Aztec Women's Basketball Starts Second Round of MWC Play Saturday at TCU

The San Diego State women's basketball team will look for a fresh start Saturday as the second round of Mountain West Conference regular-season play begins with the Aztecs traveling to Ft. Worth, Texas to take on TCU at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. The contest is scheduled to begin at noon PT/2 p.m. CT and will be televised live on The Mtn. with Chuck LaMendola calling the action for the TCU produced broadcast.

The Aztecs will look to avenge a 49-47 loss to the Horned Frogs back on Jan. 5 in San Diego in a game that went down to the final seconds. SDSU is playing five of its final eight conference outings on the road and is looking to end a current four-game losing streak, which includes yet another close defeat this time to Colorado State (56-51) on Wednesday. The Aztecs are currently in a four-way tie for sixth place in the MWC at 2-6, with the six losses coming by a combined 31 points.

TCU enters Saturday's 17th all-time meeting currently tied for second place with Wyoming at 6-2 in the league standings. The Horned Frogs will be seven days removed from dropping their second consecutive outing, losing on the road at Air Force (60-55) after falling at home vs. New Mexico (65-54). Those two losses came against league foes that were a combined 1-10 in MWC play entering the contest and ended TCU's eight-game win streak.

SDSU will be looking for its first-ever victory in Ft. Worth, but has earned a split in the regular-season series between the two foes each of the last two years. The contest will be streamed live (audio only) with Chris Ello calling the action courtside, while in-game stats will also be available on goaztecs.com.

Aztecs Drop Another Close One 56-51 To Colorado State

In a game featuring eight lead changes and two tie scores in the final 15 minutes, the San Diego State women's basketball team once again found itself on the short end of another close contest, falling 56-51, Wednesday to visiting Colorado State at Viejas Arena. The loss is the squad's 10th this season of 10 or fewer points and moved them to 8-12 overall and 2-6 in league action, while the Rams snapped SDSU's six-game series win streak, improving to 12-9 and 5-3 to finish out the first round of MWC play.

Despite the loss, Aztec senior **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** became the school's all-time career leader in blocked shots, notching three on the night to give her 252 in her career. Johnson also was the only Aztec to score in double-figures vs. the Rams, shooting 5-for-10 from the floor and 6-for-8 at the free-throw line to finish with 16 points.

SDSU sophomore **Courtney Clements (Long Beach, Calif.)** came off the bench for the first time this year to score eight points, while senior **Jessika Bradley (Sacramento, Calif.)** had eight rebounds and senior **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** tallied seven of the team's 14 assists.

Colorado State had the hot hand early, racing out to a quick 7-0 lead by hitting three of its first four shots. The

Aztecs finally got on the board close to three minutes into the contest and trailed by three points three times. The Rams pushed out to what would be the game's largest advantage at 30-22, but Clements immediately responded with a lay-up in the paint to make it a six-point game with 5:48 left.

Clements' bucket would be the final field goal by either side the remainder of the half, as a Johnson free throw was the only point scored with CSU heading into the locker room up 30-25.

The Aztecs made a pair of 3-pointers after the break to close the gap to just one and knotted the score at 34 before owning their first lead, 35-34, on a free-throw by junior **Sajoyia Griffin (San Antonio, Texas)**. The advantage changed hands seven more times over the next nine and a half minutes with the Rams going up by one at 47-46 on a lay-up at the 4:18 mark.

SDSU trailed by as many as five points in the final minute, but got a triple from Clements to get to within a single possession at 53-51. Colorado State, however, made three of its four free-throw attempts to close out the 56-51 victory.

Other Colorado State Notes

► Jessika Bradley and Courtney Clements both saw their streak of consecutive games with at least 10 points come to an end at six. Bradley had six points, while Clements managed eight.

► SDSU had a season-low three steals and tied a season high with 21 three-point attempts ... CSU's 45 field-goal attempts were fewest by an Aztec opponent this season.

► The Aztecs have yet to eclipse the 60-point mark in their last six games after doing so 11 times in their first 14 contests.

Getting The Record

San Diego State senior center Paris Johnson became the school's all-time career blocks leader Wednesday evening in the team's game against Colorado State. Johnson rejected three shots, including her final one at the 2:02 mark of the second half on a shot attempt by Ram Chantel Kennedy. The last block gave her 252 in her Aztec career, surpassing the previous record of 251 compiled by former SDSU standout Michelle Suman, who played on The Mesa from 1991-92 to 1994-95.

Johnson also owns the school's record for blocks in a season with 94 as a sophomore in 2008-09, and for blocks in a game with nine at UNLV on March 7, 2009. She is currently second in the Mountain West Conference in career blocks, trailing only New Mexico's Jordan Adams, who had 344 from 1999-2003.

Another Game, Another Line-Up

Aztec head coach Beth Burns tried her second different starting line-up in as many games Wednesday, inserting sophomore **Gabrielle Clark (Los Angeles, Calif.)** in place of classmate Courtney Clements. The start was the first of Clark's career and came one outing after junior **Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.)** made the starting five for the first time in this year and second occasion in her career in place of an injured Coco Davis at Wyoming.

Overall, SDSU has used four different starting line-ups in 2010-11, with only one - Sajoyia Griffin, Davis,

Clements, Jessika Bradley and Paris Johnson - ending in all eight victories.

Yet Another Close Call

While San Diego State may have 12 losses on the season, they haven't been by much. Wednesday's 56-51 defeat vs. Colorado State is the Aztecs' 10th by 10 or fewer points. In addition, eight of the squad's 20 contests in 2010-11, including each of its first five league outings, have been determined by three points or fewer with SDSU going 3-5 in those games. The Aztecs have dropped their six MWC contests by a combined total of 31 points.

A year ago, San Diego State was 8-7 in games decided by 10 points or less.

Nearing 1,500

Senior Paris Johnson enters Saturday's game at TCU needing just 13 points to become only the third Aztec in program history to score 1,500 points in their career.

Johnson is currently fourth in the record book with 1,487, trailing former teammate Jené Morris, who had 1,499 in 95 contests in the Red & Black. The only SDSU players to reach the 1,500-milestone are all-time leading scorer Judy Porter, who had 2,318 points from 1979-80 to 1982-83, and Faisha Wright, who compiled 1,733 points from 1991-92 to 1994-95.

Johnson is currently second among active MWC players and 16th overall in career points in league history.

Keeping Pace

SDSU recorded five blocked shots against Colorado State and now has 37 more rejections than any other MWC school. The Aztecs' 129 blocks are highlighted by three double-figure efforts all in league action, including 10 last Saturday at Wyoming, 12 vs. TCU and 14 against UNLV.

San Diego State entered the week tied for fourth place at 6.5 per game with West Virginia in the national rankings. The Aztecs trailed only No. 1 Baylor (7.3/g), Saint Mary's (6.9) and No. 15 North Carolina (6.6) in that category.

SDSU has tallied at least eight blocks in a game nine times and has 26 more blocks than second-place Utah in league action. Senior Jessika Bradley is tied for first in the MWC with 2.5/g, while classmate Paris Johnson is third with 2.1 an outing.

