

Aztecs Finished Tied For MW West Division Title: Reach Bowl Game For Fifth Consecutive Season

San Diego State persevered through injuries to key players and close losses to post a 7-6 record in 2014 and advance to a school-record fifth consecutive bowl game. The Aztecs won all seven games by double figures, joining Arkansas and Rice as the only teams in the nation to post a winning record with each victory coming by at least 10 points. The Aztecs ended Mountain West play with a 5-3 record, and tied Fresno State for the top mark in the Western Division.

Defense Does The Talking

In 2014, San Diego State posted one of the best defensive seasons in school history. The Aztecs ended the year ranked among the top 20 in nearly every statistical category, including points allowed (19.8, 13th), yards allowed (332.5, 16th), passing yards allowed (178.5, 10th) and team passing efficiency defense (112.10, 19th).

SDSU did not allow any opponent to reach 400 yards of total offense in its final nine games of the 2014 campaign. That is tied for the second-longest active streak nationally.

Ground Control

San Diego State has enjoyed a schoolrecord five consecutive seasons with at least 2,000 yards rushing and has produced a 1,000-yard running back in each of those campaigns.

Sophomore Donnel Pumphrey (2014: 1,867 rushing yards, 6.8 ypc, 20 TDs) proved to be one of the most productive running backs in the country.

In 2014, the only two players in the nation to rank among the top 10 in rushing yards per game, all-purpose yards per game, rushing touchdowns and rushing yards per carry were Doak Walker Award winner Melvin Gordon (Wisconsin) and Pumphrev.

Since 2010, San Diego State ranks 25th in the nation in rushing yards (12,339) and rushing yards per game (189.8), and tied for 22nd in rushing touchdowns (143).

Success Despite The Struggles

San Diego State's success in 2014 was all the more amazing due to its struggles in the

With a senior (Quinn Kaehler) who missed two starts due to injury and played less than 100 percent and a true freshman (Nick Bawden) who was pressed into duty twice as a starter and several other times as a reserve. SDSU did not have the balanced attack the coaching staff envisioned when the season

San Diego State had the 17th-lowest passing efficiency rating in the nation last season (109.1). Of the teams with the 28 lowest passing ratings in the nation, only SDSU and Penn State posted winning records.

The combined records of those 28 teams were 110-232 (32.2 percent).

Aztecs Honored

San Diego State sophomore running back Donnel Pumphrey earned 2014 Mountain West Football All-Conference First-Team honors

The Aztecs also had four players - senior left tackle Terry Poole, cornerbacks Damontae Kazee and J.J. Whittaker and sophomore punt returner Lloyd Mills - selected to the second team.

Additionally, senior linebacker Josh Gavert, junior right guard Darrell Greene, sophomore nose tackle Alex Barrett, sophomore linebacker Calvin Munson and sophomore Warrior (safety) Malik Smith each were honorable mention picks.

The 10 overall all-conference selections were the most in the West Division of the MW and the fourth-highest total overall. The 10 players recognized (one first team, four second team, five honorable mention) were two more than 2013 (one first team, one second team, six honorable mention). Six of the 10 award winners were sophomores and eight have eligibility remaining in 2015.

Another Year To

- → San Diego State advanced to its fifth consecutive bowl game. The Aztecs joined Stanford as the only football teams in California -FBS or NFL - to reach the postseason in each of the past five seasons.
- → SDSU is one of 27 schools to play in a bowl game in each of the last five years, which marks the longest streak in the Mountain West. San Diego State and Boise State are the only two current Mountain West schools to reach a bowl game in 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014.

- → With bowl game appearances in a schoolrecord five straight seasons, the Aztecs equaled their total number of bowls played in the 43 prior campaigns (1967 through 2009).
- → Between 2000-09, SDSU was 38-80 (.322) and owned the nation's 106th-best winning percentage. Since 2010. San Diego State is 41-24 (.631) and owns the nation's 30th-best winning percentage.
- → Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, San Diego State has posted a 41-24 record (.631). The only teams in the state of California with a better record during that span are Stanford and USC.
- → The 41 wins from 2010 through 2014 represents the highest five-year total since SDSU compiled a 45-8-2 record from 1973-
- → Since the beginning of 2010, the Aztecs have won 41 games. The total is the second most in the league, trailing only Boise State

After punting on its opening drive, SDSU forced the Lumberjacks into a 3-and-out and got the ball back with 11:58 left in the first. Pumphrey completed the 9-play, 63-yard scoring drive with a 1-yard touchdown

After NAU punted again on its next possession, the Aztecs mounted a 7-play, 88-yard march to go up 14-0. The drive was highlighted by four straight first-down plays - a 14-yard pass from Kaehler to Eric Judge, a 15-yard strike from Kaehler to Ezell Ruffin, a 33-yard reverse handoff to Lloyd Mills and a 21-

Northern Arizona tried to answer after getting all the way to the SDSU 30, thanks to a 50-yard catch and run by Alex Holmes from Kyren Poe on a 2nd and 15. San Diego State stood tall, however, and forced the Lumberjacks into a 45-yard field goal attempt. On the try, Alex Barrett reached up and swatted the

On the ensuing possession, the Aztecs got into field goal range of their own, thanks in part to an NAU pass interference call and a 33-yard run by Pumphrey. Donny Hageman then split the upright from 48 yards to put SDSU up, 17-0. It was the first successful field goal attempt by the Aztecs since Sept. 28,

Hageman later looked to make it four straight scores for the Aztecs, but his 46-yard attempt went wide

left, giving the ball back to the Lumberjacks.

