A Look at the 2016-17 Aztecs

San Diego State entered the 2016-17 with lofty goals and expectations, having been picked as the overwhelming favorite to win the Mountain West. SDSU earned 23 of 27 first-place votes in the conference's annual preseason poll to sit atop the rankings for the third straight year and for the fourth time in the last five seasons.

Even with the early target on their backs, the Aztecs had a chip on their shoulder after missing out on the NCAA tournament in 2016 and reaching the semifinals of the NIT.

SDSU opened the season with four wins in its first five games, dropping only a road contest at nationally ranked Gonzaga.

Injuries that occurred in preseason practices ultimately spilled into the first three games of the campaign and affected the growth of the unit as the schedule moved into December.

The Aztecs lost the first three games of the month before rebounding with four straight victories, including three in a row at the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic to claim the tournament crown.

Upon returning to the mainland, San Diego State dropped three games in row again only to win the next three. The up-and-down trend continued for the rest of the Mountain West campaign en route to a 9-9 ledger.

Despite the .500 conference record, the Aztecs were a play or two away from having a much better showing. In five of its MW losses, SDSU had a lead of at least 11 points and in its other four defeats, it enjoyed a seven-point advantage three times and had a shot at the buzzer to force overtime in the other.

Even with the disappointment of the conference season, the Aztecs made a run at the MW tournament, winning twice to reach the semifinals where they found themselves up by

13 points before falling eight points short.

Below are some notes on the 2016-17 squad:

► San Diego State finished in the top 25 in three defensive categories, ranking eighth in field-goal percentage defense (.388), 15th in scoring defense (62.5) and 24th in blocked shots per game (5.0).

► SDSU finished first in Mountain West games only in points allowed (63.2), field-goal percentage defense (.385) and blocked shots (4.8). The Scarlet and Black also finished second in steals (6.8). In all games, San Diego State finished first in scoring defense and field-goal percentage defense.

► The Aztecs lost 28 games due to injury, including nine from starter Malik Pope. In all, SDSU lost 24 games due to injury from players who started at least one game during the season.

► San Diego State was 2-11 in games decided by eight points or less. Prior to the year, the Aztecs were 50-22 in

games decided by six points or less or in overtime.

► SDSU was the ninth unluckiest team in the nation, according to KenPom. Of the bottom nine, only one other school had a winning record.

► Senior Dakarai Allen was named the MW Defensive Player of the Year by the league's head coaches. The award marked the third straight season in which an Aztec earned the top defensive honor. Allen also landed on the all-defensive team.

► Junior Trey Kell landed on the all-Mountain West third team in vote of the league's head coaches and media. Sophomore Jeremy Hemsley was an honorable mention selection by the coaches. Allen and sophomore Zylan Cheatham earned honorable mention distinction from the media.

► Kell for the second straight year was named to the NABC All-District 17 Second Team after leading the Aztecs in scoring, assists, steals and free-throw percentage.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State rallied from a nine-point first-half deficit to defeat cross-town foe San Diego, 69-59, in the season opener for both teams at Viejas Arena.

The Toreros began the game by making their first four shots from the field, three of which were layups. USD cooled a bit and the Aztecs started to find a rhythm, but the visitors warmed back up and scored seven unanswered points to take a 23-14 lead with 7:56 left.

The teams traded baskets and San Diego regained its nine-point lead with 5:20 remaining before halftime. SDSU, however, took over the game slowly as Trey Kell and Jeremy Hemsley combined to score the team's final 13 points before Olin Carter III made a bucket just before halftime to make it, 35-33, Aztecs.

The second half started much like the first, with USD making a layup right out of the gate and followed it with yet another, this one from Carter III. SDSU answered with layups from Zylan Cheatham and Hemsley to give the home side a 39-37 lead, but Carter III made a pair of free throws to knot the score.

Five consecutive points from Hemsley gave the Aztecs breathing room and it jumpstarted an 18-2 run that put San Diego State ahead, 57-41, with 7:10 to go.

Less than two minutes later, SDSU's lead ballooned to 19, and the Aztecs never looked back. In the final minutes, the Toreros chipped into their deficit before settling for the 10-point loss, which happened to be their eighth straight loss at San Diego State.

The Aztecs, who allowed USD to shoot 54.2 percent in the first half, clamped down in the second and held the Toreros to a 44-percent clip in the final 20 minutes.

Hemsley finished with a career-high 25 points and Kell poured in 23 of his own. D'Erryl Williams provided a spark defensively in the first half and was key to shutting USD down on the perimeter, which allowed the Aztecs to get back into the game. The senior finished with career highs in rebounds (5) and steals (2).

SPOKANE, Wash. - SDSU shot the ball poorly and committed 15 turnovers, which led to a 69-48 loss at No. 14/14 Gonzaga.

Both teams opened the game by missing 15 consecutive shots (Gonzaga - 8, San Diego State - 7), but the Aztecs were the ones to eventually jump out to a 6-2 lead.

Once the Bulldogs settled down, they scored 10 unanswered points to move ahead, 12-6. Montaque Gill-Caesar ended SDSU's scoring drought, but it was just the beginning of the Aztecs' tough shooting night as they finished the half by making just two of their 11 attempts from the field.

Gonzaga, on the other hand, outscored San Diego State, 24-13, after the Gill-Caesar basket to take a 36-21 lead at halftime. In the first half, the Aztecs shot 20.7 percent from the field and was 1-for-12 from three-point distance.

San Diego State opened the second half with a Dakarai Allen three-pointer and a Trey Kell bucket to get to within 10 points, but Jordan Mathews hit a three of his own. Jeremy Hemsley answered with a try on the next possession only to have Mathews hit yet another three-ball to push the Bulldogs lead back to 13. That would be as close as the Aztecs would get the rest of the way.