The Aztecs have led the MWC in blocks average two straight years and in three of the last four campaigns. They had a conference and school-record 195 rejections in 32 games in 2008-09, and are currently just off pace to beat that record this year.

Top 7 In The Nation

After missing the Wyoming game, Aztec senior guard Coco Davis returned to tally seven assists against Colorado State on Wednesday. She entered the week ranked seventh nationally with 6.3 assists per game and continues to lead the Mountain West Conference by a half an assist per outing over Utah's Janita Badon (5.8/g).

With 120 helpers, Davis has eclipsed the century mark for the second consecutive season and has tied her career season best that she posted a year ago.

Davis has at least six assists in 12 of the 19 contests

in which she has played and eight or more five times. Her 377 career assists are fourth in school history.

The 5-9 guard is continuing the Davis family tradition, as her older sister and 2010 grad, Quenese, ranked first or second in the league in assists each of the last four seasons.

Notes With A 'W'

An SDSU victory over TCU will mean:

►SDSU wins in Ft. Worth for the first time in eight all-time visits.

►SDSU improves to 6-11 all-time vs. the Horned Frogs and has won four of the last eight contests.

►SDSU ends its' longest losing streak since 2008 at four games.

►SDSU has yet to be swept in a regular-season series to a league foe since 2008.

TCU Tid-Bits

TCU is coming off a bye in its schedule on Wednesday and enters the weekend with a 14-8 overall record and a 6-2 mark in conference play to tie for second place with Wyoming ... The Frogs have dropped their last two games to teams that were at the bottom of the MWC standings in New Mexico at home and Air Force on the road ... The Frogs are 10-2 at home, but are just 4-6 away from Ft. Worth ... TCU is led by the conference's leading scorer in senior Emily Carter (18.1 ppg.), who has 49 3-pointers and is shooting a league-best 90 percent at the stripe ... Reigning MWC player of the year senior Helena Sverrisdottir averages 15.4 points per contest, hauls in 6.1 rebounds and has a team best 89 assists and 50 steals ... Sophomore Starr Crawford is her team's leading rebounder at 9.1 per outing ... TCU ranks second in the league in scoring offense (67.7 ppg.), free-throw percentage (74.9), field-goal percentage defense (35.9) and turnover margin (+2.9).

TCU Round 1

- SDSU held TCU without a field goal for the final six minutes of the game, cutting a 14-point second-half deficit down to only a pair, but the Aztecs came up just short, falling 49-47 in both teams' 2011 conference openers on Jan. 5.

- The Aztecs were led offensively by junior forward Kalena Tutt, who had 10 points. Seniors Paris Johnson and Coco Davis and junior Courtney Clements all tallied nine points apiece, while forward Jessika Bradley had

seven rebounds, five assists and five blocked shots.

- San Diego State raced out to a 10-point lead at 19-9 by making eight of its first 11 shots from the field, but TCU answered back with a 10-0 run over the next three minutes to tie the score at 19-19.

- TCU led 29-23 at the break and raced out to a 14-point advantage at 45-31 in the second half. SDSU held the Frogs to only one field goal the remainder of the half and came all the way back to just a two-point deficit at 49-47.

- The Aztecs had a chance to tie or win the game on the final play with seven seconds left, but Davis' pass was intercepted by TCU as the buzzer sounded.

- TCU was led by Starr Crawford's 16 points and 13 rebounds, while Emily Carter had 14 points and Helena Sverrisdottir had 12 rebounds, eight assists and five steals.

Record Watch

San Diego State's senior trio of Coco Davis, Paris Johnson and Jessika Bradley are well on their way toward making a dent in the Aztec record book.

Besides reaching the school's all-time blocks mark, Johnson is also fourth in the SDSU record book in rebounds (836) and in career points (1,487) and is one of only three Aztecs to post 1,000 points, 800 rebounds and 100 blocks in their careers. She is second in free-throw attempts (495), fifth in free throws made (2812) and seventh in games played (117).

Davis, meanwhile, moved into fourth in school history in assists (377), is fifth 3-pointers (86) and is sixth in career 3-pointers attempted (298).

After only 54 games in the Red & Black, Bradley is sixth in career blocked shots with 113, including a squad-best 63 as a junior and 50 in the opening 20 games in 2010-11. The 50 rejections this year are already 10th in the SDSU single-season record book.

Other 2010-11 In Season Notes Thus Far

- Courtney Clements' 19 points vs. UCLA are the most by an Aztec in a season-opener since Michelle Strawberry had 29 points against Wichita State in November 2005.

- Paris Johnson's 18 rebounds vs. Cal State Bakersfield is a career high (prev. 15, twice) and most by an Aztec in a single outing since Ashlee Dunlap also had 18 in a win against American University in Dec. 2002.

- SDSU played its 1,000th contest in program history on Nov. 26, downing Minnesota, 61-59, in Reno, Nev.

It is its largest deficit in a win since being down by 14 points with just under 12 minutes remaining in a 63-59 win vs. Eastern Washington on Jan. 7, 2005. Prior to that, SDSU's largest comeback was 17 points on Feb. 13, 1994, in a 67-65 win at UTEP.

- The Aztecs are 3-0 this year and 12-1 overall when Paris Johnson scores 20 or more points in a game, winning 12 straight since 2007.

- The Aztecs are 4-0 when scoring more than 70 points in a game in 2010-11.

- Each of the team's three seniors have garnered all-tournament honors this season. Center Paris Johnson has been tabbed twice, including her fourth consecutive honor at the Surf 'N Slam, and seven times overall in nine career non-conference events.

Guard Coco Davis picked up honors at the USC tournament and the Surf 'N Slam, while forward Jessika Bradley earned a spot for the first time in her career in Nevada.

- SDSU completed a 4-2 month of December and improved to 23-6 overall during that time frame in the last five campaigns.

- SDSU's overtime loss to Utah was the Aztecs' first MWC regular-season game to go the extra five minutes since falling to Air Force in 2006.

- The Aztecs have trailed by double figures and come back to win, take the lead or make it a one or two possession game in the second half five times this season.

- San Diego State matched a conference record in league games with its 14 blocked shots in the win over UNLV. The Aztecs matched their 14-rejection effort against New Mexico in 2003, and came up just one shy of the overall league record of 15, which SDSU also recorded in a season-opening win vs. Northwestern State in 2008.

- Jessika Bradley was named the Mountain West Conference player of the week on Jan. 18, for leading the Aztecs to a pair of three-point victories over UNLV and New Mexico. The award is the first of Bradley's career and first for SDSU this season.

- SDSU opponents have failed to shoot above 41 percent from the field in 16 of 20 outings this season.

- The team has hauled in 50 or more rebounds in a game four times this season after not doing so in any of its 34 contests a year ago.

- SDSU has owned at least a four-point lead in eight of its 12 losses this season and has been up by double figures in the first half three times all during league action.

- SDSU has compiled eight double-doubles in 2010-11, with one each by all three seniors. The Aztecs also had two double-doubles in the same contest at Pepperdine by Coco Davis and Bradley.