After being forced to punt once again, NAU's fourth out of its five possessions, SDSU got the ball back with 1:42 left in the second quarter. Kaehler was perfect on the ensuing drive, completing all five of his passes for 75 yards, ending with a 2-yard toss to a wide open Robert Craighead and giving the Aztecs a 24-0 advantage at the half.

NAU finally got on the scoreboard with 6:36 left in the third quarter as Jahn rumbled in from 1-yard out, capping a 9-play, 74-yard drive.

The Lumberjacks appeared to gain the momentum after the touchdown after they forced the Aztecs into a 3-and-out, and got all the way to the SDSU 38. Kyren Poe's pass on a 3rd and 5, however, was picked off by Calvin Munson and returned 64 yards to the NAU 1

Pumphrey didn't waste any time as he scored on the very first play, putting San Diego State back up by 24 at 31-7.

NAU got the ball back, but was forced into its third 3-and-out of the game. The Aztecs' Lloyd Mills then took the punt 67 yards to seal the win for the home team. It was SDSU's third punt return for a touchdown in four game dating back to the 2013 season.

San Diego State improved to 47-40-5 all-time in season-opening games, including a 19-6-1 mark in its Division I era (since 1969) when the opener is at

The 31-point margin of victory was the Aztecs' largest since beating Hawai'i by 38 (52-14) on Oct.

Kaehler extended his streak of 200-yard passing games to 13, the longest streak by a SDSU quarterback since at least 1996.

Price added 45 yards on the ground and also caught two balls for 22 yards, while Judge (5 receptions, 51 yards) and Ruffin (4 receptions, 53 yards) combined for nine catches and 104 yards.

Malik Smith led the San Diego State defense with seven tackles and three pass breakups in his first career start, while Trey Lomax and J.J. Whittaker contributed six stops apiece.

The seven points allowed were the fewest against the Aztecs since a 42-7 win over Army on Sept. 8,

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. - San Diego State held a pair of double-digit second-half leads at No. 21/23 North Carolina, but couldn't hold on in a 31-27 loss at Kenan Stadium.

Quinn Kaehler threw for a career-high 341 yards and a touchdown, and Donnel Pumphrey recorded his second straight 100-yard rushing game with 100 yards and two touchdowns on 17 attempts, but the Tar Heels scored on four straight possessions over the final two quarters and stopped the Aztecs' last drive.

Down, 31-27, with four minutes left, Kaehler used a 12-play, 72-yard drive to get SDSU all the way down to the UNC 3-yard line. His attempt from the 3, however, was intercepted by a diving Tim Scott in the corner of the end zone to end the game in favor of the Tar Heels.

After UNC took Kaehler's first interception back 100 yards for a score early in the second quarter, San Diego State bounced back with a quick 3-play, 75-yard drive, highlighted by a 19-yard gain by Pumphrey and a 56-yard touchdown strike from Kaehler to Eric Judge.

The Aztecs got the ball back on the Tar Heels' next drive as Alex Barrett deflected Mitch Trubisky's pass attempt on the third play of the drive into the hands of Jon Sanchez, who returned it six yards to the UNC 41. Five plays later, Pumphrey punched it in from 12 yards to put SDSU up, 14-7, at halftime.

At the half, San Diego State piled up 244 yards to North Carolina's 108, while dominating the time of possession by almost nine minutes (19:16 to 10:44).

After Thomas Moore missed a field goal, the Aztecs stretched their lead to 14 at 21-7 when Pumphrey's 3-yard TD run completed a 7-play, 76-

The Tar Heels responded with a long 14-play, 65yard drive over 4:26 with a 11-yard touchdown pass from Marquise Williams to Quinshad David to get within seven points at 21-14 with 4:40 remaining in the third quarter.

Donny Hageman made it 24-14 with a 49-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter in a drive that ate up 5:44 of clock time.

UNC, however, took hardly any time at all to answer as Williams connected on a 91-yard pass to Mack Hollins and make it a one-possession game

Kaehler got SDSU into scoring position on the team's ensuing drive, thanks to a 27-yard pass to Robert Craighead and a 24-yard strike to Dakota Gordon, but had to settle for a 40-yard Hageman field

North Carolina used an 8-play, 80-yard drive, culminating in a 2-yard rushing TD by Elijah Hood, to take just its second lead of the game with 8:01 left in the fourth quarter.

It appeared the Tar Heels were going to put the game out of reach as Brian Walker intercepted Kaehler on the SDSU 40 and returned it 26 yards to the 14-yard line. The San Diego State defense, however, stood tall and kept UNC to a 23-yard field goal and slim 4-point lead (31-27).

The Aztecs got all the way to the 3-yard line where Scott made the diving interception and sealed the win for North Carolina.

SDSU outgained the Tar Heels, 509-394, for the game, including a 341-263 advantage in the air. San Diego State also held an edge in rushing yards (168-131), time of possession (37:26-22:34) and first downs (23-20), but its three interceptions led to a touchdown, field goal and kneel down.

Chase Price complimented Pumprey's 100 yards with 71 on 16 carries.