Mathews, who finished with a game-high 17 points, would go on to make his third three-pointer in the first 3:04 of the period, which spurred a 19-2 run, covering nearly 10 minutes. Kell finally stopped the bleeding with a pair of free throws with 6:30 left in the game, but the game was well in hand for the home team.

Kell and Hemsley each scored 14 points to lead the Aztecs, who shot 28.6 percent for the game and had their 15 turnovers turn into 25 Gonzaga points.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State, playing its second game in three days, recovered from a sluggish opening to defeat San Diego Christian, 81-58, at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs led, 18-17, with 8:49 left in the first before snapping out of their funk. After Isaiah Milan's three-pointer brought the Hawks to within one, San Diego State went on a 10-2 run to create separation.

Milan stopped the SDSU scoring run momentarily, but the home team answered by scoring nine of the game's next 12 points to take a 37-23 lead at halftime.

The second half featured a more inspired brand of basketball, and San Diego State's 60-percent shooting exhibition proved it. The Aztecs outscored the Hawks, 44-35, in the final 20 minutes to cruise to the 23-point victory.

San Diego State had four players reach double figures in scoring and were led by Jeremy Hemsley's 23 points on 9-of-12 shooting, including a 3-for-4 effort from behind the three-point arc. The sophomore also added a season- and game-high five assists.

Hemsley's backcourt teammate Trey Kell missed only three of his 10 attempts from the field to finish with 19 points and four assists. Zylan Cheatham and Dakarai Allen chipped in with 15 points apiece with Cheatham contributing seven rebounds and three steals. Allen, meanwhile, grabbed a career-high nine rebounds and blocked a personal-best five shots.

San Diego State needed those contributions and more, for instance, D'Erryl Williams' career-high nine rebounds off the bench, because of its injury situation. The Aztecs did not have Malik Pope (knee), Max Hoetzel (knee), Matt Shrigley (ankle), Valentine Izundu (ankle) or Ben Perez (back) available.

SACRAMENTO, Calif. - SDSU defeated California, 77-65, at Golden 1 Center, the new home of the NBA's Sacramento Kings.

Jeremy Hemsley led the way for the Aztecs with 15 points, 10 straight in one stretch in the first half to open what would be an insurmountable lead.

SDSU led, 24-18, with 7:23 left before Hemsley took over the game. The sophomore used a combination of layups and free throws to tally seven points before delivering the knockout blow, a three-pointer with 3:18 to go, to put the Aztecs ahead by 16 points. San Diego State eventually led by 19 before entering the locker room up, 42-25.

In the first half alone, the Aztecs had three players score at least six points, led by Hemsley's 13. Matt Shrigley, who did not play in the previous game, came off the bench to make a trio of three-pointers. Malik Pope, meanwhile, made his season debut, started and promptly scored SDSU's first six points of the game.

The Golden Bears emerged from halftime and outscored the Aztecs, 13-6, to cut their deficit to 10. But on the very next possession, Pope made a basket and was followed by five points from Zylan Cheatham.

California made one final push, getting to within eight points with 5:45 to go, but like last time, Pope answered with bucket to get SDSU's lead back to double digits. The Bears would not get closer than nine points the rest of the way as the Aztecs secured their fourth straight win over California.

Pope finished with 14 points and contributed five fouls to the game's total of 50. Trey Kell had 11 points as did Max Hoetzel, who was also making his season debut. Shrigley rounded out SDSU's double-figure scoring contingent with 10 points.

California's Ivan Rabb led all players with 19 points and 11 boards off the bench. Charlie Moore added 17 points.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State had five players reach double figures in scoring and never trailed to cruise to a 100-67 win over Savannah State.

Leading the way for the Aztecs was Zylan Cheatham, who had 18 points on 6-for-6 shooting and eight rebounds. Matt Shrigley and Max Hoetzel each had 15 points and combined to make eight treys, including a career-high five from Shrigley.

Guards Jeremy Hemsley and Montaque Gill-Caesar scored 14 and 12 points, respectively, with Hemsley adding a game-high nine assists against zero turnovers. Trey Kell, meanwhile, had nine points, seven rebounds and seven assists.

The aforementioned players helped SDSU, which led by as many as 31 points in the first half, jump out to a 60-32 lead at halftime. The 60 points were the third most scored by an Aztec team in any half since 1996-97.

Defensively, San Diego State locked down a Tigers team that was averaging 93.6 points and eventually held them to a season-low point total. The Aztecs only allowed one player to reach double digits in scoring and it was Dexter McClanahan, who finished with 13 points and a game-high 10 rebounds.

As for the 100 points scored by San Diego State, it marked the fourth-highest output in Viejas Arena history and the most against a Division I opponent since Dec. 12, 2006, vs. Campbell (119 points). It was the first time SDSU reached the scoring plateau since scoring 118 vs. St. Katherine College on Dec. 27, 2013.

For Loyola-Chicago was paced by Jackson, who ultimately scored 24 points on 11-of-12 shooting. He was 9-for-9 on the afternoon from inside the three-point arc. Doyle finished with 12 points and Clayton Custer chipped in with 10 points.

The Aztecs had one last chance to tie or win the game after rebounding a missed free throw with 10 seconds left, but Hemsley could not split a double team near midcourt and SDSU was dealt its second straight defeat.

Defensively, San Diego State limited ASU to 9-for-24 shooting (.375) and forced 13 turnovers. At intermission, the Aztecs were ahead, 32-25.

