THE SAN DIEGO GAME

- This is the 14th consecutive season the two Division I universities in San Diego have met. SDSU is 8-5 in the previous 13 meetings and 25-17 all-time vs. the Toreros.
- San Diego State carries a five-game winning streak into Wednesday's contest. The Aztecs have also won the last two played inside Jenny Craig

Pavilion. SDSU has not left Linda Vista with a loss since Nov. 30, 2005.

- Four of the last five games played at JCP have been decided by seven points or less, including SDSU's 69-62 OT win in 2009. All five games have been decided by 10 points or less with the average margin of victory being 6.0 points.

San Diego State, USD to Battle for City Championship at Jenny Craig Pavilion

- San Diego State looks to equal its longest winning streak in series history on Wednesday when it travels to Jenny Craig Pavilion to take on cross-town foe San Diego. The Aztecs, who have won five in a row over the Toreros, will look to make it six straight in a 7 p.m. PT game set for Channel 4 San Diego.
- SDSU is trying to match its most successful run in the 42-game history of the series. Winners of five straight, the Aztecs are in search of win No. 6, which would tie the program record. San Diego State won six in a row from 1979-84 and all of those were home games played at the San Diego Sports Arena.
- The Aztecs are at the end of a grueling season-opening stretch where they have played 10 games in 24 days. The USD outing represents San Diego State's 11th game in the season's first 27 days. The 10 games played are the most in Division I and as of Tuesday morning, only Austin Peay (1-9), Brown (4-6), Detroit (4-6), Gardner-Webb (4-6), Louisiana-Lafayette (4-6), Maryland-Eastern Shore (2-8), Sacred Heart (5-5) and San Francisco (7-3) had played as many as SDSU (8-2).
- SDSU is looking to build off its second win over a nationally ranked squad, then No. 24/23 California, before it takes a 12-day break for finals. Last Sunday, the Aztecs received a game-high 25 points from Chase Tapley and 10 rebounds from Garrett Green to defeat the Golden Bears, 64-63. The win was SDSU's ninth straight over the Pac-12 and 19th in a row over a school from the state of California.
- San Diego State is creeping toward the top 25 of both major college basketball polls. The Aztecs maintained their position in the AP poll, holding steady at No. 29. In the Coaches poll, SDSU moved up three spots to 29th and picked up an additional 10 points from last week.

Tapley Named Co-MW Player of the Week

- Junior guard Chase Tapley was named Mountain West Co-Player of the Week on Monday after he averaged 20.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 1.0 blocks and 2.5 steals, while shooting 53.3 percent from the floor and 55.6 percent from three-point distance.
- The award is Tapley's second of his career. He earned his first weekly award of the year on Nov. 14.

A San Diego State Win Would...

- Extend the Aztecs' December winning streak to 14 games.
- Extend San Diego State's December road/neutral winning streak to five games.
- Extend SDSU's winning streak over California schools to 20 games.
- Extend San Diego State's winning streak over USD to six games.
- Extend SDSU's winning streak over USD at Jenny Craig Pavilion to three games.
- Extend the Aztecs' winning streak at Jenny Craig Pavilion to four games. SDSU played its second-round NIT game vs. Kansas State at JCP and defeated the Wildcats.
- Extend SDSU's winning streak over San Diego universities to 13 games.
- Extend SDSU's road winning streak to three games and improve its season road record to 3-1.
- Give the Aztecs at least nine wins through the first 11 games for the fourth time in the last six years.

Challenging Start

- With its game at UC Santa Barbara last Saturday, San Diego State closed a season-opening stretch where it played eight games in 16 days. SDSU finished with a 7-1 record.
- The Aztecs started the campaign with three home games in three days before spending its preparation day traveling to Waco, Texas, for their date with No. 11/12 Baylor.
- After the Baylor game, SDSU had one day to prepare for USC and another day to prepare for Long Beach State, which was picked to win the Big West title.
- No. 23/23 Arizona, 2011 NCAA Elite Eight participants, followed the 49ers with UC Santa Barbara (2011 NCAA participant) waiting in the wings three days later.
- After UCSB, San Diego State played host to No. 22 Creighton before beating No. 24/23 California last Sunday. That's four nationally ranked teams in the season's first 10 games.
- The Aztecs will get their first extended time off (12 days) after Wednesday's road game at USD. All told, San Diego State will play its first 11 games in a span of 27 days.

