- San Diego State kicks off the 2017-18 regular season with a Veterans' Day matinee against Presbyterian on Fri., Nov. 10. Tip on Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena is set for noon PT.
- Three Aztecs scored double-digit points, leading San Diego State women's basketball to a 71-50 exhibition win over Cal State Los Angeles on Fri., Nov. 3 in Viejas Arena. Preseason All-Mountain West honoree McKynzie Fort was the Aztecs' leader on offense, recording 19 points with team highs in rebounds (6) and assists (5). In her collegiate debut, Te'a Adams scored 15 points, going 4-for-7 from the floor with a pair of long balls, and tacking on a trio each of rebounds and assists. Senior Geena Gomez also scored in the double digits with 11 points.
- San Diego State women's basketball was picked to finish eighth in the Mountain West and senior guard McKynzie Fort was named to the Mountain West Preseason All-Conference team in the preseason coaches poll.
- Preseason All-MW honoree McKynzie Fort returns for her senior season, looking to climb her way to the top five in the Aztecs' scoring list. During the 2016-17 season, Fort became just the fourth Aztec to garner a spot on an All-Mountain West team each of her first three seasons at San Diego State after collecting an All-Mountain West first team nod last year. The only Aztec to start all 30 games, Fort finished the year in the league rankings: second in points per game (15.9), ninth in free throw percentage (.784), 11th in field goal percentage (.436), 12th in minutes played per game (31.9) and 13th in assists per game (2.5).
- Presbyterian College is coming off of a 13-18 overall mark, with a 10-8 record in Big South Conference play. The Blue Hose made the program's second appearance in the Big South Championship semifinals, falling by one point to conference-champion UNC Asheville.

Scouting the Blue Hose

- Presbyterian College is coming off of a 13-18 overall mark, with a 10-8 record in Big South Conference play.
- The Blue Hose made the program's second appearance in the Big South Championship semifinals, falling by one point to conference-champion UNC Asheville.
- Presbyterian will be led by senior guard Cortney Storey, a 2017-18 preseason All-Big South pick. Storey was the conference's assists leader (137) and ranked second in assist to turnover ratio (1.47), free-throw percentage (77.8), and steals per game (2.10), leading the Blue Hose in most offensive categories en route to a second-team All-Big South nod.
- Todd Steelman is in his second season at the helm of Presbyterian's program.

Cal State Los Angeles Exhibition Recap

Three Aztecs scored double-digit points, leading San Diego State women's basketball to a 71-50 exhibition win over Cal State Los Angeles on Fri., Nov. 3 in Viejas Arena.

Preseason All-Mountain West honoree McKynzie Fort was the Aztecs' leader on offense, recording 19 points with team highs in rebounds (6) and assists (5). In her collegiate debut, Te'a Adams scored 15 points, going 4-for-7 from the floor with a pair of long balls, and tacking on a trio each of rebounds and assists. Senior Geena Gomez also scored in the double digits with 11 points.

After a disappointing first quarter for SDSU in which the Aztecs trailed, 13-11, Adams' strong second quarter propelled San Diego State. Thirty seconds into the frame, she knocked down a three from the right side. Two-and-a-half minutes later, she served up a bounce pass under the basket to Cheyenne Greenhouse on the right side, who lifted in the ball to tie the game at 17-17. On SDSU's next possession, Adams hit her second long ball of the game, again from the right side of the basket. She followed that up with a layup for the 24-19 score at 5:55, getting nine points in 3:35.

Midway through the third quarter, the Aztecs built on their 40-34 lead with a nine-point run. Following a Gomez jumper from the free-throw line at 5:10, Adams broke away from the pack with Baylee Vanderdoes racing alongside her. She slipped the ball to Vanderdoes who made the layup, putting SDSU up by double digits at 3:47 in the third. The ensuing Aztec possession saw Gomez nail a three from the right side of the basket, which Adams built upon with a layup 24 seconds later. SDSU's 21 points in the third frame were a game high, helping the Scarlet and Black to a 51-40 lead after 30 minutes of play.

A strong fourth quarter wrapped up the game for the Aztecs, who doubled up on the Golden Eagles, 20-10, in the period.

San Diego State's bench was a major key to its success, outscoring the Cal State Los Angeles bench, 28-8. SDSU also held advantages in fast break points, 17-0, points off turnovers, 17-11, and points in the paint, 32-14.

SDSU Selected in Preseason MW Poll

- San Diego State women's basketball was picked to finish eighth in the Mountain West and senior guard McKynzie Fort was named to the Mountain West Preseason All-Conference team in the preseason coaches poll.
- After winning the Mountain West Tournament last season, Boise State was the favorite to repeat as the league champion with seven first-place votes and 221 points. Wyoming, who was the No. 2 seed at last year's tournament, collected six first-place votes and 216 points

for the second spot. Colorado State, the regular-season champion, garnered 211 votes and six first-place votes for third.