The Sun Devils, however, were a different team when they stepped back onto the floor. Arizona State's first three field goals were three-pointers and 3:05 into the period ASU led, 36-35, after a Tra Holder layup.

As the clock dipped just under 15 minutes, Max Hoetzel connected on one of his career-high four three-pointers to level the score at 38. The Sun Devils answered immediately with a trey to spur a 15-3 run that put the visitors up, 53-41, with 8:24 to play.

SDSU responded with six straight points to cut its deficit in half, but ASU came back with another three, this time from Obinna Oleka. The Aztecs wound up getting to within six points three different times over the course of the next two-plus minutes, but Arizona State pushed its lead back to eight each time.

The closest San Diego State would get the rest of the way was seven points and it ultimately ran out of time, which sent the Aztecs to their third straight loss.

In the second half alone, Arizona State shot 50 percent from the field (15-30), 50 percent from three-point range (7-14) and 100 percent from the free-throw line (12-12). SDSU was 9-for-31 from the floor in the final 20 minutes.

Trey Kell, who had 10 points to help SDSU jump out to its halftime lead, finished with 20 points and a career-high five steals. Hoetzel added 12 points and Jeremy Hemsley scored 10.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State scored the game's first 10 points and made its first 11 two-point field-goal attempts to take a 22-5 lead and never looked back in defeating Alabama State, 73-41, to stop a three-game losing streak.

The Aztecs, in fact, made their first 12 shots, the last of which was a three-pointer by Matt Shrigley to move ahead, 25-8, with 9:24 left in the first half. The trey represented the first SDSU points outside of the paint on the night.

San Diego State wound up missing its first basket with just over eight minutes left before intermission, but the misfire was one of nine as the Aztecs shot 62.5 percent and took a 42-22 lead into the locker room.

With the Aztecs holding a comfortable lead, San Diego State was able to get 11 players into the game, with nine of them scoring. Of the starters, three were in double figures, led by Malik Pope's season-high totals of 16 points and seven rebounds. Zylan Cheatham made all five of his shots en route to 11 points and six boards, while Dakarai Allen chipped in 10 points and a career-high four steals. Montaque Gill-Caesar added 11 points off the bench.

Alabama State was led by Torloft Thomas, who had 14 points and a game-high-tying three assists.

The Aztecs shut down a Dons offense that was one of the top three-point shooting units in the nation, entering the game as the fourth-best team nationally in three-point makes and fifth in three-point percentage.

San Diego State, meanwhile, used the three-point shot to earn its third win four days.

With SDSU clinging on to a 41-39 lead with 11:46 to play, D'Erryl Williams missed a layup, but the rebound was scooped by Valentine Izundu, who fed Matt Shrigley. The shot clock did not reset and the senior faked going one way and went the other, ultimately rising and nailing the trey.

USF's Ronnie Boyce answered with a layup and Shrigley was at it again, this time knocking down yet another three to move the Aztecs ahead, 47-41.

The Dons got back to within four points only to have San Diego State respond with a Zylan Cheatham three. Cheatham added a dunk after USF cut its deficit to five and the slam was followed by a Jeremy Hemsley three-pointer to increase the Aztecs' lead to 10 with 4:19 to play.

Hemsley later added another triple down the stretch to help San Diego State to the 14-point victory.

Defensively, the Aztecs limited the Dons to 4-of-20 shooting (.200) from three-point range and 37.3 percent from the field, which was well below USF's season average of 49.2 percent.

Cheatham, the Most Outstanding Player, finished with 16 points and 11 rebounds. Trey Kell added 10 points and was named to the all-tourney team. Hemsley finished with 12 points.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State let a nine-point lead with more than six minutes left in the second half slip away as it opened Mountain West action with a 68-62 home loss to New Mexico.

In less than two minutes after a Valentine Izundu dunk lifted SDSU to a 56-47 lead with 6:15 left, New Mexico nearly erased its deficit with a three-pointer from Dane Kuiper and jumpers from Jalen Harris and Tim Williams.

The Aztecs led, 61-60, with 2:19 remaining after UNM's Elijah Brown made two free-throws, but Jeremy Hemsley missed a three-point attempt on the ensuing possession.

Following the misfire, Max Hoetzel fouled Xavier Adams, who made both of his free throws to give the Lobos their first lead since opening the game with two Brown free throws. Hemsley tied the game at 62 when he made 1-of-2 from the charity stripe with 1:03 to go.

The Aztecs, however, missed a jump shot, committed a turnover and then missed another three-pointer to close the game. On the flip side, UNM made all four of its free-throw attempts down the stretch and tacked on a dunk to provide the final margin.

San Diego State, which was without Malik Pope for a third straight game (knee) and Matt Shrigley (ankle), led by 11 at halftime thanks to 46.4-percent shooting. In the second half, though, SDSU was just 9-for-25 from the field, while allowing the Lobos to shoot 44.8 percent from the floor, including a 4-for-6 effort from three and a 13-for-15 performance from the free-throw line.

New Mexico ended the game by making 6-of-12 from three-point distance and 20-for-26 from the charity stripe.

Hemsley led the Aztecs with 16 points, Trey Kell had 12 points, five assists and three steals, and Hoetzel added 10 points.

Brown finished with a game-high 22 points and Williams had 12 points and nine boards.

RENO, Nev. - San Diego State's furious second-half rally fell short as it lost at Nevada, 72-69, despite receiving a career-high 30 points from Jeremy Hemsley.

The Aztecs, who only trailed by three points at halftime, found themselves staring at a 60-50 deficit with 5:21 to go until Hemsley put them on his back.

The sophomore scored nine straight points for SDSU, all of which came on threes, to help it get to within six points. During Hemsley's scoring spree, Nevada's D.J. Fenner added five points.

