SDSU Women's Hoops Looks To Bounce Back Wednesday vs. Visiting Utah

In the first of two games between last year's Mountain West Conference regular-season co-champions, the San Diego State women's basketball squad plays host to Utah on Wednesday evening for a nationally-televised game, beginning at 7 p.m. PT at Viejas Arena. Ann Schatz (play-by-play) and former Aztec Tammy Blackburn (analysis) will have the call live on CBS College Sports.

Both sides, who are meeting for the first time since the MWC championship game last March, are coming off disappointing losses in their most recent outings on Saturday. The Aztecs traveled to 22nd-ranked TCU, falling to the Lady Frogs, 80-63. The loss was SDSU's first in its last nine MWC regular-season contests and also snapped the team's seven-game overall win streak.

Utah, meanwhile, enters this week's outing with a 10-6 record and an 1-2 mark in conference play, having dropped a 54-49 decision to visiting UNLV on Saturday afternoon. The Utes, who have yet to reach the 50-point barrier in an MWC game, traveled to San Diego in November for the JHG Jam, but did not face the Aztecs.

San Diego State will be trying for its 13th consecutive home Mountain West Conference win Wednesday, when the two sides tangle in their 42nd all-time meeting. The game will feature a live audio call with Chris Ello, as well as live stats on goaztecs.com. There will be no live video feed.

Aztec Women's Basketball's Seven-Game Win Streak Ends At No. 22 TCU, 80-63

The No. 22 ranked TCU Lady Frogs outscored the visiting San Diego State women's basketball team 42-31 in the second half to hand the Aztecs their first conference loss of the season, 80-63, Saturday afternoon at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. SDSU saw its longest win streak since the 1996-97 campaign come to an end at seven games, falling to 11-5 overall and 3-1 in conference action. The Lady Frogs, meanwhile, won their 16th consecutive home game to improve to 13-4 and 3-1 in MWC play.

SDSU junior **Allison Duffy (Lakeside, Calif.)** came off the bench to score a team-best 16 points, including 12 in the second half, on 5-for-11 shooting. Junior **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** added 12 points and a team-best eight rebounds, while senior **Jené Morris (San Francisco, Calif.)** also had 12 points, before fouling out with 2:12 left in the game.

Both Morris and senior **Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** had three steals apiece and **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** had a team-best four assists and seven points.

TCU started the afternoon with the hot hand from the field, going up early by making nine of its first 14 shots to lead by 10 points at 23-13. The Aztecs cut their deficit in half with a long-range triple from Quenese Davis and a Bradley lay-up at 23-18. The Lady Frog advantage jumped back up to nine on two occasions, but SDSU continued

to keep it close, heading into the locker room trailing by six at 38-32, despite committing 13 first-half turnovers.

The Lady Frogs scored the first five points of the second half to increase their lead back into double-figures and went to as many as 16 on three occasions before getting to 20 at the 10:03 mark. San Diego State got the deficit down 13 points, however, couldn't overcome a 12-for-38 shooting performance in the second half.

Other TCU Notes

• SDSU attempted a season-high 19 three-pointers ... TCU made an Aztec opponent season-high 21 free throws.

• SDSU logged 21 offensive rebounds, tying a season-best from the USD contest when the Aztecs also had 21.

• San Diego State has allowed an opponent to score over 70 points only three times in 2009-10. All three outings have been vs. teams ranked in the AP top 25.

• Three of the Aztecs' five losses this season have been to ranked teams away from home.

Some Streaks End

The loss to TCU on Saturday meant the end to several notable win streaks for the Aztecs, including:

► The loss snapped SDSU's eight-game Mountain West Conference regular-season win streak, which dated back to a 64-61 loss at Wyoming on Feb. 15, 2009. The eight-game streak was double the Aztecs' previous long in conference history (four games on three occasions).

► SDSU's overall win streak came to an end at seven games. That streak was the team's longest since the 1996-97 squad claimed 11 in a row.

► SDSU lost for the first time this season at an opponent's arena after starting the year 4-0. The Aztecs had won eight straight road games (non-neutral sites) overall, which was the team's longest streak since the 1996-97 team won nine in a row.

Some Streaks Continue

► San Diego State will be looking for its 13th consecutive Mountain West Conference home win when Utah comes to town on Wednesday evening. That streak dates back to the 2008 campaign when SDSU fell to Wyoming, 55-44, on Feb. 20.

► Despite the Aztecs' loss at TCU on Saturday, the team has matched its best start in the 11-year history of the Mountain West Conference. A year ago, SDSU was also 3-1 through the first four league contests.

Getting To The Glass

One of the team's biggest weaknesses a year ago was in the rebounding department. Thus far, SDSU has won the battle on the boards in 12 of 16 contests in 2009-10, including in each of the last five games.

This has led to a +4.9 season rebounding margin, which is third-best in the MWC. The team is easily rated No. 1 in league-only outings with a +10.5 mark.

The Aztecs have outrebounded an opponent by 10 or more boards six times this season, including a +21 effort (39-18) against USD and a +15 mark vs. UNLV.

A year ago, SDSU only outrebounded an opponent 12 times in 32 games and ranked 263rd nationally in rebounding margin at -3.3.

Johnson 10 Away From The 1,000-Point Club

San Diego State junior Paris Johnson enters Wednesday's game with Utah needing only 10 points to reach the 1,000 mark in her Aztec career. Johnson, who has 990 points in 79 career games, will become the third SDSU player to reach the 1,000-point mark this season and the 19th overall in program history.

Johnson can also join Michelle Suman (1991-95), Judy Porter (1980-83), Chana Perry (1988-89) and Jessica Haynes

(1986-88) as the only Aztecs to log 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 100 blocks in their careers on The Mesa.