Welcome Back!

- In addition to having six newcomers, including the nation's 23rd-ranked and the Mountain West's best incoming class, the 2017-18 Aztecs welcome back an impressive amount of offensive output from a year prior.
- Four starters from last year's team will once again don the Scarlet and Black: seniors McKynzie Fort, Geena Gomez, Lexy Thorderson and Khalia Lark.
- Five letterwinners from the 2016-17 squad are also expected to contribute this season: Arantxa Gomez Ferrer, Cheyenne Greenhouse, Abby Lowe, Monique Terry and Baylee Vanderdoes.
- Nearly 79 percent (78.9) of the team's scoring from last year returns, led by All-MW first-team pick McKynzie Fort, who single-handedly recorded almost one-fourth (24.9 percent) of SDSU's total points in 2016-17.

Fort-ifying the Aztecs' Offense

- Preseason All-MW honoree McKynzie Fort returns for her senior season, looking to climb her way to the top five in the Aztecs' scoring list.
- During the 2016-17 season, Fort became just the fourth Aztec to garner a spot on an All-Mountain West team each of her first three seasons at San Diego State after collecting an All-Mountain West first-team nod last year.
- The only Aztec to start all 30 games, Fort finished the year in the league rankings: second in points per game (15.9), ninth in free throw percentage (.784), 11th in field goal percentage (.436), 12th in minutes played per game (31.9) and 13th in assists per game (2.5).
- The Fontana, Calif., native was 116-for-148 from the free throw line, tied for the eighth-most made in SDSU single-season history.
- Fort reached the career 1,000-point mark at San José State (1-11-17), the 21st Aztec and eighth SDSU third-year to accomplish the feat, after notching season highs in points (29) and rebounds (11) for her second-career double-double.
- Fort enters the 2017-18 season with 1,233 career points, ranking 16th. Here's a look at the top 15 in the program's scoring list:

Captain Captain

- The Aztecs' captains for the 2017-18 season are seniors McKynzie Fort, Geena Gomez and Lexy Thorderson.
- Fort, a three-year starter for the Aztecs, is a three-time All-MW selection and was named to the Preseason All-MW Team this season after spending much of the 2016-17 campaign atop most offensive categories.
- Gomez, a two-year letterwinner, is one of four returning starters for San Diego State. The mastermind behind the Aztecs' offense on the court, she shot at a .360 clip (36-for-100) from 3-point range last season, the league's sixth-best percentage.
- Three-time MW All-Academic Team honoree and three-year letterwinner Thorderson helped SDSU engineer the program's best 3-point shooting season last year and will be relied upon heavily from beyond the arc for her final campaign.

Moral Support

- Stacie Terry's fourth season saw an increase in excitement surrounding the team, evidenced in home attendance. For the 2016-17 season, the Aztecs averaged 855 in attendance at the team's 14 home games, up from an average of 487 during the 2015-16 campaign (the previous high during the Terry era was for the 2014-15 season when SDSU averaged 604 fans per game). Against Michigan on Dec. 11, 2,632 fans were in attendance for the greatest showing since Jan. 24, 2009, when 2,792 were in Viejas Arena to see San Diego State play then-conference foe Brigham Young.

History Made from Beyond the Arc

- With their 200 made long balls on a program-high 620 attempts, the 2016-17 Aztecs are the program's best 3-point shooting team.
- Since the statistic started being recorded in the program's record book during the 1987-88 campaign, SDSU's most made threes came in the 2012-13 season with 164 3-pointers.
- The 2016-17 Aztecs also sported the best 3-point percentage at .319 (204-639) in seven years. The single-season record is .404 (65-for-161) set during the 1991-92 season.

Overall, Bojorquez led Sierra Linda High in assists each of her three seasons on the team. She averaged 11.8 points per game as a junior to help lead Sierra Linda to the 2016 AIA Girls Basketball State Championship Division II semifinals and notched 9.7 points per game while tying for the team lead in steals (3.6) as a sophomore. In her freshman season at Oklahoma City's Southeast High, she averaged 13 points with 5.0 assists and 3.6 steals per game on the varsity squad.

• Kiara Edwards was a four-star recruit ranked No. 119 by Prospects Nation at Valley Vista High (Surprise, Ariz.). She was invited to the 2016 Women's U17 World Championships team trials, averaging nearly a double-double over her four-year varsity career (12.9 PPG, 9.8 RPG). Her senior season, Edwards helped Valley Vista to a state title, the school's first, after averaging 12.1 points and 8.8 rebounds per game, both the team high and earning a ticket to the 2017 Arizona Girls High School Basketball

• Lexy Thorderson's 66 made 3-point field goals on 192 attempts are each fourth in SDSU history. She finished the year with the Mountain West's second-most made long balls, averaging 2.4 per game, and ranking 80th in the nation. In a single-game high, she drilled seven treys in a win against UNLV (1-18-17), tied for the third-most in SDSU history.

