on Dec. 21, which improved its record to 6-3 overall, already doubling its win total from last season. Brown, meanwhile, has been out of action since Dec. 6, and is 2-8 heading into this weekend's action.

► **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the second year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 241-175 in 15 seasons, while she is 160-110 in 10 campaigns at SDSU.► **Brown Head Coach Jean Marie Burr:** Jean Marie Burr is in her 19th season at Brown and has a school and career record of 263-226.► **Brown Series History:** Brown and San Diego State meet for the second time in a regular season non-conference tournament. The Bears won the only previous meeting in 2003 at the Lady Blazer Invitational at UAB. (Last: Brown def. SDSU, 57-49, on Dec. 30, 2003, in Birmingham, Ala.)

## Aztec Women's Hoops Plays Host To Four-Team San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic



The San Diego State women's basketball team concludes the 2006 calendar year by playing host to the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic, Dec. 28 and 30, at Cox Arena. Besides the Aztecs, the tournament also includes No. 17/16 George Washington, No. 11/10 Georgia and Brown. Brown and SDSU will play the first game on Thursday at 2 p.m., followed by the contest between two top-25 schools in Georgia and George Washington at 4 p.m. The consolation (2 p.m.) and championship (4 p.m.) games will follow two days later on Saturday.

SDSU has a current five-game win streak heading into the Surf 'N Slam and is off to its best start in 11

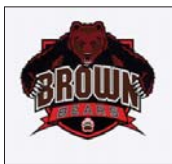

years since the 1995-96 squad went 7-2 in its first nine games. With a victory against Brown Thursday night, the Aztecs can equal their longest win streak since 2000-01.

### Fast Facts: SDSU In Regular Season Home Tournaments

► This year marks the second straight season that SDSU has played host to a tournament. Prior to 2005-06, the last time the Aztecs had a home tournament was in November 2000, when SDSU went 1-1 at the Pacific Bell Classic.

► SDSU's last non-conference tournament away from home was during the 2003-04 campaign when the team traveled to Birmingham, Ala. for the Lady Blazer Invitational. Interestingly, Brown was one of the Aztecs' foes at that event.

► SDSU did not play host to a regular-season tournament in Beth Burns' first stint as head coach from 1989-97.

► SDSU women's hoops has played host to 16 home tournaments in its previous 30 years of existence... SDSU is 15-1 in the first game of a home tournament... the Aztecs have won the team title nine times, including each of the first four.

► SDSU has split each of its last four home tournaments. The team won the first game and lost the second in 1998, 1999 and 2000. Last season, the Aztecs did the opposite, falling to Loyola (Md.), before defeating UC Davis.

### Last Time Out: Aztecs Win Fifth Straight 64-53 Over Pepperdine

Shanna Demus recorded a career-high 20 points and six steals to lead the San Diego State women's basketball team to its fifth-straight victory 64-53 over Pepperdine Dec. 21 at Cox Arena. With the win, the Aztecs doubled their season win total from last year, improving to 6-3 overall, while the Waves dropped to 7-6 in 2006-07.

Demus (Palmdale, Calif.) recorded a career-high in points in her second consecutive outing after posting 19 in the team's win versus Saint Mary's on Dec. 10. Against the Waves, the junior forward was 5-for-7 from the field and a perfect 8-for-8 from the line, while also tallying six rebounds, two assists and the career-best six steals in 32 minutes.

Demus was helped offensively by junior Jennifer Layton (Sacramento, Calif.), who scored 11 of her 15 points in the first half, and freshman Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.), who tallied 10 of her 13 points in the second 20-minute. Davis added a team game-high five assists and senior center Desiree Johnson (Kahuku, Hawaii) had a career-high four steals for the Aztecs.

SDSU scored the first two baskets of the game and led by 10 at the 12:06 mark on a three-pointer by Demus. The Aztec advantage grew to as many as 11 points twice in the first half, but the Waves used an 8-2 run heading into the locker room and trailed by just five, 32-27.

Pepperdine used that momentum in the beginning of the second half, knotting the game at 32 points apiece. Four straight free throws gave SDSU a four-point cushion, but the two schools continued to battle as the Waves got as close as three at 49-46. The Aztecs' tripled that lead on Erin Jackson's (Sparks, Nev.) rebound basket and made all four of their free throws in the final 2:32 to secure the 64-53 win.

### Other Pepperdine Notes

-The Aztecs' 11-point margin of victory is the team's largest in 2006-07 ... SDSU's previous five victories have all been by seven or fewer points.

-SDSU did not trail in a game for the first time this season.

-SDSU had two players, Shanna Demus and Jennifer Layton, reached double-figures in points in the first half. Demus' 12-point outburst is the most by an Aztec in the first 20 minutes of a game.

-Demus' 8-for-8 effort at the charity stripe is the best by an Aztec since Dec. 30, 2000, when Jamey Cox was also 8-for-8 in a win over Detroit.

### At The Start

-With a 6-3 record, SDSU is off to its best start since 1995-96, when the team opened the campaign with a 6-2 record through its first eight outings and then reeled off six straight wins for a 12-2 start.