Zylan Cheatham threw down a dunk, but the Wolf Pack answered with a trey to move ahead by seven with 39 seconds left. Hemsley, however, made his sixth three-pointer of the night and then made a layup to make the score, 68-66 Nevada, with 21 ticks left on the clock.

Fenner made two free throws to double the Wolf Pack's lead, but the three-point shot was good to the Aztecs again, with Max Hoetzel tossing in his career-high fifth of the game.

Now within one point and 12 seconds left, SDSU fouled Marcus Marshall, who made both of his free-throw attempts, which moved Nevada in front, 72-69, with nine seconds remaining.

The Aztecs ran a play for Hemsley, but his three-point magic ran out as his attempt was off the mark, propelling the Wolf Pack to victory.

In addition to scoring 30 points, Hemsley added five assists and zero turnovers, becoming just the sixth player in Division I in 2016-17, and the first Aztec since at least 1996-97, to post a line of at least 30 points, five assists and zero miscues.

BOISE, Idaho - San Diego State raced out to an 11-point first-half lead, but could not hold on to it as Boise State rallied to defeat the Aztecs, 78-66, on a wintry night at Taco Bell Arena.

In the first eight-plus minutes, SDSU could do no wrong, starting with Max Hoetzel. The sophomore started things off by knocking down a three-pointer on the Aztecs' opening possession. In fact, Hoetzel made his first four treys he attempted, three of which came in the first 6:42 of the contest.

During the game-opening 21-10 run, five different Aztecs scored, including Jeremy Hemsley, whose layup gave SDSU its 11-point cushion.

The Broncos, however, closed the first half on a 26-12 run, including a 12-2 spurt in the final four minutes, to take a 39-35 lead at halftime.

When play resumed, Boise State outscored the Aztecs, 12-6, to enjoy its first double-digit lead of the game at 51-41. San Diego State missed seven of its first eight field-goal attempts to open the second half to aid the Broncos' run.

The Aztecs managed to cut their deficit to eight points on a couple of occasions, but stared at a double-figure hole to dig out of in the final 10:11 of the evening.

Dakarai Allen led San Diego State in scoring with a career-high 17 points on 6-of-8 shooting. Hoetzel, who started for the fifth straight game in place of the injured Malik Pope, finished with a season-high 16 points and Zylan Cheatham added 12 points.

For the Broncos, they were led by Zach Haney and James Reid's 19 points. The Boise State trio of Paris Austin, Nick Duncan and Chandler Hutchison all scored 12 points apiece.

The Reid-Haney duo was responsible for 38 of Boise State's 40 bench points compared to SDSU's five. All five points came from Valentine Izundu, who added a career-high eight rebounds and a game-high three blocked shots.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State used an efficient first half and received balanced scoring to defeat San José State at home, 76-61, which also snapped a three-game losing streak to open Mountain West action.

Five Aztecs reached double figures in scoring for a San Diego State side that shot 51.9 percent in the first half and used a 9-0 run to jump out to an 18-11 lead. The Aztecs later went on a 14-0 run to help them take a 42-23 lead at halftime.

In the second half, the Spartans made a run at San Diego State, cutting a 19-point deficit down to 13 with 11:43 left. The Aztecs, however, answered by outscoring SJSU, 9-2, over the next two-plus minutes to extend their lead to 20.

San José State trailed by a dozen points later in the game, but with only 1:58 left on the clock, the visitors ultimately ran out of time.

San Diego State was led by a trio of players who scored 12 points in Jeremy Hemsley, Max Hoetzel and Trey Kell. Hemsley added a career-high seven rebounds, Hoetzel had a game- and career-high nine boards and four three-pointers, and Kell shared game-high honors with four assists.

Zylan Cheatham and Montaque Gill-Caesar also had strong efforts with 10 points apiece. Cheatham also grabbed eight rebounds and Gill-Caesar had a game-high two steals.

For SJSU, Brandon Clarke led the way with 25 points, 18 of which came in the second half, seven rebounds, four assists and two blocked shots. Ryan Welage and Jalen James, meanwhile, scored nine points for the Spartans, who only connected on 3-of-20 from three-point distance.

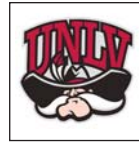

USAF ACADEMY, Colo. - San Diego State let a 10-point halftime lead slip away as Air Force won, 60-57, at Clune Arena.

SDSU was clicking on all cylinders in the first half. In the opening 4:30, the Aztecs led, 10-2, and later extended its lead to 24-10 after Dakarai Allen made a trey with 8:27 left in the period.

The Aztecs still led by 14 with 3:44 remaining, but the Falcons received a jumper and two free throws from Trevor Lyons while SDSU went scoreless to make it a 34-24 game at halftime.

In the first half, the Aztecs made seven three-pointers and held Air Force to just 2-for-8 from deep. The final 20 minutes, however, were a different story.

The second half started off on a promising note as Zylan Cheatham stole the ball away on Air Force's first possession and scored on the ensuing play. An 8-0 Falcon run nearly erased Air Force's deficit, but San Diego State answered with four straight points to push its lead back to eight.

Minutes later when the Aztecs were ahead, 42-36, Malik Pope dived for a loose ball and was sandwiched between two Falcons, taking a scary fall. The forward stayed on the ground for several minutes before walking off in a neck brace and with medical personnel. He was diagnosed with a neck strain.

When play resumed, SDSU extended its lead to eight, but in a matter of 3:40, AFA was within one point, at 50-49. The Aztecs managed to keep their lead until Air Force's Dane Morgan made two free throws with 3:02 left to move the Falcons ahead, 55-53.