Trey Lomax had a career- and game-high 10 tackles to pace the Aztec defense, while J.J. Whittaker and Na'im McGee added career-high marks of seven tackles apiece.

Despite the loss, SDSU had a second-half lead vs. a top-25 non-conference opponent on the road for the first time since Sept. 18, 2004 at No. 17/17 Michigan.

CORVALLIS, Ore. - Sean Mannion threw for 275 yards as Oregon State scored the final 28 points of the game in a 28-7 win over San Diego State at Reser Stadium.

The Aztecs were outgained, 372-215, over the game and were behind on time of possession by almost 11 minutes (35:27-24:33). Additionally, the Beavers held a 25-11 advantage in first downs and ran 18 more

Donnel Pumphrey led SDSU once again with 89 rushing yards on 17 carries (5.2 avg.) and the team's lone touchdown.

San Diego State jumped out to a 7-0 lead on its opening 8-play, 75-yard drive. The Aztecs began the game with a 36-yard rush by Lloyd Mills to get all the way to the OSU 34-yard line. After an incomplete pass on a flea flicker, Pumphrey went to work with four straight carries for 27 yards. Quarterback Quinn Kaehler found Mills on a 5-yard completion to set up a 1st and goal on the 2, before Pumphrey finished the drive and give SDSU its lone lead of the game.

After forcing Oregon State to punt, San Diego State got the ball back, but had to punt after going 3 and out. On Joel Alesi's punt, however, the Beavers' Victor Bolden fumbled the return and Pierre Romain pounced on it to give the Aztecs the ball back on OSU's 38.

SDSU, however, would give it right back after Kaehler took a sack and, and after a timeout, was picked off by Steven Nelson.

Oregon State then put together a 12-play, 70-yard drive, ending with a 12-yard TD run by Terron Ward, to tie it up at 7-7.

Each team exchanged punts until San Diego State used a 19-yard pass from Kaehler to Mills and a 15-yard run by Pumphrey to get to the Beaver 33-yard line. But the Aztecs drew two delay of game penalties and Kaehler was sacked for a loss of nine yards to get out of field goal range.

OSU responded with a 8-play, 88-yard drive to close the half with another Ward touchdown, this time from two vards out, to take a 14-7 lead.

Oregon State scored on each of its first two possessions in the second half (making it three straight overall), first a 5-yard TD run by Storm Woods and then a 2-yard scamper by Woods, to put the game out of reach.

SDSU, which allowed multiple rushing touchdowns for the first time in eight contests, had gone 14 straight games wihtout suffering consecutive defeats before

Kaehler was 14-for-26 for 106 yards and two interceptions in the loss for San Diego State. Kaehler, who dropped to 9-5 all-time as the team's starting quarterback, had his streak of 14 consecutive games with 200 yards passing snapped. The streak was the longest by an Aztec since at least 1996 and the thirdlongest active streak in the nation.

Making his first career start in place of injured Biletnikoff Award candidate Ezell Ruffin, Mills had career highs of three receptions, 35 receiving yards and 36 rushing yards, while adding two punt returns for 22 vards.

Trey Lomax, who entered the weekend in a tie for fourth nationally among freshmen with 8.0 tackles per game, had a career-high 11 stops for SDSU, while J.J. Whittaker also set a career high with 11 tackles (eight solo).

The San Diego State defense forced two fumbles (Cody Galea and Sam Meredith) and recovered their first (Pierre Romain) of the season, Malik Smith also added his first career interception.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State began its quest for a 20th conference title with a 34-17 victory over UNLV in the Mountain West opener at Qualcomm Stadium

Donnel Pumphrey rushed for a career-high-tying 167 yards, including 107 yards in the first half, and a career-best four rushing touchdowns as the Aztecs won their 14th game in their last 16 league outings.

Pumphrey, who also set a career high with 22 attempts, averaging 7.6 yards per carry, posted his third 100-yard rushing game in four contests on the year as SDSU posted its largest margin of victory (17 points) in a MW game since a 19-point win over Air Force on Nov. 10, 2012.

It was the Rebels who got on the scoreboard first as they got into good field position after forcing San Diego State to a 3-and-out on its opening possession. The Aztecs' Joel Alesi punted it 44 yards to Jay Mitchell at the UNLV 39, who returned it 48 yards to set up 1st and 10 on the 13. The SDSU defense, however, stood tall and held the Rebels to a 22-yard field goal by Jonathan Leiva.

San Diego State wasted no time answering as Pumphrey took the first play of the team's second drive 71 yards to the end zone to put the Aztecs on top. 7-3.

After the two teams exchanged punts, UNLV drove 88 yards on seven plays, ending with a 44-yard touchdown pass from Blake Decker to Devonte Boyd. It would be the Rebels' final lead of the game (10-

7), however, as SDSU scored 24 unanswered points to break open a close contest, including three straight touchdowns by Pumphrey

Pumphrey, a Las Vegas native, scored on runs from one yard, three yards and one yard, the latter coming with 11 seconds left in the half. San Diego State had started with the ball with just 0:43 left on its own 15. Quarterback Quinn Kaehler got the Aztecs down the field in a hurry, though, with a 24-vard completion to Larry Clark, a 15-yard pass to Mikah Holder two plays later and a 45-yard strike to Lloyd Mills two plays after that down to the 1-yard line. After calling a timeout, Pumphrey attempted to throw his first touchdown pass, but his attempt to Daniel Brunskill fell to the turf. On the very next play, Pumphrey pounded it across the end zone to put SDSU up, 28-10, at inter-

Neither team scored in the third quarter, but UNLV did threaten on its opening possession. The Rebels got to their own 47 after a 15-yard pass from Decker to Anthony Williams. After a 3-yard sack by Alex Barrett that pushed UNLV back to the 44, Decker was picked off by Calvin Munson at the San Diego State

The Rebels got the ball back later in the quarter, but Leiva's 43-yard field goal attempt hit the right goal post, keeping the score at 28-10 after three quarters.