Aztecs Fall Recruiting Class Ranked 20th

San Diego State women's basketball's fall 2010 recruiting class has been rated 20th nationally and first in the Mountain West Conference according to *Espn.com's HoopGurlz* national rankings. The Aztecs moved up 11 spots from last year's No. 31 final ranking, after inking five high school seniors to National Letters of Intent dur-

ing the early signing period, Nov. 10-17.

For the second campaign in a row, the Aztecs are easily the top ranked school among Mountain West Conference members, as TCU is the only other team listed in the top 40 at No. 38. San Diego State's recruiting class is rated higher than several notable programs including LSU (No. 22), Notre Dame (No. 25), Ohio State (No. 26), Georgetown (No. 27), West Virginia (No. 28), Nebraska (No. 34) and Michigan State (No. 51). The Aztecs are also the only school in a "non-automatic BCS qualifying" conference rated in the top 30.

San Diego State signed three, four-star recruits according to HoopGurlz, including forward Chairese Culberson, who was the No. 7 rated wing and 46th overall, forward Deajanae Scurry (No. 31 forward) and point guard Ahjalee Harvey (No. 32 point guard). Forwards Khristina Hunter and Erimma Amarikwa rounded out the Aztec fall signing class.

Preseason Points

The reigning MWC champion San Diego State women's basketball team has been

picked to finish second in the league in 2011 in a vote by the nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 13, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo.

The Aztecs received three first-place votes and 147 points overall, trailing only TCU, which had 16 first-place votes (174 points). SDSU, which has been picked first or second each of the last three years, just edged out Brigham Young for second place, as the Cougars had 145 points and garnered the other two first-place votes. Utah was picked fourth, followed by Wyoming, New Mexico, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force.

San Diego State has posted its two highest finishes in conference history the last two seasons, tying with Utah for first place in 2009, and for third place in 2010.

Aztec Individual Accolades

Aztec senior center Paris Johnson was tabbed to the five-member preseason all-league squad for the third straight year at the MWC's annual media day. In addition, sophomore guard Courtney Clements, who red-shirted after transferring from Arizona, was picked as the MWC's newcomer of the year and guard Melissa Sweat was chosen preseason freshman of the year.

Clements is the second SDSU player in a row to pick up the MWC's preseason newcomer of the year distinction, as senior Jessika Bradley was honored and went on to win the award last March.

Sweat, meanwhile, is the second Aztec on the current roster to earn the league's preseason freshman-of-the-year award, joining Johnson, who was honored in 2007.

Poll Watching

For the second consecutive season, San Diego State received votes in both national preseason top-25 polls. The Aztecs garnered the 34th-most votes (22 total) in

the *USA Today ESPN* coaches edition, while they had the 37th-most votes (8 total) in the Associated Press Top 25.

SDSU earned votes in the coaches' poll eight times in 2009-10, including on Nov. 23, when it reached the No. 24 slot. The Aztecs finished the campaign at No. 20, the first time they had been ranked in the coaches' poll to end a season since it began in 1986.

The team also broke through in the AP poll a year ago, earning its first top-25 ranking (23rd on Nov. 23) since March 1995, when the team ended up 22nd following a 24-6 campaign.

SDSU is joined by TCU as the only two Mountain West Conference schools to receive votes in either poll thus far in 2010-11. The Aztecs garnered one vote in the first regular-season AP poll released Nov. 16, and had two in the Nov. 22 edition.

Strength Of Schedule

In 2010-11, SDSU has potentially six regular-season games against teams receiving votes in the AP preseason poll, which included the match-up with No. 16 UCLA to open the campaign on Nov. 12. Besides No. 23 TCU, who the Aztecs play twice, No. 8 Texas A&M (Dec. 30), Dayton (Dec. 18) and USC (Dec. 19) were all ranked or receiving votes.

Other Things To Watch For In 2010-11

Coming off one of the most successful seasons in Aztec basketball history, here are a few other things to look for in 2010-11:

- ♦ SDSU senior center Paris Johnson has started all 117 career contests since coming to Montezuma Mesa in 2007-08. She needs to start the next six outings to beat the school record for consecutive starts of 122, set a year ago by Quenese Davis.
- ♦ SDSU is a combined 27-3 at home over the last two campaigns entering this season. The Aztecs have 10 or more wins at Viejas Arena in three of the last four years.
- ♦ The Aztecs have 36 Mountain West Conference wins in the last five seasons after having only 19 in the league's first seven years.
- ♦ SDSU has advanced to the final of the Mountain West Conference Championships three years in a row, after not winning a single game in the MWC tournament's first eight years of existence.

2009-10 Rewind

The San Diego State women's basketball team made a remarkable run in 2009-10, highlighted by its first Mountain West Conference tournament title and a trip to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen.

Below are a few of the accomplishments of last year's team:

- ♦ Earned its first-ever final top 25 ranking in *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll (No. 20), becoming the first MWC school to do so since 2006. The No. 20 spot ties as the program's highest-ever final ranking in a national poll (No. 20 in AP in 1985).
- ♦ Earned the program's first AP top 25 regular-season ranking since 1995 (Nov. 23 – No. 23)
- ♦ Posted back-to-back seasons with at least 23 wins for the first time since 1994-95 (24) and 1993-94 (26) ...

Logged the program's 13th, 20-win campaign with six of those coming under coach Beth Burns ... Had an eight-game win streak, the team's longest since 1996-97

- ♦ Recorded three wins over AP top 25 teams (No. 10 West Virginia, No. 17 Texas, No. 23 TCU) ... Eight of 11 losses were to teams advancing to the NCAAs, including three vs. teams advancing to the Sweet 16
- ♦ Earned the program's first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance (64-team bracket) and won two NCAA games in the same season for the first time in school history.
- ♦ Garnered the program's eighth NCAA tournament bid and made back-to-back NCAA appearances for the first time since 1994-95
- ♦ Was the lowest seed to advance to the Sweet 16 since 2007, was the first No. 11 seed to advance to the Sweet 16 since 2004, and the first MWC team to advance to the Sweet 16 since 2006 ... Was the 12th double-digit seed all-time to advance to the Sweet 16
- ♦ Won its first MWC championship title and advanced to the third consecutive MWC championship game.

Last Year's Numbers

The Aztecs' success also translated into big numbers in the stat columns. Here are some of the 2009-10 team's statistical highlights:

- ♦ SDSU led the MWC in field-goal percentage (44.5), three-point field-goal defense (27.0), blocked shots (5.4), offensive rebound percentage (40.7), victories (23 – tied)
- ♦ SDSU ended the year ranked eighth nationally in three-point field goal percentage defense, 18th in blocks per game, 22nd in field goal percentage and 25th in assists per game.
- ♦ The Aztecs limited 18 of its 34 opponents to under 60 points a game, including a 55-spot by No. 10 West Virginia. Eight foes scored 50 or fewer points and three didn't reach the 40-point barrier.
- ♦ Twelve of the Aztecs' 23 wins were by 19 or more points, after posting only six such victories in 2008-09.
- ♦ SDSU held opponents to three or fewer 3-pointers in a game 20 times last season, including a combined 3-for-22 mark in the NCAA First & Second Rounds.
- ♦ The Aztecs shot at least 40 percent from the field in 26 of 34 outings, topping the 45 mark on 14 occasions. The team's final season field-goal percentage of 44.5 is its best since the 1995-96 squad shot 45.6 percent.
- ♦ SDSU posted a school-record 155 three-pointers for the second season in a row and improved its team free-throw percentage from 61.2 in 2008-09 to 69.9 in 2009-10.

