# 2011 Season Recap

## ANOTHER YEAR TO REMEMBER

San Diego State proved that the 2010 football season wasn't a fluke.

A year after snapping a streak of six-straight non-winning campaigns, the Aztecs once again finished above .500, going 8-5 with a trip to the New Orleans Bowl.

Below are a few of the notables from the 2011 season:

- Played in the New Orleans Bowl, marking the first time in the program's 43-year Division I history that SDSU played in bowl games in consecutive seasons.
- Finished with eight victories, matching its second-most win total in a season since 1977.
- Claimed the school's second winning season in 13 years.

## LONG HAS BEST DEBUT IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Head coach Rocky Long had the best debut season by any coach in program history.

Note the following:

- Became the first SDSU coach to lead the team to a bowl game in his inaugural campaign.
- Guided San Diego State to an 8-5 record, the program's best mark in a coach's first season since Denny Stolz was 8-4 in 1986.
- Had more wins in his first season than the previous two head coaches combined (Brady Hoke - 4 in 2009 and Chuck Long - 3 in 2006).
- Led the Aztecs to their first 3-0 start in 30 years.
- Ended the program's 19-game losing streak against Pac-10/12 foes.
- Snapped SDSU's 23-game losing streak vs. automatic qualifying BCS teams.
- Gave the team its first win in the Eastern time zone since 1972.

## SECOND-HALF STARS

The San Diego State coaching staff earned its pay with halftime adjustments last season. In its 13 games, the Aztec defense decreased scoring and total yards from the first half to the second half 11 times. In the second half last year, SDSU allowed just 91 points (7.0 ppg.) and 1,948 yards of offense (149.8 ypg.).

## IN RONNIE WE TRUST

One year after leading all freshmen in rushing with 1,532 yards, sophomore running back Ronnie Hillman had an even better season in 2011.

Hillman carried 311 times for a Mountain West record 1,711 yards and 19 touchdowns. Among the national leaders, he ranked fourth in rushing yards (131.62/g), 15th in all-purpose yards (152.38/g) and 16th in scoring (9.23/g).

Hillman was nothing short of amazing, producing nine 100-yard rushing games, six 150-yard rushing contests and a 224-yard effort against Wyoming, including a school and Mountain West record-long 99-yard run.

He ended his two-year career ranked second in 100-yard rushing games (15), 150-yard rushing games (12), rushing touchdowns (36) and total touchdowns (38), third in rushing yards (3,243), fourth in 200-yard rushing games (four), fifth in all-purpose yards(137.7/g) and sixth in scoring (228).

## OTHER 2011 INDIVIDUAL NOTABLES

- Four-year starting quarterback Ryan Lindley ended his Aztec career as the school's all-time leader in career passing yards (12,690), attempts (1,732), completions (961), touchdowns (90), total offense (12,415) and starts (49).
- A two-time first-team all-league pick, Brian Stahovich became SDSU's career leader in punting yardage (10,556).
- Three Aztecs were tabbed All-Americans with Ronnie Hillman garnering third-team honors by the *Associated Press* and *Phil Steele*. He was joined on the honorable mention *SI.com* squad by Larry Parker, who led the league in interceptions (7), and Gavin Escobar, who ranked third nationally among tight ends in receiving yards per game (60.0).