California Livin'

- San Diego State has been one of the best programs in the West, having won 20 or more games six straight seasons, including three consecutive with 25 or more, and advancing to the postseason in each of those years as well.
- Last year's 34-3 record and NCAA Sweet 16 appearance solidified its spot as one of the top West Coast programs and the top team in the state of California. The Aztecs have currently won 19 straight games against California universities, a streak that spans two-plus seasons.
- Including Wednesday's game at San Diego, the Aztecs have four more games against California universities (USD, UC Riverside, Redlands, San Diego Christian). SDSU is already 5-0 this season vs. Cal-

Series History vs. San Diego

- San Diego State leads the all-time series with San Diego, 25-17, and are winners of five straight.
- The Aztecs are 7-8 in games played vs. San Diego on the USD campus, but have won their last two meetings at Jenny Craig Pavilion. SDSU, however, has won its last three inside Jenny Craig Pavilion after it played host to its second round NIT game there in 2009. The Aztecs defeated Kansas State.
- San Diego State is 3-2 vs. San Diego at Jenny Craig Pavilion.
- The series has produced some entertaining games as 26 of the 42 all-time meetings have been decided by 10 points or less. Four meetings have also needed overtime, including the 2009 get-together at Jenny Craig Pavilion.

San Diego State vs. the West Coast

- San Diego State is 110-140 all-time vs. current members of the West Coast Conference.
- The Aztecs have won their last six meetings against the old West Coast Conference alignment, but with BYU in the fold, SDSU has won seven of its last nine vs. current members of the WCC.
- SDSU vs. current West Coast members: 23-48 vs. Brigham Young, 1-1 vs. Gonzaga, 33-26 vs. Loyola Marymount, 17-35 vs. Pepperdine, 3-5 vs. Portland, 5-6 vs. Saint Mary's, 25-17 vs. San Diego, 2-2 vs. San Francisco, 1-0 vs. Santa Clara.

Steve Fisher vs. the West Coast

- Fisher has won six straight vs. last year's WCC members. Against current West Coast institutions, Fisher has won seven of his last nine vs. the league.
- Steve Fisher vs. current West Coast members (35-30 overall): 11-18 vs. Brigham Young, 1-0 vs. Gonzaga, 6-2 vs. Loyola Marymount, 1-0 vs. Pepperdine, 3-1 vs. Portland, 3-5 vs. Saint Mary's, 8-4 vs. San Diego, 1-0 vs. San Francisco, 1-0 vs. Santa Clara.

Thames Makes History

- At UC Santa Barbara, Xavier Thames exploded for a then-career-high 20 points and a personal-record 10 rebounds. With his performance, Thames became the first point guard during the Steve Fisher era, which is in its 13th season, to record a 20-point, 10-rebound game.
- Thames is the first SDSU point guard to register a double-double since Richie Williams went for 14 points and 11 rebounds at TCU on Feb. 28, 2009.
- Thames followed his historic performance with a career-high 21 points the next game vs. No. 22 Creighton.

Making an Early Case for Sixth Man of the Year

- Jamaal Franklin is certainly making his case as one of the top sixth men in the country. The sophomore is averaging 15.3 points, 5.9 rebounds and 1.0 steals in 24.6 minutes. His scoring and rebounding averages rank second on the team.
- Franklin has scored at least eight points in every game he has played and reached the double-figure scoring plateau seven times. To date, he already has a 31- and 21-point scoring effort this season.

20-Point Efforts

- So far this season, San Diego State has received nine 20-point scoring efforts from four different players, which is a lot through 10 games considering last year's 34-3 squad enjoyed 21 such performances by five different Aztecs.
- The Aztecs have had at least one 20-point scorer in three straight games, which is a season long.
- Chase Tapley has four 20-point games, Jamaal Franklin and Xavier Thames have two and James Rahon has one.

Winning the Close Ones

- After enjoying three blowout victories to open the year, San Diego State has made things interesting the last six games, each of which have been decided by four points or less with two going into overtime.
- Since the beginning of last season, the Aztecs have been hard to beat in games decided by three points or less, posting an 9-1 record.
- San Diego State's overtime record over the last 13 games has been quite impressive as well. The Aztecs have won three consecutive OT games and are 12-1 in their last 13.