Aztec In The WNBA

Guard Jené Morris became San Diego State's first-ever WNBA Draft pick on April 8, 2010, going in the first round (11th pick overall) to the Indiana Fever. Morris, who was one of 14 players invited to the Draft announcement in Secaucus, N.J., also is the first Aztec to ever don a WNBA jersey.

The San Francisco native became the 11th player in Mountain West Conference history to be tabbed in the WNBA Draft and the fourth selected in the first round. She is the league's highest pick overall since 2006, and third highest in MWC history, trailing only Utah's Shona

Thorburn (7th overall) and TCU's Sandora Irvin (3rd).

A two-time honorable mention All-American and Mountain West Conference defensive player of the year, Morris was the first Aztec to ever lead the MWC in scoring (17.1 ppg.), is the conference's all-time leader in career steals (293) and ranks third in the SDSU record book in career points with 1,499, despite only playing three seasons in the Red and Black.

She played 25 games during her rookie campaign for the Fever, before moving to Poland after the WNBA season to play professionally for CCC Polkowice. Morris has since joined a team in Israel, Raanana Hertzeliya, of the Israeli League.

In addition, fellow 2010 graduate point guard Quenese Davis is currently competing for the Flying Foxes in Austria.

TV Time

The Aztecs have had five televised games already in 2010-11, and will have two more during the regular season. Six of the games will be carried on The Mtn. and one, the contest with New Mexico, was broadcast on CBS College Sports.

Listen/Watch Live

For the 10th straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alum Chris Ello will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the fourth straight season.

Again in 2010-11, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

Burns Named To WBCA Board

This past June, San Diego State head coach Beth Burns was reelected to a three-year term on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors. She continues to serve as a Division I at-large representative on the 23-member board.

Burns had been serving a one-year term in the same position before she was elected in 2010. She is an active member of the WBCA, having previously served as a committee member for the Jostens-Berenson Lifetime Achievement Award and being on the voting panel for the *WBCA/USA Today* Coaches Top 25 national weekly poll.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the sixth season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

Burns took the program to new heights in 2009-10, as the Aztecs advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams. SDSU notched victories over a pair of top 25 foes in No. 10 West Virginia and defeated No. 17 Texas on the Longhorns' home floor. The 11th-seeded Aztecs were

the lowest seed to advance to the Round of 16 in 2010, and lowest overall since 2007.

In the last two seasons, San Diego State has posted a combined record of 47-19, including a 27-3 mark on its home court, with Burns at the helm. The Aztecs claimed the program's first-ever MWC tournament championship in 2010, after earning a share of the regular-season crown in 2009. SDSU has made two consecutive NCAA appearances, going 2-0 in first-round games, after not earning a postseason bid in the 11 previous years.

In her first stint as Aztec head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A four-time conference coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 19-year overall head coaching record of 320-232, while her school record stands at 239-167 over 13 seasons.

Earlier this fall, Burns signed a five-year contract extension to stay as SDSU's head coach through the 2014-15 campaign.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team scored only four points in the final 6:58 of the game, as the Aztecs were unable to pull off the upset of 16th-ranked UCLA in front of 2,196 fans at Viejas Arena. The Bruins rallied from an eight-point halftime deficit to claim the 55-48 victory in both schools' season-openers.

SDSU sophomore Courtney Clements had a game-high 19 points, despite missing her first nine shots from the field. Clements also added six rebounds in her first outing as an Aztec, while senior center Paris Johnson pulled down a team-best 10 boards to go with her eight points. Senior Coco Davis chipped in nine points and seven assists in her first start at point guard.

UCLA scored the first five points of the game, before San Diego State notched its first bucket of the 2010-11 campaign by freshman Melissa Sweat at the 17:41 mark. The Bruins went up by seven at 9-2, but the Aztecs went on a 7-0 run to tie the contest at 9-9.

The squads would be tied twice more in the first half, including at 16-16. Davis then hit a jumper and Clements scored seven points in a row to put the Aztecs up by nine at 25-16. After UCLA cut its deficit to five twice in the final two minutes, SDSU's Gabrielle Clark hit a 3-pointer with 23 seconds remaining to give the home team a 32-24 advantage heading into the locker room.

The Aztecs' shooting woes from the field continued into the second half, as the Bruins scored the first eight points to tie the score at 32-32. San Diego State finally got on the scoreboard with a Davis triple to stay ahead, but the lead changed hands five times, including at the 5:53 mark when UCLA hit a pair of free throws to put it up 45-44.

SDSU would manage only four more points the rest of the way as UCLA ended the evening on a 10-4 run to secure the 55-48 victory.

San Diego State senior center Paris Johnson led the Aztecs both offensively and on the glass, tallying her 16th career double-double with a career-best 18 rebounds and 19 points on 7-for-8 shooting.

Sophomore Courtney Clements was the only other Aztec in double-figure points with 15 to go with eight rebounds and three assists. Freshman Melissa Sweat had eight points and was a perfect 2-for-2 from beyond the arc, while senior Jessika Bradley had nine rebounds and three assists. Senior Coco Davis had a team-best eight assists, but was 1-for-11 from the field.

Cal State Bakersfield jumped out to an early 10-point lead, taking advantage of SDSU's five turnovers in the first three minutes, and the hot shooting of Roadrunner guard Britney McGee, who had 10 points during that same span. The Aztecs finally were able to put some offense together, scoring six straight points to get to within four at 14-10 at the 13:07 mark.

CSUB, however, pushed its lead back up to nine points until a late run, including a pair of triples by junior Sajoyia Griffin, put the home team down by only three at 33-30 heading into the locker room.

San Diego State came out of the break and tied the game at 35, before pushing out to its largest lead of the night at 44-37 less than four minutes into the second half. That advantage quickly disappeared when the Roadrunners converted two more Aztec giveaways into points and a 44-44 tie.

After another tie at 48-48, SDSU had another turnover and missed two free throw attempts which ignited a 7-0 CSUB run. The Aztec deficit would grow to 10 with 1:33 remaining and left too little time for another rally, as the Roadrunners came away with the 73-62 win.

SAN DIEGO - A pair of turnovers in the final 1:33 of the game proved costly, as the San Diego State women's basketball team was unable to record its first victory of the season, falling to visiting UC Irvine, 68-66, at Viejas Arena. With the loss, the Aztecs, who rallied to tie the score after a pair of seven-point deficits, dropped to 0-3 overall and the Anteaters improved to 1-3 on the year.