Earlier this season, senior Jené Morris became the first current SDSU player to record her 1,000th career point in her 67th game in the Red & Black with her first bucket against South Carolina on Nov. 28. Fellow co-captain Quenese Davis followed suit two games later vs. Pepperdine, reaching the milestone on a second-half jumper in her 99th career outing.

Prior to this year, the last Aztec to reach the 1,000-career point mark was Jamey Cox in 2002-03. SDSU has never had three players reach the 1,000-career point mark in the same season, but has had two accomplish the feat during the same campaign on four occasions, with the most recent being 1993-94, with Falisha Wright and Michelle Suman.

Notes With A W

An SDSU victory over Utah will mean:

► SDSU wins its 13th consecutive Mountain West Conference home game. Overall, the Aztecs have won their last six home outings this season.

► SDSU begins MWC play with a 4-1 record for the second year in a row, matching its best start in league history.

► SDSU improves to 13-29 all-time against the Utes and has claimed each of the last two meetings in San Diego. The Aztecs have won three of the last four games with Utah in San Diego.

Utah Tid-Bits

SDSU and Utah split the regular-season series last year with each team winning on its home court ... second in scoring defense (55.2 ppg.) and first in field-goal percentage defense (34.4).

One-Time Breakdown

TCU's 7-for-16 performance (43.8 percent) from beyond the arc on Saturday was just the third time this season an SDSU opponent (also UCR, LBSU) has made over 40 percent of its 3-point attempts.

Prior to the outing with the Lady Frogs, the Aztecs' last five foes had combined to shoot only 10-of-70 from long range or 14.3 percent. Conversely, SDSU made 39.3 percent (22-for-56) in that five-game span.

Overall, SDSU has held 11 of its 16 opponents to three or fewer triples in a game this season. The Aztecs still rank first in the conference in three-point field-goal percentage defense at 26.5 (54-for-204) and enter the week ranked 15th nationally in that category.

40-Frenzy Frozen

For the first time in 10 games, San Diego State failed to make at least 40 percent of its shots, recording a 38.5 field-goal percentage in the loss at TCU. The Aztecs still are second in the Mountain West Conference in shooting percentage at 44.1 and enter the week in the top 40 nationally.

The Aztecs have converted over 45 percent of their field-goal attempts seven times in 2009-10, leading to a 7-0 record. SDSU has topped the 50 percent mark on four occasions, including three straight to end the month of December, highlighted by a 60-percent performance against LMU on Dec. 21.

Offensive Shutdown

Last week, UNLV became the 10th SDSU opponent to fail to score 60 points in a game, managing only 41 points or nearly 24 off its season average entering the evening.

The Lady Rebels were also the fourth Aztec foe to score 50 or fewer points and the third in a row, before TCU scored 80 on Saturday. Two opponents have been unable to reach the 40-point barrier in New Mexico (39 points) and Arizona (38 points).

On the year, the Aztecs rank third in the MWC in scoring defense at 57.8 points an outing and are second in league contests, giving up a meager 52.5 points.

Aztec Block Party

San Diego State tied its season high for blocked shots in a game with 10 last Wednesday night against UNLV.

Junior Jessika Bradley had six of those 10 rejections, including five in the first half alone. The six blocks are a career best and tie her for sixth in Aztec single-game history. Bradley and classmate Paris Johnson are tied for the team lead in blocks this season with 28 apiece to tie for second in the Mountain West Conference.

SDSU has 79 rejections on the season with 38 of those coming within the last six contests. The team ranks second in the MWC in blocks per game (4.9) and is tied for first in league-only outings (6.3/g).

A year ago, the Aztecs averaged 6.1 blocks a game en route to a school and conference record 195 blocks.

The 300-Milestone Met

Aztec Beth Burns reached a milestone mark in her 18-year head coaching career on Jan. 13, recording her 300th career win with the team's 70-41 victory over UNLV. Burns is already SDSU's all-time winningest head coach with 219 of those 300 victories coming in her 13 campaigns on the Mesa.

She is the fourth current MWC head coach to log 300 career wins, joining Utah's Elaine Elliott, New Mexico's Don Flanagan and TCU's Jeff Mittie.

Aztecs In The National Polls

San Diego State has received votes in both national polls five times in 2009-10, including a week ago.

The Aztecs achieved its first top-25 national ranking in 14 years on Nov. 23, when the Aztecs were rated No. 23 in the Associated Press Top 25 poll. SDSU, which garnered 112 points, last appeared in the AP top 25 in March of 1995, when the team ended up 22nd following a 24-6 campaign. Overall, it is SDSU's 41st all-time appearance in the AP Top 25.

The Aztecs received votes in the AP poll six times a year ago, a first since March of 1997, when it had 15 votes before playing its NCAA tournament game against Oregon.

On Nov. 24, the team also rated No. 24 in the coaches poll, getting 74 points.

Aztec Rally Caps

SDSU has overcome at least a four-point deficit in six of its 11 victories in 2009-10. The Aztecs have trailed at one point in all but one victory this year, that being the USD contest when they led from the opening tip.

SDSU's biggest comeback victories came during the month of December. The Aztecs trailed by 10 points at UC Riverside to start the month, were down by eight in

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the second half vs. Long Beach State and had a nine-point deficit against both Wake Forest and LMU.

Although the Notre Dame and Pepperdine games ended up in the loss column, SDSU trailed by 21 vs. the No. 5 Irish and came all the way back to within two with 29 seconds left in the game. The Aztecs also were down by 11 against the Waves and ended up taking the lead with 48 seconds remaining in regulation.

Injury Bug Bites

Unfortunately for the Aztecs, the injury bug has bitten early and often for this year's team. Before the season started, the team lost sophomore **Gabrielle Clark (Los Angeles, Calif.)** to an ACL injury. Just two games into the campaign, true freshman **Kiyana Stamps (Moreno Valley, Calif.)** also went down with an ACL injury. Both Clark and Stamps will miss the remainder of the 2009-10 season.