SDSU later tied the game twice and had three chances to go ahead or tie the game in the final 25 seconds, but two Trey Kell threes and a Jeremy Hemsley three attempt were off the mark.

The Falcons were 4-of-10 from three-point distance in the second half, while the Aztecs made just 1-of-10.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State led by 10 points at half-time and enjoyed a 13-point lead early in the second half, but allowed Colorado State to successfully rally and escape with a 78-77 victory at Viejas Arena.

After the Rams erased their deficit and led by four points after a Gian Clavell three-pointer with 1:30 left in regulation, the Aztecs got the defensive stops they needed and slowly clawed their way back into the game.

Malik Pope, who returned to the starting lineup for the first time since the quarterfinal game at the Diamond Head Classic, made two free throws to trim SDSU's deficit in half. The Aztecs then forced Clavell into a turnover, but Jeremy Hemsley was only able to convert 1-of-2 from the charity stripe.

Trailing 76-75 with 59 seconds left, San Diego State forced Clavell into a missed shot and then forced another turnover, giving the Aztecs the ball with 29 seconds showing on the clock. Pope's jumper was off the mark, but Max Hoetzel got the offensive rebound and fed the ball to Trey Kell, who was fouled. The junior made both free throws to move the hosts in front, 77-76, with 11 seconds to play.

On the next play, Clavell raced down the floor and laid the ball in, giving the Rams a one-point lead with six seconds left. The Aztecs elected to not call timeout and moved the ball down the floor where Hemsley's three-point try was off the mark, snapping SDSU's 13-game home winning streak vs. Colorado State.

Clavell's game-winning field goal gave him 37 points to go with eight rebounds. Emmanuel Omogbo added 24 points and nine boards. Between the two of them, they were 8-for-10 from behind the arc.

As for the Aztecs, they had all five starters in double figures, led by Pope's 19 points and seven rebounds. Hemsley had 17 points and Kell had 16. Dakarai Allen and Max Hoetzel scored 11 and 10 points, respectively.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State stopped a two-game slide by defeating Wyoming for a ninth straight time at home, 77-68.

The Aztecs built a 17-point first-half lead thanks to a 15-3 run that covered more than eight minutes. Back-to-back triples from Trey Kell and Dakarai Allen capped the run with 4:38 left in period.

The Cowboys, however, did not go quietly into the lockerroom, scoring the next 11 points to get within six with just under two minutes to play. Montaque Gill-Caesar temporarily stopped the onslaught with a tip-in bucket, but Wyoming scored five of the game's next six points, which included a Justin James three-pointer at the buzzer to make the score, 31-27 San Diego State.

When play resumed, Malik Pope knocked down a trey on the first possession and Valentine Izundu added a layup to propel the Aztecs to a nine-point advantage in the first minute of the half.

SDSU's first five points led to a 7-2 spurt that extended its lead to 12 points with 14:46 left in regulation. Four minutes later, the Aztecs, again, led by 17 points following a pair of Gill-Caesar free throws.

San Diego State maintained its double-digit lead until Wyoming scored six unanswered points in less than three minutes to trim its deficit to nine points. The Aztecs, however, responded with five straight points of their own and enjoyed a comfortable lead the rest of the way despite the Cowboys getting to within seven points with 1:08 left.

Kell led the team with 18 points and three assists, and Pope enjoyed his second straight strong game with 17 points, eight rebounds, three assists and four steals. Allen added 13 points and seven boards, and Gill-Caesar chipped in 12 points in 12 minutes.

James, who fouled out, scored 20 points off the bench for Wyoming. Alan Herndon had 14 points and 10 rebounds.

FRESNO, Calif. - San Diego State held off Fresno State in the second half to earn a 70-67 road victory at Save Mart Center.

The win ended a number of Bulldog streaks in the process. With the SDSU decision, it ended Fresno State's 11-game league winning streak in one-possession games (three points or less), which was the nation's longest such streak, its 13-game home conference winning streak and its nine-game overall home winning streak.

The Aztecs put a stop to it all thanks to Trey Kell and clutch free-throw shooting down the stretch.

San Diego State led by 11 points with 8:01 left in the second half and allowed the Bulldogs to score 10 unanswered points to get within one point.

Dakarai Allen stopped the bleeding with two free throws, but Deshon Taylor made two of his own to bring Fresno State to within one once more.

Then Kell took over, making a three-pointer to put SDSU up, 57-53. A Bulldog jumper cut FS's deficit in half and then Kell answered with another triple, increasing the Aztecs' lead to five.

Less than two minutes later when Fresno State closed to within two, Kell responded with yet another bucket and two free throws. Then in the final 22 seconds, Zylan Cheatham made all four of his free-throw attempts and Kell added one more to keep the Bulldogs at bay and help SDSU even its conference record at 5-5.

Kell finished the game with a game-high 22 points, all of which came in the second half. Allen chipped in with 13 points and Malik Pope had nine points, seven rebounds and two steals. Valentine Izundu filled the stat sheet with eight points, six rebounds and three blocked shots.

As for Fresno State, it was led by Taylor's 18 points and Karachi Edo's 17 points and five rebounds. Jaron Hopkins contributed 13 points and seven boards.

SAN JOSE, Calif. - San Diego State jumped out to an early lead, but faced an uphill battle for the remainder of the game as San José State defeated the Aztecs in The Event Center, 76-71.

SDSU forced the Spartans into missing their first eight shots before they tallied their first points and their first 10 field-goal attempts overall. The Aztecs, however, were only ahead, 9-2, when Brandon Clarke ended SJSU's drought 5:26 into the game.