Wily Veteran

- Tim Shelton has been around the block being a fifth-year senior and his court savvy proves it.
- His effectiveness will never be shown on the stat sheet as he does things that head coach Steve Fisher says, "Wins games for you."
- Fisher's statement was never more true than in the game vs. Long Beach State as Shelton took four charges, which changed the complexion of the game, especially in the second half.
- If you thought the four charges taken vs. LBSU was impressive, Shelton one-upped himself at No. 23/23 Arizona by taking six more charges and adding six points, six rebounds and three assists in 33 minutes.

Shooting the Lights Out on the Road

- Chase Tapley has been lights out on the road this season averaging 20.3 points. The junior is shooting 51.1 percent from the floor and a remarkable 58.3 percent from beyond the arc (14-for-24). More im-

pressive is the fact that two of the three games have come against two nationally ranked foes in Baylor and Arizona.

Taking the "Free" in Free Throws Literally

- Jamaal Franklin is making a living at the free-throw line and is a major reason why he is averaging 15.3 points an outing.
- The sophomore started the season by missing his first two, but since then, it has been nothing but money in the bank as he has gone on to sink 38 of his last 46, including 20 in a row at one point, to get his average up to 79.2 percent.
- Entering the USD game, 27.5 percent of his scoring production comes from the charity stripe.

Held in Check

- San Diego State is pretty much a lock to win when holding opponents to less than 60 points. The Aztecs extended their winning streak to 35 games when they limited USC to 54 points and No. 23/23 Arizona to 57.
- SDSU is 108-10 in the Fisher era when its opponents score less than 60 points.

Wearing Out the Nylon

- Junior Chase Tapley, the lone returning starter, has been a consistent scoring option for SDSU, averaging 17.2 points on 48.8 percent shooting and an even better 50.9 percent from beyond the arc.
- Tapley has four 20-point efforts already this season, including a career-high 28 at No. 11/12 Baylor and 25 vs. No. 24/23 California.
- After going 0-3 from three-point range in the opener vs. Bryant, Tapley gone on to make 28 of his last 52 attempts (53.8 percent).
- Tapley, who had three 20-point games in four games earlier this season, is the first player to accomplish the feat since Kawhi Leonard did it in the first four games of last season, while averaging 20.5 points. Tapley and Leonard arrived at San Diego State together in time for the 2009-10 campaign. Leonard went on to become the 15th overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft.

Rahon Returns

- Junior James Rahon returned to the lineup at No. 11/12 Baylor and was one of four players who scored in double figures. He finished with 10 points.
- The San Diego native injured his left foot the Wednesday prior to the Friday season opener vs. Bryant and missed the Aztecs' first three games before being inserted into the starting lineup.
- Rahon played 29 minutes and established a career high with a team-best seven rebounds.
- Since returning at Baylor, Rahon has started every game since and is averaging 10.6 points.

I See You

- The starting backcourt and childhood friends from Sacramento, Chase Tapley and Xavier Thames, are piling up the assists.
- Thames is averaging a team-best 5.3 assists after a career-high eight vs. Bryant and another seven vs. Southern Utah, UC Davis and No. 24/23 California. Tapley, meanwhile, is averaging 2.0 assists.
- The tandem is also getting it done in the scoring column as Tapley leads the team at 17.2 and Thames ranks third, scoring at a 12.4 clip.

Thief!

- Not only has Chase Tapley done work in the scoring and assist columns, the junior has made a living as a thief this season. Entering the San Diego game, Tapley is averaging 2.7 steals, which leads the Mountain West.
- Against Bryant, Tapley had three steals and followed it with five in the 33-point blowout of Southern Utah. Then against UC Davis, the Sacramento native had a Steve Fisher-era-record seven. The aforementioned games were in consecutive days to open the season.

Drastic Improvement

- Steve Fisher has said his team is a good free-throw shooting team. In the first two games, the Aztecs shot a combined 44.4 percent (20-for-45). Since then, San Diego State is connecting at a 68.9-percent clip (131-for-190). At No. 11/12 Baylor, SDSU finished at 85.0 percent (17-for-20) for the game and then followed it with an even-better 92.9-percent effort (13-for-14) vs. USC. Against No. 24/23 California, San Diego State went 14-for-20 from the stripe, but was an impressive 12-for-14 in the second half.