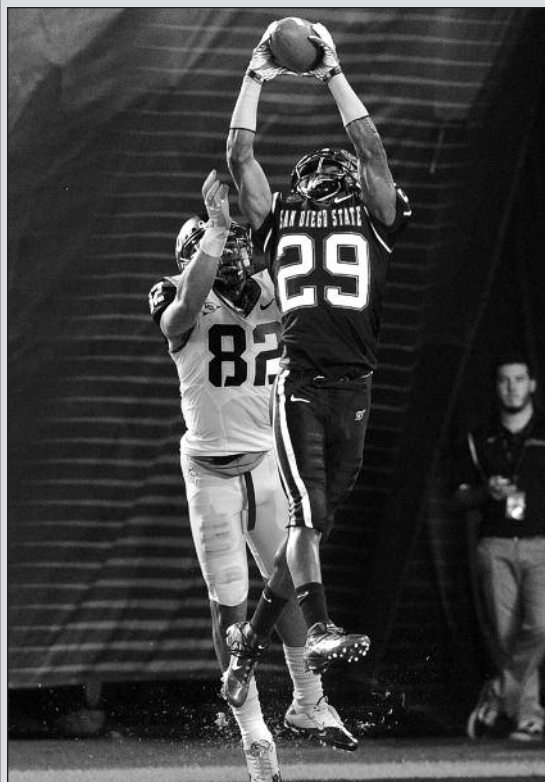

# 2011 Game Recaps

**SAN DIEGO** – The San Diego State football team put on an impressive performance on both sides of the ball, downing Cal Poly, 49-21. With the win before 34,384 fans at Qualcomm Stadium, SDSU claimed its season opener in consecutive years for the first time since 2003-04.

SDSU wasted no time kicking off the 2011 season, marching 81 yards on just six plays to take an early 7-0 lead on a Ronnie Hillman 2-yard run. After a punt, San Diego State scored a TD on three consecutive drives to open up a 28-14 lead at the half.

Quarterback Ryan Lindley found Gavin Escobar for a 3-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter, and

Dylan Denso on touchdown passes of 3 and 33 yards in the second quarter to account for the Aztecs' other first-half scores, while Cal Poly countered with a 3-yard run by Mark Rodgers and a 17-yard rushing score by Jake Romanelli.

Despite not mounting much of an offensive attack in the third, the SDSU defense came up big after the break, keeping the Mustangs to just 10 total yards of offense. Lindley threw his fourth touchdown of the game and in the process broke Todd Santos' school record for career touchdowns with his 71st on an 18-yard pass to Colin Lockett.

Hillman scampered for a 27-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter to put San Diego State up 42-14. Following a 2-yard rushing touchdown by Cal Poly's Andre Broadous, Lockett responded with a 94-yard kickoff return for the final score of the game. Lockett's kickoff return was the longest by an Aztec since 1997, and the eighth-longest return in school history.

Besides outgaining the Mustangs, 492-284, SDSU had 10 more first downs (22-12) than Cal Poly, outrushed the visitors, 289-137, and had 203 passing yards to the Mustangs' 147. Additionally, San Diego State had the ball for 36:08 compared to just 23:52 for Cal Poly.

Hillman led the Aztec offensive attack with 189 yards on 28 carries and two scores. It was his seventh 100-yard game of his career, all which have eclipsed the 150-yard barrier.

Lindley passed for 203 yards and four touchdowns, while Denso (66 yards, 2 TD) and Escobar (36 yards, TD) each caught four passes. Lockett, meanwhile, had three catches for 82 yards and a touchdown.

**WEST POINT, N.Y.** - On a weekend when emotions ran high as the nation commemorated the Sept. 11 tragedy, San Diego State survived its first-ever trip to the state of New York by edging a determined Army squad, 23-20, in front of 26,778 fans at Michie Stadium. With the victory, the Aztecs started a campaign at 2-0 in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1976-77.

The game got off to a very good start for the visitors, as quarterback Ryan Lindley found wideout Colin Lockett on the second offensive play for a 68-yard touchdown strike only 33 seconds into the contest.

Army, meanwhile, fumbled on each of its first two possessions with the Aztecs taking advantage of the second one with a 16-yard scoring run from running back Ronnie Hillman to jump ahead 14-0.

The Black Knights cut their deficit in half on the first of three rushing touchdowns on the day by quarterback Trent Steelman and headed into the break tied, as the SDSU offense went scoreless in the second quarter.

The Aztecs finally got back on the board on their final drive of the third quarter, as Hillman caught a 24-yard pass and rushed four times for 45 yards, including a 20-yard scoring effort, to put them ahead, 20-14.

The advantage would have been seven, however, SDSU place-kicker Abelardo Perez missed the extra point. Army had a chance to take the lead for the first time to start the fourth quarter, but it returned the favor by also missing an extra point following a TD, as the game was once again knotted.