The Aztecs put together a long 13-play, 67-yard drive to get to the UNLV 7-yard line. Donny Hageman then nailed a 24-yard field goal to put SDSU up by 21 at 31-10, its largest lead of the game.

The Rebels answered with a 7-play, 80-yard march, ending with a Decker 2-yard plunge.

San Diego State, however, once again grounded up clock time, using 5:29 on 66 yards over 11 plays before Hageman made a 31-yard field goal for the final points of the game.

Kaehler completed 16 of 27 passing attempts for 209 yards, his 15th 200-yard game over the past 16 contests, while Clark set career highs of four receptions and 71 yards.

Barrett had two of the Aztecs' six sacks on the night, the program's most since recording six at Wyoming on Nov. 24, 2012, while Josh Gavert tied his career high with 11 tackles in his first start of the year.

SDSU went without a turnover for the first time since Nov. 2, 2013, vs. New Mexico and picked off two passes for the first time since Nov. 23, 2013 at Boise

San Diego State finished with a .500 or better September (2-2) for the first time since 2011.

FRESNO, Calif. - San Diego State held Fresno State to 315 yards of total offense, forced two turnovers and had nine tackles for loss, but it was not enough as the Bulldogs pulled away late for a 24-13 victory at Bulldog Stadium.

The Bulldogs forced three Aztec turnovers, converting them into 14 points in Fresno State's 1,000th

Fresno State got on the scoreboard first when Kody Kroening converted a 37-yard field goal with 8:18 left in the first quarter. The Bulldogs got 40 of their 43 yards on the 8-play drive on the ground, including 27 by Marteze Waller and 13 from quarterback Brian Burrell.

Fresno got the ball right back when Kyrie Wilson forced SDSU true freshman Nick Bawden to fumble the ball after a 7-yard gain. Fresno State then put together a 10-play, 67-yard drive over 4:19, ending with a Brandon Cornette 1-yard touchdown run on 4th and goal. The key play of the drive was a 49-yard pass from Burrell to Josh Harper on a 3rd and 12 from its own 31-yard line.

SDSU got on the scoreboard just 1:16 into the second quarter when Donny Hageman split the uprights on a 24-yard field goal attempt. The Aztecs grounded and pounded their way to the field goal, gaining all 60 of their yards on the ground on the 11-play drive that ate up 4:15 of clock time. Running back Donnel Pumphrey had 33 of the 60 yards on the drive, while fullback Dakota Gordon had the other 27

After both teams traded punts to start the second half, Fresno State's Burrell was stripped by Calvin Munson and Trey Lomax scooped up the loose ball and returned it 10 yards to the Bulldog 24. The Aztecs however, were only able to cash in on a field goal and Hageman's 36-yarder closed the gap to 10-6.

Fresno State responded with an 11-play, 81-yard drive over 5:23, thanks in part to three SDSU penalties (two on fourth down, one on third down), concluding with Josh Quezada's 2-yard touchdown run. It appeared San Diego State would get out of trouble early in the drive, but Daniel Brunskill was whistled for

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. - Donnel Pumphrey rushed for a career-high 246 yards and two touchdowns and Chase Price added 141 yards and a score to lead San Diego State to a 24-14 win at New Mexico. Pumphrey and Price helped the Aztecs rush for 397 yards, the eighth most in single-game history (third most in SDSU's Division I history), and lead San Diego State to the win in Rocky Long's first game as a

Long, the all-time winningest coach in the Mountain West, who coached at New Mexico from 1998-08 and graduated from UNM in 1974, has now been on the winning sideline in each of the last 13 times the two teams have played (2001-08 as head coach with the Lobos, 2009-10 as defensive coordinator with the Aztecs and 2011, 2013-14 as the head coach at SDSU).

Pumphrey got his 246 yards on 20 attempts (12.3 avg.) with 93 of them coming on a touchdown run in the third quarter. It was the true sophomore's fourth 100-yard game of the season (in six contests) and seventh of his career. The 246 yards were the 13th most in a game in school history.

Price rumbled for 141 yards on 17 carries (8.3 avg.) for his first 100-yard game of his career. He became the 74th player in school history to rush for at least 100 yards in a game.

It was the 18th time in school history that San Diego State had multiple 100-yard rushers, where the

SDSU wasted no time on its opening drive, taking it 70 yards on 14 plays over 6:29 before Donny Hageman nailed a 25-yard field goal. It was the seventh straight make for Hageman, who improved to 8for-9 on the year on field goal tries. True freshman Nick Bawden, making his second career start, got San Diego State out of a jam with a 15-yard run on a third and 12 and later connected on a 43-yard strike to Eric Judge on a 3rd and 15, the longest pass of his short career. Bawden would go onto become just the second Aztec true freshman to start at quarterback in

a SDSU victory.