Turning Heads

- Jamaal Franklin is having a breakout sophomore season. As a true freshman, people saw flashes of it, like when he went for 13 points and 10 rebounds in 17 minutes vs. Utah.
- The Hawthorne, Calif., native ranks second on team in scoring (15.3) and rebounding (5.9), and is first in free-throw percentage (79.2 percent, min. 20 FTA).
- Franklin has scored in double figures seven times and had a career-high 31-point outburst against UC Davis and 21 vs. Long Beach State.

Green Giant

- Garrett Green has been huge in the middle for the Aztecs as he is averaging a team-best 7.4 rebounds.
- His top performance to date include a game-high 11 rebounds vs. Bryant and Southern Utah. Against

- He has had at least seven rebounds seven times this season and in each of the last five outings.

Tapley Named MW Co-Player of the Week

- Chase Tapley was named Mountain West co-player of the week on Monday, Nov. 14, for the first time.
- Tapley averaged 19.7 rebounds, 5.0 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 5.0 steals, while shooting 54.3 percent from the field, 50.0 percent from three-point range and 77.8 percent from the charity stripe.
- Tapley helped SDSU start the season with a 3-0 record after putting up a pair of 20-point efforts.

Holding Its Own

- San Diego State went 10-73 in its first 83 games vs. teams ranked in the AP Top-25. Things have certainly turned as SDSU is a respectable 10-11 in its last 21 against AP-ranked squads. In home games vs. Associated Press Top-25 squads, SDSU is 5-3 in its last eight, which includes the decision over No. 24 California. In road/neutral games vs. AP-ranked foes, meanwhile, the Aztecs have gone 4-4 in their last eight, which includes this season's victory at No. 23 Arizona.

Among the Nation's Best

- San Diego State has seen its name associated with the AP Top 25 for the last 24 polls.
- The Aztecs were in all 19 polls a season ago, peaking as high as No. 4 in 2010-11, and have seen their name in the preseason and weeks 1-4 polls.
- SDSU is receiving 50 votes in the AP, which is good for 29th, and 30 in the coaches poll, which puts them also in 29th place.

Duo With Diplomas

- Seniors Tim Shelton and Garrett Green are in their final year having already obtained their bachelor's degrees.
- The frontline tandem is currently enrolled in graduate school and is pursuing their master's degrees in education leadership.
- Shelton graduated from San Diego State last May, while Green earned his degree from LSU in August.

Coaching Stability

- Steve Fisher is the longest tenured head coach in the 13-year history of the Mountain West. In fact, he is the only men's basketball coach to be in the league from the conference opened its doors.
- Associate head coach/head coach in waiting Brian Dutcher has also been with Fisher for all 13 years.

Mountain West Preseason Predictions

- San Diego State was picked to finish in third place in the 2011-12 preseason Mountain West media poll. The Aztecs received 158 points to finish behind New Mexico (203 points; 22 first-place votes) and UNLV (183; 4).
- Sophomore Xavier Thames was selected as the preseason Mountain West Newcomer of the Year by the league's voting media. Thames is eligible this season after sitting out 2010-11 following his transfer from Washington State.







STEVE FISHER

21st FULL SEASON • 13th SEASON AT SDSU • ILLINOIS STATE, 1967

Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In 12 seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the *conference* postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs routinely mentioned among the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that the school exercised its contract option on Fisher prior to the 2011-12 season, which keeps the coach on Montezuma Mesa through 2014-15.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, 2006, 2010 and 2011, the last of which culminated with a 34-3 record and an appearance in the Sweet 16. Fisher has also taken the Aztecs to the NIT in 2003, 2007, 2008 and 2009. In 2009, SDSU advance to the national semifinals. San Diego State has currently been to the postseason six straight years.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips

to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, which put him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket after his stint in Ann Arbor. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to a NIT title as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

In 2006-07, he led SDSU to the MWC regular season and tournament crowns and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That team finished with a Division I then-school-record 24 wins. And the last five seasons, Fisher has led the Aztecs to five additional 20-win seasons and postseason appearances, including a school-record 34 wins, both the MWC regular season and tournament championships, and a NCAA Sweet 16 berth in 2011.





SAN DIEGO - On a night where San Diego State unveiled its 2011 Mountain West regular-season championship banner, its 2011 MWC tournament title banner and its NCAA Sweet 16 appearance banner, the Aztecs ultimately treated 11,734 fans to a 75-63 season-opening victory over Bryant at the Basketball Travelers Classic inside Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs dressed just seven scholarship players as projected starters Jamaal Franklin and James Rahon were out due to a team suspension and foot injury, respectively. With all the emotion surrounding the banners and the short bench, SDSU started the game sluggishly.