Starting from their own 20-yard line, the Aztecs drove 55 yards to set up what would turn out to be a game-winning 42-yard Perez field goal.

Army tried to answer with an incredible 17-play drive that ate up nearly eight and a half minutes on the clock and got it all the way down to the SDSU 25-yard line. Over the next four plays, however, the Black Knights moved backwards after they were flagged for a 5-yard penalty, gave up a 6-yard sack and threw two incomplete passes, including one on fourth down, giving the ball back and securing the Aztecs' 23-20 victory.

Overall, Army held a huge advantage in total offense (446-292) and time of possession (42:11-17:49), but had three drives ended by fumbles and two more turned over on downs. On the flip side, SDSU did not commit a turnover for the third outing in a row (longest streak in the program's division I history) and was called for only three penalties for 10 total yards.

Hillman logged his fourth consecutive 100-yard rushing effort with 117 yards, while Lockett posted his first 100-yard receiving outing with five catches for 113 yards. Defensively, SDSU was led by Jerome Long, who had a career-high 10 tackles and a sack, and junior linebacker Rob Andrews, who posted a career-best nine stops and a forced fumble.

# San Diego State 42

**SAN DIEGO** – As they say, streaks are meant to be broken and that's just what the Aztec football team did with its come-from-behind 42-24 victory over Washington State.

Not only did a San Diego State win give the program its first 3-0 start in 30 years, but it was also the team's first victory over a Pac-12 foe in 16 seasons and was the first win against a team from an automatic-BCS-qualifying conference in 12 years.

In front of the largest home crowd to ever see a regular-season contest (57,286), the Aztecs erupted for 21 fourth-quarter points and held the nation's highest scoring offense to just one touchdown after the break.

The game, however, initially got off to a very inauspicious start for the home team, as the Cougars scored on their first offensive snap on an 80-yard pass play from Marshall Lobbestael to Marquess Wilson.

SDSU countered with two rushing touchdowns from sophomore Ronnie Hillman, which sandwiched a 48-yard WSU field goal, before the first quarter even came to an end.

After combining for 28 points in the first 15 minutes, the Cougars were the only team to find the scoreboard again before the break, reclaiming a 17-14 advantage as the Aztecs committed a pair of turnovers in Washington State territory, including a fumble on the 16-yard line.

WSU took its largest lead of the night at the 12:03 mark of the third quarter when Lobbestael and Wilson hooked up again, this time on a 78-yard catch and run to go up by 10 at 24-14.

The Cougar defense forced the SDSU offense to punt on its very next possession, but a roughing the punter penalty extended the drive. Three plays later, Aztec quarterback Ryan Lindley found tight end Gavin Escobar open on the left sideline for a 25-yard touchdown.

After missing a 39-yard field goal that would have equalized the game, SDSU scored on each of its next two possessions in the fourth quarter on a 1-yard and a 59-yard Hillman run. The Aztecs later tacked on another seven points on Escobar's second TD to secure the 42-24 win.

The San Diego State defense was simply outstanding in the fourth quarter, holding the Cougars to 62 yards of offense and forcing three turnovers, including two on back-to-back interceptions by cornerback Larry Parker.

Hillman, meanwhile, tallied his fifth-straight 100-yard rushing game with 191 yards on a career-best 32 carries, while matching his career high with the four scores.

**SAN DIEGO** – In a battle between two unbeaten football teams, San Diego State managed only seven points in nine trips into Michigan territory, as the Wolverines used a 21-point first half to hand the Aztecs their first loss of season, 28-7, in front of 110,707 fans in Ann Arbor.

SDSU fumbled three times inside the Michigan 40-yard line and also turned the ball over three times on downs, negating a second-half defensive effort that saw the Aztecs allow only seven points and force three turnovers.

The Wolverines, meanwhile, were led by quarterback Denard Robinson, who found the end zone three times in the first half and completed the game with 21 carries for 200 yards and also threw for another 93 yards.