Other 2009-10 Highlights So Far

♦ SDSU senior point guard Quenese Davis recorded her 500th career assist in the team's season-opening win over UC Irvine. She is now first in Aztec history and third in the MWC record book in career assists with 576.

♦ Aztec junior center Paris Johnson has five blocks in each of the team's last three season-openers, including five versus the Anteaters in 2009-10.

♦ Jené Morris was one of six players named to the all-tournament team for the Island Division at the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas. Morris averaged 17 points in the three games, bolstered by a 32-point effort against No. 5/6 Notre Dame, which was the most points in a single game by any player at the tournament and by any player in the MWC in 2009-10.

♦ SDSU played its first overtime game in three years on Dec. 8, against Pepperdine.

♦ Quenese Davis played in her 100th career game vs. Long Beach State. She is the first Aztec to reach the century mark since Kate Eveland in 2008.

Davis is on track to play at minimum 120 career games, which would tie her for fourth-most in school history with all-time leading scorer Judy Porter. She has appeared in all 107 contests since coming to The Mesa in 2006, starting 106 of them.

♦ SDSU made 60 percent (33-for-55) of its field-goal attempts in a win at LMU. That percentage is the team's best since making 68.1 percent vs. Illinois State on Nov. 24, 2000.

♦ Seniors Quenese Davis and Jené Morris have both been named MWC players of the week once this season. Davis did so on Dec. 28, after scoring a career-high 26 points in a win over LMU. Two weeks later, Morris earned her sixth career honor on Jan. 11, following a pair of 20-point scoring performances to open conference play.

♦ San Diego State had three players earn all-tournament honors following the championship game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam. Senior Quenese Davis garnered her first-ever career MVP honors after leading the tournament field in scoring with 24 points against Wake Forest and 16 vs. Auburn. Jené Morris and Paris Johnson were also tabbed for the second straight year.

♦ The Aztecs boast victories this season over a member of the Pac-10 (first time since 2003), the ACC (first win ever) and the SEC (first since 1994).

♦ SDSU won for the first time in the 11-year league history when opening an MWC campaign on the road. The Aztecs were 0-5 in that category prior to their victory over New Mexico on Jan. 6.

♦ Senior Quenese Davis and Jené Morris have combined for eight 20-point scoring outings in 2009-10. For her career, Morris has scored 20 or more points in 17 contests, while Davis has eclipsed the mark 11 times with five of those coming this season.

♦ SDSU had two players, senior Quenese Davis and junior Paris Johnson, both recorded a double-double in the team's win over Wyoming on Jan. 9. As a team, the Aztecs have combined for six double-doubles.

♦ The Aztecs won their first three conference games of a season for the first time since the 1997 team opened Western Athletic Conference play with seven wins in a row.

♦ SDSU scored 49, first-half points in its win over UNLV on Jan. 13. The 49 points are the team's most in a half since scoring 50 in the second half of a 91-79 loss at Wichita State on Nov. 19, 2005. The 49 points are also the most in the first 20 minutes of a game since the Aztecs posted 50 in a 91-45 victory over Utah Valley State on Feb. 10, 2005.

Preseason Points

For the first time in the league's 11-year history, San

Diego State was picked to win the Mountain West Conference title in 2010 in a vote by the nine head coaches and select media members released Oct. 7, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo.

The Aztecs received 25 of the 28 first-place votes and 240 points overall.

SDSU had nearly 25 more points than second place

TCU, which received the three other first-place votes. Utah was picked third, followed by New Mexico, Wyoming, Brigham Young, UNLV, Colorado State and Air Force.

San Diego State had never finished higher than fifth place in the league before tying for the regular-season crown with a 13-3 mark in 2008-09.

More Preseason Team Tid-Bits

In addition to being picked No. 1 in the league, San Diego State has also started to earn a share of the national spotlight.

As a team, the Aztecs were tabbed No. 22 by two national preseason publications, *Lindy's College Basketball* and *Sporting News College Basketball Magazine*.

A few weeks ago, *ESPN.com* and writer Graham Hays listed SDSU No. 3 among "mid-majors" and earlier this season, picked the Aztecs as one of the "teams to watch as 2009-10 unfolds". Hays also tabbed SDSU's 2010 MWC opener at New Mexico, as the No. 2 game to watch in the nation in the month of January.

Another *ESPN.com* writer, Charlie Crème, chose SDSU No. 23 among his 64 teams to watch in 2009-10.

Jené Morris Up For National Player of the Year



Entering her third and final season at San Diego State, senior Jené Morris is already one of the most heavily-decorated players in program history and will be looking to add more to her trophy case in 2009-10.

Back in July, the 5-9 guard was one of only 25 players named to the preseason "Wade Watch" list for the State Farm Wade Trophy Division I Player of the Year award by the WBCA. The Wade Trophy is now in its 33rd year and is considered to be the "Heisman of Women's Basketball."

Morris is also up for the other college player of the year honor, the John R. Wooden Award, which has been given out annually since 2004. She is one of only 31 to make this year's list and is also a preseason candidate for the Wooden Award All-America team.

She is just the second player in Mountain West Conference history to be named to either watch list, joining Utah's Kim Smith, who was nominated for the Wade Trophy three times and the Wooden Award on two occasions.

Morris was also selected to the annual Naismith Trophy Watch List as one of only 50 women's college basketball players. The Naismith Trophy has been given out annually since 1983.

More On Morris

Aztec senior Jené Morris was named the Mountain West Conference's Preseason Player of the Year in a vote of the league's coaches and select media members. She is the first SDSU player so honored and also was tabbed to the five-member preseason all-conference for the second year in a row.

Last season, Morris, a 2008-09 honorable mention State Farm Coaches' All-American, averaged a team-best 16.1 points per game, scoring 20 or more points eight times and eclipsing the 30-point barrier on three occasions, including 35 points vs. DePaul in the Aztecs' first round NCAA tournament game.