-With its victory over Pepperdine, the Aztecs doubled their win total from all of last season. This marks the second time Beth Burns has had an SDSU team double its win total from her first to her second season at the helm. In her first stint on The Mesa (1989-97), Burns' first squad in 1989-90 won seven games, while her second doubled that with 14 victories in 1990-91.

While Burns wasn't able to do the same in her only other stop as a head coach at Ohio State, the Buckeyes still increased their win total by two from her first to her second campaign.

### They're A Steal

With 15 steals against Pepperdine, the Aztecs have combined for 65 in their last four outings (16.3/g). SDSU has now tallied double-figures in steals on five occasions in 2006-07, and ranks first in the conference in that category with an 11.89 per game average. A year ago, SDSU had 10 or more steals eight times,

including in each of its first four games to open the year.

In 2006-07, six different SDSU players have recorded three or more steals in a game 11 times. Last week, junior Shanna Demus tied the team game-high with a career-best six steals against Pepperdine. She tied the previous high set by sophomore **Tamika Lipford (Oceanside, Calif.)**, who had six against Wichita State after tallying four versus Southern Utah. Freshman Quenese Davis had three at USD, five against the Shockers and four versus Cal Poly and Saint Mary's. Demus has two to her credit, while **LaSandra Dixon (Azusa, Calif.)**, **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)** and Jennifer Layton have each turned in one game with three steals or more this year.

### Double-Double Trouble

For the first time in four games, an SDSU player did not record a double-double last Thursday night against Pepperdine. Still, four different Aztecs have combined to record eight double-doubles this season, a figure that leads the Mountain West Conference in 2006-07. All four players have accomplished the feat twice, including Quenese Davis, **Lauren Hoisington (Las Vegas, Nev.)**, Desiree Johnson and Jennifer Layton. The double-doubles are the first career efforts for each of the four, while SDSU has had two players turn the trick in the same game on two occasions.

The last time SDSU had four separate players record a double-double in the same season was in 2001-02, when five Aztecs combined for five double-doubles.

### Block Party

While the Aztecs have just five blocks in their last two games, SDSU continues to lead the conference in blocked shots with 5.33 per outing. The team had a season-high 10 blocked shots against Cal Poly, the team's most in a single game since also tallying 10 on Dec. 22, 2002 against Creighton. SDSU now has 48 blocks on the season by eight different players. The 48 blocks is already over 51 percent of the team's 27-game total of 95 from a year ago. The school's team season record for blocks is 162 by the 1987-88 squad in 31 outings.

### At The Top

Two Aztec newcomers remain at the top of a pair of stat categories in the Mountain West Conference. SDSU boasts the league's assist leader in freshman Quenese Davis, who chips in 5.67 per contest. The Aztecs occupy the top two spots in blocked shots per game with Jennifer Layton (1.89/g) holding a slight advantage over teammate Desiree Johnson (1.67/g).

### Interesting Notes

- San Diego State has trailed in five of its six victories this season, including four times in the second half. The Aztecs' trailed Cal Poly by 10 points, its largest deficit in a victory since Jan. 7, 2005, when the team was behind by 14 in the second half in a 63-59 victory against Eastern Washington.

- SDSU is a perfect 5-0 since head coach Beth Burns first used the starting five of guards Tamika Lipford and Quenese Davis, forwards Shanna Demus and Jennifer Layton and center Desiree Johnson.

- Aztec opponents have attempted 20 or more free throws in all but one game this season. The year started out with 23 free throws by each of SDSU's first three opponents, followed by 22 by its next two foes. Since then, opponent's trips to the charity stripe have bounced from a season-low 21 attempts by Wichita State to a season-high 40 by Saint Mary's. Pepperdine went to the stripe just 10 times on Dec. 21.

-SDSU shot exactly 45.3 percent from the field in both of its first two games of the season, with one being a win and the other a loss. In 2005-06, the Aztecs shot above 45 percent from the field just once in a victory over Portland State, when SDSU logged a 53.1 field-goal percentage. San Diego State has broken the 40 percent mark five times in nine games this season, after turning the trick just six times in 27 outings a year ago.

-SDSU has outrebounded its opponent in six games this season, after doing so on only eight occasions in 27 games in 2005-06.

-SDSU has had a player reach double-figures in rebounds in a game on nine occasions this season. In 2005-06, the Aztecs to only managed to meet the 10-rebound mark in a game five times, with three going to Michelle Strawberry and two by Desiree Johnson.

#### Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over the Brown will mean:

- ▶SDSU has won six straight games for the first time since 2000-01, when the Aztecs also claimed six in a row from Dec. 18 through Jan. 11.
- ▶SDSU is 7-3 overall, its best record through nine games since the 1995-96 team was 8-2.
- ▶SDSU can win seven non-conference games for the first time since 2001-02.
- ▶SDSU improves to 8-2 in home games played in the month of December since Beth Burns' return.
- ▶SDSU improves to 4-2 against teams it also faced a year ago.
- ▶SDSU head coach Beth Burns is 1-0 all-time against Brown.