The bucket was the start of a 9-2 Spartan run that eventually tied the game at 11. San Diego State was either ahead or tied until there was 5:43 left in the first half when Clarke gave San José State a 23-22 lead with a dunk.

Following a Jeremy Hemsley free throw to level the score, the Spartans used a 10-3 run to go head by seven. A Hemsley three-pointer was the only basket scored in the final 1:45 to get the Aztecs within three points, 33-29, at halftime.

Another 9-2 SJSU run to start the second period put the Aztecs behind by 11 points, but in a matter of 3:11, San Diego State trailed by only three points thanks to a Zylan Cheatham dunk.

Similar to the flow of the game, SJSU answered with seven unanswered points to take a 53-43 lead just ahead of the 10-minute mark. The Spartans' lead swelled to 12 points with a touch over four minutes to play.

San Diego State used a stifling full-court press and timely baskets down the stretch to make it a 74-71 game with 20 seconds left after a three by Trey Kell. Two SJSU free throws by Issac Thornton with 17 seconds left gave the Spartans a two-point cushion the Aztecs could not erase.

SDSU was led by Kell and Hemsley's 13 points and the duo was joined in double figures by Dakarai Allen (12 points) and Malik Pope (10).

SJSU, which made 23-of-26 from the charity stripe, was led by Clarke's 22 points and seven rebounds.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State saw four players reach double figures in scoring and it shot nearly 50 percent from the floor in a 70-56 victory over visiting Nevada.

Leading the way for SDSU was Trey Kell, who scored a team-high 17 points and became the 31st player in school history to score 1,000 points in a career.

Starting the Aztecs off on the right foot, however, was Kell's classmate, Malik Pope. The forward scored seven of San Diego State's first nine points and had 10 in the first half before finishing with 12 and 10 rebounds for his first double-double of the season.

SDSU built a 12-point lead with 2:26 left in the first half, but the Wolf Pack answered with five straight points. Then with 1:08 to go, Matt Shrigley made a three-pointer, stole the ball on the defensive end and made another try to push the Aztecs' lead to 13 points. Nevada had one last chance to trim its deficit, but Jordan Caroline misfired from three and Shrigley was fouled blocking out Devearl Ramsey. Shrigley ended up making one of two free throws to give the Aztecs a 42-28 lead at halftime.

In the second half, Nevada twice made a run at the Aztecs, the first of which got it within 12 points with 13:58 to play. San Diego State answered with an 8-0 run to inflate its lead to 20 points. Right after that, the Wolf Pack scored seven straight, but the Aztecs recorded a 7-2 spurt to end the Nevada threat.

The Wolf Pack's Lindsey Drew nailed a jumper with 5:08 to play to make it a 65-51 Aztec lead, but that would be as close as Nevada would get the rest of the way.

Other than Kell and Pope, Jeremy Hemsley (15) and Shrigley (10) reached double figures in scoring.

D.J. Fenner led Nevada with 21 points, while the league's top scorer in conference games only, Marcus Marshall, was held to four points (1-10 FG, 0-7 3FG).

LOGAN, Utah - San Diego State used a 10-0 run late in the second half to pull away from Utah State on the road, 66-62, despite a late Aggies push in the final two minutes at Dee Glen Smith Spectrum.

The Aztecs led by as many as 11 points in the first half, but Utah State outscored SDSU, 19-9, to get within one point with 1:16 left. Jeremy Hemsley gave San Diego State a bit of breathing room after he nailed a three-pointer with 24 seconds remaining and nearly gave it right back after fouling Koby McEwen on a three-point attempt. A Jalen Moore triple stopped the streak, but the Aztecs made four more free throws to extend their lead to 61-48 with 4:06 to play.

Down the stretch, Utah State outscored the Aztecs, 12-4, to make it a three-point game with 10 seconds left, but Hemsley made the second of two free throws to provide the final margin.

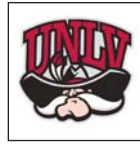
Kell ended his night with a game-high 21 points and team highs of seven rebounds and three assists. Hemsley added 13 points.

As for the Aggies, they were led by Moore's 20 points, 14 of which came in the first half, and four assists. McEwen added 13 points and Sam Merrill contributed 12 points and four assists.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State shot 50.9 percent from the floor to help it defeat UNLV for a 10th straight time, 77-64, at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs were firing on all cylinders in the first half, connecting on 57.1 percent of their attempts from the field while holding the Runnin' Rebels to just 33.3-percent shooting.

Despite the disparity, it was not until nine-minute mark when the first-half dominance began to take shape. Up until that point, SDSU owned a 19-18 lead and the game featured five ties and six lead changes.

The tide began to turn after Malik Pope made back-to-back jumpers, with Trey Kell adding a bucket and Matt Shrigley nailing his third three-pointer of the game. The 9-0 run gave San Diego State a 10-point lead before it swelled to 15 points on two occasions, the last of which came on a Shrigley layup before halftime.

Starting the second half with a 41-26 lead, SDSU kept the Rebels at a safe distance until they scored seven straight points to trim a 16-point deficit down to nine with 12:06 to go. The Aztecs, however, responded by scoring 11 of the game's next 16 points to move out in front by 15.

A 9-0 UNLV spurt got the Rebels to within six points of the Aztecs at 66-60, but Kell made a fall-away jumper with two seconds left on the shot clock to end the momentum. SDSU ended up scoring nine points in a row to take a 75-60 lead with under a minute to go and the Aztecs cruised to victory.

Pope led SDSU with 17 points and nine rebounds, with Shrigley and Jeremy Hemsley adding 16 points. All of Shrigley's career-high point total came in the first half. Kell, meanwhile, had a personal-best seven assists to go with zero turnovers.