After a short SDSU punt to open the game, Michigan drove 61 yards in just six plays, capped by a 5-yard Robinson run to give the hosts a 7-0 lead.

The Aztecs seemed headed to equalize the score on their next possession, overcoming a first and 20 from their own 20-yard line and crossing midfield. Following two consecutive 7-yard gains, San Diego State running back Ronnie Hillman lost the ball in a pile of Michigan tacklers. The miscue was Hillman's first lost fumble since his first career carry in the 2010 opener, snapping a streak of 358 consecutive offense touches without a giveaway.

Michigan, meanwhile, capitalized just a minute later, as Robinson broke free for a 53-yard score to double his team's lead at 14-0.

The SDSU offense got further into Wolverine territory when quarterback Ryan Lindley completed two long passes to set up a first down at the Michigan 36-yard line. After two rushes, Lindley misfired on consecutive pass attempts, including one on fourth down, as the Aztecs turned the ball over.

The Wolverines seemed to pick up right where they left off on offense, getting down to the SDSU 35-yard line, but Aztec senior Larry Parker forced a fumble for the second consecutive outing, which sophomore Nick Tenhaeff recovered to end the threat.

In the second quarter, SDSU had another long offensive drive, converting three third-down situations and holding the ball for nearly seven minutes, before ultimately punting from the Michigan 43-yard line.

The Wolverines had a clock-eating drive of their own, but unlike the visitors, turned it into points to take a 21-0 advantage into the locker room.

After giving up 247 yards in the first half, the Aztec defense kept the team in the game, forcing Michigan into two interceptions, a missed field goal and a fumble on four consecutive offensive possessions in the third quarter.

San Diego State converted only one of those turnovers into points when Colin Lockett scored on a 16-yard reception to cut the deficit to 21-7.

The Aztecs crossed midfield four times in the fourth quarter, but turned the ball over twice on downs and once on a fumble, as Michigan secured the 28-7 victory with one final touchdown to round out the scoring.

**SAN DIEGO** – The San Diego State football team spotted TCU a 17-point first-half lead and was never able to catch up, as the Horned Frogs earned a 27-14 victory in the Aztecs' 2011 conference opener in front of 44,248 fans at Qualcomm Stadium.

Mistakes plagued the SDSU offense throughout the game as TCU scored 17 of its points on turnovers and added another seven points after a botched field-goal attempt by the Aztecs on the other end of the field.

After holding the Horned Frogs to a field goal during their first possession of the game, SDSU marched down the field on a 16-play, 72-yard drive, but came away with nothing after a fumbled snap on a field goal try resulted in a turnover on downs. TCU took advantage of the mistake, putting together a 9-play, 91-yard drive, capped by a 39-yard touchdown pass from Casey Pachall to Antoine Hicks.

The Aztecs seemed on their way to respond, as they drove the ball 74 yards to the TCU 3-yard line in only five plays. On the sixth play, however, safety Tekerrein Cuba forced SDSU running back Ronnie Hillman to fumble the ball at the goal line and Elisha Olabode recovered it in the end zone for a touchback.

San Diego State's defense prevented TCU from scoring on the drive though, as junior cornerback Leon McFadden intercepted a Pachall pass on his own 15-yard line.

The Aztecs were unable to take advantage though, as quarterback Ryan Lindley's pass on third down was intercepted by safety Johnny Fobbs at the 24-yard line and returned to midfield.

On this occasion, the Horned Frogs took advantage of the turnover, extending their lead to 17-0 on a 31-yard touchdown catch by Josh Boyce.

The Aztec offense continued to struggle early in the second half as Lindley threw his second interception on SDSU's first drive. TCU once again capitalized on the mistake, adding three points to its lead.

San Diego State finally caught a break midway through the third quarter when fullback Chad Young forced Skye Young to fumble on a punt return, which Vanessa Harris recovered to put the Aztecs in scoring position. Three plays later, Lindley connected on a 16-yard touchdown pass with tight end Gavin Escobar to give SDSU its first points of the evening.