SDSU sophomore guard Courtney Clements posted a team-best 16 points on 7-of-15 shooting, while seniors Jessika Bradley and Paris Johnson both chipped in 13 points apiece. Bradley was one rebound short of a double-double with nine boards and senior guard Coco Davis matched her career-best with five of the Aztecs' 13 steals on the night.

San Diego State got off to a good start, scoring eight straight points within the first two minutes of the contest for an 8-0 lead. The Anteaters finally got on the board with a jumper by Jade Smith-Williams, followed quickly by a 3-pointer by Kassandra McCalister to cut their deficit to just three.

The Aztecs continued to hold a two possession advantage until going up by seven points twice, including at 22-15. UC Irvine didn't back down, eventually knotting the game at 22 and again at 24 points, and taking the lead for the remainder of the first half with an 18-11 run and a 42-35 advantage at the break.

SDSU quickly erased the UCI lead by scoring the first six points of the second half and tying the game for the third time at 44-44. The Aztecs, however, were never able to jump ahead, as the game was knotted three more occasions, but the Anteaters continued to score the very next bucket.

The final tie came at 63-63 with 3:58 left in the game. UC Irvine got a fast-break basket off a steal, followed by a miscommunication on a hand-off between Clements and Davis that resulted in another giveaway, which the Anteaters converted into two free throws with 18 seconds left. Davis hit a long 3-pointer to close the gap to just two, but too little time was left as the Anteaters came away with the 68-66 victory.

RENO, Nev. - Behind Paris Johnson's 27 points and 12 rebounds, the San Diego State women's basketball team claimed its first victory of the season, defeating Minnesota, 61-59, in its first contest of the Nugget Classic at the Lawlor Events Center in Reno, Nev. The Aztecs moved to 1-3 on the year following 1,000th game in SDSU program history, while the Gophers dropped to 3-3 on the season in the first meeting between the sides in 25 years.

Johnson dominated the paint, scoring 15 of her game-high 27 points in the first half, while also adding 12 rebounds for her second double-double of the campaign. The 6-4 center was 11-of-17 (64.7 percent) shooting for her biggest offensive output since 2008, and the 11th, 20-point scoring game of her career.

Jessika Bradley, was the only other Aztec in double-figure points with 12 to go with her seven rebounds and season-best four blocked shots. Johnson had three of SDSU's other eight rejections on the night, while sophomore Courtney Clements added nine points and Coco Davis contributed eight assists.

San Diego State held a two-point lead at 61-59 with only 20 seconds remaining, as the Gophers ended up getting a pair of chances to tie or win the game. Minnesota guard Leah Cotton missed a jumper on her team's first opportunity, but the rebound resulted in an alternate possession which gave the ball back to the Gophers with 12 seconds left.

Coming out of a timeout, Minnesota's Micaella Riche got the ball in the low block, but then tried to muscle her way to the basket, knocking over a defender and was called for an offensive foul and a turnover. The Aztecs then just had to inbound the ball, which they did, to secure the victory.

The game was tied five times in the first half, before an 18-4 run gave SDSU its largest lead at 39-25. Minnesota, however, would close that gap all the way down to only five points at the break at 39-34 on a lay-up at the buzzer.

The Aztecs started the second half quickly, moving their advantage back up to 11 points twice and later 10 points at 57-47 with 8:39 to go in the game. The Gophers staged yet another rally as SDSU struggled to find the basket, scoring only two points over a more than six-minute span to allow Minnesota to get to within two points twice, including in the final minute.

RENO, Nev. - The San Diego State women's basketball team rallied from an 11-point second-half deficit to take the lead, but couldn't come away with the victory, falling in the championship game of the Nugget Classic to host Nevada, 63-61, at the Lawlor Events Center. With the loss, the Aztecs dropped to 1-4 on the season, while the Wolf Pack improved to 5-1.

Senior Paris Johnson once again led SDSU with 19 points on 8-for-13 shooting, while also tallying seven rebounds and a pair of blocked shots. Johnson was one of two Aztecs named to the all-tournament squad along with classmate Jessika Bradley, who had eight rebounds and three blocks. Sophomore Courtney Clements added 11 points, while junior Sajoyia Griffin had her best performance of the year with a career-high nine points, five rebounds and seven assists, compared to just one turnover.

There were four ties and six lead changes in the first 10 minutes of the game as each side boasted a four-point advantage. Nevada went on a 9-0 run to go up 28-19, but the Aztecs responded with two buckets by Clements and one by Candace Chambers to close the gap to 28-26.

The Wolf Pack began to pile up trips to the free-throw line using a 13-for-16 performance at the stripe to head into the break up by six points at 39-33.

After the two sides combined for only six points in the first four minutes, the Wolf Pack broke their stalemate first, building its largest lead of the game at 51-40 at the 13:59 mark.

The Aztecs, however, wouldn't go down easily, answering with a 9-2 run to close to within four points twice, before a fast-break bucket made it a one-point game and two free throws put the visitors ahead 58-57 with 3:03 to go.

Coming out of a timeout, Nevada's Tahnee Robinson hit a 3-pointer, but Johnson tied it at 60 with a lay-up. Robinson struck again the next time up the floor, making what would turn out to be the winning basket with 25 seconds remaining to give her squad another two-point advantage at 62-61.

Bradley was fouled on the Aztecs' next possession, but was only able to make the first of her two free throws, as Robinson secured the rebound and was then fouled herself. She made one of two shots at the stripe and Coco Davis attempted to get the ball down the court with only four seconds left, but was unable to make the final shot near half court, as the Wolf Pack survived for the 63-61 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored host University of San Diego 15-6 in overtime to cap a dramatic rally, as the Aztecs came away with a 72-63 victory. SDSU, which trailed by 12 points with just 8:25 left to play, improved to 2-4 overall and won for the first time at Jenny Craig Pavilion since the annual series restarted in 2002.

Senior Paris Johnson and sophomore Courtney Clements combined for 40 of the team's 72 points. Johnson posted her fourth game with 19 or more points, finishing with 22, including a 10-for-12 effort at the stripe. Clements, meanwhile, had 18 points, six rebounds and a career-high three steals.

Johnson also had nine boards, matching the team game-high also put up by her front court classmate Jessika Bradley. Senior Coco Davis had nine points and five assists, while junior Kalena Tutt had a career-best eight rebounds.

The Aztecs had three turnovers in their first four possessions of the night, as the host Toreros raced to a 5-0 lead and later went up by seven at the 14:52 mark, but the Aztecs then kept it to within two possessions before gaining their first lead of the night on a lay-up by Melissa Sweat at 21-19.

The Toreros scored their first points after an over five-minute drought to tie the contest at 21 apiece and the two sides traded leads before heading into the break with the home side up 25-22, after SDSU failed to score for the final 4:25.

The second half began much the same way as the first with the Aztecs turning the ball over, while USD once again went up by seven at 31-24. Clements scored each of San Diego State's first seven points, helping to close the gap to only two, before the Aztecs' shooting woes began to catch up with them as USD reeled off a 14-4 run to gain its largest lead at 47-35 heading into a timeout.