Morris led the league in steals in both overall (3.33/g) and conference-only (2.94/g) outings, ranking seventh nationally and becoming the first Aztec to record 100 steals in a season since Falisha Wright in 1993-94. Morris had three or more steals in 20 of her 30 games, including a league-high eight on two occasions, which are the most by an Aztec since 2002.

Her other honors included being named the 2009 MWC Defensive Player of the Year, first-team all-MWC, MWC all-defensive team, MWC Championship all-tournament team and four-time MWC player of the week.

Morris' other 2009-10 preseason honors include being named a third-team All-American by the *Sporting News* and being tabbed one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.

Awards Aplenty

Jené Morris isn't the only Aztec to have already earned honors this season.

Junior Paris Johnson, a two-year returning starter at center, was named to the MWC preseason all-conference team for the second year in a row. Johnson has been singled out as a possible national "breakout star"

by ESPN.com's Charlie Creme, after earning first-team all-league honors as a sophomore when she led the Aztecs in rebounding (8.3/g), blocked shots (94) and field-goal percentage (53.1).

Johnson's former club teammate, Aztec Jessika Bradley, also garnered the program's first-ever Mountain West Conference preseason top newcomer award.

Bradley redshirted a year ago, after spending two seasons at nationally-ranked Baylor. She played in 65 contests for the Bears and averaged 4.8 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.1 blocks per game as a sophomore, posting a pair of double-doubles, including a 10-point, 10-rebound performance vs. then No. 10 Oklahoma.

ESPN.com's Graham Hayes singled out the Johnson-Bradley duo as one of the country's best.

Other Things To Watch For In 2009-10

Here are a few things interesting things to look at in 2009-10:

- SDSU has won 12 straight home MWC contests dating back to 2008, after going a perfect 8-0 in 2009. The Aztecs had won 18 straight home regular-season games, before falling to Pepperdine in overtime on Dec. 8. Still, the team is 42-13 on its home court in the last three years.

- The Aztecs have 27 Mountain West Conference wins in the last four seasons after having only 19 in the league's first seven years.

- With her school-record 94 blocked shots in 2008-09, SDSU junior Paris Johnson had more blocks than four teams in the MWC and more than 159 of 328 NCAA Division I schools. Johnson is second in Aztec career history in blocked shots with 176.

- SDSU will have a pair of sisters on the floor this season with Coco and Quenese Davis and Allison and Ashley Duffy. Paris Johnson's sister Desiree also played for the Aztecs from 2005-07.

Strength Of Schedule

The Aztecs have already had three games against ranked foes in then No. 5/6 Notre Dame, No. 17/20 Oklahoma and No. 22 TCU. SDSU also played six other contests vs. opponents receiving votes in either national preseason or regular season poll with Arizona, Auburn, New Mexico, South Carolina, Wake Forest and Wyoming. Another future Aztec opponent to have been receiving votes so far this season is BYU.

TV Time

The Aztecs will have a record seven regular-season televised games. SDSU's game with Arizona on Nov. 21 was carried live on The Mtn., while six of its' MWC regular-season games on TV, including three straight in mid-February. In all, the Aztecs will have five games on The Mtn. and two on CBS College Sports.

The Arena Formerly Known As Cox Arena

The home of the Aztecs underwent a change this past summer, as the facility is now named the Viejas Arena at Aztec Bowl, after being Cox Arena at Aztec Bowl since its inception in 1997.

The change over happened this past July and is part

of a 10-year deal. The arena also sports a brand new 26-foot-high-by-15-feet-wide, four-LED video scoreboard. The new center-hung unit features the latest Daktronics LED video technology, which provides SDSU fans the ability to see live and recorded video images from any seat in the arena.

Pair Sign National Letters Of Intent

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 11, of 6-3 forward **Jasmine Porter (Layton, Utah)** and 5-10 combo guard **Melissa Sweat (Bakersfield, Calif.)** to National Letters of Intent. The pair, who are each ranked among the top 100 recruits in the nation, will join the Aztecs in 2010.

Clements, Nahinu Join The Aztecs

San Diego State head coach Beth Burns announced this past May the addition of guard Courtney Clements and center Malia Nahinu to the Aztec basketball roster. The pair of sophomores transferred after playing one season at Arizona and will have three years of eligibility remaining at SDSU starting with the 2010-11 campaign.

2008-09 Rewind

The San Diego State women's basketball team made a remarkable run in 2008-09, highlighted by its first NCAA appearance in 12 seasons, its first postseason victory in 14 years, a share of the regular-season league title and a return to the national spotlight.

Below are a few of last year's accomplishments:

- Posted the program's first 20-win season in 12 years, finishing with a 24-8 overall record and a 13-3 mark in Mountain West Conference play.
- Earned an at-large bid to the 2009 NCAA tournament, defeating DePaul in the first round for the program's first NCAA victory in 14 years (1994).
- Won a share of its first-ever Mountain West Conference regular season title. The Aztecs' previous best finish in the 10-year history of the MWC was tied for fifth in 2007-08.
- Tallied its first win over an AP ranked team in 14 years by defeating then No. 4 and unbeaten Texas, 60-55, to win the San Diego Surf 'N Slam tournament title.
- Earned votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll six times, a program first since 1997. SDSU ended with five votes in the final *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll.
- Advanced to its second consecutive MWC championship game, after failing to even win a game in the event's first eight seasons.
- Posted an unbeaten home regular season for just the second time in school history, going 14-0. The record jumped to 15-0 with the NCAA victory over DePaul, before ending against No. 2 Stanford.

Listen/Watch Live

For the ninth straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

Chris Ello will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the third straight season.

Again in 2009-10, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of the televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

Ticket To Thrive

San Diego State University was one of 18 institutions or conferences that were selected by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) to receive a women's basketball grant as part of the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Grant Program, which is in its second year.