After a TCU punt, the Aztecs closed the gap to only six points with a 10-play, 77-yard drive capped by a 4-yard touchdown pass from Lindley to Young.

SDSU's defense forced a three and out on the next TCU possession, but Lindley threw his third interception of the evening, which the Horned Frogs turned into seven points the other direction to seal the 27-14 win.

**USAFA, Colo.** – Two fourth-quarter touchdowns from Ronnie Hillman were plenty for the San Diego State football team, as they cruised to a 41-27 victory against Air Force in front of 27,490 fans at Falcon Stadium. The win snapped SDSU's two-game losing streak and improved the team's record to 4-2 overall and 1-1 in the Mountain West.

San Diego State struck first on its opening drive, notching three points on a field goal after going 72 yards on 12 plays. Air Force responded by putting together a 12-play, 80-yard drive of its own to take a 7-3 lead.

The Aztecs had another long drive on their next possession, putting seven points on the board on a 27-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Lindley to tight end Alston Umuolo to give SDSU a 10-7 lead.

Air Force once again responded, scoring its second touchdown of the game on a 4-yard run from David Baska on an eight-play, 62-yard drive.

SDSU's offense got a break on its next possession as Brandon Davis returned the Falcons' kickoff 98 yards to give the Aztecs a three-point lead.

San Diego State's lead was short lived, however, as Air Force used the remaining 5:50 of the second quarter to drive 53 yards and tie the game on a 44-yard field goal.

In the second half, the Aztecs stepped up their defense by holding the Falcons to 10 points. Despite Air Force notching the first points of the third quarter on a 31-yard field goal, SDSU's offense had little issue as it scored the next 24 points of the contest.

After a 25-yard field goal by Abelardo Perez, the Aztecs tallied their third touchdown on a 28-yard pass from Lindley to Colin Lockett, which was set up by a fumble recovery, to give SDSU a 27-20 lead after three quarters of action.

In the fourth quarter, Hillman scored on consecutive Aztec possessions to put the game out of reach. Hillman's first touchdown was a 22-yard run, while the second was from 57 yards out.

The Falcons would notch one more score late in the fourth quarter, but it was too late as SDSU picked up the 41-27 win.

Hillman finished the game with 172 yards and two touchdowns on 27 carries, while Lindley passed for 209 yards and two scores.

**SAN DIEGO** – San Diego State outscored Wyoming 14-0 in the final 30 minutes, but could still not overcome a 17-point halftime deficit, as the Aztecs dropped a 30-27 decision to the visiting Cowboys at Qualcomm Stadium.

SDSU found itself playing catch up most of the evening, as the Wyoming offense proved nearly unstoppable coming out of the gate. The Cowboys scored four touchdowns on each of their first four drives and later tacked on what would prove to be the game-winning field goal as time expired heading into the locker room ahead, 30-13.

The Aztecs actually led twice, scoring on their first offensive possession for a 7-0 lead on a 44-yard touchdown reception by Gavin Escobar.

After Wyoming equalized, SDSU went back ahead just 49 seconds later when Ryan Lindley found Ronnie Hillman open down the left sideline for a 71-yard touchdown strike, the team's longest pass play of the season.

After the schools combined for a 27-point first quarter, the Aztec offense went dormant as Wyoming continued its streak of 23 unanswered points and rolled up an outstanding 396 yards of total offense in the first half alone.

The San Diego State defense finally woke up after the break, forcing Wyoming to punt eight consecutive times, including a streak of five straight three-and-outs, and allowing no points to leave the door open for a possible Aztec come-from-behind victory.

Hillman nearly single-handedly led the SDSU rally, notching the longest play from scrimmage in school history, as he got the ball at his own 1-yard line and rambled 99 yards for the touchdown, the first of his two second-half rushing scores.

Trailing by just three points at 30-27 heading into the fourth quarter, SDSU advanced into Wyoming territory three times, but came out with no points as place-kicker Abelardo Perez missed a pair of field goals from 39 and 27 yards, with the latter being with under two minutes remaining.