San Diego State finally began to hit some shots with the help of point guard Sajoyia Griffin, who notched a 3-pointer and two free throws followed by a Clements jumper to get the deficit down to five at 47-42.

It was only a three-point game heading into the final two minutes, as Davis converted a three-point play to tie the score at 55-55. USD went up by two after a steal in the backcourt, but Johnson equalized with two free throws. The Aztecs had the final possession in regulation, however, Bradley's hook shot hit off the back of the rim forcing overtime.

Bradley struck back on the first possession in overtime, hitting a reverse lay-up as SDSU opened the extra period with a 6-0 run. The Toreros cut that deficit in half with a 3-pointer until Johnson matched that with a three-point play and the Aztecs made all six of their free-throw attempts in the final 25 seconds to secure the 72-63 victory.

MALIBU, Calif. - The San Diego State women's basketball team got double-doubles from seniors Jessika Bradley and Coco Davis to help propel the Aztecs to a 75-61 victory over host Pepperdine at Firestone Fieldhouse. SDSU avenged an overtime loss to the Waves last season to claim its' second win in a row and improve to 3-4 on the year, while Pepperdine dropped to 5-5.

Pepperdine took advantage of several Aztec turnovers in the back court to climb all the way back to within four on three occasions. SDSU, however, headed into the locker room with a six-point lead at 35-29, as the Waves were unable to convert a last-second jumper.

The Aztecs got each of their first six points after the break from Johnson and Bradley and later utilized a pair of nifty passes on the baseline to push ahead 45-33, as the Wave offense went dormant for nearly four minutes.

After Pepperdine cut it to a 10-point deficit, San Diego State turned on the after burners, more than doubling its advantage at 68-47 over the next seven minutes. The Waves made a late run with the Aztec starters already on the bench, getting to within 14 points, including the final score, 75-61.

LOS ANGELES - Despite an 11-day layoff between games, the San Diego State women's basketball team returned to action and never trailed a strong Dayton squad, using a 50.9 field-goal percentage to earn a 74-62 victory at the Women of Troy Basketball Tournament at the Galen Center. With the win, the Aztecs evened their record at 4-4 on the year, while the Flyers, who advanced to last year's NCAA second round, dropped to 5-5 in 2010-11.

SDSU got another outstanding outing from a pair of seniors in guard Coco Davis and center Paris Johnson. Davis notched a career-best 19 points, including three triples, to go with a season-high seven rebounds and six assists, while Johnson scored 16 of her 19 points in the second half and also pulled down a game-high 10 boards for her third double-double of the year.

The Aztecs reeled off six quick points, hitting three of their first four shots, while the Flyers were 0-for-5 before finally scoring at the 16:08 mark. SDSU would build an eight-point advantage, but Dayton closed the gap with consecutive rebound baskets and continued to hit the glass to negate the Aztecs' hot shooting start.

The Flyers later closed to within one on two occasions with the first coming after a 10-5 run. SDSU then got consecutive triples from Davis and Clements and a three-point play from junior Kalena Tutt for its largest lead thus far at 32-23. Dayton's Justine Raterman kept her team within striking distance with a pair of triples and her squad ended up tying the score for the first and only time at 35 with 1:18 left until the break.

The Aztecs owned a slight 38-35 advantage heading into the locker room following a three-point play by 6-6 center Malia Nahinu. Scoring continued to come from the interior on both sides as SDSU went up by seven to start the second half courtesy of Johnson, who scored eight points in a row.

Dayton was within four following a three-point play at 50-46, until the Aztecs got a pair of free throws from Gabrielle Clark, which kick started an 8-0 run to move out to a 58-46 lead. The Flyers closed once again to within seven, but was never able to get any closer as SDSU ended the game on a 14-9 run over the final 6:08 to secure the first ever meeting between the two foes at 74-62.

LOS ANGELES - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 15-point halftime deficit down to just four points, but could not get any closer as the Aztecs saw their three-game win streak come to an end with a 74-64 defeat to the host Trojans in the championship game of the Women of Troy Basketball Tournament at the Galen Center. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 4-5, while USC, which is a perfect 5-0 on its home court, improved to 7-3 overall.

Aztec senior Paris Johnson had a team-high 18 points on 6-for-11 shooting and a 6-for-6 performance at the free-throw line. Classmate Coco Davis, who was named to the all-tournament team for the first time in her career, scored in double-figures for the third outing in a row with 16 points and seven assists in playing all 40 minutes. Davis and Johnson finished the weekend by combining for 72 of the team's 138 points in the two outings.

SDSU's third senior, Jessica Bradley, had a game-high 11 rebounds, while Johnson added nine to fall just short of her second consecutive double-double. Sophomore Courtney Clements and freshman Melissa Sweat each tallied seven points for the Aztecs, who owned a slight advantage over the Trojans on both the boards (39-36) and shooting from the field (41.4 to 40.3 percent).

USC junior guard Ashley Corral made each of her first five attempts from the field, including three triples, in the first 4:18 alone to give the Trojans a 15-4 lead heading into the first timeout. The Aztecs closed it to single digits at eight points on three occasions, but USC continued to make nearly all its shots coming down the floor, hitting on 16-of-35, including 4-of-7 from beyond the arc, to go up by as many as 15, including at 42-27 at the half.

SDSU held the Women of Troy without a point for the first three and a half minutes coming out of the locker room to cut the deficit to eight and later got to within six points following a 6-0 run. A 3-pointer by Briana Gilbreath following a long offensive rebound, however, quickly restored the Trojan lead out to 52-43.

The Aztecs trailed by just four on four separate occasions, including at 62-58 with 4:34 left, and had the ball on offense to cut it to a single possession. Instead, USC erupted with an 8-0 run, capped by consecutive triples from Corral and another by Christina Marinacci following a steal to go up by 12 points at 70-58. A late triple by Davis cut the margin to single digits, but the Trojans ended the evening with four more points to the Aztecs' three to garner the 74-64 win.

SAN DIEGO - Playing its first home game in the last 28 days, the San Diego State women's basketball team got 26 points from senior Paris Johnson, including 17 in the first half alone, to lead the Aztecs to a 66-57 victory over Washington State. SDSU came out ahead for the first time at Viejas Arena this season and evened its record at 5-5, while the Cougars dropped to 2-10.

Johnson was 8-for-11 from the field in the first 20 minutes and ended up 11-for-21 for 26 points, her seventh outing with 18 or more points in 10 total contests this season. Johnson also tallied 15 rebounds for her fourth double-double of the year and second in the last three games.

Jessika Bradley was the only other Aztec in double-figure points with 11 and pulled down seven rebounds. Senior guard Coco Davis recorded a season-best eight boards and contributed nine of the team's 18 assists on the night, while sophomore Courtney Clements notched nine points on 4-for-9 shooting.

The two sides combined for five lead changes in the first four minutes of action, until SDSU turned a one-point advantage into a nine-point lead via an 8-0 run, featuring three consecutive buckets in the paint at 19-10. WSU would climb back to within five on three occasions, but the Aztecs outscored the visitors 8-4 in the final five minutes to go into the locker room up 11 points at 36-25.