Jovan Mooring led all players with 26 points and five assists for UNLV.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State could not sustain a hot start and eventually fell to Fresno State at home, 63-55.

The Aztecs scored the first seven points of the game and led, 13-7, with 14:35 left in the first half. Of SDSU's first 13 points, nine were attributed to Dakarai Allen, who made his first three shots. After that, the Bulldogs went on a 9-0 run to take a three-point lead.

Jeremy Hemsley temporarily ended the scoring spree with a trey, but Fresno State responded with a 10-2 run to move out in front by eight points with just under five minutes left. Fresno State finished the first 20 minutes with a 30-24 lead.

The second half started by seeing the Aztecs misfire on their first two possessions, while the Bulldogs knocked down a three-pointer and a jumper to lead by 11 points.

Fresno State carried its 11-point advantage to the 10-minute mark and that is when SDSU made what would be its final push. Allen started the rally with a layup and Hemsley registered five consecutive points to help the Aztecs get to within one. Then a Max Hoetzel triple cut SDSU's deficit to 44-43 with 7:32 to go.

On the next possession, however, Allen fouled Deshon Taylor on a three-point attempt and the guard made all three free throws. Allen nearly erased his mistake by making a pair of free throws of his own to slice SDSU's hole in half, but a Bryson Williams free throw and later a Jahmel Taylor trey put the Bulldogs up, 51-45.

SDSU trailed by as few as five points with 4:06 to play, but would not get any closer the rest of the way.

Allen and Hemsley led the Aztecs with 13 points apiece. Malik Pope added 11 points and a team-high six rebounds.

Williams posted a game-high 18 points for Fresno State, while Deshon Taylor added 15.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. - San Diego State suffered a crushing defeat after Emmanuel Omogbo made a three-pointer with four seconds left to propel Colorado State to a 56-55 victory at Moby Arena.

SDSU took a 55-53 lead with 23 seconds remaining when the Aztecs executed a set play out of a timeout for Dakarai Allen. The senior made a layup, got fouled and made the ensuing free throw to move the visitors out in front.

The Rams came down the floor and gave the ball to Prentiss Nixon, who drove the lane, but had his shot blocked out of bounds by Zylan Cheatham. Then with nine seconds left, a broken play finished with Omogbo getting the ball and making his only three-point attempt of the evening despite an on-rushing D'Erryl Williams.

San Diego State had one last attempt, but Allen's halfcourt heave at the buzzer fell short.

The Aztecs put themselves in a great position to win the game thanks to a first half that saw them shoot 48.1 percent from the floor and limit the Rams to 28.6-percent accuracy. After 20 minutes of action, SDSU led, 33-21.

Colorado State opened the second half on a 9-1 run to trail by four points before the clock hit 17:00. The Rams later took the lead with 2:20 to go after a Nixon free throw, which set up the Allen and Omogbo sequences to end the game.

Allen led the Aztecs with 12 points, and Malik Pope and Trey Kell each had 10 points. Kell, however, fouled out with 5:10 left in the contest and did not score in the second half.

Gian Clavell scored a game-high 18 points on 6-of-24 shooting, including a 2-for-15 effort from three-point distance, after putting up 37 points in the first meeting with SDSU. The guard also had 10 rebounds.

Omogbo finished with 11 points and 11 rebounds, and Nico Carvacho produced six points and 10 boards for the Rams. Nixon added 10 points.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State won a game that was a struggle for both teams offensively, defeating Air Force, 51-38, at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs missed their first 10 shots and made 7-of-31 from the field in the first half. The Falcons, meanwhile, made just three of their 20 attempts from the floor and ultimately trailed SDSU, 22-13, at halftime.

Air Force made things interesting the second half, closing to within four points thanks to a three-pointer from Jacob Van and a basket from Frank Toohey. Similar to the first 20 minutes, San Diego State struggled to score and did not find the bottom of the hoop until Trey Kell knocked down a jumper with 15:50 left.

Nearly eight minutes had passed and the score was tied at 27 following a Lavelle Scottie layup. San Diego State then turned to its seniors on Senior Night, getting a bucket from Dakarai Allen, D'Erryl Williams and a big three-pointer from Matt Shrigley, to move the Aztecs ahead, 36-27, with 8:08 to play. Sophomore Zylan Cheatham added a basket during the senior-led 9-0 run.

Both teams responded with two free throws apiece from Toohey and Malik Pope, which kept San Diego State's cushion at nine. Then with 5:13 to go, Shrigley hit another triple to push the Aztecs ahead by 12 points.

The Falcons later sliced their deficit to nine points with 2:56 left on the game clock, but never got any closer. Down the stretch, Shrigley made four straight free throws with under a minute to play to give the Aztecs their biggest lead, 13 points, on two different occasions.

Pope ended up leading SDSU with 11 points, while Shrigley added 10 of his own. Kell grabbed a career-high 12 rebounds.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. - SDSU and New Mexico played a game that featured 71 free throws, 52 fouls and 33.6-percent combined shooting, but ended with Lobos emerging with a 64-59 victory.

The Aztecs, in particular, struggled to shoot the ball in all three phases. They were 17-of-54 from the field (31.5 percent), including 4-for-21 from three-point distance (19.0 percent), and 21-for-37 at the charity stripe (56.8).

The 16 missed free throws ultimately doomed San Diego State down the stretch as they trailed, 58-52, with 1:20 to play. The Aztecs were down by six again, this time with 21 seconds left, and later by four points with eight seconds to go.

Despite SDSU's inaccurate touch at the free-throw line, the Aztecs put themselves in a position to win the game after falling behind in the opening minutes of the first half.