The Aztecs still had one final chance to at least draw even, taking over with 1:23 left to play. Despite a 25-yard completion on first down, a sack and a false start penalty pushed the team in the wrong direction and it was unable to convert a fourth-and-8 play near midfield, turning the ball over on downs to officially end the comeback.

Hillman finished the night with 305 all-purpose yards, including 224 on the ground for his third career 200-yard game.

The nation's leading rusher also set two Mountain West records for most all-purpose yards in a conference contest and longest-ever rush with his 99-yard effort.

**SAN DIEGO** – After a slow start, the San Diego State football team notched three second-half touchdowns to close out a two-game homestand and keep visiting New Mexico winless on the season with a 35-7 victory at Qualcomm Stadium.

The Aztec defense pitched a second-half shutout for the second consecutive outing and kept an anemic New Mexico offense to only 162 total yards, including 74 on the ground and 88 through the air, and eight first downs. The 162 combined yards were the fourth-fewest allowed by SDSU in program history and fewest overall since 1998.

Offensively, the home team scored all five of its touchdowns via the run (most in a single game since 1996), put up 486 total yards and did not have a turnover for the third time in 2011.

Both sides started the evening slowly, as New Mexico punted four straight times and San Diego State punted on its first two possessions before breaking through on a 10-play, 66-yard drive capped by the first of three rushing touchdowns by junior Walter Kazee.

The Lobos crossed midfield for the first time in the game early in the second quarter, but were later forced to punt from the Aztec 43-yard line.

Taking over from their own 11, San Diego State utilized nine rushes and a pair of first-down completions from Ryan Lindley to Dylan Denso and Osmond Nicholas to double their lead at 14-0 on a 3-yard Kazee run.

The Lobos answered on their next possession with a key 23-yard pass from quarterback B.R. Holbrook to Martize Barr on third-and-6 to extend the drive. UNM running back Crusoe Gongbay then had a 14-yard reception and a 14-yard run, before recording his team's first points in three games from six yards out with only 32 seconds remaining in the half to make the score 14-7.

Coming out of the break, San Diego State scored on three of its first four possessions on a pair of 1-yard runs by Kazee and sophomore Ronnie Hillman and a 3-yarder from Chad Young to round out scoring at 35-7.

The Lobos, meanwhile, never got past their own 40-yard line in the second half, compiling only 41 yards of total offense and having two drives come to an end on interceptions by Aztec junior Leon McFadden and sophomore Gabe Lemon.

Defensively, SDSU senior linebacker Miles Burriss led the way with a team-high nine tackles, including 2.5 for a loss. Offensively, Hillman had 29 carries for 141 yards for his seventh 100-yard rushing game in 2011.

Lindley pulled to within 26 yards of breaking the conference's all-time passing record, completing 16 of his 24 attempts for 271 yards.

**FORT COLLINS, Colo.** – On an evening when wind gusts caused havoc both in the stands and on the field, the San Diego State football team successfully battled the elements to find a way to earn its sixth victory of the season, edging host Colorado State, 18-15. The win was the Aztecs' fourth in a row at Hughes Stadium and made them bowl eligible for the second consecutive campaign.

Despite missing his first two field-goal tries, SDSU senior place-kicker Abelardo Perez came through when it counted, notching his second fourth-quarter game-winner of the season from 37 yards out to break a 18-18 tie with 5:49 remaining.

The San Diego State defense then held strong for the Rams' final two possessions of the game, forcing a punt on the first drive and causing the home squad to turn the ball over on downs after four consecutive pass incompletions to secure the victory.

Colorado State actually had the early lead, scoring a touchdown on a 63-yard scamper by running

back Chris Nwoke at the 6:20 mark of the first quarter. Nwoke would finish the game with 232 yards rushing and accounted for 239 of his team's 327 total yards.

The Aztecs did not trail for long, converting a third-and-7 and a fourth-and-1 to eat up nearly six minutes on the clock, culminating in a 4-yard scoring pass from quarterback Ryan Lindley to tight end Alston Umuolo.