#### Brown Tidbits

Brown plays its first game since a 60-59 loss at Boston University on Dec. 6 ... The Bears are 2-8 overall with wins over Sacred Heart and Rhode Island ... The Aztecs and Bears have played one common opponent this season in UC Davis, which SDSU defeated, 59-52, and Brown lost to, 72-63 ... Brown is led by Ashley King-Bischof, who is averaging 14.9 points and 6.5 rebounds per game ... Annesley O'Neal has a team-high 30 assists ... #### The Rest Of The Surf 'N Slam Field

The second game of the first day of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam features a pair of top 25 schools in No. 11/10 Georgia and No. 17/16 George Washington ... Both teams are coming off 2006 NCAA tournament bids, as Georgia advanced to the Sweet 16 and GW made it to the second round ... Georgia is 11-1 overall with its lone loss being against Middle Tennessee (70-62) back on Dec. 7 ... Georgia is led by guard Cori Chambers, who averaged 16.2 points per game, while consensus preseason All-American Tasha Humphrey is second on the team in scoring (14.4/g.) and first in rebounding (7.6/g) ... Georgia and SDSU have split their previous two meetings, which both came in the 1992-93 campaign ... George Washington is 9-2 in 2006-07, with both losses coming to top-four teams in Maryland and Tennessee ... Four GW players average in double-figure points, including leading scorer Jessica Adair (14.9 ppg.) ... SDSU and George Washington have never faced each other before.

#### Injury Update

For the first time this season, Aztec head coach Beth Burns had all 12 players on the team's active roster at her disposal against Pepperdine. Freshman guard **Chelsea Williamson (Boulder, Colo.)**, who has battled stress reactions in both of her feet, suited up for the first time against the Waves, but did not see any action. Junior forward **Shannon Clay (Inglewood, Calif.)** was also back in uniform after playing her first career game against Cal Poly and then sitting out the Saint Mary's contest due to soreness in her foot.

SDSU began the year with just eight players available for its first two games. Sophomore Tamika Lipford upped that number by one when she returned against USD on Nov. 14, after recovering from offseason ACL surgery. Her classmate, LaSandra Dixon, missed the first four games before playing at Southern Utah following surgery to repair a torn meniscus.

#### Welcome To The Family

The Aztec basketball family officially welcomed a new addition to the roster last week. Guard **Christen Myles (Chino, Calif.)** joined the team on the practice court for the first time on Wednesday. Myles, who will wear jersey No. 31, graduated from Bishop Amat High School in La Puente, Calif., in 2006, and originally signed with Oregon State. She will be able to practice with the team the rest of this year and is eligible to compete in December 2007 with 3.5 years of eligibility remaining.

#### Recapping 2006-07 So Far

- Against Nevada, Jennifer Layton and Quenese Davis became the first Aztecs to record double-doubles in the same game since 2002, when Nicolette McCartney and Ashlee Dunlap did so against American University. It was also the first double-double by an Aztec since Michelle Strawberry had 22 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Portland State on Dec. 16, 2005.
- An Aztec true freshman has recorded 10 or more assists in a game in each of the last two seasons. Quenese Davis did so in her first career outing against Nevada, logging assists, while Tamika Lipford had 11 versus Portland State in 2005-06.
- A true freshman has started at the point guard position in a season-opener in each of SDSU's last four

- Jennifer Layton went 10-for-10 from the field in the second half of the UC Davis game, finishing the night with 20 points. She averaged a double-double in her first three career outings (15.7 ppg., 10.0 rpg.).

-The Aztecs' 20 assists versus UC Davis are the most by SDSU in a single-game since the team had 23 in a 91-45 victory against Utah Valley State in Feb. 2005.

-San Diego State logged a season-best 20 steals against Wichita State. The 20 steals are the team's most in a single outing since Jan. 27, 2005, when the Aztecs logged 21 in a 48-44 loss to Air Force at Cox Arena.

- Freshman Lauren Hoisington was named the Mountain West Conference co-basketball player of the week on Dec. 4. ### Pick Seven

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish seventh in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released Thursday at the league's basketball media day in Las Vegas, Nev. The voting panel consisted of the MWC's nine head coaches, as well as selected media.

The Aztecs, who ended up ninth in the 2005-06 regular season, earned 41 points from the panel, beating out eighth place Air Force by two points. New Mexico was picked to win the conference title, garnering eight of the 19 first-place votes. The Lobos edged BYU by just one first-place nod and three overall points. The Cougars are followed by TCU (126 pts.), Utah (102), Wyoming (96) and UNLV (71). Colorado State rounded out the poll with a ninth-place point total of 36.

### Aztecs Sign Stellar Fall Recruiting Class

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 8 of four highly-rated recruits - centers **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** and **Geneshia Dunbar (Dallas, Texas)** and guards **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** and **Christen Myles (Chino, Calif.)**. Johnson, Dunbar and Davis will join the Aztecs in 2007, while Myles, who is eligible to compete in December 2007, has already begun practicing with the team.

### SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 241-175, while her mark school record stands at 160-110 over 10 seasons.