• Thorderson had five games last season with five-or-more treys: a career-high seven against UNLV, six versus Boise State and five against Nevada, San José State and at UNLV.

• San Diego State had its most success beyond the arc last season against San José State. In their road game against the Spartans, SDSU knocked down 12 3-pointers, its third straight game with 10-or-more threes, and, when hosting SJSU, drilled 13 long balls.

• In the Scarlet and Black's home game against San José State, the teams combined for 25 threes, the most in a MW game this season. It was just the third time the feat was accomplished during the 2016-17 campaign.

• Versus UNLV, the Scarlet and Black knocked down 14 3-pointers for a season high and its most since Feb. 10, 2005 in a 91-45 win over Utah Valley State College. In the game, Thorderson drilled a career-best seven treys.

• Against Boise State, SDSU knocked down 11 3-pointers, five of which came in the fourth quarter (its second-straight game with five-or-more treys in a quarter after getting six in the first quarter vs. Nevada) following its 10 treys made against the Wolf Pack.

• SDSU was the first team in the conference to score double-digit threes in three straight Mountain West games, the first time since at least the 1999-2000 season that the Aztecs had consecutive games with 10-or-more 3-pointers.

The New Aztecs on the Block

• The incoming freshmen for the San Diego State women's basketball team, ranked as the 23rd- and 46th-best class in the country (according to Prospects Nation and Blue Star Basketball, respectively), capped their impressive high school careers in convincing fashion, donning the Scarlet and Black for the first time during 2017-18 season.

• Te'a Adams was three-star recruit ranked No. 22 among point guards in her class according to ESPN with a 90 scouts grade. She finished her four-year career at Juanita High as the program's all-time leading scorer with 1,835 career points,

leading the team in scoring each season. As a senior, Adams was a first-team All-3A/2A KingCo Conference honoree, her fourth consecutive all-conference honor, and was a Seattle Times Class 3A first team pick following career-high tallies in points (22.5), assists (3.3), rebounds (4.1) and assists (4.6). A 2016 All-USA Western Washington Preseason Girls Basketball Team honorable mention and KingCo 3A/2A First Team pick as a junior, she averaged 20.0 points per game. Her sophomore season, Adams was named to the 2015 All-USA Western Washington Preseason Girls Basketball first team and captured KingCo 2A/3A Co-MVP and Defensive Player of the Year accolades as a sophomore and collected All-KingCo 2A/3A first-team honors her freshman year.

• Jenay Bojorquez was a three-and-a-half-star recruit according to Prospects Nation as a three-year letterwinner at Sierra Linda High (Phoenix, Ariz.). As a senior, she earned spots on the All-5A Conference first team, the 2016-17 Sports360AZ Arizona All-Academic Girls Basketball first team (4.0 GPA) and a spot in the Arizona Girls High School

That season, Edwards was a 2016-17 All-West Valley Preps first team pick for the third-straight year after earning Girls Basketball Player of the Year runner-up nods each of the previous two seasons. She was also a two-time (2013-14, 2015-16) Sports360AZ All-Academic Girls Basketball Team honorable mention.

• Junior Loli Gomez joins San Diego State after a year away from basketball. She spent her freshman year at CSU San Bernardino, appearing in eight game and averaging 3.8 minutes per contest. Gomez, Aztec senior Geena Gomez's younger sister, was a four-year letterwinner at Edison High before joining the Coyotes.

• Ranked 30th among guards in her class, Najé Murray earned three stars and a 90 scouts grade by ESPNW as a three-year letterwinner at perennial national powerhouse St. Mary's (Stockton, Calif.). She reached the 1,000-career-point mark as a senior en route to a spot on the NorCal Sports TV Girls West All-Star roster alongside classmate Kennedy Villa. As a junior, Murray was named to the Cal-Hi Sports All-State Underclass Junior First Team after averaging 12.9 points and 2.76 steals per game when the Rams were ranked No. 1 in the nation for part of the year. She was a Cal-Hi Sports All-State Underclass Sophomore First Team honoree with 9.1 points and 2.5 steals per game as St. Mary's won the CIF Open Division state title. As a freshman, she was an All-Sac-Joaquin Section Tri-City Athletic League Second Team pick after knocking down 8.2 points, 2.67 rebounds, 2.73 steals and 2.1 assists per game.

• Kennedy Villa was a three-star recruit according to ESPN, earning a scouts grade of 88 at St. Mary's High in Albany, Calif. She was named to the NorCal Sports TV Girls West All-Star team her senior season alongside classmate Najé Murray, and was also named an All-Bay Area News Group honorable mention that year after pacing St. Mary's with 1.9 assists per game while ranking second with 10.6 points and 2.7 steals per game. St. Mary's advanced to the 2017 CIF Division III Northern regional championship game, finishing the year 22-11. As a junior, Villa averaged a team-best 11.3 points per game alongside 5.06 rebounds per game.