The 2009-10 NCAA grant program dedicated approximately \$750,000 nationally to increase awareness, exposure and attendance of women's basketball. San Diego State doubled the grant money it received from the first year of the program and is one of only three schools or conferences to receive a grant for the second straight season.

The San Diego State Department of Athletics' Ticket to Thrive program is in its second year of a five-year community outreach program created with the goal of increasing attendance at Aztec women's basketball games. The program's main objective is to establish a connection between members of the community and the San Diego State women's basketball program and is being partially funded by an NCAA grant.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns



The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the fifth season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

The 2008-09 campaign was the culmination of many years of hard

work by Burns and her staff, as San Diego State posted its first 20-win campaign in 12 years, finishing 24-8 overall and 13-3 in conference action. The Aztecs won a share of their first-ever Mountain West regular season title, advanced to the MWC tournament championship game for the second consecutive year and garnered SDSU's first NCAA bid since 1997. For her efforts, Burns was named the league's coach of the year.

San Diego State has improved by at least six wins every year after her first season back, when the team went 3-24 overall and 0-16 in league play.

In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 18-year overall head coaching record of 300-214, while her school record stands at 219-149 over 13 seasons. The game with USD was Burns' 500th as a head coach, while she reached the 300-win plateau vs. UNLV on Jan. 13, 2010.

IRVINE, Calif. - The San Diego State women's basketball team used a 12-0 second-half run to come out victorious, 64-42, over host UC Irvine in the first game of the 2009-10 season at the Bren Events Center. With the win, the Aztecs claimed their third-straight season-opener to move to 1-0, while the Anteaters dropped to 0-1 following the two schools' first meeting in six years.

SDSU had three players finish in double-figure points, including leading scorer junior Paris Johnson, who notched 11 of her game-high 18 points in the first half. Senior Jené Morris finished with 13 points and junior Allison Duffy contributed 11 points off the bench.

Aztec senior co-captain Quenese Davis had six of the team's 13 assists including the 500th of her career, which came at the 16:18 mark of the first half on a three-pointer by Morris. Johnson had five blocks and eight boards, Morris contributed four steals and forward Jessika Bradley logged a team-high 10 rebounds in her official Aztec debut.

San Diego State got off to a bit of a slow start, as UC Irvine scored the first basket of the game, before the Aztecs' first field-goal at the 17:26 mark by Johnson. The team then reeled off two more baskets to lead by five points, but the Anteaters, using a small line-up, tied the score at seven apiece and were within single digits for a majority of the first half, as SDSU led by only 10 at the half, 32-22.

Coming out the break, the two sides continued to trade baskets, until a three-point play by Allison Duffy at the 17:43 mark sparked an 8-0 run for a more comfortable 18-point advantage at 42-24, heading into the first media timeout. The Aztecs extended their scoring spurt to 12 unanswered on a layup and a pair of free throws, until UC Irvine finally broke through with a three-pointer and another basket to trail by 17 at 46-29.

The SDSU lead rose once again to 22 points with 5:37 left in the contest and never got lower than 16 points, before capturing the 22-point win at 64-42.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team jumped out to a 10-point lead early in the first half and never looked back, limiting visiting University of San Diego to only 19 points through the first 25 minutes of the game and going on to claim a 79-52 victory Tuesday evening at Viejas Arena. With the win, the Aztecs (2-0) won their first two games of a season for the third straight year, while the Toreros fell to 1-1 overall.

The Toreros countered with a jumper by Nya Mason and a bucket by Morgan Henderson, but the home team scored four lay-ups in the paint for an eight-point lead at 12-4.

A Quenese Davis jumper at the 13-minute mark sparked a 7-0 run to put the host up by 13 and would move all the way out to 26 at the half, as San Diego State headed into the locker room on a 15-2 run to make the score 45-19.

The Toreros' offense continued to struggle out of the break, as it failed to score a point until the 14:43 mark with the Aztecs now up by 34 points. The SDSU lead stayed in the upper 20's to low 30's most of the rest of the way until the final buzzer sounded for the team's 79-52 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team limited visiting Arizona to only 19 points in each half, as the Aztecs claimed a hard-fought 57-38 victory at the first-ever JHG Jam at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU improved to a perfect 3-0 and won its 18th straight regular-season contest on its home floor, while the Wildcats fell to 2-1 following the first meeting between the two sides in 11 years.

The Aztecs were led by junior center Paris Johnson, who logged her 13th career double-double with 18 points and a season-best 10 rebounds to go with four blocked shots and three steals in only 25 minutes of action. Classmate Jessica Bradley matched Johnson's rebounding effort with 10 of her own for her third-straight game in double-figures and also had three blocked shots.

Senior guard Jené Morris was the only other SDSU player in double-figure points with 12, bolstered by a pair of three-pointers. Morris and junior Allison Duffy each recorded four of the team's 14 steals on the night, and junior Coco Davis posted seven points and a game-high seven assists.

The contest proved to be a physical battle from the outset, as both teams guarded each other closely up the floor and contested most every shot. There were four tie scores in the first half, before San Diego State could put some distance between themselves and the Wildcats in the final two minutes until the break. Leading by only two points 21-19, Johnson hit a lay-up in the paint, Morris converted a three-pointer and Bradley made the first of two free throws to send the host into the locker room up 27-19.

The Aztecs used that momentum coming out of the break, going on a 13-2 run in the first five minutes to move out to a 40-23 lead with 14:51 remaining. That advantage grew to as many as 23 points at 50-27 on an Allison Duffy jumper. The SDSU lead dipped below 20 points in the final three minutes, but never fell further than 17, before claiming the 57-38 victory.

ST. THOMAS, UVI - The San Diego State women's basketball team cut a 21-point, first-half deficit all the way down to two with less than 30 seconds remaining, but was unable to pull off the Thanksgiving Day upset, dropping its first game of the season to No. 5/6 Notre Dame, 84-79, in day one action of the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 3-1 on the year, while the Irish improved to 4-0.