SDSU was set to knot the score at seven, but Brian Stahovich bobbled the snap on the extra point. Stahovich, however, recovered in time to evade the CSU defenders and find Chad Young in the end zone for the team's first two-point conversion in two years and a 8-7 advantage.

San Diego State added to its lead with another impressive offensive drive in the second quarter, using 11 consecutive draw plays to go 56 yards and go up by eight points on a 1-yard Walter Kazee plunge.

The Aztecs moved into Colorado State territory on four straight possessions in the second and third quarters, but each time came away empty as Perez missed on field goal tries of 22 and 44 yards.

CSU, meanwhile, took advantage of two SDSU personal foul penalties to start the fourth quarter and tied the game at 15 when backup quarterback Garrett Grayson used his feet to score on a 4-yard touchdown and also tack on the ensuing two-point conversion.

After a short kick-off, San Diego State got down to the Ram 20-yard line with the help of an 18-yard reception by tight end Gavin Escobar and a 17-yard run by Adam Muema to set up the game-winning field goal.

Lindley ended the night with 154 yards through the air, becoming the school's and conference's all-time career passing leader with 11,494 yards.

not overcome three early turnovers in a 52-35 loss at Qualcomm Stadium. The 35 points were the second most allowed by the Broncos all season.

The Aztecs turned the ball over three times over their first four possessions, two (fumbled a punt, fumbled a kickoff) before the offense was even able to touch the ball and fell behind, 21-0.

Adam Muema, who earned his first career start for the injured Ronnie Hillman, got SDSU on the scoreboard with an 81-yard rushing touchdown after coming into the game with just 82 career rushing yards.

BSU quarterback and Heisman Trophy candidate Kellen Moore answered with a nine-yard strike to Kyle Efaw, before San Diego State quarterback Ryan Lindley found Gavin Escobar with a 30-yard touchdown to bring the Aztecs to within 14 at 28-14.

Boise State closed the half, however, with back-to-back touchdowns on a Doug Martin 10-yard run and a 24-yard pass by Moore to Tyler Shoemaker.

A 30-yard field goal by Michael Frisina in the third quarter gave the Broncos their biggest lead at 45-14, but SDSU didn't give up and outscored the perennial national power, 21-7, in the fourth quarter to make a game out of it.

Lindley tossed touchdowns to Escobar and Muema, and Muema scored a final rushing score with five seconds left.

Moore finished the game 28-for-40 with 366 yards and three touchdowns, while Lindley countered with a 30-for-51 effort, 350 yards and three scores.

Colin Lockett (eight receptions, 149 yards) and Escobar (eight receptions, 113 yards) each had career games, while Muema rushed 13 times for 119 yards and three total touchdowns (two rushing, one receiving).

**LAS VEGAS, Nev.** – With the help of Ronnie Hillman's 192 yards and two touchdowns, San Diego State outscored its opponent in the second half for the seventh time this season en route to a 31-14 victory against UNLV at Sam Boyd Stadium.

After allowing the Rebels to put up 233 yards of offense and two touchdowns in the first half, the Aztec defense held UNLV to just 28 yards of total offense and shutout an opponent in the second half for the third time this season.

The Rebels jumped out to a fast start against SDSU, scoring back-to-back touchdowns on their second and third drives of the game. UNLV running back Tim Cornett accounted for both scores, one of which was a 54-yard run.

After the SDSU defense forced a three and out on UNLV's first drive of the second half, the Aztecs drove 53 yards to tie the contest at 14-14 as Ryan Lindley found wideout Colin Lockett for a 15-yard touchdown pass.

On the next Rebels' next drive, SDSU once again forced a three and out and responded with an 11-play, 52-yard drive that resulted in a 27-yard field goal by Abel Perez to give the Aztecs their first lead of the game, 17-14.

UNLV turned the ball over on downs on its next possession despite driving to the SDSU 36-yard line. San Diego State responded with a clock-draining 12-play, 64-yard drive that ended in a 6-yard touchdown pass from Lindley to Dylan Denso on fourth down.