The contest was tied at 4-4 with just under two minutes having gone by. The Bulldogs, however, caught fire and stymied the Aztecs to lead, 22-15, with 6:32 remaining in the half. A 13-5 run to end the frame got San Diego State back into the game and it carried a 28-27 lead into the locker room.

The Aztecs continued their surge as play resumed and promptly went on a 15-7 run to go up 43-35. All told, SDSU used a 28-12 spurt to take control of the game.

San Diego State's offensive attack was grounded momentarily when Frankie Dobbs hit back-to-back three-pointers to bring the Bulldogs to within four. SDSU, however, went on another 13-5 run to move ahead by 12 and Bryant failed to get any closer than eight points the rest of the way.

The Aztecs received three stellar efforts, including two double-doubles by Garrett Green and Chase Tapley. Green finished with 14 points and 11 rebounds, while Tapley racked up a game-high 20 points, a career-high 11 rebounds, six assists and three steals. Xavier Thames added a career-high 16 points, four rebounds and eight assists. Between Tapley and Thames, they combined for 14 assists and two turnovers.

Jones, Jr., led Southern Utah with nine points and Wade Collie led the team with five rebounds.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State wrapped up its home tournament, the Basketball Travelers Classic, with its third consecutive double-figure victory, this time an 89-74 victory over UC Davis.

Chase Tapley continued his outstanding play by scoring 23 points and adding a career-high seven steals. As good as Tapley's performance was, Jamaal Franklin's was equally impressive. Franklin nailed a jumper and Xavier Thames added a free throw to thwart the comeback as the Aztecs emerged with the 15-point victory.

At the end of the game, Tapley was named most valuable player and to the all-tournament team. Thames joined Tapley on the all-tourney squad along with UC Davis' Josh Ritchart, Bryant's Alex Francis and Southern Utah's Ray Jones, Jr.

WACO, Texas - San Diego State, playing its fourth game in five days, had its rally come up short in falling to No. 11/12 Baylor, 77-67, at Ferrell Center. The mid-afternoon game was a part of ESPN's College Hoops Tip-Off Marathon.

SDSU used a 9-2 run, with the final seven coming from Franklin, to trim the deficit to seven with 93 seconds left in the game. The Bears, however, went on to score seven straight points to put the game out of reach and improve to 3-0.

SAN DIEGO - Xavier Thames went the length of the floor and scored the game-winning lay-up with 1.8 seconds remaining in the game to lift San Diego State past USC, 56-54, in front of a sold-out Viejas Arena crowd.

SDSU trailed, 25-21, at halftime and took the lead with 11:44 left in the game when Chase Tapley knocked down a three. The Aztecs, who trailed by as many as six, never trailed the rest of the way en route to their sixth straight win over the Pac-12 Conference.

Jamaal Franklin led San Diego State with 14 points and Thames finished with 12 of his own. DeShawn Stephens, meanwhile, grabbed a game-high nine rebounds. As a team, led by Franklin's 5-for-5 effort from the free-throw line, the Aztecs made 13 of their 14 free-throw attempts.

Jones led all scorers with 15 points and was one of four Trojans in double figures. Jackson added 13 points, Aaron Fuller chipped in with 12 and a team-high seven rebounds, and Dewayne Dedmon contributed 10.

Down the stretch, LBSU rallied and was down 65-63 with three seconds remaining in regulation and Franklin fouled Casper Ware before the ball was inbounded. Ware, who finished with a game-high 26 points, stepped to the free-throw line and calmly made both free throws to send the game into overtime.

In the extra session, Thames hit three straight baskets at one point, the third of which resulted in a five-point Aztec lead. Then with SDSU ahead by two with four seconds left, Franklin sealed the game with a pair of free throws to send the Aztecs home with a win.

TUCSON, Ariz. - San Diego State jumped on No. 23/23 Arizona early and never looked back as it snapped the Wildcats' 22-game homecourt winning streak with its 61-57 decision at McKale Center.

The Aztecs won in Tucson against Arizona for just the second time in the history of the series, but won for the third consecutive outing overall. A year ago, SDSU won its 2011 NCAA Tournament second- and third-round games inside the building.

San Diego State scored first and the Wildcats responded on the next trip down. Chase Tapley returned the favor and the Aztecs were on their way to a 16-2 lead and ultimately a 21-4 advantage with 13:24 left in the first half. During its game-opening surge, SDSU received four three-pointers, including a pair from Tapley, who finished with 17 points.