After a Cougar bucket to open the second half made it just a nine-point game, SDSU went on a 12-0 run, highlighted by its only 3-pointers on the evening by center Malia Nahinu and Clements, to jump ahead by 21 points at 48-27.

After a timeout, WSU took a huge bite into the deficit, cutting it down to only nine points with just under eight minutes remaining, as SDSU missed several chances around the rim to put the game out of reach. The lead was nine on two more occasions before the end of the game, including at the 2:52 mark at 61-52, but the Aztecs pushed the advantage back out to 13 points with a jumper by Gabrielle Clark and three free throws. The Cougars finished out the night with two lay-ups in the final 31 seconds to round out the 66-57 SDSU victory.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team recorded a season-best nine 3-pointers and had four players score in double-figures to lead the Aztecs to a 72-52 win over visiting Texas-San Antonio in the first game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam at Viejas Arena. San Diego State had its largest lead of the first half heading into the locker room up by 13 points at 40-27, and moved out to an 18-point advantage on another triple at 47-29 with 14:50 left to go in the game. UTSA cut it to 13 points once, but was never able to get any closer as the Aztecs posted its biggest margin of victory this season, 72-52.

SAN DIEGO - The seventh-ranked Texas A&M Aggies claimed the San Diego Surf 'N Slam title in dominating fashion, shooting nearly 60 percent from the field and causing 31 Aztec turnovers to earn the 96-52 win over host San Diego State at Viejas Arena. SDSU dropped to 6-6 on the year with two losses to top-25 opponents, while the Aggies improved to 11-1 to round out 2010.

The Aggies had 21 giveaways themselves, but more than doubled up the Aztecs on the boards (46-21) and had 14 steals. SDSU scored 19 of its 52 points from the line, tallied five 3-pointers and registered eight blocked shots.

Texas A&M was led by tournament MVP Danielle Adams who was 11-of-15 from the field for 23 points in only 17 minutes of action.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team held visiting TCU without a field goal for the final six minutes of the game, cutting a 14-point second-half deficit down to only a pair, but the Aztecs came up just short, falling 49-47 in both teams' 2011 conference openers. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 6-7 on the season, while the preseason league favorite Horned Frogs improved to 9-6 following the contest at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs cut their deficit in half after the break, but the Horned Frogs used six baskets in the paint and raced out to a 14-point advantage at 45-31.

From there, San Diego State held TCU to only one field goal the remainder of the half and came all the way back to within two at 49-47 capped by 3-pointers from Johnson and junior Sajoyia Griffin. With only a minute left to play, the Horned Frogs stayed on the offensive side with the help of two consecutive offensive rebounds, before the Aztecs were forced to foul to put TCU on the line.

Horned Frog Helena Sverrisdottir, however, missed the front end of the 1-and-1 and SDSU grabbed the rebound before heading into a timeout with just seven seconds remaining to set up a final play. The Aztecs got the ball in the hands of Davis, who raced down the court, but her long distance pass intended for Johnson was intercepted by Sverrisdottir who wrapped up the ball as the buzzer sounded for the 49-47 TCU victory.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team got a career-high 29 points from sophomore Courtney Clements and rallied from a 12-point half-time deficit to force overtime, but was unable to notch the game-winning bucket in the final seconds, falling to visiting Utah, 70-67, at Viejas Arena. The loss was the Aztecs' fourth this year and second in a row by three or fewer points and dropped them to 6-8 overall and 0-2 in conference play. The Utes, meanwhile, improved to 2-0 in league action and 9-7 on the season.

Clements had a career afternoon, making 12 of her 19 shot attempts from the field and finishing with 29 points, 10 more than her previous high of 19 vs. No. 16 UCLA. Clements' 29 points are the most by an Aztec this season and the guard also tallied a career-best four assists and pulled down five boards.

SDSU senior Jessika Bradley notched her second double-double of the year and seventh of her career with 11 points and 11 rebounds. Paris Johnson and Sajoyia Griffin each had eight points and Coco Davis posted eight assists.

The Aztecs started strong, running out to an 11-0 lead before Utah was able to get on the scoreboard at the 15:23 mark. The basket, however, only woke up the Ute offense as it reeled off an 8-0 run to close to within three at 11-8.

After missing her opening attempt of the game, Utah's Iwalani Rodrigues did not miss for the remainder of the first half, making eight straight shots, including three from beyond the arc, to give the visitors a 12-point advantage at 39-27 heading into the locker room.

SDSU cut that deficit in half with three consecutive scores after the break and would eventually take the lead at 46-45 with 8:26 remaining. The Utes immediately countered with a Rodrigues triple and were up by five points with 1:58 left in regulation. Clements brought the Aztecs to within one point at 56-55 and was fouled on the made basket, but was unable to make the free throw and Utah went up by a pair on a free throw of its own with 38 seconds left on the clock.

The next time down the floor, Clements missed on a 3-pointer, but Gabrielle Clark grabbed the rebound for SDSU and Bradley scored the tying bucket with 15 seconds left to send it into overtime.

In the extra period, the two teams were tied once and traded the lead four times with the Aztecs going up by one on a Clements triple with 28 seconds left. After a timeout, however, Ute Michelle Plouffe made a jumper in the paint to give her team back the lead at 68-67, and on the ensuing possession, Davis' lay-up attempt with three seconds left caught the inside of the rim and Utah grabbed the rebound before hitting two free throws to close out the 70-67 victory.

LAS VEGAS - The San Diego State women's basketball team withstood a 5-1 run by host UNLV over the final two minutes of the game, holding on for a 55-52 win at Cox Pavilion. The victory was the Aztecs' first in Mountain West Conference play this season, improving them to 1-2 in league action and 7-8 overall, while the Lady Rebels fell to 7-10 and 0-3 in MWC action.

SDSU got 16 points from sophomore Courtney Clements, who scored the team's final four points, including a free-throw with 10 seconds left that made it a three-point game. Aztec seniors Paris Johnson and Jessika Bradley each fell one rebound short of a double-double, putting in 11 and 10 points respectively, while each tallying nine rebounds. The pair also combined for 12 of the squad's season-best 14 blocked shots on the evening.

After only two baskets were scored through the first three plus minutes, the sides traded leads six times before the Aztecs went up by four points at 14-10. The Lady Rebels knotted the game with two straight buckets and no side led by more than five the entire first half, as SDSU went into the break on a 7-0 run to push ahead by a pair at 27-25.

After UNLV hit a free throw, the Aztecs continued their scoring spurt for the game's biggest advantage to that point at 37-26. The host Lady Rebels went without a field goal for the first five minutes of the second half until a rebound basket by Ta'Nitra Byrd made the score 37-28. San Diego State countered with a triple from Clements, but UNLV's India Chaney bettered that effort with back-to-back 3-pointers and the visitors led by only seven with just under 12 minutes.