The senior guard tandem of Jené Morris and Quenese Davis carried the team offensively, as the Aztec front court was saddled with foul trouble most of the day. Morris notched her fifth career 30-point scoring outing, recording 26 of her game-high 32 points in the second half. Morris also tallied all four of the team's three-pointers, came away with six steals and added five rebounds.

Quenese Davis, meanwhile, kept SDSU in the game in the first 20 minutes of play, making six of her 10 shots for 15 of her 25 points, which matched a career-best. The senior co-captain was a rebound off of a double-double with a team game-high nine and tied for the lead in assists with five in playing all 40 minutes.

Besides Morris and Davis, junior forward Jessica Bradley also scored 12 points to go with eight rebounds, three assists, three steals and two blocks.

The game turned out to be the tale of two halves, as the Aztecs fell behind early, missing six of their first seven shots to trail by eight. Notre Dame, meanwhile, couldn't miss, going up by 10 points at 16-6 and then more than doubling that lead in a matter of just over three minutes, capped by a three-point play by Erica Solomon at 30-9. The deficit hung at around 20 until the 5:49 mark, when SDSU went on a 13-8 run to head into the locker room down by 15 at 44-29.

The Aztecs continued to chip away at the Irish lead coming out of the break, but didn't get to within single-digits until there was just under six minutes left to play on a Bradley lay-up at 69-60. Notre Dame edged their advantage back up to 13 and then 11, before Morris found her touch from outside, nailing three triples on SDSU's next five trips up the floor, including her final one from well beyond the top of the arc to get to within four at 79-75.

San Diego State was within a single basket following two Quenese Davis free throws with 29 seconds remaining, but the Irish made three of their four shots from the charity stripe to preserve the 84-79 victory.

ST. THOMAS, UVI - In a contest featuring 17 ties and 12 lead changes, the No. 23/24 San Diego State women's basketball team was outlasted by South Carolina, 58-55, in the final game of the 2009 Paradise Jam in St. Thomas.

The Aztecs had two players score in double-figures, as junior Allison Duffy posted a team-best 13 points on 5-for-7 shooting, including a pair of 3-pointers, to go with four steals. SDSU senior Jené Morris became just the 17th player in program history to eclipse the 1,000-career point mark, compiling 11 points before fouling out.

Co-captain Quenese Davis played all 40 minutes, notching seven assists and three steals and was one of three players with four rebounds.

No team led by more than four points in the first half of play, as the Aztecs boasted a pair of three-point advantages at 5-2 and later at 23-20, while the Gamecocks were ahead by as many as four points at 15-11. South Carolina broke a tie with a lay-up with three seconds left to head into the locker room up 26-24.

With the score tied at 27 at the 18:34 mark of the second half, the Gamecocks went on a 7-0 run with the help of a free throw and three straight buckets off steals to go up 34-27.

SDSU quickly responded, using a three-pointer by Duffy to counter with a 7-0 run of its own to once again tie the game at 34.

The score would be tied for the 17th and final occasion at 46 all with 4:59 left in the game. From there, the Gamecocks scored six unanswered points, before the Aztecs chopped their deficit all the way down to a single point with 19 seconds remaining on a three-pointer by Jerica Williams.

On the ensuing in-bound play, however, SDSU was unable to get a steal and South Carolina's Valerie Nainima found La'Keisha Sutton for an easy lay-up on to push the lead back out to three points. Davis missed a desperation and potential tying 3-pointer at the buzzer, as the Aztecs fell, 58-55.

RIVERSIDE, Calif. - San Diego State overcame an early 10-point deficit and a hot-shooting UC Riverside team for a 66-59 victory over the Highlanders at the Student Recreation Center in Riverside, Calif. Playing their fourth consecutive game away from Viejas Arena, the Aztecs improved to 4-3 on the season, while UCR dropped to 2-5.

SDSU was led by the trio of junior Paris Johnson and seniors Quenese Davis and Jené Morris, who combined to score 55 of the team's 66 points, including 35 of the 37 second half points.

Johnson logged her 14th career double-double with 17 points and 15 rebounds in 27 minutes. The 15 rebounds matched a career high, which was set March 7, 2009 at UNLV. She made all five of her free-throw attempts.

Davis scored 16 of her game-high 20 points in the second half and dished out a season-high eight assists. Morris, meanwhile, overcame a slow start to finish the game with 18 points, including a pair of three-pointers, and five steals. Both players played all 40 minutes in the backcourt for San Diego State.

The Aztecs struggled out of the gate, getting down by as many as 10 points on a three-pointer by UC Riverside's Amber Cox with 10:14 remaining in the first half. SDSU answered with eight consecutive points, including six by Johnson, to close within two with 7:17 left. San Diego State finally took the lead at 27-26 on a pair of free-throws by junior Jessica Bradley, but was outscored, 5-2, over the final 3:56 to head into intermission trailing by a 31-29 margin.

The momentum went back and forth in the second half as the Highlanders answered the Aztecs' runs with three-pointers and long jumpers. In fact, UCR, a 29.5 three-point shooting team coming into the game, made 9-of-18 from beyond the three-point arc.

SDSU, however, took the lead for good at 48-47 on a Davis lay-up with 9:38 left in the second half. The lay-up was part of an 11-0 San Diego State run that culminated with a three-pointer by Morris to put the visitors up, 55-47 with 7:23 remaining in the game.

UC Riverside closed to within five points at 64-59 at the 51-second mark, but a steal and a pair of free-throws by Davis sealed the victory for the Aztecs.

SAN DIEGO - Pepperdine's Jazmine Jackson hit the winning lay-up with less than a second left in overtime to hand the San Diego State women's basketball team a 62-61 loss at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, playing their first overtime outing since 2006, dropped to 4-4 on the year, while the Waves improved to 6-4 overall.