New Mexico answered Pumphrey's rushing touchdown with a quick 5-play, 75-yard drive over 1:17, culminating with a 45-yard pass from Lamar Jordan to Carlos Wiggins with 10:20 to play.

After forcing a punt to start the second half, SDSU took another 10-point lead when Price scored on a 27-yard touchdown run. The drive, which went 56 yards in just three plays over 0:36, was led by quarterback Quinn Kaehler, who entered the game in the beginning of the third quarter.

The Lobos responded with a 13-play, 75-yard drive over 6:29, ending with a 1-yard run by Teriyon Gipson to bring the game back to three points at 17-14.

San Diego State, however, would seal the game when Pumphrey took the second play of the drive 93 yards for the score. The 93-yard rush was the second longest in the Aztecs' Division I era (since 1969) and the third-longest rushing play in program history.

SDSU won its 10th consecutive game in the Mountain time zone, the longest active streak in the nation, and won for the 15th time in the past 18 contests.

San Diego State finished the game with a 245-yard advantage in rushing (397-152), its fifth-largest advantage in the Division Lera, New Mexico came into the weekend ranked fourth in the nation at 322.40 ards per game.

Josh Gavert led the Aztec defense with 11 tackles, including 0.5 tackles for loss, and his first interception of the season (third of career). Calvin Munson added eight stops and 1.0 TFL, while J.J. Whittaker and Na'im McGee came up with six tackles apiece.

SAN DIEGO - Donnel Pumphrey ran for 182 yards and a touchdown and Quinn Kaehler added 174 yards in the air in his first start in three games to lead San Diego State past Hawai'i, 20-10, and into sole possession of first place in the West Division of the Mountain West at Qualcomm Stadium.

The Aztecs outgained the Rainbow Warriors, 457-264, including a massive 283-90 edge on the ground. SDSU also forced three UH turnovers, while committing one, and held an almost 13-minute time of possession advantage (36:07-23:53).

San Diego State took its opening drive 86 yards on 10 plays, culminating with a 10-yard rushing touchdown by Pumphrey. The Aztecs showed its game plan early as 83 of the 86 yards were on the ground on the opening drive, which lasted 5:16, highlighted by a 34-yard run by Marcus Stamps.

After forcing a 3 and out, SDSU put together another 10-play drive, this time ending in a 36-yard field goal by Donny Hageman. It was Hageman's eighth straight field goal make.

San Diego State would take a 10-0 lead into the second quarter as it had 100 more yards (128-28) than Hawai'i after the break

The Rainbow Warriors caught a break early in the second quarter when Scott Harding's rugby punt was misplayed by the Aztecs and recovered by Quinto Pedroza. The SDSU defense, however, held UH to a field goal attempt, which was missed by Tyler Hadden from 39 yards out.

It appeared San Diego State would go into halftime with a 10-0 lead, but a Hail Mary by Hawai'i's Ikaika Woolsey was caught by Marcus Kemp in the end zone with just five seconds left on a 3rd and 15, bringing the visitors to within three at 10-7 after two quarters.

The Aztecs tacked on another score in the third quarter as they marched 92 yards on nine plays over 4:56 before Kaehler connected on a 26-yard touchdown strike to Lloyd Mills. On the scoring drive, SDSU's second longest of the season in terms of yards, Kaehler was 4-for-4 for 71 yards, connecting three times

the fourth quarter.

with Mills (39 yards) and once to Larry Clark (32 vards). San Diego State would hold its 17-10 lead into

The Aztecs got into the red zone early in the fourth, but Hageman's 31-yard field goal attempt missed

SDSU's defense ended the game in style, however, forcing three Rainbow Warrior turnovers over their final four plays, including two by Malik Smith (interception and fumble recovery) and one by Damontae Kazee (interception)

In between, Pumphrey broke 100 yards for the game with a 47-yard rush and Hageman added a 23yard field goal to close out the scoring.

San Diego State ran its home winning streak to five games, its longest since another five-game home winning streak from Oct. 9, 1998-Sept. 4, 1999 (17 seasons), and improved to 16-3 over its last 19 conference games.

The Aztecs' 283 rushing yards came against a team that was allowing just 125.83 per game, good enough for 36th in the nation. SDSU improved to 3-0 on the year and 20-2 in the Rocky Long era with 12 straight wins when rushing for at least 200 yards.

It was San Diego State's third consecutive game in which fewer than 40 points were scored by both teams, the first time that has happened since 2004

Pumphrey set a career high with 25 carries en route to his fifth 100-yard rushing game of the season and eighth of his career. The 182 yards were the second most of his career.

Kaehler finished the game with 174 yards and a touchdown, completing 13 of 24 passes in his first start since the UNLV game. He improved to 11-5 alltime as the Aztecs' starting quarterback.

Mills had a career-high four catches for 42 yards and a touchdown, while Chase Favreau (42 yards) and Clark (32) each hauled in long grabs.

Na'im McGee had a team and career-high eight tackles, while Calvin Munson chipped in with seven stops and a tackle for loss. Smith had one tackle, and the fumble recovery and interception.