The Aztecs then hit a dry spell on the offensive side, going nearly four minutes without a point as the home team closed to within three at 41-38. SDSU finally broke through with a rebound basket from Clements and a lay-up from Bradley to get a little breathing room with a seven-point lead, but UNLV came storming back to move the score to a two-point game at 47-45.

The visitors extended their lead out to seven points and could have gone up by more by converting at the free-throw line, but instead the Lady Rebels had the ball with a chance to tie or take the lead with 3-pointer on the game's final possession. UNLV's Erica Helms, however, missed the last-chance 3-pointer from the left angle and Clements secured the 55-52 victory.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team logged its second consecutive three-point victory, holding on in the game's final possession to edge visiting New Mexico, 56-53, at Viejas Arena. UNM continued to stay in the game, however, as it responded with a 3-pointer to get to within two and had a chance to tie it with Porche Torrance heading to the free-throw line with 30 seconds left. Torrance made the first, but missed the second and Davis made two free throws on the other end to put the host squad back up by three.

Following a time out, Best missed a 3-pointer on the right wing that would have tied it and Davis got the rebound to secure the 56-53 Aztec victory.

USAF ACADEMY, Colo. - In a contest featuring 17 lead changes and 14 tie scores, the San Diego State women's basketball team came out on the losing side of its fifth consecutive conference game to be decided by three points or fewer, falling at Air Force, 61-58, at Clune Arena. The Aztecs dropped to 8-9 and 2-3 in league action, while the Falcons improved to 6-11 and 1-3 in MWC play.

The Aztecs immediately jumped ahead with a 3-pointer from Clements, but Air Force finished the half with two fastbreak lay-ups and tied the score at 36.

The second half started with five lead changes over the first seven minutes of action. After the Falcons went up 45-43, SDSU went scoreless for nearly six minutes until Johnson hit a bucket at the 10:36 mark. Luckily, Air Force managed just one point over that span themselves and led by only one at 46-45.

The game was tied at 49 for over three minutes and was knotted again at 51, 55 and 56 heading into the final two and a half minutes. A jumper by Alicia Leipprandt put the Falcons up by three points 59-56 with 1:45 left to go.

The Aztecs cut the deficit to a single point on a Davis jumper and Air Force missed their shot on the other end, but Johnson was tied up getting the rebound and the Falcons had the possession arrow with 17.7 seconds left still up 59-58.

San Diego State then fouled and Leipprandt made both free throws to move the score out to 61-58. SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team was limited to two points in the final five minutes of the first half, as visiting Brigham Young rallied from an early 10-point deficit to hand the Aztecs a 65-55 loss at Viejas Arena. SDSU dropped to 8-10 overall following just its fourth double-figure defeat of the season and is now 2-4 in conference play, while the Cougars improved to 13-7 and 5-1 in MWC action.

From there, however, the Aztec offense stalled, managing only one basket, while the Cougars scored 16 points, including a pair of triples and eight points by forward Kristen Riley to take the lead and own a 31-26 halftime advantage.

Bradley came out of the locker room and scored SDSU's first seven points to make the score 38-33 with 16:21 left to play. The Cougars responded with a bucket by Riley in the paint and pushed their advantage into double-figures with a 3-pointer, which led to a 9-0 run by the visitors. The Aztecs would pull to within 10 points at 47-37 on a lay-up by Davis, but after a timeout, BYU scored four points in a span of only two seconds following an SDSU intentional foul and went up by 14.

The Cougars led by as many as 19 at 63-44 at the 5:07 mark, before San Diego State scored the game's final seven points to finish out the 65-55 loss.

Bradley also had five blocked shots and pulled down a career-high 13 rebounds for her third double-double of the year, while Clements made a team season-best four triples and had three steals. Senior Paris Johnson contributed 10 points, nine rebounds and four blocks for SDSU, which played without senior guard Coco Davis due to injury.

Wyoming got out early, hitting four of its first seven shots to own an 8-3 lead. The Aztecs, however, answered with a 4-1 run on baskets from Johnson and Bradley to get it back to a two-point game.

The SDSU offense then went scoreless for the next three and a half minutes, as the Cowgirls raced out to a 19-7 advantage before a Bradley rebound bucket ended the drought. The Aztecs finally began to heat up from the field, getting a pair of triples by Clements and one from Sajoyia Griffin to highlight a 16-2 run and take the lead at 25-23.

Wyoming answered with four straight points from the post by Chaundra Sewell and also had two 3-pointers by Aubrey Vandiver to race into the locker room up by six points at 36-30.

SDSU held the Cowgirls without a point for the first 4:50 of the second half, as it closed to within just a pair at 36-34. Wyoming didn't get its first field goal after the break until the 12:19 mark to put the host school up 41-35.

The Aztecs' stingy defense continued to limit the Cowgirls to just the one field goal, but couldn't keep them from the free-throw line as they scored seven of their first nine points to keep the lead by three at 45-42. Wyoming's final two field goals of the game were both triples with one coming at the 5:44 mark and the other with 2:30 to play and the score in its favor, 53-44. SDSU closed to six on two occasions, but the Cowgirls finished out the game at the line with six free throws for the 59-51 victory.

SAN DIEGO - In a game featuring eight lead changes and two tie scores in the final 15 minutes, the San Diego State women's basketball team once again found itself on the short end of another close contest, falling 56-51, Wednesday to visiting Colorado State at Viejas Arena. The loss is the squad's 10th this season of 10 or fewer points and moved them to 8-12 overall and 2-6 in league action, while the Rams snapped SDSU's six-game series win streak, improving to 12-9 and 5-3 to finish out the first round of MWC play.

Despite the loss, Aztec senior Paris Johnson became the school's all-time career leader in blocked shots, notching three on the night to give her 252 in her career. She surpassed the previous record of 251 held by Michelle Suman, who starred on The Mesa from 1992-95. Johnson also was the only Aztec to score in double-figures vs. the Rams, shooting 5-for-10 from the floor and 6-for-8 at the free-throw line to finish with 16 points.

SDSU sophomore Courtney Clements came off the bench for the first time this year to score eight points, while senior Jessika Bradley had eight rebounds and senior Coco Davis tallied seven of the team's 14 assists.

Colorado State had the hot hand early, racing out to a quick 7-0 lead by hitting three of its first four shots. The Aztecs finally got on the board close to three minutes into the contest and trailed by three points three times. The Rams pushed out to what would be the game's largest advantage at 30-22, but Clements immediately responded with a lay-up in the paint to make it a six-point game with 5:48 left.

Clements' bucket would be the final field goal by either side the remainder of the half, as a Johnson free throw was the only point scored with CSU heading into the locker room up 30-25.

The Aztecs made a pair of 3-pointers after the break to close the gap to just one and knotted the score at 34 before owning their first lead, 35-34, on a free-throw by junior Sajoyia Griffin. The advantage changed hands seven more times over the next nine and a half minutes with the Rams going up by one at 47-46 on a lay-up at the 4:18 mark.

SDSU trailed by as many as five points in the final minute, but got a triple from Clements to get to within a single possession at 53-51. Colorado State, however, made three of its four free-throw attempts to close out the 56-51 victory.