Later with San Diego State ahead by 15 on an Alec Williams basket, Arizona stormed back with seven consecutive points while keeping SDSU scoreless for 4 minutes, 34 seconds. James Rahon stopped the drought with two free throws and the Aztecs were clinging to a 31-29 halftime lead.

In the first 8 minutes, 38 seconds of the second half, San Diego State, again, pounced on the Wildcats, outscoring them 23-12 to open a 13-point lead. The lead was pushed to double figures thanks to back-to-back threes by Jamaal Franklin to up the cushion to 11.

Arizona rallied and the Aztecs went cold as time wound down. The Wildcats trimmed the lead to six with 3:41 left in regulation and they found themselves down nine with 34 seconds to play. But a series of missed SDSU free throws and baskets by Arizona made the game close before the Aztecs eventually emerged with the four-point victory.

On UCSB's next possession, Orlando Johnson converted a three-point play to tie the game at 62. Then, SDSU's Jamaal Franklin and the Gauchos' Jaime Serna both made the front end of a one-and-one in the final 37 seconds as the contest went into overtime.

In OT, UC Santa Barbara enjoyed a 70-66 lead with 3:39 to go, but the Aztecs went Garrett Green bucket, Chase Tapley three and a Franklin dunk to go up by three. Franklin later would make three free throws to put San Diego State up by four with four seconds left. UCSB made a three on the next trip down, but the effort proved to be not enough.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State suffered a rare home defeat at the hands of No. 22 Creighton, 85-83, in a Mountain West-Missouri Valley Challenge game at a sold-out Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs had their 27-game non-conference home winning streak snapped and had their 10-game November home winning streak halted after relinquishing a 17-point first-half lead and a four-point advantage at halftime.

SDSU was absolutely on fire for the better part of the first 13 minutes of the game. The Aztecs raced to a 6-0 lead early and the lead eventually grew to 10 with 11:32 left in the half.

Creighton scored five straight points and went on a 7-2 run to cut its deficit to five, but the Aztecs answered with 12 consecutive points to move ahead, 31-14. The Bluejays, however, went on a 21-9 run of their own and scored the final eight points of the half thanks to Doug McDermott to get within four at halftime.

In the second half, the Aztecs led by as many as eight with 12:54 to play in regulation and still owned a 62-57 lead with 8:38 to go. An 8-0 CU run gave the Jays a 65-62 lead, but Jamaal Franklin scored five points in SDSU's 5-2 spurt to tie the score at 67.

Down the stretch, San Diego State was forced to play from behind and trailed by six with 1:59 left in regulation. The Aztecs knocked down three three-pointers in the final minutes and ultimately got to within one with seven seconds left.

With five seconds on the clock, Jahenns Manigat hit his first free throw to put the Jays up by two, but missed the second. The loose rebound, however, went to CU and it called timeout and eventually won the game.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State continued its dominance over the Pac-12 Conference, this time defeating No. 24/23 California, 64-63, in front of a sold-out Viejas Arena crowd.

The victory was SDSU's ninth straight over the league and improves its record to 3-0 vs. the conference this season. Two of this year's wins against the Pac-12 were against nationally ranked programs.

After California scored the first six points of the game, rest of the first half was a back-and-forth affair. It was not until the final five minutes of the half the game opened up. Chase Tapley scored four straight points and fueled SDSU's 12-2 run, including the final eight points of the half, to help the Aztecs take a 33-25 lead at halftime.

In the second half, California made a couple of runs, tied the game on two occasions and took a one-point lead with 6:33 to go in regulation. The Aztecs responded with five straight points, but a Golden Bear three-pointer cut the lead to one.

In the final moments of the game with San Diego State up by two, Garrett Green, who had a game-high 10 rebounds, missed a jumper and Tapley stepped in and grabbed the rebound only to have Jamaal Franklin be fouled by California. Franklin then stepped to the line and knocked down two free throws to give SDSU a four-point lead with 15 seconds left.

The Bears answered with a basket and then with eight seconds remaining, Tapley, who was fouled, knocked down both free throws to put San Diego State up four before settling for the one-point victory.

Tapley finished the game with 25 points on a career-high 10 field goals. The junior also added a game-high three steals.

California was led by Allen Crabbe's 23 points and nine rebounds.