RENO. Nev. - Don Jackson ran for a career-high 124 yards and a touchdown. James Butler added 103 yards and a score and Nevada forced three turnovers to help the Wolf Pack down San Diego State, 30-14. at Mackay Stadium.

The win moved Nevada into a tie with the Aztecs atop the conference's West Division at 6-3.

SDSU led, 14-10, at halftime, but the Wolf Pack outscored San Diego State, 20-0, after the break to pick up its third consecutive comeback win. Nevada scored 29 straight to beat Brigham Young, 42-35, in Provo, Utah, on Oct. 18, and rattled off 26 unanswered points in a 26-18 win at Hawai'i on Oct. 25.

San Diego State struck first, using a 7-play, 55-yard drive over 3:45, ending with a 1-yard touchdown rush by Chase Price.

Nevada got into good field position, taking a kickoff 55 yards back to the SDSU 39-yard line. The San Diego State defense, however, held the Wolf Pack to a field goal, the first of three by Brent Zuzo.

On the visitor team's first drive of the second guarter, Kaehler was picked off by Nevada's J. McNeal on 3rd and 10 and returned it back to set up the Wolf Pack once again deep inside Aztec territory. After a no-gain, Fajardo found Richy Turner out on the slot, who ran it 20 yards into the end zone to put Nevada up, 10-7.

After two more punts by each team, SDSU tried to put together one last drive to close the half. The drive, which was 77 yards over seven plays and took just 2:12, saw Kaehler go 4-for-6 for 67 yards, ending with an acrobatic, juggling 21-yard catch by Jemond Hazely. It was the first career TD reception by Hazely, helping San Diego State take a 14-13 lead into inter-

The second half wasn't as kind for the Aztecs as they went fumble (Pumphrey's second of the game after coming into it with just two lost over 269 career attempts), punt, punt, punt, punt and turnover on downs to close the game.

The Wolf Pack, meanwhile, got a 25-yard field goal by Zuzo in the third quarter, a 24-yarder in the fourth, and rushing scores by Butler (43 yards) and Jackson (1 yard) to finish the 30-14 victory.

Pumphrey rushed for 85 yards on 13 attempts, averaging 6.5 yards per carry, and broke 1,000 yards for the season in the process. He became the 15th Aztec. to rush for 1,000 yards in a season (20th occasion overall) and the 13th in SDSU's Division I era (since

San Diego State now has had a 1,000-yard rusher in five straight seasons (2010-14) for the first time since 1991-95. The Aztecs had just three 1,000-yard rushers over the 14 years in between (1996-2009).

Price added 58 yards on just eight attempts (7.2 avg.) and had career highs of four catches and 28 yards.

Kaehler passed for 189 yards, going 21-for-36 with a touchdown and an interception.

Three SDSU players - Hazely (3 rec., 31 yds., TD), Mills (3 rec., 52 yds.) and Daniel Brunskill (3 rec., 19 yds.) - joined Price in posting career highs in receiving yards, while Ezell Ruffin, playing his first game since breaking his collarbone at No. 21/23 North Carolina on Sept. 6, had three grabs for 21 yards. Adam Roberts also posted season highs with three receptions and 33 vards.

On the defensive side of the ball, Jake Fely and Na'im McGee each had six tackles to pace San Diego State. It was Felv's first game since Sept. 28, 2013. at New Mexico State (399 days in between). Heyward added career highs in tackles (5), tackles for loss (2.0) and sacks (1.0, tied), while Jon Sanchez had three stops (all solo), a career-best 2.0 TFL and his first sack of the season

Donnel Pumphrey rushed 142 yards on the ground and a touchdown, while Chase Price had a 5-yard

Eric Judge (4 receptions, 107 yards, 1 touchdown) and Ezell Ruffin (4 receptions, 86 yards, 2 touchdowns) combined for eight catches, 193 receiving yards and three scores as Kaehler was an efficient 14for-22 for 249 yards and three touchdowns.

With the score tied at 14-14 at halftime, Kaehler hit Judge on a 58-yard slant for the go-ahead touchdown, then Price scored on a 5-yard run on the Aztecs' ensuing drive to take a 28-14 lead.

BOISE, Idaho - San Diego State scored the first 20 points of the game, but was unable to make it three consecutive victories against Boise State in a 38-29 loss at Albertsons Stadium.

In a battle between the Mountain West's top-two rushers in the Aztecs' Donnel Pumphrey and the Broncos' Jay Ajayi, Pumphrey had 147 yards and two touchdowns on 24 carries (6.1 avg.), while Ajayi rushed for 134 yards and three scores on 31 attempts (4.3 avg.).

All three of Ajayi's touchdowns came in the second half, where Boise State outscored SDSU, 28-9. San Diego State was leading Boise State, 23-10, midway through the third quarter when the Broncos

used a fake punt to spark their comeback. Facing 4th and 4 from its own 32, Chris Santani took a direct

snap and raced 24 yards for the first down. Eight plays later, Ajayi scored his first of three touchdowns on a 5-yard run to cut the Aztecs' lead to 23-17, which would remain the score after three quarters.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, Ajayi pounded the ball in from three vards out to give the Broncos their first lead of the game at 24-23.

