

San Diego State Postgame Notes

<u>Notes</u>

- San Diego State finishes with 28 wins this season, which is the third most in school history.
- SDSU finished with three postseason wins, which ties the Division I school record (2009).
- The Aztecs fall to 6-3 over their last three postseason appearances, which is their best three-season run of the Division I era.
- San Diego State falls to 14-17 all-time in Division I postseason appearances and 14-14 under Steve Fisher.
- SDSU is 12-8 under Fisher in the postseason since 2009.
- Fisher falls to 13-6 all-time in the NIT.
- The loss snaps San Diego State's three-game winning streak and the Aztecs finish the year by winning seven of their last nine games (7-2) and 21 of their last 25 games (21-4).
- SDSU is 19-6 in its last 25 games played during the month of March.

Player Notes

Dakarai Allen – 13 points, 4 rebounds, 1 assist, 1 blocked shot

Reached double figures in scoring for the third time in four games... All 12 of his double-figure scoring performances have come this season... Led the team in scoring for the second time this season... Had three straight games with four rebounds.

Zylan Cheatham – 7 points, 10 rebounds, 1 assist, 1 steal

Recorded his sixth double-digit rebounding effort of the year... His six games with at least 10 rebounds ties him with Winston Shepard for the team lead... Pulled down a postseason career high with 10 rebounds... Led the team in rebounds for the third time this season.

Skylar Spencer – 2 points, 6 rebounds, 3 blocked shots

Finished his career with 109 victories, which are the most in San Diego State and Mountain West history... He blocked three shots in the, giving him 303 for his career, which are the most in school and conference history... Had multiple blocked shots in seven straight games, including three straight with at least three rejections.

Winston Shepard – 7 points, 3 rebounds, 3 assists

Finished his career with 104 wins, which are the third most in school history... Led the team in assists for the 21st time this season and for the 48th time in his career.