After another three and out by UNLV, the Aztecs ran three minutes off the clock on a 31-yard drive capped off by a 1-yard touchdown run by Hillman.

SDSU then put the icing on the cake as they picked off Rebel quarterback Caleb Herring with less than a minute remaining to seal the 31-14 victory.

Trailing for most of the fourth quarter, the Aztecs managed put together what appeared to be a game-winning drive.

With 2:09 remaining, the Aztecs marched 69 yards down the field to take a one-point lead on a 12-yard touchdown strike from senior quarterback Ryan Lindley to sophomore wide receiver Colin Lockett.

Louisiana-Lafayette had little time to respond as there was just 35 seconds left in the contest. The Ragin' Cajuns managed to pull it off though, as they drove 49 yards in five plays despite a controversial penalty that preceded kicker Brett Baer's 50-yard field goal as time expired.

The Aztecs got on the scoreboard first on their opening drive as senior place-kicker Abelardo Perez connected on a 27-yard field goal.

ULL would go on to score the next 19 points and keep SDSU scoreless until the third quarter.

The Aztecs found their offense in the second half and quickly cut the deficit. SDSU scored its first touchdown of the night as Lindley connected on a 16-yard pass to Lockett.

Late in the third quarter, the Aztecs would find the end zone again as Lindley connected with Lockett for a 16-yard strike to bring SDSU to within two.

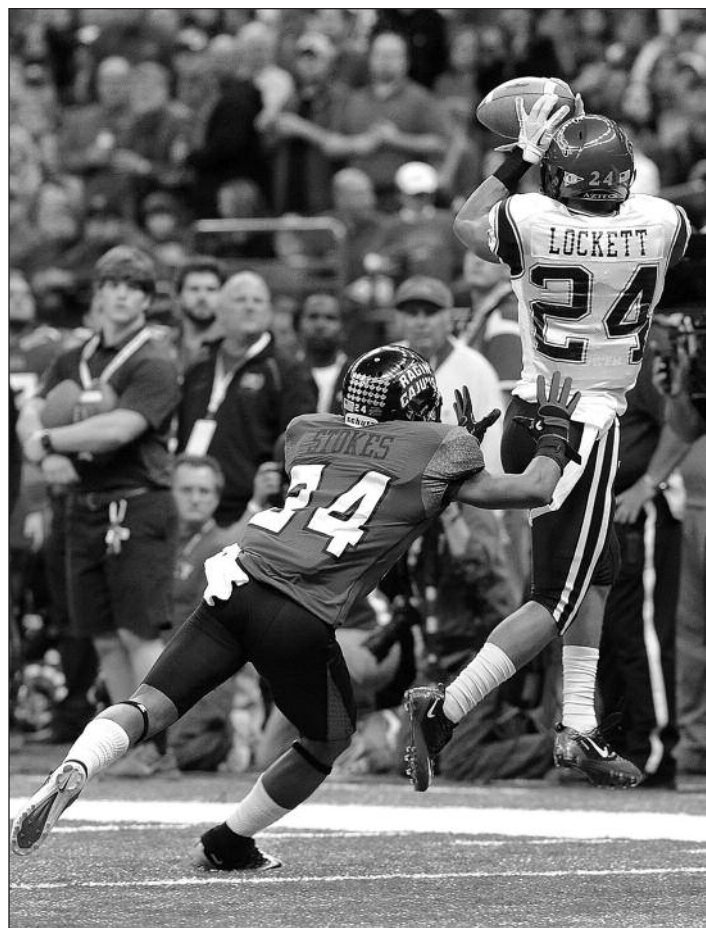
After a score from the Ragin' Cajuns, SDSU answered with a 10-play, 55-yard drive of its own to bring the Aztecs back to within two with 5:40 remaining.

Despite another touchdown from San Diego State late in the fourth quarter, Louisiana-Lafayette managed to pull off the win as time expired on field goal by Baer.

Lindley completed 28 of 49 throws for 413 yards and three touchdowns, while Dylan Denso caught five passes for 109 yards.