After forcing a 3 and out, Boise State used a 5play, 62-yard drive over 2:07, ending with a 10-yard run by Aiavi to put the Broncos up 31-23

San Diego State responded with a TD of its own when Pumphrey's 34-yard scamper narrowed the gap to 31-29. On the drive, which consisted of six plays and 70 yards over 2:46, quarterback Quinn Kaehler was 3-for-3 for 30 yards, while Pumphrey added 40 vards on the ground on just three carries. The Aztecs went for the 2-point conversion, but Chase Price was stopped on the play, keeping the score at 31-29.

Boise State sealed the game with a 14-play, 70yard drive over 6:36, culminating with a 13-yard touchdown run by its quarterback Grant Hedrick. On the drive, Boise State was 4-for-4 on third-down at-

San Diego State used a 41-yard field goal by Donny Hageman on its second possession of the game to get on the scoreboard first. The drive went for 28 yards and eight plays over 3:24.

After forcing Boise State to punt, the Aztecs put together a 10-play, 87-yard drive over 5:10, ending with a 32-yard rushing score by Pumphrey to take the 10-

Later in the second quarter. Hageman connected on his second field goal of the night - a 30-yarder - to put SDSU up, 13-0.

San Diego State got the ball back almost immediately as J.J. Whittaker picked off Hedrick and the Boise State 40 and returned it 26 yards to the Bronco 34. It took only three plays (34 yards) over 1:19 for the Aztecs to score once again as Kaehler found walk-on tight end Daniel Brunskill for a 6-yard touchdown pass and put SDSU up, 20-0.

Boise State closed the first half as Dan Goodale got the team on the scoreboard with a 21-vard field goal and then traveled 78 yards on just six plays and 1:26 before Hedrick found Tyler Sperbeck with a 14yard touchdown pass with just 17 seconds in the half.

Hageman hit his career-high third field goal of the night to give San Diego State a 23-10 advantage before the Broncos fake punt changed the momentum of the game

Donnel Pumphrey ran for 131 yards and a touchdown, while Ezell Ruffin caught seven balls for a season-high 126 yards. In addition, Quinn Kaehler recorded his second 300-yard passing game of the season and third of his career with 326 yards and a touchdown.

For the game, SDSU outgained the Falcons, 502-329, and dominated the time of possession by almost 12 minutes (35:57-24:03).

The Falcons responded early in the second quarter as Kale Pearson found Garret Griffin with a quick strike. On the play, Griffin outjumped an Aztec defender and ran unmolested 74 yards into the end

AFA mounted one last charge in the half, using an 8-play, 42-yard drive over 2:16, ending with D.J. Johnson 1-yard touchdown run. It would be Air Force's first and only lead of the game.

After forcing a punt, SDSU put together a 9-play, 75-yard drive over 3:23, culminating with Hageman's third field goal of the game, this time from 21 yards away, putting the home team up, 16-14.

San Diego State forced another Falcon punt and put the game out of reach as Pumphrey's 12-yard scoring run capped an 11-play, 84-yard drive and put the Aztecs up, 23-14, with 2:05 remaining in the third

SDSU held AFA in check over its next three drives - downs, punt, downs - before Air Force tried one last time to make it a one-possession game. The Falcons got to midfield, mostly through the air, but Munson jumped in front of a Pearson pass and returned it 56 yards for his first career touchdown for the final points

AFA mounted one last desperate attempt, getting all the way to the San Diego State 44 before Josh Gavert forced a Nate Romine fumble and Damontae Kazee recovered it, setting up victory formation for

SDSU won its seventh straight game at home for the first time since a seven-game streak from Sept. 1996-Sept. 5, 1997.

Additionally, San Diego State won its eighth straight game against a service academy team (Air Force, Army and Navy), the longest streak in the nation, and fifth consecutive vs. the Falcons, extending its record-long winning streak in the series.

The Aztecs also improved to 2-1 on the season against the Mountain Division of the Mountain West (and 5-1 over the two-year history of the two divisions), while the rest of the West Division finished just 3-12 (.200) vs. the Mountain Division.

Pumphrey recorded his eighth 100-yard rushing game of the season (in 11 games) to tie Marshall Faulk (1991 and 1992) for third in SDSU's single-season history.

SAN DIEGO - Donnel Pumphrey rushed for 267 yards and three touchdowns and the San Diego State defense allowed just 244 total yards in a 38-7 win over San José State in the regular-season finale at Qualcomm Stadium

Pumphrey, who had touchdown runs of 20, 1 and 35 yards, posted the eighth-highest total in school history and most since Larry Ned's 285 in 2001. It was his ninth 100-yard game of the season (in just 12 contests), tying him for the most in school single-season history with Ronnie Hillman (2011) and George Jones (1995).

Chase Price and Lucky Radley added rushing touchdowns for the Aztecs (7-5, 5-3 MW), who clinched their fifth consecutive winning season for the first time since 1973-77.

For the game, SDSU outgained the Spartans, 427-244, including a 393-111 advantage on the ground. The 393 rushing yards were the fourth most in San Diego State's Division I history (since 1969) and tied for the ninth most in program history.. It was the eighth straight game a team failed to get 400 yards on

SDSU held SJSU scoreless for most of the game until a 34-yard pass from Joe Gray to Andrew Vollert with 0:57 seconds remaining finally got the visitors on the board.