San Diego State trailed, 25-24, as the second period started and turned the ball over on its first two possessions. New Mexico, meanwhile, scored 12 points on its first five possessions to take a 37-26 lead. UNM saw its advantage balloon to 15 points after an Elijah Brown basket with 13:45 left.

Dakarai Allen answered with a jumper of his own, but was fouled out of the game 80 seconds later after throwing a bad pass that Brown picked off and committing his fifth foul in the process. Brown made the ensuing two free throws to push the Lobos' lead back to 15.

SDSU chipped away and later scored six consecutive points to get within six. Brown, however, answered with a triple, but the Aztecs scored three straight points to get to within six again, but would not get any closer.

Zylan Cheatham led SDSU with 13 points and was the only Aztec in double figures. Brown produced a game-high 29 points.

LAS VEGAS - San Diego State, the sixth seed at the Mountain West Championship, rallied from a 21-point second-half deficit to defeat 11th-seeded UNLV in overtime, 62-52, at Thomas & Mack Center.

The 21-point second-half comeback was the largest by the Aztecs since at least the 1996-97 season and was the largest overcome in a win since the 2010-11 campaign.

SDSU found itself needing a huge rally after a dreadful first half. The Aztecs made just four of their 27 attempts from the field, including an 0-for-7 effort from three-point distance. The Runnin' Rebels were not much better, connecting on 12-of-31 from the field, but managed to take a 32-14 lead into halftime.

With the second half just 90 seconds old, UNLV's Jovan Mooring connected on a three-pointer to put the Runnin' Rebels ahead, 37-16.

Then the Aztecs made their move.

San Diego State went on a 14-0 run in a matter of 3 minutes, 38 seconds to get within seven points. During the game-altering run, six points were scored by both Trey Kell and Jeremy Hemsley.

UNLV, playing in its own arena, however, would not go away quietly as it snapped the run with a three-point play to extend its lead to 40-30.

The Aztecs, with their new-found confidence, did not blink and answered with 11 straight points, punctuated by a Matt Shrigley trey, which put them up, 41-40, with 8:57 to go.

The game was separated by one possession until Valentine Izundu made two free throws to push SDSU out to a 50-46 lead. UNLV scored the final four points in last 2:34 to force overtime.

In the extra session, San Diego State completely blitzed the Rebels, scoring the first 12 points to earn the victory. UNLV did not score until there were nine seconds left in the game.

LAS VEGAS - Sixth-seeded San Diego State won its 10th consecutive Mountain West Championship quarterfinal game when it emerged with an 87-68 victory over No. 3 seed Boise State.

A day after struggling to shoot the ball, the Aztecs came out firing and connected early. SDSU made four of its first five attempts from the floor to take a 9-3 lead.

San Diego State later led by as many as seven points before the Broncos began to close in, tying the game at 15. Boise State later moved out in front, 32-26, after a James Reid three-pointer with 5:00 to go in the half.

The Aztecs, however, responded with 10 straight points and wound up scoring 13 of the game's next 15 points to take a 42-37 lead into the locker room.

Malik Pope stretched San Diego State's lead to seven with a pair of free throws on the Aztecs' first possession of the second half. The junior would team with Jeremy Hemsley to score 10 of SDSU's first 12 points of the frame with the final three coming on a Hemsley trey.

Later, with the Aztecs up, 59-51, Max Hoetzel knocked down one of his career-high five three-pointers. The triple started a 14-3 run, which pushed SDSU's lead to 19 points with 3:56 to play.

San Diego State enjoyed its largest lead of 22 points when Hoetzel converted another three-pointer, which gave the Aztecs an 81-59 cushion with just under two minutes to play.

Hoetzel later added three more points down the stretch to give him a career-high 21 points on 7-of-8 shooting. Pope, however, led all players with 22 points and 10 rebounds. Trey Kell and Hemsley, meanwhile, each scored 10 points with the former adding a game-high five assists.

LAS VEGAS - Sixth-seeded San Diego State, playing its third game in three days and its second in less than 24 hours, saw its season come to an end with a 71-63 Mountain West Championship semifinal loss to second-seeded Colorado State.

The night could not have started better for SDSU, which scored the first five points of the game and jumped out to a 15-2 lead following a Malik Pope three-pointer with 14:41 left in the first.

CSU chipped away at its deficit and trailed by eight, only to have Max Hoetzel knock down a trey of his own to move the SDSU advantage back up to 11 points.

The Rams, however, used a 16-6 run to level the score at 30, but the Aztecs were able to stop them in their tracks and scored the final six points of the half to enjoy a 36-30 lead at halftime.

San Diego State led for more than 12 minutes when the second half started and it was a two-possession game up until Gian Clavell converted a three-point play with 10:17 left to make it a 50-47 Aztec lead.

The game tilted when the Rams made 4-of-6 three-pointers in nearly a five-minute span. J.D. Paige tied the game at 52 with 7:15 left and Emmanuel Omogbo gave them a 57-54 lead with 5:56 to go.

Colorado State enjoyed a 57-56 advantage as the clock dipped below 4:00 and then Clavell made a triple. On the next possession Paige knocked down another three-pointer, which put the Rams ahead, 63-56.

Jumpers by Dakarai Allen and Jeremy Hemsley twice cut the Aztecs' deficit to five points, but with only 98 seconds left, SDSU was forced to foul. CSU ended up making six of its final seven free-throw attempts to seal the win.

Pope led the Aztecs with 18 points and Trey Kell added 15 of his own. Hemsley and Zylan Cheatham contributed, 11 and 10 points, respectively.