San Diego State trailed for most of the game, as the visitors got off to a 4-0 lead to start and were up by nine at halftime, 34-25. The Waves' advantage grew to as many as 11 points on their first bucket coming out of the locker room.

Facing a double-figure deficit for the second game in a row, the Aztecs finally began to pick up steam, using an 8-0 run to get to within one point at the 10:45 mark and eventually took the lead following two straight lay-ups in the paint at 48-47.

Pepperdine took back the lead on its very next basket and the game was tied for the fifth time at 52-52 with just over three and a half minutes left. Neither side was able to convert until the final minute, when Jené Morris hit a falling jumper along the baseline and was fouled with 48 seconds remaining. Morris, however, missed the ensuing free throw, which would have put SDSU up by three points, as Wave Katie Menton sent the game into overtime on a basket with 20 seconds left and the score tied at 54-54.

San Diego State fell behind by four points with 2:16 remaining in the five-minute overtime period, but rallied back to take the lead at 61-60 on a Paris Johnson lay-up and Morris' only three-pointer of the game. Pepperdine missed a jumper on its next trip up the floor, which was rebounded by Johnson, but Morris couldn't hold on to a long outlet pass at the other end and the Waves retook possession with 25 seconds remaining.

Coming out of a timeout, Jackson waited until the clock went under seven seconds and drove from the top of the key, ran around a crowd of Aztec defenders and managed to drive in for the winning lay-up on the right side of the basket to secure the 62-61 victory.

The SDSU junior duo of Johnson and Allison Duffy each finished the night with 17 points on a combined 16-for-30 shooting performance from the floor. Morris posted 13 points, five assists and three steals, while fellow senior Quenese Davis had seven assists and scored 10 points to become the second Aztec this season, and the 18th overall, to reach the 1,000-career point mark.

San Diego State ended the game outshooting the Waves from the field (42.6-37.7), but Pepperdine owned a +9 advantage on the glass, bolstered by 20-14 advantage in offensive rebounds. The Aztecs also made just 1-of-6 attempts at the charity stripe, including an 0-for-2 mark in overtime.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team went on a 5-0 run in the final 43 seconds to win a close battle with visiting Long Beach State, 67-62, at Viejas Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs picked up their fifth straight win in the series with the 49ers to improve to 5-4 on the year, while LBSU dropped to 3-6 in 2009-10.

LOS ANGELES - The San Diego State women's basketball team used a stifling defense and a career offensive performance from Quenese Davis to erase an early nine-point deficit and cruise to a 75-54 victory over Loyola Marymount at Gersten Pavilion. With the win, the Aztecs defeated the Lions for the second year in a row, improving to 6-4 on the season, while the home team dropped to 6-6 in 2009-10.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team rallied from a nine-point deficit for the second time in as many games, edging visiting Wake Forest, 63-62, on at Viejas Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs, improved to 7-4 overall, while the Demon Deacons dropped to 8-4 on the year. SDSU will take on Auburn, which defeated Valparaiso 51-50, in the championship game of the fifth annual San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic on Wednesday.

SDSU's first lead of the night didn't come until the 16:09 mark of the second half when Morris hit a lay-up for the one-point advantage at 39-28. The two sides traded leads two more times with the Aztecs looking to gain control with a seven-point lead with just 2:34 left to play.

Wake Forest went on a 6-2 run to get to within three and had a chance to tie it when Brooke Thomas was fouled on a 3-point attempt with six seconds left. Thomas, however, made just two of three free throws and SDSU was able to inbound the ball and run out the clock to preserve the 63-62 win.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team shot 52.1 percent from the field and had four players score in double-figures to claim its second consecutive Surf 'N Slam title with a 66-55 victory over Auburn at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU improved to 8-4 overall, while the Tigers dropped to 9-4 on the year following the two schools' first-ever meeting.

Four of the Aztecs' five starters finished in double-figure scoring, led by junior Paris Johnson, who was one rebound short of a double-double with a game-high 18 points and nine rebounds. Senior Quenese Davis was named the tournament MVP with her 16 points, six rebounds, four steals and five assists in 38 minutes.

SDSU junior Jessika Bradley tallied 12 points, seven rebounds and three blocked shots, while classmate Coco Davis added a season-best 10 points, including both of the team's 3-pointers. Senior Jené Morris, who had 18 points vs. Wake Forest, joined Johnson and Quenese Davis on the six-player all-tournament squad.

After having to rally from nine-point deficits in each of their last two outings, the Aztecs kept it close the entire first half, falling behind by as many as four points on nine occasions, but retaking the lead at the 2:49 mark at 27-26 on a Bradley jumper. That basket kick started a 6-2 run which put the host up 31-28 heading into the locker room.

SDSU continued that momentum after the break, pushing out to a double-figure lead less than four minutes into the second half and eventually went up by as many as 15 points at 44-29. Auburn, however, fought back with a scoring run of its own, getting to within six points three times, including as late as the 8:09 mark.

Back-to-back baskets in the paint pushed the Aztecs back in front by double-figures and the team outscored Auburn 6-2 in the final 1:33 to pull out the 66-55 victory.

ALBUQUERQUE - The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored host New Mexico 36-19 in the second half to cruise to a 61-39 victory in both schools' 2010 Mountain West Conference opener at The Pit in Albuquerque, N.M. With the victory, the Aztecs have won two straight on UNM's home court and have claimed three in a row vs. the Lobos for the first time since 1995, moving to 9-4 on the year. New Mexico, which scored its second-fewest points in the 41 all-time meetings, dropped to 8-5 in 2009-10.

Aztec senior Jené Morris scored 13 of the team's 25 first-half points and ended the night 10-for-17 from the field for 25 points to go with five assists and three steals. Junior Paris Johnson had 12 points and three blocked shots and senior Quenese Davis ended up notching her seventh straight game in double-figures with 10 points and a team-best six assists.