The San Diego State defense limited the Spartans to just 12 first downs, 23:45 of possession time

and a 31.3 percent (5 of 16) third-down conversion rate in the game. The Aztecs also forced two SJSU turnovers and did not commit one for the third time

on the season. SDSU got on the scoreboard on its second possession early in the first quarter when Pumphrey trotted in from 20 yards out, completing a 5-play, 47-yard

On its next possession, SDSU culminated a 10play, 99-yard drive over 4:49 with a 1-yard score by Pumphrey. On the drive, San Diego State's longest of the season, Pumphrey carried three times for 63

The Aztecs forced a 3 and out and got the ball back on their own 46 after a kick-catching interference penalty. From there, Price and the offensive line took care of the rest, rushing for 39 yards (32 by Price) of the 11-play, 54-yard drive, culminating with a 1-vard score by Price.

After forcing another 3 and out to start the second half, one of a season-high seven for the Aztecs, they made it 28-0 when Pumphrey scored on a 35-yard dash. Pumphrey had all 64 yards on the drive on just four carries over 1:31.

The score would remain 28-0 until the fourth quarter when Joel Alesi's 34-yard punt bounced off a SJSU player, where Radley pounced on the loose ball on the San José State 44. SDSU handed the ball off eight straight times to Price (38 yards), setting up a 23-yard field goal by Donny Hageman to make it 31-0.

After another Spartan punt, San Diego State scored for the final time as Radley knocked it in from 11 yards out. On the 9-play, 45-yard drive, Radley grounded out 28 yards on five carries, while Marcus Stamps (9 yards) and Chris Hokokian (8) also got into

It appeared the Aztecs were going to pitch their first shutout since 2010, but Gray's 34-yard touchdown completion to Vollert on a 3rd and 4 finally got SJSU on the scoreboard.

SDSU won its eighth straight game at home, its longest since a 16-game stretch in 1976-78 and wrapped up the sixth undefeated home regular season in its DI history at 6-0.

Pumphrey finished with his 267 yards on 22 carries (12.1 avg.), while Price (22 att., 93 yds) and Radley (5 att., 28 yds.) combined for 121 off the

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State's school-record fifth consecutive appearance in a bowl game ended in bitter disappointment as a 34-yard Aztec field goal sailed wide with 20 seconds to play, enabling Navy to claim a 17-16 victory in the 2014 San Diego Country Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl at Qualcomm Stadium.

The loss, San Diego State's first in seven games at The Q in 2014, came despite the Aztecs enjoying advantages in many statistical categories, including first downs (18-14), total offense (327-271) and turnovers (3-4). SDSU's Achilles' heel came on third-and-fourth-down conversions. The Midshipmen were 7-of-15 on third down and 3-for-3 on fourth-down conversions, while the Aztecs were 2-for-12 and 0-1 in

The teams combined for three first-quarter scores, with Navy taking the early lead. On its first possession, the Midshipmen converted an interception into a 10-play, 42-yard drive into a touchdown. On the drive, Navy converted two third downs and a fourth down.

The Aztecs scored points on their next two possessions. Rashaad Penny returned the ensuing kickoff 57 yards to the Navy 39-yard line. Five plays later, Donnel Pumphrey scored from five yards out to tie the

Following a Navy fumble, SDSU once again capitalized on a short field. The Aztecs were unable to get to the end zone, but Donald Hageman converted his first of three field goals to give the Aztecs a 10-7 lead.

San Diego State stretched the lead to 13-7 in the second quarter when a 10-play, 68-yard drive led to

Hageman's second field goal of the evening, a 37-yard boot. The Aztec defense was sensational on the evening, limiting Navy to a season-low 271 yards of total

offense, including a season-low 17 passing yards. SDSU also forced four turnovers and recorded eight tackles for loss. In 11 drives (not counting the final kneel down), the Aztecs limited Navy to nine yards or less six times, including five drives in a row during the second half

> One of the rare occasions Navy was able to mount a sustained drive was following the second-half kickoff. The Academy put together a 13-play drive covering 92 yards, converting third downs of three and five yards. Keenan Reynolds' six-yard run gave Navy a 14-13 lead.

> San Diego State recovered a Navy fumble on the punt return at the Midshipmen 18-yard line. The Aztecs drove to the Navy 13, but had to settle for a Hageman field goal, giving SDSU a 16-14 lead.

> No scoring came on the next eight possessions. Navy cashed in on an SDSU fumble, beginning a drive at its own 47 with 5:54 to play. The Academy put together a 10-play (all rushes), 47-yard drive and took a 17-16 lead on a Austin Grebe 24-yard field goal with 1:27 to play

> SDSU quarterback Quinn Kaehler connected on passes to Eric Judge (32 yards) and Pumphrey (16 yards) on consecutive plays to get to the Navy 21yard line. The Aztecs advanced to the ball to the 17yard line, but were unable to convert the 34-yard field goal attempt

> San Diego State ended the season 7-6, marking its fifth consecutive winning campaign.

> The Aztecs' national-leading eight game-winning streak against service academies was also snapped.


> In the game, Pumphrey rushed 21 times for 112 yards and a touchdown. He completed his season with a school single-season record 1,867 rushing yards and posted 10 100-yard rushing games during his sophomore campaign.

> Senior linebacker Josh Gavert matched a career high with a team-high 11 tackles in the game. Junior defensive tackle Christian Heyward

recorded a career-high eight tackles, all solo stops. He also recovered the second fumble of his career.