SDSU junior Jessika Bradley led the effort on the boards, posting a game-high 12 for her fifth game in double-figure rebounding.

The first half proved to be a tale of different stories for each team, as the Aztecs committed 13 turnovers and conversely, New Mexico hit only 9-of-30 shots from the field (30 percent).

SDSU made the first bucket of the game, but the Lobos responded for the first of three ties, including at 10-10 at the 10:53 mark. The Aztecs broke out of that tie with their first 3-pointer of the night by Davis and extended their lead out to five points on a Johnson lay-up.

UNM used a 6-0 run to gain its final advantage in the first half at 16-15. The Lobos, however, would only tally four more points the rest of the way, as SDSU took a 25-20 lead heading into the locker room.

New Mexico managed to get back to within a single possession after the break, scoring the first three points to close the gap to 25-23. SDSU moved back out to an eight-point lead on back-to-back jumpers by Johnson and a basket by Davis. The Aztec lead would grow to 10 points at 35-25, before dropping back to seven points on a Lobo three-pointer.

After that, Morris and Davis took over, combining to score the game's next 13 points which was a part of a 17-0 run, as SDSU went up by 22 and won by the same margin at the buzzer, 61-39.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team claimed its 11th consecutive home conference victory with a 65-50 win over visiting Wyoming Saturday afternoon at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs have now won each of their last seven regular-season conference games and have come out on top in six straight overall this season, moving to 10-4 and 2-0 in MWC action. The Cowgirls, who were the last league school to defeat SDSU on its home floor in 2008, dropped to 10-4 overall and 1-1 in conference play.

San Diego State got solid outings from each of its five starters, as senior Jené Morris notched her second consecutive 20-point scoring effort with a game-high 22 points, including a 4-for-9 performance from beyond the arc, and five assists. Two Aztecs notched double-doubles with junior Paris Johnson finishing with 13 points and 10 rebounds and senior Quenese Davis posting 11 points and a season-best 10 boards.

SDSU junior Jessika Bradley fell one rebound short of becoming the third Aztec in double-figures with nine boards and eight points, while classmate Coco Davis added five points and five assists.

Both sides started the game red hot from beyond the arc, as the two teams combined for six 3-pointers in the first nine made field-goals. There were also 10 lead changes within the first seven minutes of play until three consecutive Morris baskets started a 14-0 SDSU run to put the host ahead 29-16 at the 7:44 mark.

Wyoming would get its deficit down to single digits four times before the break, but Morris' fourth triple of the first half put the Aztecs up 39-27 heading into the locker room.

Outrebounded 23-7 in the first half, the Cowgirls got three boards within the first two minutes and came to within eight on a pair of free throws and later, trailed by seven on an Emma Langford triple at 41-34.

The seven points would be as close as the visitors would get, however, as four different Aztecs contributed at least one basket in a five-minute span to put them ahead by 16 points and later posted their largest lead of the afternoon at 17 at 61-44 with 7:20 left. Wyoming made a late run, getting to within 11, but SDSU went on to win by 15 points, 65-50.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team outscored UNLV 27-2 in the final seven minutes of the first half to easily give head coach Beth Burns her 300th career victory, as the Aztecs ran away with a 70-41 decision over the visiting Lady Rebels Wednesday at Viejas Arena. With the win, SDSU improved to a perfect 3-0 in conference play and won its seventh in a row overall, moving to 11-4 on the season. UNLV, meanwhile, dropped its seventh consecutive meeting with the Aztecs and stayed winless in the MWC (0-3), falling to 7-10 this year.

SDSU senior Jené Morris recorded a game-high 18 points, six assists and four steals in just 27 minutes of action. Junior Jessika Bradley had one of the best all-around games of her short Aztec career with 13 points, seven rebounds and a career-best six blocked shots, which tie as the most by a player in the Mountain West Conference this season.

San Diego State junior Coco Davis also chipped in 10 points with a pair of 3-pointers, classmate Allison Duffy had seven points and six boards and senior Quenese Davis just missed her ninth consecutive game in double-figure scoring, ending up with nine points to go with four assists.

The game was close for the first three minutes before the Aztecs came out of a 4-4 tie with 11 unanswered points to go up 15-4 at the 13:01 mark of the first half. UNLV then went on a run of its own, scoring seven in a row to get back to within four points at 15-11 and again at 17-13.

Quenese Davis, however, hit a 3-pointer 15 seconds later and the Lady Rebels made only one more field goal in the final nine minutes of the first half, as SDSU went into the locker room up by 32 points at 49-17.

UNLV came out of the break outscoring the Aztecs 10-4 to get to within 26 points at 53-27, but SDSU increased its lead back up to 30 points on a Duffy lay-up with 14:37 left in the game and went on to win by 29, 70-41.

WORTH, Texas - The No. 22 ranked TCU Lady Frogs outscored the visiting San Diego State women's basketball team 42-31 in the second half to hand the Aztecs their first conference loss of the season, 80-63, Saturday afternoon at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. SDSU saw its longest win streak since the 1996-97 campaign come to an end at seven games, falling to 11-5 overall and 3-1 in conference action. TCU started the afternoon with the hot hand from the field, going up early by making nine of its first 14 shots to lead by 10 points at 23-13. The Aztecs cut their deficit in half with a long-range triple from Quenese Davis and a Bradley lay-up at 23-18. The Lady Frog advantage jumped back up to nine on two occasions, but SDSU continued to keep it close, heading into the locker room trailing by six at 38-32, despite committing 13 first-half turnovers.

The Lady Frogs scored the first five points of the second half to increase their lead back into double-figures and went to as many as 16 on three occasions before getting to 20 at the 10:03 mark. San Diego State got the deficit down to as few as 13 points, however, couldn't overcome a 12-for-38 shooting performance in the second half.
